### 2007 SEASON RECAP

The 2007 Michigan State baseball team featured a mix of talented newcomers and experienced upperclassmen, providing second-year head coach David Grewe a foundation to build a winning program in East Lansing. The Spartans won 10 of their last 13 games to make a run for a Big Ten Tournament bid, and although they finished just a half-game back of making the tournament, the pieces are in place for a successful season in 2008. MSU will lose just four seniors to graduation off its 30-man roster, and will add eight highly-regarded student-athletes that have signed National Letters of Intent.

Michigan State placed seventh in the Big Ten with a 15-16 league record while finishing 25-26 overall. The Spartans played one of the toughest non-conference schedules in the Big Ten, facing top 100 teams in South Alabama, Auburn, Central Florida, Stetson, South Florida and Oklahoma. MSU scored key victories against South Florida and Oklahoma on the road, both of whom were ranked in the top 50.

The Spartans, who entered the Big Ten season at 8-8, got off to their best league start since 2004 by winning five of their first seven games, ascending to second place in the standings. Unfortunately, the team hit a rough patch in the middle of the season, losing consecutive series to Penn State, Minnesota and Michigan. MSU got hot down the stretch, however, winning 10 of its last 13 games and nine of its last 11 conference games. The Green and White took three of four at Ohio State and swept Northwestern at home to set up a showdown with Illinois on the last weekend of the regular season for the final Big Ten Tournament bid. Needing to win three of four, MSU fell just shy, winning two games but falling in two one-run contests.

Individually, several Spartans shined on the field this spring for Coach Grewe. Junior second baseman Steve Gerstenberger earned second-team All-Big Ten honors for leading the team and ranking 10th in conference games with a .378 batting average. Gerstenberger, who started every game at second base in 2007 after playing first base as a sophomore, was also third in league games with 48 hits. Overall, he led the Spartans in several offensive categories, including batting (.368), runs (37), hits (77) and doubles (14). His 77 hits tied for eighth best in a Spartan single-season.

Senior catcher/designated hitter Sean Walker caught fire in the last month of the season, slugging five of his team-high seven homers in May. Walker hit a grand slam in the win over Northwestern May 12, and hit four homers in the final series of the season at Illinois. The Round Lake, Ill., native closed his career ranking third all-time at Michigan State in doubles (43) and tied for seventh in homers (26). He also had 102 career RBI.

Other top performers at the plate included: freshman outfielder Chris Roberts, who was second on the team with a .333 batting average and earned Big Ten Player of the Week honors May 7; junior Dennis Jones, who started every game in center field and led the team with 36 RBI and 15 stolen bases while batting .322; junior Evan Friedland, who started every game at first base and tied an MSU record with 42 double plays while batting .312 with 28 RBI; junior shortstop Brandon Doherty, who hit .477 in the final month of the season to raise his average to .310; and sophomore catcher Kyle Day, who led the team with a .438 on-base percentage.

On the mound, senior Craig Brookes was MSU's No. 1 starter all season long, and led the team with 81.1 innings pitched and 57 strikeouts. Junior Jon Kibler finished the conference season seventh in the league with a 3.92 ERA and won four games to earn third-team All-Big Ten honors. Junior Mike Monterey emerged as the team's closer and had one of the finest years for a reliever in Spartan history, collecting eight saves, which was third most in an MSU single-season. Senior lefty John Dwan earned Big Ten Pitcher of the Week honors for the second time in his career after tossing seven scoreless innings at Indiana, and he also threw complete-game victories against Purdue and Illinois.

With an experienced player at every position returning to East Lansing next season, along with two Big Ten starting pitchers, a stocked bullpen and eight freshmen, look for Michigan State to be one of the top teams in the Big Ten in 2008.

