Midshipmen to Open 2006 Season on Saturday

Navy kicks off its 111th season of baseball with a two-game set at Terwilliger Brothers Field at Max Bishop Stadium in Annapolis this weekend. The Midshipmen return 16 letterwinners from their 2005 campaign which posted a 12-33-1 mark, 6-14 in Patriot League action. After compiling a 504-329 (.605) record in his first-16 years as a head coach at Providence (1990-96) and Maine (1997-05), Paul Kostacopoulos takes over the reigns and will guide the Mids in his first game in the Navy Blue and Gold this Saturday.

Navy on Opening Days

Coming into its 111th season-opener, the Navy baseball program owns an all-time mark of 62-46-2 (.573). In 2005, the Midshipmen scored a season-high 17 runs in defeating Savannah State 17-8 on Feb. 19, 2005. Prior to last year, Navy had dropped five consecutive and won only one if its previous 13 season-openers.

Earliest-Ever Home Opener...

This weekend's scheduled two-game series with Coppin State ranks as the earliest home opener in Navy baseball's 111-year history. In fact, the Midshipmen have only one game on The Yard in the month of February. On Feb. 27, 1998, Navy lost to West Virginia 5-4 in the only other home game ever played in February.

...and Earliest-Ever Season Opener

Navy's Feb. 4 season opener with Coppin State ranks as the earliest start in Navy's 111-year history. Each of Navy's previous three-earliest opening days have been against Duke, all of which resulted in losses. Prior to this season, the Mids earliest-ever opener came with an 8-1 loss versus the Blue Devils on Feb. 7, 2004. The Midshipmen have played against Duke on Feb. 9 in 1997 and 2002, losing those contests 7-5 and 6-4 respectively. However, Navy did bounce back to pick up an 8-4 win at Duke on the back-end of a doubleheader on Feb. 9, 2002.

Humble Beginnings

The Midshipmen are 29-63-1 (.317) all-time in the month of February. Last season, the Mids tallied a 3-3-1 (.500) mark in February, tying the second-best winning percentage in the month with the 1989 (1-1), 1992 (2-2), and 1994 squads (3-3). Navy's best February came in 1993, when the Mids turned in three wins in their first-four games.

Navy vs. Maryland Teams

Navy has played 20 teams hailing from the state of Maryland during its first-110 years of the program. In that time, the Midshipmen have played 277 of 2,617 all-time games against those 20 programs, accumulating a record of 185-84-8 (.682). This season, Navy is scheduled to play 11 games versus teams from the Old Line State.

MEAC Teams on Navy's Slate

Besides opening the 2006 season with a two-game set versus the northern-most member of the Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference, Navy plays nine more contests versus teams from the MEAC. The Mids travel to Maryland-Eastern Shore for a three-game series on March 11-12, host Delaware State on April 19, head to Coppin State on April 26 before hosting the Eagles on May 10.

Navy Players Hailing from Maryland

Sophomore **Bill Maugeri (Edgewater, Md.)** and freshman **Tim Hammond (Woodbine, Md.)** represent the only two Navy baseball players hailing from Maryland this season. Maugeri's hometown of Edgewater is only 20 minutes southwest of the Academy, while Hammond's hometown of Woodbine is about an hour northwest of Annapolis.

Koessler Approaching 50

Senior left-hander **Joe Koessler (Knoxville, Tenn.)** next appearance will make him one of only four pitchers to appear in 50-plus career games during their career. The program record of 58 appearances (David Lowe, 1987-90) lies within reach for Koessler, who made a program-record 27 appearances in 2004 and saw action in 14 contests last season. Of his 49 career games, Koessler has come out of the bullpen in 48 of those appearances.

