#### OPENING TIP

The Michigan State women's basketball team will look for its first-ever WNIT title as it hosts the 2008 championship game against Marquette Saturday at 4 p.m. in the Breslin Center. The Spartans defeated Bowling Green, Kansas, Michigan and North Carolina State en route to the final game of the 48-team tournament, while the Golden Eagles beat Creighton, Illinois, Kentucky and Colorado. The game, which marks just the second meeting between the two schools, will be televised on the CBS College Sports Network (formerly CSTV).

The Spartans (23-13) advanced to the championship game with a thrilling 58-57 semifinal victory over North Carolina State on Wednesday. The two teams traded leads four times in the final 90 seconds, but Allyssa DeHaan's putback with 11 seconds left proved to be the difference. Junior Mia Johnson led MSU with 17 points and three 3-pointers, while DeHaan poured in 15 points to go along with five blocks. In the game, DeHaan tied her own Big Ten single-season blocks record, as she now has 145 for the season. Michigan State has played all of its WNIT games at home and is riding an eight-game winning streak at the Breslin Center.

Entering the title game, MSU has won 10 of its last 12 games. A win on Saturday would give MSU 24 wins on the season, which would tie for the second-most victories in school history. The Spartans are also an impressive 10-1 in games decided by five points or less, including three straight in the WNIT.

Marquette (20-14) topped Colorado in the semifinals on the road, 86-72, to reach the title game. The Golden Eagles, who tied for eighth in the Big East Conference with an 8-8 mark, have won six of their last eight games. Two-time first-team All-Big East selection Krystal Ellis leads the team in scoring with 19.5 ppg and scored 40 in the quarterfinal win at Kentucky.

**WHAT TO WATCH FOR**

- **Allyssa DeHaan** has 145 blocks, which ties her own Big Ten single-season record she set as a freshman. She already owns the WNIT record for most blocks in a tournament with 17 (previous record: 12).
- **Suzy Merchant** is looking to become the winningest first-year coach in MSU basketball history, men's side included. **Karen Langeland** also had 23 wins in her first season, going 23-6 in 1976-77. Merchant is also looking to win her career-best 24th game in a season, as she also claimed 23 wins in 2004-05 at Eastern Michigan.
- With a victory, MSU would tie its second-highest win total in a single-season with 24.

**ODDS-N-ENDS**

- **Allyssa DeHaan** has 145 blocked shots in 36 games, 79 more than Purdue's Danielle Campbell, who ranks second in the Big Ten with 66 blocks. Her 145 blocks tie for eighth most in NCAA single-season history.
- In the third-round win against Kansas, DeHaan became the 20th player in MSU history to collect 500 career rebounds. She also collected her 900th career point, and is already 25th in MSU history with 931 points.
- MSU is riding a four-game winning streak, which matches a season best. The Spartans also won four in a row from Nov. 21 to Nov. 29 (Northern Illinois, Kansas State, at Delaware State, Clemson) and from Feb. 10 to Feb. 21 (Purdue, at Indiana, at Penn State, Northwestern).
- MSU is 16-0 when it has more assists than its opponent.
- Michigan State is 14-3 when leading at the half and 17-1 when leading with five minutes left in the game.
- MSU is 16-2 when holding teams to under 60 points.
- **The Spartans are 10-1 when games are decided by five points or less.**
- The starting lineup of Brittney Thomas, Mia Johnson, Mandy Piechowski, Kalisha Keane and Allyssa DeHaan is 11-3.
- MSU has won eight straight at the Breslin Center.
- MSU has won 13 postseason games the past five years, the most of any Big Ten team.
- Saturday's game marks the fourth game in MSU history in April. In addition to Wednesday's game vs. North Carolina State, the other two arrived in the 2005 Final Four, when MSU beat Tennessee in the national semifinals on April 3 before falling to Baylor in the national championship game on April 5.
- The Spartans are the last Big Ten team remaining in the postseason.
- Michigan State's 23 wins are the most for any Big Ten team this season.

**THE BASICS**

• The Spartans, with a 23-13 overall record, have won 10 of their last 12 games. MSU finished the Big Ten season 10-8, marking the sixth straight season it has won 10 or more games during the conference season.

• Michigan State has recorded five straight 20-win seasons and is making its seventh consecutive appearance in the postseason. The Spartans have won a postseason game five consecutive years, and their 13 postseason wins during that stretch is the most of any Big Ten team.



Michigan State, the youngest team in the Big Ten, has the most wins of any team in the conference. The Spartans recorded their fifth straight 20-win season.

• MSU is 10-1 this season in games decided by five points or less (wins over Kansas State, Delaware State, Illinois, Michigan (twice), Purdue, Indiana, Minnesota, Kansas, NC State; only loss at Hartford).

• Michigan State is one of the youngest teams in the country - **out of MSU's 12 active players, nine are freshmen and sophomores, the most underclassmen of any team in the Big Ten.** MSU's starting lineup the past 14 games (record: 11-3) features two freshmen (Keane, Thomas), two sophomores (DeHaan, Piechowski) and one junior (Johnson). **Eighty percent of the team's scoring comes from the underclassmen.**

• Sophomore 6-9 center **Allyssa DeHaan**, who has tied her own Big Ten single-season record with 145 blocked shots, is second in the country in blocks. **She is the first player in Big Ten history to record 100 blocks in two different seasons.** A first-team All-Big Ten selection by the media, she leads the team in scoring (14.4 ppg) and rebounding (7.4 rpg), and is just the fifth player at MSU to score 500 points in a season. **MSU's all-time leader in blocked shots with 290, DeHaan was on national player of the year watch lists this season for the Naismith Award, the Wooden Award and the Wade Trophy.** She was named Big Ten Player of the Week three times this season.

• The Spartans are relying on a heralded freshman class for extended minutes this season. The class, ranked among the top 20 in the nation, features point guard **Brittney Thomas** (7.4 ppg, 5.4 rpg, 3.6 apg) and forwards **Kalisha Keane** (12.1 ppg), **Cetera Washington** (3.0 ppg) and **Taja Wilson** (2.7 ppg). The trio of Thomas, Keane and Washington started 17 times this year for the Spartans. **Thomas and Keane became just the second Spartan duo to be named to the All-Big Ten Freshman Team in the same season (Lindsay Bowen, Liz Shimek in 2003).** Keane is 16th in the Big Ten in scoring and has scored in double figures 23 times this season; she is the top freshman scorer in school history with 436 points.

• Freshman point guard **Brittney Thomas** is one of the most versatile freshmen in the Big Ten. The honorable mention All-Big Ten selection leads conference freshmen in minutes (35.1 avg.) and assists (3.6 avg.). Thomas also ranks second in steals (1.8 avg.), fourth in rebounding (5.4 avg.) and fifth in scoring (7.4 avg.). In MSU's freshman record book, she is second in assists with 128. **Her 196 rebounds are the most ever by a Spartan freshman guard.**

• The other returning starter and tri-captain, junior guard **Mia Johnson**, tore her ACL during summer workouts and missed the first eight games of the season. After slowly re-entering the rotation, she started her first game of the season at Illinois on Jan. 24, and responded by scoring a season-high 20 points. She has started the last 16 games (MSU record: 12-4) and is currently averaging 3.9 points and 18 minutes per game. Johnson averaged 8.3 ppg and 3.9 rpg in 29.6 minutes a game last season, her first for the Green and White after transferring from Saint Louis University in 2005-06. Johnson scored 17 in the WNIT semifinals over NC State.

