KICKOFF

The Michigan State men's soccer team (11-4-3, 2-3-1 Big Ten) host the 2007 Big Ten Men's Soccer Championship Nov. 8-11 at Old College Field. The seven-team tournament begins on Thursday, Nov. 8 at 9 a.m. with No. 3 Northwestern vs. No. 6 Wisconsin. Game 2 features No. 2 Ohio State against No. 7 Michigan. MSU will play Penn State Thursday at 2 p.m.

SCOUTING THE SPARTANS

The Spartans have established themselves among the best teams in the nation this season, having spent four weeks in the NSCAA Top 25. Fifth-year senior Chris Austin (0.84 GAA) has played every minute in goal this season, and he plays in front of a defense anchored by seniors Rauwshan McKenzie and John Folino, junior Dave Hertel and sophomore Tim Granaderos. Junior forward Doug DeMartin (11g, 0a - 22) is the Big Ten's leading scorer and MSU's top offensive threat. Senior co-captain Kenzo Webster (4g, 6a - 14), the other starting forward, was MSU's leading scorer in 2006. Junior Zac Scaffidi leads the midfield corps along with seniors Kevin Reiman and Ryan Dick and freshman Spencer Thompson.

MSU IN THE BIG TEN TOURNAMENT

Michigan State is 12-15 all-time in the Big Ten Championship, which has been played annually since 1991. The Spartans have a 3-4 record when playing as the fifth seed. MSU won the tournament title in 2004 as the No. 5 seed.

HATS OFF TO DEMARTIN

Doug DeMartin has been one of the top forwards in the Big Ten this season. The Mason, Mich., leads the Big Ten with 11 goals, and 22 including three tallies in MSU's win against Western Michigan on Oct. 24. He also leads the league in points (22) and shots (65). DeMartin has 20 career goals and 46 career points.

MSU, PSU TIE IN FIRST MEETING

The Spartans and Nittany Lions tied, 2-2, in their regular season match-up at Old College Field on Sept. 23. Kenzo Webster and Louis Stephens III scored for MSU, while Jason Yeisley tallied both of Penn State's goals. The match was a shootout, as the two squads fired 17 shots on goal and 33 tries overall.

'300'

Head coach Joe Baum is the second coach in Big Ten history to reach 300 career wins, following former Indiana boss Jerry Yeagley. Baum reached the 300-win plateau in MSU's 2-1 double-overtime win at Vermont on Sept. 9. The 31-year head coach, now boasts a 307-221-51 ledger at the helm of the Michigan State men's soccer program.

Joe Baum, in his 31st season at the helm of the Spartans, has enjoyed success at Michigan State as a player, assistant coach and head coach, spending 38 years associated with the program. The veteran coach is ranked 14th among active NCAA head coaches in career victories.

A two-time Big Ten Coach of the Year, Baum became the 26th coach in NCAA Division I history to record 300 victories at Vermont on Sept. 9. Former Indiana Jerry Yeager is the only other Big Ten coach to reach the 300-win mark.

The Spartans have won 11 matches or more in seven of the past eight seasons under Baum. Before leading this year's team to an 11-4-3 regular season mark, Baum mentored last season's squad to a 10-7-2 mark, including a 1-0 victory over 2005 national runner-up New Mexico.

In 2004, MSU went 12-7-1 and won its first Big Ten Championship and advanced to the NCAA Tournament for the second time in four seasons. The Spartans' run to the Big Ten postseason crown included a 2-1 win over Indiana, which was the 2003 national champion.

Baum also led the Spartans to the NCAA Tournament in 2001, marking the first time MSU had made it to the postseason since 1969.

Baum began his coaching career in 1969 at Southern Illinois-Edwardsville as an assistant coach. From 1972-74, he was an assistant at Wisconsin-Green Bay before returning to MSU in 1974. He was named the Spartans' head coach in 1977.

A three-year letterwinner at MSU from 1966-68, Baum played goalkeeper on Spartan teams that went 33-1-7, earning him a place on the 1968 All-Midwest team. His 0.70 goals against average is still the second lowest in school history.

