The No. 13 Missouri wrestling team will take place in the restructured 2012 NWCA/Cliff Keen National Duals this weekend, serving as one of six participants in the Rutgers Regional in Piscataway, N.J. Joining the Tigers will be Cal Poly, No. 14 Kent State, No. 11 Michigan, No. 4 Minnesota and host Rutgers.

The Tigers earned the No. 3 seed and will face off against Cal Poly on Saturday at 1 p.m. On the other side of the bracket, fourth-seeded Kent State and Rutgers, the No. 5 seed, will battle. The winner of the Missouri-Cal Poly match will get No. 2 seed Michigan in the semifinals, while the Rutgers-Kent State winner will take on top-seeded Minnesota.

There are four regional sites overall, made up of six teams each. The winner of each regional will advance to next weekend's Final Four and Championship round, held at a site that will be announced. The NWCA has received bids from Oklahoma State, Minnesota, and Missouri to host the Championship round on Sunday, Feb. 19, should their programs qualify. The University of Northern Iowa has also committed to hosting the Championship Round regardless of whether their team qualifies or not. The other regionals include:

- Iowa State (Ames, Iowa): Iowa, Oregon State, Virginia Tech, Wisconsin and Northern Iowa
- Cornell (Ithaca, N.Y.): Central Michigan, Oklahoma, Purdue, Illinois and American
- Oklahoma State (Stillwater, Okla.): Boise State, Ohio State, Nebraska, Wyoming and Chattanooga

SCOUTING CAL POLY

The Cal Poly Mustangs come into the weekend with a 5-6 record on the season, though have lost four of their last five. Last Saturday, the Mustangs fell to Utah Valley by a 19-17 final, but they knocked off Arizona State, 26-11, the week prior. For the year, the Mustangs have wins over Cal State Bakersfield, Menlo College, Boise State and San Francisco State, while they've lost to Oregon State, American, Stanford, Wyoming and Air Force.

Cal Poly currently has three wrestlers ranked in the top-20 of the latest InterMat poll, led by 141 pounder Boris Novachkov, who is second in the country and 25-2 on the year. Ryan DesRoches ranks fourth at 174 pounds and has a record of 23-1, while Ryan Smith is 18th at 197 with a 19-9 mark.

Missouri and Cal Poly have met four times prior, with the Tigers taking three of those contests. Mizzou's three wins came in their first three meetings, but the Mustangs were victorious last time they faced off in 2009-10, winning by a 22-15 score.

Tigers and Golden Flashes have faced off twice this year ... Mizzou won 34-12 at Kent State in December; Kent State won 18-14 at the Virginia Duals last month ... Mizzou leads the all-time series 5-1-0.

• Michigan: Come in at No. 11 in the NWCA poll ... currently 6-5 on the season with a 4-4 record in Big Ten action ... took second at the Cliff Keen Las Vegas Invitational ... placed first at Mat Town Invitational ... split their last six duals, beating Indiana, No. 19 Central Michigan and Michigan State while falling on the road to No. 3 Minnesota, No. 6 Ohio State and No. 2 Penn State ... seven of their 10 starters are ranked in the top-20: Zac Stevens (133, 16th), Kellen Russell (141, 1st), Eric Grajales (149, 6th), Dan Yates (165, 13th), Justin Zeerip (174, 8th), Max Huntley (197, 15th) and Ben Apland (HWT, 10th) ... Mizzou is 1-3-0 all-time against Michigan.

For the fourth time in program history and first time since 2007, the University of Missouri will play host to the Big 12 Wrestling Championships, held in the Hearnes Center. The event will take place on Saturday, March 3, 2012. Head to mutigers.com for information on purchasing tickets.

WATERS AGAIN PICKED AS WRESTLER OF THE WEEK

For the third time this season, Missouri's Alan Waters has been named the Big 12 Wrestler of the Week, as announced on Monday, Feb. 6. Waters becomes just the second Tiger in program history with three career Wrestler of the Week honors, tying him with Ben Askren for most all-time. In total, Missouri wrestlers have now won four league weekly awards in one season for the first time in the Big 12 era. Waters joins current Oklahoma athlete Kendric Maple and former Oklahoma State star Jordan Oliver as the only wrestlers to be honored by the Big 12 three times in one season.

