## Bronze Boot

Colorado State and Wyoming will battle for possession of the Bronze Boot travelling trophy again in 2004. ROTC detachments at both institutions initiated the trophy in 1968. Since then, Wyoming holds a 19-17 edge in Bronze Boot games.

## Game Ball Journey

Friday night's game ball will journey from Laramie to Fort Collins via the traditional ROTC run by cadets from each institution. Wyoming's group will take turns and run the ball to the state border, to be met by CSU cadets at noon Friday, who will carry it to Hughes Stadium. The ball is expected to arrive at the stadium at about 6 p.m.

## Series Streaks

Wyoming won last year's Border War, 35-28 in Laramie in a game that ended in a blowing snowstorm. Prior to that defeat, the Rams had been victorious four games in a row. Wyoming last won in Fort Collins on Nov. 7, 1998, 27-19. The Rams then won four in a row in the series including back-to-back wins in Fort Collins in 2000 (37-13) and 2002 (44-36).

## Streaks, Part II

Colorado State has never lost back-to-back games to Wyoming since Sonny Lubick's arrival at Colorado State in 1993. Lubick has guided the Rams to eight victories in 11 previous games with Wyoming for possession of the Bronze Boot. Colorado State last lost back-to-back games to Wyoming in 1991 (35-28) in Laramie and 1992 (31-14) in Fort Collins.

## Stadium Expansion

Expansion and renovation construction continues at Sonny Lubick Field at Hughes Stadium. In the first phase of the project 4,400 permanent seats have been installed in the north end zone, along with two new scoreboards and a new video replay board. In the next year, the construction will be completed with the addition of 12 luxury suites, a renovated press box, and an expanded Rams Horn premium club seating area.

## In October

Colorado State is 37-12 (75.6 percent) in the month of October under Sonny Lubick. The Rams were a perfect 3-0 during October of 2003 and four times have won five games during the month.

## First On Friday

Colorado State plays its first-ever Friday night game in the history of Sonny Lubick Field at Hughes Stadium when the Rams face rival Wyoming Oct. 22. There have been 17 previous night games in the stadium's history. CSU's record is 9-8 in home night games at the facility.

## Short Weeks

Colorado State and Wyoming meet for only the second time since 1993 on a day other than Saturday. The teams played on ESPN Nov.16,2000 in a game televised by ESPN. Colorado State won that game, 37-13 en route to the conference title.

## Short Weeks, Part II

Colorado State has 15 times since 1993 when Sonny Lubick arrived as head coach played a nationally-televised game on either Thursday (9-4 record) or Friday night (0-2) respectively. The Rams are 7-0 in home Thursday night games, 2-6 on the road.

## First Friday

Colorado State has previously played two Friday night road games, losing 32-20 at Fresno State on Oct. 5, 2002 and 37-34 at New Mexico on Nov. 7, 2003.

## T.V. Time

Colorado State has made more national and regional television appearances - 104 entering Friday's game - than any other MWC program since 1993. Friday's game will be the program's 21st on ESPN2. Colorado State has an 11-9 record in 20 previous games shown by ESPN2 including a loss earlier this season to Minnesota.

## Only Third At Night

Friday night's game marks only the second time since Sonny Lubick Field at Hughes Stadium opened in 1968 that rivals CSU and Wyoming will play a night game. Wyoming won the first night game between the teams at the stadium, 27-19 on Nov. 19, 1998. Colorado State won the only other night game at the facility, 37-13 in 2000.

## Rams At Home

Colorado State is 43-17 (71.6 percent) in home games during Lubick's tenure. The Rams are 24-5 (82 percent) in home nonconference games since 1993. The nonconference losses have been at the hands of Oregon (1993), Colorado (1996), Fresno State (2001), Miami of Ohio (2003), and Minnesota (2004).

## Rams At Home in 2004

Colorado State enters Friday night's game with a 1-2 home record with three home dates remaining. Colorado State has never lost three home games during Sonny Lubick's career as head coach. Colorado State last loss three or more home games in 1992, finishing 2-4.

