THE STORYLINES . . .

- Tulsa football is under new direction as Philip Montgomery was named the 29th head coach in school history on December 11, 2014.
- Tulsa has the smallest undergraduate enrollment of FBS schools with 3,473 students.
- Tulsa has equaled its last two-year win total (5) with a current 5-5 record this year.
- This is the last home game for 20 Tulsa seniors — Blake Abbott, Derrick Alexander, Zik Asiegbu, Josh Bencke, Joseph Calcagni, Mandel Dixon Jr., Conner Floyd, Dylan Foxworth, Keyarris Garrett, Rey Higuera, Billy Lafortune, Zac Langer, Derrick Luetjen, Suleimman Masumbuko, Michale Mudoh, Thomas Shamet, Chris Showels, Garrett Stafford, Brad Valentino and Darrell Williams Jr.
- This game features a Tulsa offense, ranked third in the American Athletic Conference and 9th nationally with 526.9 yards, against a Navy defense ranked first in the league for total defense, allowing opponents 350.3 yards.
- Senior receiver Keyarris Garrett set an American Athletic Conference record in Tulsa's 7th game with 268 yards and 3 TDs on 14 catches vs. #17 Memphis.
- Tulsa junior linebackers Matt Linscott and Trent Martin lead the American Athletic Conference in tackles for lost yards . . . Linscott has 16 and Martin has 14 TFLs.
- Tulsa red-shirt freshman running back Ramadi Warren is coming off of two straight 100+ rushing games with 168 yards and 3 TDs against UCF, and last week 139 yards and 2 touchdowns at Cincinnati.
- Tulsa has had 28 of its 43 offensive touchdown drives in regulation that have come under two minutes for a .651 percentage to rank first in the nation . . . 16 Tulsa TD drives have been under one minute this year.
- Tulsa 's defense has totaled 19 takeaways this year after going the first seven quarters of the season without forcing a turnover.

TULSA HEAD COACH PHILIP MONTGOMERY IN FIRST SEASON . . .

- Philip Montgomery became the 29th head coach in school history on Dec. 11, 2014.
- Montgomery claimed his first career head coaching victory in the 2015 Tulsa season opener with a 47-44 overtime win over FAU . . . he has a 5-5 record as the Tulsa head coach.
- Before coming to Tulsa, he spent seven years at Baylor, where he spent the last three seasons as the offensive coordinator/QB coach.
- Under his guidance, Baylor led the nation in total offense and scoring offense in each of the last two seasons.
- Quarterbacks he tutored include 2011 Heisman Trophy winner Robert Griffin III as well as Bryce Petty and Nick Florence at Baylor and Kevin Kolb and Case Keenum at Houston.
- Before moving to Baylor, he spent five years at Houston, also under Art Briles.
- Has coached nine Bowl games in 12 years as a collegiate coach.
- Before moving to the college ranks, he spent one year as the offensive coordinator at Denton (Texas) HS, and before that spent six years at Stephenville HS, where he was a part of back-to-back Class 4A state championships in 1998 and 1999.

THE SERIES . . .

- This is the third meeting between Tulsa and Navy.
- The series is tied 1-1, as each team has won on the other's home field.
- In the first meeting in Tulsa, the Navy Midshipmen shut-out the Hurricane 29-0 in the 2004 campaign.
- Two years later, Tulsa captured a 24-23 overtime victory in Annapolis in 2006 . . . the Hurricane blocked a PAT to preserve the win.

THE HIGH OCTANE OFFENSES . . .

- Tulsa has faced four of the nation's current top-15 offenses, based on total offense, this season — No. 4 Cincinnati, No. 6 Oklahoma, No. 7 Memphis and No. 13 Houston.
- Tulsa also has one of the top offenses, now ranked 9th nationally, with an average of 526.9 yards per game.
- In Tulsa's games against the top-15 ranked offenses, the two teams have combined for over 1,000 yards in each game — Tulsa and Cincinnati combined for 1,240 yards . . . vs. Oklahoma, the two teams combined for 1,376 yards . . . Tulsa and Houston combined for 1,094 yards . . . vs. Memphis, the two teams combined for 1,238 yards
- In those four games, Tulsa and its opponents have combined for 4,948 yards and 347 points, averages of 1,237 yards per game and 86.8 points per game

A DIFFERENT KIND OF HIGH OCTANE . . .

- Navy is only ranked 63rd in total offense nationally with an average of 404.7 yards per game.
- However, the Midshipmen are ranked second for rushing offense with an average of 335.0 yards per game . . . Navy averages just 69.7 yards per game passing.

LOSSES HAVE COME TO TOP FOES . . .

