Texas's Folan Named Frank Kara Leadership Award Recipient

CLEVELAND - The National Association for Athletics Compliance (NAAC) awarded **Amy Folan**, an associate athletics director for compliance at The University of Texas, its 2008 Frank Kara Leadership Award at the 2008 NAAC Convention held June 8-9 in Dallas.

The Frank Kara Leadership Award is named after former University of Minnesota Director of Compliance Frank Kara, who lost his battle with cancer at the age of 40. Kara played an integral role in creating the annual NAAC convention, which Minnesota hosted in 2006.

Nominees must be a NAAC member; be employed as a full-time compliance administrator at an institution, conference or the NCAA at the time of the nomination; demonstrate leadership and vision promoting athletics compliance; demonstrate commitment, cooperation and allegiance in promoting excellence in athletics compliance; demonstrate a commitment to professional development and mentoring of compliance staff; serve as a positive role model; and be committed to rules education and monitoring.

Under Folan's guidance, Austin was selected as the host site of the 2007 NAAC Convention, and The University of Texas served as the major sponsor of the event.
