Wrestling finished 37th at the NCAA Championship.

The women's basketball team competed in the NCAA Tournament for the first time in program history.

The men's swimming & diving team qualified three Midshipmen for the NCAA Championship.

Rifle placed seventh at the NCAA Rifle Championship.

Men's Gymnastics qualified two Midshipmen for the NCAA Championship.

Women's Lacrosse advanced to the NCAA Tournament for a second-consecutive season.

Intercollegiate Sailing placed ninth at ICSA Nationals.

Baseball earned its first trip to the NCAA Tournament since 2002 and made its ninth appearance in program history in the national tournament.

*Head Coach: Paul Kostacopoulos

*Navy won its first Patriot League regular season and tournament titles since 2002. The Midshipmen defeated Army in the best-of-three championship series, 2-1, to take the conference tournament championship.

*The Mids became the first No. 1 seed to win the Patriot League Tournament since 2007. Navy's six Patriot League titles are the most by any team in the conference.

*In winning the Patriot League championship, the Midshipmen earned an automatic berth to the NCAA Tournament for the first time since 2002. In making its ninth NCAA appearance in program history, Navy fell to the tournament's No. 1 seed, Virginia, 6-0, in game one, and then lost to East Carolina, 6-1 - to get knocked out of the tournament.

*With a record of 33-25-1, it marked the fifth time in Paul Kostacopoulos' six seasons that Navy reached the 30-win plateau.

*Navy went 12-8 in winning the Patriot League regular season and had a conference-best 8-4 record on the road. The Mids were the only Patriot League team that did not lose a series as they took three of four games at Lehigh and Holy Cross, while they split with Army, Bucknell and Lafayette.

*After falling, 1-0, to Bucknell in 16 innings in game one of the Patriot League semifinal series, Navy responded to win games two and three by a combined score of 12-1. In allowing just two runs over the three-game series that spanned 34 innings, it marked the fewest amount of runs by an opponent in three consecutive games since 1993. Bucknell's two runs in 34 innings were the fewest Navy has allowed since 1986 when it allowed just two runs in 35 innings over five games.

*In the Patriot League Tournament finals, Navy defeated Army, 4-3, in game one, but dropped game two, 6-3. Trailing, 3-1, in the sixth inning of the decisive game three, Navy rallied for three runs en route to a 5-3 win.

*In the six games of the Patriot League Tournament, Navy pitching combined for a 1.95 ERA and limited opponents to a .208 batting average.

*MIDN 3/C pitcher Ben Nelson, who had a 0.98 ERA in 18.1 innings pitched in the Patriot League Tournament, was named MVP of the tournament. MIDN 4/C Preston Gainey, MIDN 1/C Nick Driscoll and MIDN 2/C Alex Azor all joined him on the All-Tournament team.

*Head coach Paul Kostacopoulos became the fourth Navy head coach to be named Patriot League Coach of the Year.

*MIDN 4/C Taylor Cato was the first freshman in academy history to be named Patriot League Rookie of the Year since the award's inception in 2002.

*A total of six Midshipmen were voted to the All-Patriot League teams. MIDN 1/C Wes Olson and MIDN 3/C Dave Milanes were both named to the first team, while MIDN 1/C Sam Long, MIDN 3/C Johnny Schoberl and MIDN 3/C Greg Dupell and Driscoll were voted to the second team.

*Navy held opponents to five or fewer runs in 34 of its 59 games and went 29-5 in those contests.

*The Navy pitching staff set a program record with 423 strikeouts - the previous record was 407, set in 2007.

*Azor and Driscoll set the program record for games played in a season with 59.

*The Mids played 17 doubleheaders during the season and never got swept. Navy went 9-8 in the first game of the doubleheaders and 12-5 in the second game. After starting 0-5, Navy lost more than two consecutive games just once during the season.

*The 2011 senior class of MIDN 1/C Jeff Bland, MIDN 1/C Luke Roberts, MIDN 1/C Jonathan Wright, Driscoll, Long and Olson set the program record for wins by a senior class with 115.

*Milanes (48), Dupell (35), Bland (33) and Azor (33) led Navy in RBIs, marking the first time since 2008 Navy had four players with at least 30 RBIs.

*Nelson's 80 strikeouts in 2011 led the conference and also ranked as the ninth-highest single-season total in program history.

*With six saves, MIDN 3/C Joel Rinehart recorded the fourth-highest single-season total in Navy history. Rinehart's nine-career saves rank third in program history.

*Azor finished the season with 234 at-bats, which tied for the most by any Mid in a season. Azor's 77 hits were the third-highest single-season total in the history of the program.

*In playing an academy record 59 games, Navy recorded the second-most hits (530) and runs (358) in program history.

*Olson went 7-1, becoming the first Navy pitcher to win seven games since 2007. The right-hander finished the year by not allowing more than one run in nine of his last 12 appearances.

*Bland (twice) and Azor both went 5-for-5 during the 2011 season. It marked the first time since 2008 that a Mid had a five-hit game.

*Dupell was one of 12 players named to the inaugural Academic All-Patriot League Team.

*Gainey emerged as one of the team's top arms out of the bullpen, going 2-0 with four saves in 14 appearances. The freshman had two saves against Army and was twice named Patriot League Rookie of the Week.

*Navy went 7-3 against teams that played in the 2010 NCAA Tournament - picking up wins over Bucknell (four), Central Connecticut State (two) and Jacksonville State. Navy took three of four games from Princeton, the only team it faced that made the 2011 NCAA Tournament.

Men's Basketball (11-20, Won N-Star)

*Head Coach: Billy Lange

*Navy finished with an 11-20 overall record and a 6-8 Patriot League mark, which was good for a fourth-place tie in the Patriot League standings. Navy and American are the only teams in the Patriot League to finish tied for fourth or better in each of the last four years.

*Navy finished the season ranked 10th nationally in turnover margin and eighth in the country in steals per game.

*Navy's 236 three-pointers were the fourth most for a Navy team in school history, while its 803 three-point tries were the second most.

*When Navy shoots a higher percentage than its opponent under Lange, the Mids are 59-13 overall, including 8-3 this season.

*Navy is 30-26 in the Patriot League since the start of the 2007-08 season, posting the third-best Patriot League record during that span. The 30 wins are the third most in the Patriot League during that span, behind American's 41 victories and Bucknell's 32 wins. From the 2001-02 season through the 2007-08 season (seven years), Navy won a combined 32 PL games.

*Navy has won six of its 11 games this year by double-digits after posting just two double-figure wins all of last year.

*Navy swept the season series against Army for the first time since the 2002-03 season. The Mids won the first meeting at West Point, 85-81, then used a 67-31 run over 32 minutes for a 75-58 win over the Black Knights in the Star Game in Annapolis. It was Navy's sixth Star Game win in Lange's seven years at Navy.

*Navy also swept the season series with Colgate for the first time since the 2000-01 season with an 81-78 double-overtime victory in Hamilton, N.Y., and a 75-55 decision in Annapolis on Senior Day.

*Navy played three NCAA Tournament teams in the 2010-11 season (Texas, Long Island and Bucknell).

*Navy's 72-53 win over American was the most lopsided against the Eagles since Jan. 17, 1987, a span of 32 games against American.

*Over the last five games of the regular season (3-2), Navy held its opponents to just 306 points, or 61.2 points per game, while holding Lafayette (52), Army (58) and Colgate (55) below 60 points during that span.

*Navy went 9-6 this year when scoring 70 or more points. The Mids were just 2-14 when being held to 69 or fewer points with wins over George Washington (64-57) and Lafayette (57-52).

*Navy has made at least one three-point field goal in 245 straight games, spanning over eight full calendar years.

*Navy has made at least three three-pointers in 203 of the 207 games that Billy Lange has coached at Navy.

*Navy is one of 11 schools nationally to have ranked in the top 80 in three-pointers made per game in each of the last five years.

*Navy's freshmen class had one of the best statistical seasons by a freshman class in school history. The 24.6 points per game accounted for 36.1 percent of Navy's scoring this year.

*The freshman class set the school record for the most points scored by a freshmen class in school history with 762 points, passing the previous record of 720. The 24.6 points per game average is the second best in school history.

*Billy Lange's 207 games coached at Navy are already the fifth most in school history and now in his seventh year, he has been at Navy the fifth longest of any coach in school history (Ben Carnevale - 20; John Wilson - 20; Don DeVoe - 12; Dave Smalley - 10).

*Lange ranks sixth on school's all-time career victories list (92). Dave Smalley (1967-76) ranks fifth on the list with 94.

•MIDN 4/C J.J. Avila was Navy's second player ever to win conference Rookie of the Year accolades, joining David Robinson (CAA - 1984) as winners of the award. He was named to the Patriot League's All-Rookie Team.

*J.J. Avila moved into third on the Navy freshman scoring list with 348 points and ranks high in several other categories, including steals (2nd), three-pointers made (2nd), free throw percentage (3rd), double-figure games (3rd) and minutes played (3rd).

*Avila was named the Patriot League Rookie of the Week eight times already, which was tied for the fourth most in league history.

*Avila won five straight Patriot League Rookie of the Week honors, the second most in Patriot League history.

*Avila became the fourth freshman in school history, and the first since Vernon Butler in 1983, to average 10.0 ppg and 5.0 rpg during their freshman season at Navy.

*Avila was one of four freshmen nationally to average 10.0 ppg, 5.0 rpg and 2.0 apg.

*Avila became just one of two Navy freshmen to score 350 points in a season with 150 rebounds.

*Avila was second on the Navy freshman list with 53 three-pointers and 54 steals. He was just behind Mark Majick (1992) on the three-pointers made list by a freshman (59) and Corey Johnson (2005) on the steals list (57).

*Avila scored 31 points against Towson, the second most for a Navy freshman in school history.

*Avila's six three-pointers against American equaled the most by a Navy freshman in school history.

*MIDN 2/C Jordan Sugars was named second-team All-Patriot League after leading Navy in scoring (16.0 ppg), rebounding (6.0 rpg) and three-pointers made (68).

*Sugars scored in double-digits in 25 of his last 26 games. Sugars ranks third in the Patriot League in scoring and seventh in rebounding, being one of four league players to rank in the top seven of both categories, joining Lehigh's C.J. McCollum, Bucknell's Mike Muscala and American's Vlad Moldoveanu on the list.

*Sugars' 68 three-pointers were the eighth most by a player in school history. His 155 three-pointers made during his career already rank fifth on the all-time Navy list.

*Over the last two seasons, Sugars is averaging 16.0 ppg and 7.0 rpg while making 146-of-388 (.376) three-point attempts.

*Sugars became the 20th player in school history to score 1,000 points when he did so in the regular-season home finale against Colgate.

*Sugars was just the seventh Navy player to score 1,000 points by the end of his junior season. He ranks sixth on the Navy scoring list following a player's junior season with 1,015 points.

*MIDN 1/C O.J. Avworo finished his career with 388 assists, the ninth most in school history. His 4.31 assists per game average during his career was the sixth-best average in school history.

*Avworo's career 1.60 assist-to-turnover ratio (388:243) is the ninth-best mark in school history (min. 100 assists).

*Avworo was named the winner of the Thompson Trophy, which is presented to the midshipman, male or female, declared by the Association's Athletic Committee to have done the most during the year for the promotion of athletics at the Naval Academy."

*MIDN 1/C Mark Veazey finished his career ranked fourth on the Navy career blocked shots list with 111 career blocks.

*Veazey's 114 games played were the eighth most in school history and the second most by a center in school history behind David Robinson's 127 in 1984-87.

Women's Basketball (20-12, 10-4 in the Patriot League)

*Head Coach: Stefanie Pemper

*Navy won the first Patriot League Tournament title in program history by defeating American, 47-40, in the title game of the tournament. It was Navy's first appearance in the tournament final since 1999 and just the third in all for the Mids.

*By virtue of winning the league tournament title, the Mids advanced to their first NCAA Tournament. Navy, the #14 seed in the Philadelphia Region, lost to #3 seed, ninth-ranked and Sweet 16 qualifier DePaul, 56-43.

*Patriot League teams had entered this season having lost 18 consecutive games in the NCAA Tournament. All 18 of those losses had been by at least 21 points, the average margin of defeat over the last 10 games was 34.4 points and the all-time average of defeat was 34.9 points. Navy lost to DePaul by just 13 points.

*The NCAA Tournament appearance marked the first time the Mids have advanced to the postseason.

*Navy posted a 10-4 record in the Patriot League to share the league's regular season title with Lehigh and American. It marked the first time since 1998 -- and just the second time in school history -- that the Mids earned a share of the league title. Navy garnered the No. 1 seed in the Patriot League Tournament due to tiebreakers. It was the first time that Navy entered the postseason as the top-seeded team.

