SETTING THE SCENE

• With a **6-3** mark - it's best since **1986** - SMU hosts Navy in a nationally-televised match-up on Saturday, Nov. 12.

• SMU is **13-3** in its last 16 home games, dating back to the start of the 2009 season, but one of those losses came to Navy in overtime in 2009.

• **Zach Line** continues to **lead C-USA** in rushing and has topped the 100-yard mark in seven of nine games in 2011.

• SMU is **6-0** this season when leading after the first quarter and **6-0** when scoring 21+ points.

• Since 2006, attendance at SMU home football games has increased **52 percent**.

• SMU made nearly **\$3 million in Ford Stadium improvements** over the summer, including upgrades to the football locker room and team meeting rooms as well as a new playing surface.

• Located in the nation's **fifth-largest media market**, SMU boasts an impressive resume with **138 Conference Championships, 147 NCAA Top-10 Finishes, eight NCAA Team Championships (three in football), over 100 individual NCAA Championships, hundreds of All-Americans** and one **Heisman Trophy Winner**, and has won its conference's Director's Cup in 11 out of the past 14 years.

• SMU is **one of just 20 schools** that has both a Heisman Trophy winner and multiple national championships.

• SMU is in the midst of its **Centennial Celebration**, commemorating the **100th anniversary of the University's founding and opening**. January 1, 2011 was designated as the start of the celebration period, running through 2015. SMU was founded in **1911** and opened in **1915**.

ABOUT THE MIDSHIPMEN

• After dropping six straight games, Navy rebounded to trounce Troy last week, 42-14. The Midshipmen are led by Kriss Proctor, who has run for 10 TDs and thrown for seven in 2011.

THE SERIES

• SMU and Navy are meeting for the 16th time, with Navy holding a slim 8-7 series lead. The Mustangs have struggled against the Midshipmen in recent years, though, going just 1-7 against Navy in meetings since 1995. Perhaps the "biggest" game in series history was played in Dallas in 1963 when SMU topped Roger Staubach and the fourth-ranked Midshipmen, 32-28.

THE COACHES

• **June Jones** is in his fourth season at the SMU helm. His SMU record is 22-26 and his career mark is now 98-67. Jones has led SMU to back-to-back Conference USA Western Division Championships and bowl berths. Jones went 76-41 in nine seasons at Hawaii, leading the Warriors to the All-State Sugar Bowl following the 2007 season. Prior to heading to Hawaii, Jones had a 12-year coaching career in the NFL, including head coaching stops at Atlanta and San Diego.

• Navy Head Coach Ken Niumatalolo is in his fourth season at the Midshipmen helm, where he has posted a 30-20 career record. Niumatalolo was a redshirt freshman quarterback at Hawaii in 1983 where SMU Coach June Jones was in his first year coaching quarterbacks after his five-year NFL career had ended.

LAST TIME VS. NAVY

ANNAPOLIS, Md. - Navy's Alexander Teich ran for a career-high 95 yards and two touchdowns, including the tiebreaking score with 1:38 left, and Navy rallied to beat SMU 28-21 on Oct. 16, 2010.

Navy scored 21 straight points in the second half to take a 21-14 lead, but the Mustangs moved 57 yards in 10 plays to tie it at 21 with 2:51 to go.

After SMU forced Navy to punt, Kyle Padron's first pass was picked off by Simmons and returned six yards to the SMU 13, setting up a 4-yard touchdown run by Teich.

THE GANSZ TROPHY

When SMU and Navy meet on the gridiron, they battle for the **Gansz Trophy**, a traveling trophy created to honor late coaching legend **Frank Gansz**.

Considered perhaps the top special teams coach in the history of the NFL, Gansz spent time at both SMU and the Naval Academy. Gansz was starting his second season as special teams coach on the Hilltop when he passed away on April 27, 2009. As a collegian, Gansz played center and linebacker for the Naval Academy from 1957 to 1959 and graduated in 1960. He also spent four seasons as an assistant coach at Navy (1969-72).

In all, Gansz was a veteran of 38 seasons of coaching - 24 in the NFL and 14 in the collegiate ranks. Prior to coming to SMU in 2008, Gansz was with the Jacksonville Jaguars, where he was special teams coordinator in 2000 and 2001. He served as the special teams coach of the St. Louis Rams for three seasons, helping the team to its victory in Super Bowl XXXIV.