Baum received his bachelor's degree in communications from MSU in 1969. He earned a master's degree in counseling from SIU-Edwardsville in 1971.

NATIONAL RANKINGS WATCH

The Spartans have dropped out of the NSCAA/adidas rankings after losing three straight. MSU cracked the NSCAA/adidas rankings at No. 24 on Oct. 1 after defeating Wisconsin, but fell off the national charts after a 2-0 loss to Indiana. Michigan State returned to the national ranking on Oct. 16 after defeating Notre Dame and Michigan. MSU was also dropped from the *Soccer Times* rankings, but the Spartans still stand 20th in the nation in *Soccer America*. Additionally, the *College Soccer News* Top 30 poll charts the Spartans at No. 29.

MSU is ranked fifth in the Great Lakes region by the NSCAA, behind Notre Dame, Indiana, Northwestern and Ohio State.

RPI UPDATE

Michigan State is ranked 29th in the latest RPI rankings released by the NCAA (Oct. 31). Four Big Ten teams currently stand ahead of MSU: Northwestern (3rd), Indiana (4th), Ohio State (7th) and Michigan (26th). The Spartans are 3-2 against the RPI top 50, with wins over Notre Dame (13th), Michigan and Wisconsin (42nd).

THE SERIES WITH PENN STATE

Penn State is 15-7-1 against Michigan State and is 3-6-1 against the Spartans at Old College Field. No player on MSU's current roster has beaten the Nittany Lions, with the Spartans' last win (1-0 at MSU) in the series coming on Oct. 20, 2002.

BIG TEN NETWORK

For the first time in Big Ten history, the men's soccer championship semifinal matches will be televised to a national audience. The Big Ten Network will televise Friday's two matches and will carry Sunday's final on an alternate channel. CSTV will carry both the men's and women's soccer championship matches as well. Dean Linke will handle the play-by-play duties for the three contests.

LET'S HOPE FOR SUNNY WEATHER

Although this week's weather reports don't call for 70 degrees and sunny, the weather in East Lansing this weekend is expected to be better than it was when MSU hosted in 1995. The weather was so bad, the championship match between Indiana and Wisconsin was cancelled and the two teams were declared co-champions.

SPREADING THE WEALTH

Nosa Iyoha's tally in the 14th minute against Oakland on Oct. 17 made him the 11th Spartan to score a goal this season. Six MSU players have scored once, and five have scored multiple goals. Seventeen position players and goalie Chris Austin have seen action this season.

Fifteen different Spartans have tallied at least one point this season.

2004 BIG TEN CHAMPIONS

Michigan State is hoping to duplicate the championship run it made as the tournament's fifth seed in 2004. After downing Wisconsin, 1-0, in the morning contest on Thursday, MSU defeated host and top seed Indiana, 2-1. MSU finished the run with a 1-0 win over second-seeded Northwestern to earn the conference's automatic NCAA bid.

NATIONAL HONORS

Chris Austin was named National Player of the Week by the NSCAA on Oct. 17. He made 10 saves in shutout wins over No. 3 Notre Dame and No. 21 Michigan. *Soccer America* tabbed Spencer Thompson the week's best after scoring two goals in the Spartan victories.

THE FORWARD MATCH-UP

The MSU-PSU tilt pits two of the Big Ten's top scorers against each other. Doug DeMartin, the Big Ten's leading scorer, will line up on the opposite side of Penn State's Jason Yeisley, who ranks second in the league in goals (6) but has the league lead in points per game (16 points in 12 matches - 1.33). The Mason, Mich., native also leads the conference in game-winning goals with five, and he captured Big Ten Offensive Player of the Week honors on Oct. 1 after scoring two goals in MSU's 3-0 win at Wisconsin. He was also on *Top Drawer Soccer's* National Team of the Week for his efforts.

Doug DeMartin is a two-time Academic All-Big Ten selection.

