## #7-SEED MICHIGAN STATE (13-3-3, 5-0-3 BIG)

### AT #2-SEED INDIANA (17-0-5, 5-0-3 BIG)

FRIDAY, DEC. 1 • 7 P.M. • JERRY YEAGLEY FIELD

Seventh-seeded Michigan State men's soccer (13-3-3, 5-0-3 BIG) will hit the road after a pair of NCAA Tournament wins against Virginia Tech and 10th-seeded Western Michigan. The Spartans will travel to second-seeded Indiana (17-0-5, 5-0-3 BIG) on Friday, Dec. 1 at 7 p.m. at Jerry Yeagley Field. The Hoosiers defeated New Hampshire, 2-1 in the third round on Nov. 25 to reach the Elite Eight. This is MSU's first appearance in the Elite Eight since 2014.

MSU hosted a pair of NCAA games with wins over the Hokies and the Broncos, respectively. This was the second-straight season that the Spartans hosted an NCAA Tournament game. Last season in the first round, SIU Edwardsville advanced 9-8 on penalty kicks. The teams battled to a 1-1 tie in double overtime, before the Cougars edged the Spartans in the penalty kick round.

The last time that the Spartans were a seeded team playing at home was 2014 when MSU reached the Elite Eight. That season, MSU was the overall No. 3 seed.

### ELITE EIGHT APPEARANCES

This is the third Elite Eight appearance for the Spartans in the last five years, Michigan State earned back-to-back appearance in the Elite Eight in both 2013 and 2014. Overall, the Spartans are making their eighth appearance in the Elite Eight, reaching this point during the 1962, 1964, 1965, 1967, 1968, 2013, 2014 and 2017 seasons.

### AND THEN THERE WERE TWO

There are only two Big Ten teams remaining in the NCAA Tournament in Michigan State and Indiana. Either the Spartans or the Hoosiers will advance to the College Cup in Philadelphia, Dec. 8-10. MSU is looking for its first appearance in the Final Four since 1968.

### LOOKING BACK TO 2014

The Spartans last appearance in the Elite Eight

was in 2014, when MSU took on Providence in East Lansing. Despite snagging an early lead by scoring on the first shot of the match, the Spartans fell to the Friars 3-2 with goals from Adam Montague and Zach Carroll. The Spartans exited the tournament as one of only two teams in the nation to make back-to-back Elite Eight appearances and as the only Big Ten team remaining.

### SETTING RECORDS

MSU's five BIG wins ties a school record for most conference wins, matching the 2008 squad. The Spartans 5-0-3 record is the first time that Michigan State has got unbeaten in Big Ten action, finishing with a 5-0-3 record.

### SCOUTING REPORT: INDIANA

The No. 2-seeded Hoosiers bring a 17-0-5 record into Friday's Elite Eight match with their Big Ten Conference foe Spartans. Indiana reached the Elite Eight with wins over Old Dominion (3-0) in the second round and New Hampshire (2-1) in the third round after a first-round bye. IU fell the Big Ten Tournament championship game with a shootout loss to Wisconsin, 4-2 on penalty kicks after playing to a 0-0 draw.

Indiana's success this season is due in part to the amazing play of freshman goalkeeper Trey Muse, who leads the NCAA with 17 shutouts and has allowed only five goals all season for a GAA of 0.21, making 53 saves. The Indiana offense is equally strong, as freshman forward Mason Toye is tied for first in the Big Ten with 10 goals, adding two assists, for a total of 22 points, which ranks third in the BIG.

### SPARTANS-HOOSIERS SERIES

Overall, Indiana leads the overall series 39-16-5 after playing to a 1-1 draw in the regular-season finale on Oct. 29 at DeMartin Stadium at East Lansing, as the teams ended tied for second in the BIG.

## LAST TIME MSU VS. IU - SPARTANS 1, HOOSIERS 1 - OCT. 29, 2017

In the regular-season meeting, the Hoosiers struck first in the 25th minute when Mason Toye drew a foul inside the penalty box. Trevor Schwartz converted the penalty kick, giving IU the 1-0 lead. Indiana would take the lead into halftime. The Spartans started the second half aggressively taking control of possession early on. Michigan State tied the score in the 61st minute, capitalizing on its own penalty kick. After senior midfielder Ken Krolicki was taken down in the box, junior forward Ryan Sierakowski snuck the PK past IU goalkeeper Trey Muse, which was just the fourth goal that Muse had allowed all season.