WRESTLING KNOCKS OFF NO. 10 OU, 25-12

With four big wins to close out the dual – two of those with bonus points – the No. 13 Missouri Tigers (12-3, 3-2 Big 12) defeated the No. 10 Oklahoma Sooners (12-3 (2-2 Big 12) by a 25-12 final on Sunday. Mizzou got out to a 6-0 lead with a pair of wins over top-10 opponents, as No. 3 Alan Waters knocked off No. 8 Jarrod Patterson by a 7-0 score, and No. 8 Nathan McCormick defeated No. 10 Jordan Keller, 5-3. The two teams were squared away at 9-9 at the midway point before Oklahoma jumped ahead 12-9 with a win at 165. However, the Tigers got four straight wins to end the match, including a major decision by Dorian Henderson and a fall by Mike Larson to pull out the win.

TIGERS FALL TO NO. 1 OSU, 22-12

The No. 13 Missouri wrestling team took the No. 1 Oklahoma State Cowboys down to the wire on Saturday afternoon, but couldn't pull out a couple of tight matches and ultimately fell by a 22-12 score. Opening the dual at 157, the Tigers jumped out to a 6-0 lead after No. 15 Drake Houdashelt beat No. 9 Albert White, 3-1, and Zach Toal defeated Dallas Bailey by a 5-4 decision. Oklahoma State evened things up with two decisions of their own before No. 11 Brent Haynes upset No. 7 Blake Rosholt, 10-4. No. 3 Alan Waters shut out No. 13 Jon Morrison by a 4-0 score to give the Tigers a 12-9 lead with three matches left, but the Cowboys swept the last three contests, including a win by fall and a major decision victory.

NO. 15 MIZZOU DOMINATES QUAD MEET

The No. 15 Missouri wrestling team improved to 11-2 on the season, as they swept the quad meet hosted by Southern Illinois-Edwardsville. The Tigers scored victory against Eastern Michigan, SIUE and Truman State, shutting out the latter two opponents and winning 28 of the 30 matches on the day. Missouri defeated Eastern Michigan, 25-6, SIUE, 42-0, and Truman State, 52-0. The Tigers scored 18 bonus point victories, including winning all 10 matches against Truman State by major decision or better.

WATERS EARNS SECOND WOW HONOR

For the second time this season, sophomore Alan Waters has been named as the Big 12 Wrestler of the Week, as announced on Jan. 17. Waters was recognized with the award back on Dec. 12, 2011, while junior Brent Haynes won the award last week. This is the first time that Mizzou has had three Wrestler of the Week winners since the 2006-07 season.

Waters was a perfect 3-0 at the Virginia Duals this past weekend, helping the Tigers reach the championship bout. He opened things up with a 4-2 victory over No. 19 Trent Sprinkle of North Dakota State, as Mizzou went on to win 24-9. In the semifinals against Edinboro, Waters defeated Kory Mines by a 6-2 score, helping the Tigers pull out a 19-16 victory. Despite the team loss in the championship to Kent State, Waters scored his second win of the year over No. 4 Nic Bedelyon. The two battled into overtime, with Waters scoring the decisive takedown in sudden victory. Waters is now 3-0 all-time against Bedelyon.

MISSOURI FINISHES IN SECOND AT VIRGINIA DUALS

The Missouri wrestling team saw their seven dual winning streak come to an end on Saturday night, as they fell by an 18-14 final to No. 22 Kent State in the championship of the Virginia Duals. The Golden Flashes won six of the 10 matches, overcoming two wins by major decision by the Tigers. The Tigers claimed victories over North Dakota State and No. 23 Edinboro earlier in the tournament to move into the finals.

Against Kent State, No. 3 Alan Waters scored his third career victory - second of the season - over No. 4 Nic Bedelyon with a 7-5 win in sudden victory. However, Kent State would claim the next three victories to take a 9-3 lead. Drake Houdashelt scored a major decision and Zach Toal picked up a late third period win to regain the lead at 10-9, but Kent State won three of the last four contests to take the dual.