*Navy's 10 Patriot League victories tied the school record for the most in one year (1995, 1998).

*With 20 victories in all, Navy recorded the program's third 20-win campaign in school history (23 in 1998; 22 in 1997).

*Navy allowed its three Patriot League Tournament foes -- Colgate (QF), Bucknell (SF), American (F) -- to average just 39.0 points a game. That is the lowest scoring average allowed by a league champion by an average of nine points a game.

*Navy allowed Colgate to score 36 points in its quarterfinal round game. That was the fewest points allowed by a team in league tournament history regardless of round. Bucknell scored 41 points against Navy in the semifinal round. That was the second-lowest point total tallied by a team in the semifinal round in league tournament history. Navy then allowed American to score just 40 points (including 10 in the second half) in the championship game. That was the fewest points scored by a team in the league final in Patriot League history.

*MIDN 4/C Jade Geif was selected as the Patriot League Tournament's Most Valuable Player. Geif, who averaged 10.7 points and 10.0 rebounds over the three tournament games, is the first Mid to have garnered the award.

*Joining Geif on the all-tournament team were MIDN 1/C Angela Myers and MIDN 4/C Alix Membreno.

*Navy and Lehigh are the only Patriot League teams to have won a quarterfinal round game in the Patriot League Tournament in each of the last three seasons.

*Stefanie Pemper was selected as the Patriot League Coach of the Year. It is the second time that a Navy mentor has garnered the accolade and the first since 1995.

*Geif was tabbed as the Patriot League Rookie of the Year. She is the fifth Mid to have won the award.

*Myers earned First-Team All-Patriot League honors. It is the second consecutive year in which she has garnered the laurel and the third time in her career she has received postseason accolades from the league. She is one of six Mids to have earned multiple first-team all-league honors in a career and the fourth to have earned at least three all-league accolades of any kind.

*Myers was named the winner of the Vice Admiral Lawrence Sword for Women, which is Presented to the woman of the graduating class declared by the Association's Athletic Committee to have personally excelled in athletics during her years of varsity competition.

*MIDN 1/C Cassie Consedine earned Second-Team All-Patriot League laurels. She also received the nod in 2008, which makes her the ninth player in Navy history to have received multiple all-league accolades in a career.

*Navy led the Patriot League in attendance for the fourth consecutive season. The Mids averaged 1,591 fans a game on the season and 2,467 fans a game during league play.

*Navy made 240 three-point field goals this season. It is the third consecutive season in which the Mids have broken the school record for the most three-pointers made in a year, and the second straight year in which the Mids have established a new league single-season record. Navy ranks 14th nationally with an average of 7.5 three-point field goals made a game.

*Navy also tied its own school and league record with 110 three-point field goals made during the Patriot League season. The Mids also made 110 three-pointers during the 2009-10 season.

*Navy ranks second nationally with an average of 12.1 personal fouls committed a game by the Mids. That improves upon the school record of 12.7 fouls a game (1988-89). Navy's average of 12.1 fouls a game in league play ranks second in school history (11.1, 2009-10).

*Navy allowed foes to average 53.7 points a game this year. That is the second-best scoring defense for a Navy team and narrowly missed the school record of 53.1 points a game set in the 1983-84 season that did not include either the three-point line or a shot clock.

*Navy's defense allowed just 54.7 points a game during the Patriot League season. That is the second-best mark for a Navy defense in league play, just missing last year's school-record 54.0 points-per-game average.

*Navy turned the ball over just 175 times during the league season. That is the fewest turnovers committed by the Mids in Patriot League play (by 30 turnovers) in school history.

*Navy's seven-game winning streak from Jan. 4-26 was the longest for the Mids since winning eight in a row during the 1998-99 season.

*Navy opened the Patriot League season with six consecutive wins. That is the longest winning streak in league play recorded by any Navy team.

*Myers earned Patriot League Player of the Week honors on Nov. 22 and Jan. 24.

*Geif was selected as the Patriot League Rookie of the Week on Jan. 17 and Feb. 28, while MIDN 4/C Audrey Bauer received the weekly rookie nod on Jan. 31.

*Myers was named to the all-tournament teams at the Navy Classic and Maine's Dead River Company Classic. Consedine earned the all-tournament nod at the Dead River Company Classic.

*With 163 assists this season, Myers became the first Mid in school history to dish out at least 100 assists in each of her four seasons. Her 163 helpers this year ranks fourth for a single season at Navy.

*Myers also established a new Navy record for minutes played in a single season with 1,135.

*Myers became the 15th player in Navy history to attain 1,000 career points when she reached the milestone Jan. 8 at Bucknell.

*Consedine knocked down 70 three-point field goals this season, the No. 5 single-season tally by a Mid.

*Consedine tallied 48 blocked shots this season to tie the Navy senior class record of Kim Cowling (1994). Consedine now has at least a share of each of the four class blocked shots records at Navy.

*With 206 rebounds this season, Consedine joins Connie James (1987-90) as the lone Mids to have tallied at least 200 rebounds in each of their four seasons.

*Geif broke the Navy record for field goal percentage recorded during the Patriot League season with a mark of 53.5%. That improved upon the standard of 52.7% set by Adria Schneck in 1995.

*Geif's 253 rebounds on the year is tied for fourth place at Navy for the most in a season and just missed tying the school freshman class record of 254 set by Laurie Coffey in 1996.

*Myers leaves Navy having set school career records for games played (124), games started (123), minutes played (3,940) and assists (511). She also ranks second in career steals (249), fifth in free throw percentage (79.0%), sixth in offensive rebounds (282), eighth in three-point field goals made (127) and three-point field goal percentage (33.5%), ninth in overall rebounds (703) and 11th in points (1,206). Additionally, she ranks sixth in league history for career assists.

*Myers also holds the school record for career assists (241) during the Patriot League season and ranks second in steals (118), sixth in scoring (562) and seventh in overall rebounds (317) in league games.

*Consedine holds Navy records in career defensive rebounds (727), blocked shots (215) and blocks per game (1.78). She also ranks second at Navy in career games played (121) and games started (116), third in three-point field goals made (165) and overall rebounds (882), fourth in double-doubles (26) and games with at least 10 rebounds (31) and seventh in points (1,418). Consedine's career block total ranks fourth in Patriot League history and her rebounding tally stands 10th in the league.

*Consedine also holds the Navy record for career blocked shots (94) and defensive rebounds (324) in Patriot League games, while ranking second in overall rebounds (386) and fifth in scoring (576) in league games.

Men's Cross Country (1-0, Won N-Star)

*Head Coach: Al Cantello

*Navy defeated Army in the Star Meet, 20-41, in Annapolis. The Midshipmen posted eight of the top-10 times in defeating the Black Knights for the 11th time in 14 years.

*Navy won the Patriot League title for the third consecutive year, defeating second-place American by nine points.

*The Midshipmen finished fifth out of 28 teams at the NCAA Mid-Atlantic Region Championship in University Park, Pa.

*During the course of the season, Navy was the highest-ranked Patriot League team as it was consistently in the top-five of the USTFCCA Mid-Atlantic Region poll.

*MIDN 1/C Andrew Hanko became the first Mid since Aaron Nichols in 1999 to compete at the NCAA Championship meet. Hanko earned the automatic bid to the NCAA Championship by placing sixth out of 194 runners at the Mid-Atlantic Regional Championship.

*Hanko's sixth-place finish at the NCAA regional meet earned him All-Mid-Atlantic Region honors for the second consecutive season.

*In leading the Mids to their third consecutive Patriot League title, head coach Al Cantello also garnered his third straight conference Coach of the Year honor. Cantello became just the third coach in Patriot League history to garner the accolade at least three consecutive seasons since the award's inception in 1991.

*Hanko became the first Navy runner to win consecutive Patriot League championships and conference Runner-of-the-Year laurels. He also became the seventh runner in Patriot League history to win consecutive conference titles.

*With an 18th-place finish at the Patriot League Championship, MIDN 4/C C.J. Elward posted the top time among all freshmen and was named Rookie of the Meet.

*Hanko became the first three-time, First-Team All-Patriot League honoree in Navy history. MIDN 2/C Ken Bunnell, MIDN 3/C Kyle Satterwhite, MIDN 1/C Matt DeVillers, MIDN 2/C Jeremy Haney and MIDN 3/C Dean Black all garnered Second-Team All-Patriot League accolades by finishing in the top 14 at the league championship.

*Hanko finished in the top 10 in all seven meets in which he competed in 2010. He was named Patriot League Runner of the Week on five occasions and his 10 career weekly league honors are the most by any runner in Patriot League history.

*DeVillers was one of seven conference student-athletes voted to the inaugural Men's Cross Country Academic All-Patriot League Team.

*A total of 14 Navy runners were named to the Patriot League Academic Honor Roll.

*Navy ran one of the toughest schedules in the region during the season as it competed against all but one school ranked in the final Mid-Atlantic Region top-15 poll.

*Competing with some of the best teams in the region, the Mids placed third out of 16 teams at the Harry Groves Invitational.

*The Midshipmen produced four of the top-nine times among the nine-team field to cruise to a first-place performance in the annual Navy Invitational.

Women's Cross Country (0-1)

*Head Coach: Karen Boyle

*Navy placed fourth at the Patriot League Championship with 87 points.

*MIDN 2/C Jess Palacio led Navy's effort at the Patriot League Championship with a third-place finish.

*The Midshipmen placed 10th out of 29 teams at the NCAA Mid-Atlantic Region Championship in University Park, Pa. Entering the meet, five of the teams in the region were ranked in the top-30 nationally.

*Palacio finished 21st overall at the Mid-Atlantic Regional Championship to earn All-Mid-Atlantic Region honors.

*MIDN 4/C Rachael Honrath garnered three consecutive Patriot League Rookie of the Week honors during the 2010 season.

*Palacio, who was twice named Patriot League Runner of the Week, took home first place in four meets in 2010 - Lehigh Invitational, Salty Dog Invitational, Great American Cross Country Festival and in the dual vs. Army.

*MIDN 3/C Brigid Byrne was one of seven conference student-athletes voted to the inaugural Women's Cross Country Academic All-Patriot League Team. Byrne was one of Navy's top-four finishers in every meet in which she competed.

*Navy landed a total of 14 student-athletes on the Patriot League Academic Honor Roll.

*As a team the Mids took home two invitational titles in 2010. Navy won the Lehigh Invitational to open the year and later took first as a team at the Great American Cross Country Festival.

*Despite a first-place finish by Palacio and three of the top-five times, the Midshipmen narrowly fell to Army, 26-29, in Annapolis.

Football (9-4, Won N-Star)

*Head Coach: Ken Niumatalolo

*This year marked just the 13th time in 129 years that Navy has won nine or more games in a season.

*Navy's nine wins in 2010 are tied for the fourth-most in school history.

*Navy received three points in the final *Associated Press* college football poll, placing the Mids 36th in the country.

*Navy's 31-17 victory over Army was its ninth-consecutive win over West Point, the longest streak in series history by either team.

*Navy's senior class finished their career with a 35-18 record (.660) over its four seasons. It won three Commander-In-Chief's Trophies, participated in four bowl games, won a bowl game and became just the third class in school history to beat Notre Dame three times.

*The 35 wins are tied for the second most in school history.

*The senior class finished 4-0 against Army, outscoring the Black Knights, 120-23.

*Navy clinched its eighth-consecutive winning season with a 38-37 victory over Central Michigan on Nov. 13.

*MIDN 1/C Ricky Dobbs was invited to play in the East-West Shrine All-Star Game. Dobbs joins Roger Staubach as the only other Navy quarterback to be selected for the game and is just the 23rd Navy player overall to be picked for the longest-running college all-star game.

*Dobbs and MIDN 1/C Greg Jones were named First Team All-East

*Navy head coach Ken Niumatalolo is just the second coach since World War II to lead Navy to a winning record in his first three years at the helm, joining Wayne Hardin (5-4-1 in 1959, 9-2 in 1960 and 7-3 in 1961) on the exclusive list.

*He joins Eddie Erdelatz and Wayne Hardin as the only coaches in school history to beat Notre Dame in back-to-back years.

*He is the only coach in school history to lead Navy to a bowl game in each of his first three seasons.

*His 27 wins are the most in school history in the first three years of a career.

*He is just the sixth coach in school history to win his first three games against Army. Paul Johnson went 6-0 against Army (2002-07), Wayne Hardin won his first five games (1959-63), George Welsh won his first four contests (1973-76), Eddie Erdelatz won his first three games against Army (1950-52) and Swede Larson won all three of his games against Army (1939-41).