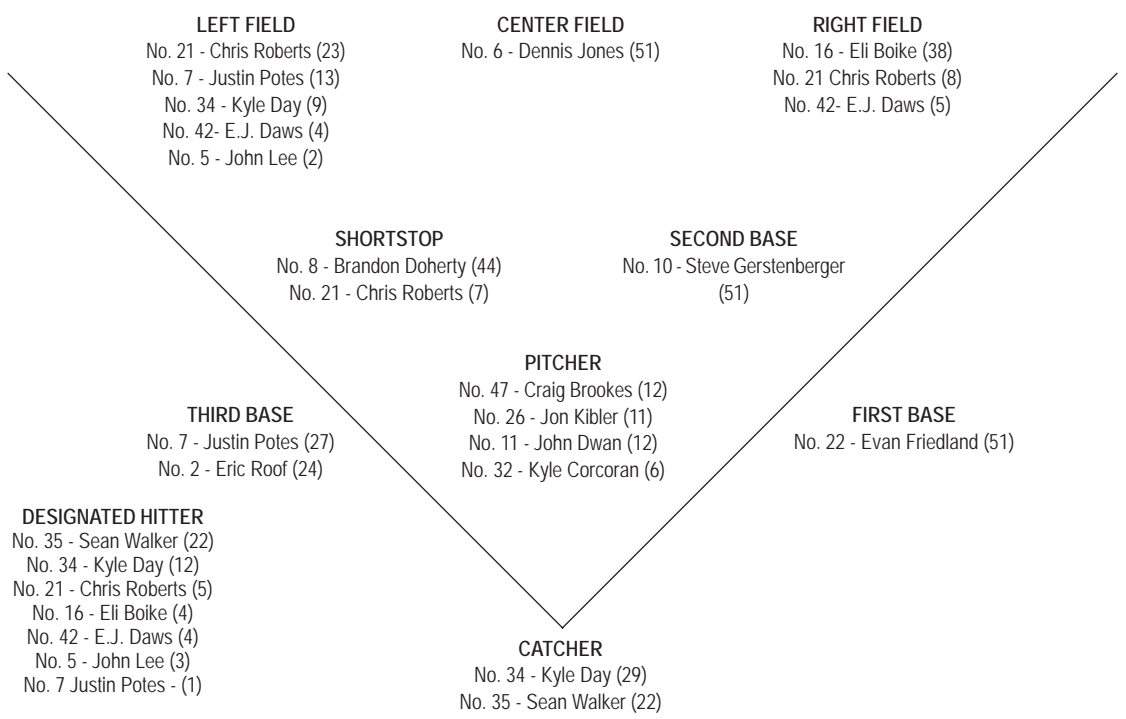

**2007 TOP PERFORMERS**

• Junior second baseman **Steve Gerstenberger**, who made the unique transition from first base to second base this season, earned second-team All-Big Ten honors after leading the team and ranking 10th in the conference with a .378 batting average during league games. He also finished third with 48 hits in conference play.

After starting 45 games at first in 2006, he started all of MSU's games this season at second. He led the team in batting (.368), hits (77), runs (37) and doubles (14), all marking career highs. He also registered career highs in stolen bases (11), RBI (31) and on-base percentage (.408). His 77 hits ranked tied for eighth best in an MSU single-season.

Gerstenberger closed the season on a 12-game hitting streak, batting .475 (28-for-59) during that stretch.

• Junior **Dennis Jones**, a speedy transfer from Macomb (Mich.) Community College, started every game in center field this season. Batting ninth in the lineup a majority of the year, Jones led the team with 15 stolen bases, 36 RBI and 10 bunt singles. Jones was the team's top clutch hitter, as he led the team with 15 two-out RBI and a .383 average with runners in scoring position.

• Senior right-handed pitcher **Craig Brookes** led the team with a 3.65 ERA, which ranked fifth in the Big Ten through the regular season. He posted wins this season over Saint Joseph's, Quinnipiac, Purdue and Northwestern, and had solid starts in no decisions at South Alabama (6 IP, 7 K, 2 H, 1 R) and Oklahoma (6 IP, 6 K, 5 H, 0 ER). He threw seven quality starts this season (at least six innings pitched and three or fewer earned runs). Brookes finished his career third in MSU history in innings pitched (274.1), fifth in strikeouts (186) and tied for seventh in wins (17).

• Freshman outfielder **Chris Roberts** was named the No. 2 newcomer in the Big Ten by *Baseball America* for a reason - he hit .331 with 27 RBI, including a .360 batting average in Big Ten games. Roberts, who made seven starts at shortstop, primarily saw action in the outfield.

Roberts was named the Big Ten Player of the Week May 7 after batting .563 (9-for-16) with five RBI in the Ohio State series. Roberts provided two game-winning hits in the Northwestern series: in the second game of a doubleheader on May 12, he broke a 4-4 tie with a two-run, bases-loaded single, and in the series finale May 13, he hit an RBI single in the bottom of the ninth inning to give MSU the 4-3 win.

• Junior relief pitcher **Mike Monterey** emerged as the team's closer in 2007. Slated to be a starter at the beginning of the year, Coach Grewe opted to use Monterey in the bullpen, and he produced in the clutch. Monterey had eight saves this spring, which ranked third in an MSU season. He also has nine career saves, good for fifth best in MSU history.

