THIS WEEK

San Diego State has a slight edge in the league standings at 8-2 (based on winning percentage) after a victory at Air Force last week, while UNLV is 9-3 after taking two of three at Utah and New Mexico is just a game back in the standings at 8-4. The Aztecs visit BYU this week, while UNLV is at Utah and New Mexico travels to Air Force. Here's a look at this week's conference matchups:

San Diego State at BYU (Apr. 15-17)

All-Time Series: SDSU leads 57-36 (1 tie)

Last 10: Tied 5-5, SDSU has won the last two meetings, but the Aztecs have a 2-4 mark in the last six games played in Provo.

New Mexico at Air Force (Apr. 16-18)

All-Time Series: UNM leads 78-38

Last 10: UNM 7-3, including a 6-0 record vs. the Falcons last season.

UNLV at Utah (Apr. 16-18)

All-Time Series: UNLV leads 61-31

Last 10: UNLV 7-3, including a 4-2 mark last season vs. the Utes.

MWC TRENDS

At the midpoint of the 2004 season, MWC teams are batting .286 and averaging 6.4 runs per game--both all-time lows since the league was formed. However, UNLV leads the MWC with a .323 batting average and is on pace to set a league record with 9.9 runs per game. Utah leads the MWC this year with 1.0 home runs per game--last year, five of the six MWC teams averaged over 1.0 homers per contest. FOUR DIFFERENT CHAMPIONS IN FOUR YEARS

The MWC has produced four different regular season champions the past four years. New Mexico captured the inaugural regular season crown in 2000, but BYU and San Diego State established themselves in the upper echelon of the league with regular season titles in 2001 and 2002, respectively. UNLV took the league by storm in 2003, winning the regular season and tournament titles after being selected fourth in the preseason poll. The Rebels were picked first in the 2004 MWC preseason coaches poll.

IN THE POLLS

UNLV appeared in the NCBWA poll this week at No. 34. The Rebels were ranked 27th in the NCBWA preseason poll.

AMONG THE NATIONAL LEADERS

Four MWC teams are represented among the national leaders (top 20) in the April 11 NCAA statistics report. New Mexico's **Matt Young** is tied for the national lead with seven triples this season and ranks second with .22 triples per game. San Diego State's **Ryan Schroyer** ranks 10th nationally with seven saves. UNLV's **Ryan Ruiz** is 11th in the nation with 1.39 runs scored per game, while teammate **Brent Johnson** is 20th with 1.39 RBI per game. Utah's **Matt Ciaramella** ranks 19th with .48 doubles per game.

COACHING MILESTONES

Utah head coach **Tim Esmay** recorded career win number 200 with a 4-2 victory over Albertson College on April 13. Now in his eighth season with the Utes, Esmay has an overall record of 201-218-1. San Diego State head coach **Tony Gwynn** is two wins away from his 50th career victory, while BYU's **Vance Law** and New Mexico's **Rich Alday** each need eight wins to reach career milestones: Law is approaching his 150th career win and Alday is nearing his 425th career victory.

RECORD CROWD

San Diego State downed Houston 4-0 on March 11 in the first-ever game played at the newly constructed Petco Park in San Diego. The game will go down in NCAA history as a record 41,106 fans turned out for the contest, shattering the NCAA all-time single-game attendance mark of 27,673 set at the Louisiana Superdome in New Orleans on April 10, 2002. College Sports Television (CSTV) selected the Houston vs. San Diego State contest as its inaugural baseball telecast of the 2004 campaign.

MOUNTAIN WEST CONFERENCE QUICK HITS

AIR FORCE

The Falcons will look to snap a 13-game losing streak when New Mexico visits this week. In five victories this season, Air Force is hitting .375 and has an ERA of 3.56. In the 27 losses, the Falcons are hitting just .269 and have an ERA over 12. Air Force leads the MWC with 49 stolen bases on the year (1.55 per game), led by Josh Wolfram with 12. Falcon pitcher Clayton Couch has two of Air Force's five victories this season and ranks second in the MWC for fewest earned runs allowed (18).

