## '06-07 Season Recap Notes



**SEASON COMPLETE:** After falling in the first round of the conference tournament to Western Michigan, the Miami University women's basketball team (12-18; 6-10 MAC) completed its 2006-07 season. The RedHawks showed improvement, upping both their overall win total (eight to 12) and Mid-American Conference win total (three to six) while placing guard **Amanda Jackson** on the all-MAC first team.

**REFLECTIONS ON THE SEASON:** Miami wrapped up the 2006-07 season with a 12-18 record and had many notable individual achievements. **Amanda Jackson** was named the MAC East Division Player of the Week four times during the regular season, while **Jaelyn Leininger** was tabbed as the MAC Scholar Athlete of the Week on Dec. 13. ... Five of Miami's returning letterwinners increased their scoring average from the 2005-06 season, while as a team, Miami increased its scoring average from 62.5 points per game to 71.6 points per game ... With an eye to the future, the RedHawks did not graduate any seniors and return 11 scholarship players for the 2007-08 season.

**PLAYER MILESTONES:** Entering her senior season having scored 1,267 career points, **Amanda Jackson** continues to move up the career scoring chart and ranks eighth on the Miami all-time list. Entering her final

season in Oxford, Jackson needs only three points to pass **Colleen Day** (2000-04) for seventh place and is 462 points away from becoming Miami's all-time leading scorer ... With 225 career steals, Jackson ranks fifth all-time at Miami ... Jackson's career scoring average of 14.3 points per game ranks third on the Miami all-time list ... **Jenna Schone** has amassed 96 career 3-point field goals in two seasons and needs four more to reach 100. She ranks ninth on the Miami career list for 3-point field goals made.

**WHEN IT'S OKAY TO ONE-UP YOUR COACH:** Ranking eighth on the Miami career scoring list with 1,267 points, guard **Amanda Jackson** has surpassed both current Miami head coach **Maria Fantanarosa** (14th; 1,086 career points) and assistant coach **Lisa Hayden** (16th; 1,047 points) on the Red and White's career scoring list. After becoming the third-fastest player in program history to reach 1,000 career points, Jackson is now three points away from passing another member of the Miami coaching staff—assistant coach **Colleen Day** (1,269 points), who stands seventh on the Red and White's all-time scoring list. Jackson also is 462 points away from becoming Miami's all-time leading scorer.

**SEASON MILESTONES:** In addition to her career milestones, guard **Amanda Jackson**

left her mark on numerous single-season charts after her successful junior season ... With 515 points, Jackson's junior season ranks third on the Miami single-season scoring chart. She is one of only three players in program history to score more than 500 points in a season ... With 12 20-point games, Jackson tied **Heather Cusick's** single-season record for 20-point games ... Finishing with 80 steals, Jackson ended the year ranked 10th on the single-season steals chart ... Converting 117 free throws, Jackson set a junior record for free throws made, besting **Cindi Merrill's** 2004-05 record of 96 ... **Jenna Schone** (136 assists) ended her sophomore season ranked eighth on the single-season assists chart.

**DOUBLE-FIGURE FUN:** A talented offensive player, guard **Amanda Jackson** finished the 2006-07 season with 16 double-figure scoring efforts in the season's final 18 games. As Miami's leading scorer at 17.2 points per game, Jackson was held under 10 points only twice in 2007. Making a successful return from a knee injury that sidelined her for all but 10 minutes of the 2005-06 season, Jackson hit double-figure points in 24 of Miami's 30 games, including 10 20-point games and two 30-point games.

**THE HAWK:** As a potent scoring threat, sophomore guard **Ashley Hawkins** averaged 14.0 points per game over the season's final six games. After being held to a combined 15 points in losses to Eastern Michigan (Feb. 7) and Western Michigan (Feb. 10), Hawkins responded with double-figure points in five of Miami's final six games, including 14 points in Miami's MAC Tournament loss to Western Michigan. The 5-foot-9 guard was arguably Miami's most improved player during the 2006-07 season, as she more than doubled her scoring average from her freshman season from 5.2 ppg to 11.0 ppg. After moving into the starting lineup at the beginning of MAC play, Hawkins registered four 20-point games and finished as the team's second-leading scorer in conference play at 13.4 points per game.