## WELCOME BACK

Michigan State was happy to welcome back junior defender Connor Corrigan, who missed three games after getting injured in the Spartans win over Penn State on Oct. 14. Corrigan returned against Virginia Tech. The junior started and played 75 minutes against the Hokies, taking three corner kicks. Corrigan played all 90 minutes against WMU on Nov. 25.

## MAKING YOUR MARK

Michigan State redshirt-junior goalkeeper Jimmy Hague has made quite an impact in his two seasons starting in net. Hague has a 0.72 goals against average during his career, which places him third all-time in MSU history behind Kevin O'Connell (0.47, 1966) and Hall of Famer Joe Baum (0.68, 1967-68). Hague is sixth in shutouts with 17. Zach Bennett (2012-15) is the all-time leader in shutouts at MSU with 35.

## CENTURY MARK

MSU head coach Damon Rensing reached a coaching milestone. With the win against Penn State on Oct. 14, the Spartan leader reached 100 career wins. Overall, he is now 103-61-25 at MSU.

## DEFENDING DEMARTIN

Due in part to the amazing student section known as the Red Cedar Rowdies, Michigan State is an impressive 16-1-4 in its last 21 games at DeMartin Stadium. Last season, MSU set a school-record with most wins at home going 9-0-2. In 2017, the Spartans were 5-0-2 at home during the regular season. Michigan State suffered its first loss at home in the Big Ten Tournament against Ohio State on Nov. 5. Prior to the OSU loss, the Spartans last loss at DeMartin was against Indiana on Nov. 4, 2015.

## CENTALA AND FISCUS EARN ACADEMIC HONORS

Michigan State men's soccer players Jimmy Fiscus and Brad Centala were named first-team Academic All-District Team. Both were recognized as a part of NCAA Division I District 5 by the College Sports Information Directors of America (CoSIDA).

This is the second-straight season that MSU has had a pair of players on the first-team all-district list. Last season, Centala and Andrew Herr were

both honored. Both players went on to earn CoSIDA Academic All-American honors in 2016.

Fiscus, a native of Novi, Michigan, has earned a 3.85 GPA in supply chain management. This is the first Academic All-District honor for the senior defender. The senior is a two-time Academic All-Big Ten honoree.

Centala, a native of Grosse Pointe Woods, Michigan, earned his second-straight All-District honor with a 3.86 in kinesiology. He was also named to the first-team in 2016. Centala earned Academic All-Big Ten honors the last two seasons.

## CLIMBING THE CHARTS

Junior forward Ryan Sierakowski and fellow junior forward DeJuan Jones are now tied in scoring with 19 points. Sierakowski has eight goals and three assists for 19 points. Jones has seven goals and five assists for 19 points. Sierakowski has scored at least 17 points in all three seasons in the Green and White, scoring 23 points last season.

## JOE BAUM: HALL OF FAMER

Former MSU soccer head coach and player Joe Baum was inducted into the MSU Hall of Fame on Thursday, Sept. 29. Baum was a part of Michigan State soccer as a player, assistant coach and head coach for a combined 39 seasons. As a goalkeeper, he led MSU to back-to-back co-national championships. Later, he served as the head coach of the men's program for 32 years and the women's program for five years, compiling a combined 389 victories. Baum established himself as one of the titans of college soccer during his tenure with the Spartan men's team. He finished his career with 320 victories, becoming just the second coach in Big Ten history to reach the 300-win plateau.

## FANS IN THE STANDS

The Spartans are 14th in the nation in attendance, averaging 1,810 fans per home game. Three Big Ten teams are ranked in the top 12 in the nation with Maryland standing No. 2 (3,230), while Indiana is ninth (2,172).

For the second-time this season, Michigan State topped its DeMartin Stadium attendance record when 4,678 fans packed the stadium and a standing room only crowd watched No. 6 MSU battle to a 0-0 double overtime tie against No. 3 Maryland on Sept. 22. In the first night game of the season on Sept. 1, 3,515 fans filled DeMartin. The previous high was 3,175 last season when MSU defeated Michigan on Sept. 18, 2016.

