MIDS LOOK TO BUILD ON SUCCESS

The 2004-05 edition of the Navy wrestling team was by all means, a successful campaign. The Mids finished with a 12-3 dual-meet record, finished third at the EIWA Tournament and sent six wrestlers to the NCAA Championships for the first time since 1991.

However, Head Coach Bruce Burnett wants more and thinks he can get it with this year's group.

Last year's team was successful, but we didn't accomplish what we wanted to, said Burnett. Our goal remains the same win the EIWA Championship and have NCAA All-Americans. We didn't do that last year.

With a solid mix of returning EIWA placewinners and a talented freshman class, Burnett hopes that this year's squad can get over the hump.

The team made a great commitment to working hard and getting better in the off-season, and the senior class is ready to step up and keep this program moving forward, said Burnett. We're getting close to where we want to be in terms of national recognition, but we have to make the next step. That's what this group has to do.

Everyone wants to win and be successful and we aren't going to stray from what we have done in the past, said Burnett. We are always going to have to prove ourselves and be committed to get to the next level. One of the benefits of coaching at the Naval Academy is that we have a lot of good athletes that are very committed to getting better.

Below is a weight-by-weight breakdown for the upcoming season.

125:

Junior Alex Usztics returns after posting an 18-14 record a year ago, including a 4-2 record in dual meets. Usztics fell one match short of placing at the EIWA Tournament. However, with another year of seasoning,

Usztics could make a push at a solid placing in the EIWA's.

Usztics is a grinder and will be counted on more so this year, said Burnett. He has gotten better every year and we hope he can continue that trend this year.

Senior Mike Kohler, sophomore Matt Beck and freshman Adam Shemon figure to push Usztics for the starting spot. Kohler was 2-5 last year, but has improved significantly from last year. Beck was just 0-2 in 2004-05, but has very good tools and Shemon was fourth in 2004 at the Minnesota State Tournament.

Freshman Caleb Levee also plans to be in the mix after a stellar prep career in

Louisiana. Levee finished last season ranked in the nation's top 30, won the Louisiana state title and was the state's winner of the Dave Shultz Award awarded by the National Wrestling Hall of Fame. The award is based equally on outstanding wrestling success, scholastic achievement and citizenship or community service.

133:

An interesting race sets up at 133. Junior Brad Canterbury is one option after posting a 13-7 record at 125 pounds last year. He wrestled the majority of his matches before the holiday break before an injury and weight issues sidelined him for the rest of the year.

Freshman Joe Baker went 0-2 at 125 pounds last year, before suffering a season-ending shoulder injury.

Sophomore Branden Beasley spent 2004-05 as Sam Grays backup and was 15-10 last year, posting five wins by major decision.

141:

Two-time NCAA qualifier Nate Gulosh has graduated, but several Mids have stepped up and appear poised to fill his shoes.

Sophomore Spencer Manley had a solid year as Gulosh's backup, posting a 12-9 record with two wins coming by fall.

Senior Chris Miosi was 9-8 in 2004-05 and has the experience needed to fill the spot.

149:

Junior John Cox returns after an outstanding 2004-05 season that saw him win 29 matches and advance to his first NCAA Tournament as a EIWA wild-card selection. Cox enters the year at No. 13 in the preseason *Amateur Wrestling News* rankings the highest-ranked EIWA wrestler in the weight class.

He has worked very hard in the off-season and we are expecting big things from

him this year, said Burnett. He wrestled a lot of matches in the offseason and we are hoping for a breakthrough year for him.

A host of wrestlers figure to be Cox's backup.

Senior Matt Gulosh is also an option. The younger Gulosh wrestled at the 2003 EIWA Tournament at 141 pounds and has been in-and-out of the lineup since. Gulosh comes from a strong wrestling family, as his older brother, Nate, qualified for the last two NCAA Championships at 141 pounds while at the Academy.

Freshman Ricky Tippett is a two-time Maryland state champion, sophomore Justin Jacobs, who went 9-4 last year, won three Michigan state championships, sophomore Joe Butcher and freshman Anthony Laurita, who placed four times at the Colorado state meet, all figure to push for time.