Meet the 2006 Captain ... D.J. Faldowski

Serving as Navy's 2006 captain on the baseball diamond is senior outfielder **D.J. Faldowski (Washington, Pa.)**. A product of Washington, Pa., Faldowski has appeared in 87 games over his first-three seasons in Annapolis. During that stretch, he has made 52 starts, belted 14 doubles and driven in 21 runs. This season, Faldowski is expected to either see time at either corner outfield position or in a designated hitter role. Following this season, Faldowski will serve as a Navy SEAL in the United States Navy.

Rhodes Scholar, Patriot League Male Scholar-Athlete of the Year

Navy baseball's 2005 team captain, **Trevor Thompson (Kent, Wash.)** was named one America's 32 Rhodes Scholars last year and is studying at Oxford. Thompson was also selected into the Navy SEALs program after posting a tremendous career in and out of the classroom. Thompson ranked at the top his class with a 3.95 cumulative grade point average in history and posted seven semesters with a 4.0 grade point average. As a result, the Patriot League named him the 2005 Male Scholar-Athlete of the Year. On the diamond, Thompson hit a team-best .322 as a senior with six doubles, 14 RBIs and 18 stolen bases. During Patriot League play, Thompson batted .371 and was selected a second-team all-league member.

Nothing But a Cloud of Dust

Navy returns three members from last year's squad that stole 10 or more bases during the season. **Jonathan Johnston (Hamilton Township, N.J.)** swiped 16 bases, while **Jared Munde (Rolling Hills Estates, Calif.)** stole 13 and **Renaldo Hollins (Virginia Beach, Va.)** had 10 stolen bases in helping Navy to a Patriot League-high 76 stolen bases in 2005. The Midshipmen stole more of than half of those bases (39 of 76) during Patriot League action last season.

29 Home Contests in 2006

The 2006 Navy baseball schedule features a 54-game slate, 29 of which are scheduled to be home contests. The 29 home games, if weather permits, will be a new program record for Navy. All but two of Navy's home games will be played at Terwilliger Brothers Field at Max Bishop Stadium, which just had FieldTurf installed during the winter. The most home games played by a Navy squad coming into this season were 24 by the 2004 squad.

Navy Head Coach PAUL KOSTACOPOULOS

Paul Kostacopoulos enters his first season as the baseball head coach at Navy after spending the past nine seasons at the helm at Maine. Kostacopoulos has a career record of 504-329 (.605) in 16 seasons as a head coach, including a 284-195 (.593) mark in his previous nine seasons in Orono, Maine.

He led Maine to a 35-19 (.648) record this past season as the Black Bears won the America East Championship and earned a berth in the NCAA Tournament for the second time in his tenure. At the NCAA Regional in Oxford, Miss., Maine defeated Southern Miss, 12-2, giving the school its first NCAA Tournament baseball win since 1991.

Kostacopoulos, 41, came to Maine after seven years at Providence College where he led his squads to a record of 220-137 (.616). In 1995, his Friars were 44-15 and won a school-record 16 Big East games. After winning the regular-season Big East Championship, the Friars finished as the tournament runner-up and received an at-large berth to the NCAA Tournament.

Providence was 29-23 in 1992 and won the Big East Tournament to advance to the NCAA South I Regional. Kostacopoulos served as an assistant at Providence for two seasons before 1990, when at age 25, he became the youngest Division I head coach in the country.

Army/Navy to Play at Camden Yards

The Sunday (April 23) doubleheader of the annual Army/Navy series will take place at Oriole Park at Camden Yards, the home of MLB's Baltimore Orioles. This is the first-time Navy will play at the current home of the Orioles, constructed in 1992. Army and Navy have met away from West Point and Annapolis on 11 previous occasions, all of which took place in at Millington, Tenn., for the Service Academies Classic. Navy owns a 9-2 all-time advantage during those 11 contests.

Navy Welcomes Scott Friedholm to Coaching Staff

After spending the past four years as an assistant at Maine, Scott Friedholm joined Dan Nellum and Ens. Jason Ronai, USN, on the 2006 Navy assistant coaching staff.

