Head Coach

Entering his 13th season at helm of the Miami University men's cross country and track and field programs, head coach **Warren Mandrell** continues to lead a pair of teams that have been a model of consistency. Mandrell's cross country teams have not finished lower than fourth in the Mid-American Conference since 1996, winning a pair conference titles in 1997 and 1998, and his track and field squads have produced 12 MAC gold medalists, including seven conference titlists in the past three seasons.

With the Miami cross country squad, Mandrell has produced three All-Americans in the past three seasons, with David Mitchell taking home All-America honors in 2004 and Dan Huling and Chris Swisher both earning All-America plaudits in 2005. Mitchell was one of the most decorated runners during Mandrell's tenure as a two-time MAC runner-up and national qualifier in 2003 and 2004. Huling, meanwhile, became the first Miamian under Mandrell to take home the conference's individual title in 2005. He also placed 26th at the 2005 NCAA Championship, the highest finish for a Red-Hawk at the national meet since Bob Reef finished 17th in 1972.

In the last decade under Mandrell, the RedHawks have won a pair of MAC Cross Country Championships and posted five runner-up finishes, two third-place finishes and a fourth-place showing. Prior to finishing fourth at the MAC meet in 2006, Miami finished as the conference runner-up for the second straight season in 2005, as Huling and Swisher placed first and third, respectively. Miami also placed 10th in the notoriously tough Great Lakes Region.

The 2004 season saw Mandrell lead the RedHawks to a second-place finish in the MAC—the team's highest finish since 2001—and a ninth-place finish at the Great Lakes Regional, one spot short of a national bid. Three of Mandrell's runners were all-MAC first-team selections, and Mitchell earned an invitation to the NCAA Championship after a 12th-place regional finish.

Mandrell's squad reached new heights in 2003 when the RedHawks qualified as a team for the NCAA Cross Country Championship. After taking third at the MAC Championship and entering the meet ranked No. 25 in the nation, Miami finished as the top MAC school at the national meet, taking 14th, its highest final national ranking since 1997.

From 1999-2002, Miami posted three runner-up finishes and one third-place finish at the conference meet. In 1998, Mandrell was honored as the Ohio Cross Country Coach of the Year after guiding the RedHawks to their second consecutive MAC Championship and a berth in the NCAA Championship. Mandrell earned MAC Coach of the Year honors in 1997 when his RedHawks ended their 12-year MAC Championship drought and finished the season ranked in the nation's top 25. Miami climbed as high as 11th in the 1997 polls.

As the head of the Miami track and field team, Mandrell mentored Huling, who turned in one of the most impressive individual seasons in 2006. Huling won the 5,000 meters, 10,000 meters and 3,000-meter steeplechase at the MAC Championships, becoming the first athlete in program history to win three individual confer-

ence titles at the same meet, and he was named the meet's Most Outstanding Performer. Huling then went on to place sixth in the 5,000 meters at the NCAA Championship, earning All-America honors and becoming the first athlete since the 1944-45 seasons to be named a dual All-American in both cross country and track and field.

During the 2005 season, both Jake Dunkleberger and Huling won MAC titles. For the second year in row, Dunkleberger captured the conference hammer title and went on to become an All-American at the NCAA Championships. Huling was the MAC Champion in the 5,000 meters and set a Miami record in the 3,000-meter steeplechase at the Mideast Regional. Five other athletes also have won conference titles during Mandrell's tenure, including Bryan Hawkins (1996, 1997), Fitz Read (1999), Chris Swank (1999), Nick Somerville (2001) and Erik Reynolds (2004).

Mandrell's student-athletes also have achieved success in the classroom. Since Mandrell's arrival in 1994, Miami has produced 88 academic all-MAC and MAC Honor Roll selections, including 20 athletes in 2005. Last season, the RedHawks also were honored by the National Collegiate Division I Track Coaches Association for having the 16th-highest team grade-point average in the nation (3.02). Two student-athletes—Swisher and Pat Sovacoool—who both qualified for the NCAA MidEast Regional in the 1,500 meters, were honored individually as all-academic selections.

Prior to taking over at Miami, Mandrell spent 12 years as the top assistant coach for the men's and women's cross country and track and field teams at Northern Arizona University. He was a part of the school's five men's and six women's Big Sky Conference Championships in cross country, as well as the 14 men's and six women's indoor and outdoor league titles.