• Sophomore center **Lauren Aitch** (7.3 ppg, 4.4 rpg), who received a medical redshirt last season due to a torn ACL, is back and healthy this season. She has scored in double figures 12 times this season, including a career-best 16-point performance vs. Clemson Nov. 29. MSU is 9-3 when Aitch scores in double figures.

• Senior guard **Courtney Davidson** is having her most productive season as a Spartan. She is averaging career bests in points (7.2) and minutes (21.4). She leads the team with 42 3-pointers made, which is tied for 15th most in an MSU single-season, and has made at least three 3-pointers in eight games. Davidson has come through in the clutch several times this season - she scored a career-high 20 points on Senior Night against Illinois; poured in 18 points in the comeback win over Iowa Jan. 10; and scored 17 in the win against Purdue Feb. 11, including two free throws with 15.6 seconds left on the clock to give MSU the 56-54 victory.

• Sophomore guard **Mandy Piechowski** tied a career high with four 3-pointers in the win over Bowling Green in the second round of the WNIT. Piechowski has scored in double figures three times this season, including a career-high 14 points at Minnesota on Jan. 27. Piechowski has started the last 14 games (MSU record: 11-3).

• The Spartans lost power forward **Aisha Jefferson** to a season-ending knee injury in the second exhibition game against Lake Superior State. Jefferson, one of three captains named by Coach Merchant at the beginning of the season, was an honorable mention All-Big Ten pick last year after averaging 10.4 ppg and 5.6 rpg.

## A LOOK AT THE OPPONENT: MARQUETTE (20-14)

**A GLANCE AT MARQUETTE:** Marquette (20-14) topped Colorado in the semifinals on the road, 86-72, to reach the WNIT title game. The Golden Eagles, who tied for eighth in the Big East Conference with an 8-8 mark, have won six of their last eight games. The Golden Eagles have also defeated Creighton, Illinois and Kentucky in the WNIT.

Marquette has been in this situation before, reaching the WNIT championship game in 2006. The Golden Eagles fell in the title game at Kansas State, 77-65.

Two-time first-team All-Big East selection Krystal Ellis leads the team in scoring with 19.5 ppg and scored 40 in the quarterfinal win at Kentucky. Ellis ranks among the national leaders in free throws, 3-point field goals and 3-point field-goal percentage. Freshman guard Angel Robinson is second on the team with 11.3 ppg.

The Eagles play an up-tempo game, averaging 70 points and ranking among the top 20 in the nation in steals with more than 11 per contest.

**COACH TERRI MITCHELL:** The winningest coach in Marquette women's basketball history, Terri Mitchell is in her 12th season at the helm of the Golden Eagle program. Mitchell has guided Marquette to six straight postseason berths and three consecutive 20-win seasons. She has taken Marquette to the NCAA Tournament six times and has eight 20-win seasons as a head coach at the school.

**COMMON OPPONENTS:** MSU and Marquette have played five common opponents this season (Wisconsin, Kansas, Northwestern, Providence and Illinois). MSU went 6-2 against those teams, while Marquette went 3-2 (wins against Wisconsin, Providence and Illinois, losses to Kansas and Northwestern).

## DEHAAN: FIRST-TEAM ALL-BIG TEN SELECTION BY THE MEDIA

Allyssa DeHaan is just the seventh Spartan in program history to be named first-team All-Big Ten. DeHaan leads the Big Ten in blocked shots for the second straight year with 140 and is among the league leaders in scoring (14.4 ppg), rebounding (7.4), free-throw shooting (83 percent) and field-goal percentage (48 percent).

An All-America candidate for both her outstanding offense and defense, DeHaan was named to national player of the year watch lists this season for the Wade Trophy, the Naismith Trophy and the Wooden Award this season. In late January, she was one of 31 candidates named to the Naismith Trophy midseason list.

## DEHAAN MSU'S ALL-TIME BLOCKS LEADER

Allyssa DeHaan became MSU's all-time leader in blocked shots after recording five against Oklahoma on Dec. 16. She reached the mark in just 43 career games. Kristen Rasmussen previously held the record with 194 blocks in 118 career games. DeHaan is currently third in Big Ten history with 290 career blocks.

DeHaan, who set the Big Ten single-season record with 145 blocked shots her freshman year and has tied that mark again this season, is second in the nation in blocks. Her 145 blocks are tied for eighth most in NCAA history. She is the first player in Big Ten history to record 100 blocks in two different seasons.

The NCAA single-season record for blocked shots was set earlier this season by Louella Tomlinson, a 6-4 freshman from Saint Mary's (Calif.). She not only broke DeHaan's freshman record but the overall blocks record with 156 blocks her first season (4.9 avg.). The previous record was held by Amie Williams of Jackson State, who had 152 in 2003.

The NCAA career record is 480, set by TCU's Sandora Irvin from 2002-05. Jessica Davenport of Ohio State owns the Big Ten career record with 384.

With three blocks at Providence on Dec. 20, DeHaan became the fastest player in NCAA Division I history to reach the 200-block milestone while playing in her freshman and sophomore seasons (44 games).

## DEHAAN ONE OF FIVE PLAYERS IN MSU HISTORY TO SCORE 500 POINTS IN A SEASON

Allyssa DeHaan leads the team in scoring this season, averaging 14.4 points a game, and her 520 points this season rank fifth in MSU single-season history. She is just the fifth player in MSU history to score 500 points in a season (Liz Shimek and Kisha Kelly-twice; Maxann Reese and Lindsay Bowen, once).

She has recorded six double-doubles and has scored in double-figures 28 times. She has five games with 20-plus points, including a season-high 27 at Wisconsin Jan. 2, tying the second-highest total of her career (career-high: 28 points vs. Rhode Island on Nov. 29, 2006).

**NOT JUST A SHOT BLOCKER**

While Allyssa DeHaan has gained national attention for her shot-blocking ability, she is just as skilled from the free-throw line. DeHaan, who is eighth in the Big Ten and 43rd in the nation at 83 percent from the charity stripe, went a perfect 11-for-11 at the line at Wisconsin on Jan. 2, becoming just the third player in Spartan history to make at least all 11 free throws in a single game.

Earlier this season, DeHaan made 30 consecutive free throws, the fourth longest streak in MSU history. Lindsay Bowen holds the MSU record with 37 straight free throws, which she set during the 2002-03 season.

DeHaan's 115 free throws made this season rank fifth in MSU single-season history. In fact, her 194 career free throws already rank 18th most in MSU history.

**DEHAAN: THREE-TIME BIG TEN PLAYER OF THE WEEK THIS SEASON**

Allyssa DeHaan has been named Big Ten Player of the Week three times this season. She has won the honor five times in her young career, tying Liz Shimek for the most Big Ten Player of the Week honors in program history.

DeHaan became one of just two Spartans in program history to earn back-to-back Big Ten Player of the Week honors when she claimed the award on Dec. 3 and Dec. 10. She was named the league's player of the week Dec. 3 after averaging 18.0 points and 8.7 rebounds in MSU's three games, including a 26-point effort against Clemson. She followed that by nearly collecting a triple-double at Indiana State, recording 24 points, 10 rebounds and nine blocks, and was again named player of the week on Dec. 10.

DeHaan earned her third weekly award of the season on Feb. 18 after leading MSU to three wins in one week (Purdue, Indiana and Penn State). She averaged 15.7 points, 7.7 rebounds, 4.3 blocks and 2.0 assists.

**COMING THROUGH IN THE CLUTCH**

Although statistics are vital to winning awards, individual moments to win games can stand out even more. Allyssa DeHaan has hit three-game winning shots in the closing seconds this season and has four career game-winning shots.

