## Media Services

### CREDENTIALS

Requests for credentials to cover Miami home football games can be submitted through the Media Info/Credentials link of the MURedHawks.com football page, or mailed or faxed on company letterhead to Mike Pearson, Athletic Media Relations, Miami University, 230 Millett Hall, Oxford, OH 45056. The fax number is (513) 529-6729. Requests should be received at least one week prior to the game. If time permits, credentials and parking passes will be mailed in advance; otherwise, they will be left at the will-call window at Yager Stadium. Persons with passes should use the press box elevator on the west side of Yager Stadium.

Spouses, dates, nonworkers and anyone under the age of 18 are not allowed in the media areas of the press box in compliance with the working code of the Football Writers Association of America.

### PRESS BOX SERVICES

A media packet, including a game program, game notes, depth charts and statistics, is available to each media member. During the game, quickie statistics are distributed after each quarter. Complete play-by-play, scoring summary, and individual and team statistics are distributed following the game. A meal is provided before each game.

In accordance with NCAA guidelines, no cheering is allowed in the media areas of the press box in order to provide a proper working environment.

### PRO SCOUTS

Seats in the press box will be available to professional scouts on a first-come, first-serve basis based on availability. If seats are not available in the press box, scouts will be provided a reserved ticket along with a press box pass that will allow them access to the press area for statistics, notes and food. Requests should be made well in advance of the game to guarantee availability and should be requested through Miami Athletic Media Relations assistant Norma McClure at (513) 529-1662.

### TELEPHONES/INTERNET

There are a limited number of courtesy telephone lines available on a first-come, first-serve basis in the Yager Stadium press box. Media requiring their own phones should contact Verizon at 1-800-483-5600. When ordering phone lines for the press box, the physical address for Yager Stadium is 5300 Bonham Rd., Oxford, OH 45056.

Wireless internet is available throughout the press box and a limited number of ethernet connections also are available to the media. Members of the media relations staff will be available to assist you.

#### By Appointment

Coach Montgomery and his entire coaching staff are available each weekday for one-on-one interviews. Contact football media relations contact Mike Pearson to schedule interviews.

#### MAC Teleconference

The 13 MAC coaches are featured on a weekly teleconference each Monday, starting at 9:30 a.m. (ET) during the regular season, beginning Aug. 27. Coach Montgomery speaks for eight minutes starting at 10:26 a.m.

To access the teleconference, dial (719) 457-1566. A replay is available Mondays beginning at 5 p.m. (ET) by calling (719) 457-0820 and entering passcode 6904022.

#### Tuesday Press Conference

Each Tuesday at 11 a.m., unless otherwise noted, in the main football office at Yager Stadium, Coach Montgomery meets with the media. His press conferences are weekly, beginning Aug. 28 through the end of the season. Audio of the Tuesday press conference, as well as quotes, are available on MURedHawks.com. A login and password are necessary to listen to the replay. Contact Mike Pearson for more details.

#### Post Practice

Coach Montgomery and the entire coaching staff are available for one-on-one interviews after practice on Tuesday and Wednesday during a typical Saturday game week.

### PLAYER INTERVIEWS

#### Post Practice

Player interviews can be conducted after practices on Tuesday and Wednesday during a typical Saturday game week. In-person or phone interviews are generally done after practice on Tuesday or Wednesday (no practices on Monday). Please contact Mike Pearson at least a day ahead of time to schedule a player interview. Home phone numbers of players are not available, and team locker rooms are off-limits to media representatives.

#### By Appointment

Player interviews also can be conducted Monday through Wednesday by scheduling an interview through the athletic media relations department. The time of the interview will be based on the player's availability for that particular day. Home phone numbers are not available.

### POSTGAME PROCEDURE

Following a cooling-off period, players and coaches from both teams will be brought to the interior office level of Yager Stadium for postgame press conferences. For afternoon games, both sets of coaches and players will be brought to the same classroom with the visiting team going first. For night games with tighter deadlines, the players and coaches will be featured in separate press conferences that will run simultaneously.

Quotes from both teams will be provided shortly after the press conferences conclude.