With Mandrell as an assistant, NAU's men's cross country squad finished in the top 20 at the NCAA Championships six times between 1984 and 1991, including a second-place finish in 1988, and the women's program finished in the top 20 every year from 1986 to 1992. He coached seven men's and seven women's All-Americans while at NAU.

Outside of coaching, Mandrell served more than 20 years as an Army officer in both active duty and reserve forces. He is a graduate of the U.S. Army Command and General Staff College. Mandrell commanded a basic training company on active duty, and he also served as the Director of Plans and Operations for the Arizona National Guard Navajo Army Depot.

Born in Lincoln, Ill., Mandrell graduated with honors from Michigan Technological University in 1978 and was Most Valuable Performer of the Michigan Tech cross country team in 1974. Mandrell also competed in track and field and cross country skiing as a student-athlete. He earned his master's degree in physical education from Northern Arizona in 1984.

Mandrell, who is a lieutenant colonel in the Army National Guard, resides in Oxford, Ohio, with his wife, Peggy, and children, Heather (17), Nathan (12) and Adam (8).

Chad Reynolds

Years at Miami: Sixth Season
Alma Mater: Miami University '99
Events: Hurdles/Sprints

Assistant Coach

Chad Reynolds enters his ninth season at the college level and his fourth since returning to Oxford as an assistant coach. Reynolds previously served a student assistant at Miami from 1997-99 and was a graduate assistant at Ohio University from 2000-01. He works primarily with the Red and White's hurdlers and sprinters.

Helping Miami to a fifth-place finish at last season's Mid-American Conference Championships, four of Reynolds' athletes scored at the conference meet, two each in the sprints and hurdles. In the sprints, Heinz Von Eckartsberg was Reynolds' top athlete, placing fourth in the 400 meters, while Michael Watts scored with a sixth-place finish in the 200 meters. Eric Bowman and Bobby Houston also placed among the top eight in their respective hurdle events, with Bowman placing seventh in the 110-meter hurdles and Houston finishing eighth in the 400-meter hurdles.

During the 2004-05 season, Chris Corgiat (400 meters) and Houston (400-meter hurdles) both scored at the conference meet, with Houston narrowly missing all-conference honors as he posted a third-place finish. Houston's 400-meter hurdle time (52.40), which ranks sixth all-time at Miami, also qualified him for the NCAA Mid-east Regional. He was one of five RedHawks to earn an invitation to the regional meet. In addition to his individual point scorers, Reynolds' 4x100 relay and 4x400 relay teams scored at the 2005 MAC Championships and helped Miami post a fourth-place team finish.

Reynolds' first season as Miami's full-time assistant was highlighted by Houston's fourth-place finish at the MAC Championships in the 400-meter hurdles and the 4x400 relay team's third-place showing.


Prior to Miami, Reynolds assisted both the men's and women's programs at Ohio. On the men's side, he guided the sprinters and jumpers, and in MAC Championships, the sprinting and jumping events were responsible for almost 70 percent of the team's total points. The Bobcats also produced three MAC Champions, including one NCAA qualifier in the long jump, under Reynolds' watch.

While an undergraduate at Miami, Reynolds served as team manager for the RedHawk cross country team during his freshman and sophomore years. He was named student assistant for his final two years – 1997 and 1998 – when Miami won back-to-back MAC titles. The 1997 MAC Cross Country Championship was Miami's first championship team in 12 seasons, while the 1998 squad qualified for the NCAA Championship.

A Findlay, Ohio, native, Reynolds attended Culver Military Academy in Culver, Ind., where he played basketball and football and earned four letters in track.

Reynolds graduated from Miami in 1999 and went on to earn his master's degree in curriculum and instruction from Ohio in 2003.

Reynolds resides with his wife, Virginia, in Oxford. The couple has a seven-month-old daughter, Contessa.

Former RedHawk standout **Ceith Creekmur** enters his first season as an assistant coach at Miami after wrapping up his four-year career in Oxford. An all-Mid-American Conference decathlete who scored at the conference meet in three of his four seasons, Creekmur handles the throws, pole vault and multi-events for the Red and White.

"We are very pleased that Ceith is continuing his involvement with Miami's track and field program," head coach **Warren Mandrell** said. "He was a great competitor and leader as a member of the team, and he has a strong commitment to the University."

