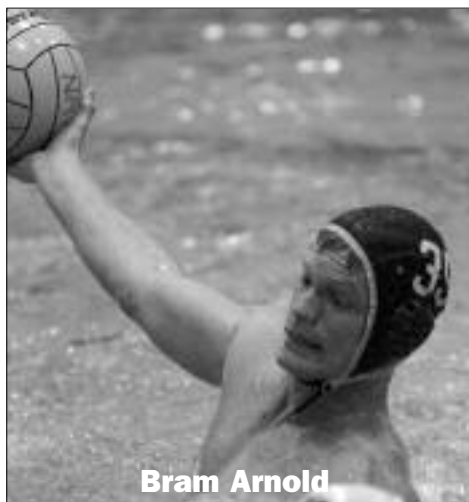

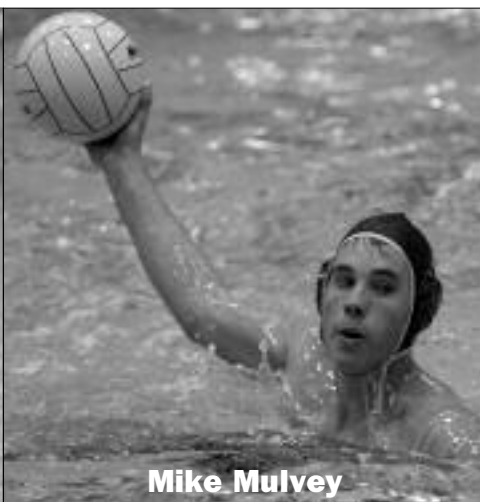

Mids Looking For Big Things in 2007

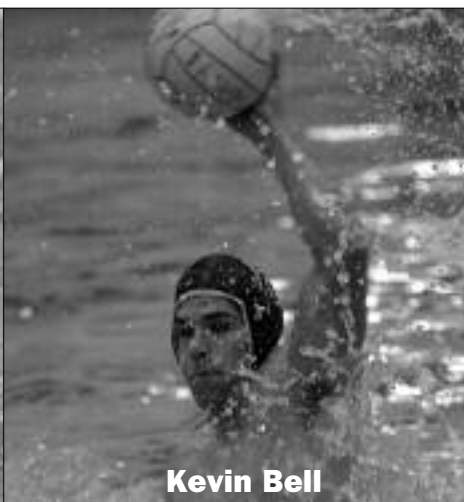
Fourteen returning letterwinners bolster Navy's attack in the pool.

Head coach Mike Schofield isn't one to mix words when previewing the upcoming season. He usually tells it like it is, good or bad.

That's why he speaks quite highly of his squad as it prepares for the 2007 season.

"All eight of our seniors are in a position to accomplish as much as any class in Navy water polo history," said Schofield, who enters year 23 on the Yard with 488 career wins. He needs just 12 wins to reach 500, which would make him the second coach all-time at Navy to win 500 games at the school (Baseball's Joe Duff -- 595 wins in 32 years from 1962-93). "They have a chance to leave a pretty big mark and we are counting on every single one of them to contribute to our success this year."

The reason for the optimism is that Schofield welcomes back 14 letterwinners, while losing just three, off last year's squad that went 24-7 and earned the school's 12th NCAA Tournament bid. The Mids went 24-3 against teams ranked outside the top four in the country (USC, California, Stanford and UCLA) and were 19-1 against teams from the East.

Leading the senior charge is a pair of returning NCAA All-Americans in Aaron Recko and George Naughton. Recko ended his year last year with third-team honors after scoring 89 points (70 g, 19 a). His 70 goals ranked ninth on the single-season list and were the second most for a Navy player since 1995.

Naughton, who will serve as the team captain, earned honorable mention All-American accolades after stopping 267 shots — the second-highest single-season total in school history.

Other key returnees from the senior class include Bram Arnold (57 g, 11 a), Andrew Bingham (4 g, 3 a), Eric Gardiner (14 g, 5 a), Tyler Hill (27 g, 13 a) and Reed MacKenzie (7 g, 5 a).