**THE FLOOR GENERAL:** Averaging 15.8 points per game over Miami's final six games of the season, sophomore **Jenna Schone** upped her season scoring average to 11.8 ppg and finished as the team's second-leading scorer. Schone also was Miami's best distributor, dishing out 136 assists (4.5 assists per game) and posting three double-digit assist efforts. Schone ended the regular season ranked in the top sixth in the conference in assists in overall games (5th, 4.53 apg) and MAC-only contests (6th, 4.31 apg). Schone has started all 58 games of her college career and was a 2006 All-MAC Freshman Team honoree.

**MILESTONE VICTORY:** With Miami's 87-79 victory over IUPUI on Dec. 30, 2006, head

coach **Maria Fantanarosa** picked up her 132nd career win and became the winningest coach in program history. Fantanarosa surpassed former Miami mentor **Pam Wettig** as the all-time wins leader on her fourth attempt at the milestone win. Having finished her ninth season at the helm of the Red and White, Fantanarosa holds a 138-122 all-time mark as Miami's head coach.

**THESE GUARDS ARE GOOD:** Miami's backcourt closed the regular season strong, as they shouldered the bulk of the team's scoring load over the final six games. Miami's three starting guards — junior **Amanda Jackson** and sophomores **Jenna Schone** and **Ashley Hawkins** — combined to average 49.3 points per game over the season's final six games, with Jackson averaging 19.5 ppg during that stretch.

**TEAM HONORS:** At Miami basketball's annual end of the year banquet, the team handed out its postseason awards. Miami head coach **Maria Fantanarosa** was recognized for becoming the program's all-time winningest coach, while junior **Amanda Jackson** was recognized for being selected to the all-MAC first team. **MAC TOURNAMENT WRAPUP:** A familiar face took home the 2007 MAC Tournament title, as the Bowling Green Falcons earned their third straight conference tournament crown. With all 12 teams advancing to Cleveland for the first time, Bowling Green and Ball State advanced to the finals, with the Falcons posting a 67-53 win over the Cardinals.

**WINNING THE TURNOVER BATTLE:** After forcing 17 Western Michigan turnovers in the first round of the MAC Tournament, Miami finished the season +4.0 in turnover margin. Even more impressive is the fact that Miami forced its opponent into 14 or more turnovers in every MAC game this season, including 20 or more turnovers seven times. Miami also converted defense into offense, as it is averaged 19.4 points per game off turnovers in conference play.

**MASTERS OF THE SWIPE:** Finishing with seven steals in its MAC Tournament loss to Western Michigan, Miami wrapped up the season with 322



steals (10.7 spg), which was nearly 3.0 steals per game more than its opponents (7.8 spg) ... The RedHawks finished their conference slate ranked second in the MAC in steals during conference play (11.25 steals per game) ... With a defense predicated on ball pressure and disrupting the passing lanes, the RedHawks reached double-digit steals in eight of their final 11 games and 19 times overall during the 2006-07 season ... Miami finished the season ranked third overall in the MAC in steals with 10.7 steals per game, with Jackson leading the team at 2.66 steals

per game.

**MAC ACCOLADES:** **Amanda Jackson** was tabbed as the Mid-American Conference East Division Player of the Week four times during the 2006-07 season. Her most recent honor was Feb. 26 after averaging 25.5 points per game and 5.5 rebounds in a pair of games against Akron and Kent State. Jackson also earned the MAC East Player of the Week award on Nov. 15, Nov. 29 and Jan. 8.

**FINISHING STRONG:** Noted for her ability to score points in bunches, junior guard **Amanda Jackson** was Miami's most impressive second-half performer during the 2006-07 season. The 5-foot-9 guard posted 11 second-half double-figure scoring efforts during MAC play, including 12 second-half points in Miami's loss to nationally-ranked Bowling Green in its final regular-season game. Jackson finished Miami's MAC slate averaging 12.2 second-half points per game and was held under 10 second-half points only five times in conference action.

**ON THE BOARDS:** Though she is perhaps more comfortable as a three, junior **Jaclyn Leininger** provided an important presence in the post for Miami, averaging 7.4 rebounds over the final 10 games of the season. Leininger finished the month of February with three double-doubles, and as Miami's most consistent post threat, Leininger averaged 8.3 points and 6.4 rebounds per game in conference play.

