San Jose State record: 3-7, 2-4 WAC. The Spartans have a three-game losing streak after a 34-33 loss at Utah State on November 12.

Navy record: 4-6. The Midshipmen have a two-game winning streak after defeating SMU in Dallas, 24-17, on November 12.

San Jose State head coach Mike MacIntyre: In his second season as San Jose State University's head coach. Has a major college coaching record of 4-19. He is 0-0 as a head coach against Navy.

Navy head coach Ken Niumatalolo: In his fourth season at Navy. Has a major college coaching record of 31-20, all with the Midshipmen. He is 0-0 as a head coach against San Jose State and 1-0 as a player. He was a reserve quarterback on the 1988 Hawai'i team that defeated San Jose State, 36-27.

San Jose State-Navy series: This is the first meeting between these teams in a four-season home-and-home series.

San Jose State and the Academies: The 2011 Navy game is the third game for San Jose State against one of the three Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) national service academies.

The Spartans have a 1-1 record against Air Force with a Western Athletic Conference victory coming in 1997, 25-22, against the #24-ranked Falcons.

In 2018, San Jose State and Army will begin a four-year, home-and-home series.

Going for a fourth win and ending a losing streak: San Jose State has its fourth chance for its fourth win of the season when the Spartans face Navy. San Jose State can exceed its combined victory total of 2009 and 2010 with a victory over the Midshipmen.

Senior Day: Twenty-two San Jose State seniors are expected to be available for the team's 2011 Senior Day pregame presentation. This senior class is the first at San Jose State to have four players with bachelor's degrees and enrolled in graduate school. Of the 23 seniors, safety **Duke Ihenacho**, linebacker **Pompey Festejo**, quarterback **Matt Faulkner** and offensive guard **Fred Koloto** are serving as 2011 team captains.

Fourth-quarter outcomes: The San Jose State-Utah State game is the Spartans' fourth game this season and second in as many weeks that a touchdown in the final minute decided the outcome. San Jose State won its first two down-to-the wire games this season at Colorado State and against Hawai'i, but lost its last two to Idaho and at Utah State. The Spartans now are 2-3 this season in games decided by seven or fewer points on the scoreboard.

Few penalties: The San Jose State-Navy game matches the top-two FBS teams based on fewest penalties in 2011. Navy is the national leader averaging 2.4 penalties a game. San Jose State is second at 3.5 penalties a game. Navy also is the national leader in fewest yards penalized a game; San Jose State is fifth.

A more productive offense: The 2011 San Jose State team needs nine points in its next two games to be the highest scoring Spartan team since 2006. Presently, San Jose State has 240, five less than the 2007 team - the top scoring Spartan team in the last five seasons.

Spartans Stay Among FBS Best: San Jose State leads the Western Athletic Conference and is tied for second nationally in turnovers gained with 29 after recovering four fumbles and coming up with a pass interception at Utah State. The Spartans came up with a season-high six in the October 14 Hawai'i win. San Jose State is the national leader with 17 fumble recoveries and is tied for 21st with 12 interceptions.

Passing Game Still Moving: In San Jose State's last six games, the Spartans are averaging 316.8 yards per game. Four times (Colorado State, Hawai'i, Louisiana Tech and Utah State), the Spartans gained more than 300 yards passing. The low during this six-game stretch was 255 yards at Brigham Young on October 8.

After being intercepted 10 times over a four-game span, the Spartans have not thrown an interception in the last two games before the Navy contest. San Jose State is in the midst of its longest stretch of 2011 without an interception.

100-Yard Rushing Plateau: San Jose State's three wins are characterized by rushing for at least 100 yards in a win. San Jose State gained a season-high 230 yards against New Mexico State, 137 at Colorado State and 103 in the Hawai'i victory. In these wins, the Spartans had more rushing plays than passing attempts. In the last three games, the Spartans gained just 134 yards on 72 carries.

New Single-Game Field Goal Record: Senior **Jens Alvernik** set a San Jose State single-game record with four field goals made in the Utah State contest (11/12). Alvernik was one of 12 Spartans to co-hold the previous single-game record of three when he booted three through the uprights at Brigham Young (10/8). Alvernik is 14-of-19 for the season and is two field goals shy of tying the San Jose State individual single-season record of 16 field goals by Lou Rodriguez in 1975.

Unlisted numbers: **Jens Alvernik** heads into the Navy game with the most field goals, most field goals per game and the most kick scoring points by a Western Athletic Conference kicker this season. Since Alvernik has not yet played in the required 75 percent of the team's games in 2011, he does not appear in the WAC nor NCAA rankings.