*Dobbs was selected as the 2010 Lowe's Senior CLASS Award winner in the Football Bowl Subdivision. The announcement and trophy presentation were made on Dec. 22 by Lowe's, an official corporate partner of the NCAA®, during Navy's alumni and fan gathering at the USS Midway Museum in San Diego. The award, chosen by a nationwide vote of Division I football head coaches, national media and fans, is given annually to the most outstanding senior student-athlete in the NCAA's Football Bowl Subdivision. To be eligible for the award, a student-athlete must be classified as an NCAA Division I senior and have notable achievements in four areas of excellence - community, classroom, character and competition.

*MIDN 1/C Jeff Battipaglia was named the team's most inspirational player by his teammates at the Poinsettia Bowl luncheon on Dec. 22. Battipaglia missed just one practice in four years and started 40-consecutive games.

*MIDN 1/C and co-captains Wyatt Middleton and Dobbs contributed two historical plays in Navy's 31-17 victory over Army. Dobbs hit John Howell with a 77-yard touchdown pass in the second quarter to give Navy a 10-0 lead. It was the longest pass play in the history of the Army-Navy game (111 games). The biggest play, however, was made by Middleton who caught Army quarterback Trent Steelman's fumble in mid-air and raced 98 yards for a touchdown. It was the longest fumble return in 129 years of Navy football and it was the longest fumble return in the history of the Army-Navy game.

*MIDN 2/C John Dowd was named a 2010 ESPN Div. I First-Team Academic All-American by the College Sports Information Director's of America. Dowd is the first Navy football player to be named a First-Team Academic All-American since 1980 (Ted Dumbauld) and only Navy's sixth first-teamer in the sport of football. A Second-Team Academic All-American as a sophomore, Dowd is a Mechanical Engineering major with a 3.92 GPA.

*Dobbs amassed an 18-7 (.720) record as a starter, rushed for over 100 yards in 13 of his 25 career starts and scored at least one rushing touchdown in 22 of his 25 career starts.

*His 41 rushing touchdowns over the last two seasons (27 in 2009 and 14 in 2010) are an NCAA record for most rushing touchdowns by a quarterback in back-to-back years.

*He scored four or more rushing touchdowns on four different occasions during his career. No other Navy player has more than one-career four-rushing touchdown day.

*He was responsible for 410 points in his career, which are the most in school history. His 198 points responsible for in 2009 was a single-season record, while his 164 points this year are the fifth most in school history.

*He is Navy's all-time leading scorer, producing 296 points.

*His 49-career touchdowns and rushing touchdowns are the most in school history.

*His 49-career rushing touchdowns are tied for the fourth-most in NCAA history for a quarterback.

*Had 13-career 100-yard rushing days, the second most by a quarterback in school history.

*Averaged 10.2 yards per pass attempt (271 attempts for 2,770 yards) in his career, which is the second-best mark in school history.

*His 5,445 yards of career total offense ranks second behind Chris McCoy (5,958 yards, 1995-97).

*He rushed for 2,665-career yards, which is fifth all-time at Navy.

*His 14 touchdown passes in 2010 are the most TD passes in a single-season by a Navy quarterback in school history.

*His 1,527 passing yards in 2010 are the fifth-most in school history.

*His 2,770 career passing yards ranks eighth all-time at Navy.

*His 20 career touchdown passes are tied for the fifth-most in school history.

*His 687 career carries are the third most in school history.

*His 13 career 100-yard rushing days are tied for the fourth most in school history.

*Navy's offense converted 88 of its 170 third downs (.518) on the season, which was the fifth-best average in the country.

*MIDN 2/C Jabaree Tuani had a monster season for the Midshipmen, recording a team-high 15.5 tackles for a loss and finishing second on the team with five sacks.

*Tuani's 15.5 tackles for a loss are the ninth most in a season for a Navy player and his 30 career tackles for a loss places him just outside the top five. He is just 14 tackles for a loss behind Navy's school record holder, Andy Person (1992-95).

*Tuani has recorded 10.5 sacks in his career, which is the fifth most in school history. He needs 12 sacks next year to break the school record of 22 set by Person.

*Navy turned the ball over just 16 times on the year, which is tied for the 12th-fewest turnovers in the nation.

•The Navy defense recovered 16 fumbles on the year, which tied for the third most in the country.

*The Mids finished No. 1 in the country in fewest penalty yards per game, averaging 27.6 yards per contest.

*Navy was second nationally in fewest penalties per game, committing just 3.38 per contest.

*MIDN 1/C Tyler Simmons recorded 73 tackles over his last six games (12.2 per game), including a career-high 17 against both Duke and East Carolina.

*He averaged 10.1 tackles per game for the season, which was the 20th best average in the country.

*He finished with 131 tackles on the year, the most by a Navy player since Rob Caldwell recorded 140 in 2005 and the second most by a Navy player since 1993 (Javier Zuluaga had 144 in 1993 and 146 in 1992).

*Middleton recovered five fumbles on the year, which was tied for the most in the country. Teammate Tyler Simmons recovered three fumbles, which was tied for the seventh most in the country.

*Yarborough is the 11th Company Commander for the spring semester.

*Jones had a banner year for the Midshipmen at wide receiver with 33 catches for 662 yards and five touchdowns (20.1 yds/rec). His 33 catches are the most since 1994 when Damon Dixon caught 51 passes and his 662 receiving yards are the most since Chris Weiler had 711 receiving yards in 1984.

*His 662 receiving yards are the fourth most in school history for a single season.

*His 811-career receiving yards are the eighth most in program history.

*He averaged 20.8 yards per catch over his career (39 catches for 811 yards), the third-best average in Navy history.

*His five touchdown catches this fall is just one off the school record for single-season touchdown receptions.

*MIDN 1/C Kyle Delahooke averaged 41.2 yards per punt (5,643 yards on 137 punts) for his career, which is the second-best average in school history.

*MIDN 2/C Alexander Teich exploded for a career-high 210 yards on 26 carries against Notre Dame and caught a 31-yard touchdown off a screen pass. It was the most yards by a Navy back in series history and it marked the first time in school history that a fullback rushed for over 200 yards in a game. He was named the ECAC Player of the Week.

*MIDN 1/C Joe Buckley was named to the 2010 ESPN Academic All-District Football Team by the College Sports Information Director's of America. Buckley boasts a 3.38 GPA in Honors Economics. His class schedule this past semester included Principles of Propulsion, Advanced Macroeconomic Theory, Public Finance, Econometrics, Honors Research Seminar and Intermediate Spanish I.

•Making just his third-career start, MIDN 2/C quarterback Kriss Proctor rushed for 201 yards and a touchdown on 20 carries in Navy's 38-37 victory over Central Michigan. The 201 yards rushing are tied as the eighth most by a quarterback in school history and the most since Ricky Dobbs rushed for 224 yards against SMU in 2008.

*He is just the sixth different quarterback in school history to rush for 200 yards in a game.

*Proctor and Alexander Teich became the first duo in school history to rush for over 200 yards in the same season.

Sprint Football (5-2, 3-2 CSFL)

*Head Coach: Maj. Mitch Maury, USMC

*The Navy senior class amassed an impressive 25-2 (.926) record in their career. The 25 wins are tied for the most by any class in the program's 65-year history.

*Since the start of the 2001 campaign, the Midshipmen have boasted an impressive 62-5 (.925) overall record and a 38-4 (.905) mark in CSFL games.

*The Midshipmen landed 26 players on the all-league teams. In the last 10 seasons, Navy has compiled a total of 232 All-CSFL honors.

*By winning their first two games of the season, the Mids extended their program-record winning streak to 25 games.

*For the second consecutive season, Navy had seven players selected to the All-CSFL First Team: MIDN 2/C Sean Ferguson, MIDN 1/C Jeremy Harbaugh, MIDN 1/C Kaleb Kaetterhenry, MIDN 1/C Mike Nolan, MIDN 2/C Zzmarr Stone, MIDN 1/C Tyler Terronez and MIDN 2/C Matt Williams.

*The Midshipmen had six players earn Second-Team All-CSFL honors: 1/C JoJo Catrini, MIDN 3/C Mike DeLong, MIDN 2/C Jordan Foley, MIDN 4/C Adrian Montecinos, MIDN 1/C Emery Persinger and MIDN 1/C Luke Pye.

*Navy totaled 13 players on the Honorable Mention All-CSFL list: MIDN 1/C Brandon Beckler, MIDN 2/C Vince DeBenedetti, MIDN 2/C Erik Erlandson, MIDN 1/C Cartwright Hall, MIDN 3/C D.J. Hooper, MIDN 3/C Julian Jerzerick, MIDN 3/C Darrin McElroy, MIDN 1/C Cody Nissen, MIDN 3/C Will Parker, MIDN 1/C Viet Vo, MIDN 4/C Brendan West, MIDN 4/C David Williams and MIDN 4/C Wayne Worthington.

*Navy led the CSFL in defense as it allowed an average of just 184.3 yards per game.

*Despite missing one game due to an injury, Terronez led the CSFL in passing yards (1,175) and completions (87) as he became the first Navy quarterback to earn All-CSFL First-Team honors since James Olson in 2005.

*Terronez threw for a single-game school record 331 yards on 25-of-44 pass attempts against Cornell on Oct. 29.

*For the second year in a row, Navy's defense posted consecutive shutouts against Mansfield, 45-0, and Princeton, 67-0. The Mids posted a total of three shutouts in 2010, marking the second time in the past three seasons they have blanked three opponents. Over the program's 395 all-time games, Navy has shut out its opposition 124 times.

*David Williams and MIDN 2/C Mary Meehan each ran for over 100 yards in a 44-6 win over Catholic JV. The two had nearly identical numbers as Meehan carried 13 times for 102 yards with one touchdown, while Williams had 13 carries for 101 yards and two touchdowns. It marked the third time since 2006 that Navy had a pair of 100-yard rushers in one game.

*Four Mids garnered CSFL Player of the Week honors during the season as Stone (defense), Montecinos (special teams), Catrini (offense) and Terronez (offense) were all recognized.

*The Navy defense intercepted a total of 17 passes, including four that were returned for touchdowns. Stone led all CSFL players with four interceptions. In the season-opening win over Frostburg State JV, the Mids intercepted six passes and returned two for touchdowns. The six picks were the most by a Navy team since it also had six in a 45-7 win over Cornell in 2002. The two interception returns for scores tied a program record.

*Navy recorded its highest point total since 2007 in a 67-0 win over Princeton on Oct. 22. Navy outgained the Tigers, 537-27, as eight different players scored touchdowns for the Mids.

*Navy downed Frostburg JV, 24-0, Catholic JV, 44-6, to open the year. The Midshipmen have won 16 consecutive games against JV football teams, dating back to the 1998 season, and are 27-1 (.964) all-time in those contests.

Golf (1-0, Won the N-Star)

*Head Coach: Pat Owen

*Produced a 6-5 victory over Army in the annual Star Meet in September, marking the program's third-consecutive win over the Black Knights at West Point. The Mids have now won 10 of the last 13 Star Matches on the links.

*As the host institution, Navy placed second at the 2011 Patriot League Championship with a pair of Midshipmen picking up All-Patriot League recognition.

*MIDN 4/C David Hall earned First-Team All-Patriot League honors following his second-place performance at the league tournament and was also named the 2011 Patriot League Rookie of the Year. Hall is the fourth Navy golfer to be named the league's rookie of the year, joining Ryan Wielgus (2006), Ben Hayes (2008) and Peter Reilly (2009).

*MIDN 2/C Tim Shield was named to the All-Patriot League Second Team after tying for sixth at the conference championship. He is a first-time recipient of this award.

*MIDN 1/C Ben Hayes garnered PING All-Northeast Region honors at the conclusion of the year after posting Navy's low average for the year (73.4).

*Hayes won his third-career individual title by scoring medalist honors at the 2011 Navy Spring Invitational. Ironically, he has played in the event three times and has taken the title in each of those appearances.

*Hayes was named the Patriot League Golfer of the Month in October and March, while Hall took the honor in September.

*MIDN 2/C Peter Reilly was named the Patriot League Scholar-Athlete of the Year for the sport of golf, boasting a 3.45 GPA as a member of the Honors Program in the field of history. He is the fifth different Navy player and sixth overall receive this honor. A Navy player has been the recipient of this award in six of the last nine years (Brian Crum 2003, Billy Hurley 2004, Chris Renninger 2007, '08, David Miller 2009).

*Navy placed among the top 10 in seven of the 11 tournaments in which it played, posting top-five finishes at The Classic at Shelter Harbor (4th), the Navy Spring Invitational (4th), the Service Academy Classic (3rd) and the Patriot League Championship (2nd).

Gymnastics (1-3, Won N-Star)

*Head Coach: Sho Fukushima

*Defeated Army, 324-322.8, on Feb. 12 at West Point to win its third consecutive Star Meet. MIDN 2/C Andrew Faulk led the way as he won the all-around competition.

