STORYLINES



1. UP AHEAD: It's Mid-American Conference season time as Miami travels to Akron to open conference play against the Zips on Wednesday at 7 p.m.

2. MAC OPENERS: Miami is 16-11 all-time in its opening MAC game. That includes a 9-2 record in games away from Millett Hall. This is the first time since the 2004-05 season that the RedHawks have not opened the conference season against Buffalo, Miami was 1-2 against the Bulls the last three years with each team winning on the road. This will be the sixth time the RedHawks have opened conference play against Akron. Miami is 5-1 all-time in conference openers against the Zips, including a perfect 2-0 record in Akron. The teams last met in a conference opener during the 2002-03 season, an 84-56 RedHawk win in Oxford.

3. GETTING BACK TO WINNING: For the first time this year, Miami is facing true adversity as it is coming off its first two-game losing streak of the season. With the next five games against MAC East opponents, how the RedHawks respond will go a long way in determining the success they have. Last season, Miami had two, two-game losing streaks, but each time responded by winning the majority of the following games.

LAST GAME: Miami University dropped its final non-conference game of the regular season Saturday when it fell 80-55 to Kentucky at Millett Hall. Jenna Schone led the RedHawks with 17 points. Miami falls to 8-5 on the season, while the Wildcats improve to 10-5.

Trailing 10-3 early in the first half, Courtney Reed found Schone for a backdoor layup and foul to complete the three-point play. Schone hit a couple more jumpers including a three-pointer to pull the RedHawks within three at 18-15 with 10:55 remaining.

A 22-12 run over the next eight minutes pushed the Kentucky lead to 40-27. Reed hit back-to-back shots to pull the RedHawks within nine, and after the Wildcats scored the next five to go up 14, she hit a three-pointer and a free throw to send Miami into the break trailing 45-35.

Both teams shot well during the half, Kentucky 53 percent of its shots (18-for-34), while the RedHawks hit 46 percent (11-for-24). Points in the paint were the big difference during the period as the Wildcats outscored Miami 28-14. Schone recorded 14 points during the half.

Kentucky opened the second half on an 11-2 run to take a 56-37 lead. Briana Dunlap hit a jumper, and followed it three-pointer to help spark a 13-4 Miami run to pull within 10 at 60-50 with 7:02 remaining. It was the closest the RedHawks would be able to get as they would score only five points the rest of the way and the Wildcats were able to put the game away.

In addition to Schone's 17, Reed was also in double figures with 14 points. Kentucky was led by Victoria Dunlap with 20. The Wildcats shot 53 percent for the game (32-for-60) and outrebounded the RedHawks 46-28.

ABOUT AKRON: Akron finished the non-conference season with a 5-8 record. The Zips have won their last two games, defeating Sam Houston State on the road 61-60 on Dec. 31, before returning home and beating Lehigh 67-59 on Jan. 4. Akron is led by preseason All-MAC East selection Kara Murphy. She averages 18.5 points per game. No other player on the Zips averages in double figures. Freshman center Kyle Baumgartner is the team's second leading scorer with 8.5 points per game and also leads the team with 7.0 rebounds per game.

SERIES HISTORY: Miami holds a 27-5 all-time series record against the Zips, including a 13-2 series lead in Akron. The RedHawks won both meetings with Akron last season, defeating the Zips 63-49 in Oxford on Jan. 16, 2008, and then winning 89-79 in Akron on Mar. 1, 2008. In that second game, Jenna Schone scored 29 points and became the 18th RedHawk to cross the 1,000 point barrier.

UP NEXT FOR THE REDHAWKS: Miami returns home to face Kent State on Saturday, Jan. 10. The game will be broadcast live on ONN and is part of a doubleheader that will feature the men against Akron at 4 p.m., also on ONN.

Head Coach Maria Fantanarosa: Her tenth season at the helm of her alma mater was one to remember as Miami head coach Maria Fantanarosa led the RedHawks to the program's first NCAA Tournament appearance in school history. Miami won 12 of its final 13 games, captured the MAC Tournament championship and earned the automatic berth in the NCAA Tournament.

