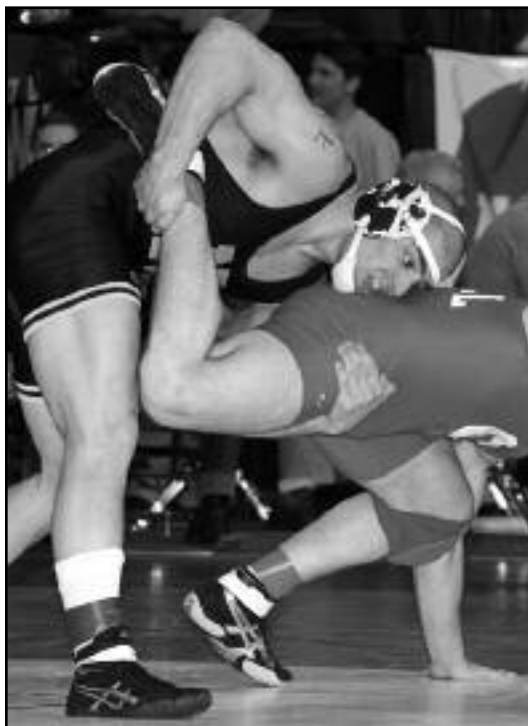

Stolpinski in 2007-08: Amateur Wrestling News, the Wrestling Report and W.I.N Magazine list Stolpinski as the No. 2 wrestler at 174 pounds in their preseason rankings ... has been invited to compete at the 2007-08 NWCA All-Star Classic in Eugene, Ore. on Nov. 19 ... only the 12th Navy wrestler to receive the invitation since its inception in 1967 and first since All-American Mark Conley in 2001-02 ... voted by his peers to serve as the Mids' team captain for the 2007-08 season ... heads into his senior campaign one win shy of becoming only the eighth wrestler in school history to win 100 matches ... stands eighth on Navy's career matches wrestled list with 134, just 27 behind record holder Mark Conley, who was credited with 161 bouts between 1998-02.

2006-07: Compiled a 44-7 record, including a 13-2 mark in dual meet action, en route to finishing fourth at the NCAA Championship in the 174-pound weight class and earning All-America kudos ... became Navy's first

wrestling All-American since Frank Edwards picked up the honor in 2002-03 ... Stolpinski is Navy's highest finisher at the national tournament since Scott Schleicher placed second at 158 pounds in 1989-90 ... along the way, Stolpinski set the program record for most matches wrestled with 51, while tying the record for most wins, matching Mark Conley's record of 44 set during the 2001-02 campaign ... his 74 wins between his sophomore (30) and junior (44) years are the third-most wins by a Navy wrestler in any two seasons combined ... Mark Conley (2001-02) and Tanner Garrett (2005-06) each won 78 matches ... finished the year with a 10-6 record against ranked competition ... in addition to his achievements at the NCAA Championship, Stolpinski won individual titles at the Navy Classic, the All-Academy Championship and he became Navy's first EIWA individual title winner (along with heavyweight Ed Prendergast) since 2002 ... with his 3-2 decision over

The Citadel's Darius Caldwell, he captured his third-consecutive All-Academy Wrestling Championship ... he is only the fourth wrestler in Naval Academy history to win three individual titles at the All-Academy tournament, joining Greg Gingeleskie (1997-98-99), Mark Conley (2000-01-02) and Tanner Garrett (2004-05-06) ... no Navy wrestler has won the individual title four years ... after dropping the title match to Michigan's Steve Luke at the Eastern Michigan Open, kicked off a 14-match winning streak with a 15-5 major decision over Cumberland's Jordan Powers at the Northwestern Duals ... his streak ended with a 3-1 loss to then second-ranked James Yonushonis from Penn State in the championship bout of the Nittany Lion Open ... won four in a row at the Southern Scuffle, including a 7-3 decision over eighth-ranked Gabe Dretsch from Minnesota ... was pinned in the championship match by Minnesota's Ben Askren who went on to win the National Championship ... kicked off a second 14-match winning streak by defeating 10th-ranked Mike Letts in the annual Maryland dual ... did not lose another match until the opening round of the NCAA Tournament when Northwestern's Nick Hayes surprised Stolpinski with a 6-5 overtime win ... easily cruised through the first round and quarterfinals

sixth-seeded Kenneth Cook from UC Davis, 7-2, and ninth-seeded Matt Palmer from Columbia, 11-8 ... pinned Oklahoma State's Brandon Mason, ranked 13th, to advance to the third-place match ... fifth-seeded Eric Luedke from Iowa just edged Stolpinski, 3-2 ... half of Stolpinski's wins were via decisions, while only one of his seven losses was by more than a decision ... turned in a flawless 18-0 record against competitors representing EIWA schools.