Team kicking record tied: San Jose State enters the Navy game with 16 field goals in 2011 tying the single-season school record set in 1975. **Jens Alvernik** accounts for 14 of the 16 field goals. The other two are by sophomore **Harrison Waid**. Alvernik and Waid are a combined 16-for-24 while the 1975 Spartans were just 16-of-30 kicking field goals.

Kickoff return for a TD: Freshman **Tyler Ervin** became the first San Jose State player since 2004 to return a kickoff for a touchdown with his 95-yard return in the Utah State game. Ervin now ranks second in the conference and 35th nationally in kickoff returns with a 24.9 average.

Season-High Five Sacks: San Jose State raised its season total of quarterback sacks to 12 with a 2011 best five in the Idaho game. End **Travis Johnson** accounted for four and end Mohamed Marah was credited with the fifth one.

Travis Johnson Two-time Player of the Week: End **Travis Johnson** was named the WAC Defensive Player of the Week for his performance against Idaho (11/5). He is the first Spartan since Deonce Whitaker in 2000 to earn multiple Player of the Week nominations to receive WAC Player of the Week honors twice in the same season. Johnson also is the first player since Quinton Jones of Boise State in 2006 to earn WAC Football Player of the Week honors in two of the game's three facets (offense, defense and special teams).

School Record-Tying Effort Matches 2011 National Best: Defensive end **Travis Johnson** became the third San Jose State football to record four sacks in one game with his performance in the Idaho game. Johnson finished with 10 tackles, a fumble recovery and one of his sacks resulted in a safety for San Jose State. Johnson's four sacks moved him up to eighth nationally in quarterback sacks and also ties him with three others for most sacks in a game this season.

Otten on John Mackey Award Midseason Watch List: Tight end **Ryan Otten** is one of 25 players named to the 2011 John Mackey Award Mid-Season Watch List. The award recognizes the top tight end nationally. Following games on November 5, eight semifinalists will be named. Otten is the first San Jose State tight end to be connected to the John Mackey Award.

Otten among nation's most productive tight ends: San Jose State's **Ryan Otten** is among the Football Bowl Subdivision's most productive tight ends in 2011. Among listed tight ends with 3.5 or more receptions per game, he has the best yards per catch average at 15.31, most receiving yards, and is the only one with two 100-plus receiving yardage games this season.

At Brigham Young (10/8), Grigsby became the first Spartan in three seasons to catch 10 or more passes in a game with his 11 receptions for 88 yards. He bettered that count in the Hawai'i win (10/14) with 12 receptions for a single-game season high 126 yards.

Grigsby is the 21st player in school history to catch at least 100 passes. He has 130 receptions in 23 games as a Spartan.

Chandler Jones Reaches 100 Career Receptions: Wide receiver **Chandler Jones** became the second Spartan this season and 22nd in school history to catch at least 100 passes at San Jose State when he caught his fourth pass in the Utah State game. Jones has 49 receptions for the season and 103 in his San Jose State career.

Chandler Jones Named To Paul Hornung Award Honor Roll: For his three-touchdown contribution in the October 14 Hawai'i win, wide receiver **Chandler Jones** now was named to the Paul Hornung Award Weekly Honor Roll. The award recognizes the most versatile player in college football.

Spartans Pick Up & Score: In San Jose State's last two victories, the Spartans scored a touchdown on a fumble recovery return. **Duke Ihenacho** ran 20 yards with a fumble recovery in the Colorado State win (10/1).

Wide receiver **Chandler Jones** picked up a fumble on a kickoff return and ran 23 yards in the Hawai'i victory (10/14). Ihenacho's fumble recovery and run for a touchdown was the first by a Spartan since the 2004 season.

The Spartans nearly came up with a third touchdown via fumble recovery at Louisiana Tech when punter **Harrison Waid** picked up a loose ball and was tackled at the 2-yard line after a 20-yard run. One play later, tailback **Brandon Rutley** scored a San Jose State touchdown.

First Defensive PAT: San Jose State notched its first defensive PAT in school history when safety **Duke Ihenacho** returned a blocked PAT for two points in the Hawai'i victory on October 14. The play was named GEICO's Play of the Week from games ending the week of October 15. GEICO's Play of the Year will be announced November 25 in a nationally-televised program produced by Intersport for CBS TV.

