Even though WKU was the home team in the season opener against Kentucky, the Hilltopper will play their true home opener at Houchens Industries-L.T. Smith Stadium this Saturday when they host Navy. WKU is looking to carry on the positive momentum gained from a solid defensive performance in a narrow 14-3 loss to UK last week, while Navy opened its year with a 40-17 home victory over Delaware. This will be the second all-time meeting between the Hilltoppers and Midshipmen, as Navy picked up a 38-22 victory in the first meeting back in 2009 in Annapolis.

Topper Tidbits

- ▶ Saturday's contest will be the first-ever visit by Navy to the Commonwealth of Kentucky. It will also be the first time a service academy team has visited WKU.
- ▶ The Hilltoppers and Midshipmen share one common coach in their past. **Joe Bugel** served as an assistant coach at WKU from 1964-68, before leaving to take a similar position at Navy prior to the 1969 season.
- ▶ This week's game begins a stretch of three straight home games for WKU at Houchens Industries-L.T. Smith Stadium — the first such streak since the Toppers played three straight at home during the second half of the 2008 campaign.

About Navy

One of the nation's best rushing teams in recent years, the Midshipmen picked up right where they left off in their opener against Delaware rushing for 391 yards in a 40-17 victory. Quarterback **Kriss Proctor** led the way with 176 yards on the ground and three rushing touchdowns. He also completed 4-of-7 passes for 46 yards and a 12-yard scoring pass to Aaron Santiago. Defensively, **Matt Brewer** paced Navy with seven tackles in the opener. However, the Midshipmen allowed the Blue Hens to rush for 220 yards and tally 363 offensive yards. Since 2003, Navy has won 71 games — the 16th-best total among all FBS teams — and have been to eight straight bowl games. Over that same span, the Midshipmen hold more wins over BCS automatic qualifier teams than any other non-AQ school. Navy has finished in the top six in the nation in rushing each of the last nine years, and led the country running the ball five times in that span. Its 391 rushing yards were the most from any FBS team during week one of the 2011 season.

Number of the Game — 48

Number of rushing yards Bobby Rainey needs to reach 3,000 for his career. To date, only five Hilltoppers in history have rushed for 3,000 yards.

WKU News and Notes

Defense Dominates — WKU's defense showed significant improvement statistically from 2009 to 2010, but if the 2011 season opener is any indication of things to come, this year's group will make an even bigger leap forward. The Hilltoppers limited Kentucky to just 190 yards of total offense last Thursday, not allowing the Wildcats to hit the century mark in either rushing (93 yards) or passing (97 yards). That also marked the lowest yardage total allowed to a Division I school (FBS or FCS) since Western Illinois totaled 146 yards on Oct. 22, 2005. It also goes down as the fewest yards allowed to a FBS school.

Jackson Brings The Hickory — Perhaps it is fitting that in a game played less than 15 miles from The Hermitage, **Andrew Jackson** was the leader of the Topper defense Thursday night in Nashville. Making his first career start at linebacker, the sophomore from Lakeland, Fla., recorded a team-high 12 tackles. He also accounted for one of WKU's three sacks, and two of its six tackles for loss on the evening. Led by Jackson's efforts, the Toppers dropped UK for a total of 40 yards behind the line of scrimmage.

Getting Picky — After recording just eight interceptions in all of 2010, the Hilltoppers recorded three picks in the 2011 season opener. Two Toppers made their first career interceptions as sophomore defensive back **Vince Williams** came up with the first turnover, and senior lineman **Jared Clendenin** came up with WKU's final takeaway of the game. Senior **Derrius Brooks** — who accounted for three of the team's eight INTs last season — picked up where he left off with his first pick of 2011.

Brakefield Takes Weekly Honor — After averaging 44.6 yards per kick on eight punts against Kentucky, sophomore punter was named the first Sun Belt Conference Special Teams Player of the Week for 2011. Of his eight punts, three went for over 50 yards — including a 58 yarder. The Nashville native also had two punts downed inside the Kentucky 10 yard line. In fact, of the seven punts that forced Kentucky to start in their own territory, the Wildcats were unable to move the ball over midfield on five of those possessions.

Starting to Look Familiar — With all the youth and turnover WKU has experienced in personnel the past couple years, a sense of stability and experience seemed to be in place in the Topper lineup against Kentucky. Of WKU's 22 offensive and defensive starters against the Wildcats, only three were making their first career starts. The other 19 starters had combined for 242 total career starts heading into the contest.