157:

Senior Adam Brochetti appears to have a grip on the competition at 157 pounds. The Kittanning, Pa., native was injured off-and-on last year, but is now healthy and in shape for the upcoming season. He posted an 18-9 record last year, but was unable to wrestle during the last month of the season.

Several Mids figure to battle for the starting spot. John Jarred was 4-2 at 165 pounds last year, but is dropping down to 157 this year. Sophomore Chris Rossi is extremely talented, but hasn't wrestled for a year after not attending the Academy a year ago. Freshman Joel Ahern

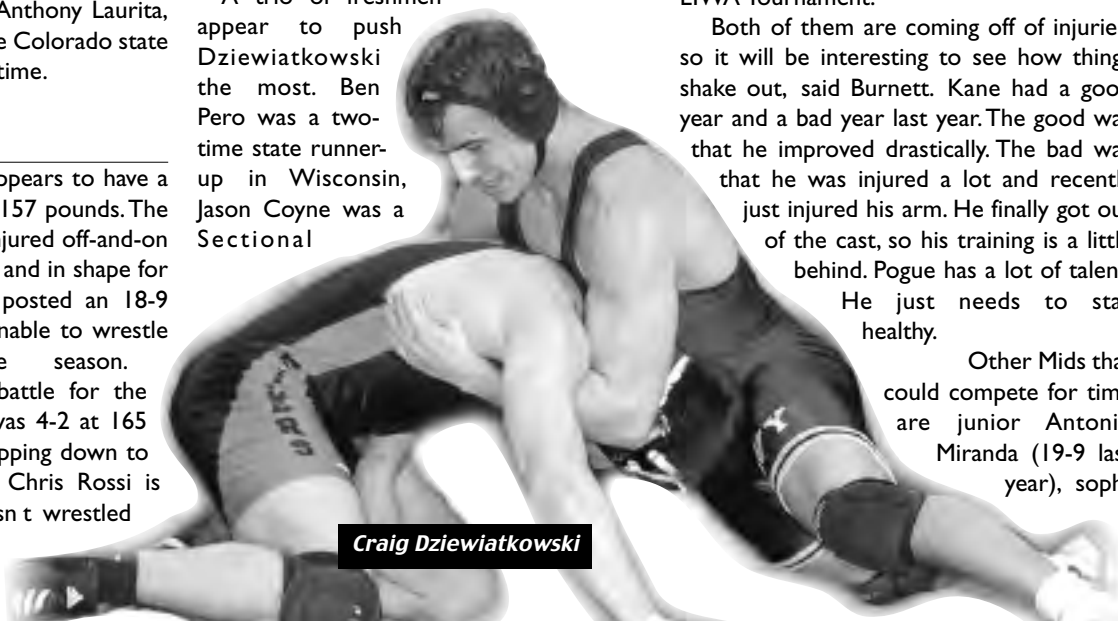
has very good skills but lacks the experience.

165:

Senior Craig Dziewiatkowski emerged from a mid-season battle last year to come out of nowhere and finish third at the EIWA meet, earning an automatic bid to the NCAA tournament. Dziewiatkowski finished with a 29-14 mark last year and enters the season ranked 17th in the preseason *Amateur Wrestling News* poll.

Craig is obviously the frontrunner, said Burnett. He has trained hard and looks very strong. He should have another very good year.

A trio of freshmen appear to push Dziewiatkowski the most. Ben Pero was a two-time state runner-up in Wisconsin, Jason Coyne was a Sectional

champion in Pennsylvania and Kenneth Lee was a two-time placewinner at the national Prep Tournament. Lee, however, suffered an injury during plebe summer and will be held up until healthy. Sophomore Robert Johnston will also be in the mix.

174:

Sophomore Matt Stolpinski returns after one of the best freshman campaigns in school history. He finished 25-17 last year with a sixth-place finish in the EIWA Tournament. His 25 wins as a freshman are the fourth most by a freshman in school history. To top it off, Stolpinski had a strong off-season as he just missed placing at University Nationals.

He's the kind of wrestler that makes me a better coach, said Burnett. He works so hard and wants to be as good as he can be. We are expecting a really big year from him.

A pair of freshman, Jesse Feinsod and Casey Caldwell appear to be in line to be Stolpinski's backup. Feinsod was a two-time Colorado state champion and Caldwell was an Indiana state runner-up with a 47-1 record in 2005.

