Credentials

Postgame Interviews

The Navy locker room is closed at all times, both at home and on the road. Postgame interviews at home games will be conducted in the interview room, across from the visitor's locker room in Alumni Hall, while interviews on the road will be conducted either outside of the Navy locker room or else in a designated media area at the arena.

The postgame interview session will begin 10 minutes following the conclusion of the game.

In addition, a limited number of direct internet jacks are available for use in Alumni Hall.

A total of 11 Navy women's basketball regular season games will be carried on the radio by WNAV-AM 1430 and its corresponding web site www.wnav.com(.)

In addition to the regular season slate of games, all Navy postseason games will be carried live by the network.

All broadcasts begin 15 minutes prior to tip with the Navy Pregame Show featuring an interview with Navy head coach Tom Marryott. The Navy Postgame Show, beginning immediately following the conclusion of the game, includes interviews with Navy players and/or a member of the Navy coaching staff.

Naval Academy at the Head of the Class for Graduation Rates

For the third year in a row, the United States Naval Academy is at the head of the class for graduating NCAA student-athletes on the Division IA level. Navy graduated 100 percent of its student-athletes in 12 of the 19 sports reported on and no sport graduated lower than 94 percent.

"Our student-athletes continually strive to set the standard on the playing fields, in the classroom and in Bancroft Hall," said Naval Academy Director of Athletics Chet Gladchuk. "The support and encouragement they receive through the Commandant and her staff and the academic dean's office is extraordinary and provides tremendous motivation to be successful across the board. We are all proud to be leaders on the field, but even more so when we can prove to be leaders in the classroom as well. Our midshipmen clearly define the true meaning of student-athlete."

Annapolis

The City of Annapolis has been home to the Naval Academy for all but four years since the founding of the school in 1845 on the grounds of what originally was the Army's Fort Severn. The Academy moved its location to Newport, R.I., from 1861-65 during the Civil War.

Originally just 10 acres, "The Yard" has grown to a size of 338 acres.

Anchors Aweigh

"Anchors Aweigh" was written by Lt. Charles Zimmerman, musical director of the Naval Academy, in 1906, with the lyrics provided by Alfred H. Miles '06 as a fight song for the 1907 graduating class. The song made its debut at the 1906 Army-Navy game and when the Mids won, the song became traditional at the contest.

*Stand Navy down the field,
Sails set to the sky,
We'll never change our course,
So Army you steer shy.
Roll up the score, Navy,
Anchors Aweigh,
Sail Navy down the field,
And sink the Army,
sink the Army Grey*

Brigade of Midshipmen

The 4,000-member student body at the Naval Academy is called the Brigade of Midshipmen.

The Brigade is organized into:

- ◆ 2 regiments
- ◆ 6 battalions
- ◆ 30 companies

Bill the Goat

The first recorded use of a goat as the mascot for Navy teams was in 1893 when an animal named El Cid (the Chief) was presented to the Brigade by officers of the USS New York. El Cid helped Navy to a 6-4 win over Army that year and a goat became the permanent mascot of the Academy in 1904.

Co-Ed

Women were first admitted to the Naval Academy during the 1976 summer, with the 1980 graduation ceremonies being the first to commission female officers. Today, women comprise roughly 15 percent of the student body.

Marine Corps

Graduates of the Naval Academy entering the Marine Corps (commissioned as 2nd Lieutenants) have the following service options available to them ...

- ◆ Aviation -- air command and control, anti-air warfare, aviation maintenance, aviation supply, pilot, naval flight officer.
- ◆ Ground -- armor*, artillery*, communications (information systems), engineering, financial management, infantry*, logistics, military police
(* — not available to women)

Midshipman

The original 17th Century meaning of the word "midshipmen" designated those men who stood watch "amidships", or in the middle portion of a ship. The middle "s" was later dropped to give the current form of the word.

Midshipmen were originally young boys who were apprenticed to sea captains to learn the trade.

In the early days of the Navy, midshipmen were trained aboard ship until they were commissioned as ensigns.

Navy

Graduates of the Naval Academy entering the Navy (commissioned as Ensigns) have the following service options available to them ...

- ◆ Aviation -- flight officer, pilot
- ◆ Nuclear Propulsion -- ships, submarines*
- ◆ Restricted Line and Staff Corps -- civil engineering, cryptology, intelligence, maintenance, medicine, meteorology/oceanography, supply
- ◆ Special Operations -- explosive ordinance disposal, explosive ordinance management, mine countermeasures, operational diving and salvage,
- ◆ Navy SEALs*
- ◆ Surface Warfare -- conventional, nuclear powered
- ◆ Submarines*
(* — not available to women)

Nickname

The official nickname for all of Navy's athletic teams is Midshipmen.

