

Postdoctoral Sports Psychology Fellowship

Counseling and Sport Psychology services, housed within the University of Washington (Seattle, WA) Department of Intercollegiate Athletics, provides all sport and performance psychology services to the 600+ student-athletes. Consistent with the UW Sports Medicine treatment model, Counseling and Sport Psychology Services regularly consults with certified athletic trainers, team physicians, nutritionist, and other support staff for integrated service provision.

The **University of Washington Department of Intercollegiate Athletics** is pleased to offer a Postdoctoral Sport Psychology Fellowship position for 2015-2016. This is a 12-month full-time position scheduled to begin in July 2015. This position is designed for an individual who is pursuing licensure as a psychologist and is seeking specialized training and experience in the delivery of clinical and sport psychology services within a collegiate athletic department. Hours accrued during this fellowship can be considered supervised experience under the direction of a licensed psychologist supervisor.

The primary roles of this position will include psychotherapy focused on clinical issues most salient to student-athletes (e.g. transition to the university, injury, disordered eating, athletic identity, career transition, and substance abuse issues); performance enhancement counseling and education with individuals and teams and LD/ADHD testing. The onsite supervisor will be Cassie Pasquariello, Ph.D., who is a licensed psychologist within the Athletic Department. Additional training on neuropsychological assessment and sport concussion may be available through campus and community partners.

Requirements: Ph.D. or Psy.D. in Clinical/Counseling/Educational Psychology from an APA-accredited doctoral training program and internship. Specialized training in sport psychology and/or AASP certification. Excellent personal qualities and skills (e.g. oral and written communication, organizational, interpersonal, and analytical) that enable effective interaction with the SAAS staff, athletic staff, sport medicine staff, colleagues, administrators, faculty and student-athletes. Strong commitment to and training in working with culturally diverse individuals. Self-motivated and disciplined, flexible and ability to respond well to change. Training and experience in LD/ADHD evaluation and assessment. Demonstrated ability to work within a multidisciplinary team.

Preferred Skills: Experience working with Division I collegiate (and/or elite) athletes and/or personal experience as a student-athlete. Specific experience working with athletes, coaches, sport medicine staff, and multidisciplinary treatment teams. Training and experience in performance concerns. Ability to present to teams and groups, including excellent public speaking skills. Crisis intervention training and experience.