Friedholm served the pitching coach on Kostacopoulos' coaching staff at Maine from 2002-05. During that time, he oversaw a pitching staff that guided the Black Bears to two NCAA Tournament appearances. In 2005, Maine's pitching staff held regional top-seed and national fifth-seed Southern Miss to two runs in a 12-2 victory in the NCAA Regional, the program's first tournament win since 1991.

Prior to his time in Maine, Friedholm served as the pitching coach with Bryant in Smithfield, R.I. from 2000-01. In those two seasons, his pitching staff paved the way to set school records in overall and Northeast-10 Conference wins in consecutive years.

Friedholm also played his first two seasons under Kostacopoulos during his collegiate career at Providence College. As a freshman in 1995, the four-year letterwinner was part of a group that won 44 games and a program-best 16 Big East Conference contests en route to an at-large berth in the NCAA Tournament. In 1996, Friedholm earned All-Big East and All-Region honors. During his senior season in 1998, he hit .395 with 13 home runs and a school-record 66 runs batted in, racking up third-team ABCA All-American honors.

Navy Among Best in APR

The United States Naval Academy's athletic program ranked seventh out of all 328 Division I schools in the NCAA's Academic Performance Rate. Navy's athletic program also ranked highest among the 117 schools with Division I-A football programs.

The APR is the fulcrum upon which the entire academic-reform structure rests. Developed as a more real-time assessment of team's academic performance than the six-year graduation rate calculation provides, the APR awards two points each term to student-athletes who meet academic-eligibility standards and who remain with the institution. A team's APR is the total points earned by the team at a given time, divided by the total points possible.

The Naval Academy had 10 sports ranked first with an APR of 1,000, meaning every student-athlete on their respective roster remained at the Naval Academy and was also eligible to compete or graduate.

Each of Navy's 23 sports sponsored by the NCAA ranked above the national Division I average of 950 and Division I-A average of 947. The Navy baseball team registered a mark of 982 to rank second among Patriot League institutions.

Renovations to Terwilliger Brothers Field at Max Bishop Stadium

The renovation process at Terwilliger Brothers Field at Max Bishop Stadium commenced in October 2005 and will feature a variety of changes that will make the home of Navy baseball one of the finest facilities in the East to play and watch a baseball game. The multi-million dollar baseball facility is named after the longtime baseball coach Max Bishop (1937-61) and the Terwilliger Family for their generous support of the Naval Academy and the Naval Academy Athletic Association.

Among the major changes taking place, the natural grass surface was dug up and Field Turf was installed. Field Turf is the same surface used by Major League Baseball's Minnesota Twins, Tampa Bay Devil Rays and Toronto Blue Jays, as well as Navy's Jack Stephens Field at Navy-Marine Corps Memorial Stadium.

Terwilliger Brothers Field will become only the third field in college baseball that features Field Turf over the entire playing surface, with the exception of the pitcher's mound and home plate. Washington State's Bailey-Brayton Field and Louisville's Jim Patterson Stadium are the only other two college baseball stadiums that possess Field Turf over the whole field.

As well as the installation of Field Turf, Navy baseball players will also benefit from the construction of 112' by 48' indoor batting cages and pitcher's mounds. The indoor facilities will assist in the instruction of Navy baseball players, rain or shine.

The dimensions of the outfield fences around Terwilliger Brothers Field at Max Bishop Stadium will remain the same after the renovation process is complete. The ballpark measures 322 feet down the left field line, 382 feet to the power alley in left-center field, 397 feet to center field, 372 feet to the gap in right-center field and 304 feet down the right field line.

In addition, several improvements are being made in and around Max Bishop Stadium to help make Navy baseball a fan-friendly environment with a fun atmosphere.

Concurrent with the field transformation, the wooden bleachers have also been taken down and 1,500 new chair-back seats will be installed with brick archways surrounding the stadium.

Behind the left field fence, one can find a state-of-the-art LED matrix scoreboard with a video screen. Concession stands, restrooms and a patio area also help to create cozy surroundings to watch a Navy baseball game.