- Three of Tulsa's five losses have come against teams that have been ranked among the nation's top-25 this year — #12 Oklahoma, #16 Houston and #25 Memphis.
- Oklahoma was ranked #16 when Tulsa faced the Sooners, Houston was unranked and Memphis was #17 . . . East Carolina and Cincinnati are Tulsa's other losses, both on the road.
- The combined record of those teams that have defeated Tulsa is 37-13 this season for a .740 win percentage — Oklahoma (9-1), Houston (10-0), Memphis (8-2), East Carolina (4-6) and Cincinnati (6-4).
- Tulsa faces another ranked opponent this week with #19 Navy coming to town.

STAFFORD, LUETJEN EARN ACADEMIC HONORS . . .

- Seniors Garrett Stafford and Derrick Luetjen were named to the CoSIDA Academic All-District 7 team . . . they are now eligible for All-America honors.
- Stafford had a 3.7 GPA in electrical engineering and graduated in 3.5 years, and has a 3.5 GPA as a graduate student in electrical engineering.
- * Luetjen has a 3.62 GPA in exercise & sports science.

ANOTHER BIG PERFORMANCE FOR "KEY" . . .

- Whether used as a decoy or catching passes senior receiver Keyarris Garrett is a big part of the Tulsa offense.
- On Saturday, Garrett had his fifth 100+ receiving game of the season with 168 yards and one TD on nine receptions against Cincinnati.
- He went over 1,000 yards for a season in that game, making it the 17th time Tulsa has had a 1,000-yard receiver for a season.
- In game #7, Garrett had an NCAA season-high 268 yards receiving against #17 Memphis with 3 TDs covering 36, 46 and 32 yards on 14 receptions.
- He currently ranks 5th nationally for receiving yards (1,164) and receiving yards per game (116.4).
- Garrett totaled 457 yards, a 228.5 average and 4 TDs on 28 receptions in Tulsa's two games against ranked opponents – #16 Oklahoma and #17 Memphis.
- On the year, Garrett has 74 receptions for 1,164 yards, 15.7 average per catch, 6 TDs and 116.4 yards per game.

GARRETT MOVES INTO 4th PLACE ON ALL-TIME RECEIVING CHART. . .

- Keyarris Garrett came into the Memphis game with 2,319 receiving yards to rank 12th on the school's career receiving chart.
- After a 268-yard performance against the #17 Tigers, Garrett jumped seven spots on Tulsa's all-time receiving list into 5th place with 2,587 yards.
- Garrett now has 2,785 career yards and sits in 4th place, needing 167 yards to move into a tie with Damon Savage (1996-99) for 3rd place.

"HAIL MARY" HEROICS AT THE HALF . . .

- Of Keyarris Garrett's six touchdown receptions this year, two have come on "Hail Mary" passes at the end of the first half.
- The first came at the 0:01 mark against #16 Oklahoma, when he leaped to out reach an Oklahoma defender in the corner of the end zone for a 43-yard TD catch.
- The second came at 0:00 when against #17 Memphis and behind two defenders, he jumped forward tipped the ball and grabbed with one hand a 46-yard TD just inside the goal line.

ANOTHER RECEIVER DOES IT . . .

- Tulsa has had four different receivers with a 100+ yard receiving game.
- Red-shirt freshman Justin Hobbs was the latest to accomplish the feat with 150 yards on 7 receptions at SMU . . . his 150-yard receiving game is the third-best in school history for a freshman, behind Dan Bitson (161 yards in 1987) and Trae Johnson (158 yards in 2007).
- It was not only the fourth time that a different Tulsa receiver has gone over 100 yards in a game, but it was the fifth time that a receiver went over 100 yards by halftime.
- Hobbs had 108 yards on 4 catches in the first half at SMU.
- Previously, Keyarris Garrett had 156 yards against Oklahoma and 142 vs. Memphis in the first half, while Keevan Lucas did it with 105 first-half yards vs. FAU and Josh Atkinson had 119 yards vs. New Mexico.



CONNER'S LAST TWO WEEKS . . .

- Not to be lost in the mix at receiver, senior Conner Floyd may not have had a 100-yard game, but he turned in back-to-back career-best performances.
- Floyd caught three passes for a career-best 72 yards and had his first career multiple TD game with two touchdown receptions against UCF.
- His first two catches in that game went for touchdowns, including a career-long 36-yarder and a 12-yarder.
- A week later, Floyd caught seven passes for a new career-high 76 yards and had a 18-yard touchdown reception against Cincinnati.

RAMADI REVS IT UP . . .

- Red-shirt freshman Ramadi Warren has played in six of 10 games this year and has averaged 74.8 yards in those games.
- Lately, Warren has turned it into high gear, rushing for 307 yards and 5 TDs in the last two games . . . his yards per carry in these two games is 9.3 yards.
- Warren had a career-best and his first 100-yard rushing game with 168 yards and three TDs vs. UCF.
- A week later, he had 139 yards and two TDs on 14 carries at Cincinnati.
- His two TD runs vs. Cincinnati each came on 4th down when he rushed 65 yards for a score and 39 yards for his second touchdown.
- Warren's 168 yards was the most for a freshman since the 2000 season, when freshman Eric Richardson had 194 and 206 yards for the top two single-season freshman marks.
- When he went over 100 yards rushing for the second straight game with 139 yards at Cincinnati, it was the first time that Tulsa had a freshman rush for over 100 yards in two games in their freshman season since quarterback Tyler Gooch did it in 2001.

