GAME PREVIEW

• After a thrilling 8-7 overtime win at Ohio State last Saturday, the 12th-ranked Navy lacrosse team will look to extend its winning streak to 3-0 when it battles No. 6 Cornell Saturday on Long Island ... the Mids and Big Red will square off in a neutral site contest held at the Mitchel Athletic Complex, the home of Major League Lacrosse's Long Island Lizards, in Uniondale, N.Y. ... faceoff is set for 1:00 pm.

• Cornell grads Art Kaminsky and Howie Borkan will call the action for MASN on a tape delayed broadcast ... MASN will air the game next Thursday at 7:30 pm ... approximately one hour after the completion of the game, it will be available via internet at www.SportsNetAmerica.com(.)

• Due to the Army-Navy men's and women's basketball doubleheader at West Point on Saturday, there will be no radio coverage of Saturday's lacrosse game.

• Navy is one of three D-I teams who have already played two games this season ... the Mids and Delaware are 2-0, while Robert Morris 1-1.

• The Mids are riding a two-game winning streak after kicking off the year with a 10-2 win over VMI at Navy-Marine Corps Memorial Stadium on Feb. 9 ... Navy followed up with a big win at Ohio State last Saturday thanks to junior midfielder **Michael Beggins'** shot just over two minutes into OT ... it was Beggins' first collegiate goal.

• Eighth-year head coach Jeff Tambroni will look to pick up where his Big Red left off a year ago ... semifinalists in last year's NCAA Championship, Cornell turned in a 15-1 record a year ago, losing to Duke by a goal ... Cornell's top point producers, Eric Pittard and David Mitchell, have graduated, though John Glynn and Max Seibald return to form one of the nation's top midfield tandems ... Glynn is Cornell's top returning goal scorer (23) and play-maker (22), while Seibald returns after turning in 17 goals and 20 assists last spring.

A LOOK BACK AT THE OHIO STATE WIN

• Scoring his first-collegiate goal, junior midfielder **Michael Beggins** ripped a shot at keeper Stefan Shroder's ankles just over two minutes into overtime to lead the 12th-ranked Navy men's lacrosse team (2-0) to an 8-7 victory over Ohio State (0-1) last Saturday at The 'Shoe in Columbus, Ohio.

• Navy, who led by as many as four goals early in the second half, held a one-goal lead with 10 seconds remaining in the game, when OSU forced a Navy turnover. The Buckeyes sent an outlet pass up the sideline where it was met by OSU Preseason All-American attack Kevin Buchanan who took a shot from eight yards out on the right wing and scored as time ran out in regulation.

• Navy senior **Mikelis Visgauss** won a crucial faceoff to start the overtime period, giving the Mids possession ... Navy would fired off five shots, including a one-timer by Beggins that would be knocked down by Shroder, but kept in play ... sophomore **Joe Lennon** took the next shot that clanged off the far post before **Basil Daratsos** hit the cross bar ... finally, Beggins was fed the ball and fired in what will be a memorable goal for he and his teammates.

• Once again, Navy utilized a balanced scoring line with six players scoring its eight goals.

• Additionally, three of the Mids' eight goals were scored on extra-man opportunities, as Navy finished 3 for 4.

• **Mikelis Visgauss** and sophomore **Frankie Coppola** combined to win 12 of the 18 face-offs for the Midshipmen, including 11 of 16 for Visgauss.

• With his goal and assist, **Nick Mirabito** moved into a tie (Jamie O'Leary, 1996-99) for 18th on the Mids' career scoring list with 117 points ... additionally, he moved into a tie (Matt Pawlikowski, 1990-93) for 20th on the assists list with 42.

• Sophomore attack man **Tim Paul** dealt out his second multi-goal game this season, while senior **Gregory Clement**, who owns six career goals, pitched his second two-goal game of his career (Holy Cross '07).

TAKING THE FIELD IN ...

10 • Navy has won 10 or more games in each of the previous four seasons.

9 • In the program's 101-year history, Navy has won nine of its 20 games against teams ranked No. 6.

8 • Eight different players accounted for the Mids' 10 goals against VMI in the season opener.

7 • Behind a 10-2 win over VMI on Feb. 9, the Mids have now won seven consecutive season openers.

