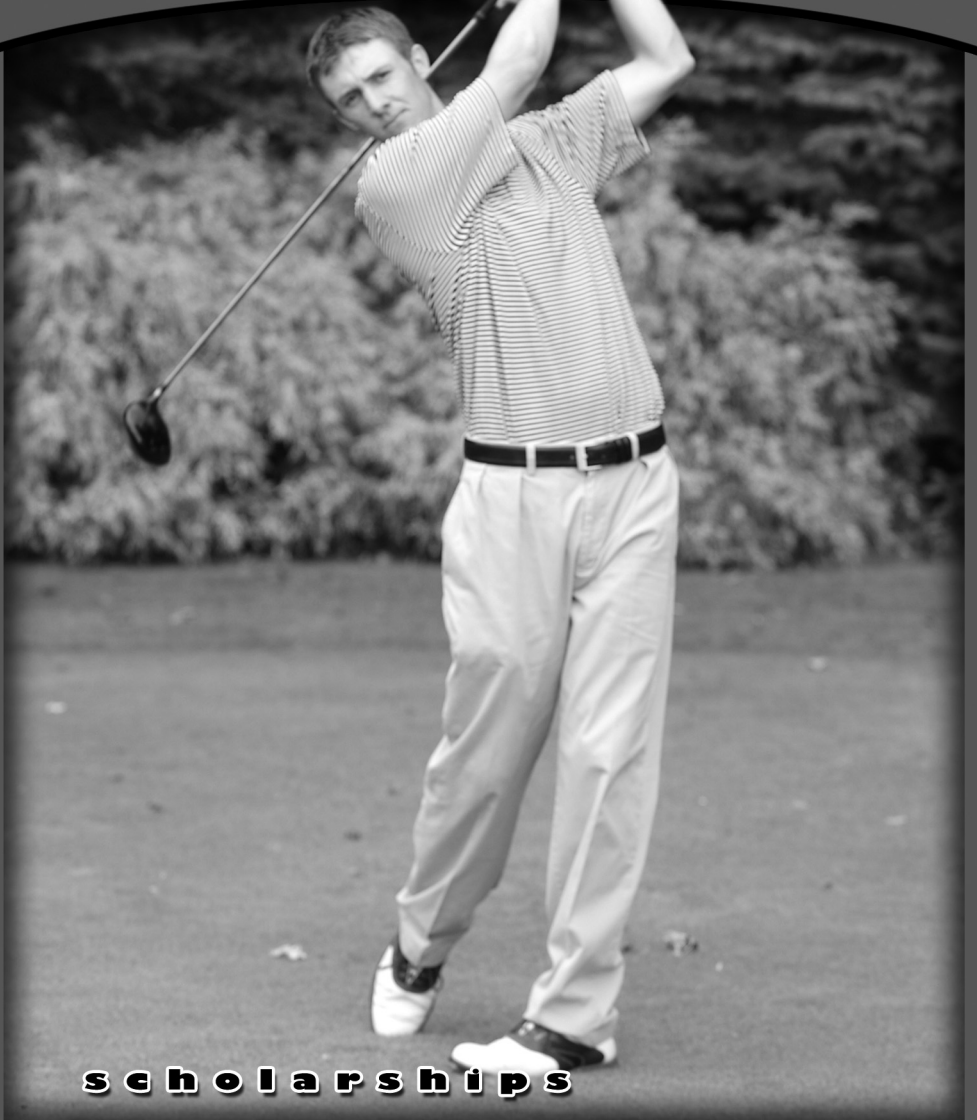

THE RED AND WHITE CLUB

One of the best ways to get involved with Miami University is through its athletics programs. The Red and White Club is a 1,500 member organization that provides athletic aid to deserving student-athletes. Gifts to the golf program through the Red and White Club help provide operational funds and scholarship dollars for the program. Interest from endowments assist varsity golfers in financing their education (scholarships or grant-in-aid) while participating in the Miami golf program.

BILL AND JILL PHIPPS GOLF SCHOLARSHIP

Miami alumni Bill ('72) and Jill ('74) Phipps announced a new fundraising initiative in September 2002. They have committed to contribute \$25,000 per year for five years to establish a golf scholarship. The program is structured as a challenge, inviting golf alumni, Miami alumni and friends of the program to make annual gifts that combine to match their \$25,000 contribution. In five years, the result—\$250,000—will be a completely endowed scholarship.

BYRON NELSON GOLF SCHOLARSHIP

The Byron Nelson Golf Scholarship Fund was established at Miami University in August 1969. The idea was conceived by H. Franklin Waltz of Toledo, a close personal friend of Mr. Nelson, and Coach Rodger Cromer. The purpose of the award is to honor and recognize Mr. Nelson, one of the greatest golfers of all time, and financially assist a promising young golfer in furthering his education. Mr. Nelson presented the first award in person to Mike Strathman in 1969.

MARTIN AND NANCY GMEINER GOLF SCHOLARSHIP

The Martin and Nancy Gmeiner Golf Scholarship Fund was established in August 1993. Marty, a 1963 graduate of Miami, was an active participant in the Miami golf program. Their oldest daughter, Kim, is a 1996 graduate of Miami. The first recipient of the award was Mitch Mahoney.

MAX JELLINEK FAMILY GOLF SCHOLARSHIP

One of the many named scholarships in the Miami University-Alumni Scholarship Program, this scholarship was established by Mr. and Mrs. Frank Jellinek, who's son, Max, was a member of the Miami golf team. This scholarship is awarded to a Miami University varsity golfer nominated by the golf coach.

HOLDEN AND CAROLINE PAINTER WILSON SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 1975 by Mr. and Mrs. Holden Wilson, Jr., this scholarship is annually awarded to a varsity golfer. The late Holden Wilson, Class of 1952, was an outstanding member of the golf team while at Miami. Caroline Painter Wilson was his mother.

WAYNE L. LISTERMAN MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

This scholarship was established by the family and friends of the late Wayne L. Listerman. This scholarship is awarded annually to a varsity golfer. His son, Dr. Randall Listerman, was a member of the Miami faculty.

PAUL AND MARY BROWN GOLF SCHOLARSHIP

This scholarship was established at Miami University as a memorial to Paul E. Brown. Mr. Brown, a 1930 graduate, was a former Miami football player and served on Miami's Board of Trustee from 1969-1978. Brown coached at Ohio State (1941-43), the Cleveland Browns (1946-62) and the Cincinnati Bengals (1968-75) where he was the team owner and general manager until 1991. In 1998, Mrs. Mary T. Brown designated this fund to be used to enhance and preserve the golf program.

JACK FLETCHER GOLF SCHOLARSHIP

In May of 2003, Jack Fletcher, a 1941 Miami alumnus and retired attorney (Griffin-Fletcher, LLP) established the Jack Fletcher Scholarship. Fletcher's sons—Geoffrey and Michael—also are Miami graduates.
