### Mids Start Defense of Commander-In-Chief's Trophy As Air Force Comes Calling to Annapolis

Coming off a thrilling 46-43 come-from-behind victory over Duke, Navy (2-2) will play host to the Air Force Falcons (3-1) Saturday afternoon at Navy-Marine Corps Memorial Stadium (34,000). Kickoff is scheduled for 1 p.m. with USAA serving as the game day sponsor. The game is a sellout.

Saturday's game will be televised nationally by CSTV with Pete Medhurst and Scott Zolak calling the action.

Bob Socci, John Feinstein and Omar Nelson will call the game on the Navy Radio Network, which includes WBAL in Baltimore (1090 AM), WNAV in Annapolis (1430 AM), 3WT in Washington, DC (1500 AM), WFED in Northern Virginia (1050 AM), WTRI in Frederick (1520 AM), The Game in Virginia Beach, Va. (102.1 FM) and Hampton Roads, Va. (1490 AM) and Sirius Satellite Radio (Channel 114). The game will also be streamed live on Navy All-Access, as well as on the web sites of the various stations carrying the game. The pregame show will air at 4 p.m.

Pete Medhurst and Joe Miller will host the Navy Tailgate Show on 1430 WNAV starting at 11 a.m.

Saturday's fly-over will feature four F/A-18F Super Hornets from the "Fighting Blacklions" of Strike Fighter Squadron 213. The diamond formation will be led by Capt. Dan "Dix" Dixon, Class of 1983 and Lt. Cmdr. Michael "Opie" Spencer, Class of 1993. The left wing will be flown by Lt. Alex "Gerber" Wright, Class of 2003 and Lt. Matt "Turbo" Speicher, Class of 2002. The right wing is flown by Lt. Jason "TIKE" Gustin, Class of 1998 and Lt. Cmdr. James "Goat boy" Bates, Class of 1995. The slot is flown by Lt. Cmdr. Luke "Crash" Barradell, Class of 1996 and Lt. Cmdr. Steve "Wang" Djuanaedi, Class of 1997.

### Navy's "Killer B's" Rally Mids To Thrilling Victory Over Duke

Junior quarterback Jarod Bryant (Hoover, Ala.), junior safety Ketric Buffin (Rowlett, Texas), senior kicker Joey Bullen (St. Simons Island, Ga.) and sophomore slot back Bobby Doyle (Chardon, Ohio) were key contributors in Navy's miraculous 46-43 come-from-behind victory over Duke in front of 32,278 fans at Navy-Marine Corps Memorial Stadium.

Bryant entered the game in relief of an exhausted Kaiponoa Kaheaku-Enhada (Jr./Kapolei, Hawai'i) with 14:38 left in the contest and the Mids trailing 43-32. Bryant promptly led the Mids down the field on a 17-play, 62-yard

scoring drive as Bullen's 35-yard field goal hit the left upright and ricocheted through to cut the Duke lead to 43-35.

The young Navy defense then rose to the occasion, forcing just the second three-and-out for the Duke offense all day.

Navy got the ball back on its own 35 with 6:40 left and Bryant led the Mids back down the field for the tying score. Senior slot back Reggie Campbell (Sanford, Fla.) ripped off a 25-yard run to start the drive and Bryant hit Zerbib Singleton (Sr./Decatur, Ga.) on second-and-nine with a 14-yard pass. The Mids moved the ball down to the Duke five where on third-and-three Doyle, who was recruited by Navy as a quarterback, took a pitch from Bryant and then stopped and threw back to Bryant for a five-yard touch-down pass to pull the Mids to within two points. Bryant then made a great run on the two-point conversion to tie the game at 43.

The Blue Devils moved the ball back down the field, but on third-and-21 from the Duke 48, Buffin picked off a Thaddeus Lewis pass at the Navy 26-yard line to give the Mids the ball back with 38 seconds left. The Mids would not play for overtime.

On first down, Bryant broke through a tackle at the line of scrimmage and rambled 35 yards down to the Duke 39-yard line. After two more Bryant runs netted 14 yards down to the Duke 25, the Mids ran the clock down and moved the ball to the middle of the field for Bullen. Bullen came on and calmly drilled a 44-yard field goal to give the Mids a thrilling victory.

Junior fullback Eric Kettani (Kirtland, Ohio) led the Mids' rushing attack with 71 yards and two touchdowns on 14 carries. Bryant added 69 yards on 14 fourth-quarter carries, while Kaheaku-Enhada rushed for 59 yards on 19 carries. Kaheaku-Enhada passed for a career-high 217 yards, completing 11 of his 16 pass attempts with one touchdown and one interception. Singleton had three catches for 48 yards, while senior OJ Washington (Tacoma, Wash.) caught two passes for 53 yards with one touchdown and one two-point conversion.

Senior Matt Wimsatt (Raleigh, N.C.) led the defense with seven tackles, a tackle for a loss and a forced fumble, while sophomore nose guard Nate Frazier (Atlanta, Ga.) had six tackles and his first-career sack. Sophomore safety Ram Vela (San Antonio, Texas) added six tackles.

The Mids eclipsed 500 yards of total offense for a second-straight week, racking up 540 yards (304 rushing, 236 passing). Duke had 506 yards of total offense (78 rushing, 428 passing).

**The Commander-In-Chief's Trophy**

The Commander-In-Chief's Trophy is presented annually to the winner of the football competition among the three major service academies — Army, Navy and Air Force—and is named in honor of the President of the United States. Navy has dominated the trophy of late, winning a school-record four-straight years and winning nine straight games against Air Force and Army in the process. Navy has won the trophy a total of nine times: 1973, 1975, 1978, 1979, 1981, 2003, 2004, 2005 and 2006. When there is no clear-cut winner, the trophy remains with the winner of the previous year's competition.

The three-sided trophy stands two-and-a-half-feet tall and is engraved with the academy seals. Reproductions of the three mascots — the Army Mule, the Navy Goat and the Air Force Falcon — are ensconced on the respective sides of this bauble. The trophy is sponsored by the West Point Association of Graduates, the Naval Academy Alumni Association and the Air Force Association of Graduates.