6 • Dating back to 2007, **Tim Paul** has turned in two or more goals in six of his last eight games, including both contests this season.

5 • Navy is on tap to play two teams currently ranked in the top 5 - No. 1 Johns Hopkins, No. 4 Georgetown.

4 • Navy has made four consecutive NCAA Tournament appearances, including a championship game battle against Syracuse in 2004.

3 • Senior attack man **Nick Mirabito** needs three points to become only the 17th player in program history to reach 120 career points.

2 • Since the beginning of 2004, Navy has lost just two games against unranked opponents (29-2).

1 • Navy has been ranked No. 1 in regular-season home attendance in each of the last four seasons, including last year (5,587 in 6 regular-season games).

THE LAST TIME ...

• Navy (14-2) joined Princeton and top-seeded Johns Hopkins as members of the Final Four when it defeated seventh-seeded Cornell (9-5), 6-5, in quarterfinal action played at Schoellkopf Field in Ithaca, N.Y., on May 23, 2004.

• After a scoreless first period Navy put together a flurry of shots with the last of three-consecutive shots making its way past Cornell keeper Matt McMonagle. The third time was apparently the charm, as junior midfielder **Graham Gill** scooped up the loose ball and fired it in for the game's first goal at the 10:13 mark in the second period.

• Nearly two minutes later, the Big Red's top goal scorer Sean Greenhalgh curled around the back side of the net and made a diving shot at Navy keeper **Matt Russell's** ankles, knotting the game at one apiece.

• Cornell took its only lead of the game with 6:50 to go in the half when former Naval Academy attack Dave Pittard found an open Andrew Collins who threaded in the shot.

• The Mids countered 37 seconds later when Dingman took a shot nearly 100 yards out to tie the game at 2-2.

• Freshman **Billy Looney** gave the Mids the lead for good when attack **Jon Birsner** threw the ball from behind the cage to Looney who was 15 yards out.

• Up 3-2, Navy ran an unusual extra-man set knowing Cornell would be prepared for Navy leading goal scorer **Joe Bossi** to set up in the front of the crease on the right-hand side. Bossi, however, was found five yards out on the left-hand side and the lefty gave Navy a two-goal lead 57 seconds into the second half.

• Bossi's goal triggered a second half that saw the two teams trade goals ... perhaps none was more impressive than Dingman's goal with 9:31 to play in the game where he fought through multiple double teams and muscled his way free to give Navy a 5-3 lead.

• Navy owned a 6-4 lead with two minutes to go when Collins produced his second goal of the game at the 1:57 mark to narrow the gap.

• Both keepers had magnificent games, particularly early ... McMonagle produced 12 of his 14 saves in the first half, while Navy's Russell posted six saves in each half.

• Navy owned Cornell in the face-off circle with junior **Chris Pieczonka** winning 12 of the 13 draws ... Pieczonka moved up to No. 2 on Navy's career face-offs win list with 191 wins, passing Jay Hull (1995-98, 183 wins) ... he also set the school record for single-season grounders with 75.

• Navy's man-down defense was impressive weathering four man-down situations ... coming into the game, Cornell was ranked fifth in the nation in extra-man opportunities, scoring on 45.8 percent of its chances.

NAVY VS. CORNELL — THE SERIES

• Saturday's contest marks the 20th meeting between the two programs, however, just the second during Navy head coach Richie Meade and Cornell head coach Jeff Tambroni's careers.

• The Mids own a commanding 15-4 advantage, winning the first 13 games of the series ... Cornell has won four of the last six.

• The two teams last met in 2004 when the Midshipmen defeated the Big Red, 6-5, in Ithaca to advance to the NCAA Semifinals.

• The last time the two programs met during the regular season was in 1975 when then second-ranked Cornell handed No. 5 Navy a 16-7 loss in Annapolis ... the two teams went on to meet again in the NCAA Semifinals that year in Ithaca, where the No. 3 Midshipmen upset No. 2 Cornell, 15-12, to earn the program's first NCAA Championship appearance.

• Saturday's game marks the first time the two teams have met on neutral soil.

NAVY VS. THE IVY LEAGUE

• Navy has played more games against members from the Ivy League than any other conference ... Saturday's contest marks the 201st meeting against an Ivy League school.

