UNM WINS 4 OF LAST 5 TO POST WINNING SEASON

- The New Mexico Lobos closed out their 102nd season of football on Nov. 24, with a resounding 53-0 shutout over in-state rival New Mexico State. UNM finished 6-5 for its first winning season under head coach Rocky Long and the program's first since the 1997 squad went 9-4. It's only the Lobos' fifth winning season since 1979.
- After a 1-3 start, UNM went 5-2 in its last seven games, including victories in four of its last five contests.
- After being picked to finish seventh in the MWC in late-July, the Lobos tied Utah for third place with a 4-3 mark, their best conference finish since winning the '97 WAC Mountain Division title at 6-2 .
- The Lobos have increased their win total in each of Long's four seasons at New Mexico, a feat that has never happened in school history: three in 1998, four in 1999, five in 2000 and six in 2001.
- The 2001 season was the third straight year that UNM has exceeded preseason prognostications. The Lobos were picked to finish last in the MWC in 2000, but tied for fifth. The guess was seventh in 1999, but New Mexico again tied for fifth.
- The Lobos set school records for total attendance (187,608) and average attendance (31,268 in six games) in 2001. The previous records were 183,972 and 30,662 set in 1997. UNM averaged 23,656 fans in 2000, meaning attendance jumped 32%, which could be one of the largest percentage increases in the country.
- New Mexico has finished in the top-20 in total defense each of the past two seasons, a first for the program. UNM finished 18th in 2001, allowing 310.8 yards a game. The Lobos were 17th in 2000, yielding 309.4 yards.
- For the second straight season, UNM led the MWC in rushing defense. The Lobos ranked 5th nationally - best in school history - allowing just 87.4 yards. It's the first time since stats became official in 1946 that UNM has given up less than 100 yards on the ground for an entire season.
- Offensively, UNM averaged 27.6 points in 2001, which is 8.5 points more than in 2000 when it logged just 19.1 points a game. That's the largest increase in 12 years, since 1988 (14.2 ppg) to 1989 (24.8 ppg).
- The Lobos' total offense also jumped from 266.6 yards a game in 2000 to 376.8 yards in 2001, an increase of 110.2 yards.
- UNM's 20-15 win at San Diego State snapped a six-game losing streak in November road games. New Mexico had not won a November away game since Nov. 1, 1997, a 40-10 triumph at TCU. It was win No. 400 fro the UNM program.
- With the postponement of games on Sept. 15, the Lobos played four straight road games between Sept. 8 and Oct. 6. The only other schools to play four in a row on the road in 2001 were San Jose State and Central Florida.
- New Mexico was the only team in the MWC that had to open the conference season with consecutive road games, at Utah and at Wyoming. BYU had two straight league road games as well - at UNLV and at New Mexico - however, the Cougars had a non-conference home game against Utah State between trips.

LOBO HISTORY

- The University of New Mexico has a 402-470-31 overall record through 102 seasons.
- UNM was founded in 1889. Three years later, the first football game was played on Oct. 7, 1892, when a team representing UNM played a squad from Albuquerque High School in a vacant lot north of the town's ice factory. The preps prevailed 5-0.

NEW MEXICO STATE REGAP

- Led by dominating rushing and defensive performances, the Lobos blasted New Mexico State 53-0, in the season finale. UNM earned its first shutout in 208 games, since blanking West Texas State 27-0 on Sept. 15, 1984, and recorded its biggest margin of victory since a 77-6 romp over the National University of Mexico in the first game ever played at University Stadium on Sept. 17, 1960.
- Leading just 3-0 after the first quarter, New Mexico took control of the game in the second period behind its senior-led rushing attack. Jarrod Baxter ran for 60 of the Lobos' 110 second-quarter rushing yards, including a 3-yard touch-down plunge to give UNM a 9-0 lead three seconds into the quarter. Vladimir Borombozin added a 34-yard field goal and sophomore quarterback Casey Kelly vaulted into the endzone from seven yards out to give New Mexico a 19-0 halftime lead.

HEAD COACH

ROCKY LONG



Rocky Long has completed four seasons as the head coach of New Mexico football. Long's career record stands at 18-28, 12-12 at home and 6-16 on the road. He is 11-18 in conference games (10-11 in the MWC), 7-9 at home and 4-9 on the road. Long is 7-10 in non-conference affairs, 5-3 at home and 2-7 on the road.

Long was named New Mexico's 28th head football coach on December 20, 1997, after spending two years as the defensive coordinator at UCLA.

This is Long's third stint at UNM. He was a graduate assistant from 1972-73 and an assistant coach from 1978-80.

A quarterback for the Lobos from 1969-71, Long was a three-time MVP and was selected as the WAC offensive player of the year following his senior season. He graduated from UNM in 1974.