## Rams On The Road

Colorado State is 42-24(63.6 percent) in 65 road games since Sonny Lubick's arrival in 1993. The Rams are 1-2 on the road in 2004.

## Offense Plus 400

Colorado State has gained 400 or more yards four times in six games in 2004, but have suffered losses in three of the contests. The Rams are 42-10 when gaining more than 400 yards under coach Sonny Lubick.

## Green Returns

RB Jimmy Green, who had the most rushing yards of any runningback on the team in 2003, has been hampered in 2004 by a nagging ankle injury. Playing in his hometown, he shook off the affects of the injury to lead the Rams with 51 rushing yards including the game-winning touchdown..

## Frosh Starters

True freshman QB Caleb Hanie is expected to make his first career start against Wyoming, replacing injured Justin Holland. Hanie joins such notable true freshman quarterback starters as Air Force's Shaun Carney, Tennessee's Austin Ainge and Chad Henne of Michigan.

## First Frosh Since 1981

When Hanie takes his first snap as the starter Friday night against Wyoming, he will become the first true freshman at Colorado State since Mark Miller in 1981 to start a game for the Rams.

## Injured Starter

The last time the Rams were forced to make a change at quarterback due to injury came in 1995, when Moses Moreno and Darren Wilkinson alternated starts most of the year. Wilkinson started the team's eighth game of the season at Wyoming, injured a thumb and was replaced by Moreno to started the rest of the year and led Colorado State to a second consecutive conference title and berth in the Holiday Bowl.

## Youthful Rams

Colorado State has now used six true freshmen in the lineup thus far in 2004, including WR Damon Morton, RB Gartrell Johnson, DE Matt Rupp, H-back Kory Sperry, QB Caleb Hanie, and RB Kyle Bell. The Rams are one of the most youthful teams in the nation with only six seniors (excluding kicking specialists) on the depth chart. The list of fewest seniors listed on a depth chart includes:

East Carolina-5; Purdue-5; Buffalo-5; Central Florida-5; SMU-5; **Colorado State-6**; Florida-6.

## Holland Passing

QB Justin Holland was injured in the first quarter of the Rams' win at San Diego State and will miss the remainder of the season. Holland ends 2004 by passing for 16,22 yards and six touchdowns, completing 121-of-197 passes. He averaged 270.3 yards per game passing. Holland three times in 2004 threw for 300 or more yards.

## Five 100's

Colorado State has boasted at least one 100-yard receiving game in five of six contests to date. WR David Anderson had his third 100-yard game of the year and ninth of his career (third most in school history) when he caught a career-most 12 passes for a career-best 232 yards and a touchdown in the win over BYU. WR Dustin Osborn, a former walkon who was awarded a scholarship last spring, caught a career-most six passes for a career-best 122 yards including a 26-yard touchdown in the game with Minnesota, then registered a second consecutive 100-yard receiving game with five catches for 101 yards in the win over Montana State.

## Babcock Streak

K Jeff Babcock enters Friday night's game having converted 30 consecutive point-after tries including three more in last week's win at San Diego State. He leads Colorado State in scoring with 34 points.

## More Dreessen

H-back Joel Dreessen enters this week's game with 105 career receptions for 1,072 yards and nine touchdowns. That is the second most receptions in school history by a tight end. Keli McGregor holds the record, 153, from 1981-84.

## At A Loss

DETerrance Carter, in the past two games, has had four tackles for 21 yards lost. Carter rallied the Rams for a 21-17 win at San Diego State by helping force then recover a fumble that led to the game-winning score with one minutes, 10 seconds to play.

## Rushing Scores

Colorado State is now 2-0 - including the win at San Diego State - when holding an opponent without a rushing touchdown, and 0-4 when allowing an opponent to score via the ground game.

## Turned Over

Colorado State won the turnover battle for the first time in 2004, generating three takeaways compared to a pair of giveaways. Colorado State converted two of the three turnovers into touchdowns. Through six games, the Rams have generated eight turnovers resulting in 17 points and allowed 16 takeaways for 68 points.