184:

Both of Navy's top wrestlers at 184 pounds are back in Jon Kane and Chris Pogue.

Kane was the starter for most of last year, but an injury sidelined him right before the EIWA Tournament. Kane posted a 26-12 record and won the All-Academy Tournament as the third seed. Pogue was 9-8 and was one match shy of placing at the EIWA Tournament.

Both of them are coming off of injuries, so it will be interesting to see how things shake out, said Burnett. Kane had a good year and a bad year last year. The good was that he improved drastically. The bad was that he was injured a lot and recently just injured his arm. He finally got out of the cast, so his training is a little behind. Pogue has a lot of talent.

He just needs to stay healthy.

Other Mids that could compete for time are junior Antonio Miranda (19-9 last year), soph-

omore Matt Parsons (11-10 last year) and freshman Scott Steele.

197:

Senior Andrew Adams appears to have a stronghold at 197 pounds after an outstanding offseason. Adams was 22-9 as a backup to NCAA qualifier Thayer Paxton last year, but appears ready to pick up where Paxton left off. Adams advanced to the quarter-finals of the U.S.

National Championships in April, defeating two 2005 All-Americans in the process.

Other Mids expected to contribute include sophomore Chris Cottrell and freshman Tyler Moyer.

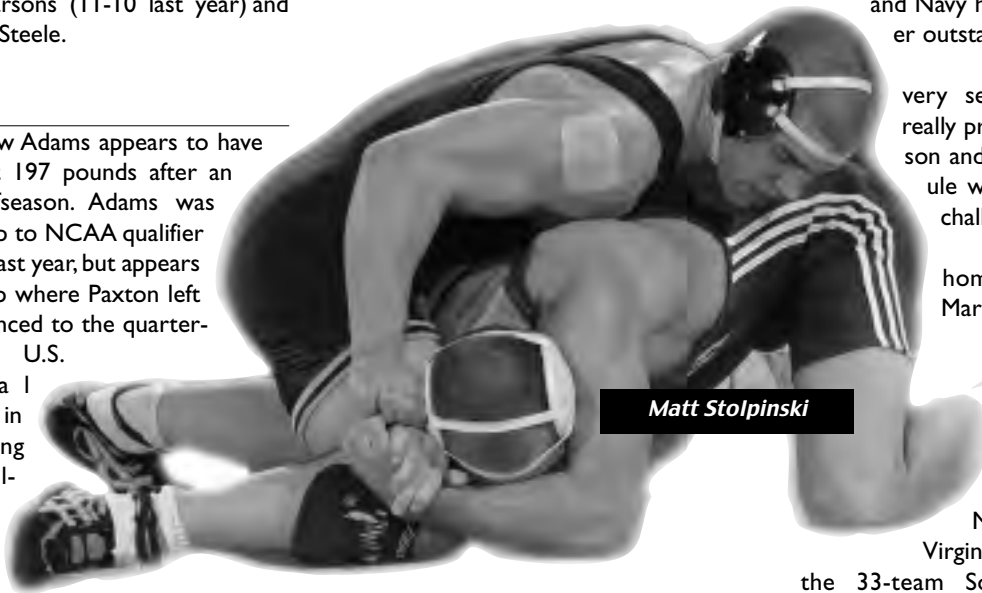
HEAVYWEIGHT:

Besides being Navy's best bet for an All-American in 2005-06, Tanner Garrett has been voted as the team captain. It's a role that Burnett thinks Garrett will excel in.

He has done an outstanding job getting everyone on the same page and getting people to work hard in the room, said Burnett. We are looking for big things from him on and off the mat.

Garrett enters the year ranked No. 7 in the preseason *Amateur Wrestling News* poll after posting a 35-5 record last year. He advanced to the round of 16 at the NCAA Tournament and his 35 wins tied for the seventh-most in school history. Garrett needs just 29 wins for 100 in his career, and would become the sixth wrestler in school history to reach that mark if he can get there.

Garrett will be backed up by a pair of skilled underclassmen. Sophomore Ed Prendergast was 10-8 as a freshman last year, while freshman Matt Intocchia was third at the National Prep Tournament in 2003.

and Navy has pieced together another outstanding schedule.