In 1986, Gansz's first year as the assistant head coach/special teams for Kansas City, the Chiefs blocked or deflected an NFL-record 10 kicks and scored five touchdowns. Because of his success with the special teams, Gansz was promoted to head coach of the Chiefs, a role he served from 1987 to 1988.

He left the Chiefs to become the special teams coach of the Detroit Lions from 1989 to 1993. In 1989, Gansz was named NFL Special Teams Coach of the Year by his peers. Gansz then spent three years as the assistant head coach/special teams for the Atlanta Falcons from 1994 to 1996.

Gansz's NFL career began in 1978 as special teams coach for the San Francisco 49ers. He coached special teams and tight ends for Cincinnati (1979-80), Kansas City (1981-82) and Philadelphia (1983-85).

After serving as a pilot in the U.S. Air Force for nearly seven years, Gansz began his coaching career at the Air Force Academy (1964-66). He also had coaching stints at Colgate (1968), Navy (1969-72), Oklahoma State (1973, 1975), Army (1974) and UCLA (1976-77).

After SMU and Navy finish their current four-game, home-and-home series in 2011, the series will resume in 2015 with another four-game, home-and-home series. SMU will travel to Annapolis in 2015 and 2017 and Navy will come to Dallas in 2016 and 2018. Future dates are also being discussed.

STOPPING STAUBACH

On October 11, 1963, the fourth-ranked Navy Midshipman came to the Cotton Bowl to play the Mustangs on the Friday night before the Texas-OU game.

A crowd of 37,000 fans came to Fair Park with the intentions of getting a look at Navy's All-America quarterback, Roger Staubach. What the crowd did not expect was that the Mustangs and second-year head coach Hayden Fry were about to knock off Staubach and company in one of the most memorable games in SMU history.

After the Midshipmen jumped out to a 10-0 lead, SMU sophomore quarterback Mac White took a sweep 22 yards for a touchdown. However, Staubach brought Navy right back to extend the lead to 18-7. SMU QB Danny Thomas then came into the game in relief and hit Thomas Hillary for a touchdown with five seconds left in the first half, bringing the Mustangs to within five at 18-13 at the intermission.

Late in the third quarter, Staubach threw a touchdown pass for a 25-13 lead. But on the third play after the kickoff, John Roderick ignited the Cotton Bowl as he took a pitch from White and made one of the most exciting plays of the decade. Roderick cut all the way across the field at the 35, got a block from White and raced into the end zone to cut the Navy lead to six at 25-19.

The Mustang defense then stepped up on Navy's next possession and made the first of several big plays that night. Dave Corder intercepted Staubach, allowing the offense to come back on the field to go for the lead. SMU drove inside the Navy 10 and gave the ball to Roderick for the final surge into the end zone. The Mustangs had stormed back to take the lead, 26-25. But Staubach, with his usual determination, moved his team down the field setting up a field goal to give Navy a two-point lead at 28-26 with 2:52 remaining in the game.

On the ensuing possession, it only took the Mustangs four plays and 47 seconds to take the lead back. Billy Gannon was able to fight his way into the end zone from the one, and SMU took a 32-28 lead.

But back came Staubach, proving why he would come to be known as "Captain Comeback" during his days at the helm of the Dallas Cowboys. However, SMU's Donald Campbell and Tommy Caughran broke up two passes in the end zone in the last few seconds, and the Mustangs had their upset win.

Coach Fry was named national Coach of the Week, and the win over Navy helped propel the Mustangs into the Sun Bowl despite the fact that they finished 4-6 and tied for fifth in the Southwest Conference.

B-AQ, B-AQ, B-AQ, B-AQ, B-AQ

It's not a duck or Chris Berman's home run call, but rather SMU's goal - get Back to AQ status. SMU's future lies in a BCS-AQ conference. For all but 15 years of its 100-year existence, SMU has competed in an AQ-like conference, and it is time to return to that level.

"We are pushing for it," SMU President R. Gerald Turner said. "It's good for Dallas."

Dallas deserves a school in an automatic qualifying conference and a BCS team would be an economic engine.

