Season Outlook

THE OFFENSE

A Look Back: After ranking among the nation's top 25 in total offense for five straight seasons under head coach and offensive coordinator **Shane Montgomery**, an injury-plagued unit struggled to establish the run and protect the passer in 2006.

Strengths: The RedHawks return eight starters, including a second-year starter in junior quarterback **Mike Kokal**, who ranked second in the MAC in passing last season ... the offensive line returns six players with starting experience and is expected to possess the depth it lacked in 2006 ... former 1,000-yard rusher Brandon Murphy returns after being limited by injuries in 2006 and leads a deep running back corps.

Question Marks: Injuries played a prominent role in the spring season as three potential offensive starters were unavailable for the spring season while recovering from injuries ... the RedHawks must hope an inexperienced receiving corps can come of age quickly as they seek to overcome the loss of six receivers from last season's squad, including the program's all-time leading receiver, **Ryne Robinson**.

QUARTERBACK

The Scoop: Senior quarterback **Mike Kokal** returns as Miami's starting signal caller with a year of experience under his belt and a better grasp of the offense. He will be supported by sophomore **Daniel Raudabaugh** and incoming freshman **Clay Belton**.

The Players:

Mike Kokal: A mobile, strong-armed quarterback who ranked among the nation's Top 20 in total offense in 2006 ... third on the team in rushing with 277 net yards despite being sacked more than 40 times ... totaled 14 touchdown passes on the year and passed for a career-best 355 yards in overtime loss at Purdue.

Daniel Raudabaugh: Backed up Mike Kokal in 2006 and was a game-time starter in a loss at Cincinnati, totaling 190 yards passing and two interceptions... saw action in four games on the year.

Clay Belton: True freshman who joined the team in the fall ... ranked among the top 30 quarterback recruits nationally by ESPN.com ... the 6-5 left-hander passed for 2,700 yards and 40 TDs as a junior but was limited by an injury as a senior.

RUNNING BACK

The Scoop: Miami struggled to gain just 86.7 rushing yards per game in 2006, and topped 100 yards rushing just three times on the year ... a trio of backs split the load while returning starter **Brandon Murphy** missed four games with injury and was limited all season ... arguably Miami's deepest position when healthy.

The Players:

Brandon Murphy: A second-team all-MAC pick and 1,000-yard rusher in 2005 who was limited to just 81 carries for 280 yards and one touchdown last season ... missed four games and had fewer than eight carries in two others due to a persistent ankle injury ... averaged just 3.5 yards per carry after posting 4.7 ypc in 2005.

Andre Bratton: Led Miami in rushing as a redshirt freshman, totaling 285 yards and four touchdowns and averaging a team-best 4.5 yards per carry ... started two games ... also led Miami's RBs with 14 receptions.

Austin Sykes: Big back who saw the first action of his career as a junior in 2006 ... totaled 204 yards rushing and three touchdowns, including two scores in a win at Buffalo ... started in overtime loss at Purdue.

Cory Jones, Jamel Miller, Thomas Merriweather:

Jones missed the 2006 season with injuries and is looking to find a role ... Miller is a redshirt freshman who caught attention as a scout team performer last season ... Merriweather will join the team in the fall after being ranked the top senior running back in the St. Louis area as a prep senior.

WIDE RECEIVER

The Scoop: A crowded position in 2006, Miami must replace the loss of six wide receivers, including the program's all-time leading receiver **Ryne Robinson** ... the RedHawks return only two receivers with a collegiate reception and must overcome inexperience.



Dustin Woods

The Players:

Dustin Woods: Broke out as a redshirt freshman, totaling 25 catches for 506 yards and a gaudy average of 20.2 yards per catch ... deep threat with blazing speed, who made all four of his TD catches from outside of 25 yards ... missed the spring while recovering from injury.

Sean McVay: Possession receiver with impressive short-area quickness who made 20 catches for 298 yards in his first full season ... slated as the starter at Miami's interior receiving spot.

Pat LaMonica: Junior walk-on who is contending for a spot on the two-deep as a receiver ... made his collegiate debut in 2006, playing primarily on special teams.

Jared Elliott: Former quarterback will see regular duty as receiver.

Eugene Harris, Armand Robinson, Donovan Potter: Trio of redshirt freshman who will be counted on to make an impact ... Harris and Robinson are expected to contend for starting roles at the outside spots.

Brayden Coombs: Could break in as special teams player.

Mitchell Anderson: Redshirt freshman who will provide depth.

Chris Givens and Jamal Rogers: Promising pair of true freshman receivers who will get a look in the fall from the coaching staff and could contribute in 2007.