The year in which the trophy is won is engraved on a plate gracing the respective academy's side of the trophy.

**Johnson's Portfolio**

► Has led Navy to an unprecedented four straight bowl games, posting a 2-2 record in the four games. The four games represent 30.8 percent of Navy's 13 bowl appearances in its 128-year history.

► Navy had never reached three, let alone four, bowl games in a row in its program history, prior to Johnson's arrival.

► The 35 wins from 2003-06 is the second most in school history in a four-year span, behind the span of 1905-08 (36). This year's squad needs six more wins to equal the greatest five-year stretch in school history with 43 wins (1904-08).

► Engineered one of the most-remarkable turnarounds in college football history, becoming just the sixth team in NCAA history to go from a winless season (2001) to a bowl game (2003) in two years or less.

► Won 2004 Bobby Dodd National Coach of the Year honors after leading Navy to a 10-2 record and its first bowl win since 1996. The 10 wins marked just the second time in school history (1905) that Navy won double-digit games. The Mids ended that year ranked No. 24 in the country.

► His teams have led the nation in rushing in three of his five years in charge of the Navy offense. His squads have posted 11 of Navy's 25 all-time 400-yard rushing games. If you throw in the times the Mids ran for over 400 yards when he was the offensive coordinator, the total swells to 14-of-25 times. As a head coach or offensive coordinator, his teams own six of the top 10 marks.

► The last two times Navy has led the country in rushing, the Mids have accomplished the feat without a 1,000-yard rusher. That has happened just 12 times in NCAA history.

► With the win against Temple, Johnson won his 100th career game, reaching the mark as the 26th-fastest coach in NCAA history.

► Johnson has been dominant against the other service academies, owning a 9-1 record with nine straight wins and outscoring Air Force and Army by a combined 274-145 (30.4 - 16.1) margin during the nine-game streak.

► Even more impressive, Navy's graduation rate of 98 percent was tops in the country, ahead of Boston College, Notre Dame, Stanford and Air Force.

► Won a pair of Division I-AA National Championships at Georgia Southern in 1999 and 2000, while compiling an astonishing 62-10 record in five years at GSU. During his first four years, he went 50-8, becoming just the fourth coach in NCAA history to win 50 games in four years.

► While at Georgia Southern, his teams broke or tied 389 individual or team school, conference, playoff or stadium records, and amassed 400 yards of offense in 45 of the last 59 contests.

**Johnson Moves Into Third Place on Wins List in Victory Over Duke**

Paul Johnson took sole possession of third place on Navy's career wins list with his 39th win on Saturday in Navy's 46-43 come-from-behind victory over Duke. Johnson is just the fourth Navy coach in the last 76 years and the seventh in the 126 years of Navy football to coach five or more years in Annapolis and post a winning record.

**Johnson Tough With Time**

Paul Johnson has posted a 16-7 record (.696) as Navy's head coach when having more than one week to prepare and is 14-5 (.737) with more than one week to prepare over the last five seasons.

In 2002, the Mids posted a 2-2 record, defeating SMU and Army and losing to Northwestern and Notre Dame.

In 2003, Navy was 4-1, defeating VMI, Eastern Michigan, Central Michigan and Army and losing to Texas Tech in the Houston Bowl.

In 2004, the Mids were 4-1, defeating Duke, Rutgers, Army and New Mexico and losing to Notre Dame, when having more than one week to prepare.

In 2005, Johnson was 3-1, losing to Maryland and beating Duke, Army and Colorado State.

In 2006, Johnson was 2-2, defeating East Carolina and Army and losing to Notre Dame and Boston College.

In 2007, Johnson is 1-0, defeating Temple.

**Johnson Among the Nation's Top Coaches**

Paul Johnson's .732 career winning percentage (101-37) is 11th among all active Division IA coaches. Johnson has the highest career winning percentage among active coaches who have not coached at a BCS school.

**Working Press**

• Admittance to the Navy-Marine Corps Memorial Stadium press box is limited to the WORKING PRESS ONLY. The press box is located on the west side of the stadium. Beverages and a buffet are available two hours before kickoff and at halftime.

**Telephones**

• There are eight courtesy phone lines and high-speed internet connections available in the press box.

**Radio**

• There are two radio booths in the NMCMS press box. One booth is reserved for the Navy Football Network; the visiting team is assigned the other broadcast space. Six credentials will be allotted to each broadcast crew, plus one for each spotter.

Visiting radio stations may purchase the use of up to three phone lines already installed by contacting Eric Ruden, Deputy Director of Athletics at 410-293-8748.

**Television**

• All of Navy's home games will be televised live by CSTV.

**Photographers**

• Still and newsreel photographers with hand-held equipment may work the sidelines between the 25-yard line and the goal line in both directions. Sideline credentials are normally issued to photographers representing daily newspapers, wire services, magazines and television stations or networks. As a general rule, each properly accredited sideline photographer will be entitled to one caption write and one messenger.

• Head Coach Paul Johnson will conduct a post-practice interview session, Monday-Wednesday, at approximately 6:00 pm. All players and assistant coaches will also be available at that time. Coach Johnson will be available via the phone Monday-Thursday from 2-3:00 pm. Please contact SID Scott Strasemeier with your interview request at least one day in advance.

**Player Interviews**

• All player phone interviews must be arranged through Strasemeier at least one day in advance. Players will do phone interviews during the day (Monday-Thursday) if their class schedule permits. Players will also be available after practice, Monday-Wednesday.

**Service Academy Dominance**

The Mids are 37-17 (.685) over the last five years and have proven to be the dominant service academy team over that time span. Navy has won nine-straight Service Academy games and is just three wins away from tying the all-time record for consecutive service academy wins. Air Force won 12-straight service academy games from 1997-2002.

