MIDS ENJOY A LITTLE HOME COOKIN', PLAY FOUR IN A ROW IN ANNAPOLIS

After playing six of its opening nine games on the road, Navy will play the next four games on its home court. Of those four games, three will be played in just six days beginning with Thursday's match-up against Susquehanna. The Mids battle the Crusaders at Alumni Hall beginning at 7:30 p.m.

Just two days after the Susquehanna contest, Navy will play host to The Citadel on New Year's Eve day beginning at 3 pm. The Mids face UMBC on Jan. 3 at 7:30 to round out the three-game, six-day slate.

NAVY-BROWN HIGHLIGHTS

☆ The Midshipmen overcame a 16-point second-half deficit to earn a nine-point victory over Brown.
 ☆ Navy more than doubled its point production in the second half, scoring 50 points over the second 20 minutes ... the Mids trailed Brown, 31-23, at the half.

☆ Sophomore guard **Greg Sprink** scored 31 of his career-high 34 points in the second half which featured a school-record tying nine three-pointers.

☆ Navy shot a season-best 79.2 percent (19-24) from the charity stripe, while Brown shot an incredible 29.4 percent (5-17) from the free throw line ... senior forward **Matt Fannin** shot 10 for 14 from the charity stripe.

☆ Rookie **Clif Colbert** grabbed a career-best eight rebounds to pace the Mids, while classmate **Kaleo Kina** led Navy in assists (5) and steals (4).

SPRINK PUTS THE SPRING BACK IN HIS JUMPER

Navy sophomore **Greg Sprink** scored 31 of his career-high 34 points in the second half to lead the Mids back from a 16-point deficit and a 73-64 victory over Brown last Thursday. The following are a few facts about Sprink's record-setting performance.

☆ Sprink is Navy's first 30-point scorer since Scott Long dumped in 31 against Eastern Michigan on Dec. 28, 2002.

☆ It's the most points by a Navy player since All-Patriot League guard Mike Heary turned in 38 against league foe Holy Cross on Jan. 29, 1997.

☆ Sprink tied the school record for three-pointers (9) set by Michael Burd 15 years ago (11/26/90) against Mount St. Mary's.

☆ Sprink, who was 1 for 4 from the field and 1 for 2 from long range in the opening half, missed just two field goals in the second stanza (9-11), including one three-pointer (8-9).

SCORING MILESTONES

Team captain **Matt Fannin** topped 600 points for his career on Dec. 20 at Yale when he turned in a season-best 20 points. Fannin was 8 for 11 from the field and 4 for 8 from the charity stripe against the Bulldogs.

Sophomore guard **Greg Sprink** broke the 300-point barrier with his record-breaking 34-point performance at Brown. Sprink helped lead the Mids back from a 16-point second-half deficit, hitting a program-tying nine three-pointers along the way.

● Susquehanna enters Thursday's contest against the Mids with a 2-7 record ... the Crusaders have lost three straight, including a six-point overtime decision at Lycoming on Dec. 10.

● Susquehanna plays in the Middle Atlantic Conference which includes Albright, Elizabethtown, Juniata, Lebanon Valley, Messiah, Moravian and Widener.

● Head coach Frank Marcinek has coached Susquehanna to double-digit wins in 14 of his 17 seasons ... last year the Crusaders picked up just three wins in 24 contests.

● Just five letterwinners return from last year's squad and only one player on the roster (junior Chad Lauer) has more than one full season in the program ... Bubba Mills was a first-team all-conference forward, but graduated last spring ... forward Mike Malko was named the conference rookie of theyear, but he transferred in the off-season to Ramapo.

● First-year assistant coach Dave Brown played two years at Colgate under the late Jack Bruen before transferring to Connecticut College where he graduated in 2002.

WHEN WE LAST MET ...

DEC. 30, 2004 . . . THE CITADEL 87, NAVY 72 CHARLESTON, S.C. - Donny McLendon scored a career-high 23 points, while Kevin Hammack netted 19 to lead The Citadel to an 87-72 victory over Navy at McAlister Field House.

