### Important Week For BYU Volleyball

PROVO, Utah (Oct. 8, 2007) – A pair of in-state rivals are on the slate next for the BYU women's volleyball team as the Cougars play host to Utah Valley on Tuesday night in the Smith Fieldhouse before traveling to Salt Lake City to face Utah on Friday night. At 11-5 overall and 4-3, BYU is looking to get on a run in the month of October.

"This is another important week for us," said BYU head coach Jason Watson. "We're excited to get back on the court Tuesday to play Utah Valley at home, and, of course, Utah is always a tough opponent, especially at Crimson Court. How we respond in these two matches is very important."

Senior outside hitter Chelsea Goodman has continued to step up for the Cougars, ranking among the top 10 in the Mountain West Conference in kills, digs, aces and points. The preseason MWC Player of the Year is just two double-doubles away from tying the league career double-double record at 47. Junior middle blocker Rachel Dyer has also been solid for BYU as she leads the MWC and ranks fifth in the nation in hitting at .452. The Cougars are capable of coming up big over the next several weeks as BYU has traditionally played its best in October, going 17-2 (.895) all-time in the month in just over two years under Watson.

BYU will begin the week with a 7 p.m. contest against Utah Valley on Tuesday night. The Wolverines are 12-5 overall this season and have won seven straight matches, one shy of the school record. Utah Valley features a one-two punch with junior outside hitter Camie Manwill averaging 4.36 kills per game and senior middle blocker Jessica Endres tallying 4.32 kpg. BYU is 5-0 all-time against the Wolverines.

An important MWC matchup is on tap for Friday night as the Cougars face Utah on Crimson Court at 7 p.m. The Utes are 7-9 overall this season and tied with BYU for fourth place in the league at 4-3 after losing the 2006 MWC Setter of the Year and Player of the Year as well as the nation's top middle blocker during the offseason. Junior outside hitter Kathryn Haynie leads the team with 3.61 kills per game while adding 2.17 digs per contest. BYU leads the all-time series, 62-21, but has not defeated Utah in Salt Lake City since 2000.

The Cougars' match against Utah Valley will be televised live on BYUTV and can also be followed via BYU All-Access or GameTracker. All-Access and GameTracker will also be available for the Utah match in addition to a live Internet audio stream on BYU Radio.

### UTAH VALLEY IN 2007

The Wolverines are 12-5 overall this season and have won seven straight matches, one shy of the school record. Utah Valley features a one-two punch with junior outside hitter Camie Manwill averaging 4.36 kills per game and senior middle blocker Jessica Endres tallying 4.32 kpg. Manwill is also second on the team with 3.91 digs per game while Endres paces the Wolverines in hitting percentage at .366 and blocks at 1.20 per game. Both players recently became the first players in UVU Division I history to record 1,000 career kills. During the Wolverines' current seven-match win streak, Endres is posting 4.85 kpg on .406 hitting. Sophomore Allyce Wilson boasts a 5.62 digs-per-game average. As a team, Utah Valley bests its opponents in every category, including kills (16.06-13.70), hitting percentage (.229-.174), assists (14.72-12.48), service aces (1.65-1.43), digs (19.14-18.13) and blocks (2.34-1.96).

### LAST OUTING

OREM, Utah (Oct. 5, 2007) - Jessica Endres and Kayli Broadbent combined for 41 kills as Utah Valley ran its win streak to seven with a 3-1 (30-11, 27-30, 30-20, 30-25) win over Texas-Pan American on Friday night. Endres, in what has become a typical night for the senior from Gilbert, Arizona, had another big match with 22 kills and a .450 hitting percentage. She also had a block solo and seven block assists.

One of the keys to the win streak has been the play of Broadbent, who like Endres, also attended Gilbert High School in Arizona. She is averaging nearly four kills per game during the streak and her 19 kills on Friday were a new career high.

Kristi Lindley had 65 assists, tying a four-game school record while Terin Ledall had a season-high 11 kills and Kristin Anderson added nine kills and hit .643. Allyce Wilson led four players with double figures in digs with 25.

After opening the match with a 19-point win, the biggest single game win of the season, the Wolverines dropped game two by three, evening the match at 1-1.