*Faulk garnered five USAG All-America honors at this year's USAG Collegiate Division Individual Championships. He placed second in the high bar and vault and then took third on the parallel bars, pommel horse, and in the all-around competition.

*Faulk was named ECAC Gymnast of the Week on three occasions this season and also earned three USAG Collegiate Division National Gymnast of the Week honors.

*Faulk earned All-ECAC accolades in the all-around and horizontal bars by finishing in the top six of each event at the conference championship meet.

*Team captain MIDN 1/C Dylan Parrott became a four-time USAG All-American in the floor exercise as he placed second in the event at the USAG Collegiate Division Individual Championships. He also became a two-time USAG All-American on the parallel bars by finishing fifth at the event.

*Parrott won the floor exercise at the ECAC Championship for the third consecutive year. He also earned All-ECAC honors in the high bar, pommel horse and parallel bars.

*Parrott was named ECAC Co-Senior Athlete of the Year at the ECAC Championship.

*Parrott was named ECAC Gymnast of the Week this season, giving him three such honors in his career.

*MIDN 4/C Chris Junghans was named ECAC Rookie of the Week after he was the highest-finishing freshman in the all-around competition at the Navy Open on Jan. 22.

*Navy posted a season-high team score of 334.55 at the All-Academy Championship, and finished in second place, ahead of Army.

*The Midshipmen placed second at the Navy Open, finishing just behind 11th-ranked Temple.

*Faulk finished in first place on five occasions in the all-around this season.

*Parrott and Faulk competed in the NCAA Championships. Parrott competed in the parallel bars, horizontal bar and floor exercise, while Faulk took part in the all-around competition and finished 18th.

Men's Lacrosse (4-9, 2-4 Patriot League)

*Head Coach: Richie Meade

*MIDN 1/C Michael Hirsch was named an Honorable Mention All-American, continuing Navy's long-standing tradition of having an All-American in each of the 90 years the award has been handed out.

*MIDN 4/C Tucker Hull became just the second Navy player to be named the Patriot League Rookie of the Year since joining the league in 2004.

*MIDN 1/C Andy Warner and MIDN 1/C Michael Hirsch were First-Team All-Patriot League selections. Warner was a second-team selection as a junior, while Hirsch was a two-time member of the first team.

*MIDN 4/C Harrison Chaires scored his first-career hat trick in the Mids' win over Holy Cross. With all three goals scored a man up, Chaires is Navy's first player to score three extra-man goals in a game since April 14, 2001, when Adam Borcz scored three at Penn State.

*MIDN Hull and MIDN 4/C Sam Jones were among the most decorated freshmen in Naval Academy lacrosse history. The duo paced Navy with the exact same stats - 38 points on 23 goals and 15 assists.

*Hull was rated as the eighth-best freshman in the country according to Inside Lacrosse, while Jones was No. 10.

*Hull and Jones were among the nation's most prolific rookie scoring tandem, tying for the third most points per game nationally (2.92). Among all players, they ranked 47th.

*With their 38 points, Hull and Jones finished tied for fourth on the Mids' all-time freshman scoring list. It's the most points by a Navy rookie since Ian Dingman posted 40 points in 2003.

*The duo tied for seventh on the Mids' all-time freshman assists list with 15.

*Hull and Jones finished the year with 23 goals, the sixth most by a Navy rookie and the most since Nick Mirabito scored 27 in 2005.

*Hull and Jones are among just 11 players in Academy history to score 20 or more goals as a freshman. It's the first rookie tandem to score 20 or more goals in program history.

*Both Hull and Jones scored four goals in a game this season, becoming just the fifth and sixth different rookies to achieve the feat during Richie Meade's 17-year coaching run. No two freshmen have scored four goals in a game in the same season until this year.

*MIDN 1/C Andy Warner ended his career on a 24-game point scoring streak that began on March 2, 2010 at Lehigh. Scored 64 points on 29 goals and 35 assists during the streak. It was tied as the 22nd-longest active streak nationally.

*Warner became just the 29th player in program history to join Navy's 100-Point Club. He is the first Mid to join the elite group since Nick Mirabito in 2008. With his assist against Johns Hopkins in the season finale, he moved into four-way tie with Mike Hannan (1976-78), Bob Pell (1970-72) and John Carter (1956-58) for 25th on the list with 101 points.

*Warner concluded his career ranked 15th on Navy's career assists list with 52.

*Scoring two goals and adding six assists in the Mids' come-from-behind win over Towson, Warner registered Navy's first eight-point performance since Jon Birsner scored eight points (OG-8A) against Colgate on March 19, 2005. It was the most assists by a Mid since Birsner posted six assists against Holy Cross on March 26, 2006.

*MIDN 2/C Logan West finished the season ranked seventh on the Mids' single-season wins list with 110 and stands sixth on Navy's all-time career faceoff wins list with 175.

*MIDN 2/C RJ Wickham broke into the top 10 on Navy's career saves list following a 10-save effort against Maryland. With 338 saves, he is 17 stops shy of tying ninth-place Louis Brown, who amassed 355 saves from 1987-90.

Women's Lacrosse (15-6, 4-2 in the Patriot League)

*Head Coach: Cindy Timchal

*Navy advanced to the NCAA Tournament for the second straight year. The Mids took on eventual national runner-up Maryland in the NCAA First Round at College Park. Maryland defeated Navy, 19-6.

*Navy made its second straight appearance in the NCAA Tournament in just its fourth season as a Division I program.

*Navy earned an automatic bid to the 2011 NCAA Tournament after defeating Northeast Conference Champion Quinnipiac, 20-5, in the NCAA Play-In Game at Navy-Marine Corps Memorial Stadium.

*The Mids won the 2011 Patriot League Championship by defeating Colgate, 15-14. Navy had trailed 11-6 early in the second half and also trailed 14-10 with 15 minutes remaining. The Mids then reeled off a 5-0 run, capped with the game-winning goal with 28.8 seconds remaining to earn their second straight league championships. Colgate was the top-seed and host of the Patriot League Championship.

*Navy entered the league tournament as the No. 3 seed (4-2) and defeated Lehigh, 10-8, in the semifinals. Navy was able to rebound from a loss to the Mountain Hawks on the final weekend of the regular season to earn the win in the semifinals to make its third straight trip to the league title game.

*Navy clinched a berth in the Patriot League Tournament with an 11-10 come-from-behind win at American. Navy trailed by one with three minutes to go before tying the game and eventually going ahead on a goal with 18 seconds to go.

*Navy defeated long-time Patriot League power Colgate twice in 2011, once in the regular season and once in the championship game. Colgate defeated Navy in the first three contests between the two schools, with the worst defeat being a 17-4 decision in the 2009 league championship game. Since then, Navy has beaten Colgate four straight times, including in the Patriot League semifinals in 2010 and the championship in 2011.

*The Mids earned one of their biggest non-conference wins in program history with a 9-8 defeat of Ohio State at home on February 18. Ohio State was unranked at the time, but spent the majority of the season in the top-20.

*Navy played both the national champion and the national runner-up this season. Navy hosted eventual national champion Northwestern on March 3, falling 18-8, and also played national runner-up Maryland in the NCAA First Round. The other two teams in the Final Four, Duke and North Carolina, squared up against Navy in the 2010 season.

*In its first four seasons, Navy has taken on six ranked opponents, including four top-5 teams.

*Head coach Cindy Timchal extended her all-time record of lacrosse wins to 394 and is just six wins away from becoming the first college lacrosse coach with 400 wins.

*Timchal made her 23rd appearance in the NCAA Tournament and coached her 44th career tournament game.

*Timchal now owns a career record of 394-105 (.790) in 29 years of coaching.

* In just four seasons as a Division I program, Navy has won 58 games (58-19, .753). There are only four teams in the country that have won more games in the last four years (Northwestern, Maryland, North Carolina and Fairfield). The closest Patriot League team in wins over the last four years is Lehigh, which has 45 wins and is 13 games behind Navy.

*Navy opened the season at 5-0, and pushed its record to 8-1, with its only loss over the first nine games coming against eventual national champion Northwestern.

*The Mids played three games on national television this season. The CBS Sports Network aired Navy's home games against Colgate and Lehigh, as well as the Patriot League Championship game.

*Navy had a program-record six players chosen to the All-Patriot League team in 2011, pushing its four-year total to 17 selections. Navy also set a new program record with four players on the first team.

*MIDN 2/C Jasmine DePompeo flourished in her first year as a starting attack. DePompeo led the team in points (99), goals (57) and assists (42). The 42 assists established a new Navy single season record.

*DePompeo was named an All-American by WomensLax.com and became the first Midshipmen to earn IWLCA All-Region honors, after being selected to the All-South Region Second Team.

*DePompeo was also chosen as the Patriot League Offensive Player of the Year and earned a spot on the All-Patriot League First Team.

*With a new Patriot League Championship record of 13 points and seven assists in the tournament, DePompeo was named the Patriot League Tournament's Most Valuable Player and to the all-tournament team. DePompeo also set a Patriot League Championship individual game record with nine points in the championship game.

*DePompeo's best performance of the year came in the Patriot League Championship game where she tied her career-high of nine points on five goals and four assists. DePompeo came through when Navy needed her most, scoring seven points on five goals and two assists in the second half as the Mids erased a five-goal deficit to defeat Colgate.

*DePompeo earned a number of weekly honors throughout the season, including being named the Synapse Sports National Offensive Player of the Week and to the Inside Lacrosse National Team of the Week after her performance at the Patriot League Championship.

*DePompeo also earned a Patriot League Offensive Player of the Week honor on Feb. 21 after scoring 11 points on seven goals and four assists in wins over Ohio State and Davidson.

*DePompeo also produced a nine-point performance with six goals and three assists in a win over Lafayette earlier in the season. DePompeo registered 11 five-point games, 11 hat tricks and had at least two assists on 12 occasions.

*The 99 points scored by DePompeo are the second-most in a single season in program history.

*DePompeo ranked first in the Patriot League and third in the nation in total points (99), fourth in the nation in points per game (4.71), eighth in total goals (57), sixth in total assists (42) and eighth in assists per game (2.00).

*Also a standout in the classroom, DePompeo earned CoSIDA Academic All-District II First Team honors.

*MIDN 1/C Caitlin Mandrin Hill and MIDN 1/C Katrina Nietsch became the first four-year letterwinners in program history. Both were freshmen on Navy's first team in 2008 and the duo helped Navy to a pair of Patriot League Championships and two NCAA Appearances in the first four years of the program.

*Mandrin Hill, the 2011 team captain, leaves Navy as the program leader in assists (96), ground balls (129), caused turnovers (84) and games played (75). Mandrin Hill also ranks second in school history with 192 career points.

*Mandrin Hill was selected to the 2011 All-Patriot League First Team at the attack position and also to the league's all-tournament team.

*Mandrin Hill was chosen as the Patriot League Midfield Player of the Year on April 18 after scoring the game-tying goal and assisting on the game-winning goal in a victory over American. Mandrin Hill grabbed the game's final two draw controls and had nine draw controls in the game.

*Mandrin Hill also earned a spot on the Synapse Sports National Weekly Honor Roll on May 10 after scoring six points on five goals and an assist and grabbing seven draw controls in Navy's NCAA Play-In Game win over Quinnipiac.

*Mandrin Hill ranked second on the team in 2011 with 69 points (35 g, 34 a) and led Navy with 75 draw controls.

*Mandrin Hill became the second Midshipmen to represent Navy in the IWLCA North-South All-Star Game. Mandrin Hill scored a goal to help her South team to an 8-6 victory in the contest.

*Mandrin Hill ranked eight in the nation in draw controls per game (3.95), and 15th in assists per game (1.79).

*Nietsch, a midfielder, was named to the All-Patriot League First Team in 2011 after earning all-league second team honors the previous three years. Nietsch is the first four-time all-league player at Navy.

*Nietsch is the program's all-time leader in games started (68) and is second in points (126) and ground balls (122).

*Nietsch tallied 29 goals and 27 ground balls as a senior. Nietsch tallied the game-winning goal with 28.8 seconds remaining in the Patriot League Championship and also scored the game-winner in Navy's victory over Ohio State. Nietsch scored eight game-winners in her career, which is tied for the program record.

*Nietsch was also named to the Patriot League All-Tournament team, the Patriot League All-Academic Team and the CoSIDA Academic All-District II Second Team.

*In addition to being Navy's nominee for the NCAA Woman of the Year Award, Nietsch also won the U.S. Naval Academy Foundation's Cheryl Dolyniuk Award. This award is given to the female midshipmen of the graduating class that has excelled in athletics, leadership and academics during her four years at the Academy.

