# Alumni Hall

## Home of Navy Basketball

A state-of-the-art functional facility. A memorial hall. That's how retired Navy Captain Harry A. Seymour Jr., director of the capital campaign for the Naval Academy Alumni Association, describes Alumni Hall.

For more than 50 years, the Naval Academy had actively sought a multi-purpose facility where the entire Brigade of Midshipmen, faculty and staff can assemble for professional, academic and entertainment activities.

The building of Alumni Hall was authorized by Congress in the mid-1980s, but funding was inadequate to build the entire facility. It was left to Naval Academy alumni and friends, through a Capital Campaign spearheaded by the Naval Academy Alumni Association, to augment the government funds to complete the building, including furnishings, decoration and landscaping.

Construction for the \$30 million Alumni Hall began in December 1987 by Donohoe Construction company with \$13 million authorized by the Department of the Navy and \$17 million to be raised in private funds. The United Service Organization (USO) donated \$500,000 as the lead gift to complete the auditorium within Alumni Hall in honor of an American who has done much for those in uniform — Bob Hope.

The Naval Academy Athletic Association, in its efforts to enhance the training and development of the members of the brigade, contributed \$1 million towards the facility.

The cornerstone for what was then called the Brigade Activity Center was dedicated in a ceremony on Sept. 19, 1988.

A multi-purpose facility with seating for up to 6,500 – including 5,710 for basketball – the hall features an auditorium that can easily be adapted for lectures, assemblies, theatrical productions, concerts, official ceremonies, indoor sports and other events.



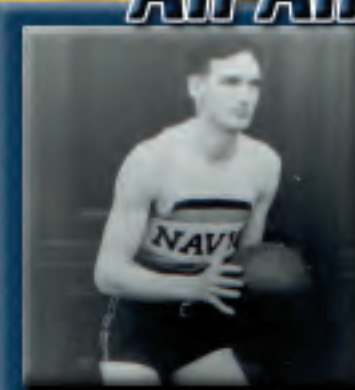
