SERIES HISTORY: Miami holds a 17-3 lead in the all-time series with Wright State. Last season, the RedHawks avenged a loss to Wright State, defeating the Raiders 90-63 in Millett Hall. The last time both squads faced off in Oxford, Wright State won 70-60 in the 2005-06 season.

WEEKEND IN REVIEW: Miami concluded its series of WNIT games with wins over Radford and IUPUI in the WNIT last weekend. Miami opened up with a 74-67 win thanks in part to 22 second-half points from senior guard **Amanda Jackson** and 10 second-half points from sophomore guard **Courtney Reed**. The Red and White came out of the locker room and shot 54.3 percent in the second-half to overcome its six-point halftime deficit. Miami continued its hot shooting against the IUPUI Jaguars as five RedHawks' scored in double-figures in the win. Jackson led the team with 21 points, while junior guard **Ashley Hawkins**, who combined for only three points in Miami's first two games, scored 14 points and recorded her first double-digit scoring effort of the season. Senior forward **Laura Markwood** went 6-of-8 from the line en route to scoring 11 points and Markwood also corralled 13 rebounds, her first double-double of the season.

JACKSON NAMED MAC EAST CO-PLAYER OF THE WEEK: Senior guard Amanda Jackson did not start her season the way she had planned when she put in nine points in a season-opening loss to Notre Dame on Nov. 9. However, Jackson put in two great performances in the final two games of the WNIT, leading the RedHawks to their first two wins of the season. Jackson put in 29 points in Miami's win over Radford, before collecting 21 points in the win over IUPUI. Against IUPUI, Jackson was 7-of-11 from the floor, including 5-of-7 from behind-the-arc. Jackson's five three-pointers set a career-high for three-point field goals made in a game.

MS. DOWNTOWN: Midway through the first half of Miami's win over Radford on Friday, Nov. 16, junior guard **Jenna Schone** hit her 100th three-pointer in her career. She becomes the ninth Miami player to make 100 treys in her career and she currently sits in ninth place on the career-chart. She enters this week's games with 104 career three-point field goals.

ON THE GLASS: Senior forward **Laura Markwood** began her final season in Oxford with a solid performance in a loss to Notre Dame on Nov. 9. Despite scoring five points, Markwood collected a game-high 12 rebounds, including seven offensive boards. Markwood continued her success on the glass against Radford and IUPUI. The Perrysburg, Ohio native set a career-high with 16 rebounds against the Highlanders, before registering her first double-double of the season with 11 points and 13 rebounds against the Jaguars. It is the first time in Markwood's career that she has collected double-figure rebounds in three consecutive games.

STARTING WHERE SHE LEFT OFF: To end the 2006-07 season, junior guard **Jenna Schone** scored in double-figures in her last six games, including a career-high 26 points against Kent State on February, 24. Schone has been Miami's most consistent scorer this season putting up 16 points against No. 24 Notre Dame and Radford, before registering 10 points in the win over IUPUI.

INSTANT IMPACT: Sophomore guard **Courtney Reed** has provided the RedHawks consistent scoring of the bench this season. Reed is one of two RedHawks' to score in double-figures in all-three games this season. Her three double-figure scoring game have already surpassed her

HEAD COACH MARIA FANTANAROSA: A

former standout on the court for the Red and White, **Maria Fantanarosa** is in her 10th season working the sidelines for the Miami women's basketball program and owns a 140-123 (.532) record at Miami. Fantanarosa surpassed Pam Wettig as the winningest coach in program history with an 87-79 victory over IUPUI (Dec. 30, 2006), winning her 132nd career game with the Red and White.

After taking over a team that had no freshman class in 1998, she guided the team to a program-record six straight winning seasons, including two MAC East Division Championships. In 2003-04, Fantanarosa led Miami to its first MAC Championship and 20-win season since 1989-90 while earning MAC Coach of the Year honors.

Fantanarosa also has helped Miami players to all-MAC accolades 13 times, including 2001-02 MAC Player of the Year Heather Cusick. After the 2005-06 season, she received a contract extension that carries her through 2011.

