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## NEW MEXICO TO BATTLE OLD RIVALS BYU AND UTEP IN EL PASO, TEXAS Lobos Looking to Upset Powerful Cougars & Miners in Triangular Meet

### UPCOMING:

The University of New Mexico track and field team will compete in its first scoring meet of the outdoor season this Saturday, March 31 when it takes on Brigham Young and Texas-El Paso at the UTEP Springtime Invitational in El Paso, Texas. Saturday's triangular meet will be a reunion of sorts for the three schools that dominated track and field in the old Western Athletic Conference throughout much of the 1960's, 70's and 80's. BYU and New Mexico joined the Mountain West Conference in 1999, while UTEP remained in the WAC.

The Lobos will face one of their toughest challenges of the year when they take on the national powerhouse Cougars and Miners. The BYU men and women both captured 2001 Mountain West Conference indoor titles as well as 2000 MWC outdoor championships. BYU's women's team was also ranked 6th in the Trackwire Online (www.trackwire.com) 2001 preseason outdoor rankings. Meanwhile, the UTEP men's and women's squads are both in the top 20 of Trackwire's preseason outdoor rankings. The Miner women's team finished seventh at the 2001 NCAA Indoor Championships and were ranked 17th in the preseason top 25, while the men finished tied for 44th at the indoor championships and were 11th in the preseason outdoor rankings. New Mexico and Brigham Young will each be competing in their third outdoor meet of 2001, while UTEP opens its outdoor season on Saturday.

Field events begin with the hammer throw at 9:45 a.m., while running events start at 12:30 p.m. with the 4x100-meter relay. All events will take place at the historical Kidd Field on the UTEP campus.

### LAST TIME:

The University of New Mexico men's and women's track and field teams made their only home meet of 2001 a memorable one. The men captured five events, while the women won four at the Don Kirby Memorial Invitational on Saturday, March 24 at the Great Friends of UNM Track Stadium. Twelve collegiate teams, five club teams and over 350 athletes competed at the non-scoring outdoor meet.

Junior Keren Sari got the Lobos off to a good start in the morning, winning the long jump with a leap of 19-02.00. Fellow junior Monique Harris finished close behind in third with a mark of 18-05.00. New Mexico's veterans continued to shine, as junior Carolina Geissler cleared 10-08.00 to finish third in the pole vault.

In the 4x100 relay, the UNM women's team was edged by New Mexico State and placed second with a time of 47.70. However, in the men's 4x100 relay, Oral Roberts and New Mexico both dropped their batons on the final exchange while battling each other for the lead and were disqualified. After the disqualifications, Colorado State jumped from third to first with a winning time of 40.92. Freshmen John David Nance and Mark Johnson got the Lobos back on track in the long jump, taking third and fourth, respectively.

Senior Lisa Coleman notched New Mexico's second victory of the day in the 100-meter hurdles with a time of 14.80. Sari was just behind her in second, with a time of 14.90. Later, the UNM men's team captured its first event of the day as sophomore Nick Lott led the Lobos' domination of the 400-meter dash, running a UNM outdoor season-best time of 48.69. Juniors Mike Peregrino and Dan Taradash and senior Voight Thornton finished third, fourth and fifth, respectively, in the event.

As the meet moved into the afternoon, the Lobos continued to excel. Senior Larry Davis finished tied for second (10.86) in the 100 meters with CSU's John Woods, before finishing second in the 200 in an outdoor season-best time of 21.27. Meanwhile, sophomores Arline Smith and Dayna McMillen led the UNM women's team with outdoor season-best times in the short sprints. Smith edged New Mexico State's LaToya Johnson by .01 with a winning time of 24.26 in the 200 meters and McMillen placed third in the 100 with time of 12.27. In

the triple jump, Mark Johnson won for the first time in his Lobo career, while Monique Harris fell short in her interstate battle with NMSU's Sherley Anku. Harris finished second behind Anku with a leap of 38-10.25.

The New Mexico men and women had some of their finest performances in the 400-meter hurdles. Junior Justin Massey won his first race of 2001 with a time of 53.03, followed by sophomore Matt Bishop, who took third (54.14). On the women's side, Lisa Coleman led the Lobos' charge, placing second in an outdoor season-best time of 60.71. Senior Felicia DeVargas (61.65) and juniors Monica Christofferson (61.74) and Kisha Smith (62.77) were close behind in third, fourth and fifth place, respectively.

Freshman Ben Ortega continued his stellar freshman debut, surging down the backstretch of the 5,000 meters to finish second (15:13.94) behind unattached runner Crisiof Baldyga. Sophomore Craig Keish notched his first win for the Lobos, winning the javelin with a throw of 186-00.00. UNM capped the meet on a high note by sweeping the men's and women's 4x400-meter relays. Neither team was challenged as the women won with a time of 3:53.85 and the men breezed to time of 3:15.03.