2005-06: Finished his sophomore campaign with a 30-11 record, including a 10-4 mark in dual meet competition ... his 30 wins are tied as the third most wins by a sophomore in program history ... he is just the 20th different wrestler in Navy history to reach 30 wins in a season ... the feat has been accomplished 30 times ... his 30 wins are the most by a Navy wrestler at the 174-pound weight class ... he improved upon previous record holder Mark Newman's mark of 29 in 2000-01 ... seven of his 11 losses were to ranked foes at the time of the meet ... his 55 wins in his first two seasons are also the third-most wins by a wrestler in his first two seasons combined ... recorded four pins during the season ... made his first appearance at the NCAA Championship after earning one of 14 wildcards ... won his opening bout at the NCAA Championship, pinning Kent State's Aaron Miller ... dropped back-to-back matches at the NCAA Tournament, marking the first time all year he lost two matches in a row ... was the lone representative from the state of Massachusetts to compete in the 2006 NCAA Championship ... was seeded fourth and finished fourth at the EIWA Championship with a 1-2 record ... dropped matches to 12th-ranked Travis Frick from Lehigh and ninth-ranked Matt Palmer of Columbia ... won his first-collegiate individual title, the Navy Classic, by defeating Kurt Brenner of West Virginia in the title match ... won the All-Academy Tournament after pinning The Citadel's Darius Caldwell and became the first Navy wrestler to win All-Academy Tournament titles in each of his first two seasons ... defeated Chad Marzec in overtime, 5-3, in the Army-Navy dual ... defeated Cornell's Dan Miracola twice, a 9-8 decision at the Southern Scuffle and by a 6-4 count at the EIWA Championship ... posted a 3-0 dual-meet record at the Lone Star Duals, winning by decision, tech fall and fall.

2004-05: Stolpinski had an outstanding freshman season, recording a 25-17 mark and a sixth-place EIWA

Tournament finish ... first Navy freshman to place at the EIWA Championships since Greg Gingeleskie placed third in 1995-96 ... led the team with seven falls, earning the Ray Swartz Award for most falls in least amount of time ... recorded first career technical fall against Jonathan Butler of Princeton in the first round of EIWA's ... then took top seed Travis Frick of Lehigh to the wire, before falling, 4-1 ... took down East Stroudsburg's John Carr at the buzzer in the consolation bracket to complete a remarkable rally to continue his EIWA Tournament. He trailed Carr, 4-0, before scoring five third-period points ... recorded three falls in a row, including avenging an earlier loss to N.C. State's Kevin Gabrielson, in early February ... claimed the All-Academy Championship, becoming just the third Navy freshman to win an All-Academy title ... dropped a 6-4 sudden-victory decision to 15th-ranked Leonel Sanchez of Cal State-Fullerton in his first career dual match ... eight of his losses were to ranked foes, including four by three or fewer points ... finished third in the Navy Classic and fourth in the Eastern Michigan Open ... recorded 28 takedowns in dual-meet action, the third most on the team ... went 5-2 at the University National Freestyle Championships in mid-April, just missing out on a top-eight finish.

High School: A 2003 graduate of Phillips Exeter Academy in New Hampshire, Stolpinski garnered four letters in wrestling ... Had a stellar scholastic career, wrestling for Phillips Exeter (N.H.) Academy ... was a four-time Class A State Champ and was a three-time New England Prep Champion ... was team MVP three times and team captain twice ... finished fourth in the 2003 Freestyle Junior National Championships ... following his high school graduation, he spent a year at the U.S. Olympic Training Center in Colorado Springs, training with the 2004 Olympians.

Personal: Full name is Matthew Graham Stolpinski ... son of Mike and Nancy Stolpinski ... born Feb. 8, 1984, in Springfield, Mass. ... a General Science Major who owns a 3.23 GPA ... one of 57 wrestlers in the country to be named to the NWCA All-Academic Team in 2007 ... named to the Superintendent's List both semesters last year and is a four-time member of the Commandant's List ... ranked 24th out of 1,085 students in military order of merit ... stands 378th in academic order of merit.

Baker in 2007-08: Enters the season ranked ninth by Amateur Wrestling News and the Wrestling Report ... chosen as W.I.N. Magazine's No. 10 wrestler at 133 pounds

2006-07: Once again found himself battling injuries during the season, but was able to earn his second-straight NCAA Tournament bid thanks to a fifth-place finish at the EIWA Championship ... turned in a 21-9 record, including an 8-3 dual match mark ... opened the year with a second-place finish at the Eastern Michigan Open where he was pinned in the title match by Michigan State's Nick Simmons ... missed the next month nursing an injury ... returned to the mat in late December where he placed third at the annual Southern Scuffle ... won his first three matches at the Scuffle, including a 10-6 decision over 14th-ranked Ricky Deubel of Cornell ... pinned Virginia's Eric Albright in the third-place match ... turned in a 2-1 record at the Lone Star Duals, including a 3-1 decision over Oklahoma's Joe Comparin ... won four straight dual matches, including a 5-3 victory over 10th-ranked Evan Sola from North Carolina ... suffered a shoulder injury against East Stroudsburg on Jan. 24 that kept him from competing at the All-Academy Championship ... helped lead Navy to its seventh consecutive win over Army by defeating William Simpson, 11-4, in the annual Star Match ... dropped a 7-5 sudden victory match against Bucknell's David Marble in the opening match at the EIWA Championship ... battled back through the consolation bracket where he was matched up against Marble in the fifth-place match ... Baker turned in a decisive 10-2 mark to clinch a berth into the NCAA Championship ... opened the NCAA Tournament with a 5-1 victory over 10th-seeded Evan Sola before Minnesota's Mack Reiter handed Baker a 12-5 loss ... came back to edge Central Michigan's Conor Beebe, 4-3, in the wrestlebacks before Indiana's Andrae Hernandez ousted him from the tournament with a 7-5 victory.

