HEAD COACH MARIA FANTANAROSA

Entering her ninth season at the helm of a program she was once a part of as a player, Miami head coach Maria Fantanarosa approaches the 2006-07 season within six wins of surpassing Pam Wettig (1975-84) as the program's all-time winningest coach.

Since returning to her alma mater as head coach prior to the 1998-99 season, Fantanarosa has guided a resurgent program to six winning seasons in the past seven years, including two Mid-American Conference East Division crowns and the 2003-04 MAC Championship.

During a trying 2005-06 campaign that was defined by injuries and an extremely young roster that derived more than 75 percent of its minutes from freshmen and sophomores, Fantanarosa laid the groundwork for the beginning of a promising future. According to Director of Athletics Brad Bates, who extended Fantanarosa's contract through 2011 following the season, the RedHawk mentor continues to head her program in the right direction.

"Maria Fantanarosa has built a successful and well-rounded women's basketball program that is a source of pride for our University," Bates said. "She has consistently recruited and graduated top-notch student-athletes who have kept the program among the most respected in the MAC and the region. Whether you are talking about graduation rates, academic performance, an impressive history of community service or competing year in and year out for the MAC title, Coach Fantanarosa has crafted her program into a complete experience for the women involved."

A fiery competitor as both a player and a coach for the Red and White, Fantanarosa has been instrumental in directing the dramatic turnaround of a program that was coming off its first losing season in 10 years when she was hired in the summer of 1998.

Critical to the program's success has been an impressive recruiting effort that has brought five of the program's top 11 career scorers and three of the top eight career rebounders to campus during her short tenure. Under her tutelage, Miami has produced 34 MAC Players of the Week, 12 all-MAC selections and four MAC All-Freshman honorees.

Since the 2000-01 season, Miami has been one of the most consistent powers in the Mid-American Conference, winning an impressive 75 games, finishing among the top three in the MAC East in all but one season and winning at least one game in six of a possible seven MAC Tournaments. Though the finished product is impressive, the road was not easy for Fantanarosa and the RedHawks.

Hired too late to recruit a freshman class for her inaugural season at Miami, Fantanarosa guided her first Miami team, which relied heavily on walk-ons, to a surprising 11-15 record and laid the groundwork for the blue collar style of play her teams would become known for.

Miami returned to its winning ways during Fantanarosa's second season, as a talented freshman class brought new life to the program. The Red and White finished second in the MAC's East Division that season, compiling a 16-12 overall record and earning passage into the MAC Quarterfinals.

With another strong recruiting class in place, Fantanarosa guided the 2000-01 RedHawks to an 18-11 record, including a 10-6 mark in the conference. Miami put an exclamation point on the season with a thrilling upset of Ball State in the MAC Quarterfinals and made its return to the MAC Semifinals for the first time in five years.

The impact of Fantanarosa's recruiting efforts was felt over the next two seasons, as Miami posted 36 wins and claimed the program's first MAC East Title in 2002-03. Heather Cusick was named MAC Player of the Year in 2001-02 and finished her career as Miami's all-time leading scorer.

The pinnacle arrived in 2003-04, when Miami shocked the league by reeling off 12 straight wins in the heart of the MAC season and capturing the overall MAC Championship. Miami went on to make the program's first appearance in the Postseason WNIT, advancing to the second round, and senior Colleen Day became Miami's first CoSIDA Academic All-American, notching second-team honors.

In her eight seasons, Fantanarosa's Miami squads have battled to a 126-104 (.548) overall record and 73-55 (.570) league mark. She enters this season needing six wins to surpass Pam Wettig (1975-84) as the program's all-time winningest coach. Ranked among the MAC's all-time Top 10 in career league wins, Fantanarosa also matches Wettig this season for the longest



tenure of any Miami women's basketball coach.

A two-time all-MAC selection while a player at Miami, Fantanarosa finished her career in fourth place and currently ranks 13th on Miami's all-time scoring list with 1,086 points. She also placed her name in among Miami's career top 10 with her 323 career assists.

Fantanarosa, 39, became the seventh head coach at Miami after serving as head coach at Western Carolina in 1997-98.

Prior to Western Carolina, Fantanarosa was the top assistant at South Carolina for three seasons. Before her work with the Gamecocks, she was the number one assistant at Xavier, where the Musketeers won the Midwestern Collegiate Conference regular season title in 1991-92 and the conference tournament title one year later.