## FROM HEAD COACH MATT HENRY:

(on facing BYU and UTEP this Saturday): "Without a doubt, this is going to be a huge challenge for us. We're going to face some very, very intense competition. When I was in school (at UNM), BYU and UTEP were always among the strongest teams in the conference (Western Athletic). UTEP was national champions and it was hard to win against them. We're glad to be invited to this meet, but we can't be afraid. We have to get in there and get after them."

(on New Mexico's overall performance at the Don Kirby Memorial Invitational): "Overall as a team, we probably had one of our best meets of the year. We still have a long way to go, but we're working at it and hopefully we can come together like we did indoors and do some nice things at the conference meet."

(on next year's potential home schedule): "I know Florida State wants to come here next year and maybe we can bring in another strong team like a Florida State. There's all kinds of teams that want to come to Albuquerque because of the good weather we have."

## INDOOR SEASON HIGHLIGHTS:

- New Mexico competed in five indoor meets in 2001 after participating in just two indoor meets last year.
- The UNM women's team had its best performance at a conference meet in 10 years, finishing fourth at the 2001 Mountain West Indoor Championships.
- The men's team had its best showing of the indoor season on Feb. 10 at the Flagstaff Invitational, where it won five events on the track at the non-scoring meet.
- Lobo athletes broke six indoor school records. Ian Stewart and Keren Sari set school records in the 200 meters and pentathlon, respectively, on Jan. 26 at the Air Force Invitational. Sari set another school record in the long jump at the Flagstaff Invitational on Feb. 10 before breaking her own record in the pentathlon on March Feb. 22 at the MWC Championships. Meanwhile Larry Davis broke Stewart's 200-meter record in the prelims of the MWC meet on Feb. 23 before breaking his own mark the next day in the event

finals.

- Monique Harris and Keren Sari were named back-to-back Mountain West Conference Women's Track and Field Athletes of the Week on Feb. 8 and Feb. 14.
- The women's team recorded season-best performances in five events at the Mountain West Indoor Championships. The Lobo men also had season-best performances in five events at the MWC Championships.
- The Lobo women notched 27 top five finishes during the indoor season. Sari recorded seven and Harris had six for the Lobos. The men recorded 21 top five finishes, including three apiece by Larry Davis and Ben Ortega.

## UNM TRACK & FIELD PROGRAM OUTLOOK:

Throughout most of the 20th century, the University of New Mexico track and field program was known as a national power. From 1930 to 1991, UNM boasted 85 All-Americans, 15 NCAA champions, and five Olympians. In 1963, the same year UNM hosted the NCAA Track and Field Championships, New Mexico's Adolph Plummer shattered the existing world record in the 440-yard dash at the Western Athletic Conference Championships. Now in the year 2001, with a century of excellence behind it, the University of New Mexico is ready to bring championship caliber track and field back to the future in the 21st century.

First year head coach Matt Henry, a former All-American middle distance runner for the Lobos, is a product of UNM's proud track and field tradition and says it's time to return the program to its former glory. A realist, Henry warns that the transition will not happen overnight, but with their team-oriented philosophy, contagious work ethic, winning attitude, and a core of New Mexico athletes, he and his coaching staff are committed to returning University of New Mexico track and field to the national stage.

"Eventually I want people to say, 'you know what, New Mexico is a great place to come and run track and field.' I don't want people to look at you twice when you say the University of New Mexico," said Henry. "I would love to fill up the stands with a great track meet here in Albuquerque and have our community being knowledgeable the way it was 30 years ago. I want to eventually bring some great teams in, fill those stands up, and have a lot of New Mexico kids competing here."

With 60 New Mexicans on the roster, Henry is well on his way to his goal of recruiting the finest track and field athletes in the state of New Mexico. After 15 years as head track and cross country coach at state power La Cueva High School in Albuquerque, Henry said he saw too many of New Mexico's most talented athletes leave to compete for out-of-state programs. Henry says it's time to bring New Mexico's best back to UNM.

"We're really trying to make a huge effort to get our New Mexico kids to come back to New Mexico because we think it's the best place to be," Henry said. "We have traveled throughout the state meeting with high school coaches because we want people to know that our goal is to get their athletes to come to school here."

At UNM, Henry and his knowledgeable staff have committed themselves to providing their track and field athletes with the finest coaching and training in the nation.

"We're really on the right track," said Henry. "We have specialists in the jumps, throws, sprints, distance events, and I do believe we have some very good coaches here that really know track and field. Our athletes are going to get coached. We're not just going to recruit athletes and let them do it on their own, we're going to coach them."

According to Henry, the secret to the Lobos' eventual success on the track is simply the fact that they will outwork their competition.

"Our people have to understand that we have to train as much or more than our competitors," he said. "We can't let somebody out-train us. One of our philosophies is that if we train better in every way, then we're going to have an advantage."