• Senior catcher/designated hitter **Sean Walker** slugged a team-high seven homers this season, including four in the last series of the year at Illinois. Walker closed his career third in MSU history in doubles (43) and tied for seventh in homers (26). He also collected a 102 career RBI. Walker hit .429 (6-for-14) with a homer and seven RBI in the Northwestern series, including a career-high six RBI and a grand slam in the series opener. In his senior year, Walker led the team with a .497 slugging percentage and hit .291 with seven homers and 27 RBI.

• Junior **Evan Friedland** started every game for Coach Grewe at first base this season. Friedland was excellent in the field, tying an MSU record with 42 double plays while coming in third in an MSU single-season with 397 putouts. At the plate, Friedland was fourth on the team with a 312 batting average and third with 28 RBI.

• Sophomore catcher **Kyle Day** was named one of the top prospects in the Jayhawk League last summer by *Baseball America* and will play in the prestigious Cape Cod League this summer for the Harwich Mariners. He led the team with a .438 on-base percentage and 33 walks. In the final weekend of the regular season, Day hit .438 with two homers and nine RBI at Illinois. He finished with a .295 batting average, three homers and 26 RBI.

• Junior shortstop **Brandon Doherty** hit an astounding .477 (21-for-44) in the last month of the season to raise his batting average to .310 for the season. A talented fielder with excellent range, Doherty started 44 games at short and collected 146 assists, good for seventh best in an MSU single-season. In the last series of the year at Illinois, Doherty hit .625 (10-for-16) with two homers and six RBI.

• Junior lefty **Jon Kibler** was named a third-team All-Big Ten selection after finishing seventh in conference games with a 3.92 ERA to go along with a 4-3 record. Kibler fired three complete games in Big Ten play, all wins, against Indiana, Penn State and Ohio State. The Freeland, Md., native was second on the team with 41 strikeouts and tied for second with 66.1 innings pitched.

**TOP GAMES OF THE 2007 SEASON**

• Feb. 25 - Michigan State 4, Jacksonville 2: John Dwan gave up one run and three hits in six innings and Nolan Moody struck out four of his five batters in relief as MSU won its first game of the 2007 campaign, a 4-2 triumph over Jacksonville, who later beat Florida State in the regular season.

• March 4 - Michigan State 22, Saint Joseph's 1: MSU plates nine runs in the first and slugs out 19 hits en route to scoring a season-high 22 runs in the 21-run victory over the Hawks.

• March 5 - Michigan State 4, Pittsburgh 3: Down 3-1 heading into the bottom of the eighth, Michigan State scored two in the eighth and one in the bottom of the ninth for the comeback win. Mark Sorensen struck out four in three innings of scoreless relief.

• March 16 - Michigan State 4, No. 21 Oklahoma 3: Chris Roberts hits a game-winning, RBI double in the top of the ninth to give MSU an upset win over the Sooners on the road. Mike Monterey fired three innings of scoreless relief to earn the win. Craig Brookes struck out six and surrendered just one unearned run in the first six innings.

• May 5 - Michigan State 6, Ohio State 4: In the second game of a doubleheader, MSU entered the top of the sixth inning down 4-1 to the Buckeyes. Dennis Jones tied the game with a bases-loaded triple in the sixth, and Steve Gerstenberger collected the game-winning RBI later in the inning. The Spartans add one more in the seventh to hold on for the 6-4, come-from-behind victory, giving MSU just its fourth doubleheader sweep over Ohio State in Columbus in series history.

• May 13 - Michigan State 4, Northwestern 3: On Senior Day at Oldsmobile Park, senior E.J. Daws scored the game-winning run in the bottom of the ninth inning on a Chris Roberts RBI single, giving MSU the comeback win.

• May 19 - Michigan State 16, Illinois 4: The Spartans hit a season-high five homers, including two by Sean Walker, and collect a season-high 21 hits in the 16-4 win over Illinois in the second game of a doubleheader sweep. Brandon Doherty, Steve Gerstenberger and Chris Roberts also went deep for MSU. Doherty went 4-for-4 and Walker registered a career-high four hits and drove in four runs.

**HEAD COACH DAVID GREWE**

Michigan State made a decision on July 13, 2005, to rejuvenate the baseball program and hired David Grewe to lead the way, making him the program's 15th head baseball coach. With the announcement came a new found energy that quickly spread throughout every inch of the program. Hired at the age of 29, Grewe, one of the youngest head coaches in the nation, brings a passion and desire to build the MSU program to great heights.

In a very short time Grewe has made his mark on the Spartan program by implementing a winning attitude amongst his players and the proud alumni of MSU. Since his arrival, Grewe's passion and energy has been shown in the effort to reunite the former Spartan greats with the current players in the program.

