Thank you for your interest and request for information regarding the literacy program. Enclosed is the model for The NABC Reading Program. Please use this as your model program and modify where necessary according to your needs.

This program targets first, second, and third graders. To maximize your team's effort and time we have created this typical scenario for you to consider and/or follow.

1. Arrange to visit one or two schools.
2. Divide your team into two groups. (12 players= 2 groups of 6 players)
3. Pair each group of players to three groups of two players.
4. At school A, each group would visit two classrooms apiece for approximately 45-minutes each.
5. At school B, each group would visit two classrooms apiece for approximately 45-minutes each.

In this short period of time, players and coaches will have the opportunity to influence approximately 250-300 elementary aged school children.

This Packet Contains:

1. A sample letter to use to communicate with the principals of the elementary schools you target for your visit.
2. The activities that should take place while in the classroom.
3. A sample schedule of what your athletes should be doing while in the classrooms.
4. A sample certificate that could be signed by each player and coaching staff prior to making copies (please make extra copies to ensure that each student

receives a certificate).

Note: Show certificates to the class prior to leaving and then give them to the teacher who will insert names and distribute to the students.

5. A sample reading list.

Note: Teachers will usually supply you with a reading list if requested.

6. A sample news release for the use of your sports information department.

Dear Principal,

We appreciate that your school is excited about participating in The NABC Reading Program with (your team mascot here). (University name) is very proud to be a part of this national project. It would be helpful to us if the participating teachers could get together and chose appropriate literature for their specific class and make a schedule that includes the teachers' name, room number, grade, and time in their class (ex. 12:30-1:15 or 1:30-2:15). NABC Reading Program In-Classroom Agenda

1. Athlete/ Reader Introductions- Name, hometown, high school, major, favorite book
2. Icebreaker Conversation- Discuss favorite activities as a child, importance of reading, items/ books currently enjoy reading, everyday ways to improve reading skills (i.e. newspapers, magazines, internet, etc.)
3. Read Aloud to Class- Teacher selects book to be read
4. Reading Related Activity- Teacher selects activity
5. Question and Answer period- Students can ask questions of the readers
6. Closing Words of Encouragement- Importance of reading and reading for pleasure, importance of education and work ethic, importance of listening, importance of good health and staying away from drugs
7. Distribute Certificates- Certificates of participation to be distributed to all students.

Suggested Schedule

10 Minutes	1) Athlete/ Reader introductions and icebreaker
15 Minutes	2) Read aloud to class
15 Minutes	3) Reading activity
5 Minutes	4) Closing words of encouragement
Remainder	5) Distribute collateral

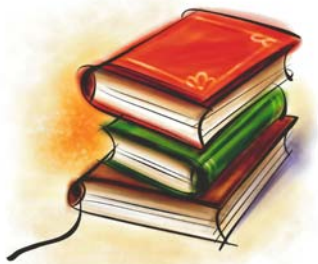