Please give any player requests to the athletic media relations staff before the end of the game. Miami personnel will direct media to the interview rooms. Miami's locker room is closed to the media.

TV INTERVIEWS/HIGHLIGHTS

Each Monday, Coach Montgomery tapes a 5-to-10 minute TV interview reviewing the previous week's game as well as previewing the upcoming opponent. This footage is available to all TV media. The tape also will include highlights from the previous game when available. Media interested in receiving the interview will need to provide exchange tape (Beta format) and a FedEx number to receive the interview. Contact Mike Pearson for more details.

DIRECTIONS TO YAGER STADIUM

From north and I-70: Take Hwy. 127 south to Hwy. 73 west. Stay on 73 west until it ends at Hwy. 27 (Patterson Avenue). Turn right and go one block to High Street. Turn left on High Street to Tallawanda Avenue. Turn right on Tallawanda to Sycamore Street, then left onto Sycamore. Proceed four blocks to Morning Sun Road/Ohio Route 732, and turn right. Follow signs to stadium parking (approximately one-half mile).

From south and I-275: Take Hwy. 27 north to Oxford. Stay on 27, which becomes Patterson Avenue. At first four-way stop, turn left onto High Street. Take High Street to Tallawanda Avenue. Turn right on Tallawanda to Sycamore Street, then left onto Sycamore. Proceed four blocks to Morning Sun Road/Ohio Route 732, and turn right. Follow signs to stadium parking (one-half mile).

WEEKLY RELEASES

Each Monday afternoon during a typical week, a set of weekly game notes will be available to the media providing up-to-date statistics, depth charts, general team information and a preview of that week's game. This weekly release is available to the general public in PDF format via MURedHawks.com. Members of the media also may request to be placed on an email list to receive all of Miami's game notes and releases pertaining to football or all of Miami's varsity athletic programs. Simply email your request to assistant athletics director for communication and technology Mike Pearson at pearsomg@muohio.edu, to be included on this mailing list. The game notes, along with MAC notes and opponent notes also will be available at Coach Montgomery's weekly press conference.