## CLOSE CALLS

In 19 games this season, the Spartans are 10-2 in games decided by one goal. Michigan State has won seven 1-0 games and defeated Rutgers, 2-1 on Sept. 8. Last season, the Spartans were an exceptional 10-3 in one-goal games, including four wins in 1-0 decisions. Last time out, Michigan State defeated Western Michigan, 2-1.

## SENIOR CLASS AWARD

Senior defender Jimmy Fiscus was one of 60 NCAA® men's and women's soccer student-athletes who excel both on and off the field were selected as candidates for the 2017 Senior CLASS Award® in collegiate soccer. To be eligible for the award, a student-athlete must be classified as an NCAA Division I senior and have notable achievements in four areas of excellence: community, classroom, character and competition.

## OH CAPTAIN MY CAPTAIN

This season, the Spartans have three captains in senior Jimmy Fiscus, Brad Centala and Ryan Scott.

## BARONE BUNCH

Sophomore Giuseppe Barone became the fourth member of the Barone family to don the Green and White last season. He joins current Spartan Hunter as well as former MSU players Mark (2008-11) Domenic (2008-12).

## HEAD COACH DAMON RENSING

Former MSU soccer standout Damon Rensing became the fifth head coach in Spartan history on January 1, 2009 after taking over for the legendary Joe Baum, who guided MSU for 32 seasons.

In 2017, Rensing begins his ninth season as head coach, after serving as an assistant coach for 10 seasons at his alma mater. In eight years, Rensing has compiled an impressive 90-58-22 record (.594).

Rensing was named MSU's head coach designate on Aug. 14, 2008 after Baum decided to make 2008 his final season as head coach. Rensing has spent nearly half his life in the Green and White with four years as varsity letterwinner, one season as an assistant with the women's program and 10 seasons in his previous position. In his first eight years as head coach, the Spartans have made six NCAA tournament campaigns, including a run to the Elite Eight in 2013 and 2014.

In 2016, the Spartans returned to the NCAA Tournament, hosting the first round in East Lansing. MSU ended the season with a 13-5-2 record, including going undefeated at DeMartin Stadium with a 9-0-2 record. The nine wins were the most-ever at home. Freshman Giuseppe Barone captured Big Ten Freshman of the Year honors, while sophomore Ryan Sierakowski earned first-team All-Big Ten honors. Juniors Jimmy Fiscus and Ken Krolicki joined redshirt-sophomore Jimmy Hague as second-team All-BIG honorees. Sierakowski, Hague, Fiscus and Krolicki all earned All-Region honors as well.

The Spartans ended the 2014 season with a 12-5-6 record overall and were 4-2-2 in Big Ten action. The 2013 season also saw Rensing named the NSCAA Regional Coach of the Year, while Kevin Cope earned All-America honors and was eventually selected as the 25th pick in the MLS Super Draft. Fatai Alashe was selected as the fourth pick overall by the San Jose Earthquakes in the 2015 MLS SuperDraft. His selection in the first round of the draft marks the highest-ever in school history, surpassing first-round pick Doug DeMartin in 2009.

In 2012, he guided MSU to its third Big Ten Tournament title in school history as the Spartans topped Michigan in overtime, 2-1.

Under Rensing's leadership, the Spartans have received 25 All-Big Ten and 19 NSCAA All-Region selections, in addition to nine players that were named to the Big Ten All-Tournament Team. The Spartans' performance in the classroom during Rensing's tenure has been equally impressive. Over the last nine years, MSU has received 94 Academic All-Big Ten selections and 38 Big Ten Distinguished Scholar selections.

# NCAA TOURNAMENT HISTORY

## 1962 (1-1)

Nov. 19 - First Round

Michigan State 4, Howard 0

In the Spartans' first-ever NCAA Tournament game, they defeated Howard, 4-0, despite shivering temperatures. As a testament to MSU's stalwart defense, it shut out Bison forward Winston Alexis. This marked the first time Alexis hadn't scored in a game in two years.

## Semifinals

Nov. 29 - St. Louis 2, Michigan State 0

MSU had beaten all of their opponents from 1960 to 1962, but one eluded them. They were jinxed by Midwest foe, St. Louis University. The Billikens defeated the Spartans, 2-0, in the NCAA semifinal round.