Junior forward **David Hooper** scored a team-high 15 points and pulled down seven rebounds for Navy, which lost for the fifth time in its last six contests. Senior forward **Laramie Mergerson** added 13 points and eight rebounds for the Mids, while junior forward **Matt Fannin** also chipped in 13 points and had seven boards.

The Bulldogs' biggest lead of the first half was seven, 29-22, at the 4:27 mark, but the Mids used two lay-ups and a three-pointer from Hooper to draw within four, 36-32, at the break.

Navy played tough the entire game, but gave up 20 points off of turnovers, including 12 in the second half. The Mids were down by just four, 55-51, at the nine-minute mark of the second half until McLendon nailed a three-pointer.

The Bulldogs never looked back as they built their lead to 11 thanks to two free throws from sophomore forward Aaron Xia with 6:45 to play. The Citadel continued to pull away gaining a 72-57 lead after a 14-5 run late in the second half. The Bulldogs' biggest lead of the game was 17 (77-60), which came after a jumper from McLendon at the 4:05 mark.

The Citadel had four players score in double figures. In addition to McLendon and Hammack, Warren McLendon added 17 points and J'mel Everhart chipped in 11. Everhart posted his fifth double-double of the year as he also grabbed 11 rebounds. Hammack added five assists and eight steals, as well.

Navy freshman guard **Corey Johnson** added 12 points in the loss, while also pulling down six rebounds and handing out a team-best four assists.

ABOUT THE CITADEL

• The Bulldogs enter their New Year's Eve battle with the Mids owning a 6-5 record ... after starting the season 0-2, The Citadel won six of its next seven contests, including a two-point overtime decision over Army on the road ... the Bulldogs have lost two straight and last played on Dec. 20 at Duquesne (L, 90-61).

• Head coach Pat Dennis is atop the Bulldogs' all-time win list, recording 154 victories ... he passed Les Robinson (132-162) on the wins list during the 2004-04 campaign.

• Guards Mark Schiavoni and Dante Terry combined for 48 of The Citadel's 126 points, as the duo outscored Florida Christian, who produced 43 points in its loss to the Bulldogs on Nov. 28 ... The Citadel broke three records in its win over FCC, most points (126), largest margin of victory (83) and most points in a half (73).

• The Bulldogs have eclipsed the century mark twice this season — 126 points against Florida Christian College on Nov. 26 and also against Atlanta Christian College on Dec. 5 ... the last time The Citadel registered 100 points was when it defeated Western Carolina, 105-97, in double overtime in 2002.

• After sitting out the 2004-05 campaign following his transfer from the Coast Guard Academy, junior guard Mark Schiavoni has become a regular in The Citadel's rotation.

• Assistant coach Clyde Wormley is a Bulldog grad and played for Pat Dennis from 2000-03 ... Wormley led the 2003 squad in field goals (88) and three-pointers (52) ... he spent last year playing professionally in Mexico

• Senior guard Kevin Hammack missed the first nine games after suffering a stress fracture in his right leg ... he returned to the court on Dec. 18 in the Bulldogs' 83-57 loss at Western Carolina ... Hammack is third on The Citadel's all-time top-10 assists list with 349 and trails record holder Jimmy Tharpe (1983-86) by 38.

NAVY-THE CITADEL SERIES

Navy and The Citadel meet for just the ninth time with the series deadlocked at four wins apiece. The Mids won three of the first four games, while the Bulldogs have claimed three of the last four contests.

Navy's last win in the series was Nov. 25, 2002, when it notched a 57-51 victory over The Citadel in Annapolis. The Citadel is 0-2 against the Mids in games played in Annapolis. The Bulldogs defeated Navy, 87-72, in Charleston last year.