Fitz Bobo: True freshman will redshirt with an injury.

TIGHT ENDS

The Scoop: Return three junior letterwinners from last season, including starter **Tom Crabtree** ... also bolstered by the addition of a pair of talented freshmen ... could take on an expanded role in the passing game due to the team's inexperience at wide receiver.

The Players:

Tom Crabtree: Returning starter who made 14 catches for 124 yards and a touchdown last season ... big, athletic tight end who can make plays in the passing game and has worked hard to become a more complete player.

Jake O'Connell: Converted wide receiver who emerged as a redzone threat in 2006 ... hauled in seven passes on the year, including touchdown grabs at Purdue and at Buffalo ... has made big

strides in the weightroom.

Pat Shepard: Played primarily on special teams in 2006, making one catch for 11 yards.

Nick Mahon: Saw limited action at fullback a year ago, but was switched to tight end this fall.

Kendrick Bruton, Rob Reiland: True freshmen tight ends who could get a look in the fall, but might redshirt ... both were ranked among ESPN.com's Top 65 recruits at tight end.

OFFENSIVE LINE:

The Scoop: An inexperienced offensive front that was lacking depth was decimated by season-ending injuries to two starters, giving up 49 sacks and struggling to create a push in the ground game in 2006 ... forced to use six different starting combinations last season due to injury and looking to feature a consistent group up front this season ... injured starters **Charlie Norden** and **Matt McKeown** returned for fall camp ... the additions of two redshirt freshmen and a Division I transfer should bolster a unit that returns seven players with starting experience.



Season Outlook

The Players:

Charlie Norden: Fourth-year starter who is expected to hold down the all-important left tackle position after returning from a foot injury that ended his 2006 season ... started only four games in '06 and never played a complete game before being ruled out for the year ... an all-MAC candidate entering last season.

Steve Meister: Third-year starter and fourth-year contributor who moved from left guard to center for the upcoming season ... one of only two offensive linemen to start all 11 games in 2006 ... the most fundamentally talented player among Miami's linemen.

Dave DiFranco: Second-year starter who moved from tackle to guard after starting 11 games at right and left tackle last year ... converted tight end who combines size and athleticism.

Matt McKeown: Entered 2006 as a first-year starter at right guard but was plagued by injuries and missed the last four games of the year.

Steve Sutter: Converted defensive end who was forced into a starting role by injuries last season ... undersized but athletic tackle who played in all 11 games while making seven starts at right tackle ... enters preseason camp as Miami's starting right tackle.

Pete Walters, Josh Satterthwait, Kyle Lovas: Trio of returning players who all contributed in 2006 ... Walters and Satterthwait both made starts, with Satterthwait finishing the season by starting Miami's final three games at right guard ... Lovas is the back-up at center ... all three are expected to contribute in reserve roles and challenge for time.

Zachary Marshall: Athletic and promising big man who sat out last season after transferring from Maryland ... a state wrestling champion in high school who is expected to challenge for a starting role at right tackle ... has three remaining years of eligibility.

Bob Gulley, Nate Williams: Redshirt freshmen who are expected to contend for roles on the two-deep during the spring ... Gulley is slated as the backup at left guard, while Williams is contending for a role at tackle.

Brandon Brooks, Mike Madsen, Kevin Koncelik, Ken Staudinger: Cast of four highly touted true freshmen who could get a look in the fall but will likely redshirt unless injuries affect depth.

