Cougars Return Home For Weekend Slate

PROVO, Utah (Oct. 2, 2007) – After playing 10 of its first 14 matches on the road, the No. 23 BYU women's volleyball team will return home this weekend for a pair of Mountain West Conference matches. The Cougars, 10-4 overall and 3-2 in the MWC, will face TCU on Friday at 7 p.m. before taking on New Mexico Saturday at 8 p.m. in the Smith Fieldhouse.

"This is another important weekend of volleyball for us in the hunt for the Mountain West Conference title," said BYU head coach Jason Watson. "TCU and New Mexico have both done well in the preseason. We're excited to be playing in the Smith Fieldhouse again and hope our fans will come out and support us."

Playing on Elaine Michaelis Court will be a welcome change for the Cougars this weekend as their 10 road matches is the most through the end of September since 1997. The Cougars have gone 3-1 in the Smith Fieldhouse this season and are averaging 1,708 fans, 17th in the nation, including the fourth-largest crowd in BYU women's volleyball history with 3,880 fans against No. 10 Wisconsin in the Cougars' home opener.

BYU swept through the weekend last week with two road wins at Wyoming (30-28, 31-29, 30-21) and at Air Force (30-17, 30-21, 30-27), the Cougars' first league sweeps of the year. Cougar middle blocker Rachel Dyer had a solid weekend as she averaged 4.00 kills per game on .564 hitting while adding 1.67 blocks per contest. On the year, Dyer ranks fifth in the nation and leads the MWC hitting .451 while ranking eighth in the league in blocks at 1.15. She has posted double-digit kills in 11 of 14 matches, including the last five.

The Horned Frogs are 15-4 overall this season and 2-2 in conference play after losing to New Mexico last week. TCU is led by sophomore middle blocker Kourtney Edwards with 3.51 kills per game followed closely by sophomore outside hitter Lauren Otto at 3.33 kpg and senior outside hitter LeMeita Smith at 3.21 kpg.

The Lobos are off to one of their best starts in program history at 12-4 overall and 3-1 in the league. Their 12 total victories is the second-highest total by a Lobo team since the formation of the MWC in 1999, and their three league victories already puts them halfway to matching the most MWC wins by a Lobo volleyball team (6 in 2005). Junior outside hitter Jeanne Fairchild paces New Mexico and the conference with 4.68 kills per game, 36th in the nation, while ranking second in the MWC in points (5.16).

TCU IN 2007

The Horned Frogs are 15-4 overall this season and 2-2 in Mountain West Conference play after losing to New Mexico last week. TCU is led by sophomore middle blocker Kourtney Edwards with 3.51 kills per game followed closely by sophomore outside hitter Lauren Otto at 3.33 kpg and senior outside hitter LeMeita Smith at 3.21 kpg. Edwards also ranks fourth in the conference hitting .404 and averages a team-best 1.26 blocks per game, fifth in the MWC. Junior setter Nirelle Hampton puts up 11.21 assists per contest while posting 0.43 aces per game, second in the conference. Senior libero Calli Corley is third in the MWC with 4.83 digs per game. As a team, the Horned Frogs outperform their opponents in kills (15.47-13.79), hitting percentage (.265-.172), assists (14.13-12.56), digs (17.53-15.69) and blocks (2.42-1.63).

LAST OUTING

ALBUQUERQUE, N.M. (Sept. 28, 2007) - The TCU Horned Frogs dropped a hard-fought match to New Mexico, 3-0 (25-30, 27-30, 30-32) Friday night, falling to 2-2 in league play. Irene Hester tallied 13 kills to establish a new career high.

The Frogs and the Lobos battled through a tight game in the first set. New Mexico gained the early advantage with a 5-1 run to open up an 11-6 lead. TCU pulled within three at 14-11 on an Irene Hester blast down the middle, but a Frog error killed the Frog momentum. TCU crept back within four, 24-20 on another kill from Hester, but the Lobos weathered the storm and came away with the 30-25 game one victory.

The Frogs let game two slip away as they squandered a big early lead. With the Lobos leading 4-3, the Frogs went on a 7-0 run behind the serving of Nirelle Hampton. Out of the TV timeout, the momentum shifted to the Lobos as they went on a 7-1 run to take an 18-16 lead. The Frogs couldn't recover and New Mexico took the 30-27 game two win.