SPRINK AMONG NATION'S FREE THROW LEADERS

According to the Dec. 19 NCAA Statistics Report, Navy sophomore guard **Greg Sprink** was second in the country in free throw percentage, shooting 96.3 percent (26-27). Making all six free throws last week against Yale (12/20) and Brown (12/22), Sprink is now shooting 97.0 percent (32-33). He trails Tamarius Brown of Arkansas-Pine Bluff who is 16 for 16 from the charity stripe this winter.

THE STREAK

Sophomore guard **Greg Sprink** has made 32 of his 33 free throws this season, missing his lone toss at Morgan State on Dec. 8. Since his miss against the Bears, he has made 14 in a row.

FANNIN FIGHTS THROUGH PAIN

Navy senior forward **Matt Fannin** has fought off injuries throughout his career. This season is no different as he has two ailing knees. One wouldn't know it, however, as he is Navy's leading rebounder, grabbing 6.3 boards, and the team's second-leading scorer, averaging 11.3 points per game.

In last week's game at Yale and Brown, Fannin averaged 19.0 points and 6.0 rebounds. He shot 70.6 percent (12-17) from the field and 63.6 percent (14-22) from the charity stripe. Perhaps the best news is that Fannin was whistled for just three fouls in the two games combined.

THE 70'S GAME

Over the last five years, Navy has scored 70-plus points just 42 times in 123 games (.341). In the last four seasons, the Mids have scored 70 points just 27 times in 93 games (.290). In 2003-04, Navy scored 70-plus points just four times, while last season, the Mids topped 70 points in 13 of the 28 contests. Navy has scored 70-plus points in six of the nine games this season, including the last six.

NAVY FOR THREE

Navy is leading the Patriot League in three-point shooting, connecting on 37.6 percent (62-165) of its triples. The Mids, meanwhile, have done a nice job defending the three, holding their foes to 29.9 percent shooting (53-177) from behind the arc. Navy is ranked No. 2 in the league in three-point field goal percent defense.

Four Navy players are shooting 40 percent or better from long range, including sophomore **Greg Sprink** who is pacing the team at 47.2 percent (17-36). Along with Sprink, rookie **Bryce Brigham** (9-21, .429), **David Hooper** (10-24, .417) and **Kaleo Kina** (9-14-34, .412) are shooting better than 40 percent. All four players are ranked among the top sixth three-point shooters in the conference. Bucknell's Jason Vegotsky is leading the league, shooting 57.1 percent (8-14), followed by Sprink.

FRESHMEN MAKE A STATEMENT

Head coach Billy Lange has wasted little time in getting his freshmen playing time. In fact, all five have earned starts this season. The Class of '09 has produced 247 points, 38.7 percent of the Mids' offense, and is averaging 27.4 points per game.

After scoring 39 of the Mids' 76 points at Penn (12/2), the rookies have continued to get better. In Navy's 106-80 win over Washington (Md.) (12/18), the freshmen scored a season-best 46 points.

PROTECT THE BALL

Navy turned the ball over a season-high 30 times against Howard (12/5), the most TOs by the Mids since their 72-67 loss to Lehigh (1/15/05) where Navy committed 25 turnovers.

Navy has turned the ball over 35 more times (187-152) than its opponents this season and owns 75 more turnovers than assists. In turn, the Mids have been outscored 161-129 (32) in points off turnovers. Each of the Mids' opponents have turned in double-figure points off turnovers, including a season-high 29 points by Penn (12/2).

SPRINK RETURNS TO FORM

After struggling against UALR (11/22) and Air Force (11/27) where he scored a combined three points, 2005 Patriot League All-Rookie Team member **Greg Sprink** came to life at Penn (12/2). His 12-point effort against the Quakers has triggered six-consecutive games of double-digit scoring. Over the last six games, Sprink has averaged 16.0 points (96 pts) and 5.5 rebounds (33 reb). In addition, he has dealt out at least one assist in all six games, while grabbing at least one steal except against Howard.