THE DEFENSE

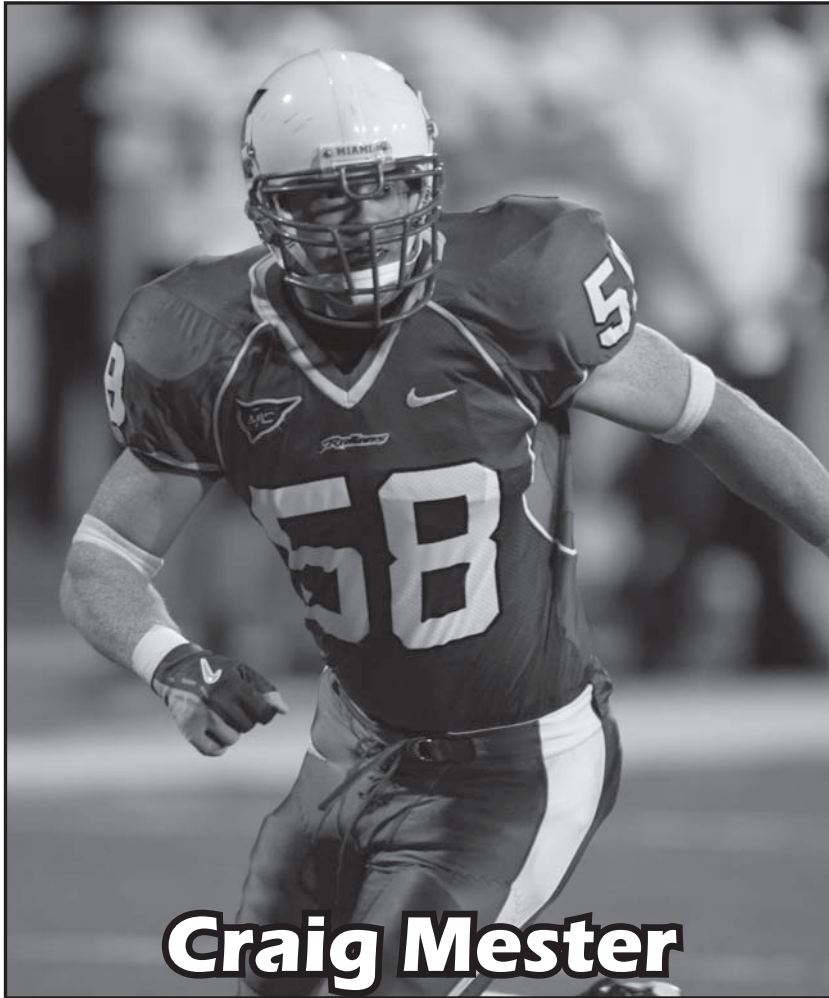
A Look Back: An inexperienced unit with just two returning starters and little depth, due to injuries, put forth a solid effort in 2006, allowing 331.8 yards of total offense per game and forcing 2.0 turnovers per game. The RedHawks had a down year against the run, allowing 173.4 yards per game on the ground.

Strengths: Miami's defense will benefit from improved depth as a handful of players injured in 2006 return to the field and a promising cast of redshirt and true freshmen compete to fill in the two-deep ... linebackers **Joey Hudson** and **Clayton Mullins** return after ranking first and second, respectively, in tackles in 2006.

Question Marks: The defensive front must replace three starters from last season's squad and features two first-time starters ... safety **Joey Card**, a first-team all-MAC pick and the leader of the unit in 2006, was lost to graduation.

DEFENSIVE TACKLES:

The Scoop: Three of the four defensive tackles who started the 2006 season on Miami's two-deep have been lost to graduation or injury, including starters **Seth Painter** and **Otto Linwood**. Junior **Ben Huddle**, and true sophomores **Mark Paun** and **Martin Channels** provide the only returning experience at the position and will be joined by a host of newcomers.



Craig Mester

The Players:

Ben Huddle: Former defensive end who saw his first action as a defensive tackle last season ... athletic presence with the ability to rush the passer or hold up at the point of attack ... missed four games after suffering an injury at Purdue but played in the last six games ... expected to start at defensive tackle.

Mark Paun: Played as a true freshman after teammate Kevin Samy suffered a career-ending injury in the first game of the season ... played in 10 games and was in on three hits for loss ... slated as Miami's starting nose guard entering the spring season.

Nick DeBartolo: Two-time letterwinner who moves from fullback to defensive line.

Martin Channels: Big body who saw limited action as a true freshman on the defensive front, contributing in four games ... expected to contend for time at defensive tackle behind Huddle.

Sean Redwine and Alex Stewart: Redshirt freshmen who could both contend for depth roles on the defensive front ... Stewart is slated as the back-up nose guard after spending last season on the scout team ...

Redwine is a strong, athletic individual making the move from tight end due to depth concerns.

Jordain Brown: True freshman who will get a long look when he arrives on campus in the fall powerful player with good quickness and explosiveness.

DEFENSIVE ENDS:

The Scoop: Defensive end is expected to be a strength of Miami's defense, with a strong four-player rotation leading the way. Miami returns two of its three ends with starting experience, including senior **Craig Mester** and junior **Joe Coniglio**. The unit will look to increase pressure on the quarterback this season after tallying just 13.5 combined sacks in 2006.

The Players:

Craig Mester: An athletic third-year starter with 12.0 career quarterback sacks ... started seven games in 2007 as part of a five-player rotation at defensive end ... a veteran leader of the defensive front.

Joe Coniglio: Athletic, strong defensive end who moved from linebacker to end prior to the 2005 season ... started nine games during 2006 and is the top returning defensive lineman in

tackles (28), and sacks (5.0).

Travis Craven: Broke out as a redshirt freshman after recovering from some early injury issues ... played in the final 10 games of the season and led Miami's defensive front with 8.5 tackles for loss, including 3.0 sacks ... projected as a starting defensive end heading into fall camp.