In game three, the Frogs again stormed out to an early lead only to see the Lobos claw back into the match, eventually tying it at 15. From there the Lobos continued to build their lead, pushing it to 20-16. TCU staved off match point, winning a long rally on an Edwards blast. After a service error, the Frogs again held off the Lobos with a Smith kill. New Mexico gained the upper hand again on a kill from Kerri Beck and sealed the victory on a Frog miscue, winning 32-30.

The Frogs were led by Smith and Hester with 13 kills. Edwards pitched in with 11. Loren Barry led the defensive charge with 14 digs, while Calli Corley tallied 11.

NEW MEXICO IN 2007

The Lobos are off to one of their best starts in program history at 12-4 overall and 3-1 in the Mountain West Conference. Their 12 total victories is the second-highest total by a Lobo team since the formation of the MWC in 1999, and their three league victories already puts them halfway to matching the most MWC wins by a Lobo volleyball team (6 in 2005). Junior outside hitter Jeanne Fairchild paces New Mexico and the conference with 4.68 kills per game, 36th in the nation, while ranking second in the MWC in points (5.16). Junior libero Gayle Tripp is fourth in the league with 4.46 digs per game, helping the Lobos rank second in that category. Freshman outside hitter Lisa Meeter is second on the team in both kills at 3.10 and digs at 3.14 and paces the MWC in aces with 0.44 per game. As a team, the Lobos outperform their opponents in every statistical category.

LAST OUTING

ALBUQUERQUE, N.M. (Sept. 28, 2007) - The University of New Mexico volleyball team made things interesting as the Lobos beat TCU, 30-25, 30-27, 32-30. The Lobos took charge quickly in game one, leading the Horned Frogs from the 5-4 point on. Freshman Lisa Meeter held serve to get the Lobos their biggest lead of the game at 21-15 and made a big kill at 27-21 to keep the six-point advantage.

Nirelle Hampton held serve to build a 10-4 lead for TCU in game two. The Lobos chipped away at the lead, finally taking over at 17-16 on the serving of Gayle Tripp. UNM gradually pulled out to a 26-21 lead on a service ace by Meeter. Jeanne Fairchild got the Lobos to 29-24 on a big kill, but TCU went down with a fight getting the Lobos to make mistakes, 29-27. Fairchild came up with the game-winner to stop the TCU charge.

Game three saw the teams battle back and forth to 15-15, when UNM took the lead, stretching out to 24-20. TCU battled back again, taking the lead 26-25 on a kill by Kourtney Edwards. The teams tied three more times at 28, 29, and 30. A kill by Kerri Beck for the Lobos and a TCU attack error got the Lobos the 32-30 win.

Fairchild, battling through a foot injury, played just the front row for the first time all season and still recorded 12 kills and two blocks. Michaelsen played setter the whole match and recorded a career-high 41 assists to go along with career-highs in kills (7) and digs (8). Meeter recorded her tenth double-double of the season with a team-leading 14 kills and 11 digs. Freshman Kelsi Phillips led the team in digs with 16, a new career-high.

Weekly Notes:**Week #6 In Review**

BYU swept through the weekend last week with two road wins at Wyoming (30-28, 31-29, 30-21) and at Air Force (30-17, 30-21, 30-27), the Cougars' first Mountain West Conference sweeps of the year. Erica Lott led the way for BYU against the Cowgirls with 13 kills on .423 hitting while Chelsea Goodman (12) and Rachel Dyer (11) weren't far behind. Several new faces saw action at Air Force as seniors Jenna Judkins and Catherine Parker and true freshman Christina Measom saw significant playing time. Measom posted a career-high six kills on 10 swings in two games against the Falcons while Goodman tallied a team-best 17 kills.

