**2004 (Junior):** Had two receptions for 33 yards at Utah...Made seven catches for 124 yards against New Mexico...Had his consecutive games with a reception halted at 19 against Wyoming...Made three catches for 32 yards against SDSU...Surpassed 2,000 career receiving yards with a career-high 233 yards against BYU moving him into fourth place on the CSU all-time charts...Had four catches for 66 yards and a score against MSU...Made five catches for 74

yards against Minnesota...Caught nine passes for a game-high 137 yards against top-ranked USC surpassing three players on the career receiving list and moving into the eighth spot...Preseason all-MWC selection...Named as top 20 receiver in the nation by Lindy's in the preseason...Street & Smith's and Athlon Sports preseason all-MWC pick...Recorded the seventh 100-yard receiving game of his career at Colorado with a nine-catch, 156 yard performance...Moved into third place on the school's all-time 100-yard receiving games list.

**2003 (Sophomore):** Named to preseason Biletnikoff Award watch list...earned first team all-conference honors after leading the MWC with 1,293 receiving yards (99.5 per game)...Hauled in a career-high 10 passes for 134 yards and a 40-yard touchdown against Boston College in the San Francisco Bowl game...Set a CSU record with six 100-yard games on the year while also posting the school's most receiving yards (1,293) and receptions (72) in a single season...ranks eighth all-time in school history with 10 career touchdown receptions...Caught five or more passes in eight contests...made eight touchdown receptions, fifth most in a season in CSU history...became the first player since 1992 to surpass 1,000 receiving yards in a season...boasted a career-most 199-yard receiving game against Air Force, a mark that ranks fourth in school history in single game receiving yards. **2002 (Freshman):** Named to MWC All-Academic team with a 3.14 grade point average... played in all 14 games...made eight receptions for 180 yards and one touchdown...blocked punt that rolled out of the end zone for a safety to give CSU a 2-0 lead against New Mexico...caught first touchdown pass of career (70 yards) at Fresno State and had two receptions for 97 yards...caught first career pass vs. Louisville, 14 yards. **Thousand Oaks:** Named all-west region by SuperPrep Magazine...all-conference three years, all-state two years while at Thousand Oaks...racked up 1,130 yards on 83 receptions and scored nine TDs in his senior season...won the league MVP and the team MVP two years...holds all major receiving records at Thousand Oaks, including yards in a season and career, passes caught in a season and career...had a 3.83 GPA and was an honor student...considered one of the finest wide receiver prospects to sign with the Rams' program...named to all-conference, all-county and all-state teams as a senior...selected to play in the California-Florida all-star game...also recruited by several PAC-10 and MWC institutions. **Personal:** Born July 28, 1983...full name: David Kent Anderson...majoring speech communications.

**2004 (Senior):** Drilled a school-record 89-yard punt against New Mexico...Hit three field goals for the eighth time in his career against Wyoming...Made three field goals and hit a 59 yard punt against Montana State...Hit three field goals and tied his career high with a 48-yarder against Minnesota...Connected on a 26-yard attempt in season-opening loss to Colorado. **2003 (Junior):** Listed on the Ray Guy and Lou Groza preseason watch lists...named as honorable mention all-MWC after hitting 13-of-19 field goals in his junior campaign...also ranked 35th in the nation with a punting average of 42.3 yards/punt...hit 1.08 field goals per game ranking 53rd in the nation in the category...made good on all nine field goal attempts on the road...responsible for 85 points in 2003, the seventh-highest figure in school history for a single season...ranks fifth in career scoring at CSU with 200 points...hit 4-of-4 field goals at New Mexico and tied a career high with a 48-yarder in CSU's win over Air Force...converted seven PAT's and one field goal in win at BYU...made two field goals from 35 and 39 yards and had two punts downed inside the 20-yard-line in win over Fresno State...averaged 45.3 yards per punt vs. Utah including two downed inside the 20-yard-line...made all three of his field goal attempts including game-winner from 32 yards at Cal. **2002 (Sophomore):** Starting kicker in all 14 games...set a new school single-season record with 24 field goals, including a 46-yarder against TCU in the 2003 Liberty Bowl...scored 118 points, second most in a season in school history...second-team all-conference...led league in field goals per game and was sixth nationally...made four of five tries vs. UNLV...six times in 2002 made two or more field goals in a game, and twice made four or more...in win at Air Force, recovered a fumble on second-half kickoff and returned it 29 yards for a score...at Virginia, tied the school and MWC record by making five field goals (27, 28, 37, 46, 28) in opening-game win...was the first game in which he had tried a field goal at the college level. **2001 (Freshman):** Handled placekicking duties for the Rams throughout the season...kicked off 60 times in 12 games, and only 21 were returned; the other 39 kicks were through the end zone or downed for touchbacks. **2000:** Joined the team as a walk-on and redshirted. **Jesuit:** Played football, baseball, and ran track...earned three varsity awards in football, two in baseball and track...named all-region as a punter as a senior...led team to four district titles. **Personal:** Born Aug. 7, 1981 in Minneapolis, Minn...son of Aaron and Pam Babcock of Tampa...has two sisters...full name: Jeff Andrew Babcock...majoring in management.