400 Yard Total Offense Threshold: San Jose State's three wins are characterized by gaining 400 yards of total offense in each triumph. In the Spartans' victories, the team is averaging 461.7 yards a game.

Penalty-Free: For the first time since the 2007 Boise State game, San Jose State completed a game without a penalty. The Spartans head into the Utah State game third nationally in fewest penalties per game (3.78) and 13th in penalty yards per contest. San Jose State tops the WAC in fewest penalty yards per game at 37.6.

First Rocky Mountain Win: San Jose State win at Colorado State was its first in the state of Colorado against a Football Bowl Subdivision opponent. Prior to the 2011 season, the Spartans had two losses at Colorado State and four at Colorado.

Gaining a Previously Elusive Road Victory: San Jose State's 38-31 triumph at Colorado State ended two long road losing streaks. The Spartans went winless in 16 consecutive road games since a November 1, 2008 victory at Idaho and were without a non-conference road triumph in 18 tries since a 2002 win at Illinois.

Recently vs. the Mountain West: Since 2006, the Spartans now have a 4-2 record against teams in the Mountain West Conference. San Jose State is 2-0 against San Diego State, 1-0 against Colorado State, has a 2006 New Mexico Bowl victory over New Mexico and is 0-2 against former Mountain West Conference member Utah.

Academic All-America nominees: Quarterback **Matt Faulkner** and linebacker **Vince Buhagiar** were nominated for the Capital One Academic All-America team as presented by CoSIDA (College Sports Information Directors of America). To be nominated, a one must have a minimum 3.30 cumulative grade-point average, be enrolled at the four-year institution a minimum of one academic year and be a significant player on a team. Faulkner is a senior majoring in business administration; Buhagiar, a sophomore majoring in psychology.

30-plus points: San Jose State's 34 and 38 points in the New Mexico State and Colorado State triumphs mark the first time since 2008 that the Spartans scored 30 or more points in back-to-back games.

High-scoring half: San Jose State's 24 points in the first half of the Colorado State win are the most first-half points by the Spartans since scoring 30 in a 51-17 win over New Mexico State in 2007.

Big plays in the New Mexico State win: For the first time since the 2008 Boise State game, San Jose State had two scoring plays of 60 or more yards in the New Mexico State victory. **Brandon Rutley** scored on a 66-yard run on the Spartans' first play of the game and tight end **Ryan Otten** scored on a 64-yard pass play.

In the 2008 Boise State game, linebacker Justin Cole scored on a 62-yard interception return and Rutley burst through the Boise State defense for a 60-yard touchdown run.

The last time San Jose State had two touchdowns produced by the offense of 60 or more yards in a game was in a 56-49 double-overtime loss to Boise State. The Spartans scored their first two touchdowns on a 69-yard Tyson Thompson run and a 79-yard pass from quarterback Adam Tafralis to wide receiver Rufus Skillern.

The 17th 200-Yard Rush: **Brandon Rutley's** career-best 33-carry, 209-yard, two touchdown performance in the New Mexico State win is the 17th time at San Jose State that a Spartan rushed for 200 or more yards in a game. Rutley is the tenth Spartan to post a 200-plus yard rushing game and the first since Tyson Thompson ran for 203 yards against Hawai'i in 2004. Rutley's 209 yards matches the tenth best San Jose State single-game total.

James Orth ties school record: Safety **James Orth** became the fourth player in school history to intercept at least one pass in four consecutive games. Others include current Jacksonville Jaguars defensive back Dwight Lowery (2006), Gerald Jones (2002) and Sherman Cocroft (1983), who had a five-year NFL career. Orth heads into the week tied for sixth nationally with four interceptions in seven games.

Punting record at Colorado State: Punter **Harrison Waid** set one San Jose State single-game record and tied a second in the Colorado State win. Waid averaged 58.6 yards per punt for five punts to eclipse a 15-year record of 56.8 yards per punt by Joe Furlow in the 1996 Air Force game. Waid matched Furlow's record of three punts of 60 or more yards in a game with kicks of 62, 63 and 72 yards.

A long, long drive based on time: San Jose State's first touchdown drive in the UCLA game covered 88 yards in 16 plays over a 7:53 time span.

The last time a Spartan team used more than 15 plays to score a touchdown was a 17-play, 78-yard drive in a 46-28 loss at Hawai'i on October 23, 2004.

The last time a San Jose State offense needed more than 7:00 to complete a touchdown drive was in the November 16, 2003 game at Tulsa when the Spartans zigzagged their way 83 yards on 17 plays in 7:13 in a 49-38 road victory.