In game three Utah Valley hit .375 and Lindley dished out 18 assists in a 30-20 win that gave the Wolverines the momentum heading into clinching game.

UV hit .314 for the match compared to .131 by Texas-Pan American. The Wolverines also played well defensively, with 12.0 team blocks and 86 digs.

## UTAH IN 2007

The Utes are 7-9 overall this season and 4-3 in the Mountain West Conference after losing the 2006 MWC Setter of the Year and Player of the Year as well as the nation's top middle blocker during the offseason. Junior outside hitter Kathryn Haynie leads the team with 3.61 kills per game while adding 2.17 digs per contest. Senior Whitney Webb is close behind Haynie with 3.17 kpg to go along with 0.91 blocks per game. Junior middle blocker Lori Baird paces the Utes in both hitting percentage at .271 and blocks with 1.56 per game, which ranks second in the league, while contributing 2.84 kpg. Senior libero Connie Dangerfield is sixth in the conference with 4.20 dpg. As a team, Utah outperforms its opponents in kills (15.17-13.78), hitting percentage (.167-.159), assists (13.97-12.58) and digs (16.38-15.91).

## LAST OUTING

SALT LAKE CITY (Oct. 6, 2007) - The Utah women's volleyball team dropped a five-game match to TCU, 3-2, on Saturday, Oct. 6. With the match tied, 2-2, TCU (16-6, 3-3 MWC) went into game five with the momentum after winning games three and four. The two teams matched each other point-for-point to start the fifth game. Tied 7-7, TCU went on a three point surge to take a 7-10 lead with help from two kills from Kourtney Edwards, and Utah (7-9, 4-3 MWC) never recovered, falling 15-13.

Utah was led by Whitney Webb's 19 kills on .424 hitting, including three blocks. Keisha Fisher had a double-double with 30 assists and 17 digs. Kathryn Haynie had 17 kills and 11 digs, while Lori Baird recorded 14 kills and four blocks.

The Utes wasted no time taking the lead in game one, quickly pulling away and leading by as many as 10 points in the contest before winning 30-21. Chelsey Sandberg and Karolina Bartkowiak each had four kills in the first game, while Sandberg also had two blocks. In game two, Utah held as much as an eight point lead, 13-5, before TCU rallied back to pull within two, 17-15. Up 19-17, the Utes went on a 5-0 run for a 24-17 lead with help from a kill and a block from Webb. Utah would take control of the contest from there, winning 30-26.

With Utah leading game three, 22-15, the Horned Frogs went on an 8-1 drive to tie the game, 23-23. Edwards led the charge with three blocks and a kill during the run. TCU would go on to win, 30-26. In game four, the Utes took a four point lead early, 13-9, but TCU scored six-straight points to take a 15-13 lead. Although Utah would come back to tie the game, 18-18, the Frogs would rally with a four point drive to take the 22-18 lead. Utah would come no closer than two points the rest of the way, falling 30-23.

**Weekly Notes:****Week #7 In Review**

The Cougars went 1-1 on the weekend with a sweep of TCU on Friday night in the Smith Fieldhouse (30-27, 30-20, 30-21) and a four-game loss to New Mexico on Saturday night (30-22, 26-30, 24-30, 25-30). Chelsea Goodman led the way for BYU against the Horned Frogs with team highs of 18 kills, .486 hitting, three aces and 17 digs while Ashton Hansen posted eight blocks. Rachel Dyer came up big against the Lobos with 17 kills followed by Goodman's 16. Goodman also recorded two double-doubles on the weekend to improve her career total to 45.

**BYU Top Performer of the Week - Chelsea Goodman**

Cougar outside hitter Chelsea Goodman recorded back-to-back double-doubles on the weekend, improving her career total to 45, just two off the Mountain West Conference record. In BYU's sweep of TCU on Friday, she posted a match-high 18 kills to go along with 17 digs while tallying season highs of three aces and .486 hitting, leading BYU in all four categories. She helped set the tone of the match early with eight kills in game one. She followed that performance up with 16 kills and 12 digs against New Mexico while totaling two aces. For the week, she averaged 4.86 kills, 4.14 digs and 0.71 aces per game on .377 hitting. On the season, Goodman leads the team in kills with 4.46 per game while ranking among the top 10 in the Mountain West Conference in that category.