Since returning to her alma mater as head coach prior to the 1998-99 season, Fantanarosa has guided a resurgent program to eight winning seasons in the past 10 years, including two Mid-American Conference East Division crowns, the 2003-04 MAC regular-season championship and the 2008 MAC Tournament championship.

Fantanarosa became Miami's all-time winningest coach in program history with her 132nd win, an 87-79 victory over IUPUI on Dec. 30, 2006, passing Pam Wettig, who previously held the mark with a career record of 131-103. Fantanarosa's all-time record at Miami now stands at 169-138.

Fantanarosa's RedHawks have been consistently recognized for their outstanding achievements and contributions on and off the court. As a result, Director of Athletics Brad Bates recently extended Fantanarosa's contract through the 2013-14 season, noting that the mentor of the Red and White continues to attract and produce high-quality student-athletes.

A native of Kulpmont, Pa., Fantanarosa earned her bachelor's degree in speech

SWISH, SWISH, SWISH: Miami is among the national leaders in three-point percentage, ranking 22nd (as of Dec. 21) by connecting on 36.7 percent of its treys. The RedHawks connected on 54.9 percent of their shots against Texas-Pan American (Dec. 5), by far its best effort of the season. Miami's next best single-game effort was 45.9 percent against La Salle (Nov. 26). Against Dayton on Dec. 10, the RedHawks hit eight three-pointers, including four from freshman guard **Maggie Boyer** (Lebanon, Ind.), the most they had hit in a game this year. The previous high for three-pointers in a game was seven set against Eastern Illinois (Nov. 14) and the aforementioned Texas-Pan American game.

DOUBLE-DIGIT RUNS: Miami has used double-digit scoring runs to help break close games open this season. Most notably, the RedHawks coasted to victory over Texas-Pan American (Dec. 5) on the heels of a 19-0 run over a span of 6:48. The streak was the longest of the year so far. Miami has six runs of 10 or more straight points this season. The RedHawks tallied 16 in a row against IPFW, 15-0 and 10-0 runs against Air Force (Dec. 6) and had 11-0 runs against both Eastern Illinois (Nov. 14) and La Salle (Nov. 25).

WINNING STREAKS: A key to last year's NCAA Tournament run was a seven-game winning streak from January 29 through Feb. 20. After dropping a game to Bowling Green on Feb. 23, the RedHawks immediately went on another six-game winning streak from Feb. 27 through Mar. 15 that culminated in a MAC Tournament Championship. While Miami has had several long winning streaks in the past, including a recent 12-game winning streak in 2004, they usually occur during the conference season. The RedHawks' recent four-game non-conference winning streak that began with a win over Wright State (Dec. 2) and also included two wins at the Air Force Classic (Dec. 5-6) and an overtime win against Dayton (Dec. 10) was the longest since the RedHawks won four in a row during the 2001-02 non-conference season. The longest non-conference winning streak for the Miami since MAC play began (1980-81) is six games, set after the RedHawks won their last five non-conference games in the 1988-89 season and then opened the 1989-90 season with a win over Wichita State.

SCHONE RUNS THE SHOW: One of the major keys to success for the 2008-09 RedHawks so far has been the performance of senior point guard **Jenna Schone** (Pickerington, Ohio). A second-team All-MAC selection a year ago and preseason pick in October, she is the team's leading scorer at 15.2 points per game. She has led the team in scoring seven times this season, including six of the last eight games. Schone has been on a torrid assist pace, averaging 4.3 assists per game, which ranks 91st in the country (as of Jan. 5). She leads the team with 56 assists.

Last season, Schone set Miami's single-season assist record with 175, as well as the single-season three-point field goal record with 84. She currently has 481 career assists, which is second all-time at Miami and 125 shy of Heather Cusick's record of 596. She also has 206 career three-point baskets, which is third on the RedHawk career list, and 24 three-point field goals short of Cusick's career record of 230.