ROCKY LONG QUICK FACTS

- Born January 27, 1950, in Provo, Utah, while his father Rob was playing football at BYU...married to the former Debra Meerdink for 28 years...oldest daughter Roxanne was a four-year basketball letterwinner at Oklahoma and is currently the head girl's basketball coach at Diamond Hill-Jarvis HS in Fort Worth, Texas...youngest daughter Hannah played volleyball and basketball at Portland State and is currently assistant women's volleyball coach at Western Oregon.
- Attended Alta Loma High School in Cucamonga, Calif...played in the 1967 California All-Star game...two-time all-league quarterback.
- Started his varsity career at New Mexico as a second-team defensive back...made his first career start at quarterback at BYU on October 11, 1969.
- Was the first UNM sophomore in the Modern Era to be elected team co-captain while in his first season of varsity competition (1969)...also team captain as a senior in 1971.
- Named UNM's most valuable player three straight seasons from 1969-71, becoming the first sophomore to receive the award...team leader in passing, punt returns and kickoff returns in 1969, and he finished second to Sam Scarber in rushing with 450 yards.
- Was the WAC Offensive Player of the Year following his senior season (1971).
- Earned the Chuck Cummings Memorial Award in 1969 and '71...the award is given to the UNM player based on morale and spirit.
- Was one of four NCAA players that spent part of the summer of 1971, visiting U.S. servicemen in Vietnam...the others were Johnny Musso (Alabama), Lydell Mitchell (Penn State) and Stan Mauldin (Texas).
- A three-time Academic All-WAC selection (1969-71)...recipient of the WAC Scholar-Athlete Award in 1970...honorable mention Academic All-America in 1969...awarded an NCAA post-graduate scholarship in 1972.
- Was an all-pro defensive back for the British Columbia Lions of the Canadian Football League in 1977...led the league in kickoff returns in 1975 and '76 and in punt returns in 1976 and '77...had 22 career interceptions in the CFL, with eight coming in 1976.
- Named to the World Football League all-star team in 1974 as a member of the Detroit Wheels.
- Was a 1996 inductee into the UNM Athletic Hall of Honor.
- As defensive coordinator at UCLA, he led the Bruin defense to a No. 2 national ranking in turnover margin (+20) in 1997, forcing 39 turnovers (18 fumbles and 21 interceptions)...the Bruins were 15th nationally in pass efficiency defense (103.84 rating) and 33rd in scoring defense (20.4 points/game).

RB Jarrod Baxter (Albuquerque)

>No. 6 fullback in the nation, Sporting News

- New Mexico slammed the door in the third quarter, outscoring the Aggies 13-0. Baxter capped an all rushing, 7-play, 59-yard drive with a 7-yard touchdown run on the Lobos' first possession of the half and Stephen Persley intercepted Aggie quarterback K.C. Enzminger on NMSU's first play of the quarter. Holmon Wiggins later scored from a yard out to give New Mexico a 32-0 lead at the end of three quarters. In the quarter, UNM ran 22 plays for 137 yards, while New Mexico State had just four plays for nine yards.
- Several of the Lobos' 21 seniors had a part in New Mexico's 60th win over the Aggies and biggest in the series since a 61-0 shutout in 1948. Baxter rushed for 131 yards and two touchdowns to pass current head coach Rocky Long on the all-time rushing list. Baxter finished 7th with 2,090 yards. Wiggins had 135 all-purpose yards, including 27 yards on punt return to finish a mere three yards shy of Chad Smith's school record of 666 career yards. Fellow senior RBs Javier Hanson and Sulayman Konte added fourth-quarter TDs and finished with career-highs of 88 and 42 yards rushing, respectively. UNM's final touchdown of the game came when senior Tony Mazotti blocked Brian Copple's punt, which was returned 30 yards by Amos Wilson, another senior.
- UNM finished with a season-high 350 yards rushing, while holding New Mexico State to just 79 yards on 31 carries. The Aggies entered the game averaging 219.5 yards and 47.2 attempts per contest.

LOBO OFFENSE NOTES

- New Mexico averaged 27.6 points in 2001, which is 8.5 points more than in 2000 when the Lobos logged just 19.1 a game. That's the largest increase in 12 years, since 1988 (14.2 ppg) to 1989 (24.8 ppg).
- The Lobos' total offense jumped from 266.6 yards a game in 2000 to 376.8 yards in 2001, an increase of 110.2 yards.
- Senior **RB Jarrod Baxter (Albuquerque)** gained 131 yards on 21 carries against New Mexico State to finish in 7th place at UNM with 2,090 career rushing yards. Current head coach Rocky Long was 7th with 2,071 yards. Baxter finished tied for 6th at UNM with 19 career rushing TDs and 7th in career rushing attempts (462).
- Senior **RB Holmon Wiggins (Los Angeles, Calif.)** completed his collegiate career with a third straight solid all-around game, totaling 135 all-purpose yards against New Mexico State. Wiggins rushed for 56 yards, caught 2 passes for 52 yards, and had 2 punt returns for 27 yards. He racked up 488 all-purpose yards the final three games: 183 rushing, 110 receiving, 62 on punt returns and 133 on kickoffs.
- Wiggins moved into the No. 12 slot all-time at New Mexico with 2,913 all-purpose yards, passing Willie Turrall (2,877). Wiggins had 1,833 yards rushing, 257 receiving, 663 on punt returns and 160 on KO returns in his career. He finished 14th all-time in rushing.
- Starting the last seven games of the season, sophomore **QB Casey Kelly (Portland, Ore.)** guided the Lobos to a 5-2 record. Kelly is the sixth quarterback - and the fifth starter - used by the Lobos since 1999.