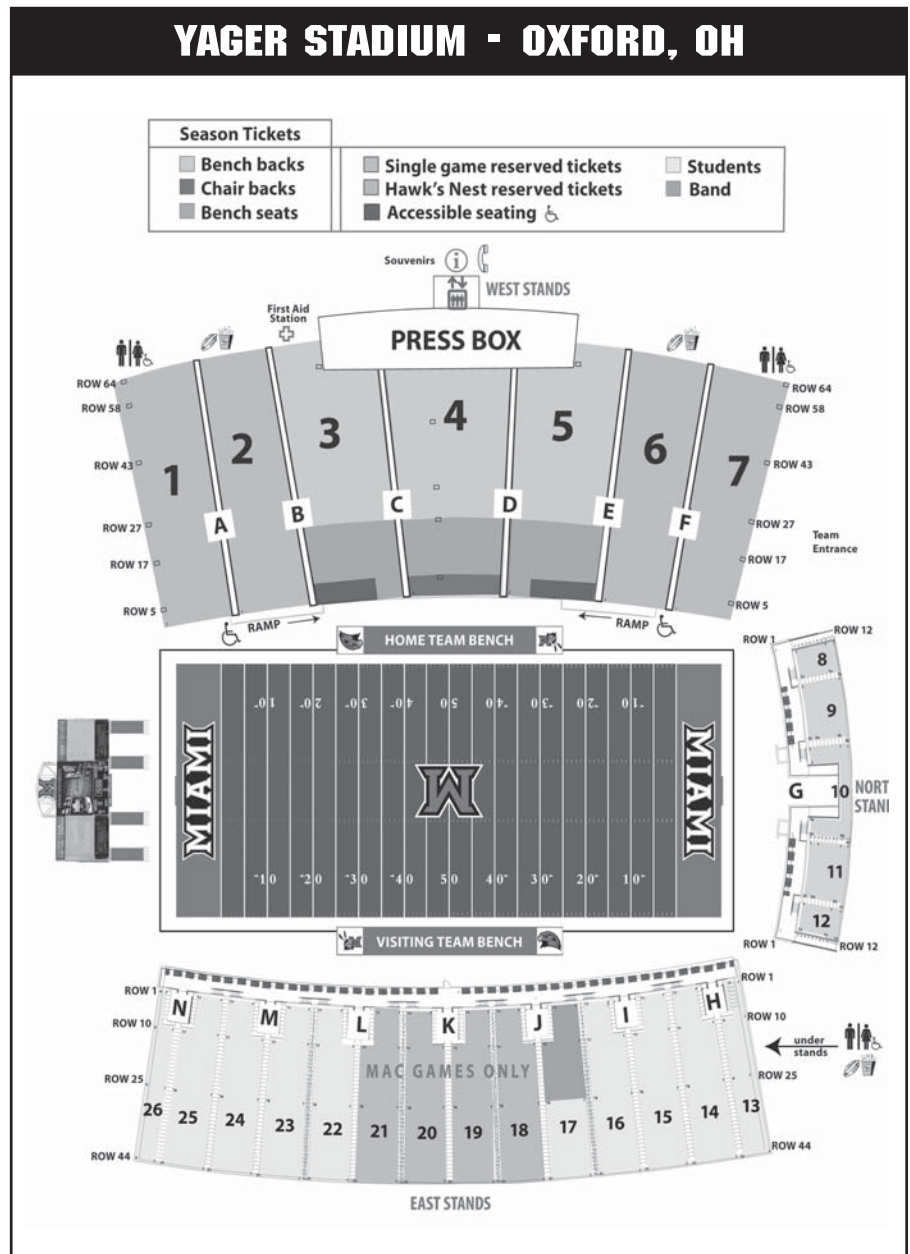

## The Mid-American Conference

From Super Bowl Champion quarterback Ben Roethlisberger (Miami University), to British Open winner Ben Curtis (Kent State University), to World Series winning manager Bob Brenly (Ohio University), to Olympic bobsled team member Brock Kreitzburg (University of Toledo) and beyond, the Mid-American Conference continues to excel in producing leaders in the world of athletics.

Providing leadership in education and in diversity, the Mid-American Conference moves into its 61st year of service to the student-athlete.

Since its inception in 1946, the Mid-American Conference has progressively grown and developed into one of the most aggressive Division I conferences in the country. Under the guidance of Commissioner Rick Chryst, the seventh commissioner in the history of the league, the MAC has responded to the ever changing landscape of membership issues and member standards in the fast-paced environment of collegiate athletics.

In May of 2007, three MAC institutions – the University of Akron, Ball State University and the University at Buffalo – were among the 10 NCAA Division I-A athletic departments recognized for excellence in the area of diversity. The achievements were honored by the Laboratory for Diversity in Sport at Texas A&M University.

In addition, Akron and Kent State were noted for Diversity Strategy; Akron and Toledo for African American Graduation: Female Student-Athletes; Ball State and Kent State for African American Graduation: Male Student-Athletes; Buffalo for Employee Diversity: Sex; and Ball State and Buffalo for Employee Diversity: Values and Attitudes.

In a report issued in September of 2006, the MAC had the highest percentage of public institutions with a Graduation Success Rate (GSR) of 70 percent or above (8 of 12 schools) and a GSR of 50 percent or more (12 of 12 schools). In football GSR, the MAC led all other I-A leagues as eight of the 12 schools topped the 70 percent or better rate. The MAC's total of eight at 70 percent-plus accounted for 32 percent of the 25 public institutions nationwide that posted 70 percent or better.

MAC football produced four bowl teams in 2006, the second most in league history in a single season. The 2007 gridiron season welcomes the addition of Temple University to the East Division.

MAC women's basketball produced two firsts in 2007. Bowling Green became the first MAC women's basketball team to advance as far as the Sweet 16 in the NCAA Tournament, and Northern Illinois' guard Stephanie Raymond became the first MAC player in the WNBA when she played for the Chicago Sky after being a second round draft selection.