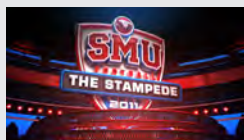

C-USA Games In **BOLD**

"THE STAMPEDE"



FoxSports Southwest and CBS Sports Network are showcasing the SMU Mustang football program in a series of half-hour shows this season. The show, titled "SMU Football 2011: The Stampede", features SMU Head Coach June Jones as well as insight into the inner workings of a college football program by giving viewers a first-hand look at practices, team meetings and campus facilities.

Agreements with both FoxSports Southwest and CBS Sports Network allow the show to have both a regional and national footprint. Shot in HD, the weekly show airs on FoxSports Southwest on Tuesdays at 6 p.m. CT and on CBS Sports Network on Wednesdays at 8:30 p.m. CT. Fans should check their local listings for all showtimes.

LINE-BACKER?

Junior running back **Zach Line** was recruited to SMU as a linebacker, but the Michigan native found his role in the team's backfield.

The **Maxwell and Doak Walker Award** Watch List member was named first-team All-Conference USA in 2010 after rushing for 1,494 yards, the second-largest single-season total in school history, and the 11th-best total in the country. On the year, Line averaged 6.1 yards per carry and scored 10 touchdowns.

As a high school senior, Line held no FBS offers. That's when Bill Keenist, the Detroit Lions' Senior VP of Communications, decided to help. Keenist's son had played with Line at Oxford High School, and Keenist sent a DVD of Line's exploits to June Jones, a former coach for the Lions.

Jones saw what he thought was a linebacker and recruited Line to SMU, but once Jones and the staff started slotting guys into positions, they moved Line to running back and it's safe to say he's there to stay.

In 2011, Line **leads C-USA** in both **scoring (11.33 ppg)** and **rushing (121 ypg)**, and rates seventh and eighth nationally in the categories, respectively.

Line has **rushed for 100-plus yards in seven of nine games** this season, and has topped the century mark in 12 of the last 16 overall. He has run for 1,089 yards in 2011 and 2,772 yards in his career, which ranks **eighth all-time** at SMU. With two 1,000+ yard seasons, Line is just the fifth player at SMU with multiple 1,000-yard seasons (Reggie Dupard (3), Eric Dickerson (2), Keylon Kincade (2), Alvin Maxson (2)).

He also set a new **school record** by rushing for **five TDs** in the win over Northwestern State. He has 17 rushing TDs already in 2011 and within two of the single-season school record of 19, set by Eric Dickerson in 1981. His **34 career rushing TDs** are third all-time at SMU.

Line even plays on special teams, forcing the fumble (the second of his career) on the opening kickoff of the second half at TCU that SMU recovered for a TD.

DJ HERO

No, not the video game... It's SMU's junior stand-out wide receiver **Darius Johnson**. Johnson was the hero of the Armed Forces Bowl, earning Team MVP honors after recording a season-high 152 receiving yards and a TD in the 2010 season finale.

The **Biletnikoff Award** Watch List member broke out this season with an eight-catch, 127-yard game against Northwestern State and followed that up with a two-TD, 10-catch, 116-yard day at Memphis. He put his stamp on the TCU win, notching 152 receiving yards for his third straight 100-yard game and tying career highs with 12 catches and two receiving TDs. He returned to the century club with a seven-catch, 135-yard performance in the Tulane win.

He has four 100-yard games this season - 12 for his career - and has three games with 10 or more catches, tying for third at SMU. In all, he has 142 career receptions (11th at SMU) for 1,709 career receiving yards.

He **ranks fourth in C-USA** with an 84-yard-per-game average and is **sixth in the league** with a six-catch-per-game rate.

GOOD TIMES - J.J. IS DY-NO-MITE!

It wasn't all good times that led SMU quarterback **J.J. McDermott** to the Hilltop. The strong-armed quarterback originally enrolled at New Mexico State, where he played for spread-offense guru Hal Mumme. McDermott flourished and was slated to be NMSU's starter in 2009, but Mumme was fired after the 2008 season and McDermott began looking for another school. Mumme had a long-standing relationship with June Jones and McDermott found his way home to Texas.

McDermott got his first extended playing time in the 2011 season opener at Texas A&M. He made the most of it, leading SMU to scores on his first two drives - including his first passing TD as a Mustang. He followed that up in week two by leading SMU to its first win of the season, besting UTEP, and then moved to 2-0 as a starter after SMU's 40-7 win over Northwestern State. He improved to 3-0 with a 357-yard, three-TD performance in a 42-0 win over Memphis.