Jakes Looks For Deja Vu Against Navy — Looking to rebound from the season opener, junior quarterback **Kawaun Jakes** will face an opponent this week that he had tremendous success against two seasons ago. Jakes — then a redshirt freshman — made his first career start against Navy when WKU visited Annapolis back in 2009. In that contest, he completed 22 of 28 passes for 276 yards and a pair of scores. He also rushed for 44 yards and a score against the Midshipmen. Jakes completed each of his first 10 passes, and was 21-of-23 passing entering the final drive of the game. He also led WKU to a season-best 434 yards of total offense.

WKU Football News and Notes

Not So Gracious Hosts — The season's home opener has certainly gone in the Hilltoppers' favor in throughout recent history. Despite trying to snap a two-game losing skid in the first game at Houchens-Smith Stadium, the Toppers have won their first game on home turf 19 of the past 22 seasons.

Rainey Streaking Towards Record — With another 100-yard effort against Kentucky, **Bobby Rainey** continues to move closer to making history. Rainey rushed for over 100 yards in each of the last five games last season — tying him with **Lerron Moore** for the second-longest streak of consecutive 100-yard efforts in WKU history. He made it six straight, and moved into second all by himself with 105 yards against the Wildcats. **Antwan Floyd** holds the school record with eight straight 100-yard rushing efforts stretched over the 1994 and 1995 campaigns.

Watch Out — A pair of Hilltoppers garnered national attention over the summer, being named to various watch lists for national awards. Senior running back **Bobby Rainey** found himself listed among the nation's elite on three lists: the Maxwell Award (nation's most outstanding all-around player), the Doak Walker Award (nation's top running back), and the Paul Hornung Award (nation's most versatile player). Rainey also appeared on the inaugural Hornung Award list in 2010. Junior tight end **Jack Doyle** was also recognized as one of the best at his position as he is one of 30 preseason candidates for the John Mackey Award, given annually to the nation's top tight end.

Offensive Production Returns — With a number of underclassmen stepping to the forefront in 2010, the Hilltoppers return nearly all of their offensive numbers from a year ago. In fact, WKU racked up 3,818 yards of total offense a year ago, and the players that accounted for 3,813 of those yards are still on the roster this season. Breaking it down, the Toppers return 99.8 percent of their rushing from last season, 90.1 percent of their receiving yards and 100 percent of their passing yards.

New-Look Toppers — On Aug. 19, WKU unveiled its new uniforms for the 2011 season to coincide with the announcement of a four-year extension to the University's contract with Russell Athletic. The new uniform set will feature nine different jersey/pant combinations. WKU is also changing to white helmets this season with the familiar red towel on each side.

Rainey Ranked Best in Sun Belt — In its 2011 Sun Belt Conference preview, *Athlon Sports* ranked the top 25 players in the league, placing WKU's **Bobby Rainey** in the number one spot. Two Toppers were among the top 25 as senior offensive lineman **Wes Jeffries** came in ranked 20th. Both Rainey and Jeffries represented the Hilltoppers on the preseason all-Sun Belt Conference team — the first two preseason all-league recipients for WKU in its three-year affiliation with the league.

Broadcasting the Toppers — Each of WKU's first five games of the 2011 season will appear on some form of ESPN broadcast platform. The season opener against Kentucky and the Oct. 6 contest at Middle Tennessee will both be televised nationally on ESPNU. Each of the first two

Hilltopper home games — Navy on Sept. 10 and Indiana State on Sept. 17 — will be available on-line on ESPN3, and the Oct. 1 conference opener against Arkansas State can be seen on the Sun Belt Network as part of an ESPN Regional broadcast.

Home Sweet Home — Including the season opener in Nashville, which goes in the books as a WKU home game, the Hilltoppers will get plenty of wear out of the home uniforms early in the season. WKU will open the year with four straight home contests, including three in a row at Houchens Industries-L.T. Smith Stadium beginning with Navy on Sept. 10. The four home games to open the season are the most in a row since 1926 when WKU began the year with five consecutive home contests. The seven total home games in 2011 are also the most for a Hilltopper team since 2003.

Streak Stands at 108 — Despite the Hilltoppers' recent struggles, an impressive streak has remained intact now for nine straight seasons. WKU has not been held scoreless in a game since a 14-0 home loss to Western Illinois on Sept. 14, 2002. The streak stands at 108 games entering this week's game with Navy. That is also the longest streak without being shut out of any team in the Sun Belt Conference. Currently, only 38 teams in the football bowl subdivision have a streak of 100 games or more. The previous WKU record for consecutive games scoring was 88, set between the 1965 and 1973 seasons. After being blanked by the Leathernecks, the Hilltoppers dropped just one more game in that '02 campaign as they went on to capture the I-AA National Championship.

Championship Effort — WKU's only team National Championship was in football (2002 I-AA). WKU also has 12 conference championships, 10 playoff appearances, and has had 64 players earn All-American honors in its 91-season history.