THE RUNNERS DO IT TOO . . .

- More than one Tulsa running back has surpassed the 100+ rushing barrier this year.
- Tulsa has had three running backs go over 100 yards in a game this year.
- The Tulsa running backs have combined for six games rushing for more than 100 yards.
- Zack Langer and D'Angelo Brewer were the first two to accomplish the 100+ yards in the same game . . . Langer had 139 yards and Brewer 133 at New Mexico.
- Langer also had 161 vs. Oklahoma and Brewer totaled 119 yards against SMU.
- The latest running back to reach 100+ yards in a game was Ramadi Warren with a team season-high of 168 yards against UCF, while he did it again a week later at Cincinnati with 139 yards.

THREE RECEIVERS ON THE BILETNIKOFF LIST . . .

- The Biletnikoff Award, sponsored by the Tallahassee Quarterback Club, honors the most outstanding receiver in college football at any position.
- Tulsa has had three receivers added to the list at different times – Keevan Lucas, Keyarris Garrett and Josh Atkinson.
- Garrett has 1,164 yards, six TDs and a 116.4 average per game on 74 receptions.
- Garrett has had five 100+ receiving games this year . . . 4 catches for 163 yards vs. FAU . . . 7 catches for 102 yards vs. New Mexico . . . 189 yards and one TD on 14 catches vs. #16 Oklahoma . . . 268 yards and 3 TDs on 14 catches vs. #17 Memphis . . . he had 168 yards and one TD vs. Cincinnati.
- In 42 career games, Garrett has 2,785 yards, 20 TDs and a 14.1-yard average on 197 career receptions.
- Junior Josh Atkinson was added to the Biletnikoff Watch List on Oct. 28th . . . he has caught 52 passes for 762 yards, three TDs and a 76.2 average per game . . . Atkinson has had five 100-yard receiving games this year.
- Junior Keevan Lucas, who was on the original Biletnikoff Watch List in 2015, is out for the year with an injury, but in four games, caught 26 passes for 409 yards and 5 TDs.

EVANS IS ONLY SECOND QB TO SURPASS 3,000 PASSING YARDS IN TWO SEASONS . . .

- Junior Dane Evans has gone over the 3,000-yard passing plateau this year for the second consecutive season.
- He now has 3,313 yards and last year threw for 3,102 yards . . . Evans ranks 5th and 6th on the school's single-season passing chart.
- His 3,000 yard plateau is only the seventh time in school history that a quarterback has accomplished that feat.
- Twenty-two times a Tulsa quarterback has gone over 2,000 yards passing, while only 13 quarterbacks have accomplished that feat.
- Evans is just one of five QBs in school history to surpass 2,000+ yards in consecutive seasons . . . the others are: T.J. Rubley (3), James Kilian (2), Paul Smith (3) and G.J. Kinne (3).
- He is now only the second quarterback to go over 3,000 yards in two separate seasons . . . both QBs have done it consecutively . . . the other is G.J. Kinne in 2010 and 2011

EVANS TIES SCHOOL RECORD FOR 400-YARD GAMES . . .

- Junior quarterback Dane Evans had his fourth career 400+ passing game vs. #17 Memphis, tying Billy Guy Anderson (1965) for the most in school history.
- Evans' first 400+ game came last year in the season opener with 438 yards against Tulane.
- Through nine games this season, Evans has three 400+ games, coming against FAU (424), #16 Oklahoma (427) and #17 Memphis (421).
- He also had four TD throws against both Oklahoma and Memphis.
- Billy Guy Anderson quarterbacked Tulsa in 1965 and had 400+ passing games of 502, 477, 477 and 451 yards in just that one season.
- Evans has 10 300+ career passing games, including seven this season, to rank third for the most in school history behind Paul Smith (15) and G.J. Kinne (14).

EVANS NOW FOURTH ON TULSA CHARTS . . .

- Dane Evans has moved into the top-5 on the school's all-time charts for passing, total offense and passing TDs.
- Evans has thrown for 7,313 career yards to move into 4th place on the school's career passing chart.
- Only a junior, Evans is 2,011 yards shy of T.J. Rubley (1987-91) for 3rd place on the school's all-time passing chart.
- His 46 passing touchdowns ranks in 5th place on the school chart for passing TDs, trailing David Johnson (2005-08) by two TD passes for 4th place.
- Evans has 7,424 yards of total offense to rank 4th on the school's career list . . . he is 1,656 yards shy of T.J. Rubley (1987-91) for 3rd place.

BACK-TO-BACK GAMES . . .

