PLAYERS OF THE WEEK (Nov. 1, 2004)

Alex Smith (Utah), Nick Speegle (New Mexico) and John Wendling (Wyoming), and Wes Zunker (New Mexico) were named Mountain West Conference Players of the Week. Smith claims Offensive Player of the Week, Speegle and Wendling share Defensive honors, and Zunker receives Special Teams recognition. Smith earns the award for the fourth time this season and seventh time in his career. Zunker earns the award for the second time this season and third time in his career, while Speegle and Wendling are first time honorees.

MWC Offensive Player of the Week

Alex Smith, Utah, Quarterback, Junior

Smith completed 22-of-33 passes (67%) for 298 yards and five touchdowns in Utah's 51-28 road victory at San Diego State. He also led all Ute rushers with 45 yards on 15 carries and was responsible for 343 of Utah's 548 yards of total offense. Smith's five passing touchdowns are a career high and tie for the second-most in school history. Smith also set an MWC record, becoming one of five quarterbacks in MWC history to pass for five touchdowns in a game.

MWC Co-Defensive Players of the Week

Nick Speegle, New Mexico, Linebacker, Senior

Speegle collected eight tackles (seven solo), including two for a combined loss of eight yards, in the 26-17 victory over Colorado State in Fort Collins. He also had a pass deflection and was part of the defensive effort that helped hold the Rams to their lowest rushing total (35 yards) in five years.

John Wendling, Wyoming, Free Safety, Sophomore

Wendling led Wyoming with 11 tackles, including seven solo stops and four assists, in a 43-26 win over Air Force. He also had two pass breakups in the victory. It was the fourth time in eight games this season Wendling has had double figures in tackles.

MWC Special Teams Player of the Week

Wes Zunker, New Mexico, Kicker, Senior

Zunker tied a career-high with four made field goals (21, 30, 46, 50), including a 50-yard kick that gave New Mexico a 26-17 lead with 3:26 left in the game. The 50-yard field goal was the second-longest of his career, behind a 51-yard connection against UTEP in 2001. Zunker was also successful on both of his extra point attempts in New Mexico's 26-17 victory over Colorado State.

WEEK 10 PREVIEW

Three conference games and one non-conference contest highlight Week 10 of the 2004 season. In the lone non-league game of the week, Air Force travels to West Point, N.Y., to face Service Academy rival Army. The Falcons have won seven straight against the Black Knights.

In conference action, 7th-ranked Utah will try to remain perfect when it hosts Colorado State. The Utes are 4-0 in league play, while the Rams are 2-2. BYU returns to the field after a week off and welcomes San Diego State to Provo. The Cougars are 3-1 in MWC play, while the Aztecs are in search of their first conference win (0-4). UNLV, currently 1-3 in the MWC, and hosts 2-2 Wyoming. In league games, the Rebels are 0-2 at home, while the Cowboys are 0-2 on the road.

WEEK 9 WRAP

Utah improved to 8-0 with a 51-28 win at San Diego State. The Utes compiled 375 offensive yards to the Aztecs 252 in the victory. New Mexico kept its bowl hopes alive with a 26-17 win at Colorado State. It was the Lobos' second straight win over Colorado State. Wyoming improved to 2-0 in conference play at home with a 43-26 win against Air Force. The Cowboys racked-up 559 yards of total offense in the victory.

LET'S TALK ABOUT RANKINGS

Utah moved up to #7 in the AP Poll and #8 in the ESPN/USA Today Coaches Poll this week. The Utes' No. 7 ranking is the highest for a Mountain West team since Nov. 25, 2001 when BYU was 7th in the Coaches Poll.

BOWL GAME CHATTER

Utah is currently bowl eligible with its 8-0 record. New Mexico and Wyoming are within one win of being eligible for a bowl game, with two and three games remaining, respectively. BYU needs two victories in its final three games, while Air Force and Colorado State must win each of their last three contests. The chart below shows what remains for each of the teams looking to become bowl eligible.