Missouri got into the finals with a 19-16 win over No. 23 Edinboro, overcoming an early 12-3 deficit. Waters got the win at 125 to start the match, but a fall and two decisions put the Fighting Scots up after four matches. However, the Tigers got back into it with four straight wins, including a major decision by Drake Houdashelt at 157 and a win by Dorian Henderson, who was wrestling up to 184, to go up 16-12. Edinboro managed to even the match with a major decision win at 197, bringing the contest down to heavyweight. Redshirt freshman Devin Mellon won by riding time in the third tiebreaker round, giving MU the win.

The Tigers kicked off the Virginia Duals with a 24-9 victory over North Dakota State. Waters defeated No. 19 Trent Sprinkle, while Eric Wilson defeated Justin Solberg in overtime to put MU up 6-0. It was 9-6 at the midway point, but the Tigers would go on to win four of the last five contests to separate themselves from the Bison. Patrick Wright won by major decision at 174, while Brent Haynes scored a technical fall at 197.

HAYNES CLAIMS BIG 12 WEEKLY HONOR

After a first place finish at the Southern Scuffle and a dominating 22-7 win over Iowa State's Cole Shafer in Sunday's dual, Missouri's Brent Haynes has been named as the Big 12 Wrestler of the Week, announced Monday, Jan. 9. It is the first career honor for Haynes and the second time this year that Mizzou has earned the award, as sophomore Alan Waters was recognized on Dec. 11. This is the first time since the 2008-09 campaign that the Tigers have had multiple winners in the same year. The Tiger junior didn't allow a single point between Dec. 18 through Jan. 2.

NO. 11 TIGERS DEFEAT IOWA STATE, 24-11

The No. 11 Missouri wrestling team won their fifth straight dual on Sunday afternoon, improving to 6-1 on the year and 2-1 in the Big 12 with a 24-11 victory over Iowa State at Hilton Coliseum. The win marks the second time in program history that the Tigers have defeated the Cyclones twice in one season, having done so in 2005-06 with 21-18 and 16-15 wins. Missouri has won four of their last five against Iowa State.

Starting at 125 pounds, No. 3 Alan Waters earned his second win over No. 12 Ryak Finch this season, shutting the Cyclone out with a 4-0 win. Sophomore Eric Wilson made his first dual start since Feb. 14, 2010 and scored a 9-3 win at 133 pounds to give Missouri the 6-0 lead. Iowa State took the 141 pound match to cut the deficit in half, but No. 20 Kyle Bradley knocked off Luke Swalla by a 5-2 score to make it 9-3. No. 17 Drake Houdashelt defeated Michael Moreno by major decision for the second time this season to give the Tigers a commanding lead at the midway point.

Iowa State got back into it with a 20-2 technical fall win by No. 5 Andrew Sorenson at 165 pounds, but three straight victories clinched the match for the Tigers. Patrick Wright and No. 16 Mike Larson each pulled out overtime wins, with Larson's coming over No. 11 Boaz Beard for his first win over a ranked opponent this season. Brent Haynes put the match out of reach with a 22-7 technical fall over Cole Shafer at 197 pounds.

HAYNES WINS TITLE, TIGERS FINISH THIRD AT SCUFFLE

The University of Missouri wrestling squad wrapped up the Southern Scuffle on Monday, finishing in third place in the team standings with 136.0 points. Penn State took home the title, scoring 191.5 points, while Minnesota (177.5 points) finished in second. Rounding out the top five were Cornell (130.0 points) and Oregon State (103.0 points).

Missouri had two finalists heading into Monday evening's championship round. Brent Haynes was scheduled to go up against his third top-four wrestler of the weekend in No. 1 Cam Simaz of Cornell, but an injury to Simaz forced him to injury default, awarding Haynes the 197 pound championship. Waters dropped his first match of the year in the championship, losing 1-0 to No. 1 Zach Sanders (Minnesota). The bout was scoreless after two periods, with Waters choosing down to start the third. Sanders would ride Waters out to secure the riding time point and give him the victory.

