



FAQ – CALL FOR PROPOSALS

What type of proposal topics is NAAC hoping to receive?

Any compliance related professional development topic can be proposed. Proposals should focus on helping attendees by teaching from experience. The best presentations are the ones that focus on real world examples.

Some examples of topics the NAAC convention audience would benefit from include:

- Best practices for effectively monitoring an important aspect of NCAA compliance
- Time-saving or productivity tips and tools you may use in your compliance office
- Best practices for developing and maintaining compliance monitoring systems
- Real-world compliance issues and solutions
- Developing a compliance staff and training the next generation of senior compliance administrators
- Strategic planning within your department and within your athletic compliance program
- Educational initiatives designed for coaches, staff and the university community
- Strategies for managing a major infractions case or investigation
- Strategies for speaking publicly (i.e. team meetings, booster functions, staff rules education, etc.
- Networking and/or career advancement advice.

Please be clear about the experience and knowledge level of the audience that you are targeting: novice, intermediate, or expert. Keep in mind that we look for a balance of all three experience levels when determining the conference schedule.

What are the limits to the number of proposals I can submit?

There is a limit of two proposals per applicant. This is done to encourage collaborations and partnerships among the compliance community. Feel free to collaborate with your colleagues and indicate what role each person would serve during the presentation of your topic.

How do I get feedback on the proposal results? How will I be advised of the status of my proposal?

The NAAC Education Committee will initially review all proposals and may follow up with individual applicants for additional clarification. Notification of selection or non-selection will be determined by the NAAC Convention Committee no later than January 11, 2012.

How can I be sure my proposal was received?

You will receive an email verifying the receipt of your proposal.