## First Game Points

Five times in six games to date opponents have scored the first points in a game including last week's game at San Diego State.

## First Time Passing

Colorado State's 21-17 win at San Diego State marked the first time in 2004 the Rams attempted fewer than 30 passes in a game. QB Caleb Haney (19) and injured starter Justin Holland (9) combined to attempt 28 passes. The pair completed 17 for 133 yards and a touchdown.

## Defensive Scores

LB Luke Adkins returned a first-quarter pass interception 71 yards for a touchdown in the win at SDSU. It was the first time the Rams had scored on defense since a 35-yard interception return for a touchdown by DB Ben Stratton against the Aztecs in Fort Collins in 2003.

## Sack Pack

Colorado State matched the team's season high with three quarterback sacks in the win at San Diego State, including one each by DT Blake Smith, DE Patrick Goodpaster, and DETerrance Carter. The Rams also had three sacks in a win over Montana State.

## First Frosh Starter

True freshman H-back Kory Sperry made his first career start in the win at San Diego State in place of injured TE Brandon Alconcel. Sperry responded by catching three passes - his first career receptions - good for 36 yards including a 20-yard gain.

## Pick Distance

LB Luke Adkins' 71-yard interception return for a touchdown at SDSU was the longest such return at Colorado State since 1993 when DB Ray Jackson intercepted a pass at UTEP and returned it 100 yards for a touchdown.

## WR David Anderson Update

- 42 receptions for 697 in 2004, of which 13 have been for 20 or more yards, including a season-most five vs. BYU.
- 4th in career receiving yards, 2,170.
- Anderson's 12 catches vs. BYU tie for the second most in a game in school history, while his 232 receiving yards in that game are the second most in a game in school history.
- Three 100-yard receiving games in 2004 including a career-most 12 catches for a career-high 233 yards and a touchdown vs. BYU. He had back-to-back 100-yard receiving games in 2004, catching 9-156 at Colorado, and 9-137 at USC.

## Media Guidelines

- All interviews with any of Colorado State University's football coaching staff or student-athletes must be coordinated through assistant athletic director for media relations Gary Ozzello.
- Interviews are prohibited from conflicting with classes, practice sessions, meetings or medical treatment.
- On-site interviews must take place at the conclusion of practice near the locker room entrance to Moby Arena.
- Home telephone numbers for student-athletes will not be released to the media.

## Student-Athlete Interviews

- Television interviews with student-athletes must be conducted following the conclusion of practice outside the entrance to the locker room.
- Interviews with student-athletes are not permitted on the practice fields, in the locker room, or training room.
- Interviews with student-athletes the day before a game are restricted to network television for use during a game telecast.
- Interviews with student-athletes are not permitted the day of a game.
- Media members are prohibited from interviewing student-athletes on the sidelines during all practices, including injured student-athletes not participating in a practice session.
- Interviews with student-athletes conducted prior to 1:30 p.m. on a normal practice day must be scheduled at least 24 hours in advance through Gary Ozzello.

## Coaching Staff Interviews

- Interviews are not permitted in the locker room or training room areas.
- Coach Lubick hosts a weekly news conference at 12 noon each Monday throughout the season. Coach Lubick addresses the media and takes questions about the past week's game and upcoming opponent. He is also available for radio and television interviews at this time.
- Coach Lubick is available for radio and newspaper interviews each Tuesday, Wednesday, and Thursday from 11-11:30 a.m. All requests should be forwarded to athletic media relations director Gary Ozzello at least 24 hours in advance of a requested interview.
- Radio interviews should last no more than 10 minutes in duration.
- Coach Lubick is available for questions via the Mountain West Conference Coaches Teleconference scheduled each Tuesday morning throughout the season.
- Television interviews with members of the coaching staff must be conducted following the conclusion of practice outside the entrance to the locker room.
- Telephone interviews with a member of the coaching staff should be arranged at least 24 hours in advance of the requested session. Athletic media relations director Gary Ozzello will arrange telephone interviews with requested coaching staff members.