- It was only the 2014 season when a Tulsa player returned an interception for a touchdown, 46 yards by Austin McDaniel against USF on Oct. 18, 2014.
- But, this year Tulsa had an INT return for a touchdown in two straight games.
- Against SMU, Kerwin Thomas intercepted a pass and took it 31 yards for a TD to give Tulsa its first lead in the game at 16-14 in the second quarter.
- A week later, Michael Mudoh had an 86-yard INT return for a touchdown against UCF.
- Mudoh's 86-yard return was the second-longest in school history, only to a 97-yard return by Jeff Jordan against Memphis in 1963 . . . both went for touchdowns.

- Δ Tulsa has an 11:1 student-faculty ratio
- Δ The average class size is 20
- Δ Tulsa is ranked 88th in *U.S. News and World Report* in its' Best Colleges 2015
- Δ 1 in 10 is the ratio of National Merit Scholars in the undergraduate student body, and is also the ratio of student-athletes among the student population
- Δ 29 is the average ACT score of incoming freshmen
- Δ 1,019,940 is the amount of square feet added to the campus in the last decade
- Δ Tulsa has 271 Presidential Scholars
- Δ 75 percent of Tulsa students graduated in the top-to percent of their high school class (based on 2014 freshman class)

The Program . . .

- Δ Tulsa was the first school to appear in five straight New Years Day bowl games
- Δ Tulsa has made 19 bowl game appearances
- Δ TU has won 36 conference championships
- Δ Tulsa has had 39 players earn 1st, 2nd or 3rd-team All-America honors
- Δ The Golden Hurricane has produced three NFL Hall of Famers, the most among Oklahoma schools (Jim Finks, Bob St. Clair, Steve Largent)
- Δ TU has the most former football players (4) to serve as head coaches in the NFL among Oklahoma colleges
- Δ Tulsa has two Heisman Trophy runners-up – Jerry Rhome (1964) and Howard Twilley (1965)
- Δ Tulsa won a school record 11 games in 2008 and 2012
- Δ Paul Smith won the 2007 Wuerffel Trophy, while Wilson Hollo-way won the FedEx Orange Bowl-FWAA Courage Award in 2008

LANGER AMONG SEASON TD LEADERS . . .

- Despite missing two games this year, Zack Langer has a team-leading 14 rushing TDs.
- In three games, the senior running back has scored 3 rushing touchdowns.
- Langer has had a rushing TD in all but one game this year that he's played . . . he did not have a rushing TD against Cincinnati but played just one play.
- He now ranks 3rd on the school's all-time list for rushing touchdowns.
- Langer is tied with Michael Gunter (1983), Courtney Tennial (2006) and Tarrion Adams (2008) with 14.
- He trails Steve Gage (17 in 1985) for second place and single-season record-holder Alex Singleton (24 in 2012).

IF ONLY ONE YARD MORE . . .

- Junior receiver Josh Atkinson has enjoyed a productive season and now with the absence of Keevan Lucas has taken a more significant role in the offense.
- Atkinson entered the game against #17 Memphis with a streak of five straight 100+ receiving games, one game shy of the longest consecutive streak in school history when Chris Penn had six straight in 1993.
- Atkinson came one yard short of 100 against Memphis when he caught four passes for 99 yards . . . he had a career-long 80-yard TD catch and run in that game.
- After not having a catch in the season opener, he turned in his consecutive 100-yard receiving games against New Mexico (119), Oklahoma (104), Houston (107), ULM (110) and East Carolina (136).
- He currently ranks second on the team with 762 yards and three TDs on 52 catches for 76.2 yards per game and 14.7 yards per catch.
- Atkinson has career totals of 1,287 yards and four touchdowns in 31 games.

HOBBS IS STEPPING UP . . .

- With the absence of receiver Keevan Lucas, lost for the season after suffering an injury in the fourth game against Houston, red-shirt freshman receiver Justin Hobbs stepped up in more extensive action against ULM.
- Hobbs came into the game with two receptions for 25 yards on the year.
- Against ULM, Hobbs caught five passes for 82 yards, including a 36-yard TD . . . a week later, Hobbs had three receptions for 57 yards at East Carolina.
- Hobbs turned in a career-best 150 yards on seven receptions at SMU, while 108 of those yards came in the first half on four catches.
- Hobbs now has 26 receptions for 463 yards and one TD in 10 games, which is the 7th-most receiving yards for a freshman receiver in school history.
- Since Lucas went out with the injury, Hobbs has totaled 24 catches for 438 yards in the last six games.

SOPHOMORES COME UP BIG IN FIRST-HALF TURNING POINT VS. SMU . . .

- In the SMU game, two Hurricane sophomores made big plays in the last 3 minutes of the first half to give Tulsa a two-point halftime lead.
- With Tulsa trailing 14-10, CB Kerwin Thomas intercepted an SMU pass and went 31 yards for his first career return for a touchdown to put Tulsa ahead 16-14 with 2:26 left in the first half.
- After SMU retook the lead 21-16 with 1:12 remaining until halftime, Tulsa marched 75 yards in 5 plays, taking just 0:56 off the clock, as RB D'Angelo Brewer had Tulsa's longest TD run from scrimmage since 2012, a powerful 23-yard burst that put the Hurricane ahead 23-21 at the 0:16 mark.