- In Kelly's seven starts, UNM made 33 scoring drives (20 TDs, 13 FGs) that averaged 8.1 plays, 56 yards and 3:21 time of possession. Twelve of the marches were nine plays or longer. Eleven were 76 yards or more.
- The Lobos kept the ball an average of 9:05 in the fourth quarter compared to the opponents' 5:55.
- UNM has scored in 106 consecutive games, the 15th-longest active streak in the nation. The last team to blank the Lobos was BYU (35-0) on Nov. 7, 1992.
- New Mexico's pass completion percentage of 42.6% (141 of 331) ranked last nationally and is the lowest by a Lobo team in 28 years, since the 1973 team completed 41.8% (74-177).

- Sophomore **WR Dwight Counter (Lancaster, Calif.)** led UNM in receiving in all but one game in 2001. Counter paced the Lobos with 43 grabs for 774 yards, 18.0 yards per catch. That's the highest average since Terance Mathis' 18.01 in 1986 (955 yards on 53 receptions). Included in Counter's total was an 85-yard TD against Colorado State, the 5th-longest scoring pass in UNM history. The last 9 games, Counter had 37 receptions for 734 yards, an average of 19.8 yards a reception and 81.6 yards a game. His career numbers: 56 catches for 921 yards.
- The 350 yards rushing against New Mexico State are the most since UNM had 360 against UTEP in 1997.
- The Lobos were turnover-free against New Mexico State for the first time since Utah in 2000, a span of 15 games.
- UNM was 4-1 when it led at halftime. The lone loss came at Baylor. The Lobos led 7-3, but lost 16-13 in overtime.
- New Mexico set season highs in virtually every offensive category in the 52-33 win over Air Force: first downs (32), first downs passing (16), pass attempts (41), pass completions (tied with 20), passing yards (324), plays (98), total offense (620), punt return yardage (67), time of possession (39:33) and longest drive (16 plays).

LOBO DEFENSE NOTES

- The Lobos finished second in the MWC and 18th nationally in total defense, allowing just 310.8 yards a game. UNM ranked 50th after six games when the average was 352.2 yards a game. New Mexico has finished in the top-20 in total defense each of the past two seasons, a first for the program. UNM was 17th last year, yielding 309.4 yards.
- New Mexico gave up an average of 26.7 points a game the first seven games, but allowed just 56 points - 14 a game - the last four. UNM went 3-1 in those contests.

- UNM allowed 1,023 yards the last 4 games (255.8 yards a game) and 1,301 yards the last 5 games (260.2 yards).
- For the second straight season, UNM led the MWC in rushing defense. The Lobos ranked 5th nationally - best in school history - allowing just 87.4 yards. It's the first time since stats became official in 1946 that UNM has yielded less than 100 yards on the ground for an entire season. The previous low was 104.1 yards in 1982. Foes averaged 2.5 yards a carry in 2001. UNM gave up just 212 rushing yards - on 101 carries - in the second half of the last 7 games.
- The Lobo defense finished the season by limiting five straight opponents to less than 300 yards of total offense. UNM also did it in five straight in 2000 between the Wyoming and San Diego State games. Prior to last year, New Mexico had not pulled off that statistical feat since the 1964 season when it kept all 10 foes under 300 yards.
- Only three backs have eclipsed 100 yards rushing against UNM since the start of 2000, a span of 23 games: Oregon State's Ken Simonton (184) and UNLV's Jeremi Rudolph (106) in 2000 and Utah's Dameon Hunter (177) in 2001.
- Senior **LB Gary Davis (Greenwood, Miss.)** led UNM with 100 tackles. He finished 1st in the MWC in sacks (8) and tackles for loss (20), and 4th in tackles (9.1 a game).
- Senior **CB Stephen Persley (Fort Worth, Texas)** grabbed his 6th interception of the season - and 9th of his career - against New Mexico State. The nine picks ties for 10th all-time at UNM. Persley finished tied for 1st in the MWC with 17 passes defensed and 2nd with 6 interceptions. Persley scored four TDs in his career on two blocked punt returns, an interception and a fumble.
- Junior **CB David Crockett (Gardena, Calif.)** deflected 4 passes, including his second interception of the season, against New Mexico State. Crockett finished strong, recording 10 of his 11 pass deflections in the final three games.
- Redshirt freshman **LB Nick Speegle (Albuquerque)** finished fourth on the team with 56 tackles.
- The Lobos scored four defensive TDs in 2001: two interceptions (Stephen Persley and David Crockett) and two fumbles (Persley and Terrell Golden).