"Mids" is an appropriate abbreviation, while "Middie" is inappropriate.

N-Star

Members of varsity teams who qualify for the varsity letter receive an N-Star for their letter sweaters if they participate in a victory over Army in any sport-designated Star Game.

The varsity N and corresponding N-Star were initiated during the early 1890s.

Navy vs. RMI Field Series Notes

The Mids have not faced any of the Rocky Mountain Invitational participating teams before.

Navy has posted records of 3-6 against teams from the Mountain West Conference (Colorado State) and a 3-3 mark against teams from the Mid-American Conference (Kent State). The Mids have not faced a team from the Missouri Valley Conference before (Creighton).

The Rams have compiled a 1-0 record against teams from the Patriot League, the Golden Flashes are 9-2 against the Patriot League and the Blue Jays have never before faced a Patriot League member school.

This weekend marks the third trip for Navy to the state of Colorado. The Mids have lost both of their previous games played in the state (Jan., '02; Dec., '04; both to Air Force.).

The Mids have posted a 3-2 record against teams from Colorado, are 1-1 against teams from the state of Ohio and have not yet faced a team from Nebraska.

Colorado State Notes

The Rams enter the tournament winless through their opening four games of the year. Included in the setbacks was a triple overtime loss to San Francisco and a 70-60 loss to Northern Colorado Tuesday night.

CSU is averaging 69.0 points and 40.5 rebounds a game, while allowing foes to score 79.8 points per game and haul in 42.5 caroms a contest. The Rams are connecting on 5.8 three-pointers a game, while opponents are sinking 9.0 triples a game. Colorado State is turning the ball over 16 times a game and forcing foes into 15.0 turnovers a game.

Sara Hunter leads the Rams in scoring this year with an average of 17.5 points per game. She also has drilled 13 of the team's 23 three-pointers this season. Three additional players are averaging just over 9.0 points a game, including Juanise Cornell (9.8 ppg) and Carine Reimink (9.5 ppg) who lead the team with rebounding averages of 8.3 and 7.8 boards a game, respectively.

Creighton Notes

The Blue Jays have posted a 2-1 record on the season, with their only loss coming at sixth-ranked Rutgers.

Creighton is outscoring its opponents by nine points a game (66.7-57.7 ppg) and holds slim a 40.0-39.0 rebounds per game advantage. The Blue Jays have nearly doubled the number of three-pointers their opponents have made (15-8) and are forcing seven more turnovers a game than they are committing (21.7-14.7 tpg).

No Creighton player holds a scoring average of over 10.0 points per game, but six players are averaging over 7.0 points a contest. Kelsey Woodard leads the team with an average of 8.0 points per game.

Additionally, five players have a rebounding average of over 4.0 rebounds a game, with Megan Neuvirth (5.7 rpg) and Kristina Voss (5.3 rpg) leading the squad.

Kent State Notes

Kent State makes the trek to Colorado with a 0-3 record on the year.

The Golden Flash is being outscored by 16 points a game (78.7-62.7 ppg) and is trailing their foes in rebounding by five boards a game (42.0-37.7 rpg). Opponents are connecting on 45.6 percent of their shots from the field (KSU is shooting 37.4%) and are converting 7.7 three-point field goals a game (KSU is averaging 2.0 3-pt. FGM/G).

Anna Kowalska leads Kent State in both scoring and rebounding with averages of 19.3 points and 9.3 rebounds a game.

Last Game for Navy

Georgetown held Navy to one field over the final 14 minutes of the first half in turning an 11-9 deficit into a 45-22 lead at the break before going on to record an 81-56 win over the Mids, Tuesday night at Georgetown.

Navy made just 1-of-9 shots from the field and turned the ball over 10 times during the decisive first half-ending stretch, while Georgetown converted 14-of-23 shots from the field and committed five turnovers during the same span.

For the game, Georgetown held a 55.2-43.2 advantage in field goal percentage and scored 29 points off of 24 Navy turnovers. Conversely, the Mids tallied 10 points following the 13 turnovers they forced the Hoyas into.

Cassie Consedine just missed her fifth double-double of the season with a Navy-best 17 points and nine rebounds. Also reaching double figures in points were K.C. Gordon with 14 and Whitney Davidson with 12.

Currier Selects Marine Corps

The seniors at the U.S. Naval Academy recently received their service assignments for their military careers. Ali Currier, the lone senior on the women's basketball team, will become a member of the ground forces for the U.S. Marine Corps. She will be commissioned as a 2nd Lieutenant in the Marine Corps upon graduating from Navy this May.