NO OVERTIME FOR YOU

There have been 20 overtime games played this season in NCAA Division I-A football. Nine of the 11 conferences have played at least one extra period contest, with the ACC leading the way with a high of four. The Mountain West and Sun Belt are the only two conferences that have yet to play an overtime contest this season. The MWC has had at least one overtime game in each of its five years of existence, with a record high four in 2002.

HOME AND ROAD RECORD COMPARISONS

Five of eight MWC teams have posted perfect home records, but no MWC team has gone unbeaten at home in league play since New Mexico accomplished the feat in 2002. Colorado State is the only MWC team to win four conference games at home in a season (2000). The Rams lead the MWC with a .737 win percentage on the road (14-5) and a .700 win percentage at home (14-6) in league play. Four of eight MWC teams have posted perfect road records since 2001, with Utah holding the longest road win streak in MWC history with its current six straight victories (BYU won five in a row from 2000-2001 and Colorado State won five straight from 2001-03).

INSIDE THE NUMBERS

91% - Utah head coach Urban Meyer's winning percentage against automatic qualifying BCS opponents. In 11 career games, Meyer is 10-1 against BCS teams. The win over Texas A&M in the season opener avenged his only loss to a BCS school. Meyer is 5-1 against the BCS as Utah's head coach.

17 - Wyoming's current MWC road losing streak, dating back to a 43-29 win at Utah on Nov. 6, 1999.

17 - The number of 100 yard rushing games for New Mexico running back DonTrell Moore, surpassing Winslow Oliver's (1992-95) school record of 16. Moore, the MWC's all-time leading rusher, also passed Oliver for second place on the school's career rushing list with 3,415 yards.

15 - The total number of pass breakups by New Mexico CB Brandon Payne. He leads both the Mountain West and NCAA in pass breakups this season. He broke Eric Jack's single-season school record of 14 set in 1993 after posting one pass deflection at Colorado State Saturday. Fellow MWC mates Derrick Martin of Wyoming and Donny Baker of San Diego State are also ranked in the top 10 nationally. Martin has nine pass deflections, while Baker has eight.

12 - The number of consecutive field goals between 40 and 49 yards for BYU's Matt Payne, tying the NCAA record. Payne's 46-yard, second-quarter field goal tied John Carney of Notre Dame, who set the record with 12 straight field goals during the 1984-85 seasons.

12 - Utah's current win streak that ranks third nationally (Boise State-19, Southern California-17). The Utes won their final four games in 2003 and are 8-0 this season. The 12-game streak is the second-longest in school history. The school record is 16 straight wins from 1928-30. The Utes' last loss was Oct. 25, 2003 against New Mexico, 47-35.

9 - The Utes' consecutive road or neutral site win streak that started on Sept. 27, 2003 at Colorado State.

6 - The current number of undefeated teams remaining in the NCAA in 2004, including Utah at 8-0 (Auburn, Boise State, Oklahoma, Southern California and Wisconsin).

6 - Utah is sixth in the latest BCS Poll released Monday, Nov. 1. The Utes had the highest debut by a non-automatic qualifying BCS team ever in the initial poll of a season at number seven on Oct. 18. The previous high was Northern Illinois at No. 10 in 2003. Only one non-automatic qualifying BCS school to be ranked in the initial Top 15 has ever completed the regular season undefeated (Marshall in 1999).

4 - The number of touchdowns BYU wide receiver Todd Watkins has caught in excess of 69 yards this season. This past week at Air Force, Watkins had a 70-yard touchdown reception, and finished the day with six catches for 153 yards. It was his fourth 100-yard receiving game of the year and his fourth touchdown of the season.

3 - The total number of points Wyoming's defense has allowed in the third quarter this season (3-Colorado State).

2 - Utah ranks second in the nation in scoring offense and total offense. The Utes are currently averaging 43.63 points per game, which trails only Boise State (47.25) nationally, and are on pace to break their school record of 42.5 ppg. Utah's 496.25 yards per game of total offense is second behind only Louisville (506.5 ypg) this season.

2 - BYU's current win streak, marking the first back-to-back wins for the Cougars since the 2002 season. That year, BYU defeated San Diego State on Nov. 2, followed by a win over Wyoming on Nov. 9. Last week's win over Air Force ends a streak of 21 straight games without consecutive victories.