"Ever since they were sophomores, this class has been critical to everything we have done," said Schofield. "If we come in with the right attitude and understand what is there for us, we should be in good

shape. If we do that, everyone else will fall in line and want to follow their example.

"My job is to make sure that we stay hungry," added Schofield. "We had great chemistry last year, led by captain Todd Carlson, and it will be interesting to see if we can maintain that chemistry this year."

The junior class, led by Mike Mulvey, also appears headed for a big year as well.

"They are a very big part of anything we plan on doing this year," said Schofield. "This class boasts a lot of size, toughness and competitiveness. They have all put in a solid summer and shouldn't take a backseat to anybody."

Mulvey ranked second on the team last year with 82 points (44 g, 38 a), ranking seventh on the single-season assist list with 38. He was a member of the of the U.S. Junior National Team in the summer of 2006 and has played at a high level ever since his arrival at Navy two years ago.

Chuck Baker also had a strong year in the pool for Schofield a year ago, tallying 31 points (23 g, 8 a). Other key contributors will be John Connors (1 g, 6 a), Marek Malik (1 g, 2 a), Andrew Neuwirth (1 g, 4 a) and Dan Zoellick (6 g, 2 a).

Schofield is looking for a few members of the sophomore class to step up in 2007, after a relatively quiet freshman year. The group has ability, and Schofield feels now is the time to show it.

"We need a few of them to step up and contribute more this year," said Schofield. "We had some sophomores play for us last year, but I think they can produce more once they gain an understanding of the game and get some confidence. They just need to go out and produce now."

Of the sophomores, Kevin Bell saw the most action a year ago, appearing in 26 games and scoring 12 points (6 g, 6 a). Johnny Meiners was the only other freshman to play double-digit games, as he appeared in 19 games with nine points (7 g, 2 a). Zac Anderson and Joe Moffit also had outstanding summers and look to contribute as

well.

Schofield also expects some immediate help from the freshmen, but was hesitant to give any names.

"We have three or four guys that have a great shot at getting minutes," said Schofield. "There are a couple of guys that we feel that we can plug in right away and won't miss a beat with. This is a good class, but with such an experienced team, it may be tough for them to break in right away."

Navy will once again play one of the nation's most-difficult schedules. Appearing on the slate will be defending national champion California in the Navy Labor Day Open, a contest at Stanford, the NorCal Open and the Princeton Invitational. Last year's schedule consisted of 22-of-31 games against ranked foes, including seven games against the nation's top 12 teams. Schofield expects this year's schedule to go above and beyond that.

"This year's schedule is the most difficult we have had since I have been here," said Schofield. "We hold our own typically against teams ranked No. 5-20, but against the top four (USC, California, Stanford and UCLA), we haven't competed very well. We need to demonstrate the experience level that will put us in position to compete with those teams for the full four quarters. We are hoping with the experience on this year's team that we can raise our level of play and win some of those games."

Schofield also expects a tougher challenge from the East teams as well.

"It will be the usual suspects here in the East," said Schofield. "St. Francis, Princeton, Bucknell, Brown, Harvard and George Washington and Johns Hopkins all will be competitive this year. While I think we are the favorites, there are about eight teams that could beat us on any given day. We are going to have a bullseye on our back and we need to come out and play every game, and let the results take care of themselves."



Mike Schofield

23rd Year as Navy head coach - Pittsburgh (1979)

Career Record: 488-191-1

Mike Schofield returns for his 23rd season at the helm of the Navy water polo program.

Under his direction, the Mids have won seven Eastern Championships and competed in 12 NCAA Tournaments. Fifteen Navy athletes have earned All-America honors under Schofield.

Last year's team was one for the record books as Navy amassed a 24-7 record and won the program's seventh Eastern Championship. The 24 wins kept a remarkably consistent streak in tact, as the Navy water polo program has won at least 19 games in all 25 years since the program's resurrection in 1982. The 24 wins were tied for the seventh most in school history and Navy went 19-1 against teams from the East. The Mids also won 14 games in a row from Sept. 27 to Nov. 12, the fourth-longest streak in school history.