Navy's top scorer, averaging 12.6 points per game, Sprink is eighth in the league in scoring, is No. 1 in free throw percentage, is No. 2 in three-point field goal percentage and is averaging 1.89 threes per game which is ranked eighth.

CRASH THE BOARDS

Last season Navy was one of the top rebounding teams in the country, owning a +5.1 rebound margin and a No. 32 national rank. The Mids also paced the league with its 41.1 rebounds per game.

Despite losing two of its top four rebounders to graduation, Navy is right back at the top of the charts. The Mids lead the league, averaging 38.4 boards per game and their +7.3 rebound margin is also atop the league.

CHIEF THIEF

Navy team captain **Matt Fannin** is nicknamed "Chief" and he just happens to lead the Mids in steals. Tied for sixth in the league in steals per game, Fannin is pacing Navy with 13 steals in nine game (1.44 spg).

SPECIAL K

Freshman guard **Kaleo Kina** is dealing out a team-best 4.1 assist per game and is the Mids' third-leading scorer (9.4 ppg). In the Mids' nine-point loss to Academy rival Air Force (11/27), Kina led Navy in scoring (14), rebounding (5) and assists (4) in his first-collegiate start. In Navy's win over Washington (Md.) (12/18), Kina topped the team in scoring (19, career high) and assists (8, career high), while adding a pair of steals and five boards.

HOOPER FROM LONG RANGE

Senior guard **David Hooper** hit at least one three-pointer in 23 of the 28 games last season, and has made a triple in 58 of the 84 games (.690) during his career.

After connecting on two of four triples against Washington (Md.) (12/18), Hooper is now tied with Erik Harris for fifth on the Mids' all-time three-point field goals list with 123. He trails fourth-place Joe Gottschalk by 13, while he is 78 away from Michael Heary's school-record of 201. He is one of only seven players in Academy history to make 100-career three-pointers. He accomplished this feat when he connected on a triple against Army in last year's Star Game.

MORE ON HOOPER

After opening the season with two scoreless contests, senior guard **David Hooper** has scored 59 points in the last seven games, an average of 8.4 points per game during that stretch. He has turned in double-figure scoring in four of the last seven games, including a season-high 16 points in the Mids' win at Morgan State (12/8). Also during that stretch, Hooper has connected on 10-of-24 three-pointers (.417). His rebound numbers have also been solid, collecting 3.7 boards per game this season, which featured 10 against Washington (Md.) (12/18). With 10 boards and 13 points against the Shoremen, it marked just the second time (Gettysburg in '03) in his career he has turned in a double-double.

COLBERT PICKS UP THE SLACK

Freshman **Cliff Colbert** played a combined 13 minutes in the first three games of the season which featured just a field goal. He took over the starting point guard position Dec. 2 at Penn and for three-straight games he turned in double-digit scoring, averaging 16.7 points against Penn, Howard (12/5) and Morgan State (12/8). On the year, Colbert is averaging 7.3 points, 3.1 boards and 2.2 steals.

Navy's 15 varsity players represent 12 different states — Arizona, California (2), Colorado, Indiana (2), Kansas, Maryland, North Carolina (2), Ohio, Oregon, Texas, Virginia and Washington.

QUICK RECOVERY

Junior forward **Carlton Baldwin**, who is averaging 5.8 points and 3.6 boards this season, made a quick recovery after breaking his right ankle the weekend of Sept. 24-25. The two-year letterwinner had surgery on Sept. 26 and was expected to be out two months. He returned to practice on Nov. 3, roughly six weeks after his surgery and was in the starting lineup in the Mids' season opener.

It's the second-straight year in which Baldwin has suffered a preseason injury. In September of 2004, he fractured a toe in his left foot and was so severe, the doctors estimated three to six months of recovery time. Baldwin missed just the first-three games of the season.