**Octoberfest**

Despite beginning the month of October 1-1 this season, BYU has traditionally played its best in October, going 17-2 (.895) all-time in the month in just over two years under head coach Jason Watson. The Cougars are 27-6 (.818) in September and 11-5 (.688) in November since Watson took the helm prior to the 2005 season. BYU has five more matches (vs. Utah Valley, at Utah, at CSU, vs. Air Force, vs. Wyoming) left in October this season.

**Winning With Watson**

BYU head coach Jason Watson has compiled an impressive 61-15 record in his two-plus seasons at the Cougar helm, including a 31-8 mark in the Mountain West Conference. Watson coached his team to the league title in 2005 while earning Coach of the Year honors and has led BYU to back-to-back NCAA Tournament berths. After a three-year absence prior to his hiring, Watson's teams have been ranked in 33 of 37 weekly AVCA Top 25 Coaches Polls, including a No. 9 ranking this season, the program's highest since 1999.

**On The Road Again**

BYU has played 10 of 14 matches on the road so far this season. The Cougars began the season with two matches at the Hawkeye Challenge hosted by Iowa before hosting the BYU Molten Classic. BYU then played three matches at the Stanford Invitational and at UNLV, San Diego State and Weber State before facing Colorado State at home. BYU then hit the road again with matches at Wyoming and at Air Force to close out the month of September. The Cougars have not begun the season with so many matches away from home before the end of September since playing 10 of their first 14 on the road in 1997.

**Double the Fun**

With 45 career double-doubles to date, Chelsea Goodman is just two double-doubles away from tying the Mountain West Conference record of 47 set by Wyoming's Michele Rauter (2000-03). Goodman has recorded 11 double-doubles already this season, including each of the last three matches, after posting an MWC-leading 18 double-doubles last year out of 29 matches in which she played. BYU's Erica Lott also appears on the active list with 22 double-doubles in her Cougar career, including five so far in 2007.

**Home Sweet Home**

The Cougars have gone 4-2 in the Smith Fieldhouse this season and are averaging 1,609 fans, 17th in the nation, including the fourth-largest crowd in BYU women's volleyball history with 3,880 fans against No. 10 Wisconsin in the Cougars' home opener. BYU went 12-1 in the Smith Fieldhouse last year and set a new program attendance record with an average of 1,902 fans, 13th in the nation. The Cougars are now 464-84 (.848) all-time at home and 26-3 on Elaine Michaelis Court over the last three years.

### BYU In the Polls

The Cougars do not appear in the Top 25 Coaches Poll this week for the first time since Sept. 12, 2005 (regular season) despite beginning the year ranked No. 17. BYU has a rich history of rankings in the AVCA Top 25 Poll. Among NCAA Division I programs entering the 2007 season, the Cougars are 10th all-time in total number of weeks ranked (279) and 11th in weeks ranked in the top 10 (122) and weeks ranked No. 1 (4). The Cougars have also traditionally finished strong, coming in 10th all-time in both weeks ranked in the final poll (20) and weeks ranked in the top five to end the year (3) and tied for sixth in weeks ranked No. 1 in the final poll (1).

### Rivals in the Rankings

Four Cougar opponents appear in this week's rankings. Wisconsin, whom the Cougars defeated in the Molten Classic, is ranked No. 9 while Stanford comes in at No. 2 and Cal Poly is No. 24 this week (both teams beat BYU in the Stanford Invitational). MWC rival Colorado State is ranked No. 23 while UNLV is receiving votes and listed 35th.

### Vs. Ranked Opponents

BYU is 1-2 this season against ranked opponents with a win over No. 10 Wisconsin on Aug. 31 and losses against No. 17 Cal Poly and at No. 2 Stanford at the Stanford Invitational. The Cougars were 1-3 in 2006 vs. ranked foes with the lone win coming against No. 4 Stanford.