BYU Top Performer of the Week - Rachel Dyer

Cougar middle blocker Rachel Dyer averaged 4.00 kills per game on .564 hitting while adding 1.50 digs and 1.67 blocks per contest last week in BYU's two road sweeps. She posted 11 kills with no errors at Wyoming to hit .579 while tallying a team-best seven blocks. The next night, she also recorded double-digit kills with 13 at Air Force on .550 hitting to go along with a career-best seven digs and three blocks. On the year, Dyer ranks fifth in the nation and leads the MWC hitting .451 while ranking eighth in the league in blocks at 1.15 per game. She has posted double-digit kills in 11 of 14 matches, including the last five.

Block Party

The BYU block has come alive in the last two weeks as the Cougars posted a season-high 17.0 rejections at Weber State on Sept. 18 and then surpassed that mark with 17.5 against Colorado State on Sept. 22 before posting 20 blocks in six games last weekend. With the recent four-match block party, the BYU has increased its season block average from 2.42 per game to 2.71. Rachel Dyer led the way against the Wildcats with 11 blocks, marking the first time this season a Cougar has posted double-digit blocks. Ashton Hansen then followed suit with a career-high 13 blocks against the Rams.

On The Road Again

BYU has played 10 of 14 matches on the road so far this season. The Cougars began the season with two matches at the Hawkeye Challenge hosted by Iowa before hosting the BYU Molten Classic. BYU then played three matches at the Stanford Invitational and at UNLV, San Diego State and Weber State before facing Colorado State at home. BYU then hit the road again last weekend with matches at Wyoming and at Air Force. The Cougars have not begun the season with so many matches away from home before the end of September since playing 10 of their first 14 on the road in 1997.

Comeback Kids

BYU has played five five-game matches this season, going 4-1 in those matches. Prior to losing 32-34, 31-33, 31-29, 30-22, 9-15 to Colorado State in their last five-game match, the Cougars had won four straight matches when forcing a fifth game after being down including at Weber State (down 1-2), at San Diego State (down 0-2) and at Iowa (down 0-2) this season and against UC Santa Barbara (down 0-2) in the 2006 NCAA Tournament first round. BYU is now 14-3 in five-game matches under head coach Jason Watson.

Double the Fun

With 43 career double-doubles to date, Chelsea Goodman is currently in second place on the MWC's all-time double-double list behind Wyoming's Michele Rauter (47; 2000-03), passing SDSU's Aspen McPartland (39; 2000-03). Goodman has recorded nine double-doubles already this season after posting an MWC-leading 18 double-doubles last year out of 29 matches in which she played. BYU's Erica Lott also appears on the active list with 21 double-doubles in her Cougar career, including four so far in 2007.

Home Sweet Home

The Cougars have gone 3-1 in the Smith Fieldhouse this season and are averaging 1,708 fans, 17th in the nation, including the fourth-largest crowd in BYU women's volleyball history with 3,880 fans against No. 10 Wisconsin in the Cougars' home opener. BYU went 12-1 in the Smith Fieldhouse last year and set a new program attendance record with an average of 1,902 fans, 13th in the nation. The Cougars are now 463-83 (.848) all-time at home and 25-2 on Elaine Michaelis Court over the last three years.

BYU In the Polls

The Cougars are ranked No. 23 in this week's AVCA poll after beginning the season No. 17 and being ranked as high as No. 9, their highest ranking since 1999. BYU has a rich history of rankings in the AVCA Top 25 Poll. Among NCAA Division I programs entering the 2007 season, the Cougars are 10th all-time in total number of weeks ranked (279) and 11th in weeks ranked in the top 10 (122) and weeks ranked No. 1 (4). The Cougars have also traditionally finished strong, coming in 10th all-time in both weeks ranked in the final poll (20) and weeks ranked in the top five to end the year (3) and tied for sixth in weeks ranked No. 1 in the final poll (1).

Rivals in the Rankings

Four Cougar opponents also appear in this week's rankings. Wisconsin, whom the Cougars defeated in the Molten Classic, is ranked No. 9 while Stanford comes in at No. 2 and Cal Poly is No. 24 this week (both teams beat BYU in the Stanford Invitational). MWC rival Colorado State is ranked No. 25 while UNLV is receiving votes and listed 33rd.