Schofield has had a long line of All-American athletes under his guidance. Last season, Aaron Recko and George Naughton received third-team and honorable mention accolades, respectively, running the All-American total to 21. It marked the eighth straight year that a Navy water polo player was named All-American, beginning with Jason Pace (HM) in 1999. Sean Foster (2nd) and Nick Hill (HM) followed up Pace's honor in 2000. Hill was named honorable mention twice more in 2001 and 2002. In 2003, Joe Donahue was a third-team

selection. Following Donahue, Patrick Rollo and Alex Ratcliffe were third-team selections in 2004 and 2005.



The Mids also succeed in the classroom as well. Led by Eric Gardiner's 4.00 GPA, one of six players nationally to record a 4.00, six Navy players were honored by the Collegiate Water Polo Association as having a 3.20 GPA or better. In all, nine players sported a 3.00 GPA or better.

Schofield is well recognized in the water polo community, having also coached on the international level, guiding the U.S. Water Polo Team at the 1997 World University Games to a fifth-place finish. He also served as an assistant for the 1992 National Team and as an assistant for the U.S. Water Polo Team that won gold medals at the World University Games in both 1991 and 1993.

The Midshipmen compete in the Collegiate Water Polo Association (CWPA), which consists of 20 schools divided into

northern and southern divisions. The southern division has been dominated by Navy, as it has won 19-of-25 divisional titles since 1982.

Schofield also directs the Naval Academy Aquatic Club, which produces some of the top young water polo players and swimmers in the country, many of whom have continued their careers at the Naval Academy.

Schofield graduated from Pittsburgh in 1979, where he was the captain of the water polo team and received most valuable player recognition. In 1982, Schofield arrived in Annapolis and assisted in resurrecting a water polo program that had been dormant for 32 years. He took over the head coaching duties in 1985, and his teams have enjoyed 15 20-plus win seasons, playing to an overall record of 464-184-1. Schofield has been named Eastern Coach of the Year seven times including last season (1982, 1984, 1986, 1990, 2000, 2003, 2006). In 2004, Schofield added National Coach of the Year to his resume, and in March of 2004 was inducted into the United States Water Polo Hall of Fame.

Mike, his wife, Gina, and their sons, Kevin (13) and Matthew (9), reside in Arnold, Md.



Mladen Stanicic **Assistant Coach** **Third Year at Navy**

Mladen Stanicic returns for his third season of his second stint as Navy water polo assistant coach. Stanicic began coaching at Navy in 1987.

"It would be hard to list all of the areas of our program that Mladen has helped make better- he does great work with our goalies, our shooters, our young guys, and runs much of our extra man offense," said head coach Mike Schofield. "Administratively, he is very skilled and has a great feel for every aspect of our program."

After immigrating to the United States, he briefly volunteered as a coach for the Fordham University men's water polo team. After relocating to Annapolis, Stanicic joined the Naval Academy Aquatics Club as a coach. He also volunteered with the men's varsity team as an assistant coach, particularly in 1988, helping the Mids to win the Eastern Championship and participate at the NCAA tournament.

He continued in his role as volunteer coach with varying degrees of engagement. After 1988, he specialized in coaching the Navy goalkeepers.

Throughout the years following 1988, Stanicic continued to work with the Naval Academy Aquatic Club and led both men's and women's teams to several national championships including the Women's Open in 1999 and multiple-age group titles in 20 and under, 18 and under, 16 and under and 14 and under competitions.

He earned a bachelor's degree at the University of Split at Zadar, Croatia, in 1981.

Mladen and his wife, Miriam, are the parents of Maro (27) and Blaise (20). Miriam serves as the USNA Director of Community Relations.

Both Miriam and Mladen are also highest-level interpreters and translators with U.S. Government, including the Department of Defense. Their assignments have included interpreting for U.S. and foreign heads of state, Secretaries of State, Secretaries of Defense and Chiefs of Defense. Their translating work included non-proliferation and export control treaties.

Maro is a former Naval Academy Aquatic Club swimmer and water polo player and Blaise is one of the NAAC current standouts. In 2005, Blaise became a member of the U.S. Junior National Team. Last year, while competing at the University of Maryland, Blaise was the team's third-leading scorer, and will serve as the team captain as a junior. Maryland is coached by former Navy assistant Carl Salyer.