Along with Waters and Haynes, eight other Tigers placed in the top-eight of their respective classes. Redshirt freshman Drake Houdashelt took third at 157 pounds, while junior Nicholas Hucke (141), sophomore Kyle Bradley (149) and senior Patrick Wright (174) each finished in fourth. Placing fifth at 174 pounds was senior Dorian Henderson, while sophomore Zach Toal took sixth at 165. At 184 pounds, juniors Mike Larson and Clarence Neely finished seventh and eighth, respectively.

NO. 12 TIGERS BLAST CYCLONES, 31-10

Scoring bonus points has been the theme for the Tiger wrestling team as of late, and Sunday afternoon was no different. No. 12 Missouri (5-1, 1-1 Big 12) won seven of the 10 matches against Iowa State in front of 1,239 fans, scoring bonus points in five of those wins to pace their 31-10 victory.

Iowa State took the early lead with an upset win at 174 pounds, as No. 7 Chris Spangler defeated No. 3 Dorian Henderson by a 7-4 decision. Missouri bounced back, however, with five straight victories to go ahead 21-3. Mike Larson scored a first period fall at 184 pounds, while Brent Haynes won by technical fall, 15-0. Devin Mellon defeated Matt Gibson at heavyweight, 3-2, and then Alan Waters scored a 13-4 major decision over No. 10 Ryak Finch before Nathan McCormick won his match by a 9-3 decision.

Mizzou also got bonus point wins from Kyle Bradley at 149, who scored a fall over Joe Cozart with just one second left on the clock,

WATERS NAMED BIG 12 WRESTLER OF THE WEEK

Mizzou sophomore Alan Waters was named Big 12 Wrestler of the Week, as announced Monday, Dec. 11 by the league office. It's the first career weekly honor for Missouri's 125 pounder, and the first honoree for the Tigers since Todd Schavrien won last December. Waters went 5-0 at the Kaufman-Brand Open last Sunday, Dec. 4, with four of his matches coming via first period falls. His fifth win, coming in the championship bout, was won by technical fall.

On Friday against No. 20 Kent State, Waters opened the dual with a dominating 12-1 major decision victory over No. 2 Nic Bedelyon. Waters opened the scoring with a takedown midway through the first period, and tilted Bedelyon to the mat twice for a pair of three point nearfalls to take a commanding 8-0 lead. After a scoreless second period, Waters worked an escape and another takedown to go with riding time.

MIZZOU PINS THEIR WAY PAST KENT STATE, 34-12

The No. 12 Missouri Tigers (4-1) scored a huge victory over No. 20 Kent State (2-3) on Friday night, blasting the Golden Flashes by a 34-12 final. No. 5 Alan Waters kicked off the evening with a major decision over No. 2 Nic Bedelyon, while Nathan McCormick, Kyle Bradley, Dorian Henderson and Mike Larson each pinned their opponents. McCormick and Henderson both recorded their falls in the first period, while Bradley and Larson earned their falls with under a minute left in each of their contests. Zach Toal defeated his opponent by a 5-2 decision, while redshirt freshman Devin Mellon upset No. 15 Brendan Barlow by a 5-3 score to close out the evening.

NINE TIGERS WIN TITLES AT KAUFMAN-BRAND OPEN

The University of Missouri wrestling team sent 34 of their grapplers to the Maryville Kaufman-Brand Open in St. Louis on Sunday, with 25 of those wrestlers finishing in the top-six of their respective weight classes. Of the 25 placers for Missouri, nine of them took home first place titles.

Alan Waters (125), Nathan McCormick (133), Kyle Bradley (149), Drake Houdashelt (157), Zach Toal (165), Dorian Henderson (174), Mike Larson (184), Brent Haynes (197) and Devin Mellon (HWT) each finished in first in their respective weight classes. Taking runner-up honors were Boomer Boyd (125), Jordan Gagliano (165), Patrick Wright (174) and Johnny Eblen (184), while Eric Wilson (133), Nicholas Hucke (141), Austin Lindsay (157), Ty Prazma (165), Todd Porter (174) and Justin Heberlie (197).