Vs. Ranked Opponents

BYU is now 1-2 this season against ranked opponents with a win over No. 10 Wisconsin on Aug. 31 and losses against No. 17 Cal Poly and at No. 2 Stanford at the Stanford Invitational. The Cougars were 1-3 in 2006 vs. ranked teams with the lone win coming against then-No. 4 Stanford.

BYU Reaches 1,000-Victory Mark

The BYU women's volleyball team celebrated a significant milestone on Sept. 15 as the Cougars became just the fourth program in NCAA volleyball history to record 1,000 wins. BYU's landmark 1,000th victory, which came at San Diego State, puts the Cougars in elite company with UCLA, Nebraska and Missouri State as the only programs to reach the 1,000-win mark. In the world of collegiate volleyball, few schools have a volleyball tradition as successful and rich as the history of the sport at BYU, whose all-time record now stands at 1,003-278-5 (.782). In the 38 seasons of its recorded history prior to this year, the Cougars have only suffered one losing season and have won 20 or more matches in 31 of the past 33 seasons.

The Nation's Best ...

The Cougars' 1,003-278-5 all-time record makes them one of the best teams in the nation, ranking fourth in all-time wins through Sunday's matches. UCLA tops the list with 1,050 victories while Missouri State ranks second at 1,019 and Nebraska is third at 1,011. The Cornhuskers passed up the Cougars at the end of 2006 with their six-match run to the NCAA Tournament title. The top 10 is rounded out by Long Beach St. (983), Penn State (954), Hawai'i (946), Texas (918), Minnesota (910) and Texas-Arlington (905).

Team Captains

The BYU women's volleyball team has selected two captains for its 2007 season in seniors Chelsea Goodman and Annie Pinegar. Goodman also served as a co-captain last year with Lindsay Hartsock.

Sister Act

Sweep Goes to Cougars

The No. 23 BYU women's volleyball team recorded its first sweep of Mountain West Conference play Friday night with a 30-28, 31-29, 30-21 win at Wyoming to improve to 9-4 overall and 2-2 in league action.

"This was an impressive road win for us," said BYU head coach Jason Watson. "I thought we got better as the match went on, which is always the goal for us."

Lott gave BYU its first lead of the match with one of her seven game-one kills to make it 6-5, which soon became 14-11. Wyoming scored three straight to tie the game at 14-14, but neither team would string together consecutive points again until the 24th and 25th tallies recorded by the Cougars, giving them a 25-22 lead. The Cowgirls pushed back to get within one at 27-26, but BYU picked up its play to record its first game-one victory since taking the first frame at No. 2 Stanford.

Wyoming gave the Cougars all they could handle in game two, going up early and running up to a 23-17 lead. However, just when it looked like Wyoming would run away with the win, BYU stormed back, going on an 8-2 run featuring three more rejections to tie the game at 25-25. A block from Goodman gave BYU a 28-27 lead, which soon turned into game point at 29-28. Lauren Scott staved off the Cougars with a kill down the middle, but Goodman again came up big with a kill down the line to give BYU another game-point opportunity. Erica Lott made quick work of the opportunity with another rejection, one of six Cougar blocks in the game.

BYU kept the momentum in its favor to start game three, building a 6-1 lead thanks in part to two more blocks and two kills from Dyer. Wyoming responded to cut the lead to one at 7-6, but the Cougars found another gear with four straight points to once again push the lead to five at 11-6. From there, it was all BYU as the Cougars put together a 7-0 run and led by as many as 12 points to record the win.

Solid Team Effort Leads to Victory

In an all-around effort including some fresh faces, the No. 23 BYU women's volleyball team clipped the Air Force Falcons' wings Saturday night with its sixth sweep of the year, 30-17, 30-21, 30-27.

"This was a good conclusion to an important weekend for us," said BYU head coach Jason Watson. "It enables us to return home next weekend and continue our hunt for the MWC Championship."

Air Force came out strong in game one to build a 7-5 lead, but the Cougars quickly took control with a 9-1 run that started with a kill and an ace from Goodman. The 14-8 BYU lead proved insurmountable as the Cougars sprinted to the 30-17 game-one victory. Goodman and Hansen each recorded five kills in the game while contributing to a .333 team hitting percentage. BYU also posted four team blocks in holding Air Force to a -.026 attack efficiency.