**Johnson 9-1 in Service Academy Games and Has Won Nine Straight**

With a 26-14 victory over Army last year, Navy head football coach Paul Johnson improved to 9-1 (.900) as a head coach against service academy teams (4-1 against Air Force and 5-0 against Army), the best start for a head coach in school history against the other two service academies. Johnson is just the second coach in school history to win his first-five games against Army, joining legendary head coach Wayne Hardin (won his first five, 1959-63). No Navy or Army coach has won six straight in the series. No Navy coach has beaten Army in the dominant fashion that Johnson has either, as the Mids have outscored the Black Knights, 202-68 (40.4-13.6), during his tenure.

**Playing the Mountain West**

Navy is 6-2 against the Mountain West Conference under Navy head coach Paul Johnson and has won the last six contests against MWC foes. The Mids are 4-1 against Air Force, 1-0 against New Mexico, 1-0 against Colorado State and 0-1 against TCU.

**Series History**

Air Force leads the all-time series against Navy, 25-14, but the Mids have won four straight over the Falcons. Navy is 6-7 all-time against Air Force at Navy-Marine Corps Memorial Stadium.

**Last Year**

In last year's Friday's edition of the *Colorado Spring Gazette*, Air Force defensive end Noah Garguile called Air Force's three-game losing streak to Navy an embarrassment. The following day, Navy made it four straight behind the running of fullback **Adam Ballard (Lewisville, Texas)** and quarterback Brian Hampton and an opportunistic defense that scored a touchdown and recorded five sacks.

Ballard rushed for 134 yards on 27 carries, while Hampton rushed for 105 yards and two touchdowns on 22 carries, as the Mids defeated the Falcons, 24-17, in front of 45,246 fans at Falcon Stadium. The Mids won the game despite completing just one pass in five attempts.

The Navy defense shut down Air Force for three quarters, recording five sacks and seven tackles for a loss. The play of the game was when linebacker Rob Caldwell forced his third fumble of the year in the first quarter, stripping Air Force quarterback Shaun Carney of the ball and corner Keenan Little picked the ball up and strolled 37 yards for a touchdown to give Navy a 7-0 lead. Outside linebacker David Mahoney was nearly unblockable coming off the edge, recording nine tackles, three sacks and forcing a fumble. Caldwell recorded nine tackles and a sack to go along with his

forced fumble, while corner **Rashawn King (Raleigh, N.C.)** broke up a pass on fourth down to end a furious fourth quarter comeback effort by the Falcons.

**Scouting Air Force**

The Falcons enter Saturday's contest with a 3-1 record under first-year head coach Troy Calhoun. Air Force owns victories over South Carolina State (34-3), Utah (20-12) and TCU (20-17 in overtime, while dropping last week's game at BYU, 31-6.

Jim Ollis is the leading rusher with 205 yards on 32 carries, while Kip McCarthy has rushed for 140 yards on 26 carries. Quarterback Shaun Carney has completed 46 of his 81 pass attempts for 523 yards with two touchdowns and three interceptions. Carney's favorite target is Chad Hall, who has caught 17 passes for 173 yards.

Chris Thomas leads the Falcon defense with 39 tackles, 3.5 tackles for a loss, one interception and three pass break-ups. Drew Fowler has recorded 30 tackles, while Carson Bird has intercepted three passes.

Air Force is ranked 21st nationally in rushing offense (223 yards per game), 114th in passing offense (130.8 yards per game), 80th in total offense (353.8 yards per game) and 98th in scoring offense (20 points per game). Defensively, Air Force is ranked 28th in rushing defense (97.8 yards per game), 68th in pass defense (235.8 yards per game), 44th in total defense (333.5 yards per game) and 17th in scoring defense (15.8 points per game).

**Sovie and Deliz Out For the Season**

The Navy defense suffered a serious blow during the Rutgers game on Sept. 7, when the Mids lost senior defensive captain **Jeff Deliz (Clinton Township, Mich.)** and junior linebacker **Clint Sovie (Jacksonville, Fla.)** for the year. Deliz suffered a right foot injury and Sovie a left ankle injury. Both had season-ending surgery on Sept. 13.

**Home Sweet Home**

Navy is 18-5 (.783) at Navy-Marine Corps Memorial Stadium over the last four years, after losing 14 straight at home the previous three years. Navy's home winning percentage over the last four years is the 20th best in the country.

**Johnson Named the Most Underrated Coach in America by Athlon**

Navy head football coach Paul Johnson was named the most underrated football coach in the country by Athlon Sports in their Eastern Football publication this fall. The top five consisted of Johnson, Chris Petersen of Boise State, Bill Cubit of Western Michigan, Bret Bielema of Wisconsin and Ralph Friedgen of Maryland.

It's no surprise that Athlon selected Johnson as the most underrated coach. After all, what he has accomplished at the Naval Academy in five seasons has been of historic proportions.

Johnson took over a program that had posted a 1-20 record the previous two years before his arrival in 2002. After a 2-10 mark in his first year, the Navy football program has achieved what many thought was no longer possible at an Academy, as Johnson has brought the Midshipmen back into the national spotlight with a 35-15 (.700) record over the last four years and has led Navy to a school-record four-straight bowl games and a school-record four-consecutive Commander-In-Chief's Trophies. The 35 wins are the second most in program history over a four-year time span.

Johnson has dominated the other two Service Academies like no other coach in the school's annals posting a 9-1 (.900) overall record, including a perfect 5-0 mark against rival Army. Last year's senior class was the first in school history to post a perfect 8-0 mark against Army and Air Force.

Johnson's teams have been successful off the field as well, as Navy ranks No. 1 in the country in graduation rates.

Johnson's triple option offense has been the backbone to the program's success as the Mids have led the nation in rushing three of the last five years. Last year, the Mids averaged a school-record 327.4 yards per contest.