THE NATION'S FUTURE LEADERS

Three of Navy's four seniors recently received their service assignments for which they will fulfill upon graduation. **Kelvin Boatner** and **David Hooper** will pursue careers as surface warfare officers aboard a ship and team captain **Matt Fannin** will serve as a naval flight officer, the backseater in an aircraft. **Leonard Green** is still awaiting his assignment.

LANGE'S 50TH WIN

Second-year Navy head coach **Billy Lange** claimed his 50th-collegiate win on Dec. 8, leading the Midshipmen to a 73-47 win over Morgan State. Lange owns a four-year coaching record of 51-52, posting a 39-19 record in two seasons at the Merchant Marine Academy and a two-year 12-23 mark at Navy.

THE YOUNG AND THE RESTLESS

Second-year head coach Billy Lange is one of the youngest Div. I men's basketball coaches in the country. Former Indiana University standout and first-year IPFW mentor Dane Fife is the youngest coach at 26 years old. Lange is the sixth-youngest coach among 326 Div. I programs. The oldest you ask? Temple's John Chaney is 73 years old and will turn 74 on Jan. 21.

ALUMNI HALL: HOME OF THE MIDSHIPMEN

The Mids have traditionally been known as a strong home court team. Navy was 15-2 at Alumni Hall during the 2000-01 campaign, winning 15 in a row while boasting a 6-0 league mark at home. But recently Navy has struggled to defend its home court. Last season marked the first time since the 2000-01 season (5-1), in which Navy secured a winning home record in Patriot League action, posting a 4-3 record.

Since opening its doors for the 1991-92 season, Navy has produced a 125-69 (.644) record in Alumni Hall. Against Patriot League foes, the Mids are 55-33 (.625).

JOHNSON HAS SURGERY TO REPAIR KNEE

Navy starting guard **Corey Johnson** tore the meniscus in his left knee in the Mids' loss against Academy rival Air Force Nov. 27. After sitting out two games, Navy's leading scorer underwent surgery on Dec. 6 to repair the tear. It is uncertain as to when or if Johnson will return this season.

POINTS A'PLENTY

In Navy's 106-80 victory over Washington (Md.) on Dec. 18, six Midshipmen scored in double digits — Kaleo Kina (19), Matt Fannin (16), Carlton Baldwin (14), Greg Sprink (14), David Hooper (13) and Adam Teague (10). The six players combined to score 86 of the 106 Navy points (.811).

The last time six Navy players scored in double figures in one game was on Jan. 27, 2001, when Jason Jeanpierre (15), Chris Williams (14), Robert Reeder (12), Kyle Barker (12), Demond Shepard (9) and John Williams (10) combined to score 73 of the Mids' 81 points in an 81-70 win over Colgate in Annapolis.

SKED IS TOUGH TASK FOR MIDS

Navy has opened the 2005-06 with one of the tougher schedules in recent memory. Here are a few facts you should know about Navy's first four opponents — Georgetown, UALR, Air Force, Penn. ☆ The four teams own a combined 30-16 (.652) record this season, including Air Force with a 10-1 (.909) mark ... last year, the four teams produced a 75-44 (.630) mark.

☆ Last season, Georgetown earned an NIT berth and lost to eventual NIT winner South Carolina in the quarterfinals by three ... the Hoyas returned all five starters from that team, including Big East Rookie of the Year Jeff Green and All-East selection Brandon Bowman.

☆ UALR has won back-to-back Sun Belt Conference East Division titles ... Navy went on the road to play the Trojans where under Steve Shields, UALR owned a 25-3 record at home and last year posted a 13-1 home record ... the Trojans lost to 14th-ranked Michigan State by five on Dec. 3.

☆ Air Force has turned its program around, reaching double digit wins in the last three seasons, including a 22-7 season in 2003-04 in which the Falcons reached the NCAA Tournament ... last season's team turned in an 18-12 record and finished third in the Mountain West.

☆ Penn has won the Ivy League title five times in the last seven years, including two of the last three ... in the last four years, the Quakers have reached 20-plus wins three times and in 2003-04, Penn posted 17 wins.