Cmdr. Tom Popp, USN **Vol. Assistant Coach** **First Year at Navy**

Cmdr. Tom Popp, USN, returns to Navy water polo after an 18-year hiatus as a volunteer assistant coach and team officer representative. He is assigned to Navy as an instructor in the Aerospace Engineering

Department.

A native of San Jose, California, Popp was a two-time high school water polo All-American at Bellarmine College Preparatory under legendary coach Larry Rogers. While playing for Navy under Coach Schofield from 1985-88, Popp helped lead Navy to three Eastern Division Championships (1986-1988) and three NCAA tournament appearances. A two-time MVP of the Eastern Division (1987, 1988), he also earned All-American Honorable Mention in 1987 and third-team All-American honors in 1988. As a senior, Popp was awarded the Naval Academy Athletic Association Sword for Men in 1989, presented to "that man of the graduating class who is considered by the Association's Athletic Council to have personally excelled in men's athletics during his years of varsity competition."

During this same period, Popp also participated on the U.S. Men's Junior National Team (1985-87), traveling to several European competitions, the Junior Pan-American Games in Ponce, Puerto Rico, and the 19 & Under World Championships in Sao Paulo, Brazil. Following his senior NCAA season, Tom trained with the U.S. Men's National Team from 1989 through April 1991.

After graduating in 1989 with a bachelor of science in Aerospace Engineering, Cmdr. Popp completed naval flight officer training and qualified as an E-2C Hawkeye aircraft mission commander. In January 1995, following deployments aboard the USS Kitty Hawk aircraft carrier, Cmdr. Popp enacted orders to the Naval Postgraduate School in Monterey, Calif., and was selected as a U.S. Naval Test Pilot School (USNTPS) Cooperative program student. Upon graduating from USNTPS at NAS Patuxent River, Md., in December 1997, Cmdr. Popp was awarded a Masters degree in Aerospace Engineering, transitioned to the Aerospace Engineering Duty Officer community, and flight tested several new E-2C advanced avionics systems.

After his test squadron duty, Cmdr. Popp served on the staff of Commander U.S. Naval Air Forces Pacific Fleet (COMNAVAIRPAC) at NAS North Island in Coronado, Calif., (February 2000 to April 2002). He returned to NAS Patuxent River in May 2002 as the AEDO Community Manager within Naval Air Systems Command. Subsequently, he assumed the T-45 Integrated Product Team (IPT) lead for the Naval Undergraduate Training Systems program office (PMA-273) in 2004 before returning to his alma mater in May 2007.

Tom, his wife, Ruth (formerly Ruth Chasen (Navy '89)), and their five daughters, Frances (16), Naomi (14), Hannah (11), Mary (7), and Ellen (2) reside in Arnold, Md.

2007 NAVY WATER POLO

The Collegiate Water Polo Association originally began as the Mid Atlantic Conference, founded by Dick Russell (Bucknell University swimming & water polo coach) in the 1970's. Its founding membership included teams from Maryland, Pennsylvania, New Jersey, and New York.

The leadership and management of the organization relied on volunteer coaches until 1990, when it hired a commissioner to perform basic scheduling for the 15 member teams. Officiating assignments at the time were performed by an independent organization called the Eastern Water Polo Referees Association (EWPPRA).

The next major milestone occurred in 1993, when the Southern and New England Conferences merged into the Mid Atlantic. The new structure combined all of the varsity teams in the East, along with the few sport clubs in existence at that time.

During the 1995 season, the conference received its first major challenge, as the organization experienced a strike by its officiating core. This strike ultimately resulted in the organization establishing its own officiating bureau, assuming responsibility for all of its officiating assignments. The conference hired Tere Ma as its inaugural Director of Officials and Loren Bertocci as its first Technical Director. These two individuals laid the groundwork for the Officiating Bureau that exists today.

NAVAL ACADEMY

ANNAPOLIS

The City of Annapolis has been home to the Naval Academy for all but four years since the founding of the school in 1845 on the grounds of what originally was the Army's Fort Severn. The Academy moved its location to Newport, Rhode Island, from 1861-1865 during the Civil War.

