### REDHAWKS FACE MICHIGAN STATE IN THIRD STRAIGHT NCAA TOURNAMENT:

Following another remarkable Mid-American Conference postseason run, Miami University's women's soccer team makes its third consecutive NCAA Tournament appearance at 11 a.m. this Friday when it faces Big Ten foe, Michigan State in Ann Arbor, Mich.

Miami, which is making its third NCAA postseason appearance and fourth by a MAC team, faces a potent Michigan State team that will be making its first NCAA Tournament appearance. The Spartans enter the first-round clash after being upset by Wisconsin in the first round of the Big Ten Tournament. The Spartans enter the tournament with the most wins since 2000, (12) and have tallied 10 shutouts in those. Michigan State's 5-3-2 conference mark is its best since 1994.

Joining Miami and Michigan State at Ann Arbor for the first and second rounds are Oakland and Michigan, who kick off at 2 p.m. Friday. The Wolverines (13-5-2), who received an at-large bid, come to the tournament rated fourth in the Great Lakes Region according to the NSCAA while Oakland (10-11-1), is one of just two teams in the 64-team field with a sub .500 record after winning the Mid-Continent Conference Tournament title. The Grizzlies earned the Mid-Con's automatic bid in a shootout over top-seeded Oral Roberts. The winners of the two first-round contests meet at 11:30 a.m. Sunday for the right to advance to the final 16-team field.

Included elsewhere in Miami's 16-team bracket are Pepperdine, Wisconsin-Milwaukee, Wisconsin and Marquette, who are playing at Marquette; Villanova, Yale, Hartford and Nebraska, who are competing at Villanova; and Arizona State, Washington State, Creighton and Santa Clara, who are playing at Santa Clara.

**UNFAMILIAR TERRITORY:** While all three of the other teams at the opening-round site have faced each other this season, none have clashed with the RedHawks. Michigan and Michigan State tied, 1-1, in double overtime on Oct. 25, while Michigan topped Oakland two days later, 2-0.

**HISTORY AGAINST THE FIELD:** Having faced just Michigan, Miami is 0-1 versus its first and potential second-round opposition. In the 2000 NCAA Tournament, also hosted in Ann Arbor, Mich., the RedHawks lost a hard-fought 4-3 double-overtime game to the Wolverines in their first NCAA tournament appearance.

**COMMON DENOMINATORS:** Miami and Michigan State have faced four of the same teams during the 2002 campaign: Bowling Green, Eastern Michigan, Central Michigan and Purdue. The Spartans were 4-0 against those teams, posting a 4-0 win over the Falcons, a 3-0 triumph against the Eagles, a 2-1 decision versus the Boilermakers and 3-0 win against the Chippewas. Miami, on the other hand, is 4-1-1 against common foes. The RedHawks claimed 3-0 wins over BGSU during the regular season and in the Mid-American Conference Tournament semifinal, topped EMU, 2-1, tied Purdue, 1-1 (OT), in the regular-season finale, and dropped a regular-season game to CMU (2-3) but triumphed over the Chippewas in the MAC quarterfinal, 5-1.

**COMMON DENOMINATORS PART II:** Michigan entertained Mid-American Conference rivals Western Michigan and Eastern Michigan this season, triumphing 3-1 and 5-1, respectively. Their other common opponent was Purdue, who the Wolverines lost to, 1-0. Oakland faced MAC foes Central Michigan, Western Michigan and Toledo and Big Ten opponent Purdue during the regular season. The Grizzlies were 2-2 against common foes, falling to Central Michigan, 2-3, and Purdue, 3-4, in double-overtime, while defeating Western Michigan, 4-0, and Toledo, 2-1.

**AGAINST THE NCAA TOURNAMENT FIELD:** Miami is 0-0-1 against the 2002 NCAA Tournament field, having faced Purdue in its regular-season finale, and tying the Boilermakers in overtime, 1-1.

**HISTORY AGAINST THE REST OF THE FIELD:** In its six-year history, Miami has faced nine of the 64 teams in the 2002 NCAA Tournament: Ohio State (0-1), Purdue (0-0-1), Utah (0-1), West Virginia (1-0), Dayton (0-2), Michigan (0-1), Southern Methodist (0-1), Kentucky (0-1) and Cincinnati (2-0). The RedHawks are 3-8-1 against those teams.