A native of Kulpmont, Pa., Fantanarosa earned her bachelor's degree in speech communication with a minor in coaching science from Miami in 1990 and a master's degree in sport administration from Xavier in 1993. She is married to Tim Morrow and has two daughters, Lauren and Allison.

During a prolific prep career at Mt. Carmel Area High School, Fantanarosa set Pennsylvania state records for most points in a career by a male or female (3,823) and most points in a single season (1,318). She was inducted into the Pennsylvania Sports Hall of Fame earlier this fall. Nationally, Fantanarosa's career point total ranks her among the Top 10 highest scorers in high school girls basketball history.

GENERAL NOTES:

- Exciting junior guard who suffered a season-ending knee injury in the 2005-06 season opener at Michigan and earned a medical redshirt.
- Underwent surgery last January and has undergone extensive rehabilitation over the past seven months. Is expected to be at full-go by the start of practice this fall.
- Possesses 3-point range as well as an exciting array of moves to get to the basket. Also an aggressive defender with quick hands.
- Miami's active career scoring leader, averaging 12.7 ppg for her career and standing within 256 points of becoming just the sixth Miami women's basketball standout all-time to surpass 1,000 points before her senior season.
- Enters the season poised to enter Miami's career Top 10 in steals, totaling 145 steals to date.
- An honorable mention all-MAC pick as a sophomore in 2004-05, when she averaged 13.1 points per game and ranked sixth in the MAC in steals.
- A MAC All-Freshman selection in 2003-04, when she averaged 12.6 points per game and snagged 84 steals while finishing second in MAC Freshman of the Year voting.
- Was Ohio's District 9 Player of the Year as a senior at Springfield South H.S., where she averaged 22.2 points as a senior.

2005-06 HIGHLIGHTS

- Scored eight points in 10 minutes of action at Michigan (Nov. 20) before suffering a serious knee injury that ended her season.
- Remained very active with the team throughout the season and was an inspiration with her positive attitude throughout a grueling rehabilitation process.

- Sophomore who was the first Miami freshman since Lisa Hayden (1991-95) to start every game of her true freshman campaign.
- Intelligent, well composed point guard who led the team, averaging 33.6 minutes per game.
- Ranked among the MAC leaders in assists (9th/4.07) and assist/turnover ratio (4th/1.52).
- Already ranks among Miami's career Top 40 in assists with 114 dishes.
- Strong shooter who broke Heather Cusick's 1999-00 freshman record with a team-high 47 3-pointers.
- Led the team with 47 steals, or 1.7 steals per game, ranking her among the MAC's Top 15 in steals.
- Second on the team in scoring at 8.5 ppg, totaling 12 double-figure scoring games and leading the team in scoring four times.
- Named to the MAC All-Freshman team after pacing league freshmen in assists, assist-turnover ratio and 3-point field goals.
- Four-year starter at point guard for a strong Pickerington North High School program that went 88-15 during her four-year prep career.

2005-06 HIGHLIGHTS

- Led Miami with 11 points and dished seven assists in collegiate debut at Michigan on Nov. 20, while becoming the first Miami freshman since 1993 to start her first collegiate game.
- Dished a career-high eight assists in Dec. 1 loss to Wright State, a total she would match two games later versus Wake Forest (Dec. 4).
- Matched a career high with 18 points, including 5-of-7 3-pointers, in Dec. 3 loss at Northwestern.
- Scored 14 points and matched her career high with eight assists in a Jan. 17 overtime loss to Kent State, while playing a career-high 40 minutes.
- Tallied 13 points, five rebounds and four assists in leading Miami to a key Feb. 18 win over Ohio.
- Finished regular season with 13 points, including three 3-pointers, in Feb. 28 loss to nationally-ranked Bowling Green.

- Streaky scorer who contributed seven double-figure scoring efforts and led the team in scoring twice.
- Ranked third on the team with 47 assists and fifth with 23 steals.
- Fourth on the team with 15 3-point field goals but shot a team-best 35.9 percent from beyond the arc.
- First-Team All-Kentucky and a Kentucky All-Star after a senior season at Henderson County High School, where she helped the Lady Colonels to a 28-6 record in 2004-05.

- Opened her collegiate career with 10 points in season-opening loss at Michigan (Nov. 20).