### The Nation's Best ...

The Cougars' 1,004-279-5 all-time record makes them one of the best teams in the nation, ranking fourth in all-time wins through Sunday's matches. UCLA tops the list with 1,051 victories while Missouri State ranks second at 1,020 and Nebraska is third at 1,013. The Cornhuskers passed up the Cougars at the end of 2006 with their six-match run to the NCAA Tournament title. The top 10 is rounded out by Long Beach St. (984), Penn State (956), Hawai'i (948), Texas (920), Minnesota (911) and Texas-Arlington (906).

### Comeback Kids

BYU has played five five-game matches this season, going 4-1 in those matches. Prior to losing 32-34, 31-33, 31-29, 30-22, 9-15 to Colorado State in their last five-game match, the Cougars had won four straight matches when forcing a fifth game after being down including at Weber State (down 1-2), at San Diego State (down 0-2) and at Iowa (down 0-2) this season and against UC Santa Barbara (down 0-2) in the 2006 NCAA Tournament first round. BYU is now 14-3 in five-game matches under head coach Jason Watson.

### BYU Reaches 1,000-Victory Mark

The BYU women's volleyball team celebrated a significant milestone on Sept. 15 as the Cougars became just the fourth program in NCAA volleyball history to record 1,000 wins. BYU's landmark 1,000th victory, which came at San Diego State, puts the Cougars in elite company with UCLA, Nebraska and Missouri State as the only programs to reach the 1,000-win mark. In the world of collegiate volleyball, few schools have a volleyball tradition as successful and rich as the history of the sport at BYU, whose all-time record now stands at 1,004-279-5 (.782). In the 38 seasons of its recorded history prior to this year, the Cougars have only suffered one losing season and have won 20 or more matches in 31 of the past 33 seasons.

## Cougars Sweep Away Horned Frogs

Behind a spectacular night from senior Chelsea Goodman, the No. 23 BYU women's volleyball team posted its third straight sweep Friday night with a 30-27, 30-20, 30-21 win over Mountain West Conference foe TCU in the Smith Fieldhouse. With the win, the Cougars improve to 11-4 overall and 4-2 in the MWC while the Horned Frogs fall to 15-6 on the year and 2-3 in league play.

"We're getting back to where we were in early September when we beat No. 10 Wisconsin," said BYU head coach Jason Watson. "We've seen some incremental changes that have helped us prepare and play better."

BYU started out slow, falling behind 13-6 early in game one, but cut the lead to three points at 14-11 with a 5-1 run. TCU kept the Cougars at bay to a 20-15 lead until Porter found her rhythm, putting down three kills in the next five points to spark BYU on a 7-2 spurt, tying the game at 22-22. Three straight Horned Frog winners seemed to have TCU back in control at 25-22, but the Cougars scored eight of the last 10 points to take the game 30-27 as Goodman blasted eight kills.

The two teams traded points early in game two until four straight Cougar points secured a 9-6 BYU lead. The Horned Frogs had a chance to tie things up at 12-11 but were thwarted in their attempt by a kill down the middle from Dyer, sending the Cougars on a 7-2 run to extend their lead to 19-13. From there, BYU never looked back, cruising to the 30-20 victory.

Game three was a battle early on as neither team was able to lead by more than one point. Finally, BYU got back-to-back kills from Dyer and Lott to go up 10-8. Moments later, TCU was back within one at 11-10, but three straight bombs from Goodman established a 14-11 Cougar lead. The Horned Frogs wouldn't threaten again as BYU kept the pressure on to record the 30-21 win.

## Solid Team Effort Leads to Victory

The No. 23 BYU women's volleyball team ran into a buzzsaw Saturday night, falling 30-22, 26-30, 24-30, 25-30 to New Mexico.

"We just weren't as prepared and focused on some very specific details that we needed to take care of," said BYU head coach Jason Watson. "New Mexico played a very competitive match."

BYU was in control through the first half of game one with a 17-12 lead but saw the Lobos come back with three straight scores. A solo block from Bryn Porter ended the UNM run and swung the momentum back in the Cougars' favor as they again led by five at 23-18. From there, it was all BYU as the Cougars cruised to the 30-22 win.

Game two was a battle early on as neither team was able to go up by more than one point. BYU finally did it with three straight points to take an 11-9 advantage but UNM came right back to go up 13-12. Back-to-back kills from Goodman and Dyer put the Cougars on top 16-14, but moments later it was 26-21 in favor of the Lobos as the BYU offense sputtered, leading to the 30-26 UNM win.

