◁ **Projected Starter: Alex Usztics, Sr.**

• Listed No. 12 in the preseason Atlantic Region rankings put out by The Wrestling Report, Usztics is coming off a 16-13 junior campaign that featured an 8-5 dual-meet record. Last year he won the All-Academy Tournament by defeating Army's William Simpson in the championship match.

Usztics will likely wrestle the top-ranked 125-pounder in the country Sam Hazewinkel from Oklahoma at the Lone Star Duals in early January, as well as 18th-ranked Eric Stevenson from Oklahoma State.

Burnett on Usztics — "Alex had a good year last season. He has to be the guy that stands out. He worked hard in the off-season to get even better and we expect him to do well. We'd like to see him make a trip to Detroit this year."

▷ **Challengers: Adam Shemon, Matt Pagan, Phil Mahne**

• Shemon saw action in just one match a year ago, but has had a solid off-season.

• Pagan spent last year at the Naval Academy Prep School but led Bishop George Ahr (N.J.) to the 2003-04 Region V Championship.

• Mahne, meanwhile led Jesuit High School (La.) to the 2005 state title with a 32-1 record, while he earned claimed the individual title.

Burnett on the challengers — "Adam Shemon returns for his sophomore year and in addition, we have two really good freshmen — Matt Pagan and Phil Mahne. They'll get a lot of experience this season and will push Alex."

◁ **Projected Starter: Joe Baker, So.**

• After suffering a season-ending injury in 2004, Baker withdrew from the Academy and returned last January to compete for the Mids. Baker produced an 11-2 record, a third-place finish at the EIWA Championship and earned a bid to compete at the NCAA Championship. Baker will have stiff competition in dual action, as well as in the EIWA

where he could meet up with top-ranked Matt Valenti of Penn. A proven winner, Joe Baker could make a run in this year's NCAA Tournament if he can stay healthy.

Burnett on Baker — "I've had the opportunity to coach high school state champions, NCAA champions, World and Olympic champions and I believe Joe's just got it. He's a tough competitor. He made it to the nationals last year as a freshman and I expect to see him on the podium this year."

▷ **Challengers: Sean Knapp, Brian DeYoung, Bobby Harned, Branden Beasley**

• Knapp produced an 8-8 record for the Midshipmen last year, which featured a fifth-place finish at the Navy Classic.

• DeYoung was the regional champion at Lake Forest High School (Ill.) and was a member of the 30-win club.

• Harned, meanwhile, was a member of Bay High School's (Fla.) wrestling squad that picked up the district championship in '03.

• Beasley owns a career mark of 20-15, including a 5-5 record a year ago. He wrestled his four matches last season at 133 pounds, before moving up to 141 pounds at the Southern Scuffle.

Burnett on the challengers — "Sean Knapp is a senior, who stepped in a did a great job for us last year. In a lot of programs, he'd be the starter. He'll be ready to wrestle in case something would happen to Joe, but I think at this

point he would have to work really hard to beat Joe. Brian DeYoung and Bobby Harned are two young guys that will get some experience this season. Branden Beasley has also been around the program for several years and will push for a spot along with the other guys."

◁ **Projected Starter: Brad Canterbury, Sr.**

• With Spencer Manley moving up a weight class, the door has opened for Canterbury who bumped up to 141 pounds at the end of last season. Canterbury turned in a 12-7 record at 133 pounds before making the move up. He won the Navy Classic at 133 pounds after recording a fall in the championship match. Northwestern is set to match up

against the Midshipmen on Nov. 12 at the Northwestern duals where Canterbury will likely face top-ranked Ryan Lang.

Burnett on Canterbury — “Right now Brad is the front runner because of his experience. He started for us in each of the last two years at two different weight classes (125 and 133). He looks awfully good right now.”

▷ **Challengers: Dave Ingram, Kyle O’Neill, Caleb Levee**

• Ingram won the state title as a senior and led East Islip High School (N.Y.) to the 2006 state championship with an impressive 46-0 record.

• O’Neill led Gaylord High (Mich.) to back-to-back state titles in 2004 (61-1) and against in ‘05 (52-2).

• Levee earned two top-five finishes last season, including a third-place showing in the Navy Classic where he defeated teammate Alex Usztics in overtime at 125 pounds. He turned in a 14-10 record.

Burnett on the challengers — “We have a good group of young men. David is a really talented young man, as is freshman Kyle O’Neill. Caleb Levee is a sophomore who is going to move all the way up from 125 pounds. We’ll have to see how he handles the increase in weight.”

◁ **Projected Starter: John Cox, Sr.**

• Ranked as high as sixth in the preseason rankings, John Cox is a two-time NCAA qualifier who is coming off a fifth-place finish at the EIWA Championship. He amassed a 34-12 record with 10 of his 12 losses coming against opponents who reached the NCAA Tournament in ‘06 and once again, a challenging schedule is awaiting him this winter.