Also placing for Mizzou were: Brandon Wiest (4th, 141), Kellen Bounous (4th, 149), Cody Johnston (4th, 174), Dustin Williams (6th, 174), Clarence Neely (4th, 184) and Jake Glore (4th, HWT).

TIGERS BLAST NO. 25 STANFORD, 26-9

Four bonus point victories helped pace the No. 13 Missouri wrestling team's 26-9 win over No. 25 Stanford, giving the team their second win of the weekend over a ranked opponent as they improve to 3-1 on the dual season. The Tigers opened the day with back-to-back major decision wins by Kyle Bradley and Drake Houdashelt. They won three of their next four matches to go up 17-3, and Alan Waters' technical fall at 125 put the match out of reach, making it 22-6. Brandon Wiest finished off the day just as the Tigers had started it, scoring one last major decision. Two of Missouri's three losses on the afternoon came to top-five grapplers, as Nathan McCormick dropped a 9-5 contest to No. 5 Ryan Mango, while Dorian Henderson fell to No. 1 Nick Amuchastegui, 3-0.

NO. 13 TIGERS DEFEAT NO. 17 OSU, 21-18

No. 5 Alan Waters scored a technical fall in his first match back from injury and Mike Larson won by major decision at 184 pounds to pace No. 13 Missouri's 21-18 victory over No. 17 Oregon State. The Tigers won six of the 10 matches to secure the match over the Beavers, who scored pins in the last two matches of the night to trim the lead. After Waters' technical fall, McCormick scored a decision to put the Tigers ahead 8-0. Oregon State won the next two matches to cut the lead to 8-6, but Missouri clinched the dual with four straight victories, including Larson's major at 184. Brent Haynes lost to a defensive pin and Devin Mellon was pinned by No. 8 Clayton Jack to close out the match, but it wasn't enough to overcome Mizzou's lead.

WRIGHT, NEELY WIN OPEN TITLES

Twenty-three members of the Missouri wrestling team competed at the Joe Parisi Wrestling Open over the weekend, hosted by Lindenwood University. Of those 23 grapplers, nine earned places in the top-four of their weight class, with senior Patrick Wright (174) and junior Clarence Neely (184) finishing in first place to lead the way for Missouri.

Finishing in second place for Missouri was Kellen Bounous at 149 pounds. Taking third on the day were Jordan Gagliano (165) and Todd Porter (174). Eric Wilson (133), Ty Prazma (165), Johnny Eblen (184) and Ryan Robinson (197) each finished in fourth place in their respective classes. The tournament did not record fifth or sixth place finishes, of which Missouri would have had three.

TIGERS FALL TO NO. 12 SOONERS, 19-18

The No. 9 Missouri wrestling team fell behind early against the No. 12 Oklahoma Sooners and couldn't overcome the deficit as they dropped the Big 12 Conference opener on Friday night. Missouri had to forfeit the 125 pound match and the Sooners would win three of the next four matches to jump ahead. Nathan McCormick knocked off No. 11 Jordan Keller to cut the lead in half, but OU recorded 10 points with three straight wins to go up 16-6. Missouri took four of the last five with wins by Zach Toal, Dorian Henderson and Devin Mellon, along with a forfeit at 197 pounds, but Oklahoma's win by No. 18 Erich Schmidtke at 184 sealed the victory for Oklahoma.

With just four teams in the Big 12 this year, there have been a few format changes to the league. The most notable is how every team will face each other twice during the regular season, with one match at each team's venue. With the six conference duals, the league will crown a dual champion for the first time in Big 12 history, given to the team with the best conference dual record at the end of the season.