## 1963 (0-1)

Nov. 21 - First Round

St. Louis 2, Michigan State 0

In a battle between Midwest powerhouses, MSU was scoreless against the defending national champions. The Spartans defeated St. Louis University 4-3 in the regular season to finish 9-0 and to put an end to the St. Louis jinx. However, St. Louis showed flashes of their 1962 NCAA Tournament victory, defeating the Spartans once again 2-0. Ken McBride and Carl Gentile scored goals for the Billikens.

## 1964 (3-1)

Nov. 21 - First Round

Michigan State 1, Maryland 0

MSU topped Maryland as Dan Dimitrious scored the only goal in snowy conditions.

Nov. 28 - Second Round

Michigan State 4, East Stroudsburg 0

The Spartans hosted the quarterfinals match against East Stroudsburg. Spartan goalie Charlie Dedich posted his eighth shutout of the season helping MSU win, 4-0, with two goals scored by Karl Thiele.

Dec. 3 - Semifinals

Michigan State 3, Army 2 (OT)

In their first trip to the NCAA College Cup, MSU triumphed in a sudden death, double overtime bout against Army, 3-2. Nigerian native, Sydney Alozie kicked the game-winning goal from 40 yards out.

Dec. 5 - National Championship

Navy 1, Michigan State 0

The Spartans reached the finals for the first time since the NCAA Tournament began in 1959. The defensive battle was a scoreless stalemate until Navy's Jim Lewis scored at 17:38 of the fourth quarter. It was only the eighth goal scored on the Spartans this season.

## 1965 (3-1)

Nov. 20 - First Round

Michigan State 7, Baltimore 0

Guy Busch scored twice and added two assists for the Spartans as they scored a school-NCAA Tournament record seven times in the opening round win. Gary McBrady added a goal and an assist for the Spartans.

Nov. 21 - Second Round

Michigan State 2, East Stroudsburg 1 (OT)

Larry Christoff scored both goals for Michigan State in the 2-1 win, including the second coming with 3:45 left in the sudden-victory period, but injured his knee crashing into the goalkeeper after the game-winning tally to keep him out of the College Cup.

Nov. 27 - Semifinals

Michigan State 3, Army 1

MSU All-American Guy Busch scored two goals in the Spartans' 3-1 victory against Army, sending MSU to their second national championship game in as many years. Rich Nelke also scored for the Spartans.

Nov. 28 - National Championship

St. Louis 1, Michigan State 0

The St. Louis soccer hex had not yet lifted as the Billikens beat the Spartans, 1-0, in the NCAA Championships. A controversial penalty shot led to a Carl Gentile goal at 9:17 of the third quarter.

## 1966 (2-0-1)

Nov. 19 - First Round

Michigan State 2, Akron 0

Tony Keyes keyed the Spartan attack in the first round victory, as he scored both Spartan goals in the win at Old College Field.

Michigan State 3, Temple 1

Tom Kreft scored twice as Michigan State built up a 3-0 lead through the first three quarters to hang on for a 3-1 win. Tony Keyes also added a goal in the third quarter for MSU.

Michigan State 2, Long Island 2 (4 OT, CK)

MSU was eliminated by the rule book against Long Island. After four overtimes, the Spartans were declared the losers in a 2-2 draw due to a rule that states in the event of a tie after all the overtimes have been played, the team with the most corner kicks wins.

**1967 (3-0-1)**

Nov. 18 - First Round

Michigan State 4, Maryland 1

The school's 100th career victory was guaranteed by two second quarter goals coming within 28 seconds of one another, as Tom Kreft and Gary McBrady each dented the twine to lead to the win.

Nov. 25 - Second Round

Michigan State 3, Akron 1

Trevor Harris scored twice in the fourth quarter to lead Michigan State to a 3-1 victory over Akron. Harris broke the 1-1 tie with 14:53 left in the game, hooking a goal into the lower left corner of the net before adding the clincher with three minutes left.

Nov. 30 - Semifinals

Michigan State 4, Long Island 0

Playing without All-American Tony Keyes, who was busy having his appendix removed, the Spartans got great offensive efforts from Ernie Tuscherer (goal, assist), Gary McBrady (goal, assist) and a stalwart defensive performance from Joe Baum, who made 12 saves in goal.