I take the scheduling very seriously, said Burnett. It really prepares us for the postseason and we feel this year's schedule will do that. It will be very challenging.

The Mids will wrestle at home against Penn State, Maryland and Army giving the fans a chance to see some of the nation's best teams and some of Navy's biggest rivals. Navy will also see powers Lehigh, Cornell, Minnesota, Missouri,

Virginia Tech and Edinboro at the 33-team Southern Scuffle in late December, which is quickly becoming one of the nation's premier wrestling tournaments. The Mids will also compete in the West Virginia Open, giving backups an opportunity to get some matches under their belts.

It's important for us to get our reserves some matches as well, said Burnett. In the event of injuries, they have to be ready to go, and be able to compete and win in the EIWA Tournament. The only way they can do that is to get experience.

We want to succeed and get better as a team, added Burnett. But the only way to do that is through sacrifice and hard work. This team has been willing to do that. That's a good start to take it to the next level. We'll continue to move forward and hopefully we'll continue to climb the ladder in the NCAA rankings.

SCHEDULE:

The schedule continues to be a challenge for the Mids, where as many as seven dual meets could come against nationally-ranked foes. Cal State-Bakersfield, UC-Davis, Penn State, Tennessee-Chattanooga, Purdue, Lehigh and Army all figure to be in or around the top 25.

Throw in the 33-team Southern Scuffle, the Penn State Open, the All-Academy Championships and the EIWA Tournament,

2004-05 RECAP

Season Recap...

¥The Navy wrestling team enjoyed one of its best seasons in the last 15 years with a third-place finish at the EIWA Tournament, sending six wrestlers to the NCAA Championships for the first time since 1991. Eight different Mids won 25 matches for the first time ever. Navy defeated Army, 23-10, in the N-Star Meet for the fifth time in a row, and now hold an incredible 37-1-5 mark against the Black Knights in the last 43 matches. Lastly, Navy also claimed the Navy Classic title for the first time since 1996 and placed third in the prestigious 23-team Southern Scuffle in late December.

In the Record Books...

¥Several Midshipmen found their way into the Navy all-time record books. The most-decorated wrestler was Sam Gray. The graduated senior finished his career in the top ten for career wins (10th, 91) and matches (3rd, 143) and was 14th on the career pins list (22).

¥Thayer Paxton concluded his career as one of 24 wrestlers with at least 75 career wins, finishing 19th on the list with 79. He tied for 10th on the career falls list with 24.

¥Nate Gulosh joined Paxton in the 75-win club with 77, good for a tie for 20th.

¥Tanner Garrett's 35 wins last season were good enough for a tie for seventh on the single-season victory chart.

¥John Cox's 29 wins as a sophomore and 49 wins in his first two years were fourth on those respective lists.

¥Lastly, Matt Stolpinski's 25 victories were the fourth most in school history by a freshman.

Carrying Its Weight...

¥There is no secret where a lot of Navy's success came last year at the top weights. The three starters at 184 (Jon Kane), 197 (Thayer Paxton) and heavyweight (Tanner Garrett) posted a combined 93-24 record with two NCAA Tournament berths. The trio combined for 17 falls, a 29-6 dual-meet record and 110 dual-meet points. They also combined for six tournament championships throughout the season.

At the NCAA s...

¥Navy had mixed success at the 75th NCAA Wrestling Championships. Navy qualified over half of its lineup for the tournament and responded by scoring 12 points, good for 33rd place. Five of the six wrestlers won at least one match, and the lone participant who didn't, Craig Dziewiatkowski, lost two matches by a combined four points to a pair of nationally-ranked foes. Tanner Garrett led the way with a 3-2 mark while Sam Gray went 2-2. Nate Gulosh, John Cox and Thayer Paxton all went 1-2. Garrett and Gray were among the final 16 wrestling in their respective weight classes. Both of Garrett's losses came by one point to nationally-ranked opponents.

Domination in Tournaments...

¥The Navy wrestling team had a large amount of success in several tournaments it competed in in 2004-05. Aside from its best finish at the EIWA Tournament in nine years, the Mids also won titles at the Navy Classic for the first time since 1996 and at the All-Academy Championships. The A-A title was the third in a row as Bruce Burnett's squad won five individual titles. Navy also finished third at the 23-team Southern Scuffle in late December. Over the course of the year, Navy wrestlers won 12 individual titles at tournaments.