Watson called true freshman Christina Measom's name in game two, and she quickly made the most of the opportunity with back-to-back kills early. But the Falcons fought with the fire expected from future servicewomen and stayed with the Cougars every step of the way through the first third of the game. BYU was finally able to build a 13-11 lead after a 5-1 run, giving the Cougars the space they needed to keep the Falcons at bay. BYU rode the slim margin as the two teams traded points until closing out the game with a 12-5 run.

With the smell of victory strong, the Cougars came out firing in game three, running up an early 7-1 lead thanks in part to four kills from Goodman. But Air Force once again stormed back, earning a chance to tie things up at 18-17 after an 8-3 spurt. However, Measom continued to shine, sending a rocket straight down the middle of the court to thwart the Falcon comeback. The Falcons made another late run after trailing 26-20, but the Cougars hung on for the 30-27 win.

BYU is a member of the Mountain West Conference. The Cougars began 2007 with an 88-28 regular-season record in eight years of MWC play after finishing second in 2006 with a 13-3 mark.

BYU won the inaugural regular season title in 1999 with a 13-1 record and won again in 2005 with a 14-2 mark. BYU appeared in the MWC Tournament title match in each of the first two seasons, winning the title over Colorado State in Fort Collins in 2000 after losing the 1999 title to the Rams in Provo. Utah won the 2001 and 2002 crowns, in Provo and Fort Collins, respectively while Colorado State captured the 2003 title in San Diego and the 2004 crown on its home court. Utah won the 2005 title, and Colorado State took home the crown in 2006, both in Las Vegas.

Six of the nine MWC programs have competed in postseason action in the seven years since the league was formed. In 2006, three MWC teams earned NCAA bids, including BYU (at-large), Colorado State (automatic) and Utah (at-large). Since the MWC was founded in 1999, BYU, Colorado State and Utah have represented the conference in the NCAA Tournament each season. Overall, BYU has made 23 NCAA appearances, followed by Colorado State with 18, SDSU with 13, Utah with nine, New Mexico with seven and Wyoming with four.

So far in 2007, BYU is the only MWC team currently ranked in the AVCA Top 25 Coaches Poll, coming in at No. 12. Utah began the season ranked but is now receiving votes along with Colorado State

BYU has a winning record over every MWC team with an overall conference winning percentage of .812.

JASON WATSON

HEAD WOMEN'S VOLLEYBALL COACH

Jason Watson was named the head coach of BYU's women's volleyball program on Feb. 17, 2005 after serving for three years as an assistant with the team.

In his two seasons at the helm, he has compiled a 50-10 (.833) overall record while leading the Cougars to back-to-back NCAA Tournament appearances and a return to the national rankings. He was named the Mountain West Conference Coach of the Year in 2005 after posting a 25-4 record in his first season as a head coach and leading the Cougars to their first MWC regular-season title since 1999.

Prior to his head-coaching debut, Watson had 11 years of collegiate coaching experience as an assistant at four universities, including two seasons with the BYU men's volleyball program and three with BYU's women's program. After an All-American playing career at BYU, Watson coached two seasons under former U.S. Olympic coach and two-time NCAA Coach of the Year Carl McGown with the Cougars' men's squad in 1995-96. He returned to BYU in 2002 as an assistant head coach for the women's team under Karen Lamb.

Watson also served as the associate head coach at Kansas State in 2001 and as an assistant coach in 2000, where he helped guide the Wildcats to two consecutive NCAA Tournament berths.

Before that, Watson spent two years at Arkansas State during which the Lady Indians won consecutive Sun Belt Conference titles. Watson began his women's volleyball coaching career with a two-year stint at Montana State, helping the Bobcats to their best record in almost 15 years.

Overall, Watson has directed or assisted in taking teams to the NCAA Tournament in six of the last eight seasons. In addition to his 50-10 (.833) head-coaching record, Watson's team's compiled a 185-97 (.656) record in his nine years as an NCAA women's volleyball assistant coach. Watson is only the fourth head coach in BYU women's volleyball history, joining JoAnn Calderwood (1956-61), Hall of Fame coach Elaine Michaelis (1962-2001) and Lamb (2002-04).