WELCOME BACK LEININGER: Senior forward **Jaelyn Leininger** (Winona Lake, Ind.) has shown no signs of the season-ending knee injury she suffered in a preseason scrimmage last year. She ranks third on the team in scoring this year at 9.1 points per game, topping double figures in four games. She also is the team's top rebounder at 6.8 per contest, grabbing at least seven on seven occasions (three in double figures). She had a season high 12 rebounds against Towson (Dec. 29). Leininger recently moved into the top 50 Miami career scoring list, currently ranking 47th with 628 points.

HAWK FACTOR: Ashley Hawkins (Henderson, Ky.) seems to have found her groove as the team's sixth man and first guard off the bench. She has spent time as both the shooting guard, as well as the backup point guard in the rare times Schone is off the floor. Hawkins has been a great distributor this season with 50 assists, an average of 4.2 per game. That ranks 100th in the nation as of Jan. 5th. She has at least three assists in all but one game that she has appeared in this season. She also does not turn the ball over, ranking 45th in the nation in assist to turnover ratio at 1.79 (as of Jan. 5).

Hawkins has appeared in 103 career games, starting 43. She currently has 713 career points, which ranks 38th on the all-time Miami career scoring list. With 228 career assists, she has cracked the Miami career top 25 list, ranking 19th.

REED THIS YEAR'S BREAKOUT PLAYER?: Every season, one player typically makes a huge jump in her contribution from the previous year. One of the candidates for breakout player this season has to be junior guard **Courtney Reed** (Andrews, Ind.). She has started all 13 games and is second on the team in scoring, averaging 12.0 points. Compare that to her first two years, when she appeared in a combined 64 games, starting only 11 (all in 2007-08), and averaged 5.8 points per game.

Against Murray State (Dec. 21) she had a career high 19 points to go along with five assists. It wasn't the only big-time scoring game she has had this season. In the season opener at Eastern Illinois on Nov. 14, Reed scored 15 points, only one off what was then her career high. She followed that up with 13 against IPFW (Nov. 22), 15 against Wright State (Dec. 2), 13 against Dayton (Dec. 10) and 15 against Butler (Dec. 13). Against Air Force (Dec. 6), she showed her defensive abilities, coming up with a career-high five steals.

FORD TOUGH: Senior center **Stephanie Ford** (Indianapolis, Ind.) was named the team's most improved player last season, and the carryover appears to have continued this year. In the exhibition game against the Hoosier Lady Stars, Ford came off the bench to score a team-high 19 points, which would have been a career high in a regular game. She accomplished that on 8-of-10 shooting in only 16 minutes of action.

Ford has started six games this season and is averaging 4.2 points and 3.3 rebounds for the season. Her best performance came against Texas-Pan American (Dec. 5), where she played a season-high 28 minutes, grabbed six rebounds (equalling her best of the year) and registered her first multiple block game of the year. Ford currently has 74 career blocks, which ranks seventh on the RedHawks' all-time list.

BOYER'S IMPRESSIVE DEBUT: The jump from high school to college is difficult, and there is always a learning curve, but freshman guard **Maggie Boyer** (Lebanon, Ind.) showed she might not take that much time to adjust after scoring 17 points in her first career game against Eastern Illinois (Nov. 14). Boyer shot 6-for-12 and hit three three-point baskets.

Boyer had another impressive game in the RedHawks overtime win over Dayton (Dec. 10). She hit four three-point baskets and played strong defense on the Flyers' starting guards, helping to hold them to 10-for-27 shooting. She also topped double figures against Wright State (Dec. 2) with 10 points and against Butler (Dec. 13) with 13. She established career bests for rebounds (six) against Dayton and assists (three) against Texas-Pan American (Dec. 5). She set a new career high on Dec. 29 with 19 points against Towson, scoring 17 in the second half. Boyer is the leading scorer among freshmen, ranking fourth overall at 9.0 points per contest.