His best game yet may have been at TCU, where he was 23-of-45 for 349 yards and four touchdowns as SMU topped the 20th-ranked Frogs 40-33 in overtime. For his work, McDermott was named the **Rivals.com C-USA Player Of The Week**.

He moved to **5-0 as a starter** after passing for a career-high 358 yards and two TDs as SMU bested UCF, 38-17. The Knights had entered the game ranked No. 2 in the nation in pass defense and had yet to allow a passing TD. It was McDermott's third straight 300-yard passing game, tying the SMU record, and his three-game total of 1,064 yards **set a new SMU record** (was 1,049 by Chuck Hixson in 1968 - at Ohio St. (417), N.C. State (323), TCU (309)). McDermott was again named the **Rivals.com C-USA Player Of The Week**, was tabbed one of eight national **Manning Award Stars of the Week** and earned **C-USA Player of the Week** honors from the league's media.

After losses at Southern Miss and Tulsa, McDermott got SMU "back in the saddle again" with a 45-24 win over Tulane, passing for 322 yards and three TDs in the win.

McDermott has helped put the "Shoot" in the Run & Shoot and leads the SMU offense which now ranks **15th in the nation** in passing offense (296 ypg).

BULLETPROOF

In Dallas, there was plenty of attention paid to the specially designed, bullet-proof vest Dallas Cowboys quarterback Tony Romo wore to protect his broken rib against the Washington Redskins, but Romo wasn't the only one donning bullet-proof protection.

Mustangs running **Zach Line** has been playing with a dislocated left shoulder, but thanks to specially-designed padding made by the same company that put Romo in a **Kevlar vest**, Unequal Technologies, Line has continued to be a force.

The company calls the material it designed a combination of padding and ballistics-grade Kevlar, and boasts that it has developed the No. 1 shock suppression system in the world.

"They absorb a lot of blows, I think those new pads really helped him," said SMU Coach June Jones. "He's sold on them."

Jones has been so impressed, nearly 20 Mustangs now sport Kevlar in their pads.

TAYLOR-MADE CLUBS

SMU defenders **Taylor Reed** and **Taylor Thompson** have "clubbed" their fair share of opponents over the past three-plus seasons.

Reed was named All-Conference USA honorable mention in 2010. He posted 145 tackles (seventh highest total in the NCAA), averaging 10.4 tackles per game. The Beaumont, Texas, native posted double-digit tackle totals in seven games and is on the 2011 **Lombardi Award** Watch List. This season, Reed leads the Mustangs with 57 stops, and his **168 career solo tackles rank 15th among all active FBS defenders**.

Thompson, a native of Prosper, Texas, started in all 14 games last season and was named All-Conference USA. An anchor in SMU's 3-4 defense, he posted 32 tackles, 5.5 tackles-for-loss, 4.5 sacks and three QB hurries on the season. He was tabbed pre-season All-C-USA in 2011 and is on the **Hendricks, Nagurski** and **Lombardi Award** Watch Lists. Thompson has forced six fumbles in 2011 and ranks 13th nationally with seven sacks.

COLE'S LAW

Senior wide receiver Cole Beasley has "laid down the law" of sorts and has made himself one of SMU's top offensive threats.

In 2011, Beasley ranks second in C-USA at 7.5 catches per game (13th nationally) and 93.38 yards per game.

After missing the TCU game with a knee injury, Beasley returned against UCF, notching a 10-catch, 134-yard and one-TD performance.

In 2010, the **Biletnikoff Award** Watch List member became just the fifth player in school history to notch a 1,000-yard season (1,060 - fourth all-time at SMU). He earned All-C-USA honors, catching 87 passes - the second-best single-season effort at SMU.

He has **227 career catches** and **2,666 career receiving yards**, both of which rank in the top four on SMU's career lists, and the 227 grabs rank **seventh among all active FBS players**.

THE GOON SQUAD

In the spring of 2010, a couple of SMU's offensive linemen decided that they needed to brand themselves. They came up with "The Goon Squad."

According to the dictionary, goon is defined as a "hired hoodlum or thug" or an awkward person, but what the linemen were going for had more to do with playing with intensity, or the "seven seconds of violence" preached by Adrian Klemm, SMU's line coach who won three Super Bowls with the New England Patriots.