*MIDN 2/C Kierstin King was Navy's fourth selection to the All-Patriot League First Team. King, a defender, scooped a team-high 34 ground balls and caused 15 turnovers. King also controlled seven draws and helped Navy's defense hold opponents to 9.71 goals per game. The Navy defense held 12 opponents to under 10 goals on the season.

*King was named the Patriot League Defensive Player of the Week on March 21 after tallying four ground balls a draw control and two caused turnovers in a win over Lafayette.

*King was also chosen to the Patriot League All-Tournament Team.

*MIDN 3/C Kathy Young earned a midfield spot on the All-Patriot League Second Team. Young ranked third on the team with 46 goals and added eight assists for 54 points. Young led the team with 13 free-position goals and also had 30 ground balls and 30 draw controls.

*Young had nine hat tricks and scored over five points in a game three times.

*On May 11, Young was named to the Inside Lacrosse National Team of the Week after scoring five goals in Navy's NCAA Play-In Game win over Quinnipiac.

*Young scored five goals in a win at American on April 13.

*Young was selected to the Patriot League All-Academic Team.

*MIDN 4/C Aimee Gennaro ranked third on the team with 67 points on 53 goals and 14 assists. Gennaro, an attack, was chosen to the All-Patriot League Second Team in the at-large position.

*Gennaro was tabbed as the WomensLax.com National Rookie of the Week on March 14, after setting school records for most points (8) and goals (7) in a game by a freshman in a win over Bucknell. The eight points against Bucknell was a season high.

*Gennaro also earned five Patriot League weekly honors. Gennaro was the Patriot League Offensive Player of the Week on February 28 and earned rookie of the week honors four times.

*Gennaro's four goals in her career debut, a win over Mount St. Mary's, set a Navy record for most goals by a freshman in a career debut.

*MIDN 4/C Molly Hamilton ranked second on the team with 33 draw controls and also scored 26 points on 22 goals and four assists.

*Hamilton had a pair of four goal games and tallied five points in win over Bryant. Hamilton also controlled a season-high nine draws in the NCAA Play-In Game win over Quinnipiac.

*MIDN 2/C Danielle Vivonetto returned midway through the season after recovering from an offseason injury. Vivonetto notched her 100th career goal and was on the field during crunch time in the Patriot League Tournament.

*MIDN 2/C Elaina Ponchione and MIDN 3/C Michelle Verbeeck combined to give Navy a formidable duo in the cage.

*Ponchione started the first 13 games of the season and amassed a 9-4 record with an 8.87 GAA. Ponchione's best game was a 15-save effort in a win over Ohio State. The 15 saves set a Navy record and the goalie held the Buckeyes to eight goals.

*For her performance against Ohio State, Ponchione was named to the Synapse Sports National Weekly Honor Roll and was named the Patriot League Defensive Player of the Week.

*Verbeeck started the final eight games of the year and posted a 6-2 record that included two wins in the Patriot League Tournament and a win in the NCAA Play-In Game. Verbeeck registered a 10.68 GAA and made 71 saves.

*Verbeeck's finest performance may have been the Patriot League semifinal win over Lehigh. Verbeeck made 11 saves and held the Mountain Hawks to eight goals to secure a bid to the Patriot League Championship.

*Verbeeck was selected as the Patriot League Defensive Player of the Week on April 18, after going 2-0 with wins over American and Longwood. Verbeeck held Longwood to six goals over 60 minutes and made 12 saves.

*In addition to the play of King on the Navy defensive backline, MIDN 3/C Claire Olechowski, MIDN 3/C Jen Eikenberg and MIDN 2/C Dominique Wright also provided consistent play throughout the season. MIDN 3/C Beth Young also played a pivotal role on Navy's defense from her midfield position. Both Olechowski and Eikenberg picked up a Patriot League Defensive Player of the Week award.

*MIDN 4/C Jill Coughlin provided the game-winning goal against American with 18 seconds to go to clinch Navy's postseason bid. Coughlin was named the Patriot League Rookie of the Week for her performance.

*Gennaro and DePompeo were the first players in the nation in 2011 to surpass 50 points. Both players did it on March 20th in a win over Lafayette.

*As a team, Navy ranked first in the Patriot League and sixth in the nation in total points (396), 15th in the nation in scoring margin (+3.38), 17th in scoring offense (13.10), 14th in win percentage (15-6, .714) and 23rd in scoring defense

Rifle (9-1, Won N-Star)

*Head Coach: Bill Kelley

*Navy finished the season with a 9-1 dual-meet record, its ninth time in Coach Kelley's 12 years at Navy that it has finished with one or fewer losses.

*Navy claimed its eighth straight MAC air rifle championship and its 11th MAC Smallbore championship in the last 12 years.

*Navy was selected for its 26th NCAA Championships appearance, the third most in NCAA history behind Murray State (28) and West Virginia (28).

*Navy has been selected for 20 straight NCAA Championships, the third longest streak in NCAA history and second-longest active streak.

*Navy placed seventh in both the smallbore and air rifle disciplines at the NCAA Championships, good for a seventh-place overall finish.

*Navy's air rifle score of 2343 against Akron in the MAC Championship was the sixth-highest air rifle score in school history.

*MIDN 1/C Chris Burleson was named second-team smallbore All-American. He finished his career as a four-time All-American.

*Burleson was the MAC smallbore champion with a score of 588, and finished second in air rifle with a 585.

*Burleson was named first-team All-MAC in both the smallbore and air rifle disciplines.

*Burleson's 580.3 smallbore average was the third-best smallbore average in school history.

*MIDN 1/C Alison Lankes was named first-team All-MAC in both smallbore and air rifle disciplines.

*MIDN 3/C Ryan Williams was named second-team All-MAC in smallbore and first-team All-MAC in air rifle. His air rifle score of 594 in the MAC Championship was the third-best air rifle score in school history.

*MIDN 1/C Kenan Wang was named second-team All-MAC in smallbore.

•MIDN 2/C Allison Paulson was named second-team All-MAC in air rifle.

Men's Heavyweight Rowing (6-3)

*Head Coach: Rick Clothier

*All five of Navy's competing boats at the IRA National Championships finished higher in the overall standings than in 2010. The Mids' open four and varsity four boats both finished fourth at the IRA National Championships.

*The varsity eight placed 11th at the IRA National Championships, while the freshman eight took seventh.

*Navy had all five boats finish in the top five of their respective finals at the Eastern Sprints Championships. Navy's varsity eight crew took third in the petite final, while the first freshman boat advanced to the grand final for the first time since 1994 where it took fourth place. As a team, the Mids placed sixth overall.

*The Mids swept Columbia and George Washington in all four races on April 30. In defeating Columbia in the varsity eight race, Navy claimed the Maxwell Stevenson Trophy for the first time since 2007.

*Navy boats combined to go 11-0 at the George Washington Invitational. The varsity eight went 3-0 and was crowned champions of the invitational.

*The varsity eight boat was voted "National Crew of the Week" in an online poll at row2k.com after going undefeated at the George Washington Invitational.

*Navy opened its fall season by winning the Poughkeepsie Regatta - defeating perennial power Cornell by 1.7 seconds.

*The varsity eight boat ended the fall season with its best finish ever at the Princeton Chase as the Mids placed fourth.

Men's Lightweight Rowing (3-3)

*Head Coach: Steve Perry

*Navy posted a total of four top-two finishes and all but one boat reached the grand finals at the Eastern Sprints. The varsity eight took sixth at the event.

*The second freshman and fourth varsity crews won their respective grand final races at the Eastern Sprints.

*The Mids won three of four races against Penn, including the varsity eight, which defeated the Quakers for the 11th consecutive season to retain the Callow Cup.

*The Midshipmen won two of three races, including both varsity races, against Columbia.

*The varsity eight opened the spring season by going 1-1 against Princeton and MIT; Navy fell to the Tigers, but defeated MIT by over 20 seconds.

*Navy's varsity eight placed seventh and the varsity four took fifth at the IRA National Championships.

*The Mids wrapped up their fall schedule with the varsity and second varsity eight boats each placing in the top 11 at the Princeton Chase.

Women's Rowing (10-5)

*Head Coach: Mike Hughes

*Navy won the ECAC Mid-Atlantic/New England Regional Championship by placing first in the varsity eight, second varsity eight and varsity four races. Navy won the overall points title by 11 points and the Directors Cup for "A" entries by nine points.

*The varsity four boat took first place at the Patriot League Championships for the second consecutive year. As a team, Navy placed second - just five points behind first-place Bucknell.

*Navy's varsity four crew also had a strong showing at the Eastern Sprints where it won the petite final.

*The Mids' varsity eight boat went 2-1 at the George Washington Invitational, while all four boats combined to go 4-0 on day two of the event.

*The varsity eight opened the season at the Murphy Cup Regatta by going 8-2 and finishing third in the final.

*MIDN 1/C Michelle Romero and MIDN 1/C Alexandra Lado earned All-Patriot League honors. Romero earned first-team accolades for the second consecutive season, while Lado earned her first-career honor in being named to the second-team.

*MIDN 3/C Jacqueline Penichet was voted to the 11-member Academic All-Patriot League Team.

*Had a boat place fourth out of 16 teams in the Annapolis Yacht Club Fall Series #1 in the J105 Class. In the same regatta, had a boat place fourth of 14 boats in the PHRF A2 Class.

*A week later in the Annapolis Yacht Club Fall Series #2, placed first and second out of 14 boats in the PHRF A2 Class.

Men's Soccer (7-5-4, 2-2-3 Patriot League, Won N-Star)

*Head Coach: Dave Brandt

*MIDN 4/C Martin Sanchez was named Second-Team Freshmen All-American by *CollegeSoccerNews.com*

*MIDN 1/C Alex Foskett was named Second Team Academic All-American, while MIDN 2/C Same Miller was named Third Team Academic All-American

*Navy recorded its first winning season since 2005 with a 7-5-4 record. The Midshipmen went 2-2-3 in the Patriot League, good for sixth place, their highest finish since the 2005 campaign.

*Navy started the season 6-1-0 and ranked as high as No. 2 in the NSCAA / Mid-Atlantic regional rankings. Navy was receiving votes in the NSCAA National Top 25 poll on Sept. 28, ranking 31st among teams receiving votes. Navy would finish the season 10th in the regional rankings.

*Navy held its opponents to just 13 goals on the season, ranking 22nd nationally in goals against average (0.77). The 13 goals were the fewest since the 2001 team held its opponents to a school-record 10 goals. Navy also ranked in the top 50 in shutout percentage (33rd / 0.44) and save percentage (30th / .817).

•Navy posted a 4-1-2 record at the Glenn Warner Soccer Facility, outscoring its opponents 14-2 in the process. Navy averaged a Patriot League-best 630 fans per game. Navy's season-high crowd of 906 against VMI on Sept. 4, 2010, was the 10th-largest men's crowd in facility history.

*Navy won 11 Patriot League weekly awards throughout the year, easily the most in the league. Navy won six Rookie of the Week awards. The 11 weekly awards were more than the combined total the program won from 2004-09 (10). The Mids won just 13 weekly awards from 2002-09.

*MIDN 3/C Michael Rakoczy was named to the NSCAA / Mid-Atlantic region second team.

* Sanchez was named to the NSCAA / Mid-Atlantic region third team. He was one of just two freshmen named to the three teams (33 players in all).

* Rakoczy was also named second-team All-Patriot League. Rakoczy was second on the team with 11 points (5 g, 1 a). Rakoczy was named to the *CollegeSoccerNews.com* Team of the Week for his game-winning goal against Army. Rakoczy was also named the Patriot League Offensive Player of the Week after scoring two goals in a 3-1 win over Delaware.

*MIDN 4/C Dave Player was named Patriot League Offensive Player of the Week on Sept. 7, and the Patriot League Rookie of the Week on Oct. 4. Arnold's five goals led the team and were tied for the fourth most by a freshman in school history.

*Navy posted a winning season (9-8-3) for the 16th-consecutive year.

*Navy spent two weeks ranked in the NSCAA Mid-Atlantic Region Poll and a third week receiving votes. The Mids appeared at No. 9 in the poll on Aug. 30 and were slotted at No. 10 on Oct. 4.

*Additionally, Navy appeared in TopDrawerSoccer.com's Tournament 64 Projections for the first three weeks of the season. The Mids were ranked as high as No. 54 in the tournament rankings.

*Navy played four teams that advanced to the NCAA Tournament and posted a 1-2-1 record against those opponents. Navy faced Penn (W, 3-2), Lehigh (T, 1-1), Texas (L, 5-1) and James Madison (L, 1-0).