A Strong Tradition On And Off The Field — While this is WKU's second year as a full Football Bowl Subdivision member, the football program has 91 seasons of success. WKU's 513-360-31 all-time record equates to a .585 winning percentage, ranking 26th among all 120 Division I FBS schools and making the Hilltoppers the winningest program in the Sun Belt Conference. WKU's 948 APR in football ranks second among all other Sun Belt Conference programs.

The Hilltoppers In OT — Since the 1996 season, the Hilltoppers have played an overtime contest seven times, compiling a 6-1 mark in those games. The first two overtime games in the program's history both came against Murray State in 1996 and 1997. Each went multiple overtimes, with WKU winning 44-41 in two extra frames in '96, then following it up a year later with a 52-50 win in three OTs. The Toppers' only overtime loss was a 23-20 setback to Northern Iowa on Nov. 5, 2005. A stretch of over five years without an OT game ended on Nov. 13, 2010 when WKU defeated Arkansas State 36-35 in Jonesboro.

Head Coach Willie Taggart



Willie Taggart was named head football coach at Western Kentucky University on November 23, 2009. In his first season as head coach, he helped lead WKU to road wins at Louisiana-Lafayette and Arkansas State and run-

ning back Bobby Rainey was named Sun Belt Conference Offensive Player of the Year after ranking third in the nation in rushing (137.4 yards per game/1,649 total rushing yards). Rainey also led the nation in rushing attempts (340) and was named Honorable Mention All-American by SI.com, while Willie McNeal was named Freshman All-American as a kickoff returner. Each of Taggart's first two recruiting classes has been named No. 1 in the Sun Belt Conference by Rivals.com.

Before joining the Hilltoppers, Taggart served as running backs coach at Stanford from 2007-09. He previously spent eight seasons as an assistant coach at WKU from 1999-2006 and served as co-offensive coordinator for WKU's 2002 I-AA National Championship team. A standout player at quarterback who set 11 school records for the Hilltoppers from 1995-98, Taggart is one of only four players in WKU's 92-year football history to have his jersey retired. He became WKU's 17th head football coach, but only the seventh since 1948.

Taggart, who joined the Stanford coaching staff following a 1-11 season in 2006, was instrumental in the development of the Cardinal offense and running game. Stanford, ranked as high as 14th in the nation by the Associated Press in 2009, posted an 8-4 regular season record with wins over nationally ranked Southern Cal and Oregon. Stanford led the Pac 10 in total offense (441.4 ypg.) while ranking second in the conference and 11th in the nation in rushing offense (224.3 ypg.). Stanford's 2,692 rushing yards in 2009 broke the school's single-season rushing yardage mark that has stood since 1949 (2,481).

The Cardinal were led by senior running back Toby Gerhart, who under Taggart's tutelage ranked second in the nation in rushing (144.7 ypg.) and earned the Doak Walker Award given to the nation's top running back. Gerhart carried a cumulative 3.25 grade point average as a management, science and technology major. He also rushed for a Stanford single-season record 1,736 yards and 26 touchdowns in 12 games in 2009, breaking his own single-season rushing record of 1,136 yards set in 2008, and was one of only five players invited to New York City for the 2009 Heisman Trophy Award presentation. He finished second in the final balloting in the closest race in the award's 75-year history. Gerhart, who was also named the Pac 10 Offensive Player of the Year, was one of only two Pac 10 players named to the first team on both the All-Pac-10 Team and the Pac-10 All-Academic Football Team. The Cardinal's Sun Bowl appearance in 2009 marked the school's first bowl game since 2001.

Taggart was at the helm of the Cardinal running game that finished second in the Pac-10 Conference in rushing offense in 2008, averaging 199.6 yards a game on the ground. Stanford's season rushing total of 2,395 yards was the third-highest mark in school history. In addition, Taggart's work with Gerhart helped the junior rush for a then single-season school record of 1,136 yards, as Gerhart became just the fifth running

back in school history to go over the 1,000-yard mark. Gerhart had one career start prior to the 2008 season. A tireless recruiter, Taggart was responsible for recruiting Florida, Georgia and Kentucky for the Cardinal along with Riverside County, California.

Prior to his arrival at Stanford, Taggart spent the previous eight seasons on the WKU coaching staff (1999-2006) and helped guide the Hilltoppers to eight consecutive winning campaigns during the stretch. He worked with current Stanford head coach Jim Harbaugh in his first three seasons of coaching from 1999-2001. Taggart started his coaching career as WKU's wide receivers coach in 1999 before working with the quarterbacks from 2000-06. He was also the co-offensive coordinator in 2001 and 2002, helping lead the Hilltoppers to the Division I-AA national championship in 2002, and was promoted to assistant head coach in 2003.

