Freshman Tulley Stapp has 19 points off 15 goals and four assists this season, while also taking the bulk of DU's draws. The Denver native combined for seven points in just over 24 hours against Colgate and Marist on March 16 and 17. Stapp is fourth on the Pioneers with 19 draw controls, and sixth in goals, assists, points and shots on goal (25). Stapp also has two game-winning goals this season. This award marks the third consecutive MPSF Newcomer of the Year award for a Pioneer, as Ali Flury (2007) and Karen Morton (2006) have won the previous two years.

Despite playing on a team led by its senior class, true freshman Alex Breiner was able to make an immediate impact for the Ducks in 2008. The 5-foot-9 midfielder has played in every game to date, coming off the bench the majority of time. The native of Alexandria, Va. has scored 21 goals (sixth on the team) along with five assists. Breiner also contributes in other ways, winning 26 draw controls and picking up 11 ground balls. Breiner was one of only two underclassmen on Oregon's roster to play in every game this season.