*Navy recorded two road wins over regionally ranked opponents. The Mids defeated George Mason, 1-0, in overtime on Aug. 29 and came-from-behind to beat Penn, 3-2, Sept. 26. Both teams were ranked No. 10 in the NSCAA Mid-Atlantic Region Poll at the time of the contests.

*Navy and Army met in West Point for game that was nationally televised on the Fox Soccer Channel. Army won, 1-0.

*The Mids erupted for nine goals during a two-game stretch in September. Navy defeated Manhattan, 5-0, and then breezed past VMI, 4-0.

*Navy was playing its best during a four-game stretch midway through the season. The Mids posted four wins in a row, defeating Duquesne (3-2, OT), Penn (3-2), Colgate (2-0) and Delaware State (6-0).

*The six goals against Delaware State was Navy's highest output of the season.

*After a slow 0-1-1 start to the season, Navy rebounded to post back-to-back 1-0 wins over Mount St. Mary's and George Mason on the second weekend of the season.

*Navy led the Patriot League in points per game (5.35), goals per game (1.80) and assists per game (1.75).

*MIDN 1/C Carissa Youker was named to the All-Patriot League Second Team for the third-straight season.

*Youker led Navy in goals (6) for the third season in a row and also led Navy with six assists and 18 points.

*Youker finishes her career ranked second at Navy in game-winning goals (13), seventh in goals (24) and ninth in points (62).

*MIDN 4/C Paloma Perez joined Youker on the All-Patriot League Second Team. The newcomer scored five goals in her first eight games of action. On the season, she ranked third on the team with 12 points (five goals and two assists).

*Paced by MIDN 4/C Ashlynn Soellner's six goals and Perez's five goals, the plebe class combined to score 16 of Navy's 36 goals on the season. The freshmen class contributed 44 percent of the team's season goal total.

*MIDN 3/C Hannah Legler led Navy with a 1.10 goals-against average and posted her first career shutout against Lafayette on Oct. 24. Legler combined with MIDN 4/C Alexes Lopez-Shaw on six other shutouts and Lopez-Shaw posted her own solo shutout against Holy Cross on Oct. 10.

*Trailing 2-0 against Presbyterian on Aug. 22, Navy scored two second-half goals to cap an improbable comeback. MIDN 2/C Katelyn George headed in a goal in the 87th minute to salvage the tie. Navy took 37 shots in the game, the third-highest single-game total in school history and the most since the 1998 season.

*The team hosted its annual Navy Invitational Sept. 10-12. The Mids lost in overtime to Charleston Southern, 2-1, and defeated Manhattan, 5-0. MIDN 2/C Kelsey Learned, MIDN 2/C Fallon Puppolo and Youker represented Navy on the all-tournament team.

*Five different players earned Patriot League weekly awards. MIDN 1/C Christine Calderon was named the Patriot League Offensive Player of the Week on Aug. 23 to kick off the season. The Mids picked up two awards the following week, as Soellner was named offensive player of the week and George was chosen as the defensive player of the week. Youker was selected as the offensive player of the week Sept. 27 and Perez earned her first offensive player of the week award on Oct. 4. Perez became just the sixth freshman in Navy history to earn the league's top offensive weekly honor.

*George, Learned, MIDN 1/C Katie Kelly, MIDN 2/C Kate Herren, and MIDN 3/C Amber Haling anchored a defensive backline that ranked third in goals against average during Patriot League play.

*Navy won two games in overtime by way of the "Golden Goal." Soellner headed in a corner kick from George in the 99th minute to defeat George Mason, 1-0. The Mids also posted a "Golden Goal" win over Duquesne, 3-2, when Perez scored in the 99th minute.

*The Midshipmen played in seven overtime games on the season, the second-most in program history behind the eight that the team played in 2008.

*In total, Navy scored seven goals in the 85th minute or later, including overtime.

*Soellner led the team with four game-winning goals. Soellner notched the game-winners in wins over Mount St. Mary's, George Mason, Colgate and Holy Cross.

*MIDN 1/C Jessica Grupp served as the 18th team captain in program history.

*Navy led the Patriot League in multiple-point performances with eight different players accomplishing the feat. Youker was the only player to do it twice. Other players to register multiple-point efforts in a game were MIDN 1/C Anastasia Abid, Calderon, Herren, MIDN 4/C Hannah Morse, Perez, Puppolo and Soellner.

*George, Serfass and Puppolo started all 20 games for Navy on the season.

*Youker ranked first in the Patriot League in assists per game (0.32), third in points per game (0.95), sixth in goals per game (0.32).

*Soellner led the Patriot League in game-winning goals per game (0.20), ranked sixth in points per game (0.75) and eighth in goals per game (0.80).

*Herren ranked third in the Patriot League with five assists.

*Grupp, MIDN 1/C Traci Willemse, Youker, Abid, Fruin, MIDN 3/C Kelcie Davis, MIDN 4/C Elizabeth Hoerner and MIDN 4/C Morgan Tilley represented Navy on the Patriot League Academic Honor Roll.

*Willemse was honored with the USNA Coaches' Calvert Award. This award is presented to the varsity letterman of the graduating class selected by the varsity coaches as having persevered the most in their career.

Squash (23-10)

*Head Coach: Craig Dawson

*Placed 16th at the 2011 College Squash Association Team Championship.

*Navy reached the 20-win mark for the seventh time in school history, including the third-straight year. Under 11th-year head coach Craig Dawson, the Mids have record 20 or more wins five times.

*MIDN 1/C Allan Lutz and MIDN 3/C Hunter Bouchard competed at the College Squash Association Individual Championship. Both playing in the Molloy Division, Bouchard advanced to the round of 16 before bowing out. Lutz closed out his career losing in the consolation semifinals.

*Lutz became the just the second player under Dawson's tutelage to win 90 matches, while also becoming the winningest player during his 11 years. Lutz produced a 99-36 record.

*Lutz scored a 3-1 victory over MIDN 4/C Hunter Beck to become the 36th different midshipman in its 53-year history to win the Barb Trophy.

Men's Swimming & Diving (12-1, Won N-Star)

*Head Coach: Bill Roberts

*Navy won all 16 events in posting a 246-54 victory over Army. It was the 20th consecutive season in which the Mids have defeated the Black Knights.

*Included among Navy's victories was a 167-133 win over Princeton. The decision was the first loss for the Tigers in their home pool since their DeNunzio Pool facility opened during the 1990-91 season (92 meets), and was Navy's first road win over Princeton since 1963 (22 meets).

*Navy's only loss during its 12-1 regular season was a 156-136 setback to Virginia, a team that would go on to place eighth at the 2011 NCAA Championship.

*Navy scored 1,056 points to win the Patriot League title. It is Navy's eighth league crown in as many years of competing at the championship, which establishes a new record for the most consecutive titles won in the sport. Additionally, it is Navy's third consecutive season of establishing a new meet record for team points.

*Navy scored 765.5 points to win the 22-team field ECAC Championship. It is Navy's third title in as many years of competing at the meet.

*Navy was ranked as high as 24th in the national poll this season.

*MIDN 1/C Olaf Olson advanced to the NCAA Championship in both the one (32nd) and three-meter (30th) springboard diving events, MIDN 2/C Mark Meyer competed at the national championship in the 200 fly (29th) and MIDN 3/C Just Vagts competed in the 1650 freestyle event (25th) at the meet.

*MIDN 2/C Mac Anthony was selected as the Patriot League Men's Swimmer of the Meet, MIDN 4/C Zach Ingold was named as the Patriot League Men's Rookie Swimmer of the Meet and Bill Roberts was tabbed as the Patriot League Coach of the Meet.

*Navy won all 16 events in posting a 240.5-59.5 victory over Army. It was the 22nd consecutive season in which the Mids have defeated the Black Knights, which ties the record for the most consecutive victories by any team in the Army-Navy rivalry.

*Navy scored 760 points to place second at the Patriot League Championship. Navy has placed either first (twice) or second in each of the last five championships.

*Despite not sending a full roster of competitors, the Mids scored 285.5 points to place sixth at the 22-team field ECAC Championship.

*MIDN 3/C Laura Gorinski posted a qualifying time for the 2012 U.S. Olympic Trials in the 100 and 200 breaststroke events. She is the first women's swimmer in Navy history to qualify for the Olympic Trials in multiple events.

*Gorinski was selected as the Patriot League Scholar-Athlete of the Year for her sport, while also being named to the Patriot League All-Academic Team for women's swimming and diving.

*Gorinski was named as the ECAC Co-Swimmer of the Meet.

*Navy's Feb. 27 win over Loyola was John Officer's 400th as the head coach of the Mids. He has compiled a 409-273 record in his 26 seasons on The Yard.

Women's Tennis (22-10, 3-0 Patriot League)

*In just its second year of varsity competition, won a school record 22 matches and advanced to the championship match of the Patriot League Tournament.

*Won a school-record nine consecutive matches from March 15 to April 23, a streak that was snapped in the league tournament finals.

*Went 3-0 during league play in the regular season and in its two years of play, is 5-1 in the Patriot League during the regular season.

*Avenged a loss to Bucknell in the 2010 Patriot League Tournament semifinals with a thrilling 4-2 victory over the Bison in this year's semifinal round. This year's match lasted four hours and five minutes.

*After starting the year 1-2, the Midshipmen won 10 of their next 11 matches to improve to 11-3.

*Went 19-6 at home and is now 29-8 all-time at the Brigade Sports Complex.

*Owns a 35-14 dual-meet record in its two varsity seasons.

*Head coach Keith Puryear was named the Patriot League Coach of the Year and now owns a 478-317 career record in 22 years as a collegiate head coach.

*MIDN 3/C Amanda Griffin and MIDN 3/C Emani Decquir were both named to the all-Patriot League first team.

Men's Indoor Track and Field (8-2)

*Navy captured the Patriot League Championship with a dramatic come-from-behind performance to overtake Army.

*The Mids trailed Army by 32 points with four events to go when the team turned the tide on their service academy rival. The Mids won the pole vault and the 3,000m to get within two points of Army with only two relay races to go. Navy then won the distance medley relay to enter the final event tied with Army. Navy then won the final race, the 4x400m relay to clinch the team title.

*Navy finished the indoor league meet with 171 points. Army was second with 165 and Bucknell third with 151. The Mids also hosted the championship meet in the Wesley A. Brown Field House.

*The championship was Navy's fourth since joining the Patriot League.

*Navy was picked third in the preseason poll.

*Head coach Stephen Cooksey was named the Patriot League Coach of the Year for the fifth time.

*MIDN 2/C Cody Rome, MIDN 1/C Andrew Hanko and MIDN 2/C Matthew Evers were all double winners at the Patriot League Championship.

*Rome won the 3,000m run with a new championship and facility record of 8:07.51 and also ran a leg of Navy's winning distance medley relay team.

*Rome was named the Patriot League Indoor Track and Field Scholar-Athlete of the Year. Rome is an applied mathematics major with a 3.55 GPA. He was also a 2010 CoSIDA/ESPN The Magazine Academic All-District II First-Team selection and has earned a spot on the Patriot League Academic Honor Roll in each of the past two seasons.

*Rome finished the season ranked 21st on the national performance list with a school-record time of 7:55.12 in the 3,000m run. Rome missed the NCAA automatic qualifying standard by .72 seconds. Rome finished the season ranked No. 1 in the Mid-Atlantic Region in the 3,000m.

*Rome was named the Patriot League Scholar-Athlete of the Year for Indoor Track & Field.

*Rome was named a Second-Team Academic All-American by the College Sports Information Director's of America.

*Navy fell to Army in the Indoor Star Meet, 96-85. The all-time indoor series is now tied at 25-25-2.

*Rome was a triple winner at the indoor Star Meet, winning the mile run and the 1,000m and also running on the Navy's winning 4x800m relay team (7:55.25).

*Della Pelle won the 800m, placed second in the mile and was on the winning 4x800 team.

*Hanko won the 3,000-meter title at his third straight Army-Navy dual.

*Navy went 1-2 in the weight throw as Ricks placed first and Porter was second. A Navy thrower has now won the weight throw in four straight seasons.

*MIDN 2/C Chris Boniwell won the shot put with his season-best toss of 51-5½.

*Navy grabbed four Patriot League weekly awards. Della Pelle, Ash and Rome all earned Patriot League Track-Athlete of the Week honors and MIDN 4/C Clay Elward earned a Patriot League Rookie of the Week accolade.

*Navy finished the indoor season ranked No. 4 ranking in the USTFCCCA Mid-Atlantic Region Poll. The Mids were ranked in the top-5 the entire season, with the high-water mark being a No. 2 showing on Jan. 25.

*Rome finished the indoor season as the top-ranked runner in the Mid-Atlantic Region in the 3,000m and Hanko was ranked third in the 5,000m.