**TOURNAMENT OPPONENTS FROM THE PAST:** Entering its third NCAA Tournament, all three of Miami's previous postseason opponents earned berths in the 2002 NCAA Tournament. The RedHawks return to the site of their first tournament appearance this season, traveling to Ann Arbor, Mich. In 2000, the RedHawks narrowly missed advancing to the second round, being edged by No. 25 Michigan 4-3 in a thrilling double-overtime battle. Last season, Miami traveled to Morgantown, W.Va., and faced West Virginia, topping the host Mountaineers 1-0 before falling to local rival Dayton, 2-0. West Virginia is again hosting opening round games and Dayton is one of the four teams at that site.

**TOURNAMENT TESTED:** Miami makes its third consecutive NCAA Tournament appearance and tries to continue the momentum that it has produced from the last two NCAA runs. Miami has more NCAA tournament experience than two of the three opponents in its first and second round bracket. This will be the Spartans' first showing in the national tournament in its 11 year history. Oakland made its initial NCAA appearance last season, falling in the first round to eventual "Sweet 16" participant Cincinnati by a 3-2 score. Michigan is the most familiar with the NCAA tournament. The Maize and Blue will host the first two rounds of competition for the sixth straight year.

**HOME COOKING:** Three of Miami's key components to its successful season will be returning to their home state for the NCAA Tournament. Freshman starters Leigh Terry (Grand Haven, MI/Grand Haven) and Lindsay Dunmead (Northville, MI/Northville), and sophomore reserve Megan Shapiro (Grosse Pointe, MI/South) will all be returning to the Great Lakes State for the second time this season. Miami traveled to Kalamazoo, Mich to play Western Michigan on Oct. 20.

**'HAWKS IN THE MAC TOURNEY:** The RedHawks, who appeared in the MAC tournament for the fourth time in as many years, have never been defeated in MAC Tournament play, boasting a 11-0-1 record. Miami defeated Central Michigan, Bowling Green and Ohio on its way to a third MAC Tournament title and NCAA berth. Last season, the RedHawks knocked Buffalo, Eastern Michigan and Central Michigan out of the tournament to make it two straight. In 2000, Miami stopped Ohio, Buffalo and Bowling Green en route to its first crown.

**DEFENSE WINS CHAMPIONSHIPS:** Without question, the key to Miami's success in MAC Tournament play has been its defense. In twelve tournament games, Miami has given up only five goals and boasts a remarkable 0.40 goals against average, including seven shutouts. Miami blanked the opposition in five consecutive MAC postseason matches between the 1999 championship game and 2001 MAC quarterfinal. Over the past four tournaments, Miami has placed six defenders and a goalkeeper on the MAC all-tournament team.

**ON THE OFFENSIVE:** Although the Miami defense has been exceptional, the RedHawk offense also has risen to the occasion during MAC tournament play. The RedHawk offense has outscored their MAC tournament opponents 34-5 over the last four years. Senior forward Danielle Berkemeier has been named to the all-tournament team the past three seasons and senior forward Andrea Cunningham earned all-tournament team honors during her freshman year. Senior midfielder Katie Milligan is the second RedHawk who has been on the all-tournament team during the past three MAC tournaments.

**MAC RECORDS:** In Mid-American Conference history, no team had won 11 conference games until Miami defeated Marshall on Oct. 27. Miami's 11 wins broke the 2001 Ohio Bobcat record for most conference wins in a season. Ohio went 10-2 during its 2001 season. The RedHawk's .917 conference winning percentage is the highest in MAC history at the completion of the conference season. The RedHawks tied the 1997 Northern Illinois squad, 1998 Ohio and Northern Illinois squads, and the 1999 Eastern Michigan squad with only one loss at the end of the conference season. None of the four teams accumulated 10 wins because the league did not have 13 MAC women's soccer schools until last season.