Grewe is entering his second year at the helm of the Spartan baseball program. In his first season, the Spartans displayed his aggressive style on the field, ranking among the Big Ten leaders in several offensive categories. MSU led the Big Ten and ranked fourth

in the nation with 29 triples, which was the second-highest total in program history. The Spartans were second in the conference and ranked among the top 35 teams nationally in stolen bases (98) and batting (.315), and also ranked second in the league in slugging (.451) and on-base percentage (.388).

Grewe arrived in East Lansing following three years at Notre Dame (2003-05) where he served as the recruiting coordinator and the hitting and catching instructor under Paul Mainieri. During his tenure, the Irish compiled a combined record of 134-54-1 (.712), including three-straight BIG EAST Tournament championships and three-consecutive NCAA Regional appearances.

The Oshkosh, Wis., native recorded multiple hits in all four contests, including a 3-for-5 performance in the series finale on Sunday. Roberts tallied five RBI and also contributed a pair of runs.
- **Jon Kibler** threw a five-hit, complete game in MSU's 5-1 victory in game one of the doubleheader at Ohio State on May 5.
- **Dennis Jones** collected seven RBI in the Ohio State series, including three on a bases-clearing triple in game three of the series and three more on a bases-clearing double in the series finale.
- In his last career game at Kobs Field, **Sean Walker** went 3-for-4 with a career-high six RBI and a grand slam against Northwestern. Walker hit the grand slam off his hometown friend and high school teammate, Ryan Myers. **Dennis Jones** also had a career game at the plate, going 5-for-5.
- In the last series of the regular season at Illinois, MSU hit .399 as a team with 11 homers and 35 runs scored. The Spartans entered the series with 10 homers as a team the entire season. **Sean Walker** hit four homers in the series, **Brandon Doherty** hit .625 (10-for-16) with two homers, and **Kyle Day** hit .438 with two homers and nine RBI. The Spartans hit eight homers in the doubleheader sweep over the Illini May 19.

**2007 NOTABLES**

- The Spartans became just the 35th school in NCAA Division I baseball history to win 2,000 games as a program with their 6-5 victory over Western Michigan on April 10. MSU's all-time program record is 2011-1635-28. Entering the 2007 season, only 34 schools in the country had won at least 2,000 baseball games.
- MSU had two wins over top 50 teams (Oklahoma, South Florida).

In conference games only, **Steve Gerstenberger** led Michigan State with a .378 batting average, which ranked 10th in the Big Ten. Gerstenberger was also third in conference games with 48 hits. **Chris Roberts** was second at .360 and was tops on the team with 23 RBI. leads the Spartans with a .378 batting average and 20 RBI. **Jon Kibler** was seventh in ERA at 3.92.

**CROSSTOWN SHOWDOWN**

In the first-ever Crosstown Showdown, the Lansing Lugnuts (Class A affiliate of Toronto) held on to defeat the Michigan State baseball team, 4-3, before a festive crowd of 6,223 fans on April 3 at Oldsmobile Park. The Spartans scored two runs in the top of the ninth to make things interesting, but couldn't come up with a game-tying hit with runners on first and second. MSU battled all game, and even out-hit the Lugnuts, 8-3.

"What a great night for Michigan State baseball," said MSU head coach David Grewe after the game. "It was a great turnout and an awesome atmosphere. Everyone was up the whole game and the bench had a lot of fun. More importantly, all the position players had a chance to get in the game. I couldn't have asked for anything more. I just thank the Lansing Lugnuts for the opportunity to play."

Down 4-1 in ninth, the Spartans rallied for two runs on three hits, led by a pair of walk-ons. Kyle Kunkel, a walk-on catcher who entered the game in the bottom of the eighth at left field, led off with a walk. He advanced to second on a Sean Walker single, and an Evan Friedland single through the right side loaded the bases with no outs. E.J. Daws followed with a sacrifice fly to center, plating Kunkel to make it 4-2. After a MSU strikeout, Nate Yahn - a sophomore walk-on catcher - came to pinch-hit with two outs and runners on first and second. Yahn, in his first at-bat as a Spartan, delivered a clutch single to left, bringing the Spartans to within one run at 4-3.

The Lugnuts responded by bringing in their closer, Julio Pinto. Pinto faced walk-on outfielder Kyle Hurtt, and although Hurtt batted to a full count and then fouled three straight pitches with two strikes, he finally succumbed to Pinto with a strikeout.

MSU used 10 pitchers in the game, and although the staff gave up just three hits to the Class A affiliate of the Toronto Blue Jays, it did allow 12 walks.