NOTING TULSA'S DEFENSE . . .

- Tulsa's defense has 80 TFLs (8.0 TFLs per game) for -252 yards through 10 games this year.
- Tulsa totaled 77 TFLs for the entire season last year.
- In the last five games (East Carolina, Memphis, SMU, UCF and Cincinnati), Tulsa's defense has tallied 45 TFLs, including 14 for -35 yards at East Carolina, 7 for -22 yards against #17 Memphis, 9 for -36 yards vs. SMU, 9 for -29 yards vs. UCF and 6 vs. Cincinnati for -19 yards.
- Tulsa went the first seven quarters this year without a takeaway, and now has 19 on the season, including seven in the last two games.
- Trent Martin's four forced fumbles are the most for a Tulsa player since 2008 when James Lockett had five caused fumbles.
- Kerwin Thomas' 11 pass breakups are the most for a Tulsa player since Charles Davis had 11 in 2010 . . . the most before that was Roy Roberts' 12 PBU's in 2007.

AGAINST SOME OF NATION'S TOP OFFENSES . . .

- The Hurricane defense has allowed 519 yards of total offense per game this year, but has faced four of the nation's top-15 offenses, including current No. 4 Cincinnati, No. 6 Oklahoma, No. 7 Memphis and No. 13 Houston.
- Those four teams have combined to average 691.2 yards per game vs. Tulsa.
- Remove those four games and Tulsa has held its remaining six opponents to a combined 426 yards per game.

BREWER, LANGER RETURN TO MAKE A DIFFERENCE IN SMU GAME . . .

- D'Angelo Brewer missed the previous two games and Zack Langer missed the previous game against #17 Memphis, but both returned to the lineup at SMU.
- The running back duo came up big for Tulsa in a 40-31 win over SMU.
- The duo combined to score all four of Tulsa's offensive touchdowns.
- Brewer had a game-high 119 yards rushing with a 23-yard TD run, while Langer had just 35 rushing yards, but rushed for three touchdowns.
- It was Brewer's second 100+ rushing game this year, while the three TDs for Langer was the third game this season had had three rushing touchdowns.

MUDOH AMONG TOP-5 ON SCHOOL'S TACKLE LIST . . .

- Senior safety Michael Mudoh now has 380 career tackles to rank in 5th place on the school's all-time tackles chart.
- Mudoh is 33 tackles shy of the school record 413 stops, held by Nelson Coleman (2003-07).
- He trails 4th by eight stops (388 by Robert Tennon, 1976, '78-80) 3rd place by nine tackles (389 by Michael White, 1987, '89-91) and 2nd place by 21 stops (401 by Shawn Jackson, 2010-13).
- Mudoh's 109 tackles this year for an 10.9 average ranks 9th in the nation.
- Mudoh has 20 double-figure tackle games in 34 career starts . . . he had his 20th career double-digit game against UCF with 13 stops.
- Mudoh had a career-high 20 tackles in the opener vs. FAU, which ties for the second-best game in the NCAA this year for tackles.
- It's the third straight season opener that he had double-figure tackles . . . his previous career-best was 17 stops coming in the 2013 opener vs. Bowling Green, and last year had 10 tackles against Tulane.
- He has 6 double-figure tackle games this year . . . Mudoh's other double-digit tackle games this year have come against #16 Oklahoma (16), ULM (11), East Carolina (12), #17 Memphis (10) and UCF (13).

LINSCOTT COMES A LONG WAY . . .

- Matt Linscott came to Tulsa in 2012 as a walk-on from nearby prep powerhouse Jenks High School.
- In 2013, he played in 11 games on special teams and in 2014 was a back-up safety and special teams performer.
- Before the 2014 season, Linscott was put on scholarship . . . during the season, he had 13 tackles, forced one fumble and had one fumble recovery in 12 games.
- In the spring of 2015 and the arrival of the new coaching staff, Linscott made the move to linebacker and earned a starting position.
- Through 10 games, Linscott has totaled 87 tackles.
- Linscott leads the Hurricane and is ranked 7th nationally for tackles for lost yardage with 16 TFLs for -62 yards . . . he also has five sacks, three pass break-ups, one interception and one forced fumble.
- With his 16 TFLs, Linscott is six away from tying the school record of 22 TFLs, set by Alain Karatepeyan (2007).
- He has had double-digit tackles in four games this season with 10 against FAU, 11 against New Mexico, 13 at Oklahoma and 12 at Cincinnati.

500+ . . .