Dec. 2 - National Championship

Michigan State 0, St. Louis 0

In a year where the Spartans reached its 100th victory and Guy Busch became the all-time leading scorer in MSU soccer history, the only thing left to do was win the NCAA Championship. A winner-takes-all game was played in St. Louis, but a heavy rain storm prohibited the completion of the game, as it was halted at the end of one half, each team being declared co-champions.

**1968 (4-0-1)**

Nov. 18 - First Round

Michigan State 5, North Carolina 0

Tony Keyes posted the only hat trick in MSU's NCAA Tournament history and Tom Kreft added a pair of scores as MSU routed North Carolina in Chapel Hill. Joe Baum stopped eight shots for the Spartans.

Nov. 23 - Second Round

Michigan State 1, Akron 0

After Akron had ended the Spartans' 33-game unbeaten streak earlier in the season, Michigan State exacted its revenge in the NCAA Tournament, thanks to a second-quarter goal from Tony Keyes. Joe Baum stopped six shots in the shutout.

Nov. 30 - Third Round

Michigan State 2, West Chester 2 (4 OT, CK)

Thanks to a 10-2 advantage in corner kicks, Michigan State earned its sixth trip to the College Cup. West Chester took a 2-0 lead in the first period, but MSU fought back, as Tony Keyes scored goals in the second and third periods to tie the game before it went through four scoreless overtimes.

Dec. 5 - Semifinals

Michigan State 2, Brown 0

Ernie Tuscherer scored Michigan State's game-winning goal 3:51 into the second half and Alex Skotarek added another five minutes later to lead the Spartans to the national championship game for the fourth time in five years. Joe Baum stopped eight shots in the win.

Dec. 7 - National Championship

Michigan State 2, Maryland 2 (2 OT)

MSU All-American Tony Keyes scored his 28th goal, still the school's single-season record, to tie the game, 1-1, but Maryland's Jaro Chareczko put the Terrapins up 2-1 in the final period. With 10 minutes remaining, MSU's Frank Morant scored his first goal of the season to knot it at 2. Neither team could score through the rest of the game, which included two overtimes, resulting in a second-straight co-championship.

**1969 (0-1)**

Nov. 22 - Second Round

Cleveland State 3, Michigan State 0

Three first-half Cleveland State goals ended Spartan coach Gene Kenney's career in the first round of the NCAA Tournament, as MSU fell, 3-0.

## 2001 (1-1)

Nov. 23 - First Round

Michigan State 2, Butler 1

Butler took an early 1-0 lead in the 19th minute, but Michigan State made a triumphant return to the NCAA Tournament after a 32-year absence, as Craig Hearn tied the game before halftime and Steve Arce found Thomas Trivelloni in the 84th minute for the game-winning goal.

Nov. 25 - Second Round

Indiana 1, Michigan State 0

The Spartans were scoreless in their 1-0 loss to the Hoosiers, the team's third loss to the national finalist during the season. Indiana's Tyler Hawley scored the only goal on a penalty shot a little more than 10 minutes into the game. The game was very physical as both teams committed 39 fouls and four yellow cards.

## 2004 (0-1)

Nov. 19 - First Round

Tulsa 3, Michigan State 1

The Spartans captured their first Big Ten Championship and beat defending national champions Indiana for the first time since 1965, but the successful season was halted by Tulsa in a 3-1 loss. Jordan Gruber scored the only goal for the Spartans. Tulsa's Ryan Porte scored two goals.

## 2007 (0-1)

Nov. 24 - First Round

Oakland 2, Michigan State 1

Michigan State, hosting the first round matchup against in-state rival Oakland, fell behind 2-0 in the first 46 minutes. The Spartans played the entire second half a man down after a questionable red card call. Doug DeMartin knocked in a penalty kick at 79:24 for MSU's lone tally.

## 2008 (0-1)

Nov. 25 - Second Round

UIC 0, Michigan State 0 (UIC advances in PKs, 3-2)

No. 4 overall seed Michigan State received a first-round bye and for the first time in school history and hosted UIC in its second straight NCAA appearance. After 110 minutes of scoreless play, Illinois-Chicago advanced to the third round, 3-2, on penalty kicks after the teams tied 0-0 in regulation and two overtime sessions.