The Goons have specific goon-names. Left tackle **Kelvin Beachum** is the "Goonologist," because he's considered more analytical. Right tackle **J.T. Brooks** is "Goonzilla" because he's the biggest. The interior linemen are known as "The Belly of the Beast."

The Goons have grown up together, with most starting since 2009. All told, SMU's line has the most career starts in the nation for an O-Line.

TAKING HOVER

Kicker **Chase Hover** took a risk by leaving Blinn College and walking-on at SMU. He joined the team on Aug. 22, but was working with the first team by Aug. 27.

Hover contacted the SMU staff after his father had read a note in the *Dallas Morning News* about SMU's concerns in the kicking game. The 2009 Plano West graduate had torn up his knee early in his senior year of high school, so any interest from colleges quickly disappeared. He rehabbed his first year of college (as a teammate of future Heisman Trophy winner Cam Newton) and then kicked for Blinn in 2010. He went through two-a-days with Blinn this summer before things worked out at SMU, where he's paying his own way.

This season, Hover is 7-of-9 on field goals and 32-of-34 on PATs.

SAG-MAN FEVER

Lombardi Award Watch List member and pre-season All-Conference performer **Ja'Gared Davis** has been gobbling up opposing quarterbacks since his arrival on the Hilltop. Davis started 13 games in 2010 and saw action in all 14, notching nine sacks - the sixth-best season in SMU history. The Crockett, Texas, native was named first-team All-C-USA and was tabbed a CollegeFootballNews.com honorable mention All-American. The junior linebacker totaled 90 tackles, including 62 solos, and 16 TFLs in 2010.

He also scored two TDs in 2010, returning a blocked field goal try 77 yards for a touchdown at Rice, and adding another TD on a 33-yard fumble return at ECU.

In the 2011 UTEP win in week two, JG was all over the field for the Mustangs, finishing with a mind-boggling stat line - eight tackles, 1.5 sacks, 2.5 tackles-for-loss, one forced fumble, one fumble recovery, one interception, three pass break-ups and one TD. Davis sealed the win for SMU with his TD at 2:39 of the 4th quarter, forcing a fumble and recovering the ball in the end zone. For his work, he was named **FWAA/Nagurski** and **C-USA Defensive Player of the Week**. He leads SMU with two interceptions on the season and ranks third on the team with 52 tackles.

THE NFL CONNECTION

Five of SMU's 10 football coaches have either played or coached in the NFL - **Head Coach June Jones** and assistant coaches **Frank Gansz, Jr., Joe Haering, Bert Hill** and **Adrian Klemm**. It's an impressive roster, and, with 49 combined seasons of playing and coaching experience, one that ranks third among all FBS coaching staffs.

SMU FACTS

PROFILE

- A private university of nearly 11,000 students close to downtown Dallas, SMU offers undergraduate, graduate and professional programs through seven schools.
- Founded in 1911 by what is now The United Methodist Church, SMU opened in 1915 with support from Dallas leaders. The University is nonsectarian in its teaching and committed to freedom of inquiry.
- Students come from all 50 states, the District of Columbia and more than 90 foreign countries.

ATHLETICS

- SMU ranks 28th among all NCAA Division I universities in the ninth-annual Collegiate Power Rankings. The rankings assess the academic and athletics standards of all NCAA athletic programs. SMU rated as the top school in Texas and, if ranked against BCS-AQ schools, would rank 10th. The Collegiate Power Rankings average student-athlete graduation rates, academic rankings provided by *U.S. News & World Report*, and the strength of athletic departments as determined by the Learfield Sports Directors' Cup.
- Since 2006, SMU has hired three former National Coaches of the Year to lead the football, men's basketball and men's golf programs.
- SMU is one of just two schools with former National Coaches of the Year at the helms of its men's basketball and football programs.
- Since 2006, attendance at SMU football games has increased 52 percent.
- Football is coming off its second-straight bowl berth and C-USA Western Division Championship, and played in its first C-USA Championship Game in 2011.
- Men's basketball recorded its first 20-win season and first postseason bid since 1999-2000, finishing 20-15 and advancing to the CIT semifinals.
- SMU has embarked on an \$80-million plan to build new facilities and improve existing ones. The \$13-million, 43,000 square-foot Crum Basketball Center, a basketball-only practice facility adjacent to Moody Coliseum, opened in February 2008, and the Turpin Tennis Stadium opened in April of the same year. Phase I of the SMU Payne Stewart Golf Learning Center at the Dallas Athletic Club was completed in 2010 and updates to the Loyd Center have been made. Renovations to Moody Coliseum, which began in 2008 with the installation of a new \$900,000 video board and redesigned court, will ramp up in the coming year as SMU has announced a near \$40-million plan for more renovations and expansion.
- Annual giving to SMU athletics has increased 82 percent over the last five years. The 2011 fiscal year was our best fundraising year to date, as we added more than \$6.6 million to the coffers in annual gifts.
- Sponsorship revenues have increased three-fold over the last five years.
- SMU has set records in royalties received each of the last five years, increasing royalty income 63 percent during that span.
- SMU has been ranked as the top school in its conference for 11 of the last 14 years in the Director's Cup overall athletic rankings.