In the WNIT semifinals against North Carolina State, DeHaan made a putback with 11 seconds left to give MSU the one-point win, 58-57. She hit a shot earlier with 46 seconds remaining that gave MSU a one-point lead at 56-55 before NC State hit a go-ahead basket 13 seconds later.

In a Jan. 24 road game at Illinois, DeHaan hit her second career game-winning shot to help the Spartans win, 65-62. With the score tied at 62, MSU got the ball in the post to DeHaan, who missed her first two shots, but put the third attempt up and in with 11 seconds remaining, giving the Spartans a 64-62 lead.

At Indiana on Feb. 14, with the game tied at 62, DeHaan hit a jumper in the lane with 1:23 left to put MSU up, 64-62. After an Indiana free throw cut the lead to one, DeHaan hit another jumper with 43 seconds remaining to give the Spartans a three-point lead at 66-63. DeHaan hit her last four field goals of the game down the stretch.

Last year at No. 5 Ohio State, with the Spartans down 57-56, DeHaan made a layup with 20 seconds left to give MSU the lead for good. DeHaan hit two more free throws with one second remaining in the 62-59 victory over the Buckeyes.

**HOW ABOUT OFF THE COURT?**

Allyssa DeHaan was named to the ESPN The Magazine Academic All-District IV Team, as selected by the College Sports Information Directors of America (CoSIDA). DeHaan earned third-team honors for her 3.38 GPA as a pre-med major. This marks the fifth consecutive year Michigan State has placed a student-athlete on the CoSIDA Academic All-District IV Team.

DeHaan was also named to the Academic All-Big Ten team, along with Mia Johnson, Mandy Piechowski and Alisa Wulff.

**SUZY MERCHANT BEGINS FIRST SEASON IN EAST LANSING**

Suzy Merchant, who owns a 224-133 career record (.627) in her 13 years as a head coach, is in her first season leading the Michigan State women's basketball program. She is just the second coach in MSU basketball history - men's side included - to win 20 games in her first season in East Lansing.

For her career, she has five 20-win seasons, including three at Eastern Michigan and one at Saginaw Valley State. She has tied her career high with 23 wins this season; she also won 23 games in 2004-05 at Eastern Michigan.

Merchant spent the past nine seasons at Eastern Michigan, compiling a 147-91 (.618) record to become the program's all-time winningest coach. She led EMU to three 20-win seasons, three postseason appearances, including the 2004 NCAA Tournament, and two Mid-American Conference West Division titles. Prior to coaching at Eastern Michigan, Merchant had a 54-29 (.651) record in three years at Saginaw Valley State.

**MERCHANT IN THE POSTSEASON**

Spartan first-year head coach Suzy Merchant is making her fifth appearance as a head coach in the postseason. While at Eastern Michigan, she took the Eagles to the NCAA Tournament in 2004 and the WNIT in 2005 and 2006. At Saginaw Valley State, she led the Cardinals to the Division II NCAA Tournament in 1997. In the 2004 NCAA Tournament, Merchant's 14th-seeded Eagles nearly upset No. 3 seed Boston College in the first round, falling 58-56. Eastern Michigan lost in the first round of the WNIT in 2005 to Kentucky and in 2006 to Indiana State.

## MSU WOMEN'S BASKETBALL: AN ELITE PROGRAM

- MSU has compiled five straight 20-win seasons (22 in 2003-04, 33 in 2004-05, 24 in 2005-06, 24 in 2006-07, 23 in 2007-08).
- MSU's 23 wins this season are tied for the fourth-most wins in program history (record: 33 in 2004-05).
- The Spartans have a combined 126-45 (.737) record since the beginning of the 2003-04 season.
- MSU has appeared in the NCAA Tournament eight times, including a berth in the 2005 Final Four.
- Michigan State is making its seventh straight appearance in the postseason.
- Counting the two NCAA Tournament games last season, MSU is 53-9 (.855) at home since 2004-05.
- Entering its 19th season at the Breslin Center, Michigan State is 187-71 (.725) all-time on its home floor.
- Michigan State has 28 wins over nationally ranked opponents in the last six years.
- MSU is just one of two teams (Ohio State) in the Big Ten to have won 20 games the past five seasons.
- The Spartans have been ranked in the top 10 nationally in attendance the past three seasons and have been ranked in the top 20 the past six seasons.

## WNIT GAME NOTES

### SEMIFINALS: MSU 58, NORTH CAROLINA STATE 57

- Allyssa DeHaan hit the game-winning shot on a putback with 11 seconds remaining to give MSU a 58-57 win over North Carolina State on Wednesday before a crowd of 4,416 at the Breslin Center.
- Mia Johnson scored 17 points, her second-best scoring effort of the season...she scored 20 at Illinois in her first start of the year...Johnson has started the last 16 games for the Spartans, and MSU's record is 12-4 during those games...she hit two clutch 3-pointers in the second half, both of which gave MSU the lead after the score was tied.
- The game had four lead changes in the final 90 seconds and eight lead changes for the game.
- DeHaan scored 15 points, giving her 520 for the season, which ranks fifth most in school history...she is one of just five Spartans to score 500 points in a single-season.
- Brittney Thomas played all 40 minutes...she played all 40 against Kansas in the third round and all 45 in the overtime quarterfinal win over Michigan...it marks the eighth game this season she has played the entire game.
- Lauren Aitch (6), Cetera Washington (5) and Taja Wilson (5) combined for 16 rebounds off the bench...MSU outrebounded the Wolfpack, 35-31.
- Lauren Aitch was 6-for-9 from the field and scored 12 points...MSU is 9-3 this season and 11-3 in her career when she scores in double-figures.
- MSU held Wolfpack guard Shayla Fields to 1-of-9 shooting and three points...Fields came into the game averaging 18.2 points in her last 10 games.
- The Spartans improve to 16-2 when holding opponents to under 60 points.
- MSU, the Big Ten leader in field-goal percentage defense, held NC State to 39 percent shooting from the field.

### QUARTERFINALS: MSU 45, MICHIGAN 40 (OT)

- Michigan State rallied to beat Michigan, 45-40 in overtime, in the WNIT quarterfinals on March 30 before a crowd of 5,116.
- The Spartans claimed the season series over Michigan, 2-1...MSU has won 11 of the past 12 meetings against the Wolverines...MSU has won six in a row over Michigan at the Breslin Center...MSU leads the overall series against Michigan, 52-15.
- It marked the second straight comeback for Michigan State over Michigan this season...the Spartans trailed by eight points, 53-45, with 6:30 to go in the game on Jan. 31 in East Lansing before closing the game on a 16-5 run to win, 61-58...this time, MSU was trailing by nine, 37-28, with 6:26 remaining and closed the second half on a 9-0 run to tie the game and send it into overtime...MSU outscored Michigan in overtime, 8-3, to close the game's final 11:26 on a 17-3 run...Michigan was held without a field goal that entire stretch and was held scoreless from the 6:26 mark in the second half until 35 seconds left in overtime.
- Allyssa DeHaan became the fifth player in MSU history to score 500 points in a single-season...she also recorded four blocks and went 7-for-10 from the line.
- Kalisha Keane scored all 15 of her points in the second half and overtime...Keane tied her career high with four steals and also had eight rebounds...she tied the game at 37 with a 3-pointer at the 1:35 mark that sent the game into overtime.
- Brittney Thomas grabbed a career-high 10 rebounds.
- It marked Michigan State's first overtime victory over Michigan (1-3).