Other recent noteworthy accomplishments include those of former Kent State President Dr. Carol Cartwright. She chaired the Executive Committee of the NCAA Board of Directors from 2002-2005 during a legislative process that keyed legislation relative to I-A status.

In addition, in an NCAA report released in October 2004, the MAC led the 11 I-A conferences in long-term graduation rates for football student-athletes at public institutions.

The conference holds over 20 national leadership positions on various NCAA committees and Division I Sport Committees and related governing groups. The committee members representing the MAC consist of coaches, athletic directors, and administration from many of the conference's schools.

### MAC Milestones

In March of 2006, Chryst and Cleveland Cavaliers President Len Komoroski announced that the Mid-American Conference Men's and Women's Basketball Tournaments will remain in Cleveland at Quicken Loans Arena through 2011. The MAC also announced a format change for both tournaments, bringing all 12 men's and women's teams to Cleveland beginning in 2007. The MAC also co-hosted the 2007 Women's Final Four at Quicken Loans Arena, after successfully hosting the 2006 NCAA Women's Basketball Regional at Quicken Loans Arena.

In 2006, Chryst announced a new, five-year relationship with International Sports Properties (ISP), Inc. to oversee and coordinate the league's marketing and sponsorship rights. ISP, which currently manages 29 college properties nationwide, is considered the leader in the collegiate sports marketing industry. The MAC is ISP's

first conference property.

ISP is responsible for managing and ultimately growing the MAC's stable of corporate partners, which currently stands at nine—FirstEnergy, Huntington Bank, Kraft, Marathon Oil, GMAC Financial Services, Aeropostale, Gatorade, Automart.com and Sirius satellite radio. FirstEnergy has been the title sponsor for the men's basketball tournament since its first year in Cleveland in March 2000. Kraft has been associated with the women's basketball tournament since 2001. Marathon Oil will be sponsoring the football championship for the third time in 2007.

### History of the MAC

Based in Cleveland since July 1999, following a 15-year stay in Toledo, Ohio, the MAC has established historic measurements in both football and men's and women's basketball since its move to Northeast Ohio.

The Mid-American Conference was founded as a five-school league on Feb. 24, 1946, in Columbus, Ohio, with Ohio, Butler, Cincinnati, Wayne State and Western Reserve admitted as charter members. The Mid-American Conference has 12 full-time schools and a 13th, Temple, for football only. Comprising the East Division are the University of Akron (joined in 1992), Bowling Green State University (1952), University at Buffalo (1998), Kent State University (1951), Miami University (1947) and Ohio University (1946). The West Division members are Ball State University (1973), Central Michigan University (1971), Eastern Michigan University (1971), Northern Illinois University (1975-86, 1997), University of Toledo (1950) and Western Michigan University (1947).

In 1946, men's basketball was the first competitive sport in the MAC, which now sponsors a total of 23 sports. Women's sports were brought into the conference's structure in 1980.

For men, championships (11) are sponsored in football, basketball, baseball, cross country, soccer, swimming and diving, indoor track and field, outdoor track and field, wrestling, golf and tennis.

For women, championships (12) are sponsored in basketball, softball, volleyball, cross country, field hockey, golf, soccer, swimming and diving, gymnastics, indoor track and field, outdoor track and tennis.



**The Motor City Bowl • Detroit, MI**  
**MAC vs. Big Ten • December 26, 2007**

Founded in 1997, the Motor City Bowl, played in Detroit, Mich., has been a proud partner of the Mid-American Conference since its inception.

The longest running bowl tie-in for the MAC, the Motor City Bowl pits the MAC versus the Big Ten in the heart of both league's territories. In 2002, with the MAC making an impressive resurgence on the college football scene, the Big Ten agreed to a deal that pits the No. 1 or No. 2 team from the MAC versus the Big Ten's No. 7 finisher—a significant move according to commissioner Rick Chryst.

"This is a tremendous development for the Mid-American Conference," said Chryst. "The opportunity to join with the premier conference in the country, in the heart of our geographies is a great thing."