THE SPARTANS ARE DEFENSIVE SOLDIERS

MSU has spent much of the season ranked among the nation's leading teams defensively, posting a 0.84 team goals against average. Michigan State has allowed just 16 goals this season, but has yielded six in the last three matches. Additionally, the Spartans did not allow a goal within the flow of play until Penn State's Jason Yeisley scored twice on Sept. 23. Until then, the only goals allowed had come off restarts, opponent corner kicks and free kicks.

FREE SOCCER

During the month of September, double-overtime matches had become the norm for the Spartans. MSU played four consecutive double-overtime contests from Sept. 9-23, going 2-0-2 during that stretch. Following that skein, Michigan State had handled its opponents in regulation until MSU's match at Valparaiso on Oct. 21 became MSU's fifth double-overtime contest of the season.

CONFERENCE CALL

The Spartans have been regular recipients of the Big Ten Player of the Week Awards this season. Chris Austin has claimed defensive accolades twice this season (Oct. 1 & 15) while Doug DeMartin and Spencer Thompson have each received the weekly laurel once. Austin won the award after shutting out Wisconsin and Michigan, while DeMartin was honored for scoring twice at Wisconsin and Thompson was honored after tallying the game-winner against Notre Dame and another goal versus Michigan.

MSU has swept the weekly awards twice this season. Chris Austin and Doug DeMartin earned the conference accolades on Oct. 1 and Austin and Thompson swept on Oct. 15.

AUSTIN POWERS MSU DEFENSE

After serving in a back-up role for the last three seasons, Chris Austin is making the most of his opportunity as the starting goalkeeper for MSU. Austin, a two-time Big Ten Defensive Player of the Week, appeared in the top 20 goals against average and save percentage before the Spartans lost three straight to close the regular season. The Livonia, Mich., native finished the regular season ranked fourth in the Big Ten with a 0.84 goals against average and is third in the conference in saves (64), save percentage (.800) and saves per game (3.56).

...ESPECIALLY IN THE SECOND HALF AND LATER

Northwestern's goal in the 86th minute of play on Oct. 28 was the first goal yielded after 60 minutes of play by the Spartans this season. MSU has outscored its opponents, 7-3, in the final 30 minutes of play this season, and hold an 11-6 advantage after intermission.

CAPITAL PUNISHMENT

The key to MSU's 5-0 win over Michigan was two first-half goals that came on penalty kicks. The Wolverines committed two fouls in the box in the first 30 minutes, resulting in two PK goals by Doug DeMartin. Michigan State is 3-for-3 this season on PK attempts. Josh Rogers buried a penalty shot against Kentucky on Sept. 16. MSU opponents are 1-for-2 on penalty kicks this season, with the lone tally scored by Cincinnati on Oct. 31.

ZO FAR, ZO GOOD

Kenzo Webster, a second team All-Big Ten selection a year ago, is second on the team with 14 points (4g, 6a - 14) this season. Webster, who leads the team with six assists, had three points each in MSU's matches against Penn State and Michigan. The Monroe, Mich., native scored MSU's lone goal against Valparaiso, with the tally coming just 28 seconds into the match. Webster was the Spartans' top offensive threat in 2006, leading Michigan State in goals (7), points (15), shots (42) and shots on goal (20).

Kenzo Webster's older brother, John, was a two-time All-Big Ten player at Michigan State.

HANGING AROUND THE CORNER

In 31 years under Joe Baum, never has MSU had as many corner kicks as it did at Valparaiso. The Spartans amassed 19 corner kicks to just two for the Crusaders. Michigan State then took eight corners against Western Michigan on Oct. 24. The outburst in corners has pushed MSU to second in the Big Ten in corner kicks with an average 6.31. Ohio State leads the league with an average of 7.06 corner kicks.

SUPER SUBS

Louis Stephens III and Jeff Ricondo have been two of MSU's top players off the bench all season Stephens III is third on the team in scoring with seven points (3g, 1a). The Saginaw, Mich., native scored a goal against Western Michigan on Oct. 24 and he also netted goals against Penn State and Bowling Green and he assisted on one of DeMartin's goals at Wisconsin. Ricondo has seen action in every match this season and scored a goal at Vermont on Sept. 9.