• The Mids own a 165-33-2 (.830) record against the Ivy League ... their last contest against an Ivy League foe was the 2004 NCAA Quarterfinal matchup in which Navy defeated Cornell, 6-5, in Ithaca.

• Breaking it down, Navy is 2-1 vs. Brown, 15-4 vs. Cornell, 13-0 vs. Dartmouth, 37-5-1 vs. Harvard, 47-5 vs. Penn, 39-15-1 vs. Princeton and 12-3 vs. Yale.

• Richie Meade owns an 8-0 record against members of the Ivy League since becoming the Mids' head coach in 1995 ... he is 6-0 vs. Penn and 1-0 against both Cornell and Princeton.

DINOLA NAMED TO TEWAARATON WATCH LIST

- Senior close defenseman **Jordan DiNola** has been named to the 2008 Tewaaraton Award Preseason Watch List ... the Tewaaraton Trophy is awarded to the nation's top lacrosse player.
- DiNola is among 51 players named to the preseason list released Feb. 21.
- A two-time All-American, DiNola has seen action in 44 of the 48 games over his three-plus year career ... he's been a starter on Navy's nationally-ranked defense in each of the last three seasons.
- It's the fifth consecutive year a Navy player has been named to the watch list, joining Ian Dingman in 2004, Graham Gill Mitch Hendler, Steve Looney and Matt Russell in 2005, Ian Dingman, Billy Looney, Steve Looney and Matt Russell in 2006 and Billy Looney in 2007.

NATIONAL EXPOSURE

- Since the start of 2004, Navy has been on television 24 times (seven appearances in '04, 6 in '05 and '06, five in '07).
- The Mids will make a minimum of six appearances on television this season ... the Colgate (3/23), Georgetown (3/29) and Johns Hopkins (4/19) will be televised by CSTV, while back-to-back road games at Maryland (4/4) and Army (4/12) will be aired by ESPNU ... the Mids' neutral site matchup against Cornell on Saturday is slated to be carried by MASN on a tape delayed basis on Feb. 28 at 7:30 pm.
- The Mids own a 12-12 record when their games are televised ... Navy is 8-5 on CSTV all-time and 4-5 on the ESPN family of networks ... the Mids are also 0-1 on Time-Warner Sports and 0-1 on MASN.
- The Midshipmen own a 39-3 record in games that have not been televised since the start of 2004.

TOUGH "D"

- Since 2000, Navy's defense has been ranked No. 1 in the country three times, including 2005 and '06 ... the Mids have been ranked in the top three in each of the last four years.
- Navy has held 28 of its last 66 opponents to five or fewer goals, and only 10 foes (Ohio State, Army and Syracuse in '04, Georgetown and Virginia in '05, Army '06 and Colgate, Georgetown, Johns Hopkins and North Carolina in '07) have managed to reach double figures.
- Since 2004, Navy has held 32 of its 66 opponents to 25 or fewer shots ... during that time frame, Navy is 28-3 (Ohio State 2004, Colgate 2006, Maryland 2007) when holding its foes to under 25 shots.

- Navy has lost just seven games when holding foes to nine or fewer goals since 2004, posting a 44-7 mark ... two of the losses came in overtime during the 2005 campaign (Bucknell and Johns Hopkins), losses in '06 were to Colgate, Georgetown (twice) and Johns Hopkins, while Maryland managed to nip the Mids in overtime in '07.

NATIONAL LEADER BOARD

- Navy finished the 2007 campaign ranked among the top 10 in five statistical categories.
- Navy's smothering defense was ranked third, giving up 6.60 goals per game, just 0.39 behind Princeton.

- Goalkeeper **Colin Finnegan** finished his career ranked No. 3 in goals-against average (6.46) and 12th in save percentage (.588).
- **William Wallace** capped off his career as the nation's fourth-leading face-off specialist, winning 64.2 percent of the draws he took.
- Attack man **Nick Mirabito** was nationally-ranked a year ago in points per game (43rd, 2.93), goals per game (79th, 1.53) and assists per game (24th, 1.40).