*The team qualified 30 athletes to the IC4A Championship over 16 different events. Navy finished tied for 20th at the IC4A Meet.

*The majority of Navy's IC4A qualifiers came from the distance corps. The Mids had 10 runners qualify in the 3,000m run, six in the mile, five in the 5,000m and four in the 1,000m.

*Bunnell, Haney and Simmonds earned IC4A All-East honors with top-eight performances at the regional meet.

*Bunnell placed second in the 3,000m run (8:12.67), Haney was fifth in the mile (4:08.05) and Simmonds placed eighth in the 60m hurdles (8.21).

*In addition to Rome (3,000m) and Hanko (5,000m) setting new school records, Montermini's 4,725 points at the Patriot League Championship in the heptathlon ranks fourth in the school record books. Simmonds ran an 8.17 in the 60m hurdles in the prelims of the IC4A Championship, the seventh best time in school history.

Men's Outdoor Track and Field (3-1)

*Head Coach: Stephen Cooksey

*Navy had four athletes qualify for the NCAA East Regional. MIDN 1/C Andrew Hanko and MIDN 2/C Cody Rome competed in the 5,000m, MIDN 2/C Dean Black competed in the 3,000m Steeplechase and MIDN 4/C Zachary Duncavage qualified for the discus.

*Black placed 15th in the 3,000m Steeplechase at the regional with a personal record time of 8:54.94. Black just missed finishing in the top-12 and earning a trip to the NCAA Championship. *Hanko placed 20th in the 5,000m at the regional with a time of 14:16.90 and Rome was 30th at 14:35.31.

*Duncavage placed 36th in the discus with a throw of 160-6 (48.92m).

*Navy tied for 13th at the 2011 IC4A Outdoor Championship with 24 points and had four athletes and one relay team earn IC4A All-East honors. Navy had 17 individual entries and three relay teams in competition.

*Hanko placed first at the IC4As in the 5,000m with a time of 14:00.11, the fourth-fastest time in Navy history. Hanko's individual title was the 31st for Navy at the Outdoor IC4A Championship.

*Black earned all-region honors with a third-place finish in the 3,000m Steeplechase at the IC4As.

*The 4x800m relay team of MIDN 2/C Lucas Connelly, MIDN 1/C David Ash, MIDN 2/C Dominic Della Pelle and MIDN 2/C George Stevenson took fourth with the second-fastest time in school history (7:27.55). Della Pelle was also eighth in the 1,500m and Duncavage also earned All-East honors with a seventh-place showing in the discus.

*Navy placed third at the Patriot League Outdoor Championship with 132.5 points and eight athletes earned All-Patriot League First or Second Team honors.

*Hanko was a double winner at the Patriot League Outdoor Championship, taking first in the 1,500m (3:47.39) and first in the 5,000m (14:30.62). Hanko's outdoor 5K title was his third in a row and his 10th career league title, including the indoor season.

*Black won his second straight 3,000m Steeplechase at the outdoor league meet.

*MIDN 2/C Chris Boniwell took first in the shot put, earning his first career Patriot League title.

*Navy had five athletes earn All-Patriot League Second Team honors with runner-up finishes: MIDN 2/C Alexander Jackson (400m), Connelly (800m), Rome (1,500m), Duncavage (discus) and MIDN 2/C Christopher Ricks (hammer).

*Other athletes that scored at the league meet were: Ash (6th, 800m), Rome (3rd, 5,000m), MIDN 2/C Kenneth Bunnell (4th, 5,000m), MIDN 3/C Christopher Galvin (4th, 10,000m), MIDN 3/C Mitch Simmonds (4th, 100m hurdles), MIDN 1/C Robert Alvarado (6th, 3,000m Steeplechase), MIDN 2/C Paul Neidhardt (5th, pole vault), Boniwell (4th, discus), MIDN 4/C Kyle Fortney (6th, discus), MIDN 1/C Patrick Norwood (4th, hammer), MIDN 1/C Nicholas Porter (5th, hammer), Ricks (3rd, javelin) and MIDN 3/C Christopher Folwer (6th, decathlon).

*Navy placed sixth in the 4xMile Relay Championship of America at the Penn Relays. The 4xMile team clocked a 16:32.69 and was comprised of Rome, Della Pelle, MIDN 2/C Jeremy Haney and Hanko.

*Hanko clocked a 13:56.93 to place third in the 5,000m at the War Eagle Invitational, the third-fastest time in school history. Rome ran a 14:01.81 at the Larry Ellis Invitational, the sixth-best time in school history. Only Ron Harris ('87) ranks ahead of Hanko and Rome in the 5,000m record book.

*The Mids suffered a loss to Army in the annual Outdoor Star Meet, but had seven athletes take individual events. Della Pelle won the 800m, Hanko won the 1,500, Rome won the 5,000m and Black won the 3,000m Steeplechase. Navy had three field athletes take first place as Boniwell won the shot put, Porter won the hammer and MIDN 3/C Miles Snelgrove won the javelin.

*Rome won the 5,000m title at Princeton's Sam Howell Invitational, Snelgrove won the javelin and Ash took the 800m run.

*Navy competed against eventual national champion Texas A&M and the national third-place finisher Florida and UF's Tom Jones Memorial Classic. Duncavage (9th) advanced to the finals of the discus at the very competitive event.

*The Mids swept an early season quad meet to pick up three dual wins on March 26. Navy bested Colgate, American and Maryland and won 13 of the 19 contested events.

*Navy was ranked in the top-10 of the USTFCCA Mid-Atlantic Region Poll for the duration of the outdoor season with the highlight being a three-week stay at No. 3 midway through the season. The Mids were ranked No. 7 in the final poll of the year.

*Hanko, Rome and Black each earned one Patriot League Track-Athlete of the Week certificate and Duncavage earned two rookie of the week awards.

*Rome was named to the CoSIDA All-Academic District II First Team and to the Patriot League All-Academic team.

Women's Indoor Track and Field (19-1, Won N-Star)

*Head Coach: Carla Criste

*Navy won nine of 20 events to win the 2011 Patriot League Indoor Track and Field Championship. The Mids totaled 157 team points to easily finish ahead of defending champion and second-place Bucknell (117).

*The championship was Navy's third indoor Patriot League title.

*Navy hosted the Patriot League Championship in the Wesley A. Brown Field House. The Mids also hosted, and won, the indoor championship in 2009.

*Head coach Carla Criste was named the Patriot League Indoor Track and Field Coach of the Year for the third straight indoor season.

*MIDN 2/C Jess Palacio was named the Patriot League Track-Athlete of the Meet after winning three events. Palacio has now won seven Patriot League track titles.

*Palacio shattered the Patriot League Championship record by 11 seconds and set new school, PR and Wesley A. Brown Field House records with her time of 4:43.58.

*Palacio also won the 800m and was on Navy's winning 4x800m relay team. The 4x800m team posted a new school record of 8:59.78.

*Palacio was joined on the 4x800m relay team by MIDN 2/C Erin Neumann, MIDN 2/C Mansfield Murph and MIDN 3/C Liz Milewski.

*MIDN 3/C Arabia Littlejohn won the 400m while running out of the slowest seeded of three sections with a PR of 57.32.

*Murph won the 500m with a then-PR time of 1:15.04.

*MIDN 3/C Kristin Smith won the high jump with a season-best clear of 5-7.

*MIDN 2/C Amanda Phelps took first place in the weight throw at the league meet. It was the sixth straight time Phelps won the event during the indoor season.

*MIDN 2/C Arian Davis won the pentathlon with a total score of 3,272.

*The 4x400m relay team of MIDN 2/C Colleen McFadden, Smith, Murph and Littlejohn won the league title.

*MIDN 2/C Christine Scales and MIDN 3/C Melanie Sluzewicz earned second team all-league honors by tying for second in the high jump.

*MIDN 1/C Ashley Bucholz was the runner-up in the triple jump.

*MIDN 2/C Ashley Aitken was the runner-up in the 60m hurdles.

*Also scoring at the league meet was Milewski (3rd, 3,000m), MIDN 3/C Brigid Byrne (3rd, 5,000m), Bucholz (3rd, long jump), MIDN 4/C Teronda Brown (3rd, shot put), MIDN 2/C Mollie Hebda (4th, 3,000m), MIDN 3/C Jessica Ridgway (5th, 60m) and MIDN 2/C Katie Taylor (6th, 3,000m).

*Navy defeated Army, 103.5-77.5 to win its sixth straight Indoor Star Meet. Navy won 12 of 17 events and placed 1-2 in five events at the meet, which was held in West Point.

*The win for Navy knotted the all-time indoor series at 12-12-1 and the 26-point margin of victory was the third largest for the Mids in the series.

*Palacio, Phelps and Bucholz were all individual double winners in the Star Meet.

*Palacio won both the 800m and the mile and also was on Navy's winning 4x800m relay team.

*Phelps won the weight throw and the shot put. MIDN 1/C Janet von Eiff placed second in the weight throw to ensure Navy gaining maximum points.

*Buchholz, the indoor season captain, won both the long jump and the triple jump.

*Smith won the high jump for the second straight indoor Star Meet.

*The Mids went 1-2 in the 3,000m at Taylor placed first and Hebda was second.

*Murph also won the 400m and Littlejohn won the 500m.

*Palacio finished the season ranked 20th on the national performance list in the 800m with her school-record time of 2:05.89. The 800m NCAA field consisted of 18 competitors this season, with Palacio missing the cut by two spots. The NCAA automatic standard was 2:05.00.

*Palacio first broke the school record in the 800m on January 29 and then broke her own school record in each of the last three weekends of the season in her quest for an NCAA qualification.

*In addition to Palacio's school records in the 800m and the mile, she also ran the second fastest time in school history in the 1,000m (2:52.70) in the only time she competed in the event all season.

*During the indoor season, Palacio placed first among college competitors in all 12 races she competed in. Palacio was first overall in all but one race. She finished second to a professional sponsored athlete.

*Navy finished the indoor season with a No. 13 ranking in the USTFCCCA Mid-Athletic Region Poll. The Mids were ranked in all seven weekly polls and the team's highest ranking was No. 11, which it achieved twice (Feb. 1 and Feb. 22).

*Palacio finished the season as the region's top-ranked runner in the 800m. Smith was ranked seventh in the high jump, Phelps was 14th in the weight throw and Davis was 13th in the pentathlon.

*Navy sent nine athletes to the ECAC Championship. Murph placed seventh in the 500m to earn ECAC All-East honors. Murph ran a 1:14.18 in the prelims, a new personal record.

*The Mids once again dominated the dual-scored portion of their schedule. Although a loss to Penn snapped a six-year indoor undefeated streak, Navy still owns an impressive 65-1 record in indoor dual scored meets since the 2005-06 season.

*The Mids earned seven weekly awards from the Patriot League. Palacio was named the Patriot League Track-Athlete of the Week four times, Phelps was the Patriot League Field-Athlete of the Week twice and Brown earned one rookie of the week honor.

*Byrne and Milewski were named to the Patriot League All-Academic Team.

Women's Outdoor Track and Field (3-0, Won N-Star)

*Head Coach: Carla Criste

*Navy had four athletes qualify for the NCAA East Regional. MIDN 2/C Jess Palacio competed in the 800m, MIDN 2/C Amanda Phelps competed in the hammer throw, MIDN 4/C Lauren Allam qualified for the discus throw and MIDN 4/C Alix Membreno in the javelin.

*Palacio placed 13th in the 800m run (2:06.27) at the regional, just one spot away from earning a berth to the NCAA Outdoor Championship. Palacio won her heat in the first round to advance to the quarterfinals, where she placed sixth in her heat and 13th overall.

*Phelps placed 29th at the NCAA East Regional in the hammer, Allam was 37th in the discus and Membreno was 37th in the javelin.

*Navy tied for 16th place at the ECAC Outdoor Championship with 21 points. The Mids were much improved at the regional meet after placing 43rd in 2010.

*Navy had five athletes earn ECAC All-East honors with top-eight performances at the ECAC Outdoor Championship. Palacio was third in the 800m with a school-record time of 2:05.42. Phelps was fifth in the hammer with a personal best mark of 185-1 (56.41m). Allam was fifth in the discus (153-1, 46.67m), Membreno was fifth in the javelin (147-6, 44.95m) and MIDN 2/C Arian Davis was sixth in the heptathlon (4,436 points).

*Other Navy athletes that qualified and competed at the ECAC Championship were MIDN 2/C Melanie Sluzewicz and MIDN 2/C Kristin Smith in the high jump, MIDN 1/C Ashley Bucholz in the long jump and the 4x400m relay team of MIDN 4/C Veronica Ffrench, MIDN 3/C Kristin Smith, MIDN 2/C Mansfield Murph and MIDN 3/C Arabia Littlejohn. Phelps also competed in the shot put in addition to earning all-region honors in the hammer.