### THIRD ROUND: MSU 58, KANSAS 54

- Michigan State defeated Kansas, 58-54, in the third round of the WNIT Thursday, March 27 at the Breslin Center.
- Allyssa DeHaan led MSU with 16 points and also collected seven rebounds and four blocks. In the game, DeHaan scored her 900th career point and grabbed her 500th career rebound.
- Kalisha Keane scored in double figures for the 22nd time this season with 10 points and became the top freshman scorer in school history. Keane surpassed the previous record of 411 set by DeHaan last year.
- Brittney Thomas also scored 10 points and had seven rebounds with three assists.
- Danielle McCray led the Jayhawks (17-16) with 18 points.
- In a back-and-forth affair, the game featured nine ties and 12 lead changes, and neither team led by more than seven points. Both teams shot under 40 percent from the field, but the difference was free throws, as MSU hit 15-of-17 shots (88 percent) from the line.
- Michigan State missed its first nine 3-point attempts, but Keane drained two 3's and Mandy Piechowski hit one down the stretch to help the Spartans notch the victory. Keane's second 3-pointer put MSU up 50-45 with 4:17 remaining, and two DeHaan free throws pushed the lead to 52-45 at the 3:40 mark.
- Kansas cut the margin back down to three at 52-49, but would get no closer, as MSU hit two field goals and two free throws in the last minute to seal the win.

### SECOND ROUND: MSU 74, BOWLING GREEN 66

- Four Michigan State players scored in double-figures, including a team-high 20 points from freshman Kalisha Keane, as Michigan State defeated Bowling Green, 74-66, in the second round of the WNIT.
- In addition to Keane, Mandy Piechowski, Allyssa DeHaan and Lauren Aitch each scored 12 points. Piechowski hit the first shot of the game, a 3-pointer, and tied a career high with four 3's in the game. Michigan State shot a season-high 60 percent from 3-point range (6-for-10) and 45 percent from the field.
- Brittney Thomas had a solid game at the point, dishing out a career-high eight assists and collecting eight rebounds.
- The Spartans dominated inside, winning the battle of the boards, 47-32, and outscoring the Falcons 40-10 in the paint. MSU limited BGSU to 32 percent shooting from the field.
- Lauren Prochaska, the MAC Freshman of the Year, scored a career-high 24 points with five 3's to lead the Falcons, who finished the season with a 26-8 record.
- Bowling Green led Michigan State 24-18 at the 8:37 mark in the first half, but the Spartans went on a 17-0 run over the next six minutes to take a 35-24 advantage, a lead they would never relinquish. MSU went into halftime with a 37-31 lead.
- MSU opened up the second half on an 18-6 run in the first five minutes, prompting two timeouts from Bowling Green. Keane scored nine of her 20 points during that span, including two layups, two free throws and a 3-pointer.
- The Spartans took their largest lead of the game at 59-39 with 13:38 remaining, but Bowling Green bounced back in the latter part of the second half, cutting the margin all the way to four points at 65-61 with just 2:20 to go.

### SPARTANS RELYING ON UNDERCLASSMEN FOR SUCCESS

It's hard to quantify just how young the Spartans are this season, but a recent survey compiled by Sports Information Directors around the country has shed some light on MSU's youth. With the active 12-person roster featuring nine freshmen and sophomores, the Spartans have the most underclassmen of any team in the Big Ten. **Those nine freshmen and sophomores have played 76 percent of MSU's minutes this season, which ranks eighth in the nation.**

**YOUNG SPARTANS GETTING HELP FROM FRESHMEN CLASS**

Michigan State features the youngest team in the Big Ten, as the Spartans are the only team in the league to start three freshmen (Kalisha Keane, Brittney Thomas, Cetera Washington) in a game this season. The trio of Thomas, Keane and Washington has started 17 times for the Spartans. Overall, MSU's 12 active players consist of nine freshmen and sophomores, which is the most underclassmen of any team in the Big Ten.

The freshmen have responded in a big way, accounting for 40 percent of MSU's points. Keane is second on the team and 16th in the Big Ten in scoring with 12.1 ppg, while Thomas is third on the team with 7.4 ppg. Off the bench, Washington averages 3.0 ppg and and **Taja Wilson** is scoring 2.7 ppg.

Keane, Thomas and Washington became the first freshmen trio to start at MSU since the 2001-02 season, when Kristin Haynie, Joy Johnson and Kelli Roehrig started. The trio of Haynie, Johnson and Roehrig started the first five games of the 2001-02 season.

**KEANE OFF TO FAST START**

Freshman forward **Kalisha Keane** is the top freshman scorer in Michigan State history with 436 points, which is also the 19th-best scoring effort in Spartan single-season history. In the third-round win over Kansas, she surpassed the previous record of 411 points set by Allyssa DeHaan last season.

Keane is second on the team in scoring this season only to DeHaan and is 16th in the Big Ten. Keane has five double-doubles and has scored in double-figures 23 times.

Among Big Ten freshmen, Keane is first in free-throw percentage (85.1) and steals (1.9 avg.), and third in scoring (12.1 avg.), rebounding (5.9 avg.) and assists (1.7 avg.).

The Ajax, Ontario, native is a natural small forward but is playing primarily at the power forward position due to the injury to Aisha Jefferson.

She has the ability to post down low but also has excellent range with her jumper.

Only 18, Keane played for Team Canada at the U21 FIBA World Championships in Moscow, Russia, and led the team in scoring with 11.1 ppg, which ranked 20th overall at the tournament.

Keane scored her 100th career point in MSU's eighth game of the season at Old Dominion, becoming the fourth player in Spartan history to reach the century mark in just eight games. Kris Emerson was the fastest, scoring her 100th point in just her sixth game during the 1983-84 season.

**FRESHMAN THOMAS IS MSU'S FLOOR GENERAL**

Freshman **Brittney Thomas** is gaining valuable experience in her first season as the starting point guard. The Bolingbrook, Ill., product has started every game and leads the team in minutes, averaging 35.1 a game, including eight games in which she has played the entire game.

Thomas has shown the ability to be an excellent all-around player - she leads all Big Ten freshmen in assists (3.6 avg.) and minutes, and ranks second in steals (1.8 avg.), fourth in field-goal percentage (47.3) and fifth in scoring (7.4 ppg). She leads all guards and is fourth among conference freshmen in rebounding with 5.4 a game. In Big Ten games, she ranked third among all players in field-goal percentage (54 percent).

Before the season is done, Thomas' name will be throughout MSU's freshman record book. She ranks second in assists with 128 and 11th in scoring with 265 points.

Perhaps even more impressive is Thomas' rebounding ability as a point guard. **Thomas has the most rebounds by a freshman guard in MSU history and is eighth on the Spartan freshman rebounding list with 196.**

Thomas is gaining some comparisons to former Spartan honorable mention All-American and current WNBA player **Kristin Haynie**. Haynie was the ninth pick in the 2005 WNBA Draft after leading the Spartans to the 2005 National Championship game. Below is a comparison of their freshman seasons:

**X-FACTORS**

When point guard **Brittney Thomas** is playing well, the Spartans usually end up on top. MSU is 4-0 when she leads the team or is tied in scoring, and 8-0 when she leads the team or is tied in rebounding.

In addition, Michigan State is 9-3 in games when redshirt sophomore **Lauren Aitch** scores in double-figures. When the reserve center is limited to single-digits, MSU is 14-10. In her two-year career, MSU is 11-3 when Aitch scores in double-figures.