PATRIOT LEAGUE SUCCESS

- Since joining the Patriot League in 2004, Navy is 31-2 (.938) against opponents from the league, including an 8-0 mark in the Patriot League Tournament ... the Mids lost regular-season contests to Bucknell in '05 and Colgate in '06.
- The Mids have produced undefeated marks in conference action in two of the last four years ... 7-0 in '04 and 6-0 in '07.
- Navy has won at least a share of the Patriot League regular-season title in each of its four years as a member of the league ... additionally, the Mids have claimed the league's tournament crown all four years.
- 24 different Mids have garnered All-Patriot League recognition, while 13 of the 24 have earned honors multiple times.
- Richie Meade was named the 2004 Patriot League Coach of the Year after leading the Mids to a flawless 7-0 mark in league competition ... he received the award a second time after guiding Navy to a 6-0 record last spring.

A DOMINANT STRETCH

- Navy is in the midst of one of its most dominant five-year runs in school history ... since the start of the 2004 season, Navy owns a 51-15 record (.773).
- The 51 wins are tied for the most in the country alongside Johns Hopkins and the .773 winning percentage is third behind Johns Hopkins (.823) and Cornell (.793).
- During that same stretch, Navy is 22-13 (.629) against ranked opponents and 29-2 mark (.935) against unranked foes.
- Since the start of the 2004 season, Navy owns a 7-5 (.583) record against teams ranked higher than the Mids in the USILA Coaches Poll ... against lower ranked or unranked teams, Navy is 44-10 (.815).
- The Mids have posted a 26-6 record at home, outscoring their foes, 362-207 (11.3 to 6.5 gpg) during that span ... just four teams have reached double digits on Navy's home field during that stretch.
- The Mids may be even better on the road since the 2004 campaign, owning a 17-7 record in true road affairs and defeating 11 ranked teams in the process ... two of Navy's seven road losses have come against unranked Patriot League opponents.
- Over the last four-plus seasons, the Mids have produced the top-three win totals in school history ... in 2004, Navy won 15 games en route to its NCAA Championship game appearance and in 2005, the Mids produced 12 wins in earning their second-consecutive NCAA Tournament berth ... Navy has won 11 games in 2006 and '07.
- The Class of 2007 became the winningest class in school history on March 21, 2007, when it claimed its 45th win in 56 contests ... the Class of '07 graduated having won 49 of its 64 contests (.766) ... the Class of '08 enters its final campaign boasting a 34-12 record (.739).

DINOLA TO LEAD MIDSHIPMEN IN '08

- Senior defenseman **Jordan DiNola** has been voted by his peers to serve as the 2008 Navy lacrosse captain.
- It is the second consecutive season a close defenseman has been chosen as the team's captain ... last year, Andrew Dow became the first Navy close defenseman to serve as team captain since Howie Meehan in 1998.
- A two-time First-Team All-Patriot League selection, DiNola has received All-America honors twice.

MORE ON THE MIDS' SUCCESS

- Behind a 12-1 win over Army in the Patriot League Tournament semifinals last spring, the Mids picked up their 10th win of the season, marking the fourth consecutive year Navy has won 10 or more games ... it's only the second time in program history and the first time since 1975-78, the Mids have strung together double-figure wins in four straight years (15 in 2004, 12 in 2005, 11 in 2006 and 11 in 2007).
- Navy's defense has given up double-figure goals just five times (Army in '06, Colgate, Georgetown, Johns Hopkins and North Carolina in '07) in its last 32 games and seven times in the last 47 ... dating back to 2003, Navy has won 29-straight games when holding its foes to five or fewer goals.
- Navy was the only program in the country to have both its extra-man and man-down units ranked among the top 11 a year ago ... the Mids finished 11th on extra-man offense (.365) and sixth on man-down defense (.784).
- Navy finished the 2007 campaign as one of five teams ranked among the nation's top 10 in both scoring offense and defense ... Navy was 10th in scoring offense (11.00) and third in scoring defense (6.60) ... joining the Midshipmen were Cornell (1/5), Duke (3/8), Notre Dame (4/4) and Ohio State (8/9).
- Navy has scored a goal in 1003-consecutive games dating back to 1910.