ANCHORS AWEIGH

"Anchors Aweigh" was written by Lt. Charles Zimmerman, musical director of the Naval Academy, in 1906, with the lyrics provided by Alfred H. Miles '06 as a fight song for the 1907 graduating class. The song made its debut at the 1906 Army-Navy game and when the Mids won, the song became traditional at the contest.

Stand Navy down the field,
Sails set to the sky,
We'll never change our course,
So Army you steer shy.
Roll up the score, Navy,
Anchors Aweigh,
Sail Navy down the field,
And sink the Army,
sink the Army Grey

BANCROFT HALL

Named after the former Secretary of the Navy (1845-46) and founder of the Naval Academy George Bancroft, Bancroft Hall serves as the dormitory for the entire Brigade of Midshipmen. Its 33 acres of floor space and nearly five miles of hallways makes it one of the largest dorms in the world.

BRIGADE OF MIDSHIPMEN

The 4,200-member student body at the Naval Academy is called the Brigade of Midshipmen.

The Brigade is organized into ...

- 2 regiments
- 6 battalions
- 30 companies

BILL THE GOAT

The first recorded use of a goat as the mascot for Navy teams was in 1893 when an animal named El Cid (the Chief) was presented to the Brigade by officers of the USS New York. El Cid helped Navy to a 6-4 win over Army that year and a goat became the permanent mascot of the Academy in 1904.



BLUE & GOLD

Now, colleges from sea to sea
May sing of colors true;
But who has better right than we

CLASS RANKS

First-year students at the Naval Academy are referred to as "plebes" during their initial or "Fourth Class" year in school, while sophomores at Navy, members of the "Third Class," are called "youngsters." Juniors at the school are designated as "Second Class," with seniors called "Firsties" in reference to their "First Class" year.

CO-ED

Women were first admitted to the Naval Academy during the summer of 1976. Today, women comprise roughly 15 percent of the student body.

COMMISSIONED OFFICERS

When a student graduates from the Naval Academy, they have the option to enter either the Navy or the Marine Corps as an officer. If they choose to join the Navy, they are commissioned as Ensigns, while those entering the Marine Corps are given the rank of Second Lieutenant.

JOHN PAUL JONES

The crypt of John Paul Jones, considered America's first naval leader and hero, is located below the Naval Academy Chapel.

The native of Scotland was born in 1747, and travelled to the colonies to assist America during the Revolutionary War. His ship never lost a battle as he reached a rank of captain in the Continental Navy.

Jones died in 1792 in Paris, France, and was buried there. His remains were returned to the United States in 1905 and he was interred at the Naval Academy eight years later.

MARINE CORPS

Those officers entering the Marine Corps have the choice of service selecting one of the following fields ...

- Aviation -- air command and control, anti-air warfare, aviation maintenance, aviation supply, pilot, naval flight officer.
- Ground -- armor, artillery, communications (information systems), engineering, financial management, infantry*, logistics, military police



MIDSHIPMAN

The original 17th Century meaning of the word "midshipsmen" designated those men who stood watch "amidships", or in the middle portion of a ship. The middle "s" was later dropped to give the current form of the word.

Midshipmen were originally young boys who were apprenticed to sea captains to learn the trade.

In the early days of the Navy, midshipmen were trained aboard ship until they were commissioned as ensigns.

NAVY

Graduates of the Naval Academy entering the Navy have the following service options available to them ...

- Aviation -- flight officer, pilot
- Nuclear Propulsion -- ships, submarines
- Restricted Line and Staff Corps -- civil engineering, cryptology, intelligence, maintenance, medicine, meteorology/oceanography, supply
- Special Operations -- explosive ordinance disposal, explosive ordinance management, mine countermeasures, operational diving and salvage,
- Navy SEALs
- Surface Warfare -- conventional, nuclear powered
- Submarines



NICKNAME

The official nickname for all of Navy's athletic teams is Midshipmen. "Mids" is an appropriate nickname, while "Middie" is inappropriate.

N-STAR

Members of varsity teams who qualify for the varsity letter receive an N-Star for their letter sweaters if they participate in a victory over Army in any sport-designated Star Game.