Lansing got on the board first, scoring a run in the third on a Scott Campbell RBI single to center. MSU tied the game in the fourth. Eli Boike led off with a double to left, advanced to second on a Walker flyout to center, and scored on a Friedland RBI groundout to second. In the fourth, the Lugnuts took advantage of a Spartan error to score two runs, taking the lead, 3-1. With two outs and runners on first and second, Yuber Rodriguez hit a single to left, but instead of just one run scoring, the Spartan leftfielder misplayed the ball, allowing two runs to score and putting Rodriguez on third.

## RECRUITING UPDATE:

### COACH GREWE SIGNS BRANDON ECKERLE IN SPRING, BRINGS CLASS OF 2007-08 UP TO EIGHT

Michigan State baseball head coach David Grewe announced on April 24 that **Brandon Eckerle** (Durand, Mich.) has signed a National Letter of Intent to play for the Spartans starting in the fall of 2007. A product of Corunna High School, Eckerle has been a standout both on the field and in the classroom.

"We could not be more excited to add Brandon to the class that we have coming in this fall," Grewe said of Eckerle, who is both a pitcher and outfielder. "He fits all of the characteristics of the players that we want in our program. He is an excellent athlete, a tough competitor, a tremendous student, a leader, and, most importantly, is a person of high character. We think that he will have a great career at Michigan State.

"My recruiting philosophy is to bring in athletes that can play multiple positions with a particular emphasis on recruiting players that play in the middle of the field," Grewe continued. "Brandon is an outstanding athlete that can cover a lot of ground in centerfield and can put a lot of pressure on a defense with his speed. He also has a chance to help us on the mound and we are excited to take a look at him there.

"With the addition of Brandon to the class that we signed back in November, we are extremely excited about the future of Michigan State baseball," Grewe said. "With their performances so far this season, it's easy to see why we're so excited about getting this class up to East Lansing. All of these student-athletes are top-notch prospects that perform at a very high level. I want them to finish their high school careers the right way, and I look forward to them wearing the Green and White next season."

### Brandon Eckerle (6-0, 175 pounds, Outfielder/Pitcher)

Plays at Corunna High School for Coach Brian Osborn...a good hitter with outstanding running speed and an excellent throwing arm...a lead-off hitter that can put a lot of pressure on an opponent's defense...also can go on the mound and use an upper 80s fastball and good breaking ball to get out hitters...as a junior in 2006, he received all-state honors as well as being recognized as Corunna's Most Valuable Player and Cy Young Award winner...as a junior, he hit over .500 for the year with 20 stolen bases...played for the Michigan Red Sox and Coach Mark Sackett during the 2006 summer and was the team's leading hitter...has been named Valedictorian of Corunna's senior class and is a member of the National Honor Society...also a state finalist for the Wendy's High School Heisman Award.

### AJ Achter (6-5, 190, RHP/OF, Oregon, Ohio/Clay High School)

After having an outstanding senior season on the basketball court, Achter is off to a great start on the diamond...received Academic All-Ohio honors and was named to the All-Toledo Blade team in basketball after leading his team with a 20.1 points per game average...since baseball season began, AJ has been unhittable, posting a 3-0 record with one save on the mound...has 18 innings pitched and no hits allowed and 39 strikeouts...at the plate, he is hitting .460 with 1 home run, 10 RBIs and six stolen bases...Clay High School is currently 10-0 for the season.

### Jeffrey Holm (OF/1B/LHP, 6-2, 180, St. Charles, Ill./North High School)

Holm and his St. Charles North team are off to a great start...the team is currently 11-1 and ranked fifth in the state of Illinois...he is hitting third in the lineup and leading his team in walks, RBIs (12 in 12 games) and stolen bases (10)...currently hitting .370 on the season...he also is 1-0 with two saves on the mound...has pitched seven innings and given up two hits and no earned runs with nine strikeouts...is currently rated as one of the Top 100 players by the The Truth Prep Baseball Report.

### Kyle Kaminska (RHP, 6-3, 170, Naperville, Ill./Central High School)

Kaminska is throwing the ball well and his team is off to a good start...Naperville Central High School is looking to repeat as state champs in Illinois this year, as both Kyle and the team are starting to hit their stride...has a 3-2 record with one save on the season...has thrown 29.2 innings, allowing four earned runs on 17 hits...has struck out 40 batters and only walked seven...currently rated in the Top 400 high school prospects in the country by Perfect Game Crosschecker and is rated as the No. 12 prospect in the state of Illinois by the Truth Prep Baseball Report.

### Tyler Newsome (LHP/OF, 6-1, 190, Palos Heights, Ill./Marist High School)
