## Malone (Ohio) Leads the First Fall NAIA Learfield Sports Directors' Cup Standings

**CLEVELAND** – Malone (Ohio) leads the first set of Learfield Sports Directors' Cup fall standings. The Pioneers have accumulated 185 total points after taking home the men's cross country title and finishing third in women's cross country.

Simon Fraser (B.C.) trails the Pioneers by 33 points after finishing fourth in the women's cross country championship and sixth in the men's cross country championship. The Clan has 152 total points.

Cal State San Marcos is in third with 140 total points, after tallying a first place finish in women's cross country and 17<sup>th</sup> in men's cross country.

British Columbia (Can.) and College of Idaho are tied fourth overall with 129 points each. The British Columbia (Can.) Thunderbirds finished eighth in women's cross country and took home ninth place in men's cross country.

The College of Idaho Coyotes finished seventh in women's cross country and 10<sup>th</sup> in the men's cross country championship.

Two of the six fall NAIA championships have been completed with the following institutions capturing titles: Malone (Ohio) (men's cross country); and Cal State San Marcos (women's cross country).

The Learfield Sports Directors' Cup was developed as a joint effort between the National Association of Collegiate Directors of Athletics (NACDA) and *USA Today*. Points are awarded based on each institution's finish in up to 14 sports -- seven women's and seven men's.

The next NAIA standings will be released Thursday, December 17.