Creekmur is in his first season as a coach at the collegiate level but is familiar with both the Miami track and field program and the MAC. A four-year letterwinner with the RedHawks (2003-06), Creekmur finished in the top eight in the decathlon in each of his final three seasons, including a runner-up finish as a junior. A second-team all-MAC honoree in 2005, Creekmur also earned MAC Track Athlete of the Week honors on March 22, 2005, after winning the decathlon at the Florida State Invitational.

In his final season in Oxford, Creekmur put the finishing touches on an impressive college career, turning in an eighth-place heptathlon finish at the U.S. Indoor Nationals and a fourth-place decathlon finish at the MAC Championships. In addition, Creekmur registered the seventh-best decathlon score in program history at the SeaRay Relays, tallying 6,899 points. Creekmur also left Miami as the school record holder in the heptathlon with 5,399 points.

A Certified Strength and Conditioning Specialist All-America honoree as a senior, Creekmur graduated from Miami in May 2006 with a bachelor's degree in exercise science. He is currently enrolled in the master's program at Miami in exercise science. Creekmur also has earned his Level I certification in the USA Track and Field coaching program.

Added Mandrell, "Ceith's experiences and detailed knowledge of Miami will be a great asset in recruiting and advising current athletes. He knows his way around the MAC and knows what it takes to be successful in the conference."

Creekmur replaces former assistant coach Grant Wall, who was hired this summer as an assistant coach with the Columbia University men's and women's combined track and field program.

ACADEMIC SERVICES

Miami's athletic department strongly emphasizes that its student-athletes succeed not only in their athletic pursuits but also in their academic endeavors. Realizing the unique demands placed on the student-athlete, Miami feels a responsibility to provide the best possible academic support.

Miami's Comprehensive Academic Support Program began during the 1987-88 academic year. The program's main focus is to monitor and track student-athlete's progress toward graduation while staying in compliance with Miami University, Mid-American Conference, U.S. Figure Skating Association, Central Collegiate Hockey Association and NCAA guidelines.

The Academic Support Program is comprised of three full-time academic coordinators, including Cindy Veraldo, Lindsay Fenton and Ryan Miller. Miller, in his first year as an academic coordinator, works directly with the men's track and field team.

The coordinators have the responsibility of implementing and coordinating all aspects of the academic support program for both the men's and women's varsity teams. Other responsibilities include meeting with potential student-athletes on recruiting trips, working in conjunction with the Rinella Learning Center to provide for student-athletes with special needs and serving as a referral source for the various offices around campus including the Student Counseling Center and the Office of Career Services.

The offices of the academic coordinators are located in the Walter L. Gross Jr. Family Student Athlete Development Center. The coordinators have the responsibility of implementing and coordinating all aspects of the academic support program for both the men's and women's varsity teams.

STRENGTH AND CONDITIONING

In today's highly-competitive world of intercollegiate athletics, the guidance and training a student-athlete receives in their strength and conditioning program is every bit as important as the direction they receive on the field. At Miami University, the strength and conditioning program is a source of pride and tradition.

Heading Miami's strength and conditioning program is James Carsey, who enters his sixth season at Miami and second year as head strength and conditioning coach. A former football standout at Ashland University, Carsey understands the direct link between success in the weightroom and success on the field.

"While the coaching staff is able to provide more direction during the season, it is limited by NCAA regulations as to how much time it can spend with the team at other times of the year," Carsey said. "The strength and conditioning staff works with the team all year long and has the opportunity to aid in each student-athletes' physical and mental development. Our role in maintaining an individual's drive throughout the year is key in getting the most out of that individual's potential."

Carsey succeeds long-time strength and conditioning coach Dan Dalrymple, who was named head strength coach for the New Orleans Saints last winter after spending 17 years building Miami's strength and conditioning program from the ground up. Assisting Carsey are full-time assistant Ryan Faehnle, who joined the staff this past summer, second-year intern Matt Cady and a group of well-trained student assistants.

"Coach Dalrymple's philosophy was always that student-athletes come to Miami to be champions, and it's our obligation to provide those student-athletes with the tools to reach their full potential," Carsey said. "We still embrace that mindset, while also working to instill qualities such as pride, integrity, loyalty and dedication."

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2006 MIAMI MEN'S CROSS COUNTRY SEASON IN REVIEW

With no scholarship seniors and 12 freshmen and sophomores comprising the bulk of its roster, the youthful Miami University men's cross country team proved that age is nothing but a number.