**Navy - The Nation's Best Rushing Attack**

In Paul Johnson's five years at the Naval Academy, the Mids have consistently been one of the top rushing teams in the country, never finishing lower than third. In 2002, Johnson's first year at the helm, Navy finished third in the nation, averaging 270.8 yards per contest. In 2003, the Mids led the nation in rushing,

averaging a then school-record 323.2 yards per game. In 2004, Navy finished third in the nation, averaging 289.5 yards per contest. In 2005, Navy led the country in rushing for the second time in three years, averaging 318.7 yards per game. Navy finished the 2006 campaign averaging a nation's-best and school-record 327 yards per game. The previous record was 323.2 set in 2003. The Mids are averaging 360 yards per game in 2007.

**Hanging On To Leads**

Navy is 29-3 (.906) in the Paul Johnson era when leading at halftime and 35-4 (.897) when leading after three quarters.

**Pick Your Poison**

Navy proved on Saturday against Duke that it can throw the ball if that is what the defense is going to give it. Junior quarterback **Kaipō-Noa Kaheaku-Enhada (Kapolei, Hawai'i)** completed his first nine passes en route to a 217-yard performance. The Mids threw for 236 yards in the game, the third most in the Paul Johnson era and the most since passing for 248 yards against Stanford on Sept. 10, 2005. Kaheaku-Enhada's 217 yards passing are the most by a quarterback in the Paul Johnson era and the most since Brian Broadwater threw for 302 yards on Nov. 11, 2000, in a 50-38 loss to Tulane. His 11 completions are the most by a quarterback since Lamar Owens completed 12 against Stanford on Sept. 10, 2005.

**Going For Two**

Prior to its two two-point conversions against Duke last Saturday, Navy had not converted a two-point conversion since Kyle Eckel ran one in against Vanderbilt on Sept. 15, 2004. Senior quarterback **Kaipō-Noa Kaheaku-Enhada (Kapolei, Hawai'i)** hit **O.J. Washington (Sr./Tacoma, Wash.)** for a two-point conversion pass in the second quarter and then **Jarod Bryant (Jr./Hoover, Ala.)** ran in a two-point conversion with 3:49 left in the contest to tie the game at 43.

**High-Scoring Game**

The 89 combined points in the Navy-Duke game were the most in a Navy game since Nov. 22, 2003, when Navy beat Central Michigan, 63-34.

**Cliffhanger**

**Joey Bullen's (Sr./St. Simons Island, Ga.)** 44-yard field goal at the gun to beat Duke, 46-43, marked the first time Navy has won a game on the final play since Sept. 21, 1996, when Tom Vanderhorst made a 38-yard field goal as time expired to beat SMU, 19-17. Bullen also kicked a game-winner in 2005 against Air Force, but Navy still had to kick-off in that game.

**Witness Protection Program**

Navy has played almost seven full quarters (114:40) since senior punter **Greg Veteto (Corpus Christi, Texas)** was last called on to punt. The Mids have not punted in three of the last nine games dating back to last year and have not punted in a game against Duke since 2005. Navy has punted just four times in four games (1.0 punts per contest). The NCAA record for fewest punts per game in a season is 1.2 (17 punts in 14 games) set by Hawai'i in 2006.

**Senior Class Has Shot at Wins Record**

The 2006 Navy football season was the culmination of a remarkable four-year run by a group of 34 midshipmen that made up the Class of 2007, a class that will go down in history as one of the greatest to play football at the Naval Academy. Thirty-five wins (second most in school history), an 8-0 mark against the other two Service Academies (first time in school history), four-consecutive Commander-In-Chief's Trophies (first time in school history), four-consecutive bowl bids (first time in school history) and two bowl wins in four years (second time in school history) leave a legacy that future classes will strive to achieve.

The first to take a crack at those marks will be this year's group of seniors. Though not as large in number (26), the Class of 2008 will have a chance to go undefeated against the other two Service Academies, win the Commander-In-Chief's Trophy all four years, go to four-straight bowl games, win three bowls games (would be the first class in school history) and with 29 career wins entering this season, will have a chance to become the winningest class in school history (need eight wins to tie the record and nine wins to break the record).

**Four Bowls in Four Years**

Navy's bid to the Meineke Car Care Bowl last fall marked the first time in school history the Midshipmen have gone to a bowl game in four-consecutive years. The Mids lost to Texas Tech in the 2003 Houston Bowl, 38-14, defeated New Mexico in the 2004 Emerald Bowl, 34-19, crushed Colorado State, 51-30, in the 2005 Poinsettia Bowl and lost a heartbreaking 25-24 decision to Boston College in 2006 in the Meineke Car Care Bowl.

**Four Consecutive Bowls With Four Different Starting Quarterbacks**

Navy appeared in its fourth straight bowl game with a fourth different starting quarterback, marking just the fifth time in NCAA history that a team has gone to four or more bowl games with a different quarterback leading it each year. UCLA holds the record with six-straight bowl games with six different starting quarterbacks.

**Mids in the Midst of the Most-Dominant Era in the History of the Army-Navy Series**

Navy's 26-14 victory over Army at the end of the 2006 season was its fifth-consecutive win over West Point, equaling the longest streak in series history. Only three other times in this historic rivalry has a team won five-straight games. Army won five straight from 1927-33 (the two teams did not play in 1928 or 1929) by an average margin of 9.2 points per game. Navy won five straight from 1939-43 (average margin of 12.2 points) and again from 1959-63 (average margin 13.6 points). Navy's current five-game winning streak has been by an average margin of 26.8 points per game (134 points in five games).

**Playing In The Big Time**

Since the start of the 2003 season, Navy has played 15 games in 10 different big league stadiums (nine NFL and one MLB) playing a 9-6 record. No college team in the country has played in more NFL stadiums than Navy has over the last five years.

The Mids will play three and possibly four games in NFL stadiums in 2007, playing Temple at Lincoln Financial Field in Philadelphia, Pittsburgh at Heinz Field in Philadelphia and Army at M&T Bank Stadium in Baltimore. The Poinsettia Bowl will be played at Qualcomm Stadium in San Diego.

**Elite Company**

Navy is one of just four schools to produce a President of the United States (Jimmy Carter) and a Super Bowl winning quarterback (Roger Staubach). The other three are Michigan (Gerald Ford and Tom Brady), Stanford (Herbert Hoover and Jim Plunkett/John Elway) and Miami of Ohio (Benjamin Harrison and Ben Roethlisberger).

