

Announcement of Head Men's Basketball Coach, Assistant Professor of Kinesiology Position  
Kinesiology Department, Hope College

Responsibilities include but are not limited to: (1) head coach of men's basketball program (2) teaching in Kinesiology Department, and (3) fulfilling the role and responsibilities of a faculty member of Hope College. The successful candidate will have experience in coaching basketball and teaching in kinesiology. A candidate with a degree in kinesiology, doctorate degree is preferred; a Master's degree is required.

**GENERAL REQUIREMENTS:** Ability to combine excellence in coaching and teaching; adherence to Hope College, MIAA, and NCAA rules; and commitment to the character and goals of a liberal arts college with a Christian perspective.

**RANK AND SALARY:** Ten-month faculty position. Salary commensurate with education and experience.