15 TIGERS PLACE AT UCM OPEN

While Missouri was facing off against Purdue to open the season, the rest of the squad was out at the University of Central Missouri Open for the squad's first open tournament of the season. Of the Tigers that competed, 15 came back having placed in the top-six of their respective classes. Leading the way for the Tigers were Nicholas Hucke (141), Austin Lindsay (157) and Todd Porter (174), who each took second place. Finishing in third were Eric Wilson (133), Ty Prazma (165), Patrick Wright (174) and Johnny Eblen (184). Simon Kitzis (141), and Kellen Bounous (149) finished fourth, while Trevor Wiest (149) placed fifth. Boomer Boyd (125), Mike Schmidt (133), Clarence Neely (184), Justin Heberlie (197) and Jake Glore (HWT) each finished in sixth place.

NO. 9 TIGERS ROLL BY PURDUE, 21-15

The No. 9 Missouri wrestling team opened their season with an impressive 21-15 win over the Purdue Boilermakers. The Tigers overcame a forfeit at 125 to open the match by winning six of the nine remaining contests on their way to win No. 1 on the year.

Down 6-0 right off the bat, Missouri won six of their next seven matches to take a commanding lead. Junior Nathan McCormick scored two takedowns in the final minute to send his match to OT, where he scored the winning takedown in seven seconds. Brandon Wiest recorded his first career dual win, while Drake Houdashelt scored an 11-4 decision in his first collegiate match. Zach Toal won 7-4 over his opponent, and Dorian Henderson gave the Tigers a huge lead when he pinned his foe in just 18 seconds. Mike Larson coasted to a 6-1 win to help clinch the match for the Tigers.

SIX SIGN FOR 2012-13

The Missouri wrestling program announced the addition of six future student-athletes that signed their National Letter of Intent on Wednesday. Joining the Missouri program starting in the 2012-13 season will be Tony Deangelo (Burlington, N.C.), Cody Hummer (Savannah, Mo.), Matt Manley (Perry, Okla.), Willie Miklus (Polk, Iowa), Austin Roper (Kirksville, Mo.) and Marc Schmidt (Centralia, Mo.)

TIGERS OPEN SEASON RANKED NINTH

The University of Missouri wrestling program opens up the season ranked No. 9 in the country, as announced Wednesday morning by the National Wrestling Coaches Association (NWCA). This is the 10th straight year that the Tigers have started the season with a top-15 ranking. Of Missouri's 10 different dual opponents scheduled for the season, six find themselves within the top-25. Oklahoma State leads the way in third, while Oklahoma is just behind Mizzou at 10th. Oregon State is ranked 18th, while Iowa State, Stanford and Kent State are ranked No. 20, 21 and 24, respectively. Purdue, the Tigers' season opening matchup, is receiving votes.

BRADLEY TAKES FIRST AT OPEN

Missouri heavyweight wrestler Dom Bradley took first place at the Sunkist Kids International Open in Mesa, Ariz., on Sunday, Oct. 31. Bradley, wrestling for the Sunkist Kids Wrestling Club, opened up action in the 120KG/264.5 lbs. freestyle class with a 3-2, 8-1 decision over Charles Fish of the Marines. He then dominated Florian Temengil of Team Palau in the finals, winning 5-0, 6-0. This is the second tournament title for Bradley this year, as he won University Nationals gold back in April.

TWO TIGERS AMONGST FIRST TRIALS QUALIFIERS

Missouri senior heavyweight Dom Bradley (120 kg/264.5 lbs.) and former Tiger All-American and current strength and conditioning coach Nicholas Marable (74 kg/163 lbs) are amongst the first qualifiers for the 2012 U.S. Olympic Team Trials, set to take place April 21-22 in Iowa City, Iowa. USA Wrestling released the initial list of qualifiers, which includes 65 wrestlers across three different Olympic styles. Marable and Bradley each qualified due to having won their true third place match at the 2011 World Team Trials back in June. Bradley is taking an Olympic redshirt this season to pursue this opportunity to make Team USA.

BACK-TO-BACK ALL-AMERICANS

In Missouri wrestling's 65 years, nine Tigers have earned back-to-back All-America honors. 32 Tigers have collected 48 honors with 13 earning two or more accolades, but only Dave Young (1981-82), Shaon Fry (1993-94), Scott Barker (2002-03), Ben Askren (2004-07), Tyler McCormick (2006-07), Nicholas Marable (2008-09), Maxwell Askren (2008-10), Raymond Jordan (2008-09) and Mark Ellis (2009-10) managed top eight finishes in consecutive years.