COACHING CAREER

Watson was honored as the 2005 MWC Coach of the Year in his first season as a head coach, becoming the first BYU women's volleyball head coach to win a league coaching award since Elaine Michaelis won Western Athletic Conference Mountain Division honors in 1997. Under Watson, the Cougars won the league regular-season title for the first time since 1999. BYU's 25-4 overall record in Watson's first year was its best since 1998, and the Cougars' 20-0 start to the season was the second-best in school history. The winning trend continued in 2006 with a 25-6 overall record and a second-round NCAA Tournament appearance. The Cougars finished the year ranked No. 20 in the nation, their first final national ranking since 2001.

Watson's Cougars were ranked as high as No. 12 in the nation during the 2005 season, finishing listed No. 26, and were invited to their 22nd NCAA Tournament. The MWC regular-season champions led the league and were 17th in the nation in hitting percentage (.274) as well as pacing the conference in kills with 16.09 per game.

In Watson's offense, three-time All-MWC setter Lauren Richards Evans finished 19th in the nation and third all-time at BYU with 13.12 assists per game while middle blocker and MWC Player of the Year Lindsay Hartssock was second in the nation in hitting percentage with a .444 mark. Both received AVCA All-America Honorable Mention recognition.



In his three years as an assistant at BYU in charge of the Cougar defense, Watson quickly established BYU as a top defensive squad. The Cougars led the MWC and were 13th and fifth in the nation in blocks per game in 2003 and 2004, respectively. BYU also led the MWC in digs in 2003 with 1,729, the most the Cougars had put up since 1997. Hartssock was named the 2004 Blocker of the Year by Collegiate Volleyball Update and finished second in the nation averaging 1.86 blocks per game in 2004 while libero Uila Crabbe set BYU and MWC single-season records in digs with 435 in 2003 under Watson's direction.

At Kansas State, Watson helped the Wildcats earn back-to-back top-three finishes in the Big 12 Conference and consecutive trips to the NCAA Tournament while achieving a 42-17 (.712) overall record and 29-11 (.725) mark in the Big 12. Coaching the setters and coordinating the offense, Watson established a powerful attack that produced several team and individual records.

Also in 2001, with Watson serving as associate head coach, KSU broke the school record for conference wins with a 15-5 mark and swept the season series with a school-best six league opponents. Two players earned All-Big 12 honors and one honorable-mention All-America recognition as school records were broken for kills, total attacks and 20-kill matches. KSU also earned the right to host the NCAA first and second rounds for the first time since the field was expanded to 64 teams and for only the second time in the school's history. In 2000, Watson helped guide an offense that set the school record with 2,024 kills and totaled 1,828 assists (No. 2 in school history at the time), 4,864 total attacks (No. 3 in school history) and a .245 team hitting percentage (No. 4 in school history). Under Watson's tutelage, setter Disney Bronnenberg finished second nationally in assists, averaging 15.01 assists per game.

Prior to his time at KSU, Watson helped Arkansas State advance to the NCAA Tournament in 1999 after winning consecutive Sun Belt Conference regular-season titles in 1998 and 1999. He helped the Lady Indians post a 51-18 (.739) record and coached a number of all-league performers, including Sun Belt Freshman of the Year Jessica Barney, who led the league in assists with 1,457 in 1999. Watson was responsible for the team's offensive schemes and setter training while coordinating the program's recruiting efforts. Watson spent two seasons as an assistant at Montana State, helping the Bobcats to a 35-24 (.593) record. In 1997, the Bobcats finished 19-12, the program's best mark since 1983. In 1996, the team went 16-12 and made its first-ever Big Sky Conference Tournament appearance.

PLAYING CAREER

As a player, Watson was a four-year starter and two-time captain from 1990-94 as the BYU men's program grew from its infancy to a national power. After a 2-25 season in the program's second year as an NCAA sport, the Cougars achieved a 21-6 record and No. 2 national ranking in Watson's senior season in 1994. Watson is still BYU's all-time assist leader with 4,649 and single-game assist record holder with 128 against Hawai'i on March 27, 1993. He was named a second-team American Volleyball Coaches Association All-American, Volleyball Magazine honorable-mention All-American and a member of the Mountain Pacific Sports Federation Third Team in 1994. He was a member of the Australian Men's National Team from 1990-91 and a member of the Junior National Team from 1987-90.