NO REIMAN FOR NO REASON

Kevin Reiman, who has started every match in the midfield and has five assists this season, will not play Thursday after receiving a red card in the second half against Ohio State. The ejection came when Reiman slide tackled an OSU player in the 76th minute. Reiman has made 35 career starting assignments in his four-year college career, and he scored his first career goal at the 32:05 mark against Wisconsin on Sept. 30. Reiman, who played his first two seasons at Maryland, had eight points, all on assists, before finding the net against the Badgers.

Kevin Reiman was on Maryland's 2005 NCAA Championship team. Reiman also helped the Terps to the College Cup in 2004.

SPARTANS TAKE TOURNAMENT HONORS

Doug DeMartin scored a goal in both matches to capture Tournament MVP and all-tournament team honors at the Nike Soccer Festival in Vermont on Sept. 7 & 9. Both of the tallies were game-winners, and DeMartin leads the Big Ten with three game-winning goals this season. Josh Rogers also got all-tournament recognition for his defensive play in Vermont.

ROGERS RETURNS

Josh Rogers, who started the first seven matches of the season before suffering a leg injury, is expected to return to the Spartan lineup for Thursday's first-round match versus Penn State. Coincidentally, Rogers suffered the injury during the Spartans' match against the Nittany Lions on Sept. 23.

OH CAPTAIN, MY CAPTAINS

Head Coach Joe Baum

31st Year • 307-221-51 • Michigan State '69

Big Ten Coach of the Year (1996, 2000)

Joe Baum is in his 31st season as MSU's head coach, and 34th overall along the sidelines for the Michigan State men's soccer program. He has been associated with Spartan soccer for a combined 38 seasons as a player, assistant coach and head coach.

He ranks 11th among active NCAA head coaches with 307 career victories and is one of just 26 coaches in NCAA Division I history to reach 300 career wins. Baum is only the second Big Ten boss to reach the 300-win mark, joining Indiana's legendary Jerry Yeagley.

A two-time Big Ten Coach of the Year, Baum has guided the Spartans to an overall mark of 307-221-51 (.574), which includes 21 winning seasons during his time overseeing the Green and White.

Baum has made his 31st season at the helm of the MSU program one of his most memorable. Not only did he pass the 300-win mark, but the Spartans spent several weeks of the season in the national rankings. MSU defeated No. 3 Notre Dame, 1-0, on Oct. 10, marking the second consecutive year MSU has defeated the nation's third-ranked team. Michigan State also defeated nationally-ranked Michigan, 5-0, before a crowd of over 2,000 at Old College Field.

Last season, Baum guided the Spartans to a 10-6-2 record, including two wins over teams ranked in the nation's top 25. On Sept. 1, Baum coached the Spartans to the program's greatest regular-season upset in school history, a 1-0 victory against third-ranked and 2005 national runner-up New Mexico.

In 2004, MSU captured its first Big Ten Tournament Championship and a berth in the NCAA Tournament for the second time in four years, finishing the season with a 12-7-1 record. The Spartans made a magical run through the conference tournament, shutting out Wisconsin, 1-0, in the first round before shocking defending national champion Indiana, 2-1, in the semifinals. Michigan State capped the tournament with a 1-0 win over Northwestern in the championship.

In 2001, the Spartans (13-6-1) made their first appearance in the NCAA Tournament since 1969. The Green and White defeated Butler 2-1 but fell in round two to Big Ten powerhouse Indiana 1-0. In 2000, Baum led the Spartans to an 11-6-2 record, including a 4-1-1 Big Ten mark, good for a second-place finish. The four conference wins were the most in school history and earned Baum his second Big Ten Coach of the

Year honors. In 1996, he led the team to a mark of 12-5-2, which also earned him Big Ten Coach of the Year honors.

In 1995, Baum guided the Green and White booters to a mark of 12-3-3, his highest seasonal winning percentage (.750) while at MSU and the program's best mark since 1975.