Miami's overall record is also a MAC record for most wins in a season and least losses in a season. The RedHawks broke their own MAC record when they finished the 2000 season with 17 wins and only three losses.

**MISS OCTOBER/NOVEMBER:** Typically known for her play in November, senior forward Danielle Berkemeier got an early start this year by scoring in seven of the nine games Miami played in October. Berkemeier scored eight goals total in October.

Berkemeier still hasn't given up her title of Miss November either. Through 15 postseason games over the past four seasons, Berkemeier has netted 16 goals, including a remarkable eight game-winning strikes.

The senior forward leads the team with 19 goals and 44 points this season.

**FINAL RECORD:** Not only did Miami set MAC records with its 11-1-0 conference mark, the RedHawks also set Miami program marks. Until this year, Miami's best MAC finish came when it finished 8-3-0 in the MAC during the 1999 season. Last year, the RedHawks went 8-3-1 through the MAC season. The Red and White also eclipsed the 15-3-0 mark set in 1999 for the best record in Miami history at the end of the season with a 15-2-2 record. Before Oct. 20th, Miami stood a half-game behind the 1999 start when the 1999 team opened the season with a 14-2-0 record through 16 games.

**MOVIN' ON UP:** The RedHawks earned their highest rating in school history this week, sixth in the Soccerbuzz.com Great Lakes Region rankings. Miami found itself rated eighth in the NSCAA Great Lakes Region poll for the third consecutive week.

This is the first time in school history that the RedHawks have been rated in five consecutive Great Lakes Region polls. Miami was receiving votes two weeks prior to their ranking, making it the first time the RedHawks had their name on seven consecutive polls.

Miami ended the season last year with seventh place in the Soccerbuzz.com Great Lakes Region rankings.

**TWO OF A KIND:** In the month of November, senior forwards Danielle Berkemeier and Andrea Cunningham have combined for nine goals, six assists and 24 points through three games. The two four-year players both earned hat tricks in the MAC Tournament this week.

Cunningham surpassed former Buffalo standout Paula Listrani as the MAC's career scoring leader on a second-half goal versus Buffalo on Nov. 6, 2001.

Berkemeier passed Listrani's 105 all-time points with a game-winning goal versus Georgia Southern on Sept. 8, 2002 to win the inaugural Miami/Adidas Invitational. Berkemeier and Cunningham are the only players in Miami soccer history (men's or women's), and second and third in MAC women's soccer history, to surpass the century mark for career points.

Berkemeier currently has 148 points while Cunningham holds 140 all-time points.

**HEAD COACH BOBBY KRAMIG:** Entering his sixth season at the helm of Miami's women's soccer program is veteran head coach Bobby Kramig. Kramig, who has headed the women's program since its inception in 1997, has been the mentor of Miami Soccer for the past 19 years.

As women's coach, Kramig has successfully guided the program through its transition from club to varsity status. In 1997, the inaugural team finished the season ranked fourth in the nation among first-year programs and placed three players on the Soccer Buzz first-year all-national team. In 1999, Kramig led the RedHawks to a landmark season that included a trip to the MAC Championship match and a Miami record 17 wins.

Kramig led the Red and White deep into the postseason in 2000, guiding the RedHawks to a 13-8-0 overall record, a MAC Tournament Championship and an NCAA Tournament berth.

2001 brought a new high for the RedHawk soccer program when Miami finished with a 15-7-1 record, a MAC Tournament title, and an upset of nationally ranked West Virginia in the first round of the NCAA Tournament.

Over the past six seasons, Miami has compiled a 75-41-7 mark (.638), including an astonishing mark of 63-20-4 (.747) and four consecutive MAC Championship appearances over the past four seasons.

**CREATURES OF HABIT:** The Miami soccer team has begun a trend they would like to continue. The RedHawks have gone 7-1-1 during each of the past two months while eclipsing many Miami and MAC records. If the RedHawks were to roll off seven wins in November before a loss, that would put Miami in the NCAA Final Four.

**GREAT EXPECTATIONS:** Though, as head coach Bobby Kramig says, the proof is in the pudding, Miami earned more than its share of preseason recognition. For the second consecutive season, Miami was selected by the league coaches as the favorite to win the 2002 MAC regular-season and tournament championships. Miami amassed 166-of-169 votes along with 11 first place votes for the regular season crown.