JOHNSON MAKES THE MARK

Second-year guard **Corey Johnson** eclipsed the 300-point plateau in Navy's loss to Air Force (11/27) after he, along with rookie teammate **Kaleo Kina**, led the Mids with 14 points apiece. Johnson led Navy in scoring (tied for lead in two games) in each of the first three games this season and is the only Mid to average double digits in the scoring column (14.7 ppg). He owns Navy's longest current consecutive games scored streak, producing points in 31-straight games.

Johnson also reached 60 steals for his career in the loss to the Falcons, swiping a team-best three passes. The two-year starter needs five assists to reach the century mark.

COLBERT EARNS PATRIOT LEAGUE HONOR

Rookie **Clif Colbert** was named the Patriot League Rookie of the Week Dec. 12 after averaging 14.0 points and 4.0 rebounds per game and leading the Midshipmen to wins over Howard (12/5) and Morgan State (12/8).

Colbert was asked to take over the starting point guard position Dec. 2 after **Corey Johnson** suffered a knee injury against Air Force (11/27). Colbert led the Mids to their first victory of the season, an 82-73 win over Howard, at the BB&T Classic where he paced the Mids with 16 points and grabbed a career-high three steals. Three days later, Colbert dumped in 12 points and pulled down five boards in Navy's 26-point road victory over Morgan State.

NAVY PICKED SIXTH IN THE PATRIOT LEAGUE

After finishing last season tied with Lafayette for sixth place, the Patriot League's coaches and sports information directors have picked Navy to finish sixth according to the 2005-06 Preseason Patriot League Men's Basketball Poll.

Behind the play of Patriot League preseason all-league pick Charles Lee and Preseason Player of the Year Chris McNaughton, Bucknell picked up 14 of the 16 first-place votes to pace the field, while Holy Cross, who won the regular-season title a year ago, accounted for the final two first-place votes and is picked to finish second.

The official dedication ceremony will be held on Saturday, Jan. 7, when the Navy men's and women's teams play host to Patriot League rival Bucknell.

A 1957 graduate of the Naval Academy, Smalley won a combined six letters in basketball and baseball, while earning four N-Stars against arch rival Army. He is one of only four midshipmen in the 99-year history of Navy men's basketball to serve as team captain for two-consecutive years. He was the Mids' top scorer during his sophomore and senior campaigns, while leading the team in free throw percentage as a junior and senior. He was also selected to play in the East-West All-Star Game in Kansas City his senior year.

Smalley scored 856 points during his three-year varsity career and twice won the Charles Evans McDonough Memorial Basketball Cup, awarded annually "to the member of the basketball squad deemed to have been the outstanding team player during the season."

Smalley was also a standout outfielder for the Navy baseball team. He won the Blair Bat, symbolic of the Eastern Intercollegiate Baseball League batting title, during his junior season with a league average of .419. He also led the league in RBIs with 12. In overall games that season, he led the squad in hits (30), homers (3), RBIs (25) and batting average (.448).

Smalley won the Naval Academy Athletic Association Sword in 1957 as the midshipman of the graduating class who was considered "to have personally excelled in athletics during his years of varsity competition."

A native of Baltimore, Md., Smalley served five years in the United States Marine Corps, where he was named to the All-Marine Basketball Team four years.

In 1962, Smalley returned to the Academy as an assistant coach with the men's basketball team and as a member of the Physical Education Department. In 1966, Smalley succeeded Ben Carnevale as head coach of the Navy basketball team. Under his 10-year direction, Navy produced a 94-130 record and his Midshipmen teams were ranked among the top 10 in the country in team defense in three of his last six seasons.