LOBO SPECIAL TEAMS NOTES

- Senior **K Vladimir Borombozin (Hollywood, Fla.)** had his school-record string of consecutive FGs made end at 16 when he missed a 25-yard attempt against Colorado State. It was his first miss since Nov. 4, 2000, when a 54-yard try was wide against San Diego State, and it turned out to be his only miss of the season. Borombozin connected on 17 of 18 FGs in 2001, and he led UNM with 82 points. Borombozin was a perfect 14-of-14 in 2001 before the errant boot.
- Borombozin, a semifinalist for the Lou Groza Award, ranks as the most accurate kicker in school history, making 27-of-33 attempts, or 81.8%. His 27 FGs are good for 4th place at UNM. Borombozin made 22 of his last 24 FGs.
- Lobo FG kickers finished 19-of-22 in 2001, the best accuracy in school history. True freshman walk-on **Wes Zunker (New Braunfels, Texas)**, who also handled kickoffs, attempted tries from beyond 42 yards. Zunker booted a 51-yarder against UTEP on the first attempt of his career and was true from 43 yards at Baylor. His only misses were from 46 yards at Utah and 54 yards against UNLV.
- Senior **Holmon Wiggins** returned 2 punt for 27 yards against New Mexico State, increasing his career numbers to 77 returns and 663 yards. Wiggins just missed the school records of 82 returns and 666 yards held by Chad Smith between 1994-97.
- UNM blocked its 4th punt of the season against New Mexico State when Tony Mazzoti redirected a boot that was recovered by Amos Wilson and returned 30 yards for a TD. Derrick Shepherd blocked two, while Stephen Persley had

one. That makes nine punt blocks the past two seasons for UNM.

- The Lobos scored two TDs on punt returns in 2001 and have four scores the past two seasons. Three of the TDs were the result of blocked punts. Holmon Wiggins ran one back 47 yards against Air Force this year while Amos Wilson took a block 30 yards against New Mexico State. Stephen Persley returned a pair of blocks into the endzone in 2000.
- The Lobos did not have a punt blocked during the 2001 season, and it's been 24 games since UNM has had one rejected. Air Force's Buck Hodgkinson was the last culprit in the 1999 season finale.

IN-SEASON HONORS

- Five Lobos captured seven weekly awards from the Mountain West Conference.
- Senior **RB Jarrod Baxter** was named MWC Offensive Player of the Week twice in 2001. The first honor came after the Lobos' 26-6 season-opening win over UTEP. Baxter rushed 25 times for a career-high 184 yards and 2 TDs. He posted a career-long run of 58 yards. In UNM's 53-0 victory over New Mexico State, Baxter gained 131 yards on 21 carries, plus 2 TDs, in just three quarters of play.
- Sophomore **S Terrell Golden** was named MWC Defensive Player of the Week after UNM's 16-13 overtime loss at Baylor. Golden recorded a career-high 13 tackles, including four for losses.
- Senior **LB Gary Davis** won MWC Defensive Player of the Week accolades twice. In the Lobos' 30-29 victory at Wyoming. Davis logged a then-career-best 13 tackles. He made four stops for losses, including 2.5 sacks. The second award followed a career-best 15 tackles - 10 solo - in the 27-17 triumph against UNLV. Davis recovered a fumble that UNM converted into a TD two plays later and shared in a tackle to stop the Rebels on 4th-and-inches as they were marching for the tying score.
- Senior **K Vladimir Borombozin** was named MWC Special Teams Player of the Week for his performance in the 20-15 victory at San Diego State. Borombozin booted a pair of 37-yard field goals, the final one coming with 2:06 remaining to secure the victory and extend his school record to 14 straight FGs made.
- Junior **LB Charles Moss** was named MWC Defensive Player of the Week following the Lobos' 53-0 shutout over New Mexico State. Moss collected a career-high 11 tackles, including two for losses, and a caused fumble.

TOO CLOSE FOR COMFORT

- Five of the Lobos' last nine losses have been by four points or less. UNM lost conference games last year to Colorado State (17-14), San Diego State (17-16) and UNLV (18-14). New Mexico lost a 16-13 overtime game to Baylor earlier this season and to BYU (24-20).

EXPANDED STADIUM A BIG HIT

- The 41-year old home of New Mexico football - University Stadium - received its most significant renovation since it was erected in 1960, and it proved to be a smashing success. A record crowd of 41,771 witnessed the Lobos' sea-

son-opening 26-6 victory over UTEP on Sept. 1, crushing the previous mark of 37,156 for Rice in 1997. UNM averaged a school-record 31,268 fans in 2001.

- While the expanded stadium has just 37,370 fixed seats, UNM was able to shoehorn nearly 4,000 more fans into the UTEP game by selling 1,000 bleacher tickets in the south end and standing-room-only spots.