The Lobos built a 13-10 advantage in game three and put the Cougars on their heels. BYU battled back to tie the game at 14-14 on a tremendous block by Porter and Dyer and were soon in front, 20-16, after two high-flying kills from Goodman. But the Lobos pushed back with everything they could, putting together a 9-1 run to take a commanding 26-21 lead from which the Cougars could not recover, falling 30-24.

UNM again came out of the gate strong to start game four, building a 5-1 lead. Porter finally tied the game for BYU at 14-14, but four straight UNM points had the Cougars staring defeat in the face. Still trailing 21-18, BYU found some momentum, scoring three straight points capped by an ace from Goodman to tie the game at 21-21. However, New Mexico refused to let the victory slip away, scoring nine of the last 13 points to seal the 30-25 win.

BYU is a member of the Mountain West Conference. The Cougars began 2007 with an 88-28 regular-season record in eight years of MWC play after finishing second in 2006 with a 13-3 mark.

BYU won the inaugural regular season title in 1999 with a 13-1 record and won again in 2005 with a 14-2 mark. BYU appeared in the MWC Tournament title match in each of the first two seasons, winning the title over Colorado State in Fort Collins in 2000 after losing the 1999 title to the Rams in Provo. Utah won the 2001 and 2002 crowns, in Provo and Fort Collins, respectively while Colorado State captured the 2003 title in San Diego and the 2004 crown on its home court. Utah won the 2005 title, and Colorado State took home the crown in 2006, both in Las Vegas.

Six of the nine MWC programs have competed in postseason action in the seven years since the league was formed. In 2006, three MWC teams earned NCAA bids, including BYU (at-large), Colorado State (automatic) and Utah (at-large). Since the MWC was founded in 1999, BYU, Colorado State and Utah have represented the conference in the NCAA Tournament each season. Overall, BYU has made 23 NCAA appearances, followed by Colorado State with 18, SDSU with 13, Utah with nine, New Mexico with seven and Wyoming with four.

So far in 2007, BYU is the only MWC team currently ranked in the AVCA Top 25 Coaches Poll, coming in at No. 12. Utah began the season ranked but is now receiving votes along with Colorado State

BYU has a winning record over every MWC team with an overall conference winning percentage of .812.

## JASON WATSON

### HEAD WOMEN'S VOLLEYBALL COACH

Jason Watson was named the head coach of BYU's women's volleyball program on Feb. 17, 2005 after serving for three years as an assistant with the team.

In his two seasons at the helm, he has compiled a 50-10 (.833) overall record while leading the Cougars to back-to-back NCAA Tournament appearances and a return to the national rankings. He was named the Mountain West Conference Coach of the Year in 2005 after posting a 25-4 record in his first season as a head coach and leading the Cougars to their first MWC regular-season title since 1999.

Prior to his head-coaching debut, Watson had 11 years of collegiate coaching experience as an assistant at four universities, including two seasons with the BYU men's volleyball program and three with BYU's women's program. After an All-American playing career at BYU, Watson coached two seasons under former U.S. Olympic coach and two-time NCAA Coach of the Year Carl McGown with the Cougars' men's squad in 1995-96. He returned to BYU in 2002 as an assistant head coach for the women's team under Karen Lamb.

Watson also served as the associate head coach at Kansas State in 2001 and as an assistant coach in 2000, where he helped guide the Wildcats to two consecutive NCAA Tournament berths.

Before that, Watson spent two years at Arkansas State during which the Lady Indians won consecutive Sun Belt Conference titles. Watson began his women's volleyball coaching career with a two-year stint at Montana State, helping the Bobcats to their best record in almost 15 years.

Overall, Watson has directed or assisted in taking teams to the NCAA Tournament in six of the last eight seasons. In addition to his 50-10 (.833) head-coaching record, Watson's team's compiled a 185-97 (.656) record in his nine years as an NCAA women's volleyball assistant coach. Watson is only the fourth head coach in BYU women's volleyball history, joining JoAnn Calderwood (1956-61), Hall of Fame coach Elaine Michaelis (1962-2001) and Lamb (2002-04).