Cox and his teammates are slated to battle Oklahoma and Wisconsin in dual matches this fall and each have a wrestler ranked in the top four at 149 pounds.

Burnett on Cox — “John should be nationally ranked this year. He was three points away from the podium last year and I really believe this is his year to break through. The national tournament is in Michigan, his home state.”

▷ **Challengers: Glenn Shober, Dave Ingram, Joel Ahern**

• A two-time All-State (Pa.) wrestler, Shober led Schuylkill Valley High School to a third-place finish at the state meet with a 45-1 record a year ago.

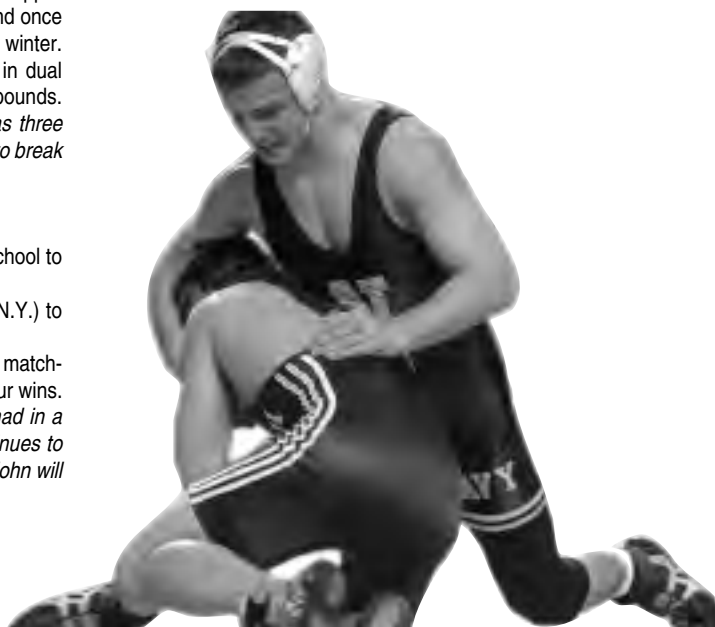
• Ingram won the state title as a senior and led East Islip High School (N.Y.) to the 2006 state championship with an impressive 46-0 record.

• As a rookie, Ahern turned in a 13-9 record, winning six of his first eight matches of the season. He placed fourth at the Navy Classic with a string of four wins.

• Jarred found his niche at 157 pounds last season where he finished the year with a 35-10 record. His 35 wins were the second most on the team, while it marked the eighth-most victories in program history. Jarred opened the 2005-06 campaign by winning 17 of his first 18 matches, including the first 12.

Burnett on Jarred — “John held the spot early on until the end of the year, but I think he’ll be challenged by Justin Jacobs. John didn’t start as a freshman and he didn’t start as a sophomore, but the rest of the guys watched how hard he worked, how committed he was and how much he helped the rest of the guys get ready when he wasn’t the starter.”

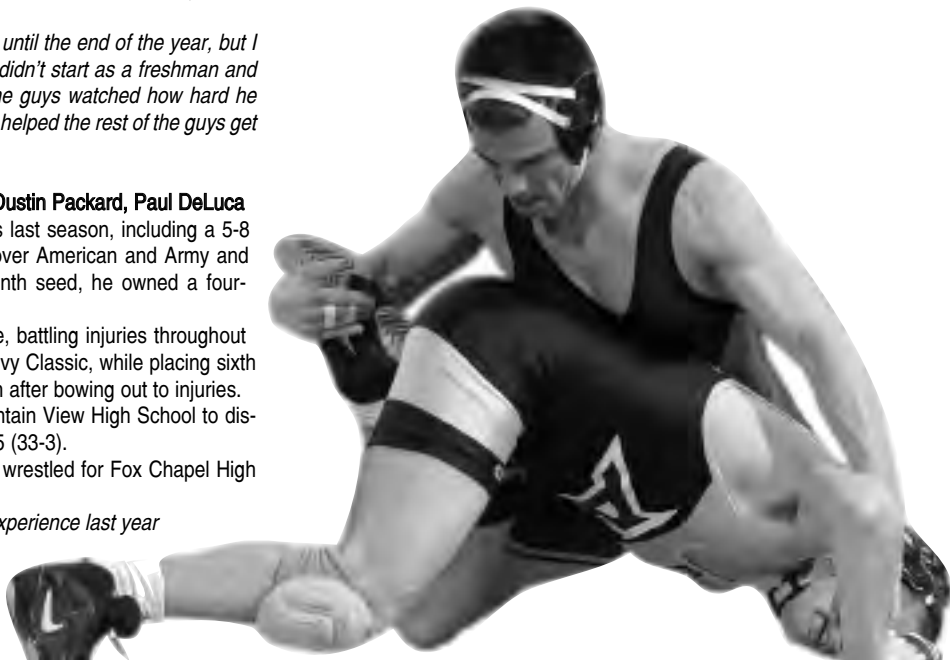
▷ **Challengers: Spencer Manley, Justin Jacobs, Dustin Packard, Paul DeLuca**