Sophomore **Jenna Schone** iced two free throws with six seconds remaining and junior **Amanda Jackson** made a dramatic comeback to the hardwood, as Miami escaped Cleveland State's Goodman Arena with an 86-84 season-opening victory over the host Vikings.

After trailing during much of the second half, Miami surged ahead over the final three minutes of the game only to see Cleveland State almost force overtime with a late 3-point field goal. Schone was fouled by a trapping CSU player on the ensuing in-bounds pass, however, and drained both free throws to regain the lead. Sophomore Stephanie Ford deflected a CSU pass on the game's final possession, preventing the Vikings from getting off a final shot and securing the victory.

Jackson, who returned to the floor for the first time since suffering a season-ending knee injury on Nov. 20 of last season, poured in a career-high 31 points and added six steals while reminding Miami fans just how much she was missed during a trying 2005-06 campaign.

Miami spent much of the first half battling through its opening-game jitters and trailed 17-9 after a Viking 3-pointer at the 12:16 mark. Struggling with foul trouble and facing a significant rebounding deficit, the RedHawks finally jump-started their offense by turning up the defensive intensity. Sparked by Jackson, who swiped five first-half steals, Miami clawed back into the game behind 16 first-half points off turnovers.

The RedHawks led by as many as 10 points after a Schone bucket to start the first half but the teams would battle back and forth throughout the half, with the game featuring 12 lead changes and 11 ties.

Miami led for all but nine seconds of the second half, but a late 3-pointer that rattled around the rim before finally falling in lifted Robert Morris University to a wild 90-89 victory and dropped the RedHawks to 1-1 on the year.

The RedHawks trailed by as many as eight points early in the first half but began to close the gap when the Colonials encountered foul trouble. A 3-pointer from junior **Amanda Jackson** put Miami ahead at 22-20, and the RedHawks held RMU to just four field goals over the final 10 minutes of the first half in building a 40-32 halftime edge.

## GAME 3

**Northwestern 80**

The Big Ten's first visit to Millett Hall since 1982 was an unpleasant one for the host Miami RedHawks, as Northwestern University blistered the RedHawks, 80-51, in women's basketball action.

Sophomore **Jenna Schone** led Miami early, hitting her first three shots, as the RedHawks pressed out to a 9-6 edge by the first media timeout. The Wildcats exploded out of the timeout, however, pouring in 11 unanswered points to claim their first edge of the night and force a Miami timeout. Trailing 17-9, Miami finally ended its drought with an **Ashleigh Brown** bucket at the 12-minute mark.

The RedHawks would trail by double digits on two occasions before **Eve Pyle** scored five straight Miami points to close the gap to seven points at 9:47. Northwestern, which continued to simmer from the field, would let Miami no closer and pressed out to a 15-point edge by the six-minute mark. The RedHawks would get no closer than 12 points over the remainder of the half, and a late Wildcat surge pushed the halftime score to 44-27.

It would go from bad to worse to start the second half. Miami could not get its offense untracked and trailed 57-27 by the time **Stephanie Ford** scored the RedHawks' first second-half points with a jumper at 14:48, ending a 13-0 Wildcat run. The RedHawks would never seriously threaten again, as NU pushed its advantage over 30 points by the seven-minute mark.

Leading the RedHawks, who finished the night at 24 percent from the field, was Pyle, who contributed a double-double of 12 points and 10 rebounds, including seven offensive boards.

## GAME 4

**Miami 90**  
**Wright State 63**

Nov. 21, 2006 • Dayton, OH

Led by junior **Sarah Hull's** career-high 23 points, Miami sprinted to a 90-63 victory over Wright State University at the E.J. Nutter Center. Hull scored 17 second-half points and was one of four RedHawks in double figures as Miami snapped its two-game losing skid.

Miami rebounded from a 29-point loss to Northwestern and posted its largest margin of victory since a 90-63 win over New Orleans on Nov. 25, 2006. Along with Hull, junior **Laura Markwood** (11), sophomore **Eve Pyle** (16) and sophomore **Stephanie Ford** (12) scored in double figures as Miami hit the 90-point mark for the second time this season. Sophomore **Jenna Schone** added a career-high 10 assists in the victory.