BRIAN SMITH

Head Coach | 14th Season

Beginning his career as Missouri's seventh Head Wrestling Coach, Brian Smith sat down with his team and made a list of goals that he hoped to help the 1998 squad and future Tiger teams accomplish. Over the past 13 years, the Missouri program has slowly but surely checked items off the list. Individual Big 12 Conference Champions, improved grade-point averages, record-setting attendances, a No. 1 national ranking and Missouri's first-ever NCAA National Champion in wrestling were all on Smith's "to-do" list. His unique TigerStyle training program has molded today's team into a national powerhouse that looks to contend for the program's first NCAA title.

Since being introduced as Missouri's Head Wrestling Coach May 5, 1998, Smith has demanded nothing but the best from himself, his coaches and his wrestlers. Owning 10 consecutive seasons with a dual record at or above .500, beginning with 2001-02, Smith has coached 15 All-Americans to 27 top-eight performances and three Tigers to four national titles.

Smith's teams have made a remarkable turnaround. Inheriting a program that had not seen a winning record since the 1991-92 campaign, the Tigers are now continuously ranked among the top-10 in the nation, reaching as high as No. 1 during the course of the 2006-07 campaign. On Dec. 12, 2006, the Missouri wrestling team became just the 11th wrestling program in history to earn a No. 1 ranking.

In 2003, Smith helped his team to its highest Big 12 tournament finish ever (second), a feat the team repeated at home in the Hearnes Center in 2007 and again in Ames in 2011.

The 2010-11 squad also accomplished something that no other Tiger team had done before, as they took home the team title at the 2010 Midlands Championships. Despite not having a single finalist, the Tigers cruised past the rest of the field with 103.5 points. Mizzou ended up placing six wrestlers overall, with freshman Alan Waters leading the way with a third place finish at 125 pounds.

The winningest coach in program history, Smith has compiled a 159-80-2 record at Missouri and became only the second Tiger wrestling coach to reach the 100-win plateau. In May of 2007, Smith's hard work paid off as he earned the Dan Gable Coach of the Year Award as presented by W.I.N. Magazine.

The demands that Smith puts on his wrestlers extend well beyond the mat. In the fall of 2002, his team had a grade-point average of 2.81, the highest GPA for a Missouri wrestling team under Coach Smith. In 2010, Smith had eight wrestlers with GPAs over 3.0. In all, 21 wrestlers have been recognized by the National Wrestling Coaches Association (NWCA), Big 12 and CoSIDA for their academic achievements since he took the reins in 1998.

Smith's collegiate coaching career began at Cornell University in 1992. While an assistant at Cornell, he put together two of the nation's top-10 recruiting classes, a feat he accomplished without athletic scholarships, (Ivy League schools do not offer athletic scholarships). Those recruiting classes helped Cornell take two Ivy League Championships, a 10th-place finish at the 1993 NCAA Championships and a 17th-place finish in 1994. At the 1994 NCAA Championships, one of Smith's top athletes, David Hirsch, became Cornell's first national champion since 1960.

A competitor himself, Smith was a three-time All-Big Ten wrestler and a four-time letterman at Michigan State from 1986-1990. As a senior, he was selected as the Spartan's Most Outstanding Wrestler. Competing at 126-pounds, Smith finished fifth at the Big Ten Championships in 1988, third in 1989 and second in 1990. Smith stands among the top-25 on Michigan State's all-time wins list with 84 career victories as a Spartan. He also stands tied for 19th on MSU's single-season wins list with 32 victories in 1990.

The Florida native graduated from Michigan State with a degree in education and married the former Denise Dean in 1993. Brian and Denise, have three children, Quinn (17), Kylie (15) and Braden (11). In the spring of 2009, Smith received his Master's Degree in Athletic Administration from William Woods University.