A 1990 graduate of Miami, Fantanarosa was a two-time All-MAC honoree for the Red and White. Following her graduation, she went on to serve as an assistant women's basketball coach for Xavier (1990-94) and South Carolina (1994-97) before serving a one-year stint as head coach at Western Carolina (1997-98).

One of the most prolific scorers in high school girls basketball history, Fantanarosa's 3,823 career points while at Mt. Carmel Area High School in Kulpmont, Pa., rank among the all-time top 10 nationally.

double-scoring efforts of last season (2). Reed made the first start of her career against IUPUI last Saturday and she did not disappoint. She played the most minutes of her career (25) and went 4-of-7 from the field for 10 points. She also corralled two rebounds and dished out a career-high five assists.

INJURY UPDATE: In a scrimmage prior to the start of the 2007-08 season, senior forward **Jaclyn Leininger** suffered a season-ending knee injury. Leininger will redshirt this season and return in the 2008-09 season to complete her last season of eligibility.

PLAYER MILESTONES: After scoring nine points in Miami's season opener, senior **Amanda Jackson** surpassed former Miami player and current Miami assistant coach, **Colleen Day**, for seventh place on Miami's career scoring list. Jackson currently has 1,326 career points, and is 403 points away from becoming Miami's all-time leading scorer ... With 232 career steals, Jackson ranks fifth all-time at Miami ... Jackson's career scoring average of 14.4 points per game ranks third on the Miami all-time list.

GUESS WHO'S BACK: An array of experience returns from last year's squad including First-Team All-MAC performer, senior guard **Amanda Jackson**. Along with Jackson, Miami's two other top scorers for a year ago, junior guards **Jenna Schone** and **Ashley Hawkins**, provide the RedHawks a high-powered offensive attack. Senior forward **Laura Markwood** anchors the Miami frontcourt as fellow senior **Jaclyn Leininger** will miss the 2007-08 season due to a knee injury sustained in the off-season. Miami also returns sophomore guards **Courtney Reed** and **Ashleigh Brown**, while junior forward **Stephanie Ford** and sophomore forward **Chanell Ridley** look to bolster Miami's frontcourt.

NEW FACES: With 10 letterwinners returning, the RedHawks added strong depth in freshmen **Briana Dunlap**, **Michelle Oswald** and **Michele Weynandt**. As a senior at Hillcrest High School in Illinois, Dunlap averaged 19.8 ppg, 5.2 apg, 4.2 spg and knocked down 84 three-pointers. Oswald left West Lafayette High School as its all-time leading scorer and averaged 16.8 ppg, 5.7 rpg and 3.7 apg during her senior campaign. Weynandt comes to Miami from Schifflonge, Luxembourg.

WHEN IT'S OKAY TO ONE-UP YOUR COACH: Ranking seventh on the Miami career scoring list with 1,326 points, guard **Amanda Jackson** has surpassed current Miami head coach **Maria Fantanarosa** (14th; 1,086 career points), assistant coach **Lisa Hayden** (16th; 1,047 points) and assistant coach **Colleen Day** (1,269 points) on the Red and White's career scoring list.

2006-07 SEASON MILESTONES: In addition to her career milestones, guard **Amanda Jackson** left her mark on numerous single-season charts after her successful junior season ... With 515 points, Jackson's junior season ranks third on the Miami single-season scoring chart. She is one of only three players in program history to score more than 500 points in a season ... With 12 20-point games, Jackson tied **Heather Cusick's** single-season record for 20-point games ... Finishing with 80 steals, Jackson ended the year ranked 10th on the single-season steals chart ... Converting 117 free throws, Jackson set a junior record for free throws made, besting **Cindi Merrill's** 2004-05 record of 96 ... **Jenna Schone** (136 assists) ended her sophomore season ranked eighth on the single-season assists chart.