## Postgame Procedures

- All players must report immediately to the locker room area before conducting interviews of any kind.
- Coach Sonny Lubick will meet with the media in a designated interview area at the conclusion of a 10-minute cooling period. When his remarks have concluded, he will then appear on a live network radio show, and the team locker room is open to the media.
- No student-athlete or coach can appear on a live postgame television or radio interview without permission obtained in advance of the game.

Colorado State's football program has taken another major step in the Rams' continued rise of national prominence under Coach Sonny Lubick.

A \$15.2 million gift to the athletics department from the Bohemian Foundation is being used to renovate, expand and enhance the school's football facility. A new artificial surface practice field was completed in December of 2003 and has been in use since that time.

The process is underway at the stadium with total completion expected prior to the 2005 season opener. In 2004, two new scoreboards including a state-of-the-art high resolution videoboard will be installed. Also, nearly 5,000 permanent seats will be installed in the north end zone. By 2005, the rest of the expansion and renovation including luxury suites, an expanded Rams Horn premium seating area, renovated press box, and additional fan amenities will have been completed.

The gift to athletics was part of a record \$20.1 million gift to the university, of which \$4.9 will be used for University Center for the Performing Arts. It is the largest single gift in school history and among the largest ever presented to a school in state history.

Pat Stryker, president of the Bohemian Foundation, praised Lubick for his contributions to the university and the Fort Collins community.

"Sonny Lubick is the embodiment of the university's commitment to building a quality program by caring about student athletes and playing by the rules," said Stryker of her gift on behalf of athletics.

"I'm thrilled to be able to recognize that commitment, and Sonny's character, through this gift."

Lubick was touched not only by the announcement of the renovation and expansion, but the renaming of the football facility.

"I am truly honored and humbled by the support of Pat Stryker and the Bohemian Foundation," he said. "Her commitment to academic and athletic excellence is second to none, and we plan to continue to work as hard as we can to honor her faith in us."

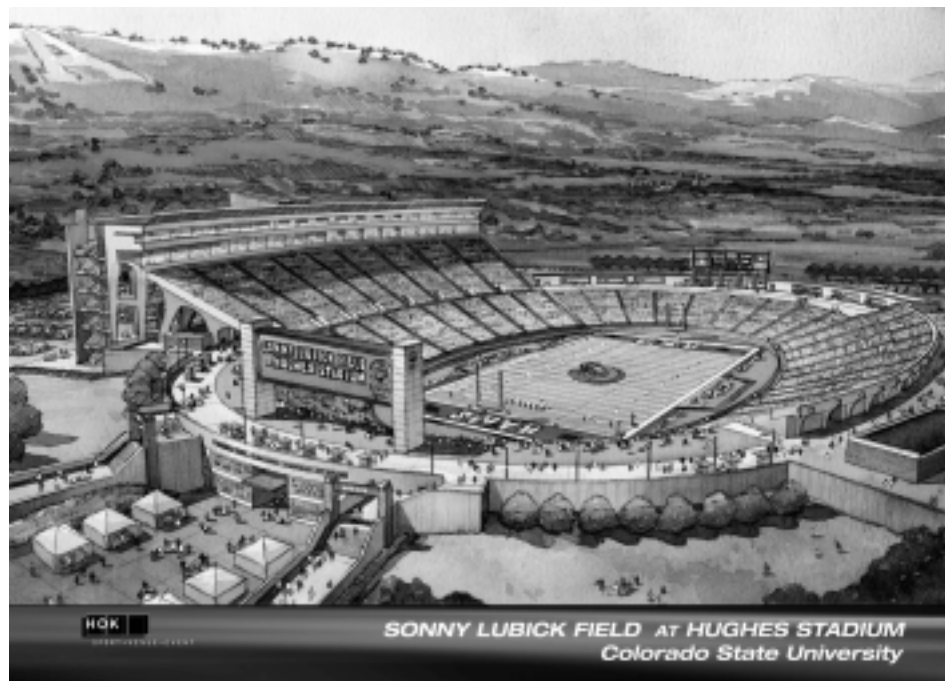
Since Lubick arrived as Colorado State's football coach in 1993, the Rams have achieved national success and acclaim, ranking among the national leaders in total victories. Six times since 1994 the Rams have won or shared the conference title, among the top figures in the nation. Lubick's six titles are the most by any current action Mountain West Conference coach.