**NO BREAKS IN THIS SCHEDULE**

MSU played one of the toughest non-conference schedules in the Big Ten. The Spartans played the most non-league road games of any team in the Big Ten with eight, and played five non-conference teams (LSU, Kansas State, Old Dominion, Oklahoma, Hartford) ranked in the top 50 of the RPI (collegerpi.com).

**CLUTCH DOWN THE STRETCH**

In the final two minutes of games and in overtime, MSU is shooting 79 percent from the line (72-for-91). **Kalisha Keane** is a perfect 10-for-10, while **Courtney Davidson** (23-for-28) and **Brittney Thomas** (14-for-17) are both shooting 82 percent during that stretch.

**NO SURPRISE HERE**

Led by **Allyssa DeHaan's** conference-leading 145 blocks, the Spartans are first in the Big Ten and 12th in the nation in rejections with a total of 198 (5.5 pg). MSU set a Big Ten team record last season with 211 blocks, while DeHaan set the single-season mark with 145. The 198 blocks this season are second most in Big Ten history.

**CAN'T FORGET ABOUT THE BENCH**

Michigan State's bench has outscored its opponents by 224 points this season (6.2 a game), and is averaging 20.2 points a game from its non-starters. Much of that total is coming from senior guard **Courtney Davidson** (7.2 ppg) and sophomore center **Lauren Aitch** (7.3 ppg).

**A BIG WIN FOR MSU**

MSU's win over No. 17/18 Ohio State on Dec. 30 was the first win over a ranked team this year for the Spartans. Michigan State has 28 wins over nationally ranked opponents since the 2001-02 season. It also marked Coach Suzy Merchant's first-ever win over a ranked team in her coaching career.

Coach Merchant had her hair spray-painted green at center court by her players after the upset. It was part of a "Hair-Dare" promotion by the MSU Athletics Department.

**HOW ABOUT THOSE COMEBACKS?**

MSU has had a flair for the dramatic at home games this season, rallying from double-digit deficits to beat Iowa (down 16), Purdue (13), Illinois (12) and Michigan (10).

The Spartans overcame a 13-point halftime deficit to defeat Iowa, 73-65, on Jan. 10 at the Breslin Center. It marked the largest halftime comeback since Feb. 12, 2004, when the Spartans also came back from a 13-point halftime hole (33-20) to beat Michigan, 59-54.

At one point late in the first half, Iowa went up by 16 points. The 16-point comeback is one of the biggest comeback victories in school history, just shy of the 17-point rally at Purdue last season. The Spartans recorded an 18-point comeback on Jan. 29, 1999, at Iowa. Down 46-28 at the break, MSU - led by Maxann Reese's school-record 41 points - came back to win 81-69.

Against Purdue this season on Feb. 11, MSU trailed by 13 points in the first half and by nine midway through the second half before going on a late run to pull out the victory.

On Senior Day against Illinois, MSU fell behind 24-12 in the first half before storming back for the 54-46 victory.

The Spartans rallied twice to beat Michigan at home. On March 30 in the WNIT quarterfinals, MSU was down by as many as 10 and fell behind 37-28 with 6:26 to go. The Green and White closed the second half on a 9-0 run to send the game into overtime and won, 45-40. On Jan. 31, the Spartans trailed Michigan by eight points at 53-45 with 6:30 to go before rattling off a 16-5 final surge to win, 61-58.

Another comeback arrived in the Big Ten Tournament quarterfinals. Minnesota led the Spartans by six points, 47-41, with less than four minutes to go before MSU went on a 15-4 run to end the game with a 56-51 victory.

**SPARTANS ADVANCE TO PRESEASON WNIT SEMIFINALS, GO 2-1 IN TOURNAMENT**

Michigan State went 2-1 in the Preseason WNIT and advanced to the semifinals of the 16-team tournament before falling to No. 4/4 LSU on Nov. 15 in Baton Rouge, La., 64-41.

The Spartans opened the 2007-08 campaign with a dominating 65-35 victory IUPUI in the first round of the Preseason WNIT at the Breslin Center. MSU followed with a 73-53 win over Evansville in the second round.

It marked MSU's first-ever appearance in the 14-year history of the Preseason WNIT. Allyssa DeHaan led the Spartans in scoring (14.0 ppg), rebounding (9.3 rpg) and blocks (6.3 bpg) during the tournament.

LSU eventually lost to Maryland in the Preseason WNIT championship game in College Park, Md.

**JUNIOR FORWARD AISHA JEFFERSON OUT FOR THE SEASON WITH KNEE INJURY**

Junior forward **Aisha Jefferson** has a torn anterior cruciate ligament in her right knee and will miss the entire 2007-08 season. Jefferson underwent surgery on Dec. 7. She suffered the injury while driving to the basket on a fastbreak in the first half of an exhibition game against Lake Superior State.

Jefferson, who earned All-Big Ten Freshman honors in 2005-06, improved her numbers as a sophomore, ranking third on the team with 10.4 ppg and 5.6 rpg to garner honorable mention all-conference accolades. She played in 67 games her first two seasons, including 44 starts, and averaged 8.5 ppg and 5.3 rpg. She scored in double-figures 20 times last season and collected four double-doubles. A natural leader, Jefferson was one of three captains named by Merchant at the beginning of the season.

**MERCHANT NAMES CAPTAINS**

Prior to the season, Suzy Merchant named juniors **Aisha Jefferson** and **Mia Johnson** and senior **Alisa Wulff** to serve as captains for the 2007-08 season. It marks the first time the program has had all new captains since the 2002-03 season.

**FANS KEEP ON COMING**

Michigan State finished ninth in the nation in attendance in 2006-07, averaging 6,737 fans per game. It marked the second straight season MSU has finished in the top 10 nationally in attendance. The program has been ranked in the top 20 nationally in attendance the past five seasons.

**The Spartans wrapped up the 2007-08 regular season averaging 6,937 fans a game, good for second in the Big Ten and 10th in the nation. It marks the highest season average in school history, eclipsing the 2005-06 season, when the Spartans averaged 6,787 fans. MSU has now averaged more than 6,000 fans a game for four straight seasons.**

The season-high crowd of 11,245 on Jan. 5 against Penn State was the sixth largest in program history, and the crowd of 10,024 vs. Indiana on Jan. 20 was the seventh largest. The crowd of 4,765 for Suzy Merchant's first game as a head coach was the largest season-opening crowd in program history. MSU also set attendance records in its two exhibition games, averaging 4,885 fans for the two games, including a record 5,018 vs. Lake Superior State on Nov. 4.

For the first time in school history, Michigan State hosted the NCAA Tournament First and Second Rounds at the Breslin Center in 2007. Thanks to the nation's second-largest crowd during the NCAA Women's Basketball Tournament's Second Round, East Lansing led all eight First- and Second-Round sites with a total 21,340 fans passing through the turnstiles during the three sessions of the four-day event. The Breslin Center crowd of 8,056 on March 20 was the second largest in the country.

**MICHIGAN STATE TO HOST FIRST AND SECOND ROUNDS OF 2009 NCAA CHAMPIONSHIP**

Michigan State University and the Breslin Center have been selected as one of eight additional first- and second-round sites for the 2009 NCAA Women's Basketball Championship, the NCAA Division I Women's Basketball Committee announced Feb. 12. The sites were added after the NCAA Division I Women's Basketball Committee announced in the summer of 2007 that the championship would be expanding to 16 pre-determined first- and second-round sites, beginning in 2009.