- The Hurricane offense has surpassed the 500-yard plateau in six games this season. . . Tulsa averages the 9th-most yards nationally with 526.9 per game.
- Tulsa gained 600+ yards in each of its first three games with 618 yards vs. FAU, 600 yards at New Mexico and 603 yards at #16 Oklahoma.
- This was the first time in school history that Tulsa had three consecutive games with 600 yards of total offense.
- The last time Tulsa had back-to-back 600+ total offense games was in 2008 when it happened twice – 606 vs. New Mexico (Sept. 20) and 641 vs. Central Arkansas Sept. 27), and 602 vs. SMU (Oct. 11) and 791 vs. UTEP (Oct. 18).
- Tulsa has also gone over 500 yards of total offense against ULM (563), #17 Memphis (534) and Cincinnati (588).
- The Hurricane missed the 500+ plateau four times this year against Houston (456), East Carolina (463), SMU (419) and UCF (425).

TAKEAWAYS COMING TULSA'S WAY . . .

- It took the Tulsa defense eight quarters this year to get its first takeaway, but when it did, the second one came on the very next possession.
- With a 30-21 lead heading into the fourth quarter against New Mexico, the Tulsa defense became opportunistic in the final period.
- Senior end Derrick Alexander recovered a fumble on UNM's first drive of the fourth quarter, giving the offense the ball on the New Mexico side of the field.
- On New Mexico's next possession, sophomore cornerback Kerwin Thomas intercepted a pass and returned it 14 yards.
- The two takeaways amounted to 10 points for the Hurricane.
- On New Mexico's next drive, Tulsa's Trent Martin forced a fumble and a loss of two yards on a 4th-and-1 play, thus giving the Hurricane offense the ball.
- In the next game, Tulsa's defense forced two fumbles against Oklahoma, both in the second quarter and both leading to 14 Tulsa points.
- Tulsa had one fumble recovery vs. Houston and three takeaways against ULM.
- Tulsa has had seven takeaways in the last two games – 4 vs. UCF and 3 at Cincinnati.
- Tulsa's defense has now totaled 19 takeaways on the season and the Tulsa offense has scored 79 points off of those opponent turnovers, while the defense has scored 12 points on two interception returns.

WHAT YOU DIDN'T KNOW ABOUT TULSA'S FOOTBALL TRADITION . . .

- Tulsa was the first school to play in five straight New Years Day Bowl Games — Sun Bowl (1-1-42), Sugar Bowl (1-1-43), Sugar Bowl (1-1-44), Orange Bowl (1-1-45) and Oil Bowl (1-1-46).
- Ellis Jones, an All-American guard in 1945, was a one-armed player. He was the defensive standout for the College All-Star team vs. the Chicago Bears in 1945.
- Three former TU football players are enshrined in the Pro Football Hall of Fame in Canton, Ohio. They are Bob St. Clair, Jim Finks and Steve Largent.
- Two former Tulsa players finished runner-up in the Heisman Trophy voting — quarterback Jerry Rhome in 1964 and receiver Howard Twilley in 1965.
- Perhaps the greatest Tulsa football player of all-time is Glenn Dobbs (1940-42). He was also head coach of the Hurricane teams in the 1960's. Eighth Street which runs north of H.A. Chapman Stadium was dedicated as Glenn Dobbs Drive on Oct. 21, 2000. A statue of Dobbs was erected outside the stadium before the 2013 spring game.
- Former TU players — Glenn Dobbs, Howard Twilley and Jerry Rhome — are enshrined in the College Football Foundation Hall of Fame.
- Other former TU players went on to the NFL — Steve Largent, Drew Pearson, Rickey Watts, Don Blackmon, David Alexander, Jerry Ostroski, Gus Frerotte, Dennis Byrd, Tom Miner, Steve August and Gus Frerotte — to name a few.
- Coaching in the NFL — Tulsa has had four former players serve as head coaches in the NFL — Tommy Hudspeth (Detroit Lions); Sam Rutigliano (Cleveland Browns); Ray Rhodes (Philadelphia Eagles and Green Bay Packers); and Lovie Smith (Chicago Bears and currently with the Tampa Bay Buccaneers).
- Tulsa has three former players and two former coaches who have been inducted into the College Football Hall of Fame. The players are Glenn Dobbs, who also coached the Hurricane, Howard Twilley and Jerry Rhome . . . the coaches are Francis Schmidt (1919-21) and John Cooper (1977-84).



HERE'S SOME NUMBERS AFTER 10 GAMES . . .