WISNER CLEANS UP BOARDS: Another freshman with a strong start to her college career is forward **Erin Wisner** (Solon, Ohio). She currently ranks third on the team in rebounding at 4.9 per contest and enjoyed a breakout game of 11 points and seven boards against Wake Forest (Nov. 29). She missed three games after injuring her shoulder against Air Force (Dec. 6), but returned to action against Towson (Dec. 29)

BROWN DOES THE LITTLE THINGS: Junior **Ashleigh Brown** (Delaware, Ohio) has been Miami's "energy" player this season, grabbing the key rebounds, diving for the loose balls or just motivating the team with her effort. However, she has shown signs of being the star player when she is needed. She scored a career high 21 points on 9-of-15 shooting against Murray State (Dec. 21), and also pulled down seven rebounds (five offensive), three steals and a block. She topped double figures in scoring for the second time against Texas-Pan American (Dec. 5) when she tallied 10 points on 5-of-7 shooting. Against La Salle (Nov. 25), she gained a then career-high 16 points on 8-for-10 shooting, and also recorded five rebounds, two assists, two blocks, and three steals. Against Dayton (Dec. 10) she matched a career high with nine rebounds and followed it up with eight points and seven rebounds in a career high 36 minutes against Butler (Dec. 13). So far this season she is fifth on the team in scoring with 6.5 points per game and second with 5.0 rebounds per game. After averaging only 7.5 minutes per game during her first two seasons as a RedHawk, Brown is second on the team this year with an average of 27.6 minutes played per game this year.

HANDING OUT THE HELPERS: Miami was credited with 20 assists against Texas-Pan American (Dec. 5) with six different players handing out at least one. The total was just one shy of the season high of 21, registered against Wright State in the previous outing. The RedHawks also topped 15 assists against Dayton (18), La Salle (17), Butler (17) and Air Force (16). With an average of 13.91 assists per game, the RedHawks ranks 117th in the nation as a team in that category as of Jan. 5

THE NEWCOMERS: Six freshmen make up one of the strongest recruiting classes on paper in Miami history. The class includes **Michelle Oswalt** (Lafayette, Ind.), who was originally part of last year's class, but an injury caused her to miss the season, and she made her Miami debut against Eastern Illinois. She is currently sidelined after suffering an injury in that game. She is joined in the backcourt by **Maggie Boyer** and **Ariel Thomas** (Cincinnati, Ohio). In the front court are **Erin Wisner**, **Rachael Hencke** (Grafton, Wisc.) and **Lillian Pitts** (Shaker Heights, Ohio).

Wisner, Hencke and Pitts have played key roles in backing up the forward spots. Thomas has appeared in eight games so far this season at guard. She scored her first career points against #20 Florida (Dec. 30).

Trailing 35-23 with five minutes remaining in the half, Reed caught fire to help keep Miami in the game. A free throw and two three-pointers by Reed cut the EIU lead to 40-30. The Panthers pushed the lead back to 47-34, but an Erin Wisner basket at the buzzer had the RedHawks trailing 47-36 at the half. Reed led Miami with 11 points at the half. Boyer had seven. Eastern Illinois shot 54.8 percent during the half compared to the RedHawks 43.3 percent, and outboarded Miami 20-15.

The RedHawks opened the second half on an 11-1 run to cut the Panther lead to one. Boyer hit a three-pointer and two free throws, followed by two Leininger buckets and a Reed layup during that stretch.

Several free throws by EIU pushed the lead back to 10 at 70-60, Miami had one last run as a Boyer three-pointer and a couple of jumpers by Leininger cut it down to four at 76-72. With under a minute to go, Jenna Schone stole the ball and hit a layup to make it 76-74, but fouled out on the ensuing possession. The Panthers hit their free throws in the last minute to seal the win.

OXFORD, Ohio – Miami scored seven straight points late in the first half to take the lead for good, then ran off 16 in a row in the second to cruise to a 73-57 victory over IPFW Saturday afternoon at Millett Hall. Jenna Schone led all scorers with 21 points, while Courtney Reed added 13 points.