- A pavilion now connects the east and west stands for the first time. Renovation on the northwest corner of the stadium was completed in October of 2000 and includes new concession stands, restrooms, novelty stands and landscaping. The next phase is to renovate the remaining three corners with new facilities.
- The highlight of the renovation is a \$1.8 million state-of-the-art videoboard at the north end of the stadium. Appropriately named LoboVision, the system has instant replay and live-action capabilities. It was financed through corporate sponsorships from PNM, Bank of the West, Isleta Casino & Resort, Albuquerque Publishing, Comcast, Creamland

Dairies and AT&T Wireless.

- Manufactured by Daktronics, Inc., the board measures 60 feet high and 61 feet wide. The videoboard is 21 x 28. A staff of 10, including three cameras, is needed to operate the system during a game. Personnel from UNM Media Technology Services handle all game-day production.

with nine sacks in the 26-6 victory over UTEP. Trailing 6-5, UNM grabbed momentum right before halftime as true freshman Wes Zunker connected on his first collegiate field-goal attempt, a 51-yard boot, to give New Mexico an 8-6 lead. The UNM defense held UTEP scoreless the rest of the game, limiting the Miners to a minus-53 yards rushing, the fourth-stingiest effort in school history. UNM gained 271 yards on the ground, 214 of those coming in the second half.

at Texas Tech (L, 42-30)

- Texas Tech used a 100-yard kickoff return in the third quarter to regain momentum and pull away for a 42-30 victory. Following a Lobo field goal that trimmed Tech's lead to 21-17, Ivory McCann fielded the ensuing kickoff eight yards deep in his own end zone. Going against all conventional wisdom, he raced virtually untouched into the end zone. Texas Tech added two more scores to grab an insurmountable 42-17 lead five minutes into the fourth quarter. The Lobos finished with two nice scoring drives. Jarrod Baxter had his second straight 100-yard rushing game, carrying 23 times for 106 yards. The last time UNM scored as many as 30 points and lost was in a 52-31 setback to SMU in 1996.

at Baylor (L, 16-13, OT)

- Unable to capitalize on several scoring chances, the Lobos fell to Baylor 16-13, in overtime when the Bears booted a 29-yard field goal on their first possession of the extra period. New Mexico scored only three points despite having the ball inside the Baylor 5-yard line on three occasions. UNM fumbled twice, the first error coming at the end of the first half with the Lobos leading 10-3 as QB Rudy Caamano mishandled the snap at the Bears' 4 on a first-and-goal. The final miscue came in overtime. UNM had a 4th-and-2 at the BU 3, but RB

Jarrold Baxter was stripped of the ball as he was heading into what appeared to be a wide open endzone. New Mexico had yet another drive stall in the first half when two penalties pushed it out of field-goal range. UNM had a first down at the Baylor 20 before the infractions. The Lobos tied the game at 13 with 1:40 left in regulation on Vladimir Borombozin's 21-yard field goal. New Mexico had a 2nd-and-goal at the BU 5, but had to settle for the three points. Caamano passed for a career-high 258 yards.

at Utah (L, 37-16)

- For the second straight week, the Lobos were unable to capitalize on scoring opportunities, then couldn't stop the Utah offense in the second as they fell, 37-16. New Mexico trailed 14-7 at halftime, but lost fumbles twice inside the Utah 20. It also was whistled for a dead-ball personal foul after a 27-yard pass play took UNM to the 10-yard line. The drive stalled and the Lobos missed a 46-yard field goal. Momentum switched in UNM's favor during the first part of the third period. After a Utah punt, the Lobos' first play of the second half was a 47-yard strike from Kelly to WR Dwight Counter to tie the game at 14. Later, Lobo LB Gary Davis sacked Rice in the end zone for a safety to hand UNM its first lead at 16-14. However, it was all Utah after that. The Utes took the lead on a 33-yard field goal late in the third quarter. After three straight incomplete passes by the Lobos, Adam Tate scored on a 46-yard run to give the Utes a 23-16 lead. Utah added two more scores in the final quarter against a tired Lobo defense that was on the field for more than 11 minutes in the third period.

at Wyoming (W, 30-29)

- The Lobos held on to beat the Cowboys 30-29, when Jarvis Wallum missed an extra point with 21 seconds remaining. UNM halted a five-game road skid and snapped a seven-game losing streak to UW in Laramie, winning there for the first time since 1992. UNM led 30-16 with 4:15 left in the game after CB David Crockett intercepted a Casey Bramlet pass and returned it 17 yards for a score. It was the second interception for a TD by UNM on the day. CB Stephen Persley snagged a deflected pass and returned it six yards in the first quarter. The Cowboys staged a dramatic comeback in the final minutes. Bramlet connected with Brock Ralph on a 66-yard strike to trim the Lobos' lead to 30-23 with 3:20 left. After UNM failed to pick up a first down, Wyoming took over at its own 27 with no timeouts and 1:29 left. Seven plays and 73 yards later, Malcolm Floyd caught a deflected pass in the end zone to bring UW within a point. Wallum's PAT attempt hit the right upright. The Lobos covered the onside kick and ran out the clock. Lobo QB Casey Kelly engineered a nice drive right before halftime. Making his first collegiate start, Kelly marched UNM 80 yards in 7 plays, capped by a 5-yard TD toss to TE Joe Fiola. Kelly was 4-of-4 passing for 71 yards on the drive that gave UNM a 17-6 lead at half.