Colorado State has played in eight bowl games including five in a row, among the most in the nation.

Lubick's Rams have also enjoyed 10 consecutive winning seasons, the sixth longest active streak nationally.

Improvements at the stadium and the football program include:

- New artificial turf for the playing surface on Sonny Lubick Field at Hughes Stadium.
- New artificial turf for one of the Rams' practice fields, located south of Moby Arena;
- Two new scoreboards, one each on the south and north side of stadium;
- A new, giant, state-of-the-art video board that can provide instant replays and can provide fans with statistical game information and graphics;
- An 18-percent increase in seating capacity at the stadium;
- Installation of permanent seats in the north end zone;
- Major enhancements to the Rams' Horn club-level seating area, including added restroom facilities, a second elevator, additional seating, and expanded dining amenities;
- A renovated and improved press box;
- The addition of luxury suites available to major donors, which will include catered food service, seating, and television monitors;
- New concessions stands and restrooms on the north end of the stadium, adding 5,000 square feet of concession space, a 71-percent increase, and a 36-percent increase in restroom facilities;
- Paved parking areas on the northwest and southwest sides of the stadium to increase and improve space for donors and ticket holders.

## Stadium Facts

Since Sonny Lubick's arrival in 1993, Colorado State has won nearly 75 percent of the team's home games. Sonny Lubick Field at Hughes Stadium has been the site to some of the greatest games in school history, and national and regional television broadcasts take place at nearly every home game.

The stadium lies at the base of the foothills of the Rocky Mountains, about two miles west of the main campus area and in one of the most scenic settings to be found anywhere. In 2000, permanent lighting standards were installed, then 4,400 additional permanent seats were constructed into the north end zone.

## Sonny Lubick, Head Coach 12th Season • Western Montana '60

Colorado State football coach Sonny Lubick has been paid many tributes during his 11 seasons at the helm.

For instance, he has been honored as the conference coach of the year four times.

In 1994, *SPORTS ILLUSTRATED* honored the personalbe Lubick as its national coach of the year. That same year he received several national recognition from several other organizations as well.

But perhaps the greatest tribute and a testimony to what he has meant not only to Colorado State's football program but the entire athletics department, university community and the region came in May of 2003.

During the announcement of a \$15.2 million gift by Pat Stryker and the Bohemian Foundation to renovate and expand the school's football stadium, officials announced that the field would be named in Lubick's honor.

That "Sonny" spring day will long be remembered as one of the greatest moments in Rams' athletics history. Sonny Lubick Field at Hughes Stadium is undergoing significant changes that will expand the capacity, provide two new scoreboards including a state-of-the-art video replay board, expanded premium club level seating, and the addition of luxury suites. There will also be a new playing field installed, as well as other fan amenities to provide Ram fans the finest spectator experience.

More than anything else, the gift and the ensuing renovation and expansion serve as daily reminders what Lubick has meant not only to the football program, but to the athletic department in general and the university as a whole.

It is more than his performance on the field, which has been remarkable: 6 conference titles, 8 bowl appearances, and ranking among the top 15 programs nationally in total victory.

Lubick has won 91 games in 11 seasons including four times guiding the Rams to 10 or more victories in a campaign.

It is more about who he is as a person, a husband, and father, more about what he stands for and cares about.

In December of 2003, Lubick was named one of four national finalists for the Eddie Robinson Coach of Distinction Award for his community service work and success with the Rams' program.