2005-06: Baker fought off injuries to produce an 11-2 record, a third-place finish at the EIWA Championship and a berth to wrestle at the 2006 NCAA Championship ... after spending 14 months recovering from a season-ending injury in 2004-05, Baker dropped his first match back, a 9-3 decision to Lehigh's John Stout in a dual match ... bounced back and won nine-consecutive matches beginning with an 11-7 win over NC State's

Garrett Cummings on Jan. 28 ... also earned dual-meet wins over American's Jordan Lipp (7-5) and a technical fall against Army's Frankie Baughan (20-4) to win the N Star ... won the All-Academy Tournament which included a pin against John Victoria of the Merchant Marine Academy ... seeded fourth at the EIWA Championship, he won his first two matches, including pinning Trent Dixon of Franklin & Marshall in the opener ... dropped a heart-wrenching 11-8 decision to Penn's Matt Valenti, the eventual 2006 NCAA Champion ... came back to pin Army's Baughan and defeated 19th-ranked Mike Mormile of Cornell to finish third and earn a bid to wrestle at the NCAA Championship ... dropped his opener against 18th-ranked Gabriel Flores, 9-3, before handling 19th-ranked Andrae Hernandez of Indian in the consolation bracket, 16-9 ... his NCAA hopes ended with a 12-9 loss to Northern Iowa's Christopher Helgeson ... wrestling unattached, he won the Penn State Open in December before returning to the Naval Academy for the second semester of the 2005-06 academic year ... named the Most Outstanding Wrestler of the Penn State Open, after defeating North Carolina All-American Evan Sola in the quarterfinals and eventually winning the title.

2004-05: Wrestled in just two dual meets, before suffering season-ending shoulder injury ... left school in the spring semester and received a medical redshirt, enabling him to compete as a freshman in 2005-06 ... one of his losses was an 11-10 loss to 14th-ranked Efrén Ceballos, an All-American from Cal State-Bakersfield.

High School: A 2003 graduate of Poway High School, Baker was a four-year wrestling letterwinner ... a 2003 State Champion and All-American, while posting a 38-2 record ... placed fourth at the state meet in 2002 ... team finished fourth (2001), third (2002) and second (2003) at the state meet ... attended the Naval Academy Prep School during the 2003-04 academic year ... wanted to attend the Naval Academy his whole life, as he didn't apply anywhere else ... high school teammate, Pat Payne, wrestles at Arizona State

Jacobs in 2006-07: Produced a 14-17 record after beginning the season at 157 pounds before eventually moving into the starting role as Navy's 165-pounder ... struggled to make the weight change early on, but settled in near the end of the year ... won the first four matches of the year en route to a fourth-place finish at the Eastern Michigan Open ... turned in a 3-2 record at the Nittany Lion Open ... split his four matches at the Southern Scuffle which included a 8-0 victory over The Citadel's Zach Filter in the opener ... made the move to 165 pounds in early January when Navy headed south to the Lone Star Duals ... claimed an 8-3 decision over Lehigh's Manuel Schubert to earn his first dual win over the year and only the second of his collegiate career ... also defeated Leif Ruschmeyer from East Stroudsburg, 3-0, in dual action ... won his opening two matches at the All-Academy Championship before dropping a 3-0 decision to Army's Brian Rowan in the title match ... 11th-ranked Steve Anceravage from Cornell defeated Jacobs in the EIWA Championship opener, but Jacobs came back to earn a consolation victory over Army's Rowan via a medical forfeit ... Jacobs would in turn fall victim to injury in the following match against Harvard's Frankie Colletta to end the year.

2005-06: Opened the season with three-consecutive wins at the Eastern Michigan Open en route to a sixth-place finish ... forced to forfeit his final three matches of the EMU Open due to injury ... owned a 13-4 record at 157 pounds ... placed third at the Navy Classic by winning his last four matches, including a 6-0 decision against Duquesne's Rob Dempsey in the third-place battle ... won his first three matches at the Edinboro Open where he finished sixth ... earned a technical fall (16-0) against Binghamton's Chris Klucka in the opening round and Zach Snyder of Penn State in the third round ... was again forced to forfeit his last two matches because of injury ... also competed at the Southern Scuffle where he put together a 2-2 record.