BYU (L, 24-20)

- Brandon Doman completed a 15-yard touchdown pass to Andrew Ord with 3:33 left to hand the 17th-ranked Cougars a hard-fought 24-20 victory. The decisive score was set up when Doman converted a 4th-and-11 situation from the UNM

36. Doman ran for 14 yards on an option keeper. BYU played without standout running back Luke Staley, who was held out over concerns about his eligibility. The Lobos had two chances to regain the lead in the final minutes. One drive ended in an interception. The last try resulted in a failed attempt on fourth-and-13.

- UNM took a 7-3 lead midway through the second quarter on a textbook 14-play, 80-yard drive, capped by Jarrod Baxter's 1-year TD plunge. Buoyed by a 44-yard kickoff return, BYU regained the lead at 10-7 on a 28-yard wide receiver screen. The Lobos answered with another long drive - 13 plays, 76 yards - to tie the score at 10-10 at halftime. UNM had to settle for a 20-yard Vladimir Borombozin FG despite having 2nd-and-goal at the BYU 2.
- The Cougars started the fourth quarter with their own long drive that ended in a 27-yard scoring pass and a 17-13 lead.

Again, UNM countered. A 19-yard scoring toss from WR Derrick Shepherd to RB Javier Hanson on a double-reverse pass gave the Lobos a 20-17 edge with 6:09 left. The razzle-dazzle culminated an 11-play, 80-yard drive. Despite the relative low score, the lead changed hands seven times.

Air Force (W, 52-33)

- The University of New Mexico erupted for a season-high 620 yards and 32 first downs en route to a wild 52-33 homecoming victory at University Stadium. The game started on an ominous note for UNM when Air Force QB Keith Boyea kept the ball and raced 65 yards for a touchdown on the game's first play from scrimmage. After UNM mishandled a punt, the Falcons were in business again at the Lobo 14, but had to settle for a field goal and a 10-0 lead.
- The Lobos answered. QB Casey Kelly hit Joe Manning with a 15-yard TD pass. Kelly gave it right back on UNM's next possession, though, when Wes Crawley returned a mis-fired Kelly aerial 29 yards for a score to push the lead back to 17-7. The Kelly-Manning tandem connected again, this time from 35 yards as UNM trimmed the deficit to three. Another Air Force score and field goals by each team gave Air Force its fourth 10-point lead of the first half at 27-17. Kelly capped an 8-play, 80-yard drive by finding Dwight Counter on an 18-yard scoring pass with 6:54 left before half.
- UNM took its first lead of the game with 48 seconds left in the half when CB Stephen Persley scooped up an errant option pitch by Boyea and sprinted 25 yards to put the Lobos ahead 31-27. New Mexico's special teams joined in the scoring midway through the third quarter when Holmon Wiggins fielded a punt, broke several tackles and scampered 47 yards down the right sideline for a touchdown and a 38-27 lead. Boyea led the Falcons back, plunging into the endzone from a yard out to cut the lead to 38-33 early in the fourth.
- Air Force got no closer though, as the Lobos' dominating rushing attack put the game out of reach. Following Boyea's touchdown, New Mexico ground out 64 yards rushing on a season-high 16-play drive, covering 80 yards. RB Jarrod Baxter scored on a seven-yard run. Baxter added another touchdown and the Lobo defense intercepted Boyea twice

in the final eight minutes of the game to secure the victory. The staggering numbers in the fourth quarter: New Mexico held the ball for 13:46 and ran a mind-boggling 31 plays for 162 yards of offense. Air Force gained just seven yards on five snaps, covering 1:14 on the game clock. The Lobos had the ball for 22:35 of the second half.

San Diego State (W, 20-15)

- While not aesthetically pleasing, the Lobos made enough key plays on both sides of the ball to come away with a 20-15 victory at San Diego State. UNM has won three straight over the Aztecs at Qualcomm Stadium. The clincher came when Lobo DE Brian Johnson sacked Aztecs QB Lon Sherriff on a 4th-and-7 from the San Diego State 43. Lobo Scott Gerhardt also had a sack on SDSU's last drive.
- San Diego State only had to travel 29 yards for its first score following a short Lobo punt and 15-yard punt return. Sherriff found Gray McNeill on a 4-yard pass and a 7-0 first-quarter lead. The Lobos answered early in the second period when QB Casey Kelly hooked up with WR Dwight Counter on a 36-yard scoring pass. After Derrick Shepherd blocked a punt, UNM took over at the Aztecs 18. Unable to gain a first down, the Lobos had to settle for Vladimir Borombozin's 37-yard field goal and a 10-7 lead. SDSU tied the score at 10-10 on a 42-yard field goal.
- The Lobos found paydirt late in the second quarter when Kelly lofted a picture-perfect 61-yard TD pass to Joel Baker. UNM took a 17-10 lead into the lockerroom at halftime. The only scoring in the third period was a SDSU field goal to trim UNM's margin to 17-13. The Aztecs seemed to gain momentum down the stretch after dumping Kelly in the endzone. The safety made the score 17-15 UNM with 6:43 left.
- Arguably the biggest play of the game came next when the Aztecs' Donte Gamble fumbled the punt and Shannon Kincaid recovered at the SDSU 38 with 2:37 left in the game. The Lobos picked up one first down - on a 19-yard pass to Joe Manning - but again had to rely on the able foot of Borombozin. His 37-yard FG with 2:06 to go forced the Aztecs to score a touchdown of their final drive. UNM held the nation's leading rusher - Larry Ned - to 93 yards on 27 carries. He was averaging 146 yards a game.