Miami opened on a 13-3 run, holding the Raiders without a field goal for the first 4:10 of the game. After Miami led by as many as 14, Wright State clawed its way back with a 15-7 run and trailed by only six at the 10-minute mark. Holding a 24-22 at the final media timeout, Ford and Hull combined to score Miami's final 10 points of the half and helped the RedHawks take a 34-28 lead into halftime.

The RedHawks opened the second half on a 14-4 run over the first four minutes, sparked by the hot shooting of Hull, who hit five 3-pointers in the second half. Miami stretched its lead to 62-45 with just under 12 minutes to play, and it grew to as many as 30 by the eight-minute mark, with Miami ripping off a 13-0 run and holding Wright State scoreless from the 11:30 to 7:20 marks.

Miami's lead hit 34 at the 4:10 mark, its largest of the game, and the RedHawks coasted over the final four minutes as they wrapped up a 27-point win.

## GAME 5

Despite a balanced scoring effort that saw four players hit double figures, Miami fell in overtime, 73-66, to the Northern Iowa Panthers in the opening game of the Basketball Travelers Husky Classic.

The RedHawks never found their rhythm in the extra session, shooting 1-for-9 in overtime and managing only a late layup from sophomore **Ashley Hawkins**. Senior **Amanda Jackson** led Miami with 18 points, while junior **Laura Markwood** chipped in her second double-double of the season with 12 points and 11 rebounds.

Northern Iowa jumped out to an 11-4 lead over the first four minutes of the game, but Miami cut Northern Iowa's lead to 16-12 by the 11:27 mark, as its pressure defense came up with five early steals. The two teams traded baskets for the remainder of the first half, as there were three ties and two lead changes, and a Panther basket with 55 seconds left gave Northern Iowa a 32-30 lead at intermission.

Northern Iowa went on a 7-0 run and took a 54-48 lead with 7:13 left in the game, but the RedHawks answered with a 10-3 run of their own, tying the game at 58-58 with 5:17 remaining. Miami went up, 62-59, but a pair of Northern Iowa baskets knotted the game at 64-64 with just under one minute to play. Both teams turned the ball over on in the final minute, and Northern Iowa's desperation three-pointer from halfcourt fell well short.

Northern Iowa then scored the first nine points in overtime and held Miami scoreless for the first 4:40 of the extra frame as it scored a seven-point win. Pyle (12 points) and Hawkins (10 points) also scored in double figures for Miami, but it was undone by its 37 percent shooting.

Senior **Amanda Jackson** scored a game-high 28 points and hit a pair of clutch free throws with 13.7 seconds remaining as Miami defeated the Saint Louis Billikens, 85-83, in the consolation game of the Basketball Travelers Husky Classic.

Sophomore **Jenna Schone** scored a career-high 19 points and 10 different RedHawks found their way into the scoring column as Miami defeated Youngstown State, 69-51, for its first home win.

On a chilly shooting night in which Miami converted on 35.5 percent of its shots, Schone was the RedHawks' hottest hand as she pumped in 14 second-half points and finished 8-of-13 from the floor. Junior **Amanda Jackson** added 17 points, five rebounds, four steals and two assists.

After Miami opened the game on a 7-0 run, Youngstown State responded and took an 8-7 lead with 15:52 left in the half. In addition to Leininger's 22 points -- which was two shy of a career high -- junior **Sarah Hull** (18 points), junior **Amanda Jackson** (13 points) and sophomore **Eve Pyle** (13 points) all hit double figures in points as Miami shot 51.7 percent from the floor. More importantly, the RedHawks converted their shots late, as Miami ended the game on a 9-0 run over the game's final 1:59 and handed the Wolverines a 10-point loss.

Miami sprinted out to an 11-4 lead over the first 5:38 and led for the final 16:30 of the first half as it shot 64 percent from the floor, including 4-of-8 from 3-point range. After halftime, Miami's lead grew to as many as 11 before a 17-5 Michigan run put the Wolverines in front, 68-67, with 6:52 remaining in the game.