Under Taggart's guidance from 2003-06, quarterback Justin Haddix set school career records with 8,890 yards of total offense, a 57.1 completion percentage, 50 touchdowns and a 137.28 pass efficiency rating. Haddix also finished his career ranked second all-time on the Hill with 541 completions and 7,929 yards passing.

Taggart helped coach an offensive unit that set school records for points (432), total yards (5,479) and first downs (263) en route to the 2002 NCAA Division I-AA national championship. The Hilltoppers ranked second in the nation in pass efficiency and sixth in rushing, and averaged 38.8 points per contest in four playoff victories.

In Taggart's first year calling plays in 2000, WKU ran for 293.4 yards per contest, leading the Gateway Football Conference and ranking second in the country in the category as WKU claimed the league title and advanced to the quarterfinals of the I-AA playoffs. In his first season in 1999, WKU ranked eighth in the nation and first in the conference in rushing.

Taggart's efforts helped WKU quarterbacks earn all-conference mention in three consecutive seasons - Jason Johnson (2000), Donte Pimpleton (2001) and Jason Michael (2002).

Taggart also spent his collegiate playing days at WKU (1995-98) and was only the third WKU athlete in the past half-century to hold down the quarterback slot for the Hilltoppers for four straight years. Taggart - who set 11 WKU school records - had his jersey retired on October 23, 1999. He currently is WKU's all-time leader in rushing touchdowns (47), ranks second in scoring (286 points), pass efficiency rating (127.71) and rushing yards (3,997), is tied for third in most 100-yard rushing games (17), and is tied for fourth in touchdown passes (30). His rushing yards were the most in NCAA Division I history at the time for a quarterback.

In each of his last two collegiate seasons, he was a finalist for the prestigious Walter Payton Award which is an honor given annually to the top offensive player in I-AA football. Taggart finished fourth in the balloting in 1997 and seventh as a senior the following year. An All-American as a senior, he was also the 1998 I-AA Independents' Offensive Player of the Year. Taggart was recruited to WKU by Jim Harbaugh to play for his father, Jack.

Taggart graduated from WKU with a bachelor's degree in social sciences in 1998.

As a prep standout at Manatee (Fla.) High School, he was a first team all-state and all-conference selection as a senior after guiding the Hurricanes to the state 5A Championship game. He led MHS to the state title his junior season and helped the school post a 26-4 record during that two-year span while recording more than 3,000 yards passing and 975 yards on the ground.

Taggart and his wife Taneshia have two children, Willie Jr. and Jackson.

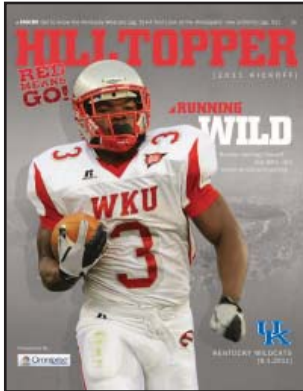

Nashville, Tenn. — Josh Clemons scored on a 14-yard touchdown run, and Morgan Newton shook off three interceptions in throwing a 31-yard TD pass to La’Rod King in helping the Wildcats beat WKU 14-3 on Sept. 1.

Kentucky had only 75 yards total offense through the first three quarters before Newton drove them 80 yards late in the fourth to put away the victory. The Hilltoppers were the home team in this game played at the home of the NFL’s Tennessee Titans.

Winston Guy had an interception that set up Clemons’ TD run on a night when the Wildcats struggled with at least six three-and-outs on offense. They struggled to beat a team they routed 63-28 last season with backups getting plenty of playing time.

Kentucky had six starters back, including four on the offensive line, from a team that reached a fifth straight bowl last season. It didn’t help as the Wildcats’ line got pushed around all night. Kentucky struggled to get its offense going early with Newton settling in at quarterback with the departure of Mike Hartline.

But the Wildcats led 7-3 at halftime despite being outgained 101-35 in total offense and 234-190 for the game.

The Hilltoppers also sacked Newton three times, and the Kentucky quarterback had at least three passes dropped by receivers.

Newton got going just in time, shaking off two interceptions in the fourth quarter, the last with 9:40 left and Kentucky driving. Newton’s pass bounced off an official’s left arm and Wildcats guard Stuart Hines before going to WKU defensive end Jared Clendenin.

Facing third-and-14 at the Kentucky 16, Newton ran up the middle for 58 yards in the game’s longest play before being dragged down. He then found King wide open for a TD with 4:35 left.

The offenses struggled so much that the punters had the best plays most of the game. Ryan Tydlacka had a 59-yard punt for Kentucky that pinned the Hilltoppers deep, while Hendrix Brakefield had a 58-yarder for WKU.

WKU held the ball for 34 minutes, and Bobby Rainey ran for 105 yards, his sixth straight game with at least 100 yards rushing.