If you go a step further, Navy is one of just one of three teams (Michigan and Stanford are the others) to produce a Super Bowl winning quarterback, President of the United States and a Heisman Trophy winner.

**The Staff That Stays Together, Wins Together**

One of Navy's strengths is an experienced coaching staff that has not only coached a significant amount of time at the Naval Academy, but has also coached together as a staff for a long time. This year's coaching staff combines for 10 years of coaching at the Naval Academy and has served 78 years under the direction of Paul Johnson, including 64 years under Johnson at the Naval Academy.

**When Navy Passes For More Yards Than it Rushes, It Usually Means Defeat**

Navy's 248 yards through the air against Stanford last fall are the most passing yards by a Navy team since Oct. 26, 2002, when Navy threw for 329 yards in a 51-30 loss to Tulane. Navy produced more yards through the air (248) than on the ground (235) for the first time since its 21-17 loss to Delaware on Nov. 1, 2003. The Mids are 0-3 under Paul Johnson when they accumulate more yards passing than rushing in a game.

**Campbell a Dual Threat**

Senior slot back **Reggie Campbell (Sanford, Fla.)** is one of only two players in the country that is averaging more than 7.0 yards per carry (minimum 100 carries) and 15.0 yards per catch (minimum of 25 catches) for his career. Campbell is averaging 7.6 yards per carry (1453 yards on 192 carries) and 21.5 yards per catch (31 catches for 667 yards) in his career. Houston's Anthony Aldridge is averaging 9.0 yards per carry (1,290 yards on 144 carries) and 19.1 yards per catch (37 catches for 706 yards).

**Campbell Makes Big Plays in the Passing Game**

Senior slot back **Reggie Campbell (Sanford, Fla.)** is averaging 21.5 yards per catch for his career, the second-best average in school history. Campbell has caught 31 passes for 667 yards and four touchdowns.

Navy did not have a 1,000-yard rusher last season for the second-consecutive year, making last year's team just the 12th team in NCAA history to lead the nation in rushing without a 1,000-yard rusher. Since 2003, Navy is 13-3 (.813) in games following a loss. The Mids have lost back-to-back games just three times during that four-year span, losing to Maryland and Stanford to start the 2005 season, to Rutgers and Notre Dame in 2006 and to Rutgers and Ball State in 2007. Navy has not lost three-straight games since the 2002 season when the Mids lost 10 in a row.

**Johnson's Teams Explode Down The Stretch**

Over the last four years, Navy has posted a 10-2 (.833) record over the final three games of the season and has outscored the opposition, 464-246 (38.7-20.5).

**Harper on the Watch List For Rimington, Outland and Lombardi Trophies**

Navy senior center **Antron Harper (Eastman, Ga.)** has been selected to the Watch List for the 2007 Rimington Award, which recognizes the most outstanding center in college football, for the Outland Trophy, which is awarded to the best interior lineman in college football and for the Lombardi Award, which is presented to the top lineman in college football.

Harper has arguably been Navy's best offensive lineman the past two seasons despite being one of the smallest offensive linemen in the country at 5-11, 257 pounds. Harper had started 25-consecutive games for the Midshipmen at guard over the last two years, but moved to center this spring. Navy has led the country in rushing the last two seasons and set a school record last year by averaging 327 yards per contest. He has been named to the ESPN.Com All-Bowl team the last two years.

The Remington trophy is presented by Canon, Cornhusker Marriott, and Logitech and is hosted by the Boomer Esiason Foundation. Esiason created his foundation in 1993 to support research and treatment of cystic fibrosis. Esiason and Dave Rimington were teammates on the Cincinnati Bengals from 1984-87. Rimington, the award's namesake, was a consensus first team All-America center at Nebraska in 1981 and 1982 during which he became the John Outland Trophy's only double winner as the nation's premiere college interior lineman. The winner is selected by determining the consensus All-American center pick from four existing All America Teams including: American Football Coaches

Association Walter Camp Foundation Sporting News Football Writers Association of America. The winner will be honored at an awards banquet at the Rococo Theater in Lincoln, Nebraska in January of 2008.

The 2007 Outland Trophy announcement will be on Dec. 6 in Orlando, Fla., on the ESPN Home Depot College Football Awards Show. The Outland Trophy presentation banquet, sponsored by the Greater Omaha Sports Committee, will be in January 2008 in Omaha, Neb. The Outland Trophy has been awarded annually by the FWAA since 1946. It is named after the late John Outland, a lineman at Pennsylvania at the turn of the century. Wisconsin offensive tackle Joe Thomas won the 2006 Outland Trophy.

The 2007 Rotary Lombardi Award, presented by Wachovia and benefiting the American Cancer Society, will be presented in Houston, Texas on December 5 at the Hilton Americas Hotel. The Rotary Lombardi Award was founded in the weeks following the death of legendary football coach Vince Lombardi from cancer in 1970. When Marie Lombardi granted the use of her husband's name to the Rotary Club of Houston, her only stipulation was that all net proceeds from the event be donated to the American Cancer Society.

**Ballard Selected to East-West Shrine Game**

Navy senior fullback **Adam Ballard (Lewisville, Texas)** has been selected to the 2008 East-West Shrine All-Star Game, which will be played Saturday, January 19 at the University of Houston. The game will be televised nationally by ESPN. The East-West Shrine Game is the premier All-Star Game in America, and has a long history of distinguished players and coaches in the game.

Ballard, who was ranked in the preseason as the third-best fullback in the country by *The Sporting News*, has rushed for 1,460 yards and nine touchdowns in his career. His career average of 5.5 yards per carry ranks fifth all-time at Navy. Ballard is the 21st player in school history to be selected to the East-West game. Outside linebacker Tyler Tidwell played in the game last year.

