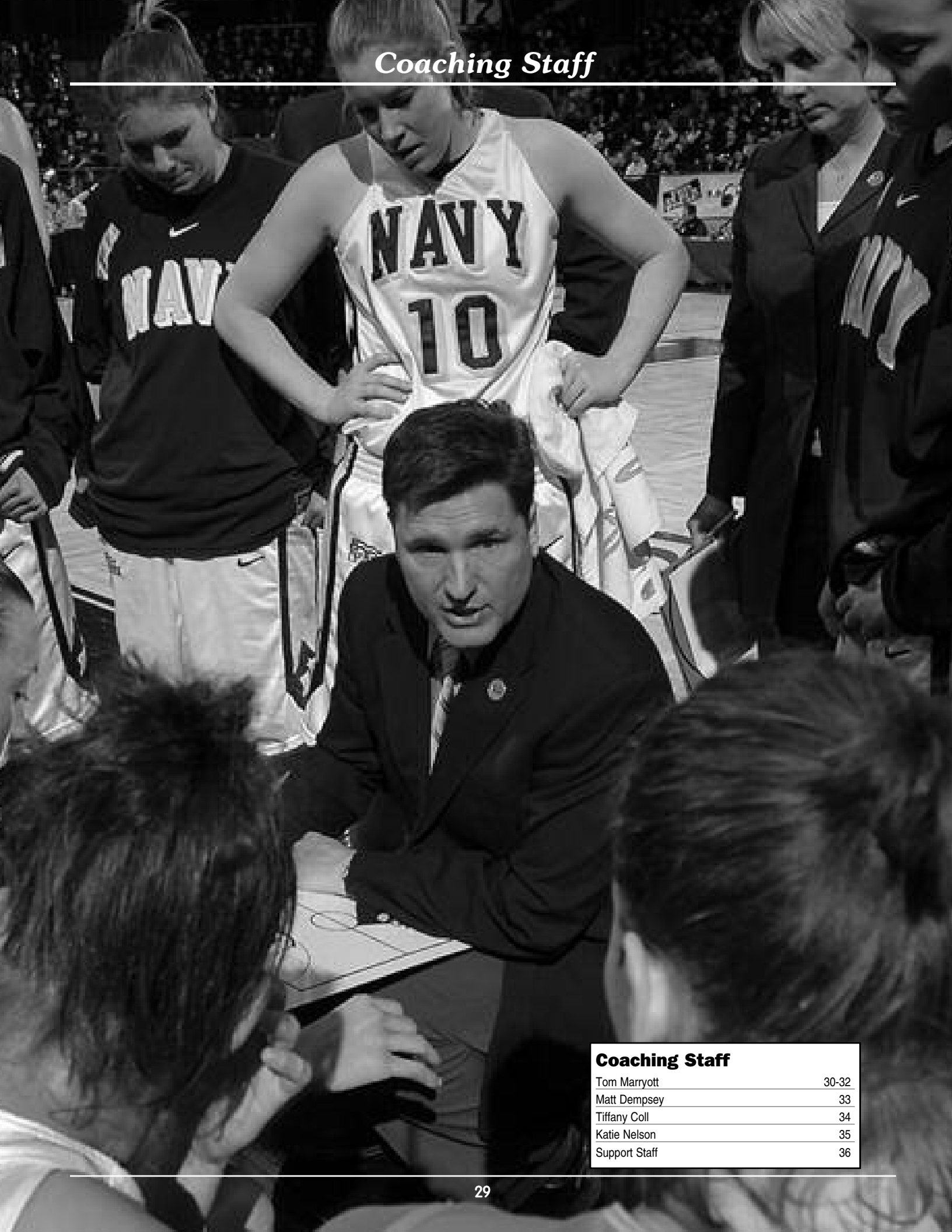

Tom Marryott

Head Coach ☆ Fifth Season
Castleton (Vt.) State '85

Head Coach, Navy Women's Basketball, 2004-pres.

◆ Has posted an overall record of 50-66 and a Patriot League record of 25-31 during his tenure.

2003-04 Season

◆ During his initial season coaching both the team and on the women's collegiate level, led Navy to 13 overall victories and a 6-8 record in Patriot League games.

◆ Among the victories was the program's first over Holy Cross in Worcester, Mass.

◆ Navy competed at the prestigious Rainbow Wahine Classic in Honolulu, Hawaii, where the Mids faced nationally-ranked Texas and Arizona, as well as Syracuse.

◆ Courtney Davidson was named First-Team All-Patriot League and garnered CoSIDA Academic All-America accolades for the second-straight season.

2004-05 Season

◆ Navy entered the season with only three players who had totaled over 100 points in their respective careers.

◆ The Mids ended the year with a 6-8 record in league play and won the program's first postseason game in six seasons.

◆ Nikki Curtis received Second-Team All-Patriot League honors.

2005-06 Season

◆ Navy posted a 7-7 record and a fourth-place finish in the Patriot League. The .500 record and the league placing were the best for the Mids in seven years.

◆ Navy compiled a 6-6 record in true road games, the most wins and highest winning percentage in eight years.

◆ The Mids set a school and Patriot League record by averaging 6.32 three-point field goals made a game.

◆ Lauren Skrel garnered Second-Team All-Patriot League honors.

◆ Meredith Addington was the inaugural recipient of the Patriot League's Women's Sportsmanship Award.



2006-07 Season

◆ Navy finished the league season tied for fourth place in the standings with a 6-8 record.