PERSONAL

A physical education and sports business management graduate of BYU in 1995, Watson is a native of Homebush, Australia. He and his wife, Larissa, have two sons and one daughter.

2006 SEASON REVIEW

The No. 20 BYU women's volleyball team continued its tradition of excellence in 2006 with a 25-6 overall record and a second round NCAA Tournament appearance.

"I'm pleased with the progress we made this year," said BYU head coach Jason Watson, whose teams have gone 50-10 in his two years at the helm. "The season we were able to put together this year was representative of the direction we want the program to go. We feel like we have work to do, but we are going to get better."

The Cougars finished in second place in the Mountain West Conference with a 13-3 league record and spent the season ranked in the AVCA Top 25 Poll, ending the year at No. 20 after making their 23rd NCAA Tournament appearance in the 26-year history of the Championship. The Smith Fieldhouse once again proved to be a dominant homecourt advantage as BYU went 12-1 on Elaine Michaelis Court during 2006 while setting a program attendance record with an average crowd of 1,902.

Injuries plagued the Cougars throughout the year as the team played 13 matches without the services of all of their starters. Sophomore setter Amy Schlauder sat out eight matches with a broken finger while junior rightside hitter Erica Lott missed two contests and sophomore middle blocker Rachel Dyer was unavailable on five occasions due to injury. However, despite going more than a month without their full starting rotation, the Cougars rallied around their teammates as several players stepped up and made the most of their playing opportunities, ensuring continued success.

BYU began the year taking consecutive tournament titles with three sweeps at the UCF Fall Invitational followed by a win over then-No. 4 Stanford, the eventual national runner-up, in Provo the next weekend in front of a record crowd of 4,050 while earning the BYU Molten Classic crown. The Cougars then took their 6-0 record on the road to the Jayhawk Invitational where they suffered their first defeat of the season against host Kansas after Schlauder broke her finger in the first game. But BYU bounced back the next day to beat Arkansas behind the play of back-up setter Jenna Judkins, who paced the Cougars to a 7-1 record in Schlauder's absence while leading the MWC in assists during her stint at the net.

After going 8-1 prior to starting league play, BYU won its first four conference matches, including its first home win over Colorado State since 2000. Without the services of Schlauder or Lott, however, the Cougars then suffered their only home loss of the year to in-state rival Utah in front of another record-breaking crowd of 4,455. But the loss was quickly forgotten with a seven-match winning streak, including four sweeps, that saw the Cougars improve to 19-2 overall and rise as high as No. 16 in the nation.

Unfortunately, BYU's winning streak came to an end when the Cougars suffered their only back-to-back defeats of the year at then-No. 9 Utah and at New Mexico. But BYU rebounded with five straight wins to end the regular season. As part of the run, the Cougars beat the Rams in Fort Collins, Colo., to complete the season sweep of CSU for the first time since 1995.

Postseason play did not begin as the Cougars hoped with an early exit from the MWC Tournament in Las Vegas, but the time off prepared BYU for a tough first round NCAA Tournament matchup against UC Santa Barbara in Los Angeles. The Cougars completed an incredible comeback from two games down to earn the five-game win behind the strength of Annie Kemp Pinegar's record-setting 42 digs, breaking the 22-year-old BYU mark. However, BYU could overcome host USC the following night, falling to the No. 6 Trojans to end the season with a 25-6 record.

In addition to being ranked No. 20 in the nation as a team to end the year, the Cougars finished 16th nationally in hitting percentage (.269), 24th in win/loss percentage (.806) and 33rd in blocks per game (2.96). Several individuals also excelled as Cougars led the MWC in four of the seven statistical categories tracked by the league including hitting percentage (Lindsay Hartsock), kills (Chelsea Goodman), assists (Schlauder) and points (Goodman). Hartsock ranked 17th nationally in hitting with a .389 mark while Schlauder ranked 24th in assists per game at 13.15 and Goodman was 43rd in the nation with 4.49 kills per game.