WYOMING'S TRENTON FRANZ GARNERS NATIONAL SCHOLAR-ATHLETE AWARD

Wyoming senior offensive lineman Trenton Franz was one of 15 student-athletes named to the 2004 National Scholar-Athlete Class by the National Football Foundation and College Hall of Fame announced Nov. 1. The 15 student-athletes come from all NCAA divisions, I-A, I-AA, II, and III and averaged a 3.7 GPA as a group. To be eligible for a National Football Foundation and College Hall of Fame post-graduate fellowship, the nominee must be a senior or graduate student in his final year of eligibility, have a grade point average of at least 3.0 on a 4.0 scale, have shown superior academic application and performance, have outstanding football ability as a first team player, and have demonstrated strong leadership and citizenship. The 2004 Division I-A Scholar-Athlete Award Class is below.

SDSU'S MORRISON NAMED BUTKUS AWARD SEMIFINALIST

San Diego State senior linebacker Kirk Morrison is one of 12 semifinalists for the 2004 Butkus Award, presented annually to the best linebacker in college football. The field will be trimmed to three on Nov. 11th with the winner announced Dec. 10. The semifinalists were chosen from a preseason watch list of 68 players. Morrison was a first-team All-America linebacker last year, according to *College Football News*. He is a two-time all-conference player and the reigning Mountain West Defensive Player of the Year. Morrison is also on the watch list for the Bronko Nagurski Trophy (outstanding defensive player), the Chuck Bednarik Award (outstanding defensive player), the Lombardi Award (outstanding offensive or defensive lineman) and the Lott Trophy (defensive impact player of the year). Morrison is currently second all-time at San Diego State with 363 tackles. He entered the season 11th among the nation's active players in career tackles. Morrison is also eighth all-time at SDSU in tackles for loss (40).

Three finalists will be named Nov. 15, and the winner will be announced Dec. 9 on the ESPN College Football Awards Show from Orlando, Fla.

Wes Zunker of New Mexico, Connor Barth of North Carolina, and Jad Dean of Clemson make up the Week 10 Lou Groza Award Top Three Stars of the Week announced Nov. 1. The other star performers last week were Connor Barth, who led North Carolina to a 31-28 victory over #3 Miami after making a 42-yard field goal as time expired, and Jad Dean of Clemson, who went 4-for-4 in field goals (21, 47, 36, 42) in the 26-20 victory over NC State. What You Should Know:

- * Air Force dropped its second straight game after a 26-43 loss at Wyoming. The Falcons gave up 559 yards of total offense to the Cowboys, the second most this season (573 vs. Cal).
- * Freshman Marcus Brown made the first start of his career at Wyoming. He replaced the injured Cameron Hodge at linebacker. Brown is the fourth freshman to start for AFA this season, joining QB Shaun Carney, OL Caleb Morris and DB Bobby Giannini.
- * Senior HB Darnell Stephens moved into 20th place on the Air Force career rushing list with 1,416 yards. Stephens moved past Scott McKay (1998-00), who had 1,400 yards and Qualario Brown (1997-00), who had 1,406. Stephens ranks fourth all-time at the Academy for rushing yards for a halfback in the option era (1980-present). He is one of only seven halfbacks to hit the 1,000-yard mark in the option era.
- * Junior QB Adam Fitch and junior WR Jason Brown connected on a 45-yard TD pass in the fourth quarter, marking the longest pass play of each player's career. The TD is the first of Brown's career. The TD pass is the first for Fitch this season and second of his career.
- * HB Anthony Butler rushed for a career-high 94 yards at Wyoming.
- * Senior DE Ryan Carter and sophomore DB Chris Sutton each posted career-highs at Wyoming with 11 and 10 tackles, respectively.