Sam Gray finished his career tied for 10th on the career victories list with 91 and his 143 matches were the third most in school history.

THE NAVAL ACADEMY ATHLETIC ASSOCIATION

The Naval Academy Athletic Association (NAAA), founded in 1891 by Robert Means Thompson, is a non-profit organization whose objective is to promote, support and assist in financing the athletic contests of the Midshipmen of the United States Naval Academy in accordance with the policy of the Superintendent of the Academy.

Through an intercollegiate athletic program, which is one of the largest in the country, and a highly-organized intramural and club sports program run by the Naval Academy, each midshipman is afforded the opportunity to compete in athletics at a level commensurate with his or her abilities. The emphasis on physical fitness is borne out in the first line of the mission of the Naval Academy: To develop midshipmen morally, mentally and physically.

The NAAA's presence on the grounds of the Naval Academy was established by Public Law 75-50 of March 26, 1938. Under the terms of that law, the Superintendent of the Academy was authorized to accept gifts and bequests of money from the Navy Athletic Association (as the NAAA was then named) and the Naval Institute to use that money to construct a building for use as a United States Naval Academy Museum on land owned by the United States. Thus, Preble Hall was erected at the Naval Academy. That same public law authorized the Secretary of the Navy to accept the building and to use and maintain such building as the Naval Academy Museum and for the administrative offices of the Navy Athletic Association and the Naval Institute. NAAA later moved to Ricketts Hall.

NAAA funds are generated through admissions charged for intercollegiate athletic contests, appearances by Navy teams on television, from dues and gifts from members of the association and from interest on invested funds. All revenue received by the NAAA is committed to the support of the Academy's intercollegiate athletic program.

The NAAA arranges the schedules for intercollegiate athletics, including the 30 varsity sports (21 for men, nine for women) and nine plebe/junior varsity teams, provides coaching staffs and equipment and maintains a central office to handle the administrative details of the athletic program.

The NAAA is governed by an Athletic Board of Control composed of seven members, chaired by the Commandant of Midshipmen, and reporting to the Superintendent of the Academy. The other members are the President (Director of Athletics) and Vice President of the NAAA (Deputy Director of Athletics), two members of the faculty and staff at the Naval Academy as appointed by the Superintendent; an Officer Representative for a varsity athletic team, who shall be recommended by the Director of Athletics and appointed by the Commandant of Midshipmen; and the Institutional Athletic Representative to the NCAA who shall be appointed by the Superintendent.

All negotiations, plans, appointments and acts of the NAAA which affect the Naval Academy athletic program are subject to the review and approval of the NAAA Board of Control and the Superintendent of the Naval Academy.

The NAAA is headed by the Director of Athletics and his staff members which include the Deputy Director of Athletics (an active duty Naval Officer), the Associate Directors of Athletics and Assistant Directors of Athletics, who are responsible for the finances of the association, compliance with NCAA rules, promotion and publicity, operations, scheduling, admissions and academic support of the intercollegiate athletic program.

Membership in the NAAA can be obtained by joining our Blue & Gold Club. Currently there are 6,500 alumni, naval officers and

friends of Navy athletics. The membership was opened to all interested parties in the early 1980s. In 2004 it changed its name to "The Blue & Gold". The intention and mission of this vehicle for giving remains the same, as has been the case for more than 113 years - supporting the Brigade of Midshipmen in intercollegiate athletics.

The mission is simple: We expect to win in everything we do - on and off the field of competition. The Blue & Gold provides the supplemental resources necessary to assist our coaches and midshipmen to realistically pursue the highest level of success with the context of their physical challenges. We are an institution invested in a mission that educates future leaders in moral, mental and physical excellence. The Blue & Gold enables our midshipmen to pursue the highest goals possible as members of varsity or junior varsity teams.

