## 2003-03 Season In Review

The 2002-03 season was one of the Spartans' most successful campaigns in school history. With experienced senior captains Nik Fekete, Gray Maynard, Karl Nadolsky and Rashad Evans, MSU posted a 10-7 record, as each wrestler advanced to the NCAA Championships.

Michigan State placed 18<sup>th</sup> at the NCAA Championships, fourth at the Big Ten Championships and third in the Big Ten regular season standings with a 6-2 record. Six Spartans advanced to the national championships and Nick Simmons and Maynard earned All-American honors as each finished seventh in their respective weight class.

Maynard earned All-America honors for the third consecutive season while Simmons earned the first All-America nod of his young career. The two seventh-place finishes helped push the Spartans to their top 20 finish at the NCAA Championships.

While the championship finishes were no doubt exciting, Michigan State concluded one of most its memorable home dual seasons in program history with a 19-18 win over No. 12 Penn State on Feb. 16. The Spartans ended their home season on a six-match winning streak, including wins over No. 21 Wisconsin, No. 5 Oklahoma, No. 2 Iowa and No. 7 Michigan. MSU was 6-2 overall at home during the 2002-03 campaign.

Two of the most exciting wins came over Iowa and Michigan - back-to-back in the same weekend, no less. On Feb. 7, MSU defeated Iowa for the first time since 1971 by winning on criteria after wrestling to a 19-19 team score. The Spartans won on criteria B, which declares the team with the most falls is the victor of the dual. Senior Arsen Aleksanyan recorded the lone pin of the dual at 165 pounds, which gave MSU the stunning victory over collegiate wrestling's most storied program.

After the emotional victory over the Hawkeyes, MSU turned around on Feb. 9 to defeat their archrival Michigan, 16-15, before a packed crowd of over 3,100 in Jenison Field House.

The Spartans were up 13-12 with two matches remaining in the dual when Gray Maynard stepped up with a huge victory over former high school teammate Ryan Bertin at 157 pounds. Maynard, who lost to Bertin three times in 2002, avenged his previous losses with a dramatic 5-4 tiebreaker win.

MSU carried its regular season success into the postseason with a fourth place finish at the Big Ten Championships in Madison, Wis. Four Spartans placed in the top three and seniors Maynard (157) and Fekete (197) finished runners-up in their weight classes as MSU compiled 92.5 points. Six Spartans earned bids to the national tournament, including Maynard, Fekete, Simmons and Evans. Simmons won four consecutive matches to take third place while Evans also finished third. Simmons avenged his only loss of the tournament with a 6-2 win over Tony Black of Wisconsin, who beat Simmons in the quarterfinals. After the win, Simmons was named the Big Ten Freshman of the Year. Rounding out the qualifiers for MSU were Nadolsky (4th - 149) and Ryan L'Amoreaux (6th - 141). L'Amoreaux moved up a weight class for the 2003 season. He posted a 12-12 record at 141 pounds after going 14-9 at 133 in 2002.

The Spartans' third-place finish in the Big Ten standings was its best finish since 1995-96. MSU split two tough road matches in the last weekend of conference action to finish tied for third in the Big Ten dual standings with a 6-

2 record. The Spartans handled No. 16 Purdue, 23-9, Feb. 21, but lost

a heartbreaker at No. 8 Illinois, 17-16, on Feb. 23. Iowa and Minnesota each finished the Big Ten slate with a 7-1 mark. MSU finished the regular season with 10 victories, the most for the program since 1995-96.

With national accolades and dual meet victories mounting, the MSU wrestling program enjoyed a year of milestone moments as head coach Tom Minkel recorded his 100th career win at Northwestern on Jan. 24, joining Grady Peninger (213 wins) and Fendley Collins (158) as the only coaches in Spartan history to reach the century mark for victories. On the mat, Nadolsky became just the 13th Spartan to record 100 wins with a 22-7 technical fall win on Feb. 2, while Maynard followed Nadolsky's footsteps by racking up his 100th career victory on Feb. 21.

With two All-American grapplers, a top 20 national finish and exciting victories over the country's top programs, 2003 proved to be one of Michigan State wrestling's greatest ever.

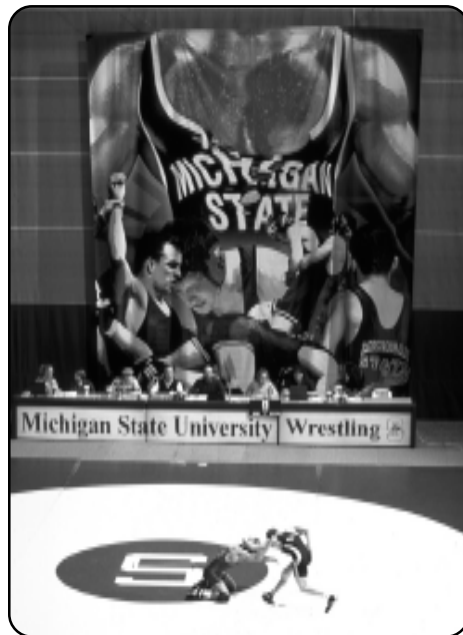

Jenison Field House  
Home of Michigan State Wrestling



The Michigan State wrestling team's home is the 5,017-seat Jenison Field House. Featuring the nation's only wrestling platform, fans are treated to a truly unique wrestling venue. In addition, the Spartan wrestling program unveiled a 20-by-25 foot mural on the north curtain in 2001, highlighting former Spartan stars. Banners commemorating MSU's eight Big Ten championships and the 1967 National Championship team hang in the rafters, bordering around the platform. Jenison Field House, which underwent an \$8 million renovation in 2001, is one of college wrestling's most intimate venues.



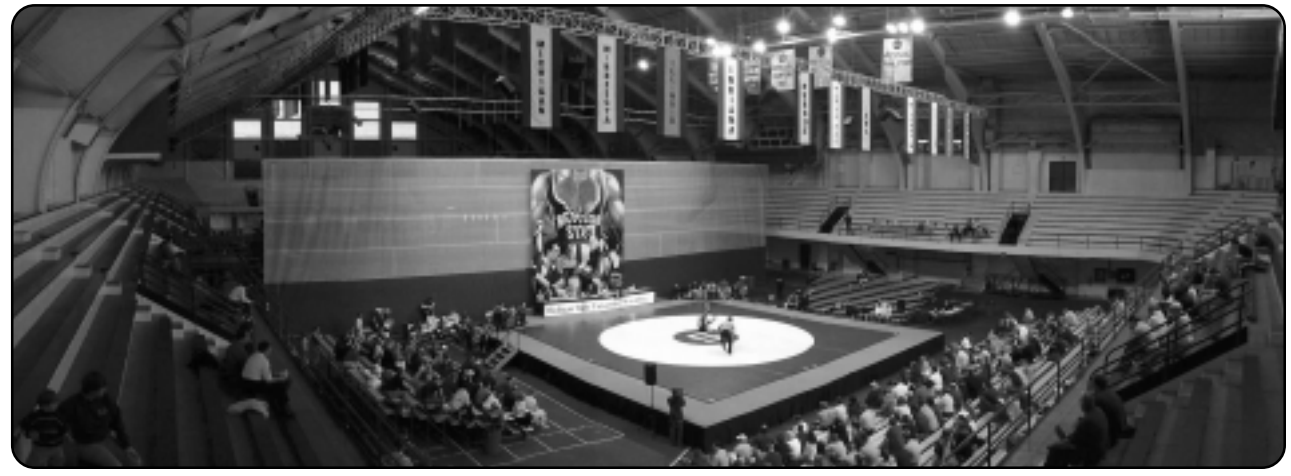