#### COACHING CAREER

Watson was honored as the 2005 MWC Coach of the Year in his first season as a head coach, becoming the first BYU women's volleyball head coach to win a league coaching award since Elaine Michaelis won Western Athletic Conference Mountain Division honors in 1997. Under Watson, the Cougars won the league regular-season title for the first time since 1999. BYU's 25-4 overall record in Watson's first year was its best since 1998, and the Cougars' 20-0 start to the season was the second-best in school history. The winning trend continued in 2006 with a 25-6 overall record and a second-round NCAA Tournament appearance. The Cougars finished the year ranked No. 20 in the nation, their first final national ranking since 2001.

Watson's Cougars were ranked as high as No. 12 in the nation during the 2005 season, finishing listed No. 26, and were invited to their 22nd NCAA Tournament. The MWC regular-season champions led the league and were 17th in the nation in hitting percentage (.274) as well as pacing the conference in kills with 16.09 per game.

In Watson's offense, three-time All-MWC setter Lauren Richards Evans finished 19th in the nation and third all-time at BYU with 13.12 assists per game while middle blocker and MWC Player of the Year Lindsay Hartssock was second in the nation in hitting percentage with a .444 mark. Both received AVCA All-America Honorable Mention recognition.



In his three years as an assistant at BYU in charge of the Cougar defense, Watson quickly established BYU as a top defensive squad. The Cougars led the MWC and were 13th and fifth in the nation in blocks per game in 2003 and 2004, respectively. BYU also led the MWC in digs in 2003 with 1,729, the most the Cougars had put up since 1997. Hartssock was named the 2004 Blocker of the Year by Collegiate Volleyball Update and finished second in the nation averaging 1.86 blocks per game in 2004 while libero Uila Crabbe set BYU and MWC single-season records in digs with 435 in 2003 under Watson's direction.

At Kansas State, Watson helped the Wildcats earn back-to-back top-three finishes in the Big 12 Conference and consecutive trips to the NCAA Tournament while achieving a 42-17 (.712) overall record and 29-11 (.725) mark in the Big 12. Coaching the setters and coordinating the offense, Watson established a powerful attack that produced several team and individual records.

Also in 2001, with Watson serving as associate head coach, KSU broke the school record for conference wins with a 15-5 mark and swept the season series with a school-best six league opponents. Two players earned All-Big 12 honors and one honorable-mention All-America recognition as school records were broken for kills, total attacks and 20-kill matches. KSU also earned the right to host the NCAA first and second rounds for the first time since the field was expanded to 64 teams and for only the second time in the school's history. In 2000, Watson helped guide an offense that set the school record with 2,024 kills and totaled 1,828 assists (No. 2 in school history at the time), 4,864 total attacks (No. 3 in school history) and a .245 team hitting percentage (No. 4 in school history). Under Watson's tutelage, setter Disney Bronnenberg finished second nationally in assists, averaging 15.01 assists per game.

Prior to his time at KSU, Watson helped Arkansas State advance to the NCAA Tournament in 1999 after winning consecutive Sun Belt Conference regular-season titles in 1998 and 1999. He helped the Lady Indians post a 51-18 (.739) record and coached a number of all-league performers, including Sun Belt Freshman of the Year Jessica Barney, who led the league in assists with 1,457 in 1999. Watson was responsible for the team's offensive schemes and setter training while coordinating the program's recruiting efforts. Watson spent two seasons as an assistant at Montana State, helping the Bobcats to a 35-24 (.593) record. In 1997, the Bobcats finished 19-12, the program's best mark since 1983. In 1996, the team went 16-12 and made its first-ever Big Sky Conference Tournament appearance.

#### PLAYING CAREER

As a player, Watson was a four-year starter and two-time captain from 1990-94 as the BYU men's program grew from its infancy to a national power. After a 2-25 season in the program's second year as an NCAA sport, the Cougars achieved a 21-6 record and No. 2 national ranking in Watson's senior season in 1994. Watson is still BYU's all-time assist leader with 4,649 and single-game assist record holder with 128 against Hawai'i on March 27, 1993. He was named a second-team American Volleyball Coaches Association All-American, Volleyball Magazine honorable-mention All-American and a member of the Mountain Pacific Sports Federation Third Team in 1994. He was a member of the Australian Men's National Team from 1990-91 and a member of the Junior National Team from 1987-90.