## 2009 (0-1)

Nov. 22 - Second Round

Duke 2, Michigan State 1

The fourth-seeded Spartans received a first-round bye and hosted a second-round game for the second consecutive year. Duke scored twice in the first half before MSU's Rubin Bega narrowed the deficit to 2-1 in the 77th minute. MSU pressured the Blue Devils with a flurry of chances in the final 10 minutes, but couldn't get the tying goal.

## 2010 (2-1)

Nov. 18 - First Round

Michigan State 2, Oakland 0

Michigan State got a pair of goals from midfielder Domenic Barone and four saves from keeper Avery Steinlage to post a 2-0 victory over Oakland in the first round of the 2010 NCAA Tournament at DeMartin Stadium.

Nov. 21 - Second Round

Michigan State 1, Butler 0

Senior midfielder Jeff Ricondo returned from a monthlong injury layoff and scored the dramatic game-winning goal in a 1-0 Michigan State victory over previously-unbeaten Butler in NCAA second-round action in Indianapolis.

Nov. 28 - Third Round

North Carolina 1, Michigan State 1, North Carolina advances on to penalty kicks. A goal from UNC's Enzo Martinez with less than 10 seconds left in regulation tied the game at one after nearly 64 minutes of scoreless action. Tied through two overtimes, the teams preceded to penalty kicks, where North Carolina prevailed, 5-4, on its final kick.

Nov. 15 - First Round

Michigan State 2, Cleveland State 1

MSU jumped out to a 2-0 lead before the game was 20 minutes old and surrendered a goal to the visiting Vikings in the 87th minute for a 2-1 win in the first round. Zach Bennett made four saves, his second-highest total of the season, in his first career NCAA victory.

In the Spartans seventh double-overtime game of the season, Tim Kreutz sent in a game-winning header in the 107th minute to advance MSU to the third round of the NCAA Tournament. After a balanced afternoon of attacks for both squads, it was a possession off a free kick that ended the game. Off a Louisville foul at midfield, Kevin Cope lofted a free kick into the box, where Adam Montague flicked the ball up to Kreutz, who knocked it past the keeper inside the left post.

Dec. 1 - Third Round

Michigan State 1, Georgetown 0

Earning its program record-tying 13th shutout of the season, a goal in the 28th minute from Adam Montague off a ball played in by Jay Chapman gave the Spartan defense all they needed to hold off the Georgetown attack and punch their ticket to the NCAA Elite Eight.

Dec. 7 - Elite Eight

Notre Dame 2, Michigan State 1

After the Spartan defense cleared out a dangerous opportunity for the Irish, a loose ball from a corner kick was sent in by Evan Panken off a deflection put Notre Dame up 1-0 in the 32nd minute. The Irish applied pressure, scoring their second goal just three minutes into the second half. Though the Spartans came back with a header from Jay Chapman after a two-goal deficit, they were unable to obtain the equalizer as time expired in the second half.

## 2014 (1-1-1)

Nov. 23 - Second Round

Michigan State 1, Oakland 0

The No. 3 seeded Michigan State men's soccer team shut down Oakland, 1-0, in the second round of the NCAA Tournament. After a tough, scoreless first half, in the 67th minute, Michigan State earned another corner kick from Lewis. Junior defender Zach Carroll scored his fifth goal of the season and fifth as a Spartan since transferring from Virginia, on a header inside the box from the set piece to win the game.

Nov. 30 - Third Round

Michigan State 2, Washington 2 (2OT)

Coming back from a 2-0 deficit to tie game at 2-2 with a goal from Tim Kreutz, the Spartans battled through double overtime with No. 14 seed Huskies to send the game into penalty kicks. The Spartans advanced on penalty kicks 4-3.

Dec. 6 - Elite Eight

Providence 3, Michigan State 2

Despite snagging an early lead by scoring on the first shot of the match, the Spartans fell to the Friars 3-2 with goals from Adam Montague and Zach Carroll. The Spartans exited the tournament as one of only two teams in the nation to make back-to-back Elite Eight appearances and as the only Big Ten team remaining.