The Naval Academy Athletic Association operates and maintains the Navy-Marine Corps Memorial Stadium and the Naval Academy Golf Course and coordinates the use of such other athletic facilities as Alumni Hall for basketball; Halsey Field House for track and field and wrestling; Lejeune Hall for swimming, water polo and wrestling; Macdonough Hall for gymnastics and volleyball; Bishop Stadium for baseball; Ingram Field for track and field; the Glenn Warner Soccer Stadium and Rip Miller field, an all-purpose practice facility used by lacrosse and football.

Since 1924, the NAAA has invested in many permanent projects at the Naval Academy. The NAAA's interests relate not only to athletics, but to the overall quality of life enhancing the training and development of the Midshipmen

BEAT ARMY!

At the Naval Academy, beating Army is important. Plebes yell "Beat Army!" in Bancroft Hall, "Beat Army" is on every weight in the Naval Academy weight room and alums and fans alike scream "Beat Army!" at the end of Blue & Gold, the Naval Academy alma mater.

Navy has dominated Army over the last 30-plus years, posting a winning record against the Black Knights 31 of the last 34 years and winning the N-star series nine-consecutive years.

Over the past eight years the Midshipmen have won 67 percent of all athletic contests played against West Point, including an astounding 70 percent of all N-Star contests.

Taj Mathews closed out his career against his arch rival by scoring a career-high 26 points and leading Navy to an 84-69 Star Game victory over Army, Navy's 12th in the last 13 played. Mathews broke the Navy record for most three-pointers made (6) and attempted (14) in an Army-Navy contest.



Navy defeated Army in the outdoor season in dramatic fashion with the meet decided by the final event of the day. The 4x400-meter relay team defeated the Black Knights by four seconds and anchorman, plebe William Ricks, captivated the audience with a salute as he ran through the finish line.



Aubra Thomas has yet to lose an individual or relay race against Army, putting together a two-year 6-0 individual mark to go along with a 2-0 relay record. Thomas claimed wins last season in the 100 and 200-yard breaststroke events, along with the 200-yard individual medley. The victory over Army extended Navy's win streak to 16 straight over the Black Knights.





Led by the senior class, the Navy rifle team captured its 12th-consecutive N-Star against Army. Matt Albright, the recipient of Navy's 2005 Sword for Men, was the Mids' highest scorer in both the smallbore (587) and air rifle (586).

MIDSHIPMEN IN THE COMMUNITY

One of the challenges we continue to face is helping our children understand the importance of education and helping them realize that lofty goals are attainable. With an increasing number of collegiate athletes dropping out of school early to pursue lucrative contracts in the professional arena, we are left with the question "who are our children's role models?"

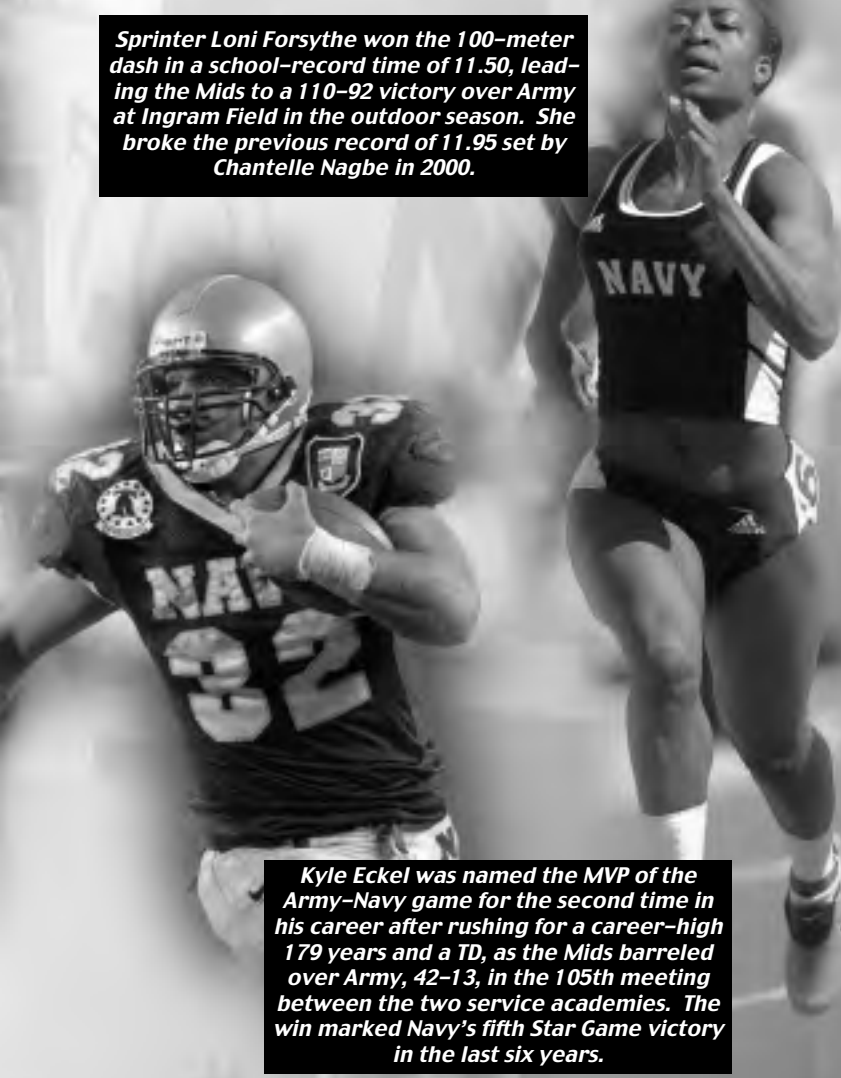
At the United States Naval Academy, the Midshipmen have to balance the rigorous requirements of education, athletics and basic military training. With Navy athletes competing at the Division I level, the demands of their sports heighten the importance of maintaining solid grades. Navy is one of the few Division I schools in which all athletes must meet stringent academic expectations. This is what makes our Midshipmen such tremendous role models, successfully maintaining that balance between athletics and academics at a highly competitive level.