DOUBLE-FIGURE FUN: A talented offensive player, guard **Amanda Jackson** finished the 2006-07 season with 16 double-figure scoring efforts in the season's final 18 games. As Miami's leading scorer at 17.2 points per game, Jackson was held under 10 points only twice in 2007. Making a successful return from a knee injury that sidelined her for all but 10 minutes of the 2005-06 season, Jackson hit double-figure points in 24 of Miami's 30 games, including 10 20-point games and two 30-point games.

THE HAWK: As a potent scoring threat, sophomore guard **Ashley Hawkins** averaged 14.0 points per game over the final six games of her sophomore season. After being held to a combined 15 points in losses to Eastern Michigan (Feb. 7) and Western Michigan (Feb. 10), Hawkins responded with double-figure points in five of Miami's final six games, including 14 points in Miami's MAC Tournament loss to Western Michigan. The 5-foot-9 guard was arguably Miami's most improved player during the 2006-07 season, as she more than doubled her scoring average from her freshman season from 5.2 ppg to 11.0 ppg. After moving into the starting lineup at the beginning of MAC play, Hawkins registered four 20-point games and finished as the team's second-leading scorer in conference play at 13.4 points per game.

THE FLOOR GENERAL: Averaging 15.8 points per game over Miami's final six games of the season, sophomore **Jenna Schone** upped her season scoring average to 11.8 ppg and finished as the team's second-leading scorer. Schone was also Miami's best distributor, dishing out 136 assists (4.5 assists per game) and posting three double-digit assist efforts. Schone ended the regular season ranked in the top six in the conference in assists in overall games (5th, 4.53 apg) and MAC-only contests (6th, 4.31 apg). Schone has started all 58 games of her college career and was a 2006 All-MAC Freshman Team honoree.

MILESTONE VICTORY: With Miami's 87-79 victory over IUPUI on Dec. 30, 2006, head coach **Maria Fantanarosa** picked up her 132nd career win and became the winningest coach in program history. Fantanarosa surpassed former Miami mentor **Pam Wettig** as the all-time wins leader on her fourth attempt at the milestone win. Having finished her ninth season at the helm of the Red and White, Fantanarosa holds a 138-122 all-time mark as Miami's head coach.

THESE GUARDS ARE GOOD: Miami's backcourt closed the 2006-07 regular season strong, as they shouldered the bulk of the team's scoring load over the final six games. Miami's three starting guards — junior **Amanda Jackson** and sophomores **Jenna Schone** and **Ashley Hawkins** — combined to average 49.3 points per game over the season's final six games, with Jackson averaging 19.5 ppg during that stretch.

MASTERS OF THE SWIPE: Finishing with seven steals in its MAC Tournament loss to Western Michigan, Miami concluded last season with 322 steals (10.7 spg), which was nearly 3.0 steals per game more than its opponents (7.8 spg) ... The RedHawks finished their conference slate ranked second in the MAC in steals during conference play (11.25 steals per game) ... With a defense predicated on ball pressure and disrupting the passing lanes, the RedHawks reached double-digit steals in eight of their final 11 games and 19 times overall during the 2006-07 season ... Miami finished the season ranked third overall in the MAC in steals with 10.7 steals per game, with Jackson leading the team at 2.66 steals per game.

MAC ACCOLADES: **Amanda Jackson** was tabbed as the Mid-American Conference East Division Player of the Week four times during the 2006-07 season. Her most recent honor was Feb. 26 after averaging 25.5 points per game and 5.5 rebounds in a pair of games against Akron and Kent State. Jackson also earned the MAC East Player of the Week award on Nov. 15, Nov. 29 and Jan. 8.

In its opener of the 2007-08 season, Miami University's women's basketball team fell to Notre Dame in the opening round of the WNIT, 98-50.

The Fighting Irish hit six of their first seven shots out of the gates to take a 12-2 lead over the RedHawks with 16:56 remaining in the first half. Two free throws by senior guard Amanda Jackson kept the RedHawks within 10 points, 14-4, but Miami went scoreless over the next 5:17 and Notre Dame extended its lead to 30-4. Trailing 36-8, a three-point play by senior forward Laura Markwood and five more points by Jackson, including a three-pointer from the left wing, led Miami on a 10-0 run to cut its deficit to 36-18 with 6:03 left to play in the first half. A trey by Reed at the 5:24 mark and two free throws by Markwood with five seconds remaining would be all of the scoring for the rest of the half as the RedHawks trailed, 48-23, entering halftime.