Four teams will play first-round games at the Breslin Center either Saturday, March 21 or Sunday, March 22, 2009. The second-round game will be on Monday, March 23 or Tuesday, March 24. In all, the Breslin Center will host three games.

Last year, Michigan State hosted the first and second rounds of the NCAA Women's Championship for the first time in school history at the Breslin Center. East Lansing led all eight first- and second-round sites with a total 21,340 fans passing through the turnstiles during the three sessions. The 2007 event featured eight teams, including host Michigan State and NCAA finalist Rutgers.

# Head Coach Suzy Merchant



A long and steady journey through the coaching ranks has led veteran head coach Suzy Merchant to her dream job in East Lansing. Merchant, who spent the past nine years as the head coach at Eastern Michigan and was the winningest coach in school history, was named the

head coach of the Spartan women's basketball program at Michigan State on April 30, 2007.

"Growing up in Michigan and having family that attended Michigan State, I can tell you that this is where I want to be," said Merchant. "Women's basketball has gone to the next level at Michigan State. A solid foundation has been laid, not only in terms of winning but also in terms of a tremendous fan base. The game-day environment in the Breslin Center is truly special and people around the state and around the country have taken notice.

"It's exciting to be part of a program where the campus and the people in the community have embraced these young women to create an electric atmosphere. I know that expectations will be high, and I welcome the challenge of continuing the program's excellence."

Merchant, 38, has been a part of winning programs every step of her career. In her 13 years as a head coach, she has won more than 60 percent of her games, collecting a 224-133 (.627) career record as a head coach at Saginaw Valley State, Eastern Michigan and MSU.

In her first season at Michigan State, Merchant has taken the youngest team in the Big Ten to its seventh straight trip to the postseason. She is just the second coach in MSU basketball history - men's side included - to win 20 games in her first season in East Lansing. The Spartans collected their fifth straight 20-win season against one of the toughest schedules in the Big Ten, and won 10 conference games for the sixth consecutive season. MSU also advanced to the semifinals of the Big Ten Tournament for the fifth straight year after beating Minnesota in the quarterfinals.

Upon her hiring at MSU, Merchant instantly immersed herself in the Greater Lansing community - she has helped at events for Ele's Place, the Special Olympics, Women Working Wonders for the Sparrow Foundation, the Mid-Michigan Children's Initiative, the Boys and Girls Clubs of Lansing and the Haven House.

During her tenure with the Eagles, Merchant guided Eastern Michigan to a record of 147-91 (.618), including three 20-win seasons, three

postseason appearances and two Mid-American Conference West Division titles.

Merchant's 2003-04 Eastern Michigan team claimed the MAC West Division and MAC Tournament championships for the first time in school history, earning the program's first-ever bid to the NCAA Tournament en route to a 22-8 record. She followed that impressive season by winning 23 games in 2004-05, the most in school history, and sent EMU to the postseason for the second straight year with a WNIT appearance.

In 2005-06, the Eagles reached the 20-win plateau for the third consecutive season and won their second MAC West title with a 15-1 conference record, notching the most league wins in school history. Their 22-8 overall record put them into the postseason for the third straight year as the Eagles earned a bid to the WNIT. While on maternity leave for most of last season, Merchant's Eagles finished second in the MAC West Division

with a 10-6 league record and finished 16-13 overall.

Before coaching at Eastern Michigan, Merchant spent three seasons at Saginaw Valley State, posting a 54-29 (.651) record. After inheriting a team with a losing record, Merchant quickly built the SVSU program into a winner, going 15-11 in her first season before going 19-11 in year two while earning a berth in the NCAA Division II Tournament for just the second time in school history. In her final season, Saginaw Valley State collected a 20-7 record and was ranked as high as 15th in the nation.

The Traverse City, Mich., native has 15 years of collegiate coaching experience, all in the state of Michigan. A four-year starter and three-year captain at Central Michigan, Merchant began her coaching career at Oakland University, serving as the top assistant coach for three seasons.

EAST LANSING, Mich. (AP) - Allyssa DeHaan scored 18 points and had seven blocked shots to help No. 17 Michigan State beat IUPUI 65-35 in Suzy Merchant's Spartan coaching debut.

Canadian freshman Kalisha Keane added 12 points in her first college game, a first-round matchup in the Preseason WNIT.

Merchant's first win in her dream job was never in question. Michigan State roared to a 12-0 lead and forced eight turnovers before allowing a point.

DeHaan, a 6-foot-9 sophomore, had five of the first seven points and was too much for the Jaguars to handle at both ends of the court.

The Spartans led 37-22 at halftime, then pulled away in the last 20 minutes, when IUPUI hit just 13.8 percent of its shots from the field.

### Notes:

- In the first Preseason WNIT game in school history, MSU defeated IUPUI, 65-35, before a crowd of 4,765...it marked the largest season-opening attendance in program history (previous: 3,960 vs. UC Santa Barbara in 2005)...it marked the first-ever meeting between the two schools.
- Michigan State has won nine straight season openers...in its 36th year, the program is now 24-12 in season openers.
- In her MSU debut, head coach Suzy Merchant won by 30 points, the biggest margin of victory for a Spartan coach in her first game...the fifth coach in program history, Merchant became the third Spartan coach to win in her debut.
- Dating back to 2001-02 at Eastern Michigan, Suzy Merchant has won seven straight season openers.

NORFOLK, Va. - No. 20 Michigan State lost at Old Dominion in the first-ever meeting between the two schools, 79-73, before a crowd of 3,420 at the Ted Constant Convocation Center. Courtney Davidson led the Spartans with a career-high 17 points and five 3-pointers, while Kalisha Keane scored 15 points and Allyssa DeHaan added 13.

Old Dominion forced 22 Spartan turnovers, and scored 27 points off those turnovers. The Monarchs also held a 6-0 advantage in fast-break points.

Foul trouble limited DeHaan to a season-low 23 minutes, including just eight in the first half. The sophomore center finished 5-of-6 from the field with eight rebounds and four blocks. Keane sat the final 7:39 of the first half with two fouls.

MSU started strong, jumping out to an early 11-point lead with a 17-6 advantage as Keane hit a jumper at the 12:49 mark. The Spartans led most of the first half until ODU senior guard T.J. Jordan nailed a 3-pointer with 1:51 left in the half, giving the Lady Monarchs a 30-29 lead. Jordan hit another 3 with two seconds remaining as ODU took a 35-31 lead into halftime. With DeHaan and Keane on the bench, ODU rattled off a 23-10 run to end the half.

Old Dominion started the second half on an 8-2 run to stretch its lead to 10 points at 43-33 at the 17:49 mark. The Monarchs led by double digits for the next six minutes and took a 58-46 lead on a Megan Pym jumper with 12 minutes remaining.

The Spartans battled back, however, and went on a 10-0 run over the next three minutes. Keane's layup at the 8:41 mark cut the Monarch lead to 58-56. But it's as close as the Spartans would get.

Davidson almost single-handedly kept the Spartans in the game, scoring MSU's final 14 points, including four 3-pointers.

TERRE HAUTE, Ind. - Led by Allyssa DeHaan's near triple-double with 24 points, 10 rebounds and nine blocks, No. 23 Michigan State handed Indiana State its worst home loss in five years with a dominating 83-58 win before a crowd of 4,492 at the Hulman Center. The Spartans had five players score in double-figures, including Kalisha Keane's 20 points and 11 rebounds, marking her first career double-double. The Sycamores (5-3), who defeated No. 20 Vanderbilt at home earlier this season, entered the game winning 35 of their last 40 games at home.