TOURNEY TALK

- Navy has made four straight appearances in the NCAA Tournament and 24 in its 100 years of tradition
- Navy has played in the fifth-most NCAA Tournaments behind Johns Hopkins (36), Maryland (29), Virginia (29) and Syracuse (26).
- The last time Navy qualified for four-consecutive NCAA Tournaments was 1986-89 ... the Mids received a bye in the '86 tournament, while winning their first-round games in 1987-88-89.
- Navy is 4-5 in tournament action under 14th-year head coach Richie Meade.
- Senior **Nick Mirabito** has scored five goals and added four assists in the four NCAA Tournament games in which he has played, including his hat trick against Delaware in the first round of the 2005 tournament ... it was his first-collegiate NCAA Tournament contest.
- The Mids lost two of their most proficient scorers in NCAA Tournament action, **Ian Dingman** and **Billy Looney**.
- Dingman scored a goal in five of the six NCAA Tournament games in which he played ... he scored two or more goals in all five of the games in which he found the back of the net, including two in the National Championship Game against Syracuse in '04.
- Looney scored a goal in seven of the eight NCAA Tournament games he played in, including a hat trick against Virginia in the 2005 quarterfinals, as well as last year's first-round matchup at North Carolina.

A CLOSER LOOK AT NAVY'S 2008 SCHEDULE

- Since the start of the 2004 season, Navy has played 35 of its 66 games against teams ranked in the top 25, posting a 22-13 record ... two of the losses have come against the No. 1-ranked team in the country at the time (Johns Hopkins twice) ... meanwhile, four of the losses have been at the hands of Georgetown ('05, '06 2x, '07) ... other losses to ranked teams in that span were against No. 20 Ohio State ('04), No. 4 Syracuse ('04), No. 7 Georgetown ('05), No. 6 Virginia ('05), No. 5 Georgetown ('06), No. 12 Johns Hopkins ('06), No. 5 Georgetown ('06), No. 7 Georgetown ('07), No. 11 Maryland ('07), No. 7 Johns Hopkins ('07) and No. 9 North Carolina ('07).
- In fact, since the start of the 2000 campaign, 65 of Navy's 118 games (.551) have been against ranked teams ... in those games against ranked opponents, Navy is 34-31 (.523), with eight of those losses against Johns Hopkins.
- In games against unranked foes since 2000, Navy is 48-5 (.906) ... the losses have come to UMBC ('01), Air Force and Penn State ('03), Bucknell ('05) and Colgate ('06).

FAN SUPPORT SECOND TO NONE

- The Mids have led the country in regular-season home attendance in each of the last four years ... in 2005, Navy averaged 5,332 fans per game at Navy-Marine Corps Memorial Stadium and in 2006, the Mids drew 4,321 per contest ... last spring more than 33,000 fans came out to watch Navy's six regular-season home games (5587.3).
- Last March, 14,625 fans crowded into Navy-Marine Corps Memorial Stadium to watch one of the most hotly-contested battles in Div-I, as Maryland took the Mids to double OT ... it was the third-largest documented crowd to watch a Navy lax game at the stadium.
- In April 2005, 14,124 fans witnessed the Mids' 9-8 victory over Maryland ... it was the largest crowd to watch a regular-season Div-I lacrosse game in '05.
- In the following home game, a crowd of 12,117 watched Navy beat archrival Army, 12-9, in the Star Game ... it was the sixth largest in school history and it marked the first time in program history that Navy drew over 10,000 fans in back-to-back games ... it was the largest documented crowd to see an Army-Navy lacrosse game.

HOME COOKIN'

- Navy owns a 26-6 record (.813) in games played at Navy-Marine Corps Memorial Stadium since the start of the 2004 campaign, outscoring its foes, 362-207 (11.3 to 6.5 gpg).
- Navy has not lost a Patriot League game at home in its four-plus years as a member of the conference.
- The Mids have allowed just four teams (Colgate in '07; Georgetown in '05; Ohio State and Johns Hopkins in '04) to reach double digits in games played on their home field over the last four seasons ... Navy has held 13 of its 31 opponents to five or fewer goals since 2004 in games played at home.
- Navy owns a 66-28 (.702) record at home under the direction of head coach Richie Meade ... the Mids have reached four wins at home every season Meade has been the head coach ... Navy has recorded five or more wins at home in six of Meade's 13-plus seasons, including seven wins in 2004, '05, '06 and '07.