BYU COUGARS
4-4, 3-1 MWC

This Week: vs. San Diego State
Up Next: vs. New Mexico

What You Should Know:

- * BYU won in Colorado Springs for the first time in four tries since 1994 with its 41-24 win over Air Force Oct. 23.
- * The 41 points against Air Force were the most scored by the Cougars in a game this season, and highest total against the Falcons since recording 63 on Oct. 20, 2001. It was also the most points the Cougars have tallied since posting 44 against San Diego State on Oct. 4, 2003.
- * BYU's offense totaled just 161 yards, including 78 yards rushing and 83 yards passing in the first half at Air Force. In the second half, the Cougars exploded with 366 yards of total offense, including 95 yards on the ground and 271 yards through the air. BYU finished the day with 527 yards of total offense.
- * BYU held Air Force scoreless in the first quarter, marking the fifth time this season the Cougars have posted an opening quarter shutout. On the year, BYU has posted a total of eight shutout quarters, including the third quarter against the Falcons.
- * BYU won for the first time this season when trailing at the half. The Cougars faced a 10-3 deficit at the break at Air Force, marking the fourth time this season they have trailed at the half. The Cougars were 0-3 when trailing at the half prior to the win Saturday.
- * Freshman Dennis Pitta grabbed an 11-yard TD pass in the third quarter, marking the first TD reception by a BYU tight end this season. It was also Pitta's first career TD. With the TD reception, Pitta became only the third different BYU receiver to record a TD reception this season, joining Todd Watkins (4) and Austin Collie (5).
- * BYU LB Gary Lovely picked up a blocked Air Force punt and returned it eight yards to give BYU a 24-10 lead in the third quarter. It was Lovely's first career TD, as well as the first time BYU has scored on a blocked punt since the 1992 season (Travis Hall vs. Utah.) Dennis Pitta, who scored two touchdowns in the game, was credited with the blocked punt.



COLORADO STATE RAMS
3-5, 2-2 MWC

This Week: at Utah
Up Next: vs. UNLV

What You Should Know:

- * Colorado State is 25-7 in games played during the month of November during Sonny Lubick's tenure.
- * Colorado State is 12-14 against top 25 teams since 1993 when Sonny Lubick arrived as head coach. The Rams are 0-2 this season with losses to USC and Minnesota.
- * Colorado State has gained 400 or more yards offensively in five of seven games in 2004, including an even 400 in the win over Wyoming. The Rams are 43-10 when gaining more than 400 yards under coach Lubick.
- * Colorado State is 0-3 in 2004 when the Rams have scored fewer than 20 points in a game, and 0-5 when allowing 20 or more points in a game.
- * Colorado State has boasted a 100-yard receiving performance in six of eight contests to date. WR David Anderson had his fourth 100-yard game of the year and 10th of his career (third most in school history) when he caught seven passes for 124 yards against New Mexico. Earlier this year, he caught a career-most 12 passes for a career-best 232 yards and a touchdown in the game vs. BYU.
- * Anderson caught a school-record 72 passes for a record-setting 1,282 yards in 2003. To date in 2004, he has 49 receptions for 821 yards, 179 yards shy from becoming only the second player in school history to record two seasons of more than 1,000 receiving yards. Greg Primus had 1,081 yards in 1991, and a season later had 1,002 receiving yards.
- * Jeff Babcock had the best day punting in his career after averaging 52.2 yards on six punts. His first punt went 89 yards, setting a new school record, and the second longest punt in MWC history.
- * Colorado State has used six true freshmen in the lineup thus far in 2004 (WR Damon Morton, RB Gartrell Johnson, DE Matt Rupp, H-back Kory Sperry, QB Caleb Hanie, and RB Kyle Bell). The Rams are one of the most youthful teams in the nation with only six seniors (excluding kicking specialists) on the depth chart. The list of fewest seniors listed on a depth chart nationally includes: East Carolina-5; Purdue-5; Buffalo-5; Central Florida-5; SMU-5; Colorado State-6; Florida-6.