The Spartans played one of their most efficient games of the season, outscoring the Sycamores 40-12 in the paint and dishing out 25 assists against a season-low seven turnovers. Courtney Davidson collected a career-high seven assists, while Keane had five.

DeHaan, the nation's leading shot blocker, swatted nine shots against ISU, tying her own mark for the most blocks in a game in MSU history. Not only was DeHaan 9-of-17 from the field and 6-for-6 at the line, she also tied her career high with five assists.

As if the offensive effort wasn't enough, DeHaan limited Sycamore forward Laura Rudolphi, the team's second-leading scorer with nearly 15 points a game, to one point on 0-for-12 shooting. MSU's defense held Indiana State to 28 percent shooting and halted the Sycamores' potent fast-break attack to just four points.

Michigan State hit eight of its season-high nine 3-pointers in the second half.

Keane took over in stretches of the second half, scoring 12 of her 20 points and going 5-for-6 from the field and 2-for-2 from 3-point range after the break.

Davidson added 11 points for MSU, while Alisa Wulf and Lauren Aitch each scored 10. It marked the first time MSU has had five players score in double-figures this season.

Teammate Courtney Paris had 13 points and 14 rebounds to stretch her NCAA-record streak of double-double performances to 68. The Sooners (7-2) broke a 53-53 tie with a 13-2 closing run and had a 47-31 rebounding advantage.

Trailing 28-17 at the break, Oklahoma answered by extending its defense and taking full advantage of Michigan State's turnovers. The Sooners finally drew even at 40, then fell behind again at 52-44. But the Spartans managed just three points in the final 6:42 while six Oklahoma players scored.

The Sooners shot 64.5 percent from the field in the second half after hitting just 23.5 percent in the first. Many of those baskets came on second and third chances as Thompson had seven of her team's 21 offensive rebounds.

Keane hit a jumper to retake the lead for Michigan State (8-4) at 44-42, but Hartford's Jaime McCabe responded with a three-point basket to give the Hawks the game's final lead. Hood scored a lay-up to put Hartford up 47-44 and the two teams traded baskets down the stretch.

A three-point basket by Alissa Wulff with 48 seconds remaining pulled the Spartans within one at 52-51, but Erica Beverly made two free throws for Hartford and the Hawks' defense held on for the win.

Michigan State's DeHaan opened up the games scoring, but Hartford responded with an 8-0 run to take an early lead. The Spartans battled back to tie it at 8 with just over 15 minutes remaining in the first half, but the Hawks pulled away again to lead 15-8.

Keane hit a jumper with 8:25 to go into the opening half. A three-point basket by Wulff and a pair of baskets by Keane, including a three-point basket, gave Michigan State a 18-15 lead and put the team up for the first time since its opening possession.

**EAST LANSING, Mich.** - In its 2007-08 Big Ten Conference opener, the Michigan State University women's basketball team dropped a 74-63 decision to Minnesota this afternoon in front of 6,818 fans at the Breslin Center. Freshman Kalisha Keane (Ajax, Ontario/Westdale) led the way for the Spartans, who fall to 8-5 on the season overall, with 18 points and seven rebounds and three steals. Classmate Brittney Thomas (Boilingbrook, Ill./Boilingbrook) chipped in 14 points and tied a career-high with five steals.

The Golden Gophers had four players in double-figures, paced by 19 points from Emily Fox and a 16 points, 11 rebound effort from Leslie Knight. Brittney McCoy added 14 and Ashley Ellis-Milan rounded out the four visitors in double-figures with 10 points.

After an Alyssa DeHaan (Grandville, Mich./Grandville) layup to begin the game, Minnesota went on a 10-2 run, behind six points from Emily Fox, to open up an early 10-4 lead. The Golden Gophers lead would grow to as much as eight (16-8), but a 12-2 Spartan spurt, capped by an Alisa Wulff (Pickering, Ontario/Virginia) three-pointer, would tie the game at 18 with 11:27 to go in the first half. Minnesota would regain the lead, but the Spartans followed with seven-unanswered points over a 1:40 stretch to opened their biggest lead of the game at 29-24 with just over eight minutes left in the half. MSU controlled the scoreboard until the late in the first stanza, when the Gophers closed the final 3:17 on a 7-2 run for a 39-35 halftime advantage. The Spartans forced 15 first half Minnesota turnovers, but the Gophers shot 53.1% (17-32) from the field and out-rebounded MSU 20-12, leading to the first half lead.

Thomas knocked down a jumper at 18:31 for the first points of the second half, but Minnesota would go on a 14-4 string over the next seven minutes, holding the Spartans to 1-for-5 shooting from the field and forcing five turnovers in the stretch, to take a 53-41 leads they would not relinquish. Michigan State would get within four on three occasions, as late as 4:08 in regulation, but could not get any closer. Despite only hitting six of their first 15 foul shots, Minnesota would hit 9-of-14 from the line in the final four minutes to seal the win.

Keane was 7-for-21 from the field and had a strong drive to the basket and two free throws to keep the Buckeyes (9-3, 0-1) at bay.

Michigan State coach Suzy Merchant had her blonde hair spray-painted green at center court by her players after the upset. Her team bounced back from its recent anemic rebounding to rule the boards 44-35.

Star Allen had 12 points, Marcella Packer and Jantel Lavender 11 each, and Ashlee Trebilcock 10 for Ohio State, the preseason conference favorite. Allen added nine rebounds and five assists.

The Spartans led 34-29 at the half and built their lead to 13 points several times in the second half.

It was the first win over a ranked team in three tries for Merchant as the Spartans' first-year leader.

Michigan State grabbed 22 offensive rebounds, 15 more than they managed against Minnesota, and had 12 steals. Freshman point guard Brittney Thomas had five offensive boards and five steals. She also committed 11 turnovers.

The Spartans had chances to blow the game open but were 2-for-15 from 3-point range. They won in a way that few expected, with a 15-4 edge in second-chance points.

The Buckeyes outshot Michigan State from the field 39.3 percent to 35.8 percent, but had just 11 assists to go with 20 turnovers. Those mistakes kept Ohio State from getting closer than five in the late stages.

Packer had six turnovers and only one assist for the Buckeyes, who lost for just the third time in their last 35 league games.

**EAST LANSING, Mich.** - A pair of extended second half runs propelled Penn State to a 69-57 victory over Michigan State. The Spartans, who fall to 9-7 overall and 1-3 in the Big Ten, were led by sophomore Allyssa DeHaan's fourth double-double of the season and 11th of her career. DeHaan totaled 14 points, 10 rebounds and six blocks. PSU improves to 11-4 overall and 2-1 in conference play.

The crowd of 11,245, the sixth largest total in MSU women's basketball history, saw an evenly played first half, as the Nittany Lions held a 37-36 advantage, but the visitors came out of the locker room strong to take control of the game. After a DeHaan jumper gave the Spartans back the lead at 38-37 in the second half's first minute, PSU ran off eight unanswered points over the next 3:58 to open up a 45-40 lead it would not relinquish.

Michigan State would get within two on a pair of occasions, the last coming after a Lauren Aitch layup with 11:41 remaining in regulation moved the score to 49-47. However, the Spartans would make only one field goal over the next 7:22, allowing the Nittany Lions to go on another prolonged run, this time 14-4, to put the game out of reach at 63-51 with five and a half minutes remaining. Penn State hit six of its final seven free throws in the game's last three minutes to seal the win.

