Top returning scorer (11.3 ppg) and rebounder (6.4 rpg) ... averaged 12.2 ppg in league play a year ago ... started Miami's last nine games a year ago, averaging a team-high 15.6 ppg during the span ... had four 20-point scoring efforts and three double-doubles in 2002-03 ... totaled four double-digit rebounding efforts in 2002-03 ... ranked among the MAC's Top 15 in rebounding (6.4 rpg) and Top 10 for offensive rebounding (2.9 rpg) ... became just the 14th RedHawk to 500 career rebounds and is tied for 10th-place all-time at Miami in rebounding ... named MAC East Player of the Week four times in her career.

2002-03

Poured in 16 points off 6-of-8 shooting from the field in defeat of Wright State (Dec. 7) ... honored as MAC Scholar-Athlete of the Week on Dec. 9... Notched first double-digit rebounding effort of the season at Saint Louis (Dec. 15), grabbing 10 rebounds and tallying eight points in the loss ... poured in 17 points, including 9-of-11 free throws, in Dec. 18 loss to Saint Francis (Pa.) ... tallied first 20-point effort of the season in overtime loss at Kentucky (Dec. 21), posting 22 points off 8-of-12 shooting from the field before fouling out ... netted first double-double of the season versus Butler (Dec. 28), contributing 10 points and a career-high 14 rebounds ... led Miami with 16 points and eight rebounds in MAC-opening defeat of Akron (Jan. 7) ... enjoyed best all-around outing of the season in loss to Toledo (Jan. 18), scoring 12 points, grabbing 11 rebounds, dishing six assists and snagging three steals while

committing just one turnover ... named MAC East Player of the Week on Feb. 17 after leading Miami to road wins over Northern Illinois (Feb. 13) and Bowling Green (Feb. 15) ... poured in 17 points off 6-of-9 shooting from the field at NIU ... tallied 21 points and drained 7-of-7 free throws in come-from-behind win at Bowling Green ... carried a string of 23 consecutive made free throws from Feb. 13-Feb. 26 ... tallied 13 points and 10 rebounds in Feb. 19 defeat of Central Michigan ... led Miami in March 4 defeat of Marshall, tallying a season-high 24 points, grabbing five rebounds and swiping three steals ... scored six straight points in overtime, including the go-ahead basket, in Miami's regular-season finale against Marshall ... named MAC East Co-Player of the Week on March 6 ... poured in 20 points, including 10-of-10 free throws, and grabbed seven boards in MAC Semifinal loss to Ball State (March 14).

Started Miami's last 11 games of 2002-03 after getting just one start in the RedHawks' first 18 outings ... one of Miami's most prolific long-range threats, ranking seventh all-time in career 3-point field goals (109) ... tallied nine double-digit scoring outings in 2002-03 ... 60 percent of her shots came from beyond the 3-point arc ... finished last season fifth on the team in scoring (7.6 ppg) and second in 3-point field goals (38) ... bagged multiple 3-point field goals in a game 10 times in 2002-03.

Tallied 12 points off 4-of-8 shooting in season-opening defeat of Valparaiso (Nov. 23) at the Spartan Chevrolet Classic ...