**Navy Wins Against Ranked Opponents**

Navy last beat a ranked opponent on Oct. 4, 2003, when the Mids defeated Air Force, 28-25 at FedExField in Landover, Md. Navy has beaten just one ranked team in the last 20 years, five in the last 30 years and nine in the last 40 years. Navy last beat a team ranked in the *Associated Press* Top 25 on Sept. 28, 1985, when Navy upset No. 20 Virginia, 17-13.

**Campbell and Deliz Elected 2007 Team Captains**

Navy head football coach Paul Johnson announced June 7 that slot back **Reggie Campbell (Sr./Sanford, Fla.)** and safety **Jeff Deliz (Sr./Clinton Township, Mich.)** have been elected team captains for the 2007 football season by their teammates.

"It's a great honor for Reggie and Jeff to be elected by their teammates and I know it's a role they won't take lightly," said Johnson. "I think the team made two great selections and I know both of these young men will do a great job."

Campbell, who has started 25-consecutive games for the Midshipmen, rushed for 706 yards and five touchdowns, caught 13 passes for 244 yards and two touchdowns and accumulated 1,362 all-purpose yards last fall as he was named Honorable-Mention All-East. He is one of the more explosive players to ever play at Navy, averaging 7.5 yards per carry (third-best in school history) and 22.6 yards per catch (second-best in school history) for his career.

Deliz played in 12 games last fall, mostly as a nickel back, and contributed 25 tackles, 3.5 tackles for a loss, one sack and an interception. He came on strong at the end of the year, recording his first-career sack and interception against Army and then tied his career-high for tackles with five against Boston College in the Meineke Car Care Bowl.

**Bowl Eligible Navy to Play in the 2007 San Diego County Credit Union Poinsettia Bowl**

The United States Naval Academy Midshipmen will play in the 2007 San Diego County Credit Union Poinsettia Bowl should they win six or more games in the regular season, San Diego Bowl Game Association President Rudy Castruita announced on April 11. The game will be played on Dec. 20 at 9 p.m. (EST) and the game will be televised nationally by ESPN.

"We're ecstatic the Midshipmen will likely be returning to San Diego for the third annual bowl game," Castruita said. "They created so much excitement in the inaugural game two years ago and we sincerely would look forward to their tradition-rich football program returning to San Diego this December."

The bowl game will match the Midshipmen against the second selection from the nine-team Mountain West Conference. The Pioneer Pure Vision Las Vegas Bowl has the first pick. Navy played in the inaugural San Diego County Credit Union Poinsettia Bowl in 2005 defeating the Colorado State Rams 51-30 in front of 35,842 Qualcomm Stadium fans.

"The Navy family is still talking about the fantastic experience we had in San Diego for the inaugural game," said Naval Academy Director of Athletics Chet Gladchuk. "The bowl staff makes this game a first class experience for our team and all who visit one of the finest destination cities in the country. We need to win games this fall to be rewarded, but our fans can be certain that having a trip to San Diego in December as a possibility will be more motivation than ever for our team to succeed."

**Staubach Named Co-Recipient of the National Football Foundation's Highest Honor**

Roger Staubach and Pete Dawkins of Army are the co-recipients of the 2007 National Football Foundation's Gold Medal Award. The Gold Medal, the NFF's highest honor, has been presented to seven U.S. Presidents, four U.S. Generals, three U.S. Admirals, one U.S. Supreme Court Justice, 25 Corporate CEOs and Chairmen, John Wayne and Jackie Robinson. Dawkins and Staubach will become the 51st and 52nd recipients of the award, which has been bestowed since 1958. The awards will be presented at the 50th Annual Awards Dinner on December 4, 2007, at the Waldorf-Astoria in New York City.

"The awards committee is incredibly proud to present the Gold Medal to Pete Dawkins and Roger Staubach," said NFF Awards Committee Chairman Bob Mulcahy. "Not only have they reached the pinnacle of collegiate football success as Heisman Trophy winners and members of the Hall of Fame, but they have proven themselves as selfless leaders through their courageous military careers and business endeavors."

A fixture in the Dallas area for more than 40 years, Roger Staubach has shined in everything he has pursued, and his drive for excellence has garnered him national attention as the consummate leader on and off the playing field. Staubach, a native of Silverton, Ohio, was a natural athlete and earned letters in three sports while attending the United States Naval Academy. As only a sophomore, Navy coach Wayne Hardin started Staubach in the second half of the Cornell game, hoping to give his Midshipmen a spark. Staubach led Navy to six touchdown drives that game, and a few weeks later, led his team to a 34-14 upset over Army. The following season proved even more successful, as he was named the 1963 Heisman Trophy winner and Maxwell Award recipient.

Although drafted by the Dallas Cowboys in the 1964, Staubach did not start playing until 1969 due to military commitments. He chose to volunteer for a one-year tour of duty in Vietnam, then spent the rest of his Naval career in the United States, playing football on various Naval service teams. As a 27-year-old Vietnam Vet, Staubach rejoined the Cowboys just in time for training camp. He served as a back-up his first two seasons, but garnered the starting spot in 1972. He would go on to lead Dallas to two Super Bowl victories, claiming MVP honors in the 1972 victory. He also landed five trips to the Pro Bowl.

Staubach was inducted into the College Football Hall of Fame in 1981 and the Pro Football Hall of Fame four years later. Known for his humanitarian efforts, he has received numerous awards for civic service, most recently accepting the Natural Leader Award at the Billiard Ball to benefit the Boys and Girls Club of Greater Dallas. For over 25 years, he has been the chairman and CEO of The Staubach Company, a Dallas-based real estate strategy and service firm with 60 offices throughout North America. The company finished the 2006 fiscal year with 6,750 transactions totaling \$26 billion.