In the summer of 2003, he was recognized by the American Diabetes Association's Colorado Chapter as a "Father of the Year." He is an annual contributor and participant in several local and national charities, including the St. Jude's Children's Hospital campaign.

Each spring, Lubick can be spotted visiting local elementary schools to visit students about the importance of education and being a solid citizen.

On the school's campus, he has achieved celebrity status, not because of the success and recognition he has generated for the entire institution, but for his gentle nature and caring personality.

Those who have had the pleasure of dealing with Lubick quickly recognize why he has succeeded as a coach.

Lubick cares deeply about the people around him - from the members of his coaching staff to every player on the roster. He has built Colorado State's program into one of the nation's finest with hard work, dedication, and a commitment to helping people attain success.

He has a philosophy he shares not only with his team, but with the community and Ram fans nationwide.

- **Responsibility:** Having each member of Colorado State's program take responsibility for their actions and impact on the success of the team.
- **Character:** Lubick places a premium on student-athletes who display integrity and honesty.
- **Respect:** Earning respect among peers, fans, and colleagues remains more important to the veteran coach than gaining popularity.

- **Keep winning and losing in perspective:** Sonny Lubick keeps his program on an even keel - not too high after a monumental victory, of which there have many during his career, nor too low following defeat. Lubick has the presence in the program to keep his program focused on the goal ahead.
- **Work hard and enjoy what you do:** Sonny Lubick's work ethic, dedication and enthusiasm is contagious to those around the Rams' program. He also firmly believes that individuals in any situation perform at peak levels when they enjoy what they are doing.

Lubick's philosophy has paid tremendous dividends to Colorado State's program. Consider that in 11 seasons, he has won 91 games and appeared in 8 bowl games while winning 6 conference titles.

In 11 seasons prior to his arrival, the Rams' program tasted victory only 47 times and played in a single bowl game.

He is without question the most successful coach in school history and has earned the reputation as one of the nation's finest football coaches. He has brought unmatched success and popularity to the base of the Rocky Mountains with his style and grace.

"People know who Colorado State is now. When we go to a bowl game, and see the fans and students enjoying the game, that's what we talk about as coaches and makes us excited," Lubick said.

Lubick is quick to credit his staff and the student-athletes for the program's prominence.

"It's about good coaches and having good student-athletes. Players know they are being treated fairly and that this is a good place," said Lubick

"It takes all of us to have a good program: the student-athletes, coaches, staff, the student body. Those are the little things that make big things happen."

While Lubick is pleased with the program's progress, he is not satisfied or complacent.

"I'm proud to be part of something like this," he said of the Rams' achievements. "But we're going to keep pushing to get better. We want to maintain a solid program that has respect throughout the country. Other coaches from around the country look at our program and know something good is going on here."

The Rams under Lubick, who signed a new 5-year contract in 2002 have:

- Earned 8 bowl invitations in 10 seasons, more than any other MWC team and among the most appearances nationally;
- Won or shared six conference titles;
- Won conference games since than any other MWC program;
- The Rams rank among the top 15 programs nationally in total victories since 1994;
- Seven times since 1994, the team has won eight or more games in a season. Four times - the only times in school history it has happened- the Rams have won 10 (three times) or more (11) games in a season.
- Twice, in 1999 and again in 2002, the Rams completed a "Front Range" sweep by beating Air Force, Colorado and Wyoming.
- In 2002 for the first time in school history, Colorado State owned wins over AFA, BYU, Colorado, Utah and Wyoming in the same season.

Lubick has won more conference titles - 6 - than any other MWC head coach. The veteran coach also ranks among the national leaders in career victories.

The Rams' program has attained lofty status with 10 consecutive winning seasons from 1994-2002, among the highest totals in the nation.

Success on the field has been transformed into overall popularity of the program. Colorado State, since Lubick's arrival, has appeared in 97 regional and national television games.

In 2003, Colorado State finished among the top 15 programs nationally in percent capacity, 102.1, having drawn more than 183,000 fans for 6 home games, 30,631 per contest. All of those figures rank among the top three in school history.