Baum also helped build MSU women's program, serving as the program's first head coach from 1986-90 and compiling an impressive 69-23-5 (.737) record.

Baum began his coaching career in 1969 at Southern Illinois-Edwardsville as an assistant to Bob Guelker. From there, he took a similar post at Wisconsin-Green Bay from 1972-74.

In 1974, Baum came to Michigan State as an assistant to Ed Rutherford. Baum held the position for three seasons, helping State post a record of 25-7-3 (.757). He was promoted to the head coaching position in 1977 when Rutherford

stepped down to serve as a full-time administrative assistant to then-Athletics Director Joe Kearney.

In 30 seasons, Baum has built the Spartan program into a consistent winner. During his tenure, he has coached such Spartan greats as forward Tom Doherty (34 goals from 1982-85) along with goalkeepers Paul Zimmerman (29 shutouts from 1982-85) and Reid Friedrichs (Big Ten Player of the Year in 1996). Two players from the 2004 Big Ten Tournament Championship team, Jordan Gruber and John Minagawa-Webster, played professional soccer while Ryan McMahon earned a full-roster contract from the Kansas City Wizards of the MLS in the spring of 2007. In addition, since the Big Ten Conference's sponsorship of men's soccer in 1991, 34 different players have garnered 50 berths on all-conference teams.

A three-year soccer letterman at MSU from 1966-68, Baum led the Spartan booters to a 33-1-7 record, including a 33-game unbeaten streak. He was in goal for two NCAA co-championship squads and was named to the 1968 All-Midwest team by the National Soccer Coaches of America. Baum still owns the second-lowest career goals-against average (0.70) in Spartan men's soccer history.

Baum received his bachelor's degree in communications from MSU in 1969 and a master's degree in counseling from Southern Illinois-Edwardsville in 1971.

Baum resides in Okemos and his family includes his wife, Janice, along with children, Stefan and Kelsey.

Associate Head Coach Damon Rensing

31st Year • 97-57-17 while on staff • Michigan State '97

Former MSU soccer standout Damon Rensing is completing his ninth year on the coaching staff at his alma mater. With four years as a member of the soccer team and one season as an assistant with the women's program, Rensing has spent almost half his life in the Green and White.

After six seasons as assistant coach under head coach Joe Baum, Rensing was promoted to associate head coach following the 2004 season.

During his nine years at Michigan State, Rensing has helped lead the Spartans to the 2004 Big Ten Championship and its first two trips to the NCAA Tournament (2001, 2004) since 1969. Michigan State has posted an 97-57-17 (.617) overall record with Rensing at the sidelines, including 11 or more wins in six seasons.

Rensing returned to the Spartan program in 1999 after serving as assistant women's soccer coach at UNLV in 1998. He helped that club to an overall record of 8-10-1 along with a No. 3 national ranking for first-year programs. In addition, he coached the Las Vegas Premier Soccer U-17 Team to a state champion-

ship. Still active in the development of soccer players, Rensing is currently in his sixth year as a Michigan Olympic Development Program coach.

During the 1997 campaign, he assisted with the MSU women's soccer team before moving to UNLV when former MSU women's assistant Staci Hendershott was appointed head coach of that program.

Rensing was a four-time letterwinner and three-year starter with the MSU program (1993-96). His senior year saw him capture All-Big Ten first-team recognition after picking up 14 points on five goals and four assists. He was a second-team honoree to the All-Big Ten Team as a sophomore and junior. During his four years, he played in 74 games, 55 as a starter, and totaled seven goals and 13 assists for 27 points.

Rensing earned his bachelor's degree from MSU in communication in 1997. He married the former Daune Koester in May 2004. Their first daughter, Anna Hanley, just turned one year old in July.