## ROSTER:

If the size of the men's and women's rosters are any key, hard work has not intimidated any athletes on the 2001 UNM track and field team. After fielding a team with just 53 athletes last year, New Mexico has 45 athletes on the men's roster this season along with 30 on the women's roster for a total of 75. Henry says the more his team grows, the more competitive and more successful it will eventually become.

"To me it's pretty simple, the more people you have, the bigger selection you have," said Henry. "If it was up to me, we'd have 100 men and 100 women on this team. I'd love to have a huge team and I hope that as time goes on, people realize that it might be a process to make the squad. When there's competition just to make the team, without a doubt, that's going to help the whole process of eventually winning track meets."

The growth of the team will primarily help UNM end the depth problems that have plagued the squad in recent years. With more talented athletes in each event, an individual will be allowed to specialize and excel in one or two events.

"If we have enough people and we can spread them out, then we won't have to put a person in six events during the track meet,"

### HEAD COACH

## MATT HENRY

Matt Henry was named head coach for UNM's men's and women's track & field and cross country teams on June 17, 2000. Henry led the Lobo cross country teams to one of their best seasons in recent years, highlighted by the men's teams stunning upset of No. 12 Arizona State at the Arizona State Invitational. Prior to coming taking over at New Mexico, Henry had been the coach of the boy's and girl's track and cross country teams at La Cueva High School in Albuquerque. While at La Cueva, Henry led the Bears to four straight boys' state track titles (1997-2000), three boys' state cross country championships and a pair of girls' state cross country titles. Henry was named the National High School Track Coach of the Year in 1999.

Henry was a four-year letterman for the UNM track team from 1971-74. Competing in the 440-yard dash and 880-yard run, Henry was a part of the Lobos' conference champion two-mile relay team that earned all-America honors at the 1972 NCAA Indoor Championships.

said Henry. "Maybe they can just do a couple, and of course when you do that we know performances are going to improve. It's important to have a big team and that's one of my goals for this program."

While individual performances are ultimately the key to a program's success in track and field, Henry says the team must be the focal point. Though track and field athletes may not be directly affected by their teammates' performances the way football, basketball or soccer players are, Henry believes his athletes must have a strong team identity to be successful.

"I don't think we're going to get recognized as having one great individual here," said Henry. "Our emphasis has to be team; we talk about team all the time, I enjoy the team aspects, and that's how we're going to approach it."

As the program grows, the camaraderie, motivation and support associated with Henry's team first philosophy will provide the building blocks for future success.

## **2001 SCHEDULE:**

Though the Henry era of UNM track and field is just beginning, there is a high level of excitement and energy in Albuquerque. Henry himself is particularly excited about the quality of competition his team will face in 2001. Both the indoor and outdoor schedule feature outstanding competition at some of the nation's premier track meets. The indoor season is highlighted by meets at Oklahoma and Texas Tech, where the Lobos will face some of the best teams in the powerful Big XII conference, and is capped by the fierce competition at the Mountain West Conference Indoor Championships in Colorado Springs, Colo. The outdoor schedule will take the Lobos coast to coast, with meets at Arizona, UTEP, New Mexico State, UT-Arlington, the Texas Relays in Austin, Texas, the Michael Johnson Invitational in Waco, Texas, and the 107th running of the Penn Relays in Philadelphia, Pa. New Mexico will also host its own meet, the Don Kirby Memorial Invitational, and will finish in San Diego, Calif., at the Mountain West Conference Outdoor Championships.

"I'm really excited about our schedule this year and the opportunities we're going to have," said Henry. "This is the best thing for us in this first year, trying to expose ourselves to this kind of competition. We are going to the Penn Relays, which is probably the most prestigious track and field event in America, and I want people to know that we are going to compete at some of the best meets in America. We are going to go the Penn Relays, we are going to go to the Texas Relays, as well as having a very good indoor schedule as well."

## **GREAT FRIENDS OF UNM TRACK STADIUM • THE HOME OF LOBO TRACK & FIELD:**

The Great Friends of University of New Mexico Track Stadium is a multifunction, 6,000-seat facility that was completed for use in 1985. The complex was renovated in the summer of 1996 to include a soccer field. The track is constructed of an all-weather, encapsulated surface called Versaturf, which is the same surface used for the 1992 Olympic Trials in New Orleans, Louisiana.

The 400-meter track is composed of eight racing lanes and includes a steeplechase water-jump. To bolster performances, sprints can be run in either direction to negate the effects of unfavorable weather. The two long jump/triple jump runways, two pole vault runways and a high jump apron are also of Versaturf construction. They are located behind the goals of the soccer field, allowing competitors to compete in an east or west direction. The improvements to the facility also include the installation of lights, giving UNM the opportunity to host night meets.

With more than 300 days of sunshine a year and an elevation of 5,200 feet above sea-level, Albuquerque is a favorite training location for some of the world's best track and field athletes. The world class training environment and facilities at UNM provide an opportunity for exceptional running and field event performances.