The Naval Academy Athletic Association works with local schools to expose youth to the Midshipmen, with the hope of providing a lasting impression.

Typically, in assembly style, the Midshipmen speak to the students about life at the Academy, the experiences of competing in Division I athletics and what they've learned while at Navy, in addition to answering the multitude of questions that the students have.



Sprinter Loni Forsythe won the 100-meter dash in a school-record time of 11.50, leading the Mids to a 110-92 victory over Army at Ingram Field in the outdoor season. She broke the previous record of 11.95 set by Chantelle Nagbe in 2000.



Kyle Eckel was named the MVP of the Army-Navy game for the second time in his career after rushing for a career-high 179 yards and a TD, as the Mids barreled over Army, 42-13, in the 105th meeting between the two service academies. The win marked Navy's fifth Star Game victory in the last six years.



For just the third time in the history of the two programs, Army and Navy met twice on the lacrosse field with the Mids claiming wins in both contests. Navy's midfield dominated in both contests with second-year starter Billy Looney a star in the Star Game win. Looney scored Navy's final two goals to seal the Mids eighth-straight N-Star.

THE ARMY-NAVY RIVALRY

There are few rivalries in all of sports that compare to that of Army-Navy. On the mat, Army-Navy wrestling is no exception. The two schools have been going to battle on the mat every year since 1957, when the Mids topped the Cadets, 17-8. Army then took four of the next five matches, before Navy went on the most dominant streak in the history of intercollegiate competition between the two academies. From 1963 to 1996, the Mids went 34 consecutive matches without a loss. Navy won 30 and tied four between 1963's 18-9 win, and 1996's 21-9 win. Through the streak, there were a few close matches, like Navy's 22-18 win in 1993. But the majority were lopsided, such as the Mids' 40-2 win in 1975. Navy's dominance was most evident in the 1970s, when Navy never failed to score fewer than 23 points, and never gave up more than 14. The average score between 1970 and 1979 was an amazing Navy 31.3, Army 6.7. In 2001, Navy captured an exciting 19-13 victory at West Point, while the Mids scored an electrifying 22-9 win over the

Black Knights in Alumni Hall in 2002 with a crowd of over 3,000 looking on that included Secretary of Defense Donald Rumsfeld. Last year, in front of a partisan Army crowd of 1,800-plus, which, however, included a vocal cheering section of approximately 75 Mids, Navy came away with a 23-10 decision in West Point, and now hold an eight-match unbeaten streak against Army, dating back to 1997. In the last 42 matches between the two teams, Navy is a remarkable 37-1-5.
