

DIVISION II ADA ACADEMIC ACHIEVEMENT AWARDS

The Division II Athletics Directors Association (DII ADA) announced the 2010-11 recipients of the DII ADA Academic Achievement Awards. The Academic Achievement Awards recognize the academic accomplishments of student-athletes at the Division II level. Ninety-nine institutions sent in nominees for the 2010-11 Academic Achievement Awards, while a total of 3,700 student-athletes are being recognized. The Great Lakes Valley Conference had 434 student-athletes nominated, followed by the Northern Sun Intercollegiate Athletic Conference with 381.

TO QUALIFY, A STUDENT-ATHLETE MUST:

- Have a cumulative grade-point average of 3.5 or higher on a 4.0 scale.
- Have completed a minimum of two years (four semesters) of college level work.
- Have been an active member of an intercollegiate team during his/her last academic year.

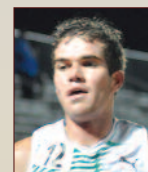
