## NABC Announces Rosters For First Division III Senior All-Star Game

**KANSAS CITY, Mo. (March 17, 2010)** – The National Association of Basketball Coaches (NABC) announced rosters today for the first NABC Division III Senior All-Star game, which will be played as part of the 2010 NCAA® Division III men's basketball championships, March 20, at the Salem Civic Center in Salem, Va.

The NABC Division III All-Star game will be played on Saturday, March 20, at 10:30 a.m. (EDT), replacing the consolation game. Two 10-man teams will be selected for the game, with two players coming from each of the eight regions in Division III. The remaining four senior players will be selected from the two semifinal teams which do not reach the Division III national championship game, scheduled for 1 p.m. on Saturday.

The game will feature a pair of outstanding former coaches who have both been recipients of the NABC Division III Distinguished Service Award. Former University of Wisconsin-River Falls coach **Rick Bowen** will lead the West team while **Dr. Mike Beitzel**, who coached for 20 seasons at Hanover College, will guide the East team.

The senior all-star players were nominated by coaches and selected by a panel of coaches representing each region in Division III.