NEW MEXICO LOBOS
5-4, 3-2 MWC

This Week: Open
Up Next: at BYU

What You Should Know:

- * New Mexico's 26-17 victory at Colorado State marked its third straight win. The Lobos are over .500 (5-4) for the first time this year.
- * New Mexico won back-to-back games against Colorado State for the first time since 1981-82. It was also the Lobos' first victory in Fort Collins since a 22-14 win in 1995.
- * New Mexico overcame a halftime deficit for the second straight time on the road (trailed 17-7 at UNLV) and came away with a win. The Lobos were down 7-3 at CSU before prevailing 26-17.
- * New Mexico scored 13 points in the third quarter at CSU and has now outscored opponents 80-19 in the third quarter this year, including 69-9 over the past seven games. The Rams' TD was the first allowed by the Lobos in the third quarter since Washington State in the season-opener.
- * The Lobos recovered two fumbles and had an interception at CSU, all coming in the second half. In the past six games, New Mexico has forced 16 turnovers while committing just four. During its current three-game win streak, UNM has an 11-to-1 turnover advantage.
- * The Lobos rank among the best in the nation with a +11 turnover ratio (24-13) this season, including a 14-3 advantage in five MWC games.
- * New Mexico has collected 11 interceptions in nine games this year. In 2003, UNM had 13 picks in 13 games.
- * New Mexico won for the first time in five games this year when scoring less than 24 points.
- * Junior RB DonTrell Moore scored his 40th career TD Saturday at Colorado State, surpassing Terance Mathis' (1985-89) school record of 39. Moore had 154 yards rushing in the game, giving him 3,415 career yards in 34 games.
- * The Lobos are 5-1 in their last six MWC road games and have captured seven of their past nine away from Albuquerque.



SAN DIEGO STATE AZTECS
2-6, 0-4 MWC

This Week: at BYU
Up Next: at Air Force

What You Should Know:

- * San Diego State dropped a 51-28 decision to Utah Saturday. The Aztecs have dropped five straight games for the first time since opening the 2002 season with an 0-5 record.
- * For the first time as a Division I program, San Diego State has opened league play with four straight losses. In 1960, while still in the small-college ranks, SDSU went 0-5 in California Collegiate Athletic Association play.
- * The Aztecs have lost four straight conference games for the first time since 2001 when they won their league opener against Colorado State and then lost five straight conference games before closing the season with a victory over Wyoming.
- * WR Jeff Webb has caught at least one pass in each of the last 18 games, and has at least three catches in each of his last 13 outings. Webb had nine receptions for 138 yards against Utah.
- * In the last meeting against BYU, Webb collected 253 yards and three touchdowns on 10 catches.
- * Redshirt freshman Brandon Bornes had a career day against Utah. He rushed for 112 yards on 17 carries, including a 41-yard run in the first half.
- * Senior linebacker Kirk Morrison has 363 career tackles, ranking second all-time at San Diego State behind Whip Walton (407).
- * Seven players have accounted for SDSU's 10 interceptions this season. Last year, the Aztecs recorded 12 interceptions in 12 games.



UNLV REBELS
2-6, 1-3 MWC

This Week: vs. Wyoming
Up Next: at Colorado State

What You Should Know:

- * UNLV is 4-4 after bye weeks under John Robinson.
- * UNLV fell 63-28 at Utah in their last outing on Oct. 23. The 63 points given up by the Rebels are the most since falling at BYU by an identical score (63-28) on Oct. 12, 1996. It was also the second time since the inception of the MWC, Utah has scored over 50 points against UNLV (52-14 in 1999).
- * RB Dominique Dorsey recorded his fifth 100-yard rushing game of the season, and the 10th of his career, with 179 yards at Utah. Dorsey leads the MWC in rushing with 946 yards on the year and a 118.2 yards per game average. Dorsey needs 19 yards to pass Michael Morton (1978-81) for third-place on the all-time Rebel rushing list.
- * UNLV rushed for 311 total yards at Utah. Outside of Dorsey's performance, Dyante Perkins had 95 yards on 18 attempts.
- * Six different Rebels caught passes against Utah, led by Alvin Marshall with three receptions for 46 yards.
- * WR Earvin Johnson passed Len Ware (1996-99) for second place on UNLV's career catch list with 166. Johnson needs three receiving yards to pass Demond Thompkins (1991-93) for third on that list (2,396).
- * UNLV's defense has forced 10 turnovers in its two victories and just three in its six losses.
- * After starting the year 8-14 in red-zone chances, the Rebels have scored on 14 of 15 trips inside opponent 20-yard lines (nine TDs/five FGs).