Jordan Stevens: High-motor redshirt freshman who could have contributed as a true freshman but was redshirted due to injury ... ranked as the No. 34 defensive end prospect nationally coming out of high school.

D.J. Svabik: Redshirt freshman who has been plagued by injuries ... has a good frame and potential.

Morris Council and Alex Kajmowicz: True freshmen who could contend for playing time with strong fall camps.



Season Outlook

LINEBACKER:

The Scoop: A year after replacing five of the six players off its two-deep, Miami's linebacking corps will benefit from more experience and dramatically improved depth in 2007. Juniors **Joey Hudson** and **Clayton Mullins** were the team's top two tacklers in 2006 and are poised to build on last year's foundation. A crop of talented individuals from the last two recruiting classes will help fill in the two-deep.

The Players:

Joey Hudson: Miami's only returning 2006 all-MAC pick, earning second-team honors at middle linebacker ... returning leader in tackles (97) and interceptions (5) ... tied for second nationally among linebackers in interceptions ... was unavailable in the spring while recovering from offseason surgery.

Clayton Mullins: Returning starter at outside linebacker who came on strong at the end and finished second on the team with 91 tackles ... totaled at least seven tackles in each of his final six games, including two 10-tackle outings ... coming off a strong offseason in which he added mass and made strides in strength and speed.

Caleb Bostic: True sophomore who saw action in 11 games on special teams and as a depth player in 2006 ... expected to take over as the starter at Miami's open outside linebacker spot in 2007 ... impressive specimen with an ideal combination of size and speed.

Chris Shula: Versatile, intelligent individual who saw action in all 12 games last season as a special teams contributor and Miami's top reserve linebacker ... tabbed as a back up on Miami's two deep for both **Caleb Bostic** and **Clayton Mullins**.

Mickey Mann: Lettered as special teams player, but has good chance to play at "Sam" linebacker.

Rion Robinson: Redshirt sophomore who might be a special teams player.

Dexter Korto: Athletic redshirt freshman who is slated to be reserve outside linebacker spot ... expected to be key contributor on special teams.

David Britt: Colorado sophomore will compete for back-up duty.

Michael Baker, David Davis, Alex Kaufman, Ryan Kennedy and Jerrell Wedge: Talented true freshmen who will be given an opportunity to play in reserve roles.

SAFETY:

The Scoop: Despite the graduation of two-time all-MAC safety **Joey Card**, the position remains one of the strongest and deepest on the team. Junior **Robbie Wilson** is a returning starter and is joined by true sophomore **Jordan Gafford**, who made extensive contributions in 2006.

The Players:

Robbie Wilson: Ranks third among returning players in tackles from 2006 with 59, including 37 solo hits and two forced fumbles ... possesses an ideal combination of size and speed ... starter at strong safety ... a defensive leader.

Jordan Gafford: True sophomore who was an important contributor on special teams and as a depth player in 2006 ... slated to replace Joey Card as Miami's starting free safety ... has impressive football smarts and instincts.

Jason Gibson and Ben Bennett: Both slated as the top reserves at strong safety ... Gibson is a sophomore who saw time primarily on special teams last season ... Bennett is a redshirt freshman who had a solid spring season.

Brian Palascak: Physical player who could be special teams member.

Peris Edwards: Promising redshirt freshman who will contend for a reserve role and potentially contribute on special teams.

Josh Krauth: Redshirt freshman walk-on who will back-up the regulars.

DeAndre Gilmore and Anthony Kokal: True freshmen who figure in future plans.

CORNERBACKS:

The Scoop: Cornerback is another strong group with impressive depth despite the graduation of a starter. The group will be led by returning starter senior **Jerrid Gaines**, but should be extremely competitive with several strong contenders.

The Players:

Jerrid Gaines: Remarkable athlete with dangerous speed who was identified as Miami's shut-down cornerback last season ... totaled 49 tackles and made two interceptions while starting 11 games last season.

Wendell Brunson: Sophomore who made strides as a redshirt freshman, including regular appearances on the field and one start at cornerback ... competing for the starting cornerback opposite of Gaines ... good athlete.

Jeff Thompson: Sophomore who is tabbed as a top reserve at the cornerback spot ... served as a nickel back at times during 2006 ... coaches have been impressed with his work ethic and foot speed.

Bryan Roland: Junior cornerback attempting to come back from a season-ending knee injury ... entered 2006 as a potential starter after playing extensively as a redshirt freshman ... good technician.

Tersee Nande: Senior who hopes to see time with special teams.

Brandon Stephens: True freshman who signed with the program last year, but made his debut this spring.