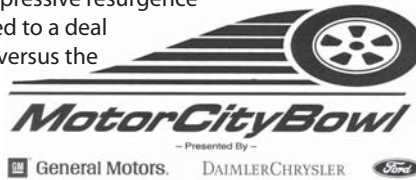
The 2007 Motor City Bowl, which will be the 11th edition of

the game, is scheduled to air on ESPN at 7:30 p.m. on Wednesday, Dec. 26. Last season, MAC champion Central Michigan defeated Middle Tennessee State, an at-large fill-in for the Big Ten, 31-14.

Since 1997, the MAC has posted a 6-4 record in the Motor City Bowl, but before this past year, the MAC had not won the bowl since a 28-24 Bowling Green defeat of Northwestern in 2003.

Activities during the week of the bowl game, which is located within one-day driving distance for most fans from both conferences, allow the competitors and fans alike to enjoy many of the highlights of downtown Detroit.

Also the home of the MAC Championship game, Ford Field, the home of the Motor City Bowl, is a state-of-the-art indoor facility that hosted Super Bowl XL in 2006 and is the home of the NFL's Detroit Lions.

**The GMAC Bowl • Mobile, AL**  
**MAC vs. Conference USA • January 6, 2008**

Entering its fourth season in 2002, the GMAC Bowl, played at Ladd-Peeble Stadium in Mobile, Ala., inked a deal with the Mid-American Conference that pits the first selection from the MAC against Conference USA's No. 2 team.

"We are very excited to enter into an agreement with the GMAC Bowl," MAC Commissioner Rick Chryst said. "It is especially gratifying that the MAC's second bowl affiliation be with a city like Mobile, where the civic leaders have accomplished so much in the bowl business."

The MAC has posted a remarkable run of success at the GMAC Bowl, where its teams have combined to win five of their six appearances, downing programs such as Memphis, Louisville and UTEP behind a list of eventual NFL quarterbacks

that includes Byron Leftwich, Ben Roethlisberger, Omar Jacobs and Bruce Gradkowski.

The 2008 GMAC Bowl is scheduled to air on ESPN at 8 p.m. on Sunday, Jan. 7. Last season's GMAC Bowl saw Southern Miss defeat MAC East champion Ohio, 28-7, ending the MAC's run of five straight wins in the bowl.

Activities during the week add to the festive atmosphere of the game itself, including a Mardi Gras Parade and Block Party that brings out much of the community.

Miami's lone appearance in the GMAC Bowl came during its magical 2003 season, when it downed Louisville, 49-28, behind an MVP performance from Roethlisberger.

Ladd-Peebles Stadium, which seats 40,646, also plays home to college football's prestigious Senior Bowl in late January.



**The International Bowl • Toronto, CAN**  
**MAC vs. Big East • January 5, 2008**

The NCAA announced approval in April of 2006 for the International Bowl, college football's newest bowl game, which is played at Rogers Centre, home of the CFL's Toronto Argonauts, in Toronto. The second game will be played on Jan. 5, 2008, and will match a team from the Big East Conference against an opponent from the Mid-American Conference.

"This is the only college bowl game played outside of the US," said Ken Hoffman, Executive Director for the game. "It is an exciting opportunity for the City of Toronto and two football teams that will have an international experience."

The International Bowl is the first college bowl outside the United States since the Bacardi Bowl was played in Cuba in 1937. The game will be played on Saturday, Jan. 5, 2008, with a

noon kickoff time and will air on ESPN2 in the U.S. and TSN in Canada. The Big East won the inaugural International Bowl with Cincinnati defeating Western Michigan, 27-24, in an exciting game.

Bob Gennarelli, Associate Commissioner for the Mid-American Conference said, "Toronto is a world class destination city within a one-day drive for all of our fans. We are projecting fan travel at record levels."

ESPN television has partnered with the organizers in a multi-year year agreement to broadcast the game in the U.S. and Canada as well as provide assistance with marketing and sponsorship sales.

"We look forward to taking this project to the market place and expect the uniqueness of the event to generate significant interest," said Dan Shumaker, Director of Collegiate Development, ESPN Television.