UTAH UTES
8-0, 4-0 MWC

This Week: vs. Colorado State
Up Next: at Wyoming

What You Should Know:

- * Utah's 8-0 start ties the school record set in both 1930 and 1994. A Ute team has never started the season 9-0. The 1930 team finished at 8-0, while the 1994 team fell to 8-2 before winning its last two games and finish 10-2.
- * The 2004 Utes own the second-longest win streak in school history (12). The school record is 16 straight wins from 1928-30. The 2004 Utes hold the school record for consecutive road/neutral site wins with nine.
- * Utah is averaging 43.63 points per game, and is on pace to break the school scoring record of 42.50 ppg set in 1930.
- * Utah has scored 50 or more points in back-to-back games for the first time in school history (63 vs. UNLV and 51 at SDSU).
- * Utah's coaching staff has strong ties to this week's opponent: Head coach Urban Meyer coached the receivers at Colorado State from 1990-95. One of Meyer's former CSU players, Billy Gonzales, is now his receiver/special teams coach. Gonzales played wideout for the Rams from 1989-93.
- * Utah has dominated the scoreboard in the first half this season, out-scoring opponents 233-79.
- * Utah has scored on 40-of-45 red zone attempts this season (89%), with 83 percent of those drives resulting in TDs. If you don't count three "kneel downs" at the end of games, the Utes have scored on 40-of-42 red zone opportunities. Opponents have scored on 13-of-21 (62%) trips inside Utah's 20 yard line —10 of those touchdowns.



WYOMING COWBOYS
5-3, 2-2 MWC

This Week: at UNLV
Up Next: vs. Utah

What You Should Know:

- * Wyoming defeated Air Force, 43-26, Saturday. The win was the Cowboys fifth of the season, marking their most victories since the 1999 season when they finished 7-4.
- * Wyoming is 5-0 at home in 2004, marking the Cowboys' first 5-0 start at home since 1998. Wyoming went on to post a 5-1 home record that season.
- * Wyoming did not have a turnover in the win over Air Force. The previous two weeks, Wyoming turned the ball over four times against both BYU and CSU.
- * Wyoming forced two Air Force turnovers (one fumble and one interception) and turned both of those turnovers into points. The Cowboys scored a touchdown on the next possession after each of the those two turnovers. Prior to those two scores, UW had failed to score after the last 10 turnovers it had forced.
- * The Cowboys' 559 yards of total offense and 88 plays were both season highs, and marked the second time this season UW accounted for over 500 yards of total offense and ran over 80 plays. The Pokes had 537 yards on 83 plays against Appalachian State in the season opener
- * Wyoming has scored 30 or more points three of five home games this season. Only San Diego State held the Pokes to under 30 points in War Memorial Stadium, but the Cowboys still defeated the Aztecs 20-10.
- * Junior QB Corey Bramlet completed 19-of-27 passes for a career-tying high 256 yards. He also posted 256 yards at Colorado State a week ago.

GAME NOTES

Freshman QB Caleb Hanie had a career day, hitting 20-of-36 passes for 285 yards and two touchdowns in a 17-26 loss to New Mexico. Junior WR David Anderson was Hanie's favorite target, collecting seven catches for 124 yards. QB Alex Smith threw for 298 yards and a career-high five touchdown passes in a 51-28 victory at San Diego State. Smith threw his first four scoring passes in the first half. He hit Paris Warren on TD throws of 5 and 10 yards, had an 18-yarder to Savoy and a 3-yarder to Travis LaTendresse.

THE GAME

Utah has dropped three straight games to Colorado State in Salt Lake City dating back to a 38-21 win in 1993. The Utes lost each of those contests by 8 points or less. Utah had also lost five in a row to the Rams prior to last year's 28-21 win in Ft. Collins. DB Dave Revill forced a Colorado State fumble on Utah's 21-yard line and Arnold Parker scooped up the bounce and raced 80 yards for the game-winning touchdown with 1:33 remaining.

THE COACHES

Sonny Lubick is in his 16th season as a head coach with an all-time record of 115-68.