UNLV (W, 27-17)

- The Lobo defense blanked UNLV for the final 2 1/2 quarters and forced two second half turnovers en route to a 27-17 victory. UNM erased a 17-14 halftime deficit, outscoring UNLV 10-0 in the second half as kicker Vladimir Borombozin connected on a pair of field goals and RB Jarrod Baxter scored on a 2-yard touchdown run.
- Down three points entering the third quarter, UNM's go-ahead touchdown was set up when LB Gary Davis recovered a fumbled snap by QB Kurt Nantkes. Following the turnover, Lobo QB Casey Kelly completed a 21-yard pass to RB Holmon Wiggins, setting up Baxter's touchdown to give the Lobos a 21-17 lead with 10:06 remaining in the third quarter. Davis and the Lobo defense shut down the Rebels' running game and allowed just 83 yards of total offense in the final two quarters. UNLV, which entered the game averaging 226.6 yards on the ground, was held to 107 yards, 40 of which came on a first-quarter TD run by Dominique Dorsey. Davis finished with a career-high 15 tackles and the fumble recov-

ery, while senior cornerback Stephen Persley intercepted his fifth pass of the season.

- Borombozin connected on a 31-yard field goal late in the third quarter and a 40-yarder with 2:01 left in the game to secure the Lobo victory. The Lobos took a 7-0 lead in the first quarter on a 21-yard run by WR Derrick Shepherd. After Dorsey's run, the Rebels took a 14-7 lead on a 26-yard scoring pass. Kelly capped a 10-play, 74-yard drive with a 1-yard sneak to tie the score at 14-14. UNLV took the lead at halftime on a 49-yard field goal.

Colorado State (L, 24-17)

- Needing a victory to secure a bowl berth, the Lobos came up on the short end against the Rams, losing 24-17 to snap a three-game winning streak. Casey Kelly was intercepted five times, including on the Lobos' final two possessions.
- Trailing 21-17 with 6:26 left in the fourth quarter, New Mexico forced Colorado State into a 4th-and-4 from the UNM 30-yard line. CSU opted to go for the first down and got it on a 5-yard gain. Five plays later, CSU connected on a 19-yard field goal to give the Rams a 24-17 lead with 2:53 remaining. Kelly drove the Lobos 46 yards on the ensuing possession before an interception. After a punt pinned New UNM on its own 5 with one minute remaining, Kelly drove the Lobos 59 yards before having his desperation pass snuffed.
- New Mexico's offense struggled to get on track in the first half as Colorado State built a 6-0 lead on a pair of field goals, marking the only time UNM was shutout in the first half since last year. On its first possession of the second half, CSU converted three third downs including a third-and-2 when Bradlee Van Pelt hit receiver Dallas Davis across the middle for a 39-yard TD pass. Van Pelt then caught the two-point conversion to give the Rams a 14-0 lead.
- The Lobos rebounded in a big way, scoring a pair of touchdowns in a little over a minute to knot the game at 14. Two plays after the CSU score, Kelly hit a wide open Dwight Counter down the right sideline for an 85-yard touchdown. UNM struck again on defense as senior LB Gary Davis jarred the ball loose from Van Pelt. Safety Terrell Golden scooped up the fumble and went 24 yards for the touchdown. After a 6-yard TD run put the Rams back ahead by seven with 4:01 left in the third quarter, New Mexico drove to the CSU 10. The Lobos were unable to convert on 3rd-and-8 and settled for a 24-yard Vladimir Borombozin field goal to cut the CSU lead to 21-17.
- New Mexico dominated the final statistics, outgaining the Rams 411-299, tallying a 24-17 advantage in first downs and finishing with a 32:40-27:20 edge in time of possession. However, CSU finished +4 in turnovers. New Mexico entered the red zone twice, but came away with only three points.
- The Rams started five of their first 11 drives inside UNM territory. Their scoring drives were 7 plays for 1 yard (FG), 4 plays for 11 yards (FG), 8 plays for 76 yards (TD), 2 plays for 22 yards (TD) and 10 plays for 69 yards (FG).