Consecutive lay-ups out of the gate by Jackson and junior guard Courtney Reed followed by a trey from the right wing by junior guard Jenna Schone, with 18:34 to play in the second half, made the score 30-50 and gave the RedHawks a spark coming out of the half. From that point, the Fighting Irish went on a 21-3 run, giving Notre Dame a 71-33 lead at the 10:58 mark. Down the stretch, the Irish pulled away and the RedHawks dropped its opener, 98-50.

Schone led the RedHawks with 16 points and Markwood finished with five points and a game-high 12 rebounds. Miami held its own on the glass and grabbed 24 offensive rebounds in the game.

22 second-half points by senior guard Amanda Jackson and 10 second-half points by sophomore guard Courtney Reed led the RedHawks to a come-from-behind victory over Radford in the WNIT.

The RedHawks started off hitting only two of its first nine shots, while Radford started out 4-of-7 from the field as the Highlanders took an 8-5 lead into the first media timeout. A three-pointer by junior guard Jenna Schone at the 11:53 mark brought the RedHawks within one point, 11-10, which was Schone's 100th three-point field goal of her career. The Highlanders went on a 7-0 run of their own to regain a 25-19 advantage with 3:13 to play and their six-point lead stayed intact, as Radford went into the locker room up 29-23.

Jackson orchestrated the Miami offense in the first two minutes of the second half by getting to the line and hitting a pair of free throws, as well as finding Reed in the lane for two lay-ups. Two more buckets by Jackson tied the game at 35-35 with 16:27 remaining in the game. After a Schone lay-up brought Miami within one point, 42-43, at the 13:10 mark, a trey by Walker extended the Highlander lead to 46-42 heading into the under 12-minute media timeout. Reed provided a spark off the bench as she put in three consecutive lay-ups, putting Miami ahead, 48-46. Another Reed fast break lay-up followed by an assist from Reed to Jackson for an easy transition bucket extended Miami's lead to 52-47. After Radford closed to within two points, 55-53, three baskets by Jackson, including a trey from the right wing, gave Miami its largest lead of the game, 62-53, with 3:39 remaining in the second half. Miami's lead would hold down the stretch as the RedHawks defeated the Highlanders, 74-67.

In the final game of the WNIT, Miami had five players score in double figures as the RedHawks defeated the IUPUI Jaguars, 73-59.

Strong defensive ball pressure and rebounding coupled with good offensive execution gave the RedHawks a six-point lead at the first media timeout. Junior guard Ashley Hawkins scored off an 18-foot jumper in the first six seconds and junior guard Courtney Reed connected on back-to-back lay-ups to give Miami a 6-0 lead with 15:47 to play in the first half. Two free throws by senior forward Laura Markwood gave Miami a four-point lead, 10-6, but a seven-point spurt by IUPUI pushed the Jaguars ahead, 13-10, with 9:44 remaining in the half. From that point, Miami went on a 20-4 run to extend its lead to 30-17 at the 3:35 mark of the first half. During the run, junior guard Jenna Schone connected on two three-pointers and junior forward Stephanie Ford collected five points to pace Miami during its spurt. Miami headed into halftime with a 39-38 lead.

After Miami scored five consecutive points out of the half to take a 16-point lead, 44-28, the Jaguars went on a 10-0 run to close within 39-44 at the 13:17 mark. Holding on to a five-point lead, back-to-back three-pointers from Jackson and Hawkins helped push the RedHawk lead back to nine points, 52-43. Up 61-49, a trey by Markwood followed by a Jackson floater gave the RedHawks a 14-point lead, 63-49 heading into the final eight minutes of the game. Two Cunningham free throws left the Jaguars down 11 points, 63-53, and five consecutive points by Jackson gave Miami its biggest lead of the game, 70-52. From that point, Miami cruised to a 73-59 win.