KNOW THIS!

- SMU has the largest athletic budget among non-AQ schools.
- SMU built a \$60-million on-campus stadium in 2000 and has an additional \$80 million committed to new facilities and facility improvements.
- SMU has a history of athletic success at the highest level. For 85 or its 100 years, SMU competed in an AQ-like conference, the Southwest Conference. Over that span, SMU has won eight NCAA Team Championships, over 100 individual NCAA Championships, and 138 Conference Team Championships, while posting 147 NCAA top-10 team finishes.
- SMU has won its league's Directors' Cup 11 times in the last 14 years. In the 2010-11 Directors' Cup, which quantifies a school's overall success in collegiate athletics, SMU finished ahead of Boston College, Colorado, Ole Miss, North Carolina State, Utah, Wake Forest, Oregon State, Washington State, Mississippi State, Rutgers and Kansas, all members of AQ conferences.
- SMU is on a huge upswing. Over the past five years, football attendance is up 52%, annual giving is up 82%, sponsorship revenues have increased three-fold and royalty income is up 63%.
- Led by June Jones, SMU's football team has earned consecutive bowl berths after winning back-to-back C-USA Western Division Championships.
- SMU is the only FBS athletic program in Dallas, a top-five TV market and arguably the most football-intense region in the state/country. Dallas is the nation's ninth-largest city and part of the fourth-largest metropolitan area in the nation, ranking as the No. 1 visitor and leisure destination in Texas.
- In terms of academics, SMU would rank second overall among Big 12 schools, according to *U.S. News & World Report's* 2011 guide of the best national universities. And SMU's Cox School of Business is one of the few schools in the nation with three MBA programs ranked in the top 15 by *Bloomberg Businessweek*.

COMPARATIVE DATA

- The average SAT score of the first-year undergraduate class for fall 2011 is approximately 1268, 25 points higher than the fall 2010 entering class. Average SAT scores have risen 125 points in last ten years.
- Total applications for the incoming first-year class have increased from 3,869 in 1995 to almost 13,000 for the fall 2011 incoming class of 1,400.
- SMU's endowment has more than doubled since 1995, when it totaled \$482.9 million. The endowment surpassed the \$1 billion mark in 2005 and is now \$1.2 billion.
- SMU's main campus has grown from 60 buildings and 176 acres in 1995 to 90 buildings and 230 acres in 2011. Other campuses are at SMU-in-Plano, on 25 acres north of Dallas, and SMU-in-Taos, on 295 acres in Northern New Mexico.

ACADEMIC RANKINGS

- In January 2011 the Carnegie Foundation for the Advancement of Teaching raised SMU's classification to a research university with "high research activity," reflecting the University's dramatic increase in research.
- SMU ranks among the "best national universities" in *U.S. News & World Report*.
- Cox School of Business is one of the few schools in the nation with three M.B.A. programs ranked in the top 15 by *Bloomberg Businessweek*.
- Dedman School of Law ranks among the nation's top 50 law schools in *U.S. News & World Report*.

RECENT ADVANCEMENTS

- "The Campaign for SMU: A Time to Lead" exceeded its initial goal of \$300 million by raising \$542 million from 1997-2002.
- In September 2008 SMU launched "SMU Unbridled: The Second Century Campaign" with a goal of \$750 million. Gifts to date have exceeded \$537.8 million at the campaign's midpoint.