The Mastodons led 20-19 when Miami scored seven straight points. Jaclyn Leininger hit two free throws and Ashleigh Brown each made a layup before Schone capped the run with a three-pointer. The lead reached seven at 34-27 after two more Leininger free throws, but IPFW's Courtney Reed answered with a three to cut the margin back to four. The RedHawks held a 38-32 advantage at the break when Ashley Hawkins made a driving layup at the buzzer.

Miami led 44-38 with 15:09 to play when it broke the game open. Hawkins hit a conventional three-point play to start a 16-0 surge that pushed the margin to 22, 60-38, by the 11-minute mark. From there, IPFW scored eight straight points to trail by 14, but Miami answered with six in a row and was never threatened again.

Both teams started slowly with IPFW hitting just two of its first 11 shots, while Miami connected on their of its first eight. Miami finished the game better, finishing at 39.7 percent after a 43.8-percent effort in the opening stanza. Rebounding was a key as the RedHawks held a 58-25 advantage on the boards, including 10 from Leininger and eight each from Brown and Reed.

Miami committed 18 turnovers in the contest, while forcing the Mastodons into only 10.

OXFORD, Ohio – A career high 16 points from junior Ashleigh Brown on 8-of-10 shooting led Miami University to a 63-50 win over La Salle Tuesday night.

Miami played strong defense throughout the game, holding La Salle to 34 percent shooting and forcing the Explorers into 20 turnovers.

The RedHawks started the first half slowly, shooting only 28.6 percent during the first 10 minutes. Trailing 10-4, Jenna Schone hit a key early three-pointer, which was followed on the next possession by a Courtney Reed backdoor layup that closed the gap to one at 10-9. With the score 12-11 in favor of La Salle, Schone hit another three-pointer to give Miami its first lead since the score was 2-0.

After the Explorers hit two free throws late in the first half to tie the score at 23, Ashley Hawkins hit a three-pointer to give the RedHawks the lead. OXFORD, Ohio - Miami overcame a 13-point deficit in the final two minutes of regulation, but Butler scored the last six points in the second overtime for a thrilling 86-81 Bulldog victory. Senior Jenna Schone led the RedHawks with season-high-tying 21 points, while Courtney Reed added 15 points and four rebounds.

Miami opened a five-point lead, 72-67 with 2:45 left in the first overtime, only to see Butler send the game to a second. Brittany Bowen hit a three-pointer, then Melanie Thornton answered an Ashley Hawkins jumper with four straight points to tie the game at 74. Schone had a chance to win the game, but missed a pair of free throws with five seconds left.

Bowen started the second overtime with a three-pointer just nine seconds in, but the game was later at 79 with 3:34 left. Butler went up 80-79 after a free throw by Lade Akande, but Reed put Miami ahead for the final time, 81-80 with 2:13 to play, by hitting both of her attempts at the charity stripe. The Bulldogs then hit six straight free throws to pull away.

Butler finished the game with a 48.1-percent shooting effort, including 53.3 percent from outside the three-point arc. Miami countered by hitting just 40.9 percent of its attempts from the floor.

The RedHawks had two other players reach double figures -- Maggie Bower with 13 and Hawkins with 10.

Two baskets by Brown and a rebound putback layup from Stephanie Ford gave the RedHawks a 65-60 lead. After Murray State tied the score at 65 with 1:43 remaining, Reed scored two straight buckets to put Miami ahead for good.

The RedHawks struggled to find their shot during the game, shooting 38.2 percent. They outrebounded Murray State 40-39, and most importantly kept the Racers off the offensive glass, giving up only eight offensive boards.

After Shanae Baker-Brice split two free throws with 17 seconds remaining, Miami drew up one final play. The ball was knocked out of bounds by a Towson player with 2.9 seconds, and on the ensuing out of bounds play Reed was tripped by Halienna Snowden. She calmly hit both of her free throws and the RedHawks defended the final play to escape with the 69-68 win.

In addition to Boyer's 19, Schone finished with 14 and Reed 10. Schone moved into the top-10 of the Miami career scoring list, tying Julie Howell for ninth with 1,227 career points.