- Dangerous 3-point shooter who shot 44.0 percent from beyond the arc in non-conference play, ranking among league leaders, before struggling in MAC play and finishing at 28.3 percent.
- Saw her first extended minutes in three seasons, as she took a medical redshirt her true freshman season and played a limited reserve role in 2004-05.
- Played primarily as an off-guard but also saw limited minutes as Miami's reserve point guard.
- Averaged a career-best 7.5 points per game and totaled 10 double-figure scoring outings this season.
- A three-time All-Ohio pick for Greenfield McClain High School, where she helped the Tigers to a four-year record of 90-6 while becoming the program's all-time leading scorer (1,670).

2005-06 HIGHLIGHTS

- Contributed 13 points, six assists and five steals in Nov. 25 win over New Orleans in the opening game of the Saint Louis Billiken Classic.

- Occasionally explosive scorer and rebounder who was plagued by injury and illness during her freshman campaign.
- Played in 17 games, missing seven games in December with a foot injury and the last three games via illness and suspension over team rules violation.
- Led the team, averaging 5.8 rebounds per game, while contributing a solid 6.4 points per game.
- Recorded five double-figure scoring games while leading the team in scoring on two occasions.
- Strong finisher inside who also can step outside and hit the 3-pointer.
- First-Team All-State and Pennsylvania AAAA Player of the Year as a senior at Oakland Catholic High School, where she helped the Eagles to two state championships.

2005-06 HIGHLIGHTS

- Began her college career by snagging 29 rebounds (9.7 rpg) over her first three career games before being sidelined by a foot injury.

- Can score as a shooter and penetrator as well as from the free throw line, where she shot a team-best 85.4 percent (41-of-48).
- Saw action in all 28 games and made two starts.
- Averaged 6.9 ppg and shot 40.6 percent from the field to lead Miami's guards in field goal percentage.
- 2004 Indiana Miss Basketball after averaging 25.3 ppg and leading Warsaw High School to the state championship game.

- Experienced breakout game in title game of the Saint Louis Billiken Classic (Nov. 26), pouring in 24 points and grabbing 10 rebounds versus SLU while earning MVP honors.

REDHAWK TEAM NOTES

WHO'S GONE: Graduation claimed two senior starters from Miami's roster for the upcoming season. Senior guard **Cindi Merrill**, a three-time all-MAC pick, graduated as Miami's fourth all-time leading scorer, while senior center **Amber Miller**, one of the program's most improved players over the past three years, finished her career ranked just outside of the program's career Top 10 in blocked shots. Also departed is forward **Katie Guerriero**, who left the program after earning two letters and averaging 5.5 ppg last season.

WHO'S BACK: The benefit of Miami's 2005-06 growing pains can be found in a returning core that accounted for 61.1 percent of the team's scoring and 68.5 percent of its rebounding last season. The RedHawks return three 2005-06 starters in freshman **Jenna Schone** and sophomores **Sarah Hull** and **Laura Markwood**, and also get back junior **Amanda Jackson**, a two-year starter who missed last season with a knee injury. Though the 2006-07 RedHawks will feature no seniors, they will return a total of nine past letterwinners.

TAKING THE WORLD BY STORM: This past May, Miami University's women's basketball team went global, when they participated in a 10-day European tour of Germany, Austria and Italy. Along with taking in all of the sites, the RedHawks played four exhibition games versus professional European teams, winning all four outings despite having only eight available players. According to head coach **Maria Fantanarosa**, who also took the RedHawks on a European tour in 2002, the experience was perfect for building team chemistry. After its 2002 European tour, Miami went on to win the 2002-03 MAC East Division Championship.

HOW YOUNG WERE THEY? The youngest team in the Mid-American Conference, Miami's 2005-06 squad featured five freshmen—matching **Maria Fantanarosa's** largest freshman class at Miami—four scholarship sophomores—two of which averaged fewer than 9.0 minutes per game in 2004-05—and a combined total of just three juniors and seniors. That number was further skewed by junior **Amanda Jackson's** season-ending injury, which was suffered in the first game of the season. Of the 5,625 minutes played by the RedHawks in 2005-06, 75.7 percent were played by freshmen and sophomores, including nearly 40 percent from true freshmen.

ONE TOUGH SCOUT: Whether it was a blessing or a curse, Miami's inconsistency on offense made it a very difficult team to scout. While senior **Cindi Merrill** was the team's clear proven scorer, as many as 10 different players proved that they could step up and ignite the offense. Through 28 games, nine different players led or tied for the team lead in scoring at least once, while 10 players scored in double digits on at least three occasions. Miami finished the season with seven players on its roster averaging at least 5.2 points per game—no one else in the MAC had more than six.