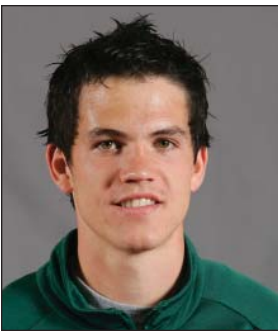

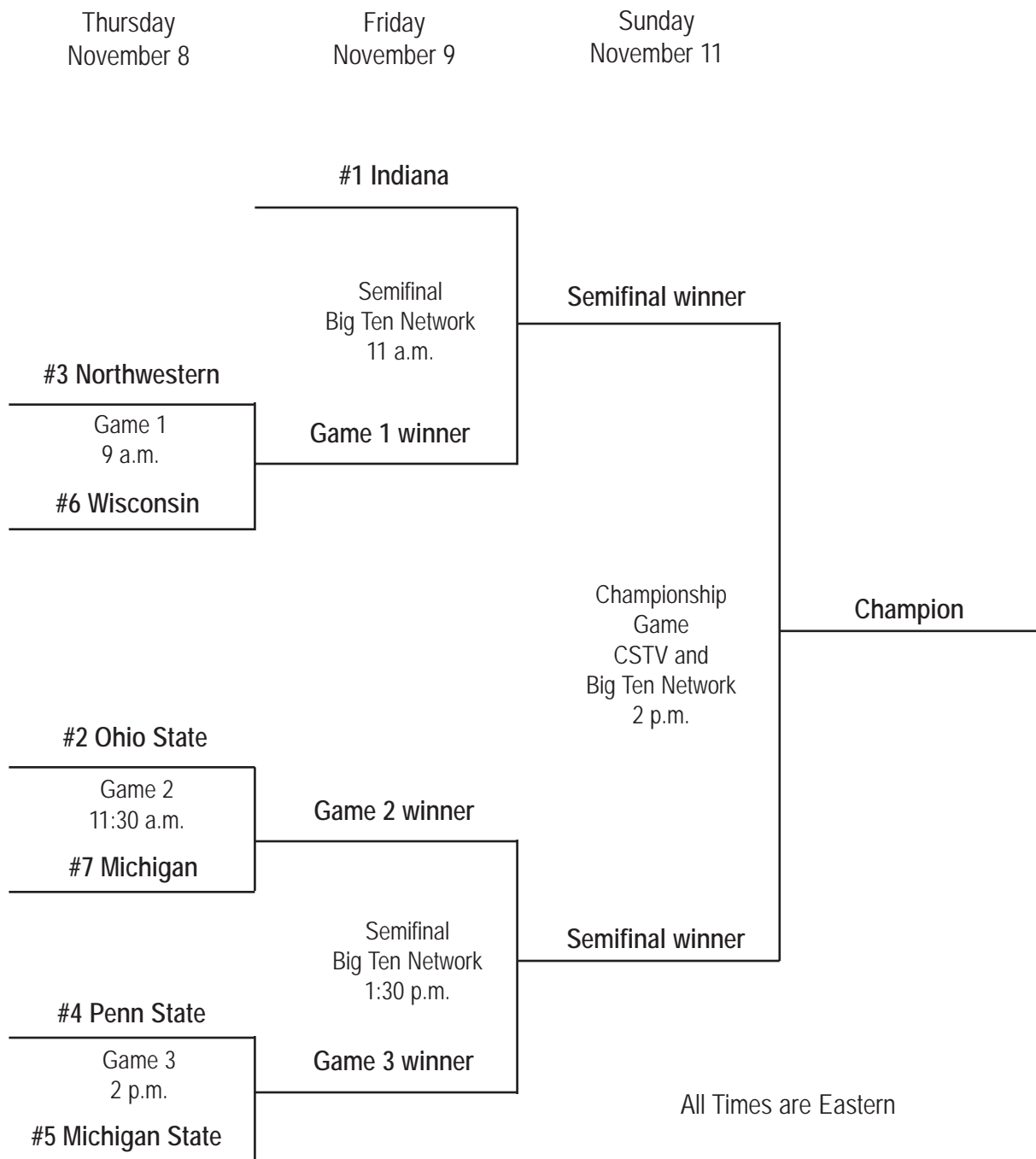