*The Mids placed second at the 2011 Patriot League Outdoor Championship with 164 points and swept the three individual athlete awards. Navy had three athletes earn All-Patriot League First Team honors by winning individual event titles.

*Palacio was named the Patriot League Track-Athlete of the Meet, Phelps was the field-athlete of the meet and Allam was the rookie of the meet.

*Palacio set a new Patriot League Championship Meet record with her first-place time in the 800m of 2:07.35. Palacio also won the 1,500m run with a Navy school record time of 4:22.58.

*Phelps earned the league's top field honors by winning both the hammer throw and the shot put. Phelps recorded a mark of 181-1 (55.20m) to win the hammer and took first in the shot put with an effort of 44-3½ (13.49m).

*Allam set a new Patriot League Championship Meet record and school record with a first-place showing of 165-8 (50.49m) in the discus.

*Navy had five individuals and one relay team earn All-Patriot League Second Team honors with runner-up finishes.

*Bucholz set a new school record in the long jump with a second-place mark of 19-5½ (5.93m).

*Sluzewicz was second in the high jump with a clear of 5-7 (1.70m).

*Membreno was second in the javelin throw with a mark of 154-11 (47.21m).

*Davis placed second in the heptathlon with 4,590 points.

*MIDN 3/C Brigid Byrne placed second in the 10,000m run with a time of 36:50.06.

*The 4x400m relay team of Littlejohn, Murph, Ffrench and Palacio took second place at the league meet with a time of 3:51.00.

*Also scoring at the league meet was MIDN 2/C Jessica Ridgway (4th, 100m), Murph (3rd, 400m), Littlejohn (4th, 400m), MIDN 2/C Katie Taylor (3rd, 5,000m), Byrne (6th, 5,000m), MIDN 1/C Bethany Rahall (4th, 3,000m Steeplechase), Smith (3rd, high jump), Ffrench (4th, high jump), Bucholz (3rd, triple jump), MIDN 4/C Teronda Brown (4th, shot put and 5th, discus), MIDN 2/C Ella Starr (4th, hammer), the 4x800m relay team of MIDN 4/C Kellie Hall, MIDN 2/C Lauren Carson, Murph and Palacio (4th) and the 4x100m relay team of Ridgway, Smith, Ffrench and Littlejohn (4th).

*Navy dominated Army in the annual Outdoor Star Meet, 129-73, in Annapolis. The Mids won 16 of 19 events and the 56-point margin was the largest-ever over Army for the Navy women's track and field program.

*The N-Star win gave Navy its third straight indoor/outdoor sweep of Army in women's track and field.

*Navy's individual winners at the Outdoor Star Meet were: Ridgway (100m, 200m, 4x100m), Littlejohn (400m, 4x100m), Palacio (800m, 1,500m, 4x400m), Taylor (5,000m), Rahall (3,000m Steeplechase), Smith (high jump, 4x100m, 4x400m), Ffrench (4x100m, 4x400m), MIDN 4/C Rachel Slater (4x400m), MIDN 2/C Christine Scales (pole vault), MIDN 3/C Jordan Kronshage (pole vault), Bucholz (triple jump), MIDN 1/C Janet von Eiff (shot put), Allam (discus), Phelps (hammer), Membreno (javelin).

*Along with her indoor season, Palacio turned in one of the most impressive middle-distance years in Navy history. Palacio won a pair of Patriot League Championship Track Athlete of the Meet honors, won four individual league titles, set four school records and two Patriot League Championship records. She also won seven Patriot League Track-Athlete of the Week awards. Over the course of the indoor and outdoor seasons, Palacio won 17 individual races.

*The Mids placed sixth at the competitive Colonial Relays with 11 top-10 performances. Navy also swept an outdoor tri-meet against Maryland and American and took first place at the McDaniel Twilight Invitational.

*Navy was voted as the preseason favorites in the annual Patriot League Preseason Coaches Poll.

*Allam set a new Patriot League record with five rookie of the week certificates. Palacio earned three track-athlete of the week honors from the Patriot League and Phelps earned a pair of weekly field-athlete of the week awards.

*Navy was ranked in the USTFCCCA Mid-Atlantic Region Poll for the duration of the outdoor season. Navy's best ranking was No. 6 on April 5 and the team finished the season ranked No. 10.

*The women's track and field team had a number of contributors that also played other sports at Navy during the 2010-11 year. Ffrench was a member of the women's volleyball team and, along with Membreno, was on Navy's league championship women's basketball team. MIDN 1/C Anastasia Abid joined the track program after completing a four-year career with women's soccer and was the team's second-ranked runner in the 3,000m Steeplechase.

*Byrne was named to the Patriot League All-Academic Team, completing a trifecta that also included earning all-academic honors for cross country and indoor track and field during the 2010-11 year.

Volleyball (7-23, 1-13 Patriot League)

*Head coach: Mike Schwob

*MIDN 2/C Maida Kalic' garnered all-tournament honors at the Spartan Classic (Norfolk State).

*Kalic' and MIDN 4/C Erin Fortner were named to the all-tournament team at the University at Buffalo Invitational.

*Fortner was selected to the all-tournament team at the Bryant Invitational and at the Kristen Dickmann Memorial Tournament (Navy).

*Fortner was selected as the Patriot League Rookie of the Week on September 7. She became the first Mid to earn the weekly honor in five seasons.

*Fortner's 253 kills made her the first Navy freshman since 2000 and the third since records began being compiled in 1991 to lead the Mids in kills. Additionally, her 438 assists are the most for a Navy freshman since 1999 and places her third among all freshmen at Navy.

*Team captain MIDN 1/C Jenny Rudewicz ended her career ranked sixth in Navy history and third during the decade-long rally scoring era with 1,653 assists. She also is ranked eighth overall and fourth among rally scoring players with an assist-per-set average of 5.33.

*MIDN 2/C Holly Berger's 420 digs this season rank third in school history and second in the rally scoring era. Her 1,015 career digs ranks third overall at Navy and second among rally scoring players. Additionally, Berger's 97 aces ranks ninth at Navy and fourth among players who competed under the rally scoring system.

*MIDN 3/C Lauren Carpenter was one of seven student-athletes named to the inaugural Patriot League All-Academic Team for the sport. Carpenter, Fortner, MIDN 4/C Sara Baugh, MIDN 2/C Amanda Hine and MIDN 4/C Kelsey Owen all were named to the Patriot League Academic Honor Roll.

Water Polo (25-7, 7-1 CWPA Southern Division)

*Head Coach: Mike Schofield

*Navy finished the season ranked 15th in the final CWPA Top 20 poll with a 25-7 record. It marks the 29th straight year that Navy has won at least 19 games. In 12 of the seasons, Navy has won at least 23 games.

*Navy captured at least a share of first place in the CWPA Southern Division for the sixth straight year. Navy has placed third or better in 18 of the 19 CWPA Southern Division Tournaments.

*Navy's Mike Schofield was named the Eastern Coach of the Year for the eighth time in his 26 years at Navy. Schofield now owns 578 career wins at Navy and will likely become the school's all-time winningest coach in any sport next year (baseball's Joe Duff - 595).

*Navy has now advanced to six straight CWPA Eastern Tournament Championship games, posting a 3-3 record in those six games.

*Navy's 9-0 start was the third-best start in school behind 1983 (15-0) and 1984 (13-0).

*MIDN 2/C Stevie Ray and MIDN 2/C Kyle Wertz were named first-team All-East. Wertz was named to the All-East team for the second straight year, becoming one of 13 players in school history to earn two All-East honors. Just three players (Alex Ratcliffe, Tom Popp and Lawrence Kough) have won three All-East accolades. Wertz finished with 34 points (25 g, 9 a) in just 10 games, while Ray was third on the team in scoring with 53 points (45 g, 8 a).

*MIDN 1/C Luke Baldwin led the team in points (83), goals (54) and assists (29). He was named first-team All-Southern Division. Baldwin was named CWPA Southern Division Player of the Week on Oct. 20.

*MIDN 1/C Jordan Carter was named second-team All-Southern Division. Carter was fourth on the team in scoring with 37 points (30 g, 7 a).

*MIDN 2/C Darren McKay was named the CWPA Southern Division Defensive Player of the Week on Oct. 20.

*MIDN 3/C Jackson Hummeldorf, Baldwin, MIDN 4/C Sean McDonald, MIDN 4/C Joel Elenbaas, MIDN 3/C Archie Warren were named to the CWPA Scholar-Athlete Team.

* Baldwin and Warren were named to the ACWPC Scholar-Athlete Team.

Wrestling (5-3, Won N-Star)

*Head Coach: Bruce Burnett

*The Midshipmen tied for 37th out of 73 teams at the NCAA Championship in Philadelphia, Pa.

*MIDN 1/C Bryce Saddoris, MIDN 1/C Matt DeMichiel, MIDN 2/C Luke Rebertus and MIDN 2/C Aaron Kalil received automatic berths to wrestle at the NCAA Championship by way of their finish at the EIWA Championship.

*The Midshipmen finished sixth out of 13 teams at the EIWA Championship in Lewisburg, Pa. Nine of Navy's 10 wrestlers placed - 125 Aaron Kalil, 3rd; 133 Allen Stein, 8th; 141 Dustin Haislip, 7th; 157 Bryce Saddoris, 2nd; 165 Mason Bailey, 8th; 174 Matt DeMichiel, 2nd; 184 Luke Rebertus, 4th; 197 Oscar Huntley, 8th; 285 Dan Miller, 7th)

*Navy defeated Army in the Star Match, 24-9, in West Point. The Mids own a 14-match unbeaten streak against the Black Knights that includes 11-consecutive wins. Navy owns an incredible 43-1-5 record against Army in the last 49 matches.

*Navy earned a 19-15 victory over nationally-ranked Lehigh, marking its first win over the Mountain Hawks since 2007 and only its second win in the series since 1997.

*Navy won the All-Academy Championship for the 10th time in the 17-year history of the event. Five wrestlers were crowned champions, while another three finished as the runner-up in their respective weight class.

*The Mids earned their 18th Navy Classic team title in the 33-year history of the tournament. Navy took seven of the 10 individual titles - 125 Aaron Kalil, 141 Joe Locksmith, 149 Eric Filipowicz, 157 Bryce Saddoris, 174 Matt DeMichiel, 184 Luke Rebertus, 285 Dan Miller.

*Head coach Bruce Burnett claimed his 100th-career victory by leading Navy to a 21-19 win over North Carolina on Jan. 28.

*MIDN 1/C Bryce Saddoris became just the sixth wrestler in school history to qualify all four years for the NCAA Championship and second (Joe Baker 2006-07-08-09) during head coach Bruce Burnett's 11-year stint.

*Saddoris garnered All-America recognition after placing seventh at the NCAA Championship. He is one of 16 Navy wrestlers to receive All-America recognition multiple times during his

career. He placed sixth at the 2009 NCAA Championship en route to earning his first All-America citation.

*Saddoris closed out his career with a 147-40 record, making him Navy's all-time winningest wrestler. He broke Matt Stolpinski's record of 141 wins on March 5 with a 12-4 major decision over Bucknell's Brantley Hooks in the opening round of the EIWA Championship.

*Saddoris' 78.6 win percentage (147-40) is the ninth best in school history.

*Saddoris also became Navy's record holder for most matches wrestled in a career with 187. Ironically, Saddoris' match against Oklahoma State's Robert Erisman to determine All-America status was the go-ahead match. Stolpinski previously held the record with 184 matches wrestled.

*Saddoris is the only wrestler in school history to reach 30 wins in each of his four seasons. He won 35 matches as a freshman, 43 as a sophomore, 32 as a junior and 37 as a senior.

*With his 37 wins this season, Saddoris became the Mids' all-time single-season wins leader at 157 pounds. The previous record holders were John Jarred (2005-06) and Tyrone Neal (1998-99) who both won 35 matches at that weight class. Saddoris also holds the top two marks at 149 pounds.

*MIDN 1/C Matt DeMichiel closed out his career with an 84-47 record to stand 22nd on Navy's all-time wins list.

*MIDN 2/C Luke Rebertus turned in a 31-11 record at 184 pounds. He joins the 30-win club for the second time in his career and is one of 13 different wrestlers in program history to win 30 or more matches multiple times in their career.

*Rebertus' 31 wins are the third most in school history at the 184-pound weight class.

*MIDN 2/C Aaron Kalil tied the school record for wins at 125 pounds with his 29-11 record. Prescott Garner set the record during the 2008-09 season.

*MIDN 3/C Oscar Huntley was named to the NWCA Scholar-Athlete Team