- Manley produced a 17-15 record at 141 pounds last season, including a 5-8 dual-meet mark. He picked up dual-meet wins over American and Army and heading into the EIWA Tournament as the seventh seed, he owned a four-match winning streak.
- Jacobs turned in a 13-4 record as a sophomore, battling injuries throughout the year. He earned a third-place finish at the Navy Classic, while placing sixth at the Eastern Michigan Open and Edinboro Open after bowing out to injuries.
- An All-State (Idaho) standout, Packard led Mountain View High School to district and state titles in 2003 (33-1) and again in ‘05 (33-3).
- DeLuca is a three-time all-county selection who wrestled for Fox Chapel High School in Pittsburgh.

Burnett on the challengers — “Justin got a lot of experience last year and is a talented wrestler. Dustin Packard and Paul DeLuca will push the envelope, as well. Spencer Manley will give it a go at 157 this year, up two classes from 141 a year ago. He had a

fine season last year and we’ll see how things go with him moving up in weight.”

• Ranked among the top 20 in all four wrestling publications, Stolpinski is in prime shape to make a move this season. He coming off a 30-11 sophomore campaign in which he became just the 20th wrestler in program history to reach 30 wins. Seven of his 11 losses were to ranked foes at the time of the meet. With his fourth-place finish at the

EIWA meet, he earned his first trip to the NCAA Championship. He earned individual titles at the Navy Classic and the All-Academy Tournament become the first Navy wrestler to win All-Academy Tournament titles in each of his first two seasons. Stolpinski would like to have the opportunity to avenge his EIWA loss to Columbia’s Matt Palmer who is ranked No. 6, but will likely have to wait until the EIWA Championship. Meanwhile, he’ll get a challenge from OSU’s Brandon Mason, an NCAA qualifier and ranked No. 4, when the two teams battle at the Lone Star Duals.

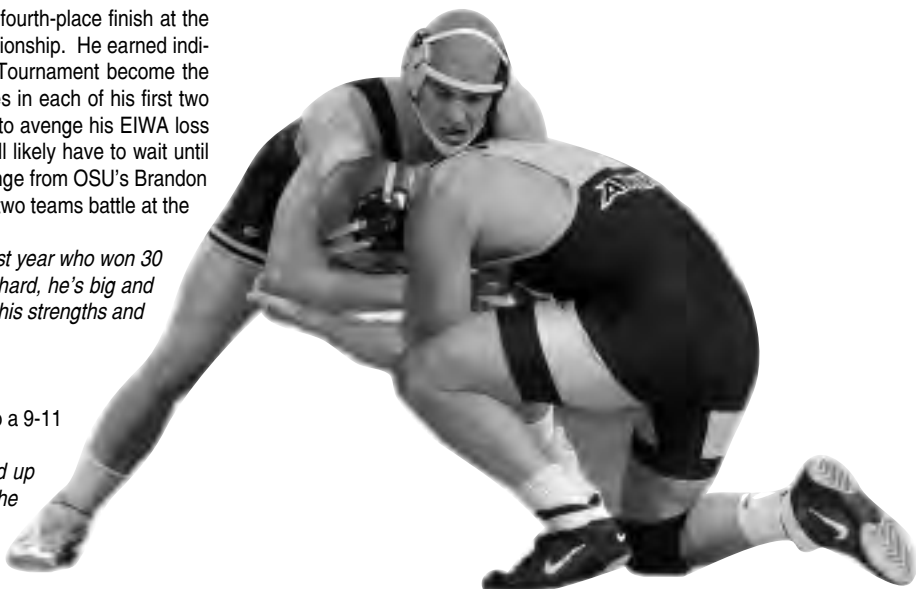

He struggled right out of the gates, but by the end of the season he had won six of his last nine matches and placed fourth at the Edinboro Open. Feinsod may have the opportunity to face-off against returning National Champion John Hendricks of Oklahoma State when the two programs battle at the Lone Star Duals Jan. 6.

Burnett on Feinsod — “Jesse was our backup at 174 last year and he is going to try and make the cut to 165. He is a solid sophomore who looks strong right now and had a good summer of wrestling.”

▷ **Challengers: Robert Johnston, Peter Rushin, Jason Coyne, Russ Kropp**

- Johnston won three of his first five matches en route to a 9-11 record.
- Rushin posted a 1-2 record as a rookie a year ago. He was an All-State (Va.) standout at Robert E. Lee where he claimed the state title his senior year.

Burnett on Miranda — “Antonio wrestled a lot of varsity for us last year. He won the Navy Classic last year at 197 pounds and the year before he was at 184, placing at West Virginia. He's definitely in the hunt, but we'll see how well he's able to manage his weight.”