Despite shooting 58 percent (15-for-26) from the field in the first 20 minutes, the Spartans went to the break down a point. Penn State held the lead until a 3-pointer by freshman Cetera Washington with 7:31 left put MSU ahead 27-26, its first lead since 2-0. After a fall-away jumper by Tyra Grant on the next possession regained the lead for the Nittany Lions, DeHaan's put back at 6:44 made the PSU lead short-lived. The Spartan lead would grow to three (31-28) with just under five minutes remaining, however, sloppy play to end the half - eight turnovers in the final six minutes - cost the Spartans a chance to take the lead into the intermission. PSU hit four of its final six shots from the field in the final 3:38 to close out the first half with the edge.

**EAST LANSING, Mich.** - The Michigan State women's basketball team overcame a 13-point halftime deficit to defeat Iowa, 73-65. Michigan State, which was down 35-22 at the break, outscored Iowa 51-30 in the second half. Brittney Thomas scored a career-high 18 points and had six steals for the Spartans.

Down 52-39 with 12:00 remaining, MSU went on a 20-4 run over the next seven minutes to take a 59-56 lead. Thomas' fast-break layup at the 5:53 mark gave MSU its first lead, 57-56, since the first half. MSU outscored Iowa 31-13 in the last 12 minutes of the game.

Senior guard Courtney Davidson tied a career high with 18 points and hit three 3-pointers, while reserve guard Takeya Fortner played a career-high 16 minutes and scored a career-high five points. Kalisha Keane and Lauren Aitch also scored in double figures for MSU with 12 and 10 points, respectively.

Michigan State turned up the pressure in the second half, causing 17 Hawkeye turnovers and nine steals. For the game, MSU forced 25 turnovers, a season high for a Spartan opponent, and tied a season high with 12 steals. Thomas scored 16 of her 18 points in the final 20 minutes and Davidson scored 13 of her 18 in the second half.

For the first 10 minutes, the two teams traded leads, but Iowa went on an 11-0 run to take a 24-13 lead with 6:12 remaining. With the game tied at 54 with less than 30 seconds remaining, Purdue's Fahkara Malone drove against two Spartan defenders and had her lay-up blocked by MSU's Brittney Thomas and rebounded by Cetera Washington. After an MSU timeout, Malone then fouled Davidson before Michigan State could in-bound the ball, putting Davidson on the line for the game-clinching free throws.

Purdue's Kalika France missed a 17-footer with 6 seconds remaining, and Michigan State dribbled out the clock.

DeHaan became the first player in Big Ten history to record consecutive 100-block seasons. She set a Big Ten single-season record with 145 rejections last season.

Purdue raced out to a 19-6 lead in the first nine minutes of the game, but the Spartans clamped down on defense for the remainder of the half. MSU went on an 18-2 run from the 11:26 mark to the 2:31 mark, including one stretch it held Purdue scoreless for more than five minutes, to close the gap to a one-point deficit at 28-27 going into the break. DeHaan had 12 points in the first half on 5-of-7 shooting.

A 3-pointer by Natasha Bogdanova with 10:16 remaining in the game gave Purdue its largest lead of the second half, 47-38. A lay-up by DeHaan and a pair of jumpers by Washington pulled MSU within 49-45 with 7:22 left in the game. After a pair of free throws by Freeman, Lauren Aitch scored on consecutive possessions to cut Purdue's lead to 51-49 with 4:58 remaining.

The Boilermakers took a 53-49 lead 15 seconds later on a pair of free throws by Bogdanova, but Davidson hit a clutch three with 1:26 left to make it 53-52. Malone then split a pair of free throws to give Purdue a 54-52 advantage. Aitch answered with a lay-up to tie the game at 54.

WEST LAFAYETTE, Ind. - The Michigan State women's basketball team had its four-game winning streak snapped as it fell to Purdue, 69-59, at Mackey Arena. Four Boilermakers scored in double figures as they held the Spartans to 35 percent shooting from the field.

Poor shooting starts in each half were the keys to Michigan State's offensive woes. The Spartans went 3-of-17 from the floor in the first 13 minutes of the first half, and converted only one field goal in the first 10 minutes of the second half.

MSU's Kalisha Keane scored a game-high 18 points and hit a season-best three 3-pointers. Allyssa DeHaan chipped in 15 points, marking the 23rd time this season she has scored in double figures.

Mia Johnson scored 14 points, her second-highest total of the season, on 4-of-5 shooting from the field and 5-of-6 shooting from the free-throw line.

The Boilermakers were led by FahKara Malone and Lakisha Freeman, who each scored 16 points.

Purdue dominated the boards, outrebounding the Spartans, 42-24. The 24 rebounds were a season low for MSU. Michigan State also dished out a season-low seven assists.

Purdue never trailed in the game and took a 33-25 lead into halftime. MSU had the lead cut to five points on two different occasions in the second half, but could not get any closer. After two Courtney Davidson free throws made it 36-31 at the 16:02 mark, Purdue put the game out of reach with a 14-1 run over the next four minutes to go up, 50-32. The Boilermakers led by double-digits the remainder of the game.

MSU closed the game on a 12-3 run to make the final 69-59 in favor of Purdue.

EAST LANSING, Mich. - Courtney Davidson, one of two Michigan State graduating seniors along with Alisa Wulff, led the Michigan State women's basketball team to a 54-46 come-from-behind win over Illinois on Senior Night Thursday at the Breslin Center. Davidson scored a career-high 20 points as MSU rallied from a 12-point first-half deficit. The Spartans, who have won five of their last six games, close the regular season with an 18-12 overall record and a 10-8 mark in the Big Ten.

Trailing 24-12 with 8:41 remaining in the first half, Michigan State would go on an extended 32-8 run over the next 23:23 to open up its largest lead of the night at 44-32. During the span, the Spartans held the Illini to 3-for-25 shooting from the field and forced nine turnovers.

Illinois opened its initial lead by scoring the game's first 11 points and jumped out to a 13-2 lead in the first five minutes. The Fighting Illini kept a hold of the advantage until the Spartans' drawn out run began with nine unanswered points from 8:41 to the 2:20 mark in the first stanza to shorten the deficit and help bring the halftime score to 26-21.

The second half began with a 5-0 run by MSU to tie the game with 16:46 remaining for the first time since the opening tip. After an Illini basket, the Spartans scored the next four points to take their first lead of the game (13:10) and never trailed again.

Aside from Davidson's 20 points, freshman Brittney Thomas was only other Spartan in double-figures with 10 points, also adding seven rebounds and three assists. Fellow freshman Cetera Washington grabbed a career-high nine rebounds, and sophomore Allyssa DeHaan added seven points and five blocks.

Defense was the story of the game, as MSU held Illinois to 31.3 percent (15-for-48) shooting from the field, while the Spartans only managed a 32.7 percent (18-for-55) shooting night of their own. Michigan State also held a decisive 46-28 edge on the boards, including a 20-7 margin on the offensive end.

Danielle McCray led the Jayhawks (17-16) with 18 points. In a back-and-forth affair, the game featured nine ties and 12 lead changes, and neither team led by more than seven points. Both teams shot under 40 percent from the field, but the difference was free throws, as MSU hit 15-of-17 shots (88 percent) from the line.

Michigan State missed its first nine 3-point attempts, but Keane drained two 3's and Mandy Piechowski hit one down the stretch to help the Spartans notch the victory. Keane's second 3-pointer put MSU up 50-45 with 4:17 remaining, and two DeHaan free throws pushed the lead to 52-45 at the 3:40 mark.

Kansas cut the margin back down to three at 52-49, but would get no closer, as MSU hit two field goals and two free throws in the last minute to seal the win.