GIVING A LIFT: While experience was not a strength of her team, head coach **Maria Fantanarosa** was able to make use of the team's depth. Averaging better than 40 substitutions a game, Miami played at least 10 players in all but one of its games in 2005-06 and outscored the opposition's bench in 20 of those 28 games. Miami was just 1-7 in the games in which its bench was outscored. The RedHawks, who got 40.8 percent (28.0 ppg) of their scoring off the bench in wins, had 10 players average at least 10.0 minutes per game.

SECOND CHANCES: When you are struggling to put the ball in the basket, you had better give yourself as many shots as you can while ensuring your opponents get as few looks as possible, making rebounding a critical factor. Over the course of the season, Miami was just 3-15 when it was tied or outrebounded but forged a 5-5 mark when it claimed an edge on the boards. The 2005-06 RedHawks

pulled down a league-high 40.1 rebounds per game, including a MAC-best 15.6 offensive boards per game.

MERRILL NAMED THIRD-TEAM ALL-MAC: Following a trying season in which she was, at times, asked to carry a young team, senior guard **Cindi Merrill** was honored as a third-team all-MAC selection. Merrill led Miami and ranked seventh in the MAC in scoring at 14.6 points per game, leading the RedHawks in scoring 14 times in 25 games, despite playing with a broken hand for much of the year.

SCHONE EARNS SPOT ON MAC ALL-FRESHMAN TEAM: After becoming the first Miami freshman to start every game of her freshman campaign since 1991, point guard **Jenna Schone** was one of five players selected by the league coaches to the MAC All-Freshman Team. Schone, who led all league freshmen in assists (4.1 apg), assist-turnover ratio (1.5) and 3-point field goals (47), was one of three Miami players to start every game and led the team, averaging 33.6 minutes per game. Schone is Miami's fourth MAC All-Freshman pick since **Maria Fantanarosa** took over.

STEALING THE SHOW: With the start of MAC play, the RedHawks turned up the intensity and started forcing more turnovers. Including a 14-steal effort versus Ohio on Feb. 18, which matched a season-high, Miami averaged 9.19 steals in MAC play, to rank fifth in the league. After topping 10 steals just twice over their first eight games, the RedHawks have made 10 or more steals 12 times over the last 20 games and forced 17.5 turnovers per game in MAC play.

AS THE BALL TURNS: After committing 28 turnovers in a loss at Eastern Michigan on Feb. 11, Miami rededicated itself to taking care of the ball. Over the last six games, Miami committed fewer than 15 turnovers five times and averaged just 13.8 turnovers per game. The RedHawks committed only 11 turnovers versus Bowling Green in its regular-season finale after committing a season-high 33 miscues versus the Falcons in their Jan. 21 meeting. Miami finished the year with 12 turnovers in its MAC Tourney loss at NIU.

MERRILL NAMED THIRD-TEAM ALL-MAC: Following a trying season in which she was, at times, asked to carry a young team, senior guard **Cindi Merrill** was honored as a third-team all-MAC selection. Merrill, who was a second-team all-league selection as a sophomore and junior, is just the fifth Miami player to earn all-MAC recognition three times in her career and just the second, joining Hall of Famer **Monica Niemann**, to do so without being named honorable mention. Merrill led Miami and ranked seventh in the MAC in scoring at 14.6 points per game, leading the RedHawks in scoring 14 times in 25 games, despite playing much of the season with a broken hand.

SCHONE EARNS SPOT ON MAC ALL-FRESHMAN TEAM: After becoming the first Miami freshman to start every game of her freshman campaign since 1991, point guard **Jenna Schone** was one of five players selected by the league coaches to the MAC All-Freshman Team. Schone, who led all league freshmen in assists (4.1 apg), assist-turnover ratio (1.5) and 3-point field goals (47), was one of three Miami players to start every game and led the team, averaging 33.6 minutes per game. Schone is Miami's fourth MAC All-Freshman pick since **Maria Fantanarosa** took over.

JACKSON LOST FOR 2005-06 SEASON: Junior guard **Amanda Jackson**, who was injured in the first half of Miami's Nov. 20 season-opener at Michigan, underwent successful surgery on Jan. 6 to repair a knee injury. A 2005 honorable mention all-MAC pick and runner-up for MAC Freshman of the year in 2004, Jackson was Miami's second-leading returning scorer (13.1 ppg). After extensive rehabilitation, she is expected to be at full-go when practice starts this fall.