- Tulsa has averaged 36.5 points, while scoring over 30 points 8 out of 10 games.
- The Hurricane has scored 40+ points in five games this season, the most 40+ games since five in the 2012 campaign.
- Tulsa averages 86.5 offensive plays per game after 10 games.
- The Hurricane set a school record with 107 offensive plays against ULM, breaking the mark of 103 plays that was set against SMU in 2012.
- In the first two games Tulsa went over 40 points in each game, marking Tulsa's first back-to-back 40-point scoring games since 2012 when Tulsa had 49 points at UAB and 45 at Marshall.
- Tulsa had a 100-yard receiver in nine of 10 games this year, with two receivers each going over 100 yards in two of the first three games – UNM and Oklahoma.
- Four different Tulsa receivers have had a 100-yard receiving game and three different running backs have had at least one 100-yard rushing game.
- The first game that Tulsa did not have a 100-yard receiver came in the ninth game of the year against UCF.
- Tulsa had two 100-yard rushers vs. New Mexico with Zack Langer gaining 139 yards and D'Angelo Brewer had his first career 100+ game with 133 yards.
- QB Dane Evans went over 2,000 passing yards in the sixth game this year.
- Before throwing an interception against Houston in the third period, Evans had gone 125 passes between interceptions.
- Tulsa has 52 pass plays and 15 touchdown passes for over 20 yards this year.
- Keyarris Garrett has been on the receiving end of 20 of those 20+ passing plays with a long of 50 yards against FAU . . . Josh Atkinson has 10 20+ pass receptions, including a season-long 80-yard TD reception against #17 Memphis .
- The Hurricane had seven passes go for over 20 yards against #17 Memphis, including six 30+ yard receptions by Keyarris Garrett.
- Tulsa has 12 KO returns and two punt returns that have gone for over 20 yards, giving Tulsa 80 plays on offense, defense and special teams of over 20 yards, and 20 that have gone for TDs.
- The Hurricane has had two defensive plays, both INT returns for touchdowns, a 31-yard return by Kerwin Thomas and an 86-yard return by Michael Mudoh.

TULSA PUTS UP NUMBERS AGAINST #16 SOONERS . . .

- Tulsa had its third 600+ total offense game with 603 yards vs. #16 Oklahoma . . . in Oklahoma's previous two games the opposing offenses (Akron and Tennessee) combined for only 480 total yards between them vs. the Sooners.
- Dane Evans threw for 427 yards and four TDs vs. Oklahoma . . . Keyarris Garrett had a career-best 14 receptions for a career-high 189 yards and one TD vs. Oklahoma . . . fellow receiver Josh Atkinson had 10 catches for 104 yards and one TD.
- Zack Langer had his second straight 100+ rushing game with 161 yards and one TD on 31 carries vs. Oklahoma.
- Three Tulsa tacklers had double-digit stops, including Michael Mudoh (16), Matt Linscott (13) and Kerwin Thomas (12).
- * Despite two more takeaways by the Tulsa defense, the Oklahoma offense broke a Tulsa school record for opponent total offense with 773 yards.

AN OPENING GAME HIGHLIGHT FOR LANGER . . .

- Senior Zack Langer came into this year's season opener having never carried the ball once in an opening game for the Hurricane . . . he played in both the 2012 and 2013 openers but did not carry the ball, and in 2014 was injured for the first game.
- This year, it wasn't until Tulsa's last possession of the first half that Langer touched the ball for the first time in a season opener . . . he went for one yard on his first touch and a game-high 18 yards on his second carry.
- Langer ended the game as one of the heroes, finishing the game with 89 rushing yards and three TDs, as well as one reception for 34 yards.
- Langer's third TD, covering three yards, was the game-winner in overtime.

WHY GOLDEN HURRICANE?

Enter the name Howard Acher as the Tulsa head coach in 1922. When he took over the position, Acher saw great potential in his team and wanted to publicize it by creating a new identity with a new nickname. Sports writers and others had called the school by any number of names from the Presbyterians to the Orange and Black, to the Kendallites.

After an opening day win against a strong Texas Christian University team in 1922, Acher put his mind to work. The press had claimed that the Kendall football team blew through its opponents like a tornado. So, it figured that Tornadoes, would be the nickname with "golden" added to identify the color of the uniforms. However, it was later found that Georgia Tech had claimed that name, so from tornado it was evolved meteorologically to a hurricane. Thus the squad voted, and the name "Golden Hurricane" became the new team moniker with the gold added because of the jersey color.

TU lived up to its nickname as the Golden Hurricane blew through the Texas A&M defense in the next game with pass after pass from quarterback Rex Thomas. TU won its first game as the Golden Hurricane by a score of 13-10.

WHAT IS IT ABOUT OPENERS . . .

- Dane Evans has started two season openers for the Golden Hurricane, including 2014 and this year, and has put up huge numbers.
- In overtime wins against Tulane in 2014 and FAU this season, Evans has thrown for 862 yards and six TDs.
- Evans has averaged 431 yards and three TDs in Tulsa's last two season openers.
- One of his favorite targets in the last two openers has been fellow junior Keevan Lucas . . . Lucas has totaled 426 yards and five TDs for an average of 213 yards and 2.5 touchdowns in the last two season opening games.

LOOKING BACK AT THE OPENER . . .