Winning the first two meets of the 2006 season and placing among the top four teams at the Mid-American Conference Championship for the 11th straight season, the RedHawks built positive momentum under 13th-year head coach **Warren Mandrell**. Despite having only four runners with previous experience at the conference meet, a talented corps of underclassmen paced Miami's fourth-place finish at the MAC Championship and helped the RedHawks finish in the top half of the Great Lakes Region, traditionally one of the toughest regions in the country.

"We had some talented runners, but we were very young this season," Mandrell said. "Heading into the conference meet we had four guys with MAC Championship experience, but our team competed well, and potentially everyone is back next season."

THE REDHAWKS' HOT START

Heading into the season, Mandrell and the RedHawks faced the daunting task of replacing All-Americans Dan Huling and Chris Swisher, but Miami opened the season with impressive performances in the first two meets. The RedHawks won both the Dayton Flyer 5K Challenge and Miami Invitational and placed four of the top five runners at both races. Individually, sophomore **Brad**

Untrauer placed second at Dayton and junior **Michael Veatch** finished first at Miami's home meet, with both runners taking home MAC Runner of the Week honors in consecutive weeks.

Miami continued its string of strong September performances by finishing third in a 24-team field at the Penn State Spiked Shoe Invitational, with sophomore **Pat Sovacool** placing sixth overall and becoming the third Miamian to earn MAC Runner of the Week accolades. After opening October with a fourth-place finish at the 42-team All-Ohio Championship, Miami finished 33rd in a tough field at the Pre-NCAA Invitational.

"I thought we ran well at Dayton and we were solid at our home meet," Mandrell said. "Penn State was probably our best meet of the season and the most complete race we ran."

A cold and muddy MAC Championship saw Miami finish fourth—the 11th consecutive season the Red and White posted a top-four MAC finish—as the RedHawks battled the rain-soaked course at Beaver Island State Park in Buffalo, N.Y. With standing water on the course, poor footing and gusting winds of 30 miles per hour, Miami still placed three runners in the meet's top 30, led by Sovacool's 26th-place finish. Freshman **Paul Krebs** and redshirt freshman **Kevin Silver** also placed 27th and 30th, respectively.

"We thought before the season started we would finish second, third or fourth, but the poor conditions didn't

help our team. The true distance runners excelled at the conference meet, and Krebs had his best race of the season. We went on to finish 14th at the regional meet, and it was great to end the season being ranked in the top 15 regionally.

AN EYE TO THE FUTURE

With the potential to have all of their letterwinners returning next season, the RedHawks can carry over the momentum from the 2006 season and challenge for a conference title in 2007. Mandrell expect both Sovacool and Krebs to pace Miami next season.

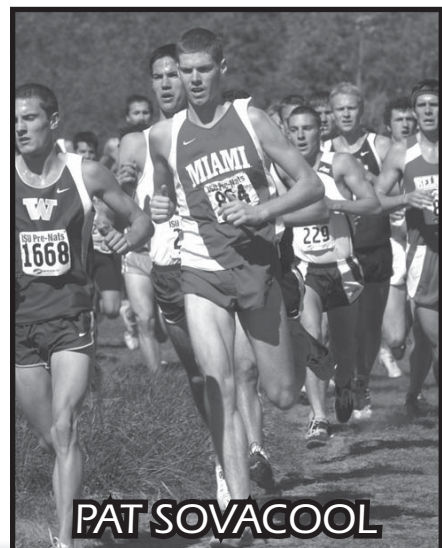
"Both were number one runners for us during the season and were our most consistent runners," Mandrell said. "Pat had a huge breakthrough this season, and he is really developing as a distance runner. Michael was dependable all season long, and I expect him to be a leader for us next season as a senior."

Perhaps most surprising this season was the performance of Silver, who used took advantage of his redshirt season last year to improve.

"Kevin was a pleasant surprise for us, and he either our third or fourth runner for most of the season," Mandrell said. "He was a guy that wasn't in the top 20 coming out of high school, but he has developed tremendously."

Over the course of the season, Miami had eight different runners place in the scoring five, including Krebs, **Justin Campbell** and **Ryan Tamm**.

"We were young and inexperienced this season," Mandrell said, "but we got lots of racing experience for our young guys that should pay off in the future."

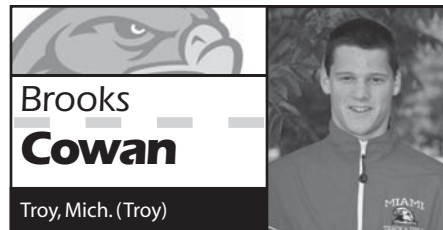