Cornelius Ward and Jonathan Wells: True freshmen who make their RedHawk debuts this fall.

THE SPECIALISTS

The Scoop: Miami returns almost all of the key specialists from 2006 but must replace four-year longsnapper **Dave McClain**. Punter **Jake Richardson** is a third-year starter and true sophomore kicker **Trevor Cook** converted 10-of-13 attempts last season.

The Players:

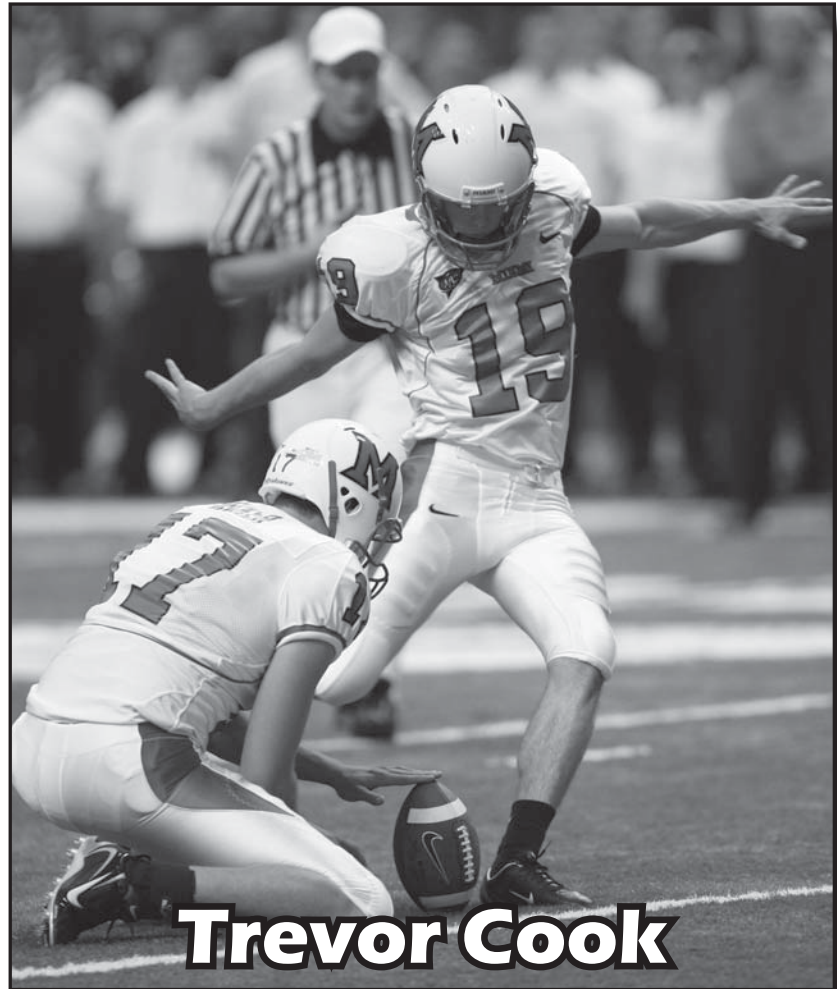
Jake Richardson: A third-year starter at punter who continues to realize his potential with each season ... upped his average to 41.1 yards per punt and pinned the opposition inside the 20 12 times in 2006 ... backed up by sophomore **Chris DiCesare**.

Trevor Cook: True sophomore with a big leg who connected on 10-of-13 field goals after winning the starting job five games into 2006 ... connected on a 49-yard effort in his first attempt and has range from outside of 50 yards.

Nathan Parseghian: Junior who started the 2006 season as Miami's starting placekicker before being replaced by Cook ... supplanted Cook as Miami's leg of choice on kickoffs later in the season.

Kyle Decker: Walk-on quarterback who is a third-year starter at holder for the RedHawks ... Sean McVay looks to back up Decker at the holder position.

Chase Collins and Adam Rummler: Contenders for Miami's longsnapper position ... Rummler emerged from the spring as Miami's potential starter at the position ... Collins is a third-year veteran of the program who has seen limited game action.



Punt Returner: Miami must replace one of the nation's top punt returners in Miami and MAC record holder and NFL fourth-round draft pick Ryne Robinson ... redshirt freshman wide receiver **Eugene Harris** and redshirt freshman defensive back **Brandon Stephens** have emerged as the top candidates at the position.

Kick Returners: Miami returns a trio of individuals who returned kicks last season, including wide receivers **Dustin Woods** and **Sean McVay** and running back **Andre Bratton** ... **Robbie Wilson** also looks to factor into the mix.