Michigan tied the game at 72-72 with 3:10 left, but a 6-2 Miami run that included five straight points from Leininger, gave the RedHawks a 78-74 advantage with 1:32 remaining. Miami then forced a poor shot with the shot clock expiring on Michigan's next possession, and Hull hit a pair of free throws to put Miami up, 80-74, with 45 seconds left.

Michigan forced another shot in traffic with 35 seconds on the clock, and Pyle's layup with 16 seconds left after Miami broke a halfcourt trap effectively sealed the victory.

## GAME 10

**Miami 73**  
**Illinois State 89**

Dec. 9, 2006 • Normal, IL

Despite junior **Jaclyn Leininger's** second straight double-double, the Miami RedHawks fell to the Illinois State Redbirds, 89-73, at Redbird Arena. Leininger scored 18 points and grabbed a career-high 14 rebounds, but Miami never recovered from a 31-14 Illinois State run to close the first half as it suffered a 16-point loss.

Following up a 22-point, 11-rebound performance against Michigan, Leininger shot 8-of-11 from the floor and had a career high in rebounds for the second straight game. Leininger's 14 rebounds were the most for a Miami player since **Eve Pyle** grabbed 15 boards on Jan. 25, 2006 against Ball State. Pyle led the RedHawks in scoring with 19 points and added eight rebounds, while junior **Amanda Jackson** chipped in 10 points, five rebounds and five assists in a losing effort.

Miami jumped out to a 23-21 lead with 9:53 left in the first half, but a 31-14 run to close the half sent the RedHawks into the locker room down 49-37. The Redbirds hit five first-half 3-pointers while Miami's post rotation was hampered by foul trouble. Leininger picked up two fouls in the first seven minutes of the half, while sophomore **Stephanie Ford** and **Kris Coner** had three fouls and two fouls, respectively.

Illinois State's lead grew to as many as 17 in the second half, but seven straight Miami points from Leininger cut Miami's deficit to 12 with under 12 minutes left in game. A Leininger 3-pointer from the right wing was part of a 7-0 Miami run that cut Illinois State's lead to single digits at 71-63 with 9:50 remaining, but Leininger picked up her fourth foul at the 8:04 mark, and Illinois State held Miami without a field goal for the final 4:38 as it wrapped up a double-digit win.

A sluggish start by Miami sunk the RedHawks in an 88-70 loss to the Temple Owls at the Liacouras Center. Despite placing three players in double figures, led by junior **Sarah Hull's** 13 points, Miami trailed by 23 points at halftime and was unable to get on track in its 18-point loss.

Miami struggled throughout the game to find an answer for Temple's **Kamesha Hairston**—the nation's third-leading scorer—as she poured in 23 points, including 21 in the first half, and grabbed 13 rebounds. **Lady Comfort** also had 20 points for Temple, while juniors **Jaclyn Leininger** (12 points) and **Amanda Jackson** (10 points) hit double figures for Miami in the loss.

Temple opened the game on a 14-2 run and never looked back. Miami missed its first four shots but finally broke into the scoring column on an off-balance jumper by Hull with 18:09 left, and after cutting Temple's lead to single digits at 18-11, the Owls continued to surge and led, 37-21, with 7:08 remaining in the first half.

Boosted by a 13-6 run to close the half, Temple carried a 50-27 lead into intermission. Miami was out rebounded by Temple, 29-15, which included 12 offensive rebounds, and the RedHawks also struggled from the floor, connecting on only 36 percent of their shots.

The second half got off to a promising start as Leininger converted an old-fashioned three-point play, but Temple continued to pull away. The Owls led by as many as 34 before a late run, spearheaded by Miami's three freshmen, cut the deficit to under 20. One rookie who impressed playing career-high minutes was **Chanell Ridley**, who grabbed a team-high six rebounds and notched her first collegiate basket on a layup with 2:32 left in the game.

Head coach **Maria Fantanarosa** picked up her 132nd career win and surpassed **Pam Wettig** as the winningest coach in program history as Miami downed the IUPUI Jaguars, 87-79, at the IUPUI Gymnasium.

Five different RedHawks scored in double figures, led by junior **Amanda Jackson's** 21 points, as Miami snapped a three-game losing streak and won its first game on a season-long five game road trip.