- Saturday's meeting will be the 40th installment between the two rivals. It marks the first leg in the race for the Commander-In-Chief's Trophy given annually to the winner of the football competition between the three service academies, first awarded in 1972.
- Air Force leads the series, 25-14, but Navy has won the last four meetings by a combined 16 points. Three of the last four games have been decided by three points, including two in which Navy kicked field goals (2004, 2005) on essentially the last play of the game.
- The teams have played every year since 1972, and the 40 meetings are the fifth most against an opponent for the Mids (Army - 107, Notre Dame - 80, Penn - 47, William & Mary - 42).
- Navy's current four-game win streak against the Falcons is the longest Navy winning streak against Air Force. The Falcons won 11 straight in the series from 1982 to 1992.
- In games in which Navy scores at least 20 points against Air Force, the Mids are 11-7 all-time. However, Navy has won five straight games against the Falcons, dating back to 1996, when scoring at least 20 points.

**Last Meeting ► Navy 24, Air Force 17 ► Oct. 7, 2006**

A late stand by Navy's defense and the inside-outside rushing attack of Adam Ballard and Brian Hampton guided the Midshipmen to a 24-17 win over Air Force on Saturday.

Like all recent Navy-Air Force games, this one went down to the wire. Air Force, trailing 24-7 midway through the fourth quarter, pulled to within a touchdown with 3:06 left and recovered the onside kick.

However, the Midshipmen defense held as Rashawn King broke up a pass by Shaun Carney to Victor Thompson on a fourth-and-6.

Navy (5-1) takes its first step toward retaining the Commander-in-Chief Trophy, given annually to the best of the three service academies. Navy has won three straight.

Navy's senior class is one step away from becoming the first in school history to go 4-0 against both Air Force (2-2) and Army. All that stands in the way is a win over Army on Dec. 2.

Hampton bounced off Falcons tacklers all afternoon, rushing for 105 yards and two touchdowns. His 1-yard touchdown dive in the second quarter marked the sixth straight game he's scored. It's the fifth-longest streak in the nation.

Ballard had 27 carries for 134 yards, all on fullback dives. For a change of pace, the Midshipmen gave the ball to Reggie Campbell, who had 58 yards.

Navy all but put the game away in the third quarter with two time-consuming drives that resulted in a 38-yard field goal by Matt Harmon and a 2-yard touchdown run by Hampton. Navy had the ball for more than 13 minutes in the third quarter.

Air Force cut the lead to 24-17 in the fourth quarter on a 30-yard field goal by Zach Sasser and Carney's 5-yard touchdown pass to Travis Decker with 3:06 remaining.

• The nation's top-ranked rushing attack from a year ago outrushed the Owls by 287 yards.

Junior quarterback **Kaipo-Noa Kaheaku-Enhada (Kapolei, Hawaii)** rushed for 102 yards and one touchdown and completed three of his seven passes for 78 yards to lead Navy to a 30-19 victory over Temple in front of 30,368 fans at Philadelphia's Lincoln Financial Field in the season opener for both squads.

The Mids jumped out to a 14-0 first-quarter lead, scoring on their first two drives of the game. Senior fullback **Adam Ballard (Lewisville, Texas)** scored on a one-yard run on the Mids' first possession and then Kaheaku-Enhada ripped off a 44-yard touchdown run on Navy's next possession.

After Temple pulled to within 14-10 in the second quarter thanks to a Navy fumble that led to the Owls first touchdown, Ballard scored his second touchdown of the night on a nice five-yard run. Junior kicker **Matt Harmon (Taylors, S.C.)** drilled a 23-yard field goal as time expired in the second quarter to give the Mids a 24-10 halftime lead.

The Mids struggled in the second half and managed just two field goals thanks to a fumble and some costly penalties. Temple pulled to within 27-19 with 4:06 left in the game on a 23-yard touchdown pass from Adam DiMichele to Matt Balasavage, but sophomore nose guard **Nate Frazier (Atlanta, Ga.)** blocked the extra-point and then Harmon nailed a career-long 43-yard field goal with 1:07 left in the game to provide the final margin.

Junior **Shun White (Memphis, Tenn.)** led the Navy rushing attack with 122 yards on eight carries. Ballard added 78 yards on 21 carries to go with his two touchdowns.

Junior linebacker **Clint Sovie (Jacksonville, Fla.)** led the Mids with 10 tackles, while senior co-captain **Jeff Deliz (Clinton Township, Mich.)** added nine tackles. Senior outside linebacker **Matt Wimsatt (Raleigh, N.C.)** recorded seven tackles and his first-career sack and interception. Junior safety **Ketric Buffin (Rowlett, Texas)** also recorded an interception.

• Rutgers took full advantage of turnovers, converting them into 17 points, the difference in the score.

Mike Teel completed 14 of his 19 pass attempts for 266 yards and three touchdowns to lead No. 15 Rutgers to a 41-24 victory over Navy in front of a sellout crowd of 43,514 at Rutgers Stadium. With the win, the Scarlet Knights improved to 2-0 on the year, while Navy fell to 1-1.

The Mids had 289 yards of total offense against a stout Rutgers defense, but three interceptions, including two in the end zone, by junior quarterback **Kaipo-Noa Kaheaku-Enhada (Kapolei, Hawaii)**

proved costly.

The Navy defense gave up 476 yards of total offense as the Scarlet Knights scored on seven of their nine possessions in the game.

Navy fell behind 14-0 thanks to a disastrous first quarter. After a Rutgers punt that left the Mids with the ball on their own four-yard line, the Mids were able to get one first down before having to punt. Senior **Greg Veteto (Corpus Christi, Texas)** got off just a 27-yard punt, giving Rutgers the ball on the Navy 40-yard line. Three plays later, Teel hit Shamar Graves with a 12-yard touchdown pass to give Rutgers a 7-0 lead.

Rutgers took a 24-7 halftime lead, but Navy came out of the locker room to start the second half and drove 67 yards on seven plays with Kaheaku-Enhada scoring from the two to cut the Rutgers lead to 10.

Rutgers converted another interception in the endzone into points, as it drove 77 yards in 15 plays and Jeremy Ito nailed a 20-yard field goal with 2:34 left in the third quarter. Navy answered with a field goal of its own as **Matt Harmon (Jr./Taylors, S.C.)** was good from 34 yards out to make it 27-17, but that was as close as it would get.