LOBOS IN OVERTIME

- The Lobos are 1-2 in overtime games, including a 16-13 setback this year at Baylor. UNM played two games in 1998, winning a 39-36 triple-OT thriller against Utah State and losing to San Diego State 36-33 in a single overtime.

BLOCK PARTY

- With four blocks this season (Stephen Persley against Texas Tech; Derrick Shepherd vs. Baylor/San Diego State, Tony Mazotti vs. New Mexico State), the Lobos have rejected nine since the start of the 2000 season.
- After having gone 21 straight games during most of 1998 and all of '99 without blocking a punt, the Lobos established a school record with five blocks in 2000, including one in three of the last five games. UNM rejected three in 1940, '48 and '79. The Lobos scored twice on the blocks in 2000 - both by Persley - against Oregon State and Air Force. Persley (Oregon State/Utah) blocked two while Dave Mauer (Texas Tech), Terrell Golden (Air Force) and Larry Davis (UNLV) had one.

SEASON TICKETS

- Lobo fans purchased 13,204 season tickets, the 2nd-highest total in school history. UNM sold 12,223 last year. It's the eighth straight year fans have purchased at least 10,000 season tickets. The single-season record is 14,254 in 1998.

GREAT JOB IN SCHOOL

- The UNM football team combined to post a 2.59 grade-point-average during the 2001 spring semester. That's the highest semester GPA by the Lobo gridgers since the school began charting grades in 1988. Two of the top-three semester GPAs have occurred under current head coach Rocky Long. The Lobos had a 2.52 GPA in the spring of 2000.

SUCCESSFUL WALK-ONS

- Some of the better-known Lobos began their careers as walk-ons, including three of the Lobos' 2001 five captains. Jarrod Baxter, Brian Johnson and Mohammed Konte all started at UNM without athletics scholarships.
- Baxter was a walk-on during the 1997 fall semester under former head coach Dennis Franchione. He was placed on scholarship in January of 1998. Johnson was a 195-pound walk-on running back when he came to Albuquerque in the fall of '97. He impressed Rocky Long and his staff so much during '98 spring drills that he received a scholarship that fall. Konte, also a redshirt in '97, paid his own way for three years before being placed on aid in the fall of 2000.
- Newcomers to the walk-on-to-scholarship saga include senior WR Joel Baker, sophomore S Terrell Golden, sophomore QB Casey Kelly, senior FB Sulayman Konte, sophomore S Justin Millea, junior NT Adrian Terry and sophomore WR Terrence Thomas.

CLINIC HELPS UNDERPRIVILEGED KIDS

- The eighth annual UNM Women's Football Clinic was held on August 2, with nearly 150 football-hungry females attending. Consequently, over 500 Albuquerque area children were able to see a Lobo game as part of the UNM Send-A-Kid Program, which provides tickets for underprivileged and disadvantaged youth. Since the program was founded in 1994, over 7,000 children have been able to see a game.

ROCKY LONG SAYS

- (recapping 2001) -- "I don't think our quarterback play was as good as anticipated in the early part of the season. After the quarterback change, our offense got a little bit better each week. I didn't think our pass coverage was as good as I hoped it would be early in the season. We played a lot more running teams at the end, but I thought we made more plays in coverage. We knocked more passes away and we covered better. Our run defense was real good all year."

"The best part of our team this season that was a concern going into the year was the kicking game. When the kicking is not a problem, nobody mentions it. But as soon as it becomes a problem, it's a huge deal. Vladi (Borombozin) had a great year, but our coverage and protection teams were pretty good, too."

"Our (2001) seniors did a great job of leadership with personally having some big-time problems footballwise. It had to be a very disappointing year for Brian (Johnson) because of his knee. Mohammed (Konte) played with (a groin) injury most people didn't know about, and he didn't play as well at the end of the year."

- (on 2002) -- "We're going to be a pretty young football team. This (2001) senior class did a good job of demanding that the other guys do what they're supposed to do. It will be interesting to see how we do in the offseason and in the summer because it's a whole new group of

guys that have to demand that the other guys do what they're supposed to do.

"We lost some solid linemen, but the offensive line should be better. The tight ends will be better. The receivers will be better, and the quarterback will be better."

"I don't know who the fullback will be; I don't know who the tailback will be. We have some good young players, but it's not like putting seniors out there who have played a lot of football."

"The kicking game is a big question mark going into the offseason. We don't know who our kicker will be and we don't know who our punter will be for sure. We lost our return guys, too. A lot of the coverage teams and return teams will be back, though."

- (on recruiting) -- "We would like to take one defensive lineman, two linebackers, one safety and one corner from junior college. We're looking for one to replace (Gary) Davis. On offense, we are not going to take a junior college player unless we think he can start for us."

2002 SPRING BALL EARLY...AGAIN

- The Lobos are slated to begin spring practice on Monday, Feb. 11, 2002, and conclude on Thursday, March 7. The team will have 15 practices every Monday, Tuesday, Thursday and Friday between those dates.
- UNM started on Feb. 12 a year ago, which was believed to be the earliest start for an NCAA Div. I-A football team in 2001.