Jackson broke out of a shooting slump with as she connected on 9-of-13 from the floor, while sophomore **Eve Pyle** (18 points, eight rebounds) and junior **Jaclyn Leininger** (12 points, nine rebounds) controlled the paint for Miami. Junior **Sarah Hull** (12 points) and sophomore **Ashley Hawkins** (11 points) also scored in double figures for Miami, and sophomore **Jenna Schone** dished out a career-high 11 assists.

Miami jumped out to a 21-16 lead by the 12-minute mark as the hot-shooting RedHawks hit nine of its first 12 shots. Pyle's pair of free throws with 9:18 left in the first half capped a 13-4 Miami run and extended the RedHawks lead to 29-20.

## GAME 16

**Akron 73**

Career-best scoring efforts from sophomores **Jenna Schone** and **Ashley Hawkins** carried Miami to its fourth straight win, as the RedHawks downed Akron, 79-73, at Millett Hall. Schone and Hawkins scored 27 and 21 points, respectively, as Miami moved to 3-0 in Mid-American Conference play for the first time since the 2001-02 season.

Junior **Amanda Jackson** also scored in double figures in the victory, notching 16 points and scoring her 1,000th career point at the 16:08 mark in the second half. Jackson became the third-fastest player in program history to join the 1,000-point club, hitting the mark in her 75th game.

Cold shooting by Miami in an early hole before a pair of free throws from freshman **Courtney Reed** gave the RedHawks their first lead of the game, 10-8, with 13:02 left in the half.

Miami took a 14-12 lead after back-to-back transition baskets from Hawkins and Jackson, but Akron answered with an 8-2 run, taking a 20-16 lead with 7:54 remaining. The Zips' lead grew to six by the six-minute mark, and Akron led for the rest of the half, carrying a 34-28 into intermission.

A furious rally by Miami fell short at the M.A.C. Center, as Kent State downed the RedHawks, 83-76. Despite a career-high 22 points from sophomore **Ashley Hawkins**, Miami nearly rallied from a pair of 10-point second-half deficits but ultimately dropped its first Mid-American Conference game of the season.

Miami sprinted out to an 11-3 lead after the first four minutes and forced Kent State to call an early timeout at the 16:05 mark. After Miami's lead hit 10 at 13-3, Kent State reeled off eight straight points and cut Miami's lead to 13-11 with 13:24 left in the first half. Miami then pushed its lead to 17-11 before a 9-2 run gave Kent State its first lead of the game at 20-19 at the 10-minute mark.

Kent State ended the first half on a 14-6 run and took a 44-34 lead into intermission. Miami turned the ball over three times in the final 2:56, and the Golden Flashes hit on 53.3 percent (16-of-30) from the floor.

In the second half, Kent State continued to convert easy baskets and still held a 52-42 edge with 16 minutes remaining. An 11-3 Miami run, however, brought the RedHawks right back, narrowing Kent State's lead to 56-53 with 7:49 remaining.

Miami knotted the game at 59-59 off sophomore **Jenna Schone's** 3-pointer from the right wing with 10:14 left to play but could not get over the hump, as the Golden Flashes pushed out to an 11-point lead at 79-68 with 3:26 remaining.

Four quick points from Hawkins and mid-range jumper from Schone cut Kent State's lead to 79-74 at the two-minute mark, but the RedHawks' rally fell short as the Golden Flashes converted their free throws down the stretch.

Despite nearly rallying from a 14-point deficit with under three minutes to play, Miami fell to the 17th-ranked Bowling Green Falcons, 64-56, at Millett Hall. Trailing 58-44 with 3:05 remaining, Miami put together a 12-2 run and pulled to within four with under 40 seconds but could not get over the hump as Bowling Green won its 30th consecutive Mid-American Conference game.

Hosting a ranked team for only the fourth time in program history, junior **Amanda Jackson** helped the RedHawks put a scare into the nationally-ranked Falcons, scoring a game-high 21 points. Sophomore **Jenna Schone** also had 18 points, but Bowling Green limited Miami to 32.4 percent shooting and held the RedHawks under 60 points for only the second time this season.

Jackson scored eight of Miami's first nine points, knotting the game at 9-9, and back-to-back baskets from sophomore **Stephanie Ford** and junior **Laura Markwood** staked Miami to 13-9 advantage at the 12-minute mark.