In 1976, Smalley left his post as the men's coach and later that year was asked to lay the groundwork for a women's basketball program. His first season leading the women, competing at the junior varsity level, he led the Mids to a 10-1 record and won the Maryland AIAW state championship for small colleges. The program achieved varsity status in 1977, and he guided the Midshipmen to a 12-year combined record of 179-119 that featured 10 winning seasons. Smalley's teams recorded back-to-back 18-win seasons in 1981-82 and 1982-83, and the 1986-87 team finished 18-8 and captured the ECAC South Division II Championship.

Smalley held the title of Assistant Director of Athletics in charge of admissions since 1979 and was promoted to Senior Associate Athletic Director for Admissions, Academics and Compliance in 2001. In that capacity, Smalley handles the admissions process for recruited athletes in each of Navy's 30 varsity sports. Smalley and his staff also monitor the academic progress of Navy's 1500 student-athletes.

ELITE EIGHT ANNIVERSARY

This year marks the 20th anniversary of the 1985-86 team's memorable run in the NCAA Tournament. Led by All-American David Robinson, the Mids disposed of Tulsa, Syracuse and Cleveland State before dropping a 71-50 decision to top-ranked Duke in the Elite Eight. Navy will welcome back the 1985-86 Elite Eight team on Jan. 7 to recognize their accomplishments.

ROUGH STARTS

For just the third time in its 99-year history, Navy started its season 0-4. It's the third time in the last 14 seasons in which the Mids have gotten off to an 0-4 start.

☆ In Don DeVoe's first season as head coach (1992-93), the Mids lost their first five games before edging out Eastern Washington, 57-56, in a neutral site contest.

☆ In DeVoe's final season (2003-04), the Mids fell to 0-5 before squeaking out a 61-60 win over Gettysburg.

NAVY HEAD COACH BILLY LANGE

The 2004-05 campaign was the beginning of a new era for Navy basketball with first-year head coach Billy Lange at the helm. One that preached a commitment and the restoration of a tradition that has bled Blue and Gold for years.

With the new outlook came a new style of play, a new attitude — an aggressive, fast-paced, in-your-face, sense of panic which was welcomed not only by the team, but by Navy's faithful fans.

2004-05 NAVY HIGHLIGHTS

☆ Finished 9-19, winning four more games than in 2003-04 ... Navy's five conference wins were the most since the 2001-02 team owned a 5-9 league record.

☆ Won five of their last 10 games, including a 66-62 victory over Patriot League Tournament champion Bucknell, who defeated Kansas in the first round of the NCAA Tournament.

☆ Finished 2004-05 ranked among the country's top 50 in rebound margin (32nd, +5.1) and steals (34th, 8.9 spg).

☆ Finished the 2004-05 campaign ranked No. 1 in the Patriot League in four statistical categories (overall games) — scoring offense, rebounding offense (41.1), offensive rebounds (16.11) and rebounding margin (+5.1).

☆ Displayed a +13.5 scoring gain over the previous season, while averaging just under six rebounds a game more than the 2003-04 campaign.

☆ In league games, paced the conference in rebounding offense (42.4) and offensive rebounds (17.14).

☆ Finished the season by setting three school records for Patriot League action — three-point field goals made (99), three-point field goals attempted (297) and rebounds (593).

☆ Helped mold **Corey Johnson** and **Greg Sprink** into Patriot League All-Rookie Team members ... the duo made Academy history as Johnson and Sprink became the first tandem to score 200 points each in their plebe season.

ADDITIONAL COACHING HIGHLIGHTS

☆ Part of a staff which led Villanova to three-straight appearances in the National Invitational Tournament, including the quarterfinals in 2004.

☆ Led the Merchant Marine Academy to two Skyline Conference crowns and a berth in the 2001 NCAA Division III Sweet 16.

☆ Named the New York Metropolitan Basketball Writers Division III Coach of the Year in 2001.

☆ In his first and only season as the head coach at Bishop Eustace, taking over for his father, Bill Sr., who was in a life-threatening accident just one week into the season, Lange led the team to a 20-6 record and an appearance in the state New Jersey State Championship game.