The varsity N and corresponding N-Star were initiated during the early 1890s.

SCHOOL COLORS

Each class at the Naval Academy produced their own set of class colors until 1892 when Navy Blue and Gold were established as the official colors for the entire Naval Academy.

SUMMER TRAINING

Summers remain a busy and challenging time of year for midshipmen. Their initial tenure at the Naval Academy begins around July 1 prior to the start of the freshman year at the school with "Plebe Summer." Instead of taking academic classes, plebes receive military indoctrination and learn basic seamanship and sailing.

The summer following plebe year is spent aboard various ships to gain knowledge and experience of the workings of the Navy. Included in this time is a three-week cruise aboard either a 44-foot Naval Academy sailboat or a Yard Patrol craft traveling on the East Coast.

Portions of the summer before the start of a second-class year is spent visiting bases of both the Navy and the Marine Corps. That leads up to the next summer when midshipmen join an operational unit of the Navy or Marine Corps for several weeks. In addition, rising firsties also begin to accept leadership roles at either the Naval Academy for plebe summer, the Naval Academy Prep School (Newport, R.I.) or aboard a yard patrol or sailing cruise.

TECUMSEH

Tecumseh is the Native American figurehead which has been facing Bancroft Hall since 1866.

The statue originally was the figurehead of the USS Delaware and named after Tamanend, a Delaware chief. The name was later changed to Tecumseh after a Shawnee chieftain who lived from 1768-1813.

The original wooden statue was replaced after 50 years by the current bronze version.

Tecumseh is painted prior to football games and during Commissioning Week he is adorned with the shoulder boards of a Navy ensign on one side and that of a Marine Corps second lieutenant on the other.

THE YARD

"The Yard" is another name for the grounds of the Naval Academy. Originally just 10 acres, The Yard has grown to a size of 338 acres.

IN THE CLASSROOM

MAJORS

Students at the Naval Academy can select one of 43 different majors within the following 19 fields of study:

Division of Engineering & Weapons

Aerospace Engineering, Electrical Engineering, General Engineering, Mechanical Engineering, Naval Architecture, Ocean Engineering, Systems Engineering

Division of Math & Science

Chemistry, Computer Science, General Science, Information Technology, Math, Oceanography, Physics, Quantitative Economics

Division of Humanities & Social Science

Economics, English, History, Political Science

In addition to graduating with a Bachelor's of Science, students can also attain a minor in one of seven different languages.

GRADUATE SCHOOL

There are no graduate school classes offered at the Naval Academy, but opportunities for midshipmen to attain a postgraduate degree at a civilian school or university are available. The ability to attend medical school, as former Navy football player **Terrence Anderson '00** did, is another option.

In addition to furthering their education at schools across the country, students at the Naval Academy annually are in competition for one of the prestigious Rhodes Scholarships to study at the University of Oxford in England.

Since Navy's first Rhodes Scholar, E. Van Meter '28, a total of 43 Naval Academy graduates have received the Rhodes Scholarship, including 10 over the last six years. Among Navy's recent recipients is former baseball player **Trevor Thompson '05**.

COSIDA ACADEMIC ALL-AMERICANS

Naval Academy student-athletes have been selected as an Academic All-American by the College Sports Information Directors of America 44 times over the years, with Mids garnering 18 awards since 2000.

The list of recent honorees includes two-time Academic All-American **Courtney Davidson** (women's basketball, 2003 & '04), first-team recipient **Trevor Thompson** (baseball, 2005), and third-team honorees Sean Blackman (gymnastics, 2006) and Kirsten Andrews (cross country/track & field, 2006).

Navy student-athletes garnered a pair of Academic All-America awards last season with women's soccer players Lizzie Barnes (first team) and **Kari Weniger** (second team) earning recognition.

ACADEMIC PROGRESS RATES

The APR is the fulcrum upon which the entire academic-reform structure rests. Developed as a more real-time assessment of teams' academic performance than the six-year graduation-rate calculation provides, the APR awards two points each term to student-athletes who meet academic-eligibility standards and who remain with the institution. A team's APR is the total points earned by the team at a given time divided by the total points possible.