An 11-2 Bowling Green run put Miami in a six-point hole at 20-14, until Jackson hit a 12-footer that sparked a 6-0 Miami run. Miami went into halftime trailing 30-27, however, as Bowling Green held the RedHawks to 34.4 percent shooting from the floor in the first half.

A 7-4 Miami run to open the second half knotted the game at 34-34, but Bowling Green slowly pulled away, as a pair of free throws from Amber Flynn with 6:13 left pushed Bowling Green's lead to double digits at 51-41.

After Miami ripped off its 12-2 run in the final three minutes, Bowling Green missed four of six free throws in the final minute, but Miami could not convert, missing its final four shots.

Unable to overcome a slow start, Miami fell to Ball State, 90-62, at Worthen Arena as the Cardinals scored the first 11 points of the game and broke open a 10-point game late in the second half.

Junior **Amanda Jackson** led Miami with 12 points while sophomores **Eve Pyle** (11 points) and **Ashley Hawkins** (10 points) also hit double figures.

Ball State jumped out to an 11-0 lead less than four minutes into the game, hitting their first three attempts from behind the 3-point arc. Miami finally got on the scoreboard when Hawkins hit a transition jumper at the 16:20 mark.

Miami cut Ball State's lead to single digits by the 12-minute mark, but the Cardinals' hot shooting kept their lead at 23-14 with 11:12 left in the half.

Pushing its lead to as many as 19 points, Ball State controlled the remainder of the half and took a 44-29 lead into intermission. Ball State shot a blistering 62.1 percent in the first half (18-for-29), including 6-of-8 from behind the 3-point line.

Ball State kept its double-digit lead intact by scoring 10 of the first 16 points after halftime, but Miami slowly chipped away and pulled to within 12 at 59-48 with 11:34 left to play. Pyle's 3-pointer at the 15-minute mark sparked a 13-4 Miami run, while Hawkins also contributed six points in the spurt.

After an offensive rebound and putback from freshman **Ashleigh Brown** cut Ball State's lead to 10 points at 64-54, Ball State reeled off 17 straight points and pushed its edge to 81-54 with 4:32 left in the game.

Ball State closed the game on a 26-8 run over the final 8:36 and finished the game shooting 60.7 percent from the floor.

Sophomore **Ashley Hawkins** scored a career-high 28 points and sophomore **Eve Pyle** notched her third career double-double with 13 points and 11 rebounds as Miami ended a three-game losing skid with an 87-77 win over Toledo. Miami led by as many as 21 points in the second half and weathered Toledo's late second-half run as it snapped a seven-game losing streak against Mid-American Conference West Division opponents.

In her third 20-point effort of the season, Hawkins hit 11-of-19 shots from the floor and added a game-high six steals, while junior **Amanda Jackson** added 21 points, five rebounds and five assists. Sophomore **Jenna Schone** also dished out a career-high tying 11 assists in the win.

Miami scored the first nine points of the game, after a pair of Toledo baskets, the RedHawks extended their lead to 19-6 behind a 10-2 run. Miami's lead grew to as many as 14 after Schone's 3-pointer from the right wing at the 10:07 mark.

A 10-5 run from the Rockets pulled them to within single digits at 29-20, but the RedHawks kept their advantage above 10 points for the final five minutes and took a 41-30 lead into halftime.

Hawkins scored eight of Miami's first 10 points after intermission, and after Toledo cut Miami's lead to single digits, 10 straight RedHawk points, punctuated by Jackson's baseline 3-pointer with 12:18 remaining, extended the RedHawks' edge to 63-44.

Down by 21, the Rockets ripped off a 12-0 run, slicing the RedHawks' lead to nine at 76-67 with 4:23 left in the game. Toledo then pulled to within eight points at 78-70 with 1:36 to play, but baskets from Jackson and free throws from Schone and Pyle in the final 90 seconds sealed Miami's first home win against Toledo since Jan. 11, 1995.

Despite placing four players in double figures, including junior **Jaclyn Leininger** with her third career double-double, Miami fell, 82-70, to the Northern Illinois Huskies at the Convocation Center.