Junior fullback **Eric Kettani (Kirtland, Ohio)** led the Mids in rushing with 48 yards on nine carries, while Kaheaku-Enhada completed five of his 12 pass attempts for 35 yards with one touchdown and three interceptions.

The defense was led by freshman **Wyatt Middleton (Norcross, Ga.)**, who recorded a career-high 11 tackles, while senior **Irv Spencer (Oakwood Village, Ohio)** had 10 stops.

• Navy couldn't get the big stop defensively when it needed it.

Two costly fumbles, two blocked field goals and the defense's inability to get a key stop added up to a 34-31 loss Saturday night in front of 32,087 fans at Navy-Marine Corps Memorial Stadium. The Mids rushed for 521 yards in the game, the third most in NCAA history for a losing team.

The game was a track meet from the start as neither team could slow down the other. The two teams combined for 1,124 yards of total offense in the game.

Junior quarterback **Kaipo-Noa Kaheaku-Enhada (Kapolei, Hawaii)** had touchdown runs of one and 80 yards in the first half, but did not play in the second half thanks to two sprained ankles. Ball State quarterback Nate Davis threw a seven-yard touchdown pass to Darius Hill and a 50-yard touchdown pass to Dante Loe to go along with a five-yard touchdown run to give Ball State a 21-14 halftime lead.

Navy tied the game at 21 on its first possession of the second half on a 24-yard touchdown run by **Eric Kettani (Jr./Kirtland, Ohio)** and on Ball State's ensuing possession, **Ketric Buffin (Jr./Rowlett, Texas)** intercepted a Davis pass in the end zone to give the Mids a chance to take control of the contest.

After a Ball State field goal tied the game at 24, Navy came back on the next play from scrimmage as Kettani busted through the line of scrimmage and outraced the Cardinal secondary to the end zone for a 71-yard touchdown run to give Navy a 31-24 lead with 5:53 remaining in the game.

The defense, however, couldn't come up with the big stop when it was needed most, letting Ball State drive 69 yards on just nine plays. The big play of the drive was on third-and-nine from the Ball State 43 when Davis hit Hill for 30 yards. Three plays later, the game was tied at 31 on a 12-yard touchdown pass from Davis to MiQuale Lewis.

Navy still had an opportunity to win the game. The Mids took the ball over at their own 29 with 3:53 left in the contest and calmly marched down the field setting up Harmon's attempt for a game-winning field goal. Bryant hit White with a 13-yard pass to move the ball down to the Ball State 34 and then Bryant busted off a 13-yard run on the next play to move the ball down to the Ball State 21-yard line. After two Bryant runs put the ball in the middle of the field, Harmon came on with two seconds left to kick a chip-shot 31-yard field goal to win the game. Harmon's kick was a line drive that never got off the ground, as it was easily blocked by the Cardinals' Brandon Crawford sending the game into overtime.

Ball State won the toss and elected to go on defense first. On the first play from scrimmage, the Mids had Ball State in a bad defensive alignment and should have scored a touchdown on the play, but Bryant's pitch to White was late and his fumbled pitch was recovered by Ball State.

Ball State ran four plays that moved the ball down to the Navy seven-yard line and Hogue came on to kick a 24-yard field goal to give Ball State the win.

Junior quarterback **Jarod Bryant (Hoover, Ala.)**, junior safety **Ketric Buffin (Rowlett, Texas)**, senior kicker **Joey Bullen (St. Simons Island, Ga.)** and sophomore slot back **Bobby Doyle (Chardon, Ohio)** were key contributors in Navy's miraculous 46-43 come-from-behind victory over Duke in front of 32,278 fans at Navy-Marine Corps Memorial Stadium.

Bryant entered the game in relief of an exhausted **Kaipo-Noa Kaheaku-Enhada (Jr./Kapolei, Hawaii)** with 14:38 left in the contest and the Mids trailing 43-32. Bryant promptly led the Mids down the field on a 17-play, 62-yard scoring drive as Bullen's 35-yard field goal hit the left upright and ricocheted through to cut the Duke lead to 43-35.

The young Navy defense then rose to the occasion, forcing just the second three-and-out for the Duke offense all day.

Navy got the ball back on its own 35 with 6:40 left and Bryant led the Mids back down the field for the tying score. Senior slot back **Reggie Campbell (Sanford, Fla.)** ripped off a 25-yard run to start the drive and Bryant hit **Zerbin Singleton (Sr./Decatur, Ga.)** on second-and-nine with a 14-yard pass. The Mids moved the ball down to the Duke five where on third-and-three Doyle, who was recruited by Navy as a quarterback, took a pitch from Bryant and then stopped and threw back to Bryant for a five-yard touchdown pass to pull the Mids to within two points. Bryant then made a great run on the two-point conversion to tie the game at 43.

The Blue Devils moved the ball back down the field, but on third-and-21 from the Duke 48, Buffin picked off a Thaddeus Lewis pass at the Navy 26-yard line to give the Mids the ball back with 38 seconds left. The Mids would not play for overtime.

On first down, Bryant broke through a tackle at the line of scrimmage and rambled 35 yards down to the Duke 39-yard line. After two more Bryant runs netted 14 yards down to the Duke 25, the Mids ran the clock down and moved the ball to the middle of the field for Bullen. Bullen came on and calmly drilled a 44-yard field goal to give the Mids a thrilling victory.

Junior fullback **Eric Kettani (Kirtland, Ohio)** led the Mids' rushing attack with 71 yards and two touchdowns on 14 carries. Bryant added 69 yards on 14 fourth-quarter carries, while Kaheaku-Enhada rushed for 59 yards on 19 carries. Kaheaku-Enhada passed for a career-high 217 yards, completing 11 of his 16 pass attempts with one touchdown and one interception. Singleton had three catches for 48 yards, while senior **OJ Washington (Tacoma, Wash.)** caught two passes for 53 yards with one touchdown and one two-point conversion.

The Mids eclipsed 500 yards of total offense for a second-straight week, racking up 540 yards (304 rushing, 236 passing). Duke had 506 yards of total offense (78 rushing, 428 passing).