BYU

The Cougars bring a 4-8 conference record into this week's series vs. San Diego State. BYU broke a nine-game losing streak against UNLV with an 8-7 victory over the Rebels on Thursday. Shortstop Brandon Taylor hit his team-leading eighth home run vs. UNLV on Thursday and leads the Cougars in RBI (28) and doubles (9). After playing 35 of their first 38 games on the road, the Cougars return home to play 13 of their final 19 games in Provo. Friday's game against San Diego State will be televised and can be viewed nationally on BYU-TV through DirecTV and the Dish Network.

NEW MEXICO

The Lobos are just one game back in the MWC standings heading into this week's series at Air Force. Josh Mader and Matt Young rank among league leaders for batting average, slugging percentage and hits. Young is tied for the national lead in triples with seven on the year. New Mexico is hitting .337 with 14 home runs in 12 victories this season, but managed just a .277 batting average in 19 losses.

SAN DIEGO STATE

SDSU is off to an 8-2 start in conference play and has won seven of its last 10 contests. The Aztecs hit just .244 vs. non-conference opponents, but they raised the average to .360 in league contests. James Guerrero is second in the MWC with a .513 average in MWC contests, followed by Brock Ungricht in third place with a .488 average. In the last 10 games, Ungricht has a team-best 13 RBI. Righthander Scott Shoemaker is 4-0 in MWC games and has an MWC-best 1.39 ERA with 27 strikeouts.

UNLV

The Rebels, picked to win the Mountain West Conference in the preseason coaches poll, are 9-3 in league play. UNLV leads the conference (MWC games) in runs scored, hits, doubles, triples and home runs. Peter White has a league-best .528 batting average, while Brent Johnson has a league-high 18 RBI. The top three Rebel pitchers, David Seccombe, Matt Luca and Jake Vose, have teamed up for eight of UNLV's nine conference wins and 79 of the team's 109 strikeouts in league action. Luca has an MWC best 30 strikeouts in MWC contests.

UTAH

The Utes are 3-7 in conference play with wins over New Mexico and Air Force. The Utes swept a doubleheader vs. Albertson College earlier this week and will host UNLV in a three-game set. Head coach Tim Esmay recorded career win No. 200 with a 4-2 victory over Albertson College on Tuesday. Eric Chevalier has hit safely in 31 straight MWC contests dating back to last season. Chevalier is hitting .415 vs. MWC foes this season.

MWC BASEBALL CHAMPIONSHIP

The 2004 Mountain West Conference Baseball Championship will be hosted by UNLV in Las Vegas, Nev. All six MWC teams will compete in the double-elimination tournament May 26-29. Seedings will be determined by regular-season results in conference games.

All requests for media credentials for the Mountain West Conference Baseball Championship should be submitted to Assistant Director of Communications Ron Christian at the MWC office prior to the event.

The MWC Championship will take place at Earl E. Wilson Stadium at Roger Barnson Field. Dedicated in 1994, the \$1.5 million, 3,000-seat stadium is one of the finest in college baseball. The park dimensions are 335 feet down the left and right field lines, 375 feet in the power alleys, and 400 feet to straightaway centerfield.

Mader, from Albuquerque, N.M. (Cibola HS), totaled 10 RBI and a .409 batting average (9-for-22) in five games last week, including a pair of conference wins. Mader was 3-for-5 with two runs and four RBI in a 15-4 series opening win over Utah. He followed in game two with a double and an RBI as UNM won 7-4 in 11 innings. Mader had two of the Lobos' six hits in a loss to Utah in game three, including a double. Mader started the week by tying a career-high with five RBI at No. 15 Nebraska as he accounted for six of the Lobos' seven runs vs. the Huskers. Despite Mader's three-run homer in the fifth inning and RBI singles in the third and sixth innings, Nebraska went on to post the victory.

Buck, from Thornton, Colo. (Lamar CC), tossed a complete-game victory in the series finale vs. New Mexico. He allowed just one earned run and six hits over nine innings vs. the Lobos. He struck out two and walked one as he picked up his first win of the year. Buck had two relief appearances last week as well. Overall, he pitched 12 innings, allowing just one earned run and nine hits for a .75 ERA with six strikeouts.