#### PERSONAL

A physical education and sports business management graduate of BYU in 1995, Watson is a native of Homebush, Australia. He and his wife, Larissa, have two sons and one daughter.

**2006 SEASON REVIEW**

The No. 20 BYU women's volleyball team continued its tradition of excellence in 2006 with a 25-6 overall record and a second round NCAA Tournament appearance.

"I'm pleased with the progress we made this year," said BYU head coach Jason Watson, whose teams have gone 50-10 in his two years at the helm. "The season we were able to put together this year was representative of the direction we want the program to go. We feel like we have work to do, but we are going to get better."

The Cougars finished in second place in the Mountain West Conference with a 13-3 league record and spent the season ranked in the AVCA Top 25 Poll, ending the year at No. 20 after making their 23rd NCAA Tournament appearance in the 26-year history of the Championship. The Smith Fieldhouse once again proved to be a dominant homecourt advantage as BYU went 12-1 on Elaine Michaelis Court during 2006 while setting a program attendance record with an average crowd of 1,902.

Injuries plagued the Cougars throughout the year as the team played 13 matches without the services of all of their starters. Sophomore setter Amy Schlauder sat out eight matches with a broken finger while junior rightside hitter Erica Lott missed two contests and sophomore middle blocker Rachel Dyer was unavailable on five occasions due to injury. However, despite going more than a month without their full starting rotation, the Cougars rallied around their teammates as several players stepped up and made the most of their playing opportunities, ensuring continued success.

BYU began the year taking consecutive tournament titles with three sweeps at the UCF Fall Invitational followed by a win over then-No. 4 Stanford, the eventual national runner-up, in Provo the next weekend in front of a record crowd of 4,050 while earning the BYU Molten Classic crown. The Cougars then took their 6-0 record on the road to the Jayhawk Invitational where they suffered their first defeat of the season against host Kansas after Schlauder broke her finger in the first game. But BYU bounced back the next day to beat Arkansas behind the play of back-up setter Jenna Judkins, who paced the Cougars to a 7-1 record in Schlauder's absence while leading the MWC in assists during her stint at the net.

After going 8-1 prior to starting league play, BYU won its first four conference matches, including its first home win over Colorado State since 2000. Without the services of Schlauder or Lott, however, the Cougars then suffered their only home loss of the year to in-state rival Utah in front of another record-breaking crowd of 4,455. But the loss was quickly forgotten with a seven-match winning streak, including four sweeps, that saw the Cougars improve to 19-2 overall and rise as high as No. 16 in the nation.

Unfortunately, BYU's winning streak came to an end when the Cougars suffered their only back-to-back defeats of the year at then-No. 9 Utah and at New Mexico. But BYU rebounded with five straight wins to end the regular season. As part of the run, the Cougars beat the Rams in Fort Collins, Colo., to complete the season sweep of CSU for the first time since 1995.

Postseason play did not begin as the Cougars hoped with an early exit from the MWC Tournament in Las Vegas, but the time off prepared BYU for a tough first round NCAA Tournament matchup against UC Santa Barbara in Los Angeles. The Cougars completed an incredible comeback from two games down to earn the five-game win behind the strength of Annie Kemp Pinegar's record-setting 42 digs, breaking the 22-year-old BYU mark. However, BYU could overcome host USC the following night, falling to the No. 6 Trojans to end the season with a 25-6 record.

In addition to being ranked No. 20 in the nation as a team to end the year, the Cougars finished 16th nationally in hitting percentage (.269), 24th in win/loss percentage (.806) and 33rd in blocks per game (2.96). Several individuals also excelled as Cougars led the MWC in four of the seven statistical categories tracked by the league including hitting percentage (Lindsay Hartsock), kills (Chelsea Goodman), assists (Schlauder) and points (Goodman). Hartsock ranked 17th nationally in hitting with a .389 mark while Schlauder ranked 24th in assists per game at 13.15 and Goodman was 43rd in the nation with 4.49 kills per game.