◆ The back-to-back fourth-place finishes for Navy is the best for the program in consecutive years since 1998 (first-place tie) and '99 (third).

◆ Carly Meyer became just the second Mid to lead the Patriot League in scoring, as well as the seventh player in school history to receive first-team all-league recognition.

◆ Kate Hobbs was named First-Team All-Senior CLASS (Celebrating Loyalty and Achievement for Staying in School).

Asst. Coach, Navy Men's Basketball, 1999-2003

◆ Served as an assistant coach to Don DeVoe for the Navy men's program.

◆ Navy posted an 80-65 overall record, as well as a 30-26 mark in Patriot League games, during his five years with the team.

◆ The Mids advanced to the championship game of the Patriot League Tournament in both 2000 and '01.

Head Coach/Athletic Director, NAPS, 1988-98

◆ Was the athletic director and head basketball coach at the Naval Academy Prep School (Newport, R.I.) from 1988-98.

◆ The men's basketball team compiled a 124-75 record during his decade as the coach.

◆ Coached future Naval Academy standouts Hassan Booker, Skip Victor, Jehiel Lewis, Victory Mickjel and Matt Sladky.

Additional Coaching Positions, 1986-88

◆ Began his coaching career immediately upon graduating from college by serving as a graduate assistant coach at Vermont during the 1985-86 season.

◆ Next, served as an assistant coach for one season (1986-87) at Genessee Community College (Batavia, N.Y.).

◆ Returned to the Division I level the following season (1987-88) as a graduate assistant at Providence.

Collegiate Playing Career, Castleton State, '85

- ◆ Was a four-year member of the basketball team at Castleton State (Castleton, Vt.).
- ◆ Set the school record for the most consecutive games started.
- ◆ Helped lead the Spartans to the NAIA Tournament during his final season.
- ◆ Inducted into the school's athletic hall of fame in 2001.

Personal Information

- ◆ His father, the late Rear Adm. Ron Marryott, USN, graduated from the Naval Academy in 1957 and served as the school's Superintendent from 1986-88.

The 2007-08 season will mark Tom Marryott's fifth year as the head coach of the women's basketball program, his 10th year overall at Navy and his 20th season of being associated with U.S. Naval Academy basketball.

Asst. Coach, Navy Women's Basketball, 2004-pres.

- ◆ Joined the program prior to the start of the 2003-04 season.
- ◆ Serves as the director of the Navy Girl's Basketball Camp during the summer.

Head Coach, Green Mountain College Men's Basketball, 1990-2003

- ◆ Was the head coach of the men's team at Green Mountain College (Poultney, Vt.) for 13 seasons.
- ◆ Led the Eagles to five Mayflower Conference titles and to a 216-157 record during his stint as head coach.
- ◆ Green Mountain advanced to the NAIA National Tournament four times under Dempsey.
- ◆ Left as the winningest coach in the program's history.
- ◆ Earned five conference coach-of-the-year honors and was selected as the 1994 NAIA District 5 Coach of the Year.
- ◆ Also served as the school's assistant athletic director during his final two years.



Head Coach, Green Mountain College Women's Basketball, 1986-89

- ◆ Served as the head coach of the women's program for three years.
- ◆ The Eagles posted a 38-34 record in those three seasons.

Additional Coaching Positions, 1984-01

- ◆ Was the softball coach at Green Mountain College from 1990-2001, winning a pair of conference titles and earning one league coach-of-the-year accolade.
- ◆ Served as a physical education instructor (1984-90) and athletic director (1985-88) at West Rutland High School (West Rutland, Vt.).
- ◆ Was also a health/physical education instructor at Green Mountain College (1990-2001) and Castleton (Vt.) State (1992-2003).

Collegiate Playing Career, Castleton State, '84

- ◆ Was a four-year member of the basketball team at Castleton State (Castleton, Vt.).
- ◆ Totaled over 1,000 points in his career.
- ◆ Earned all-conference and all-district honors as a member of the soccer team and still holds school records in both sports.
- ◆ Inducted into the school's athletic hall of fame in 1997.

Assistant Coach, St. John's (N.Y.), 2006-07

- ◆ Began her coaching career as a graduate assistant coach at St. John's (N.Y.) during the 2005-06 and '06-07 seasons.
- ◆ The Red Storm posted a 22-8 record and a mark of 11-5 in the Big East Conference during her initial season. St. John's was consistently ranked in the national polls during the season and advanced to the second round of the NCAA Tournament.
- ◆ Last year, the program compiled an overall record of 8-20 and a conference mark of 4-12.
- ◆ In addition to coaching at St. John's, Coll also obtained a Master of Arts Degree in sociology from the school this past May.



Professional Playing Career, 2003-05

- ◆ Played professionally in four different leagues during her overseas career.
- ◆ After competing with the Rhondda Rebels (Treorchy, Wales) in the English Basketball League' (first division) during the fall of 2003, played for the Gibo Grasshoppers (Katwijk, Holland) in the Dutch League (first division) starting in Jan. of 2004.
- ◆ Went on to play for the SV Halle Lions (Halle, Germany) in the German Bundesliga (first division) in the fall of 2004 and for Uniao da Madeira (Madeira Island, Portugal) in the winter of 2005.

Collegiate Playing Career, UMBC, '03

- ◆ Served as the captain of the Retrievers during her junior and senior seasons.
- ◆ UMBC reached the finals of the Northeast Conference Tournament during her final season.