UNIQUE RESOURCES

- SMU is the site of the George W. Bush Presidential Center, consisting of a library, museum and independent institute. Groundbreaking was held in November 2010, and the center is expected to open in 2013. It will be a valuable source of research materials and programs for scholars, students and visitors.
- The Meadows Museum at SMU houses one of the finest collections of Spanish art outside of Spain. A new partnership with the Prado Museum in Madrid includes the loan of major paintings from the Prado and an internship exchange.

COMMUNITY CONTRIBUTIONS

SMU was founded in 1911 through a partnership between the city of Dallas and The United Methodist Church. Since its opening in 1915, SMU has continued to create academic programs to advance the city's progress, such as programs in business and engineering. Other schools contribute to the cultural and artistic life of Dallas, such as Meadows School of the Arts and its Meadows Museum. A major focus today for all schools of the University is enhanced service to the city.

Cyrus Gray and Christine Michael ran for two touchdowns apiece and Ryan Tannehill threw for two more scores to help No. 8 Texas A&M beat SMU 46-14 on Sunday night.

The Aggies intercepted SMU quarterback Kyle Padron on SMU's first two possessions to jump out to a 14-0 lead.

SMU coach June Jones replaced Padron with backup J.J. McDermott after the early miscues and he helped the Mustangs cut it to 20-14 in the second quarter. But the Mustangs couldn't do much offensively after that and the Aggies scored 26 straight points the rest of the way to secure the win.

McDermott finished with 254 yards passing and a touchdown, but was sacked seven times. Zach Line ran for 128 yards and a score and 6-foot-8 defensive end Margus Hunt blocked two extra points for the Mustangs. Line had 101 yards rushing with 10 minutes left in the second quarter, but managed just 27 the rest of the way.

SMU hasn't enjoyed many stampedes since the days of Eric Dickerson and the Pony Express.

The Mustangs relished one Saturday.

SMU stormed the field after a fourth-down pass from No. 20 TCU fell incomplete in overtime, clinching a 40-33 upset of the Horned Frogs, just the second win over a ranked team for SMU since it was banished from football by the NCAA's so-called death penalty in the 1980s.

It looked like the Mustangs would cruise to their biggest win in four years under coach June Jones, one of college football's most noted turnaround artists. But SMU coughed up a 16-point lead in the fourth quarter before J.J. McDermott started overtime with a 19-yard scoring pass to Jeremy Johnson, McDermott's fourth TD pass of the game.

SMU won it when TCU quarterback Casey Pachall couldn't get his team in the end zone after throwing three fourth-quarter touchdown passes. His toss on fourth-and-2 was tipped and bounced off the chest of TCU's Brandon Carter, prompting a wild SMU celebration that also marked the end of TCU's school-record 22-game home winning streak.

Even though TCU scored 23 fourth-quarter points, the Mustangs also were moving the ball behind McDermott and Darius Johnson, who repeatedly teamed up for big third-down

completions, starting with a 13-yard touchdown on the game's opening drive. The pair hooked up on a 21-yard score to put the Mustangs ahead 33-17 barely a minute after Pachall had thrown his first TD pass on the opening play of the fourth quarter.

McDermott and Johnson did it again on a 32-yarder on third-and-17 midway through the fourth before TCU finally stiffened.

After forcing a punt, the Frogs drove 77 yards to a field goal, then SMU's Kenneth Hacker hesitated a yard deep in the end zone and was tackled at the 10 on the subsequent kickoff. The Frogs held and had to drive just 46 yards to the tying score, a 4-yard pass from Pachall to Luke Shivers with 1:16 remaining.

SMU's Zach Line entered the game second nationally with 11 touchdowns, but the biggest play from the linebacker-turned-running back came on the kickoff coverage team to start the second half. He stripped TCU's Greg McCoy inside the 10, and Chris Parks recovered in the end zone for a 24-10 lead.

The Mustangs rode the momentum swing from that play until TCU's big rally in the fourth quarter.

The Horned Frogs couldn't stop SMU on third down and were having trouble getting first downs themselves for the most first half. The problem was best illustrated early in the second quarter when TCU had second and less than a yard and couldn't keep the ball. Ed Wesley lost 4 yards, and Waymon James fell down short of the first-down marker after catching a short pass from Pachall.

Wesley turned things in TCU's favor in just one play, though. He ran through a huge hole in the middle of the line and skirted through the secondary before he was caught from behind on a 63-yard run to the SMU 3. Matthew Tucker scored two plays later to cut SMU's lead to 17-7.