**ON THE ROAD AGAIN:** Miami has been far more successful in the past on its home turf posting a 38-16-5 mark, however, the RedHawks have also excelled on the road. Since Sept. 7 of 2001 the RedHawks have posted an 18-4-0 mark. Miami has a 33-22-2 mark away from Miami Soccer Field over the past five years on the road, but had managed only one season with a winning road record before last year, a 7-3-1 mark in 1999. The Red and White used a strong postseason run, to finish the 2000 road ledger at 5-5.

**HOT KEEPER:** Freshman goalkeeper Leigh Terry went 349 minutes without allowing a goal until Northern Illinois freshman Chanelle Crosby scored in the 81st minute on Nov. 18th. Terry's scoreless streak is the longest streak set by a single goalkeeper in Miami history. It was the second longest scoreless streak that Miami has amassed during the 2002 campaign.

The longest shutout and scoreless streak Miami has ended at five games and 554 minutes when Ohio's Rachael Najjar scored in the 49th minute on Sept. 27 of this year. The streak included five straight shutouts that dated back to Sept. 6th when the RedHawks gave up a goal in the 54th minute against St. John's. Senior Katie Karlander, junior Emily Smith, and Terry combined to set the all-time scoreless-minute streak. Miami has shut out 10 of its last 19 opponents and allowed only 12 goals during that time period.

The 554 minutes of scoreless play broke a Miami record that dated back to the RedHawks' 2000 MAC Tournament Championship run in which they posted 317 scoreless minutes. The streak included victories over Ohio, Buffalo, and a double-overtime win over Bowling Green.

The RedHawks' 10 shutouts on the 2002 season surpasses the nine that Miami had last year for the all-time mark.

**PLAY ON PLAYA'S:** For the second consecutive season, a Miami soccer player was named MAC Player of the Year, as senior Danielle Berkemeier earned the top honor from her peers at the annual MAC Women's Soccer Awards Banquet.

Joining Berkemeier on the first-team was last year's MAC Player of the Year, senior Andrea Cunningham, seniors Danielle Altiero and Audry Wieman along with sophomore Ashley Swinehart.

Also honored from the RedHawks was second-team selection senior Shaedyn Cousino, who joined Cunningham and Berkemeier as four-time all-MAC honorees.

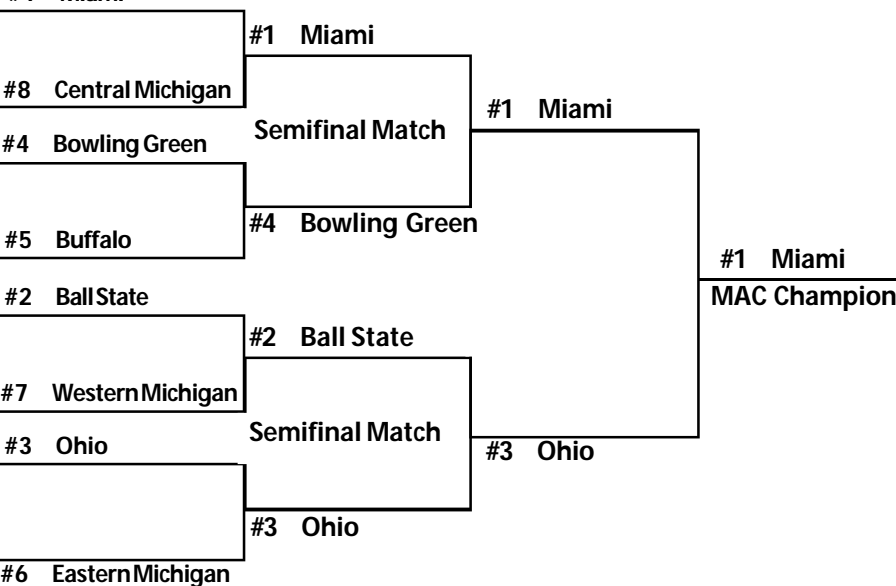