Leininger led Miami with 17 points and added 11 rebounds, while freshman **Courtney Reed** (12 points) and sophomores **Jenna Schone** (11 points) and **Ashley Hawkins** (11 points) also scored in double figures. Despite cutting a 17-point second-half deficit to five with under seven minutes to play, Miami could not get any closer as Northern Illinois won its sixth straight home game.

After Northern Illinois carried an 11-9 advantage into the first media timeout, the Huskies put together a 10-4 run and extended their lead to 21-13 with 12:47 left in the first half.

Northern Illinois' lead grew to double digits by the 12-minute mark, and the Huskies held the RedHawks without a field goal for the final 5:33, taking a 44-31 lead into intermission. The Huskies led by as many as 17 in the second half before Miami mounted a comeback, as back-to-back layups from Hawkins brought Miami to within single digits at 52-43 with 13 minutes left to play. The RedHawks kept chipping away as a 10-2 run started by Reed's 21-foot 3-pointer and capped by Schone's old-fashioned three-point play, cut the Huskies' lead to 62-57 with 7:04 remaining.

Miami could get no closer than five points as Northern Illinois put together a 13-3 run, pushing their lead to 75-60 and effectively putting the game out of reach with under three minutes to play.

A cold-shooting effort sunk Miami in a 74-56 loss to the Eastern Michigan Eagles at Millett Hall. Miami connected only on 28 percent of its shots and hit 18 field goals as its nine-game home winning streak against Eastern Michigan was snapped.

Despite converting 24 Eastern Michigan turnovers into 21 points, the game was decided in the painted area as the Eagles outrebounded the RedHawks, 55-33, and held a 40-22 advantage on points in the paint. Juniors **Amanda Jackson** (14 points) and **Jaclyn Leininger** (12 points) each scored in double figures for Miami in the loss.

Unable to overcome a sluggish start, Miami saw its losing streak hit three games as it fell, 90-68, to the Western Michigan Broncos at University Arena. Despite 23 points and 10 rebounds from junior **Jaclyn Leininger**, Miami trailed by 22 at halftime and was held to 35.2 percent shooting in the loss.

Miami was held scoreless for the game's first 4:26, and as its cold shooting continued, Western Michigan pushed its lead to 18-4 by the 12:28 mark. The only Miamian creating offense in the game's first nine minutes was Leininger, as she scored Miami's first eight points on a variety of mid-range jumpers, keeping Miami within 12 at 20-8 with 11:05 left in the half.

Miami trailed by as many as 21 in the first half and went into halftime down 41-22. With junior **Amanda Jackson** on the bench in foul trouble, Miami never got comfortable on the offensive end and finished the half shooting 27.8 percent from the floor. Jackson scored Miami's first 10 points of the second half, but Miami could not chip away at Western Michigan's lead and still trailed 50-34 with 15:49 remaining. Western Michigan increased its lead to 25 by the 10-minute mark and led by 20 until sophomore **Ashley Hawkins'** layup with 5:34 remaining made it 82-64.

Leininger's double-double was her team-leading fourth of the season. Carrie Moore, who entered the game as the nation's leading scorer, paced Western Michigan with 29 points and 11 rebounds.

Running into the hot-shooting Ohio Bobcats, Miami fell, 87-74, at the Convocation Center. Ohio hit 58 percent of its shots, including 64 percent in the first half, as it handed Miami its fifth straight road loss.

Junior **Amanda Jackson** led Miami with 21 points, while sophomores **Jenna Schone** (19 points) and **Ashley Hawkins** (12 points) also scored in double figures. The difference in the game was the final 12 minutes of the first half, as the Bobcats turned a one-point lead into a 52-28 halftime advantage with a 30-7 run over the final 11:55 of the first half.

It was a tale of two halves for the Miami RedHawks in its 86-76 loss to Kent State at Millett Hall. After Miami led by three points at halftime, Kent State shot 72 percent from the floor over the final 20 minutes and limited Miami to 29 percent shooting in the second half as the RedHawks dropped their third straight game.

Junior **Amanda Jackson** scored 23 points and moved into a fourth place on the Miami single-season scoring list with 496 points, while sophomore **Jenna Schone** also topped the 20-point mark, finishing with a game-high 26 points.