Naval Academy graduate Jack Stephens donated the money to build the home of the UALR Trojans, the Jack Stephens Center ... the Navy-UALR contest was the first men's basketball regular-season game contested at the arena at the request of the late Mr. Stephens ... despite outrebounding the Trojans by 10 and shooting a solid 76.2 percent from the charity stripe, the Mids dropped to 2-0 ... midway through the first half, head coach Billy Lange put five freshmen on the court together ... Navy's freshman class scored 30 points, while the freshman and sophomore class combined to score 49 of the 57 points ... freshman **Kaleo Kina** scored a then career-high 10 points, while fellow rookie **Adam Teague** grabbed a team-high tying eight rebounds ... the Mids turned the ball over 24 times and committed 26 fouls.

Navy shot a season-best 54.0 (34-63) percent from the field en route to a 26-point win over Washington (Md.) ... it's the first time Navy has tripped the century mark since defeating Lehigh, 100-75, on Jan. 29, 2000 ... it's the most points by the Midshipmen since their 109-73 triumph over Lehigh on Feb. 8, 1997 ... six players turned in double-digit scoring efforts, including freshman **Kaleo Kina** who registered a career-high 19 points, while dealing out a career-best eight assists ... the last time six Navy players scored in double digits in one game was on Jan. 27, 2001 when Jason Jeanpierre (15), Chris Williams (14), Robert Reeder (12), Kyle Barker (12), Demond Shepard (9) and John Williams (10) combined to score 73 of Navy's 81 points in an 81-70 win over Colgate in Annapolis ... senior **David Hooper** had another strong performance, turning in his second-career double-double with 13 points and 10 boards.

GAME 8 ☆ YALE 73, NAVY 70 ☆ DEC. 20, 2005 ☆ NEW HAVEN, CONN.

Navy held a five-point lead with six minutes to go, but Yale put together a 10-2 run between 5:30 and 1:39, as the Mids dropped a three-point decision to the Bulldogs ... Yale scored 38 points in the second half, the most second-half points by a Navy opponent this season, while the Mids scored a season-low 28 points in the second half ... Navy recorded a season-low tying 14 turnovers, including just five in the second half ... the Mids were whistled for 10 more fouls than Yale (22-12) ... Yale finished the game with 12 fouls, the same number of fouls the Mids were called for in the first half ... the Bulldogs outscored Navy by 10 from the charity stripe and shot 78.3 percent from the line, the best an opponent has shot against the Mids ... Navy was outrebounded, 36-26, including 9-7 on the offensive boards, marking the first time this season the Mids have been outrebounded on the offensive glass ... senior captain **Matt Fannin** paced the team with 20 points, shooting 8 for 11 (.727) from the field, and grabbed five boards ... rookie guard **Kaleo Kina** turned in 14 points and led Navy with six assists.

GAME 9 ☆ NAVY 73, BROWN 64 ☆ DEC. 22, 2005 ☆ PROVIDENCE, R.I.

Navy sophomore **Greg Sprink** scored 31 of his career-high 34 points in the second half to lead the Mids back from a 16-point deficit and a 73-64 victory over Brown ... Sprink is Navy's first 30-point scorer since Scott Long dumped in 31 against Eastern Michigan on Dec. 28, 2002 ... it's the most points by a Navy player since All-Patriot League guard Mike Heary turned in 38 points against conference foe Holy Cross on Jan. 29, 1997 ... en route to his 34 points, Sprink tied the school record for three-pointers, targeting nine, eight in the second half ... he tied the record originally set by Michael Burd 15 years ago (11/26/90) against Mount St. Mary's ... Sprink, who was 1 for 4 from the field and 1 for 2 from long range in the opening half, missed just two field goals in the second stanza (9-11), including just one three-pointer (8-9) ... the Mids shot a season best from the charity stripe, knocking down 19 of its 24 (.792) attempts, including senior captain **Matt Fannin** who was 10 for 14 ...
