About the Camp Director



Camp Director **Dave Brandt** *Navy Men's Soccer Coach*

After amassing a 246-26-12 record, along with eight (8) College Cups and six (6) National Championships in 12 years at D-III Messiah, Brandt is quickly reshaping the Navy program into a contender for the Patriot League title. The Midshipmen followed a 7-5-4 mark in 2010, a season in which they received votes in the National Top 25 poll at mid-season and narrowly missed the Patriot League play-offs, with a 7-7-5 mark in 2011 and the program's first league playoff appearance since 2001. A narrow loss on penalty kicks after a 110-minute scoreless tie knocked the Midshipmen out of the semifinals. The team will return nine of 11 starters and almost all of its goal production from 2011 for the 2012 campaign. At Navy, Brandt has established the same possession and attack-oriented style of play that fueled Messiah's success and has made the Midshipmen into an exciting and entertaining team to watch. A popular clinician and teacher of the game, Brandt became well-known at the D-III level for taking players who flew under the recruiting radar of larger programs and developing them into top players.



Assistant Director **Derek Potteiger** *Navy Men's Assistant Coach*

As a player, Navy's top assistant has a long list of high-level accomplishments. A high school All-American and '02 Penn State graduate, Potteiger captained the Nittany Lions for three (3) years and earned All-Big Ten honors in each of his four (4) years. He was an All-American as a senior and was drafted by New England of the MLS. His professional career included stints with the Pittsburgh Riverhounds, Harrisburg City Islanders, and Cleveland City Stars – a team he captained to the USL 2 title in 2008.