- With the win over FAU, Tulsa improved to 67-48-1 overall in season openers and 61-24 in home openers at Skelly Field @ H.A. Chapman Stadium.
- It was the third straight season that Tulsa's home opener ended in dramatic fashion . . . in 2013 Carl Salazar knocked through 34-yard field goal with no time remaining to give Tulsa a 30-27 win over Colorado State . . . last year, Tulsa and Tulane went into two overtimes when a Demarco Nelson interception on Tulane's second possession preserved Tulsa's 38-31 lead.
- After trailing 7-0 in the first quarter, Tulsa scored the next 21 points for a 21-7 lead at the 12:49 mark of the second quarter . . . FAU rattled off the next 24 points to take a 31-21 lead at the 11:14 mark of the third period . . . Tulsa could get only as close to three points twice, before knotting the score at 41-41 with 0:03 left in regulation . . . Tulsa held FAU to a field goal in OT, before Zack Langer ran in from 3 yards out for a 47-44 win.
- Keevan Lucas and Keyarris Garrett combined for 356 receiving yards and 2 TDs.
- It was the second straight season opener that Dane Evans had thrown for over 400 yards, the first two 400+ yard passing games of his career.

GETTING THAT ROAD WIN . . .

- With a road win over New Mexico in the second week of the season, Tulsa snapped a six-game road losing streak.
- Tulsa was 0-6 last year on the road, as the last road victory came in the final road game of the 2013 season when Tulsa defeated Louisiana Tech, 24-14, on Nov. 23 in Ruston, La.
- The victory also put Tulsa at 2-0 on the season for the first time since the 2009 season when Tulsa won its first two games, both on the road at Tulane (37-13) and New Mexico (44-10).

LUCAS NAMED AAC OFFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK AFTER WEEK ONE . . .

- In the season opener, Keevan Lucas caught 10 passes for 193 yards and two TDs, while also carrying the ball twice for 21 yards vs. FAU, thus earning the first American Athletic Conference's Offensive Player of the Week award this season.
- His 193 yards was the second-highest receiving total for the first weekend of the college football season.
- Lucas' touchdown receptions covered 39 yards to tie the game 7-7, and one for 43 yards to give Tulsa a 21-7 lead in the second quarter.
- On Tulsa's game-tying drive in the final minute, Lucas caught four passes covering 58 yards on the 12-play, 53-yard drive, with three catches going for first downs.
- In the overtime series, Lucas took the first play 11 yards to the 14-yard line leading to the winning touchdown.
- The weekly award is the second straight year that Lucas began the year as The American's Offensive Player of the Week.

- Including Miller, Tulsa had a total of 11 players who saw their first collegiate action against FAU in the season opener.
- Six offensive players and five defensive players saw their first-ever playing time in the season opener.
- The offensive players included WR Justin Hobbs, TE Chris Minter, OT Willie Wright, OG Tyler Bowling, C Chandler Miller and OG Alex Pagonis.
- The defensive players earning their first collegiate playing time were DB Sam Gottsch, DB McKinley Whitfield, DB J.R. Reed, LB Tim Quickel and DE Myles Mouton.
- Minter and Whitfield are true freshmen, Reed is a freshman gray-shirt, Pagonis is a JUCO transfer, while Hobbs, Wright, Bowling, Miller, Gottsch, Quickel and Mouton are all red-shirt freshmen.

FIRST STARTS . . .

- A total of six players earned their first career starts in the season opener, including three on offense and three on defense.
- The first-time offensive starters were red-shirt freshmen OC Chandler Miller (Bixby, Okla.) and WR Justin Hobbs (Overland Park, Kan.) and sophomore OT Evan Plagg (Guthrie, Okla.).
- The three players on defense receiving their first career starts were sophomore SAF Jordan Mitchell (Owasso, Okla.), junior LB Matt Linscott (Jenks, Okla.) and sophomore DE Jeremy Smith (Sperry, Okla.).
- In the second game, three more Tulsa players saw their first career starting assignment with sophomore DE Frankie Davis (Broken Arrow, Okla.), junior SAF Jeremy Brady (North Little Rock, Ark.) and red-shirt freshman OT Willie Wright (Houston, Texas).

TEN STARTERS BACK ON OFFENSE . . .

- A total of 10 starters returned to the Tulsa offense in 2015.
- Six more players, who have started at least one game in their careers, also returned to the Hurricane offensive unit.
- The Hurricane returned 100-percent of its rushing and passing totals and 94 percent of the teams' receiving total.
- Tulsa's offense put up 412.5 total yards in 2014 to rank fourth in the American Athletic Conference for total offense.

THE DEFENSE . . .

- Tulsa's defense returned 27 lettermen, including six returning starters and another seven players who started at least one game in their careers entering this year.
- The defensive front returned three starters from the 2015 season, including end Derrick Alexander and tackles Derrick Luetjen and Jerry Uwaezouke
- The line also welcomed back the return of 2013 starting tackle Jesse Brubaker, who missed all but one game last year with an injury.
